ran's nuclear deal should bring stability and good neighbourliness rather than interference, Gulf Arab states told US Secretary of State John Kerry yesterday as they began talks on the merits of its historic accord with world powers.

Qatari Foreign Minister Khalid Al Attiyah, welcoming Kerry to Qatar for the talks with the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), said the alliance wanted to spare the region "from any dangers and threats from nuclear weapons".

"This should be done by authorising the use of nuclear technology for peaceful purposes in line with international rules," he said, speaking for the GCC as host of the meeting.

"We look forward with hope to the nuclear agreement ... leading to the preservation of security and stability in the region, and we emphasize the importance of cooperation with Iran based on principles

of good neighbourliness, non-interference in internal affairs and solving disputes peacefully," he commented.

Al Attiyah expressed hope that the nuclear deal concluded between Iran and the world powers in Vienna last month would help maintain security and stability in the region.

In the meantime, he warned against the repercussions of the failure of the Middle East peace process and the continuation of the Israeli occupation

of Palestinian territories, which is the major cause for instability in the region.

Al Attiyah urged the US to exert further efforts to restore the peace process to track and to end occupation in line with the international resolutions and the Arab Initiative.

Speaking in Egypt on Sunday, Kerry said the United States had labeled Iran the world's numberone state sponsor of terror, but this was precisely why it was so important to ensure

Tehran did not obtain a nuclear weapon.

Speaking to reporters in Doha yesterday, Kerry said: "It was crystal clear that the US and GCC regarded their partnership as indispensible for the security of the region".

He added that the US had agreed to speed up the transfer of weapons including missiles - to its allies in the Gulf, as well as to co-operate more closely with them against Islamic State (IS) militants and Al Qaeda.



Sir Edward Heath named in child sex abuse probe

London

Police have named Sir Edward Heath as a suspected paedophile in the most extraordinary twist yet in the ongoing investigation into allegations of historic child abuse. Appealing for potential victims of the late former Prime Minister to come forward, Wiltshire Police revealed that he had been named in relation to offences concerning children. But they declined to give any details about the nature of the allegations against Sir Edward, who died in 2005, aged 89. The revelations came as it was announced that the Independent Police **Complaints Commission was** investigating claims that the police had quietly dropped a criminal trial in the 1990s.

CABINET: NEED UNIFIED STANCE AGAINST TERROR

Condemns Sitra terror blast, praises supportive stances

The Cabinet session, chaired by Prime Minister HRH Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa at the Gudaibiya Palace yesterday, called for adopting unified stances and rallying behind the leadership as the best way to fend off sedition and foil attempts to subvert Kingdom's security and stability.

The Cabinet also condemned the heinous terror blast in Sitra, which led to the martyrdom of two on-duty policemen. The session offered deepest condolences to the families of the bereaved.

In a statement following the session, the Secretary-General of the Cabinet Dr. Yaser bin Essa Al Nasser said the Cabinet considered the perpetrators as

essential partners in the terror crime.

It urged the competent authorities to quickly finalise necessary security procedures to bring the criminals to justice.

"Such terror acts will not impede the government's efforts to enhance developments that benefit the nation and the citizens, nor will they affect its tireless work to maintain the Kingdom's status as a secure and stable nation under its leadership" said the Cabinet.

The Premier underlined

MINISTRY TO KEEP TAB ON CONTENTS OF MEDIA

To be done in coordination with various government agencies

he Ministry of Information Affairs will keep an eye on the contents of local as well as international media to ensure that the media houses project the true development achieved by Bahrain.

Addressing media yesterday after the weekly Cabinet meeting, chaired by Prime Minister HRH Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa, Information Affairs Minister, Isa bin Abdulrahman Al Hammadi said that the mediamonitoring job would be done in coordination with various government agencies.

The Minister said that the government would take all necessary actions to deal with local media, which publish wrong information about the Kingdom. "Even the international media will also be contacted if they give inaccurate information about Bahrain," he said.

The Minister said that the government had established laws in 2002 to regulate media in the Kingdom. "If needed, the Kingdom will enact more

The Information Affairs Minister said that the current Press Law did not apply to social media. The new laws, which will be enacted in future, will bring social media under Press Law. "But currently there

The Minister said that the government would take all necessary actions to deal with local and international media, which publish wrong information about the Kingdom

Interior would create laws to tackle the violations committed on social media. Later the law will be presented to the Public Prosecution. In this regard, the role of the Information Affairs Authority (IAA) is to coordinate with the Interior

"If anyone notices violations on social media, he/she can bring it to the notice of the person concerned. We have to use the social media in a right way," he remarked.

Hearing starts in breach of traffic law case against Asian man

he High Criminal Appeals Court has commenced hearing the trial of an Asian man, who contested a conviction in a breach of traffic law case. The defendant was earlier given 20 days' imprisonment for using his car for commercial transportation.


He was captured after transporting a Gulf national from the Bahrain International to Airport Manama. Prosecutors claimed that the defendant offered to give the visitor a lift to Manama at a fair of BD5 when he met him at the airport.

However, the defendant alleged that it was the Gulf National who requested him to transport him to Manama by his car in return of money. "I drove my friend to the airport, and while I was about to leave, I saw the man (the Gulf national). He requested me to take him to Manama by my car for BD5," the defendant pointed out in his statement.

The accused was captured at the airport exit while he was en route to Bahrain's capital. He was convicted before the Lower Criminal Court - which is concerned with hearing cases related to traffic violations

on grounds of providing public transportation without a license. Judges had also fined him BD500 for his offence as well as ordered for his immediate deportation once he completes his jail term.

The initial ruling also included a three-year-long re-entry ban to Bahrain against him. It's worth to note that it was the first time for a Bahraini court to issue a verdict for such a road violation. The case was referred to the appeals court after the defendant contested his initial sentence. His case was adjourned yesterday until August 5 to summon up a translator for him.







as combat and administrative readiness. He also met other officials there.



MTT LAUNCHES NEW RADAR WIND AND TEMP PROFILER

The RWTP will contribute to improving safety for airports

The Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications Meteorological Directorate has completed the installation of a Radar Wind and Temperature Profiler that measures wind and temperature in the atmosphere.

Ahmed Al Nemah, the Acting Undersecretary of Civil Aviation Affairs at the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications (MTT) said that the completion of the project is an important milestone in the Ministry's strategic plan to develop the Kingdom's meteorological services, by investing in cuttingedge technology that enables the Meteorological Directorate to closely observe the weather phenomena affecting the takeoff and landing of aircraft,

Data from the Profiler will be furnished to any requesting airline using Bahrain International Airport for assistance in takeoff or landing

especially in the lower layers of the atmosphere.

This in turn will contribute to further improving safety at the Bahrain International Airport and strengthening its standing amongst various Airline Companies working in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Adel Deham, Director of



The MTT Facility

Meteorology at MTT's Civil Aviation Affairs, explained that the main function of the radar is to measure the velocity (speed and direction) of the wind in addition to the atmospheric temperature at different altitudes above the runway on a continuous basis, and such information can then be furnished to any requesting airline using Bahrain International Airport for assistance in takeoff or landing.

Deham added that this information would help forecast weather conditions

and enable the Meteorological Directorate to issue necessary weather warnings to pilots of aircraft during takeoff and landing, ensuring avoidance of weather- related accidents that can affect the safety of passengers and aircraft. Helicopters, which are low altitude flying aircraft, will be especially served by this radar.

"The information generated from this device will enable us to expand our database, and can be used in the future in the field of research or to predict the movement of any lingering components in the atmosphere, including harmful gases in the event of any disaster, God forbid, in the Gulf Region," he said.

The radar data will be one of the main inputs for the Numerical Weather Prediction project, which is one of the MTT's upcoming projects.

Ahmed Jaffar, a Parkinson's disease surviver, is on his way for another intense challenge as he is hoping to tackle the extreme temperatures of Iceland in the next 12 days. The Arad resident who is a successful businessman and the owner of a large supermarket chain in Bahrain has already completed five challenging trips including an adventure in Antarctica,

Ahmed Jaffar, who suffers from Parkinson's disease, drew international acclaim as well as admirers from around the globe who refer to him as the 'beast of Bahrain'

horseback riding and trekking in Mongolia as well as climbing Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest peak in Africa.

Jaffar drew international acclaim as well as admirers from around the globe who refer to him as the 'beast of Bahrain'. Last

year, researchers from The Austrian Parkinson's Support Group gave him the title 'Ambassador for Parkinson's Affairs and Relationships' in an awarding ceremony in

Now, he is on yet another trip to 'challenge Parkinson's' as well as to inspire others "so that they won't give up". Speaking to *DT News*, Jaffar said "I go for these challenging trips to show that Parkinson's has not defeated me as well as to show people who are suffering difficulties in life that they can achieve great things no matter what the obstacles are."

Despite being burdened with the life-altering disease, Jaffar leads a normal life, working hard on his business and taking care of his family in addition to a rigorous

exercise routine. "Exercise is very important, if I fail to exercise rigorously and consistently, the Parkinson's starts to take over. This is one of the reasons I am taking up big challenges such as Kilimanjaro, Antarctica and Iceland. These trips strengthen me physically and mentally."

Jaffar is expected to reach Iceland today morning after leaving Bahrain last night. His plans for Iceland include glacier hiking, Iceberg Boating, trekking, hiking and Horse Riding.

"It will be a busy schedule. It will be physically exhausting. I am a little tensed, as I have not prepared for it as much as I wanted to. Because of various reasons, I did not get enough time to prepare and practice and it might be leaving me a little short fitness-wise for such a huge endeavour. However, I hope it can be managed."

"The extreme climate will be the greatest challenge. Its never easy to tread from a country like Bahrain where temperature rises to over 40 degree Celsius to another country where it is very cold,"

Woman drags dealer to court for car's defect

"She took the car to the dealership, and they told her that there was a problem in the engine. She kept the car for two days and they received a call informing her that the car was ready. When she asked them about what was the problem, they failed to response to her questions," he added.

The lawyer requested the court to summon up a mechanical technician to conduct a thorough check on the car to ascertain its condition and the type of defect in the engine as well as its causes.

Also, the old lighting system at some schools will be replaced with power-saving lighting and

aluminium insulating windows are to be installed to save power and preserve natural resources in the Kingdom.

A number of nine old schools with deteriorated concrete structures have been chosen to undergo constructional maintenance; based on lab reports prepared by the Ministry's Materials Engineering Directorate in coordination with the Services Directorate of the Ministry of Education.

The Ministry is keen to complete all maintenance works coinciding with the start of the school year.

3700 Bahrainis to perform Hajj this year

Atotal of three thousand seven hundred Muslims from Bahrain have registered to perform Hajj this year, confirmed Head of Bahrain Hajj Mission Shaikh Adnan bin Abdullah Al Qattan while speaking to the *DT News* yesterday.

He said that the process of registration has been completed and the pilgrims are expected to start their journeys to Mecca from September 9. "All the pilgrims must go for vaccination before going for Hajj," he said, "they should not take it as something imposed on them - it is only for their protection."

Exact date of Hajj cannot be fixed in advance as it depends on the Islamic lunar calendar based on the sighting of the moon. Anyhow it is expected to fall between 21 to 26 September.

He added that he himself would perform Hajj this year. Shaikh Adnan advised the pilgrims to perform the obligation of Hajj with full devotion spending their time in

the remembrance of Allah Almighty. He asked them to do good deeds and stay away from all sorts of political conversations during Hajj. "Follow the rules of Bahrain and Saudi Arabia," he said.

Water, water everywhere

MONSOON BRINGS RAIN AND MISERY

Monsoon rains have claimed hundreds of lives across Asia, authorities reported yesterday, as rescuers scrambled to reach remote areas of India, Pakistan and Myanmar after flash floods and landslides.

Authorities in India say more than 120 people have died across the country in recent days, while more than a million have been displaced by rains worsened by a cyclone that barrelled through the Bay of Bengal last week.

Yesterday, rescuers resumed their search for villagers after downpours caused a landslide in India's remote northeastern state of Manipur, where an official said four bodies have so far been recovered from a hamlet buried by a collapsed hill.

In neighbouring Myanmar heavy seasonal rains - augmented by Cyclone Komen -- have killed 46 people so far and affected more than 200,000, with swathes of the country hit by rooftop-high floods.

The government has designated four "national disaster-affected regions" in central and western Myanmar, where villagers have been forced to use canoes and makeshift rafts to escape the rising waters. Thousands of others are already in camps for the displaced including in the Kalay district of Sagaing region, where residents told of unusually powerful floodwaters swamping homes in hours.

"We've lost all that we have. Our house is still under water," Htay Shein, 62, said from a temporary shelter in Kalay.

"We have seen floods, but never anything like this before."

The United Nations said swollen rivers threaten more areas of the country, adding it could be days before the true extent of the disaster emerges.

"Logistics are extremely difficult. Assessment teams are having a hard time reaching affected areas," said Pierre Peron, Myanmar spokesman for the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs.

President Thein Sein promised authorities would do their "utmost" to provide relief, according to the staterun *Global New Light of Myanmar*. Landslides in Chin state - south of Sagaing - have destroyed 700 homes in the state capital Hakha, which is completely cut off from surrounding areas, the report added.

Rains have also battered the western state of Rakhine, which already hosts about 140,000 displaced people, mainly Rohingya Muslims, who live in exposed coastal camps following deadly 2012 unrest between the minority group and Buddhists.

Monsoon misery

The annual monsoon is a lifeline for farmers across the region, but heavy rains and powerful cyclones can also prove deadly. Poor infrastructure and limited search and rescue capabilities routinely hamper relief efforts across the region, with roads, phone lines and electricity often knocked out by rising waters.

India, which receives nearly 80 per cent of its annual rainfall from June to September, sees tragedy strike every monsoon season. This year West Bengal has been hit hard with 48 people killed, according to state management minister Javed Ahmad Khan.

"More than 1.8 million people in 5,600 villages have been affected by the flooding... nearly 1.1 million have been moved to camps," Khan said.

Pakistan has seen 116 people die so far. Ahmed Kamal, spokesman for Pakistan's National Disaster Management Agency, said more than 850,000 people had been affected by this year's floods.


Dozens have also perished in Nepal and Vietnam following floods and landslides. In Vietnam toxic mudslides from flood-hit coal mines in the northern province of Quang Ninh, home to the UNESCO-listed Halong Bay tourist site, claimed the lives of two families and spewed coal into town centres.

n the 'The Competitive Advantage of Nations', Michael Porter, in 1990-the world renowned authority on competitive strategy and the competitiveness and economic development of nations, states, and regions-said, "A nation's competitiveness depends on the capacity of its industry to innovate and upgrade. Companies gain advantage against the world's best competitors because of pressure and challenge. They benefit from having strong domestic rivals, aggressive home-based suppliers, and demanding local customers."

In Bahrain, are we following the right strategy to create competitive advantage? At the least, we are not having

home-based suppliers; this sentiment is echoed by Yasser Najeeb, factory manager, Awal Food Factories.

He questions the red-carpet welcome given to MNCs to invest in Bahrain.

"MNCs import 99 per cent of their raw materials and export 99pc of their products. And, they don't have to pay taxes. How is Bahrain benefitting from this?"

He invited the small and medium sector companies in Bahrain for tie-ups with Awal, as suppliers." We need the help of other companies to procure raw materials. At present, we are doing all the sourcing on our own and it involves a lot of running around."

Najeeb added, "We are a 100pc Bahraini company and sell our products in this market. We will be able to focus on

our strategic business areas by outsourcing our supplies to other Bahrain companies. For small and medium companies, who specialize in delivering different raw materials, according to their expertise, there is a great opportunity with us"

"If anyone in Bahrain is ready to deliver the raw materials to our factory, we will be very happy to take their

"Our initiative will add more jobs to the economy. Instead of job seekers, more job creators will be available. Also, the government will get more revenue streams in the form of taxes and fees"

The factory manager at Awal Food also lamented the fact that the cost of running business has gone up steeply in recent times. "The companies are forced to cut costs due to the increased cost of land and other charges. We can't run away, right? So, we are forced to cut costs. But where?"

If Bahrain is able to provide efficient, cost-effective suppliers of raw materials, then industries will be able to survive here. But, to achieve this objective, it is imperative to have an atmosphere, similar

to Dubai, wherein starting of a business doesn't involve a lot of hassles, as now," Najeeb said.

Apple pushed down to 3rd in China smartphones in Q2

Shanghai

Two Chinese smartphone makers pushed US technology giant Apple into third place in the world's biggest market in the second quarter, an independent analyst firm said yesterday.

Upstart Xiaomi, known for delivering high-performance products at cheap prices, was the largest smartphone vendor in China based on shipments with a 15.9 per cent market share in the April-June period, Canalys said in a press release.

Telecom equipment maker Huawei was close behind at 15.7pc, it said, followed by Apple, South Korea's Samsung and Chinese firm Vivo, without giving the percentages for those three. US technology giant Apple had taken top spot in the Canalys rankings for the first three months of 2015, and its third place showing came despite the launch of its large-screen iPhone 6 and iPhone 6 Plus last autumn.

Apple's iPhone sales surged 85pc in Greater China -- which includes Hong Kong and Taiwan -with revenue from the region more than doubling to \$13 billion for the latest quarter ended June 27, according to

he company.

"We remain extremely bullish on China and we are continuing to invest," Apple chief executive officer Tim Cook said last month when the company announced earnings.

ajor Gulf stock markets edged up yesterday after Sunday's sell-off but Saudi Arabia lagged because telecommunications operator Mobily tumbled following yet another negative earnings restatement.

The main Saudi index edged up 0.2 per cent, having dropped 3.2pc in the previous session. Petrochemicals giant Saudi Basic Industries was the main support, rising 1.3pc after falling 3.9pc on Sunday in response to a fresh drop in oil prices.

Another heavyweight, Saudi Arabian Mining (Ma'aden) , jumped 3.5pc and almost fully recovered from Sunday's sharp decline.

But Etihad Etisalat (Mobily), the kingdom's most traded

stock, tumbled 7.4pc to 31.30 riyals, its lowest close since mid-2009.

Other Gulf markets did slightly better although none of them fully recovered Sunday's

losses as oil prices continued to fall on Monday.

Dubai's index edged up 0.4pc and Emaar Properties, the emirate's biggest listed developer, was the most traded stock, rising 1.3 pc.

The company posted a 16pc

increase in second-quarter profit to 1.18 dirhams (\$321m) on Sunday. SICO Bahrain had forecast Emaar's quarterly profit would be 817m dirhams and Naaem brokerage had expected 1.09bn dirhams.

Abu Dhabi's index edged up 0.6pc. Qatar added 0.9pc as Qatar Insurance surged 5.1pc to a new all-time high of 106.10 riyals, rising above its July peak of 102.50 riyals. The stock gained strong momentum in May when MSCI added it to its emerging markets benchmark.

Egypt's bourse fell 0.9pc and, according to bourse data, most selling pressure came from Arab retail investors. Kuwait index slipped 0.4 pc to 6,213 points, Oman index fell 0.9 pc to 6,499 points, as Bahrain bourse slipped 0.1 pc to 1,329 points.

Dubai heading for another realty bubble?

Dubai

The International Monetary Fund called yesterday on Dubai to take "stronger

measures" to avert another property bubble, after prices rocketed at a rate reminiscent of the 2009 crisis.

Authorities in the Gulf emirate have already doubled sales duties to four per cent, and the central bank of the United Arab Emirates has tightened lending facilities.

"These measures are good," said IMF regional director Masood Ahmed, adding however that there was a need for even tougher steps.

"It is time to consider stronger measures particularly in ways to discourage a quick turnaround," Ahmed told a forum in Dubai, warning of renewed market activity aimed at fast profits.

He suggested increasing sales duties substantially to prevent such activity, citing Singapore's 30pc tax on sales made within a year of purchase as an example.

"I think it is time to consider

'DENIED' IN FRONT OF A RAINBOW FLAG

Manila

The Philippine government promptly rejected the first same-sex marriage licenses applied by two couples in the conservative Catholic nation.

Maria Arlyn Ibanez and her partner Joanne Reena Gregorio joined Pastor Crescencio Agbayani and his partner Marlon Pelipe in trooping to a civil registry office in Manila, hoping to raise awareness about gay rights.

"We expected it would be denied but we tried it anyway.... We thought maybe there would be a miracle and it would be approved," Ibanez, a 33-year-old call centre worker, said.

After the government agency turned them down, Ibanez and Agbayani, who runs an informal church for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people, brandished a sign saying, "We were denied" in front of a rainbow flag.

Officials at the agency told reporters it was the first time a same sex couple had applied for a marriage licence.

Government officials have

previously said no same-sex unions will be recognised unless a law is passed for the purpose, adding that it would likely be blocked by legislators allied with the Catholic church.

The Philippines - where 80 per cent of a population of 100 million is Catholic - is the only country where divorce is not legal, largely due to church influence.

Abortion is also illegal. Gay rights lawyer Clara Rita Padilla said the marriage license applications reflected the need to legalise same-sex unions in the Philippines. "The right to marry is guaranteed by our constitutional rights to equality, equal protection of the law, privacy, and religion," she said in a statement.

Ibanez said yesterday's rejection will not stop her and her partner from taking part in a "wedding" ceremony slated later this month at Agbayani's church.

The union would not be legally recognized, but would show her commitment to her partner, she said.

Uproar and disruptions

INDIA'S PARLIAMENT SUSPENDS 25 MPs

New Delhi

India's parliament yesterday suspended 25 opposition lawmakers following days of uproar and disruptions that have so far thwarted the government's hopes of passing major economic reforms in the current session.

The lawmakers, from the main opposition Congress party, have been banned from the lower house for five days amid mounting government fears that the current session will be a washout.

"You have come to the well of the house... and are persistently, wilfully obstructing the house," parliamentary Speaker Sumitra Mahajan said to jeers and heckling from the opposition benches.

The opposition has been demanding the resignation of Foreign Minister Sushma Swaraj and a number of other The lawmakers, from the main opposition Congress party, have been banned from the lower house for five days

scandal-hit ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leaders.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's right-wing government, which swept to power last year on a pledge to revive the economy, wants to push through a series of reforms including a new national sales tax.

But, Modi's appeal for opposition support at the start

of the session in July has been ignored.

Congress vowed yesterday to push on with the disruptions for the session's remaining eight days, with party president Sonia Gandhi calling the suspensions a "black day for democracy".

The government needs the support of the opposition in the upper house where it lacks a majority to pass its bills.

Modi is keen to pass a long-pending national goods and services tax, which aims to replace a myriad of overlapping state duties that often deter investment, as well as a controversial bill that makes it easier for businesses to buy land.

The opposition is demanding Swaraj quit over her role in helping corruption-hit former cricket boss Lalit Modi to obtain a passport.

The government has branded the disruptions irresponsible but the BJP was also accused of continuously disrupting parliament during its decade in opposition until 2014.

An exasperated Mahajan said she had no choice but to suspend the MPs who had been storming the well of the chamber, chanting and waving posters.

"I repeatedly called meetings, even warned about these placards, disruptions etc over the last few days," the Speaker said.

India orders hundreds of porn sites blocked

New Delhi

India has ordered more than 800 porn sites blocked for "objectionable" content, a government official said yesterday, igniting a row about freedom of speech in the world's biggest democracy.

The telecommunications department has directed Internet service providers (ISPs) to block 857 websites, in the right-wing government's first major crackdown on online pornography.

"We have written to the ISPs asking them to control free and open access to objectionable websites," N.N. Kaul, a department spokesman, said.

Since the weekend, users across India have been hit with blank pages when they try to access adult sites, many of them based outside the country - sparking anger on social media about moral policing.

According to the adult site Pornhub, India was its fourth largest source of traffic behind the United States, Britain and Canada in 2014.

Deepening rift Mullah Omar's family refuses to back new leader

The family of deceased Taliban leader Mullah Omar has refused to pledge allegiance to his successor, calling on religious scholars to settle a deepening rift within insurgent ranks over the power transition.

Mullah Akhtar Mansour was announced as the new Taliban chief on Friday after the insurgents confirmed the death of Mullah Omar, who led the militant movement for some 20 years.

But, splits immediately

emerged between Mansour and those who challenged his appointment, including the late leader's son Yakoub and his brother, Mullah Abdul Manan.

"Our family... has not declared allegiance to anyone amid these differences," Manan said in an audio message released on Sunday, without naming Mansour.

"We want the ulema (religious scholars) to resolve the differences rather than declaring allegiance to any side," said the audio message, which Taliban source confirmed was from Manan.

"Our family will serve the new leader... if he is elected with consensus."

The comments highlight the Taliban's biggest leadership crisis in recent years at a time when the rival Islamic State group is making gradual inroads into Afghanistan.

Mansour on Saturday called for unity in the Taliban in his first audio message since becoming head of the group, in comments apparently aimed at averting a factional split. OBAMA TAKES A BIG STEP TO CUT CARBON EMISSIONS

Us President Barack Obama challenged America and the world to step up efforts to fight global warming yesterday at the formal unveiling of his administration's controversial, ramped-up plan to cut carbon emissions from US power plants.

Declaring climate change the greatest threat facing the world, Obama said the power plant owners must cut carbon dioxide emissions by 32 per cent from 2005 levels by 2030.

Electric power plants account for some 40pc of US emissions of carbon dioxide, the most common gas greenhouse

change. Obama described the move as "the single most important step America has ever taken in the fight against global climate change."

The announcement fires the starting gun on a monthslong environmental drive that will shape his legacy.

Later this August, Obama will become the first president to visit the Alaskan Arctic.

"Our fellow Americans have already seen their communities devastated by melting ice and rising oceans," Obama said.

impassioned an collective call for action. And in December, representatives from around the world will

gather in Paris to hash out rules designed to limit global temperature increases to two degrees Celsius (3.6 degrees Fahrenheit).

Meanwhile, the EU hailed Obama's clean power plan as "a positive step" to cut carbon emissions ahead of a global climate summit in Paris.

"The clean power plan is a positive step forward in the genuine efforts of the United States to cut its emissions,' Miguel Arias Canete, the EU commissioner for climate action and energy, wrote on Twitter.

However, opponents in the energy industry have vowed to fight the plan.

Jewish extremist head arrested

Jerusalem

Alewish extremist group's leader was arrested yesterday after a Palestinian baby died in a West Bank firebombing, as police investigated online threats against Israel's president for condemning "Jewish terrorism".

The domestic intelligence service named him as Meir Ettinger, a grandson of Meir Kahane a rabbi who founded the racist anti-Arab movement Kach and was assassinated in 1990 in New York.

He was arrested in Safed in northern Israel "because of his activities in a Jewish extremist organisation", a Shin Bet

spokesman said. Police said Ettinger, who is aged around 20, was suspected of "nationalist crimes" but did not accuse him of direct involvement in Friday's firebombing.

According to Israeli media, he was the brains behind a June 18 arson attack on a shrine in northern Israel where Christians believe Jesus performed the miracle of loaves and fishes.

Ettinger was due to appear in court tomorrow for a custody hearing, police said.

Media reports Ettinger could face a year of "administrative detention" under the government's harder line against "Jewish terrorists".

UK announces new steps against illegal immigrants

Britain's government promised new measures yesterday to crack down on illegal immigrants by making landlords evict them, as the Calais migrants crisis continued to dominate the headlines.

Landlords in England who do not remove people with no right to remain in Britain, or do not check their immigration status before renting them a property, could be jailed for up to five years.

The move, announced by Communities Secretary Greg Clark, is set to be included in a new Immigration Bill that parliament will debate in the

coming months. Immigration is one of the most sensitive issues in British politics and Prime Minister David Cameron's centre-right government has been battling to bring the numbers down for years.

Images trying illegally to cross the Channel Tunnel from France to Britain have fuelled calls from political opponents for ministers to do more and Cameron has warned that the situation could last all summer.

Migrants in Calais made around 1,700 attempts overnight Sunday to cross, according to French police sources.

Glaciers melt to lowest level on record: study

laciers worldwide Thave shrunk to levels not seen in 120 years of record keeping, with meltoff accelerating in the first decade of the 21st century, according to a study released yesterday.

On average, glaciers currently lose between 50 to 150 centimetres (20 to 60 inches) of thickness every year, reported the study, published in the Journal of Glaciology.

"This is two to three times more than the corresponding average of the 20th century,

said Michael Zemp, director of the World Glacier Monitoring Service and the study's lead author.

More than a billion people, especially in Asia and South America, get more than half of their drinking water from the seasonal melting of snow melt and glacier ice, previous research has shown.

The current rate of global glacier melt is without precedent for the 120 years covered by scientific observation, and probably for much longer, Zemp

Moreover, accelerated ice

loss has created a dynamic whereby glaciers in many regions will continue to diminish even if global warming did not continue to boost global temperatures.

Preliminary data from the last five years, not covered in the study, suggest that rapid decline of ice mass is continuing apace.

The 20th-century record ice loss observed in 1998 "has been exceeded in 2003, 2006, 2011, 2013, and probably again in 2014," Kemp said.

The long-term trend of glacier retreat takes into account shorter periods where, in some locations, glaciers have regained some of their lost ice mass.

Many so-called "ice tongues" formed by glacier runoff in Norway, for example, regained a couple hundred metres in length during the

Overall, though, they have retreated by several kilometres compared to the areas covered in the late 19th century.

The World Glacier Monitoring Service compiles the results of worldwide glacier observations submitted annually from a global network of scientists & observers.

BATTLE FOR AIRBASE

Aden

Loyalist forces began a major offensive yesterday aimed at retaking Yemen's largest airbase, which is held by rebels, as troops from the Saudi-led coalition entered recaptured second city Aden.

The pro-government troops deployed heavy armour supplied by their backers in the assault on Al Anad base, some 60 kilometres (35 miles) north of Aden, military sources said.

"The battle to retake Al Anad base has begun," a military source said.

Hundreds of troops and militia equipped with tanks and armoured vehicles supplied by the coalition deployed around the base before yesterday's attack, their commander Fadhl Hassan said.

Another source said Saudiled warplanes were providing air cover for the loyalist forces, who launched the offensive from a mountainous region west of the base.

Al Anad, in southern Lahj province, housed US troops overseeing a drone war against Al Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula until shortly before Iran-backed Shia Huthi rebels overran it in March. An officer taking part in the offensive said the troops had reached the western entrance of Al Anad by mid-afternoon yesterday.

The progovernment troops deployed heavy armour supplied by their backers in the assault on Al Anad base

But, an attempt to break into the base from the south failed and loyalist forces met "stiff resistance" from the rebels, added the officer who asked not to be named.

Fierce fighting was under way outside the base and "several" people were killed on both sides, he said.

Another officer said that coalition warplanes helped loyalists on the ground by launching new raids, destroying two rebel tanks and

four vehicles and killing those inside, he said.

Retaking Al Anad would help bolster security in Aden, whose liberation the government of exiled President Abedrabbo Mansour Hadi announced in mid-July.

It would also open the way to loyalist forces to push further

north against the Huthis, who have enjoyed strong support on the ground from fighters close to former president Ali Abdullah Saleh.

Meanwhile, the Saudiowned *Al Hayat* newspaper said 1,500 troops, most of them from the United Arab Emirates, had reached Aden.

The UAE is a member of the coalition, which has carried out more than four months of air strikes targeting the rebels and their allies.

Military sources spoke of further progress by loyalist forces who they said had recaptured Houta, the provincial capital of Lahj, and seized Al Ribat highway north of Aden.

Aden has been devastated by four months of coalition air strikes and fighting on the ground.

Saudi beheads murderer in 110th execution since Jan

Saudi Arabia yesterday beheaded one of its citizens convicted of murder, adding to a sharp increase in executions this year.

Mugrib al Thanyan was executed in Eastern Province after being found guilty of shooting dead another Saudi after a dispute, the ministry of interior said in a statement. His case brings the number of beheadings this year in the kingdom to 110.

5.3-magnitude quake rocks Pakistan's southwest: USGS

Islamabad

A 5.3-magnitude earthquake struck Pakistan's southwestern Baluchistan province yesterday, the US Geological Survey said, but local officials said there were no reports of damage or casualties.

The quake struck at a depth of 27 kilometres, with its epicentre located 82 kilometres south west of Khuzdar district in Baluchistan province, where people felt the shockwave.

"The magnitude of the earthquake was recorded 5.5 and its depth was 10 kilometres," Muhammad Shafique, a meteorologist at Pakistan's met office, said.

Yemeni refugees flee to Djibouti

Dibouti appealed yesterday for aid after hundreds of Yemeni refugees fleeing civil war arrived in the Horn of African nation, adding to thousands already being supported.

"The refugees arriving have lost everything," said presidential spokesman Naguib Ali Taher, adding they needed shelter as well as medical care, including psychological support.

Djibouti, a tiny nation of over 800,000 people, is a haven for Yemeni refugees fleeing the air strikes that have devastated their country.

Two boatloads bearing more than 200 refugees arrived last week, Taher said, warning that the "flood does not stop", with more boats arriving over the weekend.

Almost 10,000 Yemenis have arrived in the small state since late March, according to the UN refugee agency, the UNHCR.

Pak 'teen' convict faces gallows despite protests

Karachi

Pakistan is preparing today to hang a convicted killer whose case has attracted international protests.

Shafqat Hussain was sentenced to death for killing a seven-year-old boy in Karachi in 2004, but has had several stays of execution, most recently in June.

The case has prompted grave concern among human rights campaigners as Hussain's lawyers and family claim he was only 15 at the time of the killing, though a government-ordered probe ruled he was

an adult. Hussain's supporters also say he was tortured into confessing.

Yesterday the local government in the Kashmir region, where Hussain is from, requested a stay of execution while they look into the controversy surrounding his age. "On the basis of the recommendations of the Sindh Human Rights Commission, I have decided to conduct an enquiry at the level of the Government of Kashmir into the matter of the juvenility of Mr. Hussain," the state's leader, Sardar Muhammad

Yaqoob Khan, said in a letter to Pakistan's President.

"It is in the interest of justice that the execution of Mr. Hussain ... be postponed on humanitarian grounds," he wrote.

Khan added that he had also asked the local government in Sindh province, where Hussain is jailed, to look into allegations that torture was used to extract a confession.

A government official in Sindh confirmed that the provincial authorities had also recommended a stay in the execution. Late yesterday, however, the federal government was yet to announce any postponement.

United Nations rights experts have said his trial "fell short of international standards" and called on Islamabad to reinstate a moratorium on the death penalty.

Maya Foa of the British antideath penalty campaign group Reprieve condemned the plan to hang Hussain as an "absolute disgrace".

An official at Karachi Central Prison said Hussain's execution was scheduled for today following a death warrant issued by a court.

Nigeria also impressed on the road this year in qualifiers for the 2015 All-Africa Games, an under-23 competition like the Olympics.

After hammering Gabon 4-1 in Libreville, they overcame

Zambia 2-1 in Lusaka to reach the Africa tournament during September in Brazzaville.

In November, Nigeria will join hosts Senegal, Algeria, Egypt, Mali, South Africa, Tunisia and Zambia at an Olympic tournament, with three 2016 Rio Games places up for grabs.

After wasting many firstleg chances, Nigeria coach Samson Siasia vowed that his team would attack a Congolese side guided by veteran French coach Claude Le Roy at Stade Municipal in Atlantic oil hub Pointe-Noire.

Keeping the promise, the 'Dream Team' spent much of the opening half on the

Mohammed, Daniel Etor and Oghenekaro Etebo threatening to score.

Even during a more balanced second half, Nigeria created the better chances and substitute Aminu Umar squandered a late chance to win the second leg.

Nigeria have been the most successful African football nation at the Olympics, winning the 1996 Atlanta tournament and finishing runners-up to Argentina in Beijing seven years ago.

Mali followed up a solitarygoal away victory over Gabon by winning the return match 2-0 at Stade Modibo Keita

in Bamako. The Gabonese had to score first to have a realistic chance of salvaging the tie, and they did after 68 minutes

Unfortunately for the visitors, the goal came at the wrong end of the pitch with Mboudou Karl putting the ball into his net.

Adama Traore added a second Mali goal a minute from time to earn his team an easier-than-expected passage to Senegal for the November 28-December 12 tournament.

Mali qualified once for the Olympics football tournament, topping a 2004 Athens group before losing to Italy in the quarter-finals.

New 1.5km record

I'M SHOCKED: KATIE

Katie Ledecky of the US admitted she was shocked after breaking her own 1,500m freestyle record in the heats of the world swimming championships in Kazan yesterday.

The 18-year-old, who also holds the 400m and 800m records, clocked 15min 27.71sec to better the 15:28.36 secs she swam at the Pan-Pacific Games in August last

"My coach told me to swim the first 900m easy, build over the next 300, then the final 300 was my choice and to be honest, it felt pretty easy," said Ledecky, who came within a second of her 400m record on

"I wasn't kicking much and I think breaking the world record is testament to the hard work I have put in and the shape I am in right now.

"I am pretty shocked that I was able to do that."

Ledecky only recently finished high school in Maryland, but this is the eighth

time the teenager has set a world record in her fledgling career.

It is the fourth time the defending champion has broken the 1,500m record alone having first achieved the feat in Barcelona two years ago on her way to winning the world title.

This is the second world record to fall in Kazan after Sweden's Sarah Sjostrom feat in the women's 100m butterfly heats on Sunday.

Sun eyes second gold

Also in yesterday's heats, Chinese medal-machine Sun Yang stayed on course to claim the second of the four golds he wants in Kazan after cruising into Monday night's 200m freestyle semi-finals as the fastest qualifier.

Sun defended his 400m freestyle title on Sunday, but faces some stiff competition over the shorter distance.

Britain's James Guy, who took silver behind Sun in the 400m final, was just 0.10sec behind Sun's time of 1min 46sec dead.

Germany's world record-holder Paul Biedermann and Australia's Cameron McEvov are also medal contenders for Tuesday's final at 0.39sec behind Sun's time.

Missy Franklin of the United States opened her individual campaign as the world and Olympic 100m backstroke champion was fifth fastest into yesterday's semifinals.

Hungary's 'Iron Lady', Katinka Hosszu, was the fastest through in a national record of 58.78sec but will sit out the evening's backstroke semis to defend her 200m individual medley world title. She finished second to Australia's Emily Seebohm in her heat having won gold to Seebohm's silver at the 2012 Olympics and Barcelona's worlds

After Australian medal hopes Mack Horton and Christian Sprenger bombed in their respective heats and the men's team failed to qualify for Sunday's 4x100m freestyle final, Mitchell Larkin was fastest through to the evening's 100m backstroke semi-finals.



Wins 100m gold

TY ENDS BRIT DROUGHT

dam Peaty won the men's Aloom breaststroke gold at the world swimming championships yesterday to become Britain's first world champion in the event for 40 years

The 20-year-old, who is making his worlds debut, swam 58.52 seconds with Olympic champion Cameron van der Burgh of South Africa taking silver at 0.07secs as he lost out to the Commonwealth champion on the wall.

Britain's Ross Murdoch took bronze at 0.57s back.

Peaty's gold was his country's first at a world championships since Liam Tancock won the 50m backstroke in Shanghai in 2011.

his Commonwealth Games victory in Glasgow last year, when he also beat Van der Burgh.

"I'm really happy with that and Cameron put up a good fight," said Peaty, who says he is already relishing the pair's clash at the Rio de Janeiro Olympic Games next

"I'm sure it's going to be another tough race in Rio.

"It wasn't the time I expected to do and it wasn't the time I wanted. but world championship finals and Olympic finals are only about the win and I brought it home tonight."

Peaty fought for the title, chasing Van der Burgh down hard in the dying stages to nick gold in the African to again settle for worlds silver having lost out to Australia's Christian Sprenger two years ago.

The new world champion admitted seeing Van der Burgh comfortably ahead at the turn had given him extra motivation.

"I turned and saw his (Van der Burgh's) feet and I was like 'right, I've got some catching up to do now'," said Peaty.

"Twenty-five metres out he was still in front, so I was a bit sceptical, but I remembered what I had trained for was moments like this and I came out on top thankfully.

"I was surprisingly relaxed going out there and it has been a help

(in the British trial).

"I was a bit slower going out, but that's what sport is all about, it could have gone either way.

"I'm glad I have people like Cam to push me on and push the sport forward."

This is the first time Britain has a world champion in the event since David Wilkie won both the 100 and 200m breaststroke titles at the 1975 championships in Cali, Colombia.
