Oil soars 10pc after OPEC deal

Oil prices soared nearly 10 per cent in New York yesterday after OPEC member countries reached a deal to jointly cut output, putting an end to months of suspense on markets.

The accord announced by the Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries is aimed at reducing a global supply glut

that has kept prices low. The cartel will lower its monthly output by 1.2 million barrels per day (bpd) to 32.5 million bpd from January 1, Qatar's energy minister and president of the OPEC conference said.

"This is a major step forward and we think this is a historic agreement, which will definitely help rebalance the market and reduce the stock overhang," Mohammed

Bin Saleh Al-Sada told a news conference.

He also said that the deal will help global inflation accelerate to a "more healthy rate", including in the US.

According to OPEC, Saudi Arabia will reduce output by 486,000 bpd from October levels to 10.1 million bpd. Iraq will cut by 210,000 bpd to 4.4 million bpd and UAE 139,000 to 2.9 million bpd.

Libya and Nigeria are exempted, while Indonesia has suspended its membership. Iran will actually increase production by 90,000 bpd to 3.8 million bpd under the deal.

Russia responded to the decision saying it was ready to cut its own oil production by 300,000 bpd next year. (AFP)
