# Oregon school shooter committed suicide

The 26-year-old gunman behind a mass shooting at a college in Oregon, US that left nine people dead committed suicide after a shootout with police, authorities said yesterday.

"The medical examiner has determined the cause of death of the shooter to be suicide," Douglas County Sheriff John Hanlin told reporters.

He said the shooter was enrolled in the class where the killings took place.

Hanlin said investigators were poring through numerous leads and had interviewed hundreds of people, including neighbors and family members of the shooter, to try to determine what set off the rampage.

He said 14 weapons belonging to the shooter had been recovered, including six at Umpqua Community College in Roseburg where the massacre took place.

# SHURA COUNCIL SLAMS IRAN THREAT

# Committee condemns Iranian interference

The Shura Council's Committee of Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security, in a statement, expressed its support to all measures taken by Bahrain to deter the Iranian interferences and threats, "which have gone beyond all international conventions regulating relations between countries."

The committee stressed on the importance of the Kingdom's latest decisions, including recalling the Ambassador to Iran Rashid Saad Al Dossari, and terming the Iranian embassy Charge D'Affaires Mohammed Redha Babai persona non grata.

The committee also hailed the submission of an official complaint by the Foreign Minister to UN Secretary General against Iran and its unacceptable interference in Bahrain's internal affairs. 'Iran's attempts to impose hegemony on the whole region will be doomed to failure, thanks to the awareness and determination of the GCC and the people's belief in the Arab identity of the region'

The committee pointed out that such steps would boost the Kingdom's security and safeguard the interests of all the people in Bahrain. The body observed that security was a priority after Iran's incessant threats by its leaders on many occasions, its continued exportation of terrorism and its extremist ideology to neighbouring countries.

The committee lauded the vigilance of the Interior Ministry here and its success in thwarting many terror plots in which Iran has emerged as the primary source of funds. It also slammed the Iranian policy inciting violence, terrorism and sectarianism, adding that the Iranian objectives are obvious and have nothing to do with the slogans of its leaders.

It also said that the Iranian statements bear threats to the GCC countries, pointing out the speech of Iran's Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces Ali Al Khamenei last week during a graduation ceremony of cadets in which he targeted

Saudi Arabia following the Hajj stampede.

The committee voiced its rejection of Khamenei's defamatory statements as they do not show any respect to the major role played by Saudi Arabia in serving the pilgrims and facilitating their rituals. It also added that the Iranian statements represented an explicit threat to sow sedition by disseminating fallacies.

The committee stressed that Saudi Arabia's security is part of Bahrain's security, adding that Iran's attempts will never succeed to shake regional stability.

"Iran's attempts to impose hegemony on the whole region will be doomed to failure, thanks to the great awareness and determination of the GCC people and their belief in the Arab identity of the region and the wisdom its leaders," read the statement.

# Road revamp plans unveiled

If Iran doesn't mend its ways and stop smuggling arms to Bahrain, it will result in a breakage of all kinds of relations between both the counties, stated MP and Head of Public Utilities and Environment Committee Jamal Dawood.

He was speaking to DT News following Bahrain's decision to recall its ambassador Rashid Saad Al Dossari from Iran and demand Iranian Charge d'affaires Mohammad Reza Babaei to leave Bahrain within 72 hours.

The decision came after Bahrain intercepted the biggest Iranian cache of arms and explosives in Nawaidrat since 2011.

"If this situation persists it means Iran does not want to review its foreign policy and is fully determined to interfere in the internal affairs of Bahrain and other regional countries. In that case, we are ready to end all kinds of relations with Iran," Dawood said. He said the problem



ystery looms over the Mystery rooms over latest mishap in a cafeteria at the Capital Governorate, after an explosion destroyed much of Baneen Sandwiches and Falafel shop on Friday.

The falafel shop in Bilad Al Qadeem was closed when the blast took place at around 3:30pm, a source told DT News.

No injuries were reported in the incident. However, items worth around BD4000 were destroyed in the explosion. Some of the vehicles parked near the shop were also affected.

The impact of the blast

cracked and shattered the windows of the neighbouring shops, as the explosion forced soft-drink coolers, food items and other goods to fly out onto the road facing the shop.

Noor, Mohammed

shopkeeper of the adjacent store, ran to the scene first. He told DT News he was sleeping inside his shop when the explosion took place. "It was so loud I thought it happened in my shop," he said.

# The shop kept its gas cylinders at the back of the building

The neighbour informed the shop's in-charge Ashraf, who arrived shortly at the scene. According to him, all three workers at the cafeteria were sleeping in their room, located in the same residential block, when the incident took place.

"I informed the owner and the authorities," said Ashraf.

"Initial investigations showed

that it was caused by a gas leak, but this idea is hard to believe," he weighed in.

"There were no signs of flames or smoke," continued the person in charge of the shop, "...and we keep the gas cylinders at the back of the building - some 20 meters away - not inside the shop."

"Everything at the entrance was destroyed, while the back of the restaurant was slightly damaged," Ashraf added.

The husband and father of a 6-year-old was already suffering from diabetes and heart diseases when he was diagnosed with Gangrene, a condition where tissues die due to insufficient blood supply. The condition has paralysed one of his legs

seeking help from several officials through social media, told *DT News*, "My husband is currently bedridden and there is no one else but me to nurse him. The physical strain that I take to carry him around has now given me spinal disc problems. This is apart from my own diabetes and hypertension."

She said their financial situation is going from bad to worse. "We are under heavy debts. We have not paid the rent of our house for six months and have defaulted the three years' electricity bills," she lamented.

Adding to this is the expense of their son, who has just started his first year of school.

The wife confirmed that she recently booked an appointment with a doctor in Salmaniya Medical Complex and is waiting to see what treatment he needs.

"The doctors have said his heart is too fragile to undergo a surgery. I have no idea what lies ahead for me," she said.

# 7 main causes of fluctuations in exchange rates

Main causes of fluctuations in exchange rates of international payments are: 1. Trade Movements 2. Capital Movements 3. Stock Exchange Operations 4. Speculative Transactions 5. Banking Operations 6. Monetary Policy 7. Political Conditions!

The various theories of exchange rate determination, as we have seen, seek to explain only the equilibrium or normal long period exchange rates.

Market rates (or day-to-day rates) of exchange are, however, subject to fluctuations in response to the supply of and demand for international money transfers.

In fact, there are various factors which affect or influence the demand for and supply of foreign currency (or mutual demand for each other's currencies) which are ultimately responsible for the short-term fluctuations in the exchange rate.

Important among these are:

# 1. TRADE MOVEMENTS:

Any change in imports or exports will certainly cause a change in the rate of exchange. If imports exceed



demand for foreign currency rises; hence the rate of exchange moves against the country. Conversely, if exports exceed imports, the demand for domestic currency rises and the rate of exchange moves in favour of the country.

# 2. CAPITAL MOVEMENTS:

International capital movements from one country for short periods to avail of the high rate of interest prevailing abroad or for long periods for the purpose of making long-term investment abroad. Any export or import of capital from one country to another will bring about a change in the rate of exchange.

# 3. STOCK EXCHANGE OPERATIONS:

These include granting of loans, payment of interest on foreign loans, repatriation of foreign capital, purchase and sale of foreign securities etc., which influence demand for foreign funds and through it the exchange rates.

For instance, when a loan is given by the home country to a foreign nation, the demand for foreign money increases and the rate of exchange tends to move unfavourably for the home country. But, when foreigners repay their loan, the demand for home currency exceeds its supply and the rate of exchange becomes favourable.

# 4. SPECULATIVE TRANSACTIONS:

These include transactions ranging from anticipation of seasonal movements in exchange rates to the extreme one, viz., flight of capital. In periods of political uncertainty, there is heavy speculation in foreign money. There is a

scramble for purchasing certain currencies and some currencies are unloaded. Thus, speculative activities bring about wide fluctuations in exchange rates.

# 5. BANKING OPERATIONS:

Banks are the major dealers in foreign exchange. They sell drafts, transfer funds, issue letters of credit, accept foreign bills of exchange, take up arbitrage, etc. These operations influence the demand for and supply of foreign exchange, and hence the exchange rates.

# **6. MONETARY POLICY:**

An expansionist monetary policy has generally an inflationary impact, while a constructionist

policy tends to have a deflationary inflation. Inflation and deflation bring about a change in the internal value of money. This reflects in a similar change in the external value of money. Inflation means a rise in the domestic price level, fall in the internal purchasing power of money, and hence a fall in the exchange rate.

# 7. POLITICAL CONDITIONS:

Political stability of a country can help very much to maintain a high exchange rate for its currency; for it attracts foreign capital which causes the foreign exchange rate to move in its favour. Political instability, on the other hand, causes a panic flight of capital from the country hence the home currency depreciates in the eyes of foreigners and consequently, its exchange value falls.

# AMCHAM IS COMMITTED TO SUPPORTING SMES

he American Chamber of L Commerce Bahrain has recently hosted a business networking luncheon at the Ritz Carlton attended by Zayed Al Zayani, Minister of Industry, Commerce and Toursim. US Ambassador William Roebuck was in attendance as well as a room full of leading businessmen and businesswomen representing some of the over 200 US businesses in Bahrain as well as the many Bahraini companies with US business interests.

The Minister stated that the US-Bahrain Free Trade Agreement, now in its 9th year, has been a success. In 2014, US-Bahrain bilateral trade was over US\$2 billion, a 22% increase over 2013. In 2014, US exports to Bahrain were reported at US\$1.06bn, up from US\$350.8m

in 2005 the year before the FTA went into effect, and exports from Bahrain to the US were up to \$965m from \$431.6m in 2005.

However, the Minister also noted that the FTA could be utilized more and that an Export Assistance Center would be created to help companies in Bahrain increase their export markets to the US as well as to the region and beyond.

The Minister cited the garment & textile industry as an example of FTA's success – growing from small low quality productions before the FTA to now state-of-the-art factories manufacturing top quality garments and textiles for leading brands in the US, representing 24% - the second largest category - of exports from Bahrain to the US, employing 8000 people in good clean well paying jobs – 1000 of these jobs employ Bahrainis, mostly women. He also spoke about his trips to Washington DC and his ongoing efforts to extend the TPL provision in the FTA allowing this industry to be able to continue to export duty free. Without an extension the TPL provision is due to expire in July

Mr. Zu'bi commented, "AmCham has been working closely with the garment industry and the Ministry on the TPL extension. It is challenging but we are optimistic that a positive arrangement can be found. AmCham is committed to supporting SMEs and helping grow bilateral trade between the US and Bahrain and we look forward to continuing a fruitful collaboration with the MOIC."

# SEI report: Regional CFO's and HR | DUBAI HOLDING RECORDS heads expecting strong growth

Eighty percent of companies expect to see an increase in headcount over the next three years despite mounting macroeconomic and operational challenges, according to SEI's (NASDAQ: SEIC) third annual End of Service Benefits (EoSB) report, released yesterday. The report revealed that 53% of respondents expect Expo 2020 to impact them positively, as opposed to 45% in last year's poll – while 63% of respondents claim that they have felt no negative impact as a result of the change in oil prices. Only 5% of companies surveyed expect major restructuring as a direct result of changes in oil prices.

As per the survey findings, finance executives, under continuous pressure to maintain profitability, cited operational costs as a key challenge and cost reduction as a top priority for the year. Coupled with the expected increase in headcount and salaries, and in turn liabilities, this helps to explain why Financial Executives and Chief Financial Officers are now taking a more active role in HR decisions. For instance, 63% of finance executives now believe talent management is one of their functions' strategic goals.

The report findings go on to show that employees are now beginning to stay longer and as a result, accumulating a

greater share of End of Service Benefits. But despite the pressure to maintain profits and control risk, companies may still not be managing their EoSB liabilities efficiently. 73% of respondents either do not separate EoSB funds from their working capital or don't know how their EoSB liabilities are being managed. In fact, only 13% have set up enhanced EoSB plans, even though companies that have these in place seem to enjoy better attrition rates than those that do not. However, given the increasing alignment between finance and HR functions, the potential talent retention benefits of enhanced EoSB schemes were

not lost on the respondents: 36% stated that they would be interested in a cost effective EoSB or Savings scheme, or both, while 40% would consider outsourcing investment management services of their entire EoSB

Commenting on the results of the survey, Samer Abdel Kader, Head of SEI Investments (Middle East), said:

"In an employment environment that has remained competitive despite increasing challenges across the region, End of Service Benefit plans have proven to be a valuable mechanism in not only retaining, but also attracting key talent. While they remain underutilized, we're beginning to notice a change in perception, as employers- under pressure to control costs- begin to recognise their unique ability to reduce their financial risk while providing a potentially lowercost alternative to traditional methods of retaining staff."

The survey, conducted in May and June 2015, was completed by 110 C-level executives, Finance heads and HR department heads across a variety of sectors within the GCC. 

# Marvel, ABC join hands for 'Damage Control'





# KUWAIT TO INTRODUCE TAXES IN 2016: MINISTRY

A mid plunging oil prices and growing deficit fears, Kuwait yesterday announced plans to gradually roll out a tax collection system, starting next year.

The move follows Kuwait's decision to stop diesel, kerosene and aviation fuel subsidies earlier this year. Oil Minister Ali al Omair told parliament three weeks ago that ending subsidies on diesel would save around \$1 billion a year.

The new tax system, currently in its planning phase, is being developed in collaboration with International Monetary Fund (IMF).

"The IMF will prepare a preliminary report on how to impose taxes on companies in Kuwait," Commerce and Industry Minister Abdulmohsen Al Mudej said after a meeting with IMF representatives, the official

KUNA news agency reported.

The two sides discussed ways of introducing corporate taxes for Kuwaiti and foreign

taxes for Kuwaiti and foreign companies operating in the oilrich Gulf state after the recent introduction of a new corporate law, the minister said.

Kuwait currently imposes no taxes on local companies, Kuwaiti citizens and expatriates, but it requires foreign firms to pay 15 per cent tax on their profits.

Kuwait's finance ministry said in a statement that it is planning to introduce a modern taxation system for Kuwait, which includes the development of an organisational structure and training for staff members.

An awareness campaign will

also be rolled out as part of the move to educate people about the new system, the report said.

The IMF has in the past advised Kuwait to subject local companies to corporate tax as part of a series of measures aimed at boosting non-oil revenues and cutting spending.

Kuwait has posted a budget surplus in each of the past 15 fiscal years due to high oil prices but has also increased public spending from under \$13 billion (12.4bn euros) to more than \$77bn this fiscal year, mostly on wages and subsidies. Earlier this year, the emirate stopped diesel, kerosene and aviation fuel subsidies and the finance ministry is considering similar measures for petrol, electricity and water.

Oil income contributes around 94 per cent of Kuwait's public revenues but the sharp drop in prices is expected to substantially reduce its income. Kuwait's revenues in the first

10 months of the current fiscal year dropped 16pc to \$74.5bn compared to \$88.8bn last year, according to finance ministry figures. In the same period, oil income dived 17.3pc to \$68.3bn from \$82.5bn.

The state is however forecast to end this fiscal year with a surplus-albeit smaller than usual-for the 16th year in a row. The government has announced the 2015/2016 budget with a \$24bn deficit despite slashing spending by 17.8pc to \$65.1bn.

The oil-rich state currently spends about \$18bn annually on subsidies, with the cost of subsidies between 2005 and 2013 increasing more than fourfold, or about 23pc a year, the Finance Ministry said. There are about 1.25 million Kuwaitis in the country, in addition to 2.9m foreigners. It pumps about 2.8m barrels of oil per day. (AFP, arabianbusiness.

# Argentina to pay back \$6 billion in debt

**Buenos Aires** 

Argentina will repay \$5.9 billion of its debt on Monday in keeping with its repayment schedule, the country's economy minister said Friday.

"We will follow this deadline as we have done for years. It is the largest payment in one instalment in a decade," Economy Minister Axel Kicillof said.

The payment will be made by drawing on the country's foreign exchange reserves, which showed a balance of \$32.5 billion Friday.

"We will pay, all in good time, and Argentina will continue on the path of debt reduction."

A longstanding dispute over the debt with US hedge funds remains, however.

Since its economic collapse in 2001, Argentina, the third-largest Latin American economy, has renegotiated its debt with 93 per cent of its creditors, but a handful of US-based hedge funds have held out for full repayment and refused debt restructuring.

# Amazon pulling Chromecast, Apple TV from shelves

San Francisco

Amazon on Friday said it will stop selling Apple TV and Google Chromecast devices that compete with the online retail titan's own mediastreaming hardware.

The reason given for the move was an intent to focus on devices that play well with Amazon Prime video service, which the Seattle-based company has been ramping up with original shows and content partnerships.

"Over the last three years, Prime Video has become an important part of (Amazon subscription service) Prime," an Amazon spokesperson said in an email response to an inquiry.

Amazon will continue to sell Roku and the company's own Fire TV devices, along with Xbox and PlayStation consoles made by Microsoft and Sony respectively, according to the spokesperson, who referred to the selection as "excellent choices."

Chromecast and Apple TV are to be pulled from Amazon's virtual shelves as well as those of third-party shops at the end of this month, according to exchanges by resellers in online forums. The news came shortly after Google and Apple unveiled improved versions of their devices for channelling digital movies, television shows, and more from the Internet to television screens.

# BoJ to cut forecast for growth

The Bank of Japan (BoJ) will this month cut its forecast for both economic growth and inflation amid a slowdown in the global economy and cheaper commodities, a leading newspaper said yesterday.

The central bank will unveil the downward revisions in its biannual outlook for economic activity and prices report due out October 30, the Nikkei business daily said.

BoJ policymakers will downgrade the forecast for economic growth to around One per cent from 1.7pc for the current fiscal year to March 2016, the daily said. It added that the following fiscal year's growth estimate would also be lowered from 1.5pc, but did not give details.

The Nihon Keizai Shimbun -- or Nikkei daily, which recently bought the Financial

Times for \$1.3 billion -- has a track record of financial scoops and is considered a must-read for executives.

With China and other emerging markets slowing, the global economy is seen expanding by only about three pc this year, with little hope of a quick improvement in 2016, it said. Japanese business investment, consumer spending and other economic activity is holding up well in the Bank's view, but it forecasts that domestic growth may fall somewhat short of expectations, it added.

The central bank is also expected to trim its consumer price growth forecast, from its earlier estimate of 0.7pc to less than 0.5pc for the current fiscal year in the wake of a

slump in crude oil prices, the daily said. The Nikkei did not publish what the specific new forecast.

BoJ policymakers will consider pushing back the bank's expected timeframe for achieving its 2.0 inflation target, now described as around the first half of fiscal 2016 starting in April next year, according to Nikkei.

Central bank chief Haruhiko Kuroda remains upbeat on reaching the promised 2.0pc inflation -- a cornerstone of Japan's attempt to conquer years of deflation and revive the long-sluggish economy.

But Japanese consumer prices fell 0.1pc in August year-on-year, the first decline in over two years, official data showed late September, fuelling speculation that the central bank may unleash a fresh round of stimulus measures.

# Volkswagen suspends sale of some vehicles in Australia

Sydney

Embattled auto giant Volkswagen yesterday suspended the sale of some diesel-powered cars in Australia as the fallout from its emissions-cheating software expanded.

Volkswagen Group Australia (VGA) said it met with government authorities on Friday "to advise them of its strategy in Australia" to address concerns raised around the world about the technology.

"In its first step, effective immediately VGA has temporarily suspended the sale of affected vehicles fitted

The company suspended sale of vehicles fitted with 1.6 or 2.0 litre **EA189** diesel engines

with 1.6 or 2.0-litre EA189 diesel engines," it said in a statement.

"The suspension will

remain until the emission issues are addressed in those vehicles," it added, without naming the models

of the vehicles affected. The Australian development comes a week after Canberra said it would ensure that any vehicles with the so-called defeat devices could not be supplied in the country as it sought urgent clarification on how many vehicles here were involved in the

growing scandal. Estimates by Fairfax Media newspapers have suggested that more than 40,000 vehicles made by Volkswagen and Volkswagen's top-of-therange Audi subsidiary could be fitted with the diesel engines that contain the

# HACK MAY HAVE HIT 4.6M CLIENTS

Scottrade said Friday it was notifying some 4.6 million customers about a hack into its database which could have leaked private information.

Scottrade said in statement it was notified of the incident by US federal officials who "recently informed us that they've been investigating cybersecurity crimes involving the theft of information from Scottrade and other financial services companies."

"Although Social Security numbers, email addresses and other sensitive data were contained in the system accessed, it appears that contact information was the focus of the incident," the statement said.

"We have no reason to believe that Scottrade's trading platforms or any client funds were compromised. Client passwords remained fully encrypted at all times and we have not seen any indication of fraudulent activity as a result of this incident.

Scottrade said it was working with "a leading computer security firm" to assess the impact of the breach and strengthen its network.

It said it was notifying customers of the hack "as a precaution.'

The news comes one day after T-Mobile said 15 million customer records may be been leaked in an attack on credit monitoring bureau Experian, and follows a series of other high-profile incidents involving corporate and government databases.

# **Drone market to hit \$10 billion**

London

The market for military drones is expected to almost double by 2024 to beyond \$10 billion (8.9bn euros), according to a report published Friday by specialist defence publication IHS Jane's Intelligence Review.
"The global defence and

security market for Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) will expand at 5.5 per cent per year over this decade, from the current figure of \$6.4bn," according to the analysis.

"Unmanned systems are here to stay," said Derrick Maple, principal analyst on unmanned systems for the London-based group.

future operations across the globe.

Israel was the top exporter of UAVs last year, but is set to be overtaken by the United States through sales of General Atomics Predator series and Northrop Grumman Global Hawk, said the report.

Western Europe is forecast to reach \$1.3bn in sales by 2024 as it seeks to reduce its reliance on US and Israeli imports, it added.

However, it also faces competition from China, Russia, India, South Korea and Japan -- whose combined sales are predicted to reach \$3.4bn by 2024.

# **BOMB HITS KUNDUZ HOSPITAL**

A suspected US air strike on a hospital killed 16 people vesterday in the Afghan city of Kunduz, medical charity MSF said, a bombardment that the UN condemned as "inexcusable, and possibly even criminal".

Dozens more were seriously wounded at the facility, a key lifeline that has been running "beyond capacity" during fighting that saw the Taliban seize control of the northern provincial capital for several

The strike left the building engulfed in flames, with photos posted by Doctors Without Borders showing their staff shocked and dazed.

"At 2:10am (2040 GMT) local time... the MSF trauma centre in Kunduz was hit several times during sustained bombing and was very badly damaged," the organisation, known by its French initials, said.

MSF spokeswoman Kate Stegeman said 16 people were killed in the bombardment, among them three children, charity said the bombing continued for more than 30 minutes after American and Afghan military officials were

The International Committee of the Red Cross said the strike was "an appalling tragedy". "Such attacks against health workers and facilities undermine the capacity of humanitarian organisations to assist the Afghan people at a time when they most urgently need it."

He said Russia had managed to destroy IS command posts, warehouses storing ammunition and explosives, communication hubs, training camps as well as "mini-factories that made weapons for suicide bombers".

# Saudi national with suspected MERS dies in PH

A Saudi national suspected of carrying the MERS virus has died while visiting the Philippines, the health department announced yesterday.

The patient, who had a cough, fever and occasional chills, died in an undisclosed hospital last Tuesday after a two-day confinement, Health Secretary Janette Garin said in a statement.

The patient's X-ray results also "suggested" MERS infection, Garin said, without providing additional details.

n original menu from Athe last first-class lunch served aboard the ill-fated Titanic has sold for \$88,000 to a private collector at an online auction.

The luncheon menu had been saved by a first-class passenger, Abraham Lincoln Salomon, one of only a handful of people who climbed aboard a lifeboat called the "Money Boat" or "Millionaires' Boat" when the main ship started sinking into the icy waters

of the Atlantic. The lifeboat gained its moniker because the wealthy passengers it saved purportedly bribed the crew to row away from the disaster rather than rescue more people.

Signed on the back in pencil by another first-class passenger, Isaac Gerald Frauenthal, the menu provides a fascinating insight into both the opulence on board the ship and food fashions of the

# 'IS' KILLS JAPANESE MAN IN B'DESH

Dhaka

The Islamic State group claimed responsibility for shooting dead a Japanese citizen in northern Bangladesh yesterday, days after they said they were behind the murder of an Italian aid worker in Dhaka.

Police said the latest victim, whom they named as Hoshi Kunio, aged 66, was riding in a rickshaw when he was shot dead in Kaunia town in Rangpur district at about 10:30 am local time (0430 GMT).

"He was travelling to the town from Rangpur city, where

he had been living for a while, on a cycle rickshaw when his vehicle was stopped by three men riding on a motorcycle," deputy police chief of Rangpur, Saifur Rahman, said.

The IS jihadist group later claimed the killing on *Twitter*, according to the SITE Intelligence Group, a US monitoring organisation.

The shooting came less than a week after a 50-year-old Italian citizen, Cesare Tavella, was shot dead near the capital's diplomatic zone, an attack that was also claimed by IS.

The Bangladesh government had sought to calm security fears in the country after the first murder on Monday, describing it as an "isolated incident".

Yesterday, in the wake of the second killing, the government tried to allay mounting concerns over the safety of foreign nationals in the country, saying it was taking both murders "very seriously".

"The aim of the murder of innocent people in this way is to make an attempt to create instability in the country," Home Minister Asaduzzaman Kamal said.

Kunio was a frequent visitor to Bangladesh and worked on a farming project in Rangpur, about 300 kilometres (180 miles) north of Dhaka, police

"Two of the assailants shot him twice in the chest with pistols while the other waited with the motorbike ready to flee," local police chief Rezaul Karim said, adding four people had been interrogated over the murder but none had been arrested.

# Germany marks 25 years of unity

Germany yesterday Celebrated 25 years since its joyful reunification, with its leaders urging the nation to muster the same strength and solidarity to face a record refugee influx.

The silver anniversary of the day communist East Germany and the capitalist West reunited as one country comes with Europe's top economy standing at a crossroads.

Chancellor Angela Merkel and President Joachim Gauck, both of whom grew up under communism, attended ceremonies in the business capital Frankfurt with the resonant slogan "Overcoming Borders".

In the keynote speech, Gauck focused on the refugee crisis and called on Germans to recapture the same cando spirit that gripped the country in the heady months between the fall of the Berlin Wall and the remarriage of east and west.

"Today we celebrate the courage and self-confidence of that time. Let us use this memory as a bridge," said Gauck, who was a dissident pastor in East Germany.

# Vatican acts after Polish priest reveals homosexuality

Vatican City

The Vatican reacted furiously yesterday after a priest employed as a senior official publicly declared his homosexuality on the eve of a synod of bishops that is due to touch on the divisive issue of the Church's relationship to gay believers.

In a statement, a spokesman for Pope Francis said Polish priest Krysztof Charamsa's action had been "very serious and irresponsible", and that he would be automatically kicked out of his post as a theologian in the Vatican.

Flanked by his Catalan boyfriend and sporting his priest's collar, Charamsa told a news conference in Rome he had been compelled to speak out against the hypocrisy and paranoia that he says shapes the Church's attitude to sexual minorities.

While appearing resigned to

the fact that his life as a priest is over, he said: "I'm out of the closet and I'm very happy about that."

Visibly moved at times, but always smiling, the 43-year-old added in Italian: "I want to be an advocate for all sexual minorities and their families who have suffered in silence."

In an indication that Charamsa had planned the move for some time, he presented a 10-point

"liberation manifesto" against "institutionalised homophobia in the Church", which he said particularly oppressed the gay men who, according to him, make up the majority of priests.

He also revealed plans for a book about his 12 years at the heart of a Vatican bureaucracy only just recovering from a scandal under previous pope Benedict XVI over the influence of a "gay lobby" among senior clergy. "I dedicate my coming out to all gay priests," Charamsa said. "I wish them happiness even if I know that most of them will not have the courage to make the gesture I have made today."

"To my Church, I want to say that I reject and I denounce the current atmosphere of exasperating homophobia. Open your eyes to the suffering of gay people, to their desire for love."

# **HUNDREDS MISSING IN GUATEMALA LANDSLIDE**

Santa Catarina Pinula

At least 32 people were dead and several hundred missing after a landslide smashed through a village on the outskirts of the Guatemalan capital, officials said.

More than 500 rescue workers, police and soldiers, as well as desperate residents, clawed away at the debris with picks and shovels, searching for survivors all day and into the late evening, before suspending the painstaking hunt for the night.

Families reported receiving text messages from people they believed to still be trapped, more than 24 hours after the landslide struck the village of El Cambray II, in the municipality of Santa Catarina Pinula. Authorities said that

Their estimate is based on the 125 homes that Thursday's landslide destroyed or damaged after heavy rain.

The affected area is about 15 kilometers (10 miles) east of the capital Guatemala City.

Thirty-four people were pulled out alive from the mud and rubble, while 25 others were injured, CONRAD officials said.

Families have reported receiving text messages from people they believed to still be trapped.

Among the 32 dead are at least three children.

The impact of the heavy rain was exacerbated by a nearby river, officials said.

# Army veteran hailed as hero

Roseburg

An army veteran was hailed a hero for charging the gunman during a mass shooting at a college in Oregon, before being shot despite pleading that it was his son's birthday.

Chris Mintz, 30, who was studying to become a fitness trainer at Umpqua Community College in Roseburg, sprung into action Thursday when the shooting began, urging people to flee and running toward the building where the killings were taking place, his family and witnesses said.

Mintz tried to prevent the gunman - widely identified

as Chris Harper Mercer, 26 from entering a classroom by throwing his weight against

the door. But the gunman managed to blast his way in and shot Mintz seven times, ignoring pleas that it was his son Tirek's sixth birthday.

"He told him, 'please don't do this, it's my son's birthday today'," Mintz's cousin Ariana Earnhardt told CNN.

The family said that Mintz was shot in the back, abdomen and left hand and suffered two broken legs.

"He's going to have to learn to walk again," Earnhardt said. "But he walked away with his life, and that's more than so many other people did."

A GoFundMe campaign set up by the family to help with Mintz's rehabilitation had raised more than \$450,000 by late Friday.

# 24 killed in Baghdad suicide attack claimed by IS

### **Baghdad**

Blasts killed at least 24 people in one of Baghdad's main Shia neighbourhoods yesterday when suicide bombers tried to breach a checkpoint in an attack claimed by the Islamic State group. "Three suicide bombers tried to cross the checkpoint at Adan Square" in the Kadhimiyah neighbourhood, said Baghdad Operations Command spokesman Saad Maan. Saad Maan said security forces at the checkpoint engaged the attackers and shot dead one of them, while the other two blew themselves up.

# Cairo Univ bans teachers from wearing face veil



The ban is already receiving mixed reviews from students

he recent decision to ban all female staff from wearing the full face veil aims to put an end to student complaints of "poor communication" in class, the head of Egypt's Cairo University said.

Although the head-to-toe covering known locally as the niqab is "not a phenomenon" among his teachers, Gaber Nassar told The Associated Press that he wants to "cure the disease" before it becomes one.

Islamic clerics and students have denounced the move as discriminatory, but Nassar said he has the backing of

the Grand Mufti, Egypt's top religious authority.

The niqab, Nassar said, is especially problematic in language courses, where the cloth barrier of the veil hinders student-teacher communications — producing low grades and graduates incapable of enunciation.

The vast majority of Egyptian Muslim women wear a form of veil that covers the hair, but leaves the face uncovered. However the number of women wearing the full niqab veil has increased dramatically in the past 10-20 years.

In 2009, Cairo University

had banned both students and staff from wearing the niqab on campus or in the university's dorms. The ban was later overturned by a Cairo court following a lawsuit filed by a professor.


"That was unconstitutional because it said all of the university, we are saying now only the lecture halls," Nassar said, daring anyone to challenge his decree in court.

"We are not banning the niqab, we are just regulating it."

The ban is already receiving mixed reviews from students.

"This is part of the greater war on Islamists," said a student.

# VENUS BAGS 47TH TITLE

Venus Williams won her biggest title in five years at the Wuhan Open yesterday after Garbine Muguruza retired, making her the fifth player to pull out mid-match in the late-season tournament.

Williams took the first set and was three games up in the second when the Spaniard stopped play at 53 minutes, handing the American veteran the 47th title win of her career, and her first victory at a WTA Premier Five event since she beat Victoria Azarenka in 2010 in Dubai.

Wimbledon Muguruza -- ranked world number eight, 16 places ahead of American veteran Williams -- had a tough semi-final against Germany's Angelique Kerber, winning in straight sets but falling during the closing tie break and injuring her ankle. But the 21-year-old said it was exhaustion not injury that made her pull out.

"It's a sad day I had to retire. Sometimes your body's not recovered," the 21-year-old said on court after the match.

Muguruza called her coach



Sam Sumyk -who was wearing a t-shirt bearing the phrase "It's not my fault" -- on court during the first set but no words of advice could change the slow pace of the match.

"I had my chances. But I knew with Venus, it's hard with her serve, with her shots, if you're not 100 per cent," the . Spaniard said.

Williams, who turned pro the year that Muguruza was born, was also struggling during the final with leg pain and had both of her thighs wrapped. But she said that experience gained during her

more than two-decade long career allowed her to put the injury out of her mind.

"By the time I'm on the court, I've blocked it (pain) out if I've decided I'm going to play. At that point I'm in the match and not anywhere else,' Williams said.

# **Walking wounded**

Williams had a gruelling semi-final the day before against her sister Serena's nemesis Roberta Vinci -- who beat Serena in the US Open semi-final, denying her a chance at the first calendar Grand Slam since 1988.

The title winner conceded that she would have had a tough match against Muguruza if her young opponent had been on form.

"I probably wouldn't have had many chances if you (Muguruza) had been feeling well," Williams said in an on court interview.

The 2006 women's final at the Australian Open was also won on a retirement, with German Justine Henin-Hardenne handing France's Amelie Mauresmo her first Grand Slam victory when she pulled out in the second set.

Novak Djokovic took his third consecutive title at last year's ATP World Tour Finals when Roger Federer withdrew hours before the match blaming his decision on pain and his age. (AFP)

# Bale, Ramos fit to return

# Nick Kyrgios out, Ferrer and Lopez in final showdown

op seeds David Ferrer and Feliciano Lopez set up an all-Spanish affair in the final while volatile Australian Nick Kyrgios fell short of reaching his second professional final at the Malaysian Open yesterday.

Ferrer recovered from a set down to overcome Benjamin Becker from Germany 3-6, 6-2, 6-4 in a 125-minute battle.

"I needed to be more aggressive on the forehand and that worked for me in the second and third game," the world number eight told reporters.

"I have only played once before this tournament, but my fitness was good today and I hope to keep this consistency on Sunday." Second seed Feliciano Lopez booked a berth in the final by defeating Kyrgios 7-6 (7/2), 7-6 (7/5).

The match was close and could have gone either way, but I'm proud of the way I played. I needed to be aggressive and was happy that my volleys and serves worked out well," said the 34-year-old Lopez.

Lopez also dismissed any talks of retirement.

"People have been asking me, when will you quit? I tell them I am not done yet, I take it one year at a time. As long as I stay healthy and can challenge the best in the world, I don't have a specific plan," he said.

Despite his defeat, Kyrgios is nonetheless eyeing a higher ranking as he seeks to put this season's controversies behind.

The Australian, whose temper and crude on-court comments have earned him a "bad boy" image, kept his emotions in check in Malavsia.

The seventh seed hammered 13 aces but struggled with Lopez's deft dropshots and volleys.

"I was looking good today, but he came up with some ridiculous volleys today and you have to appreciate something like that," said Kyrgios, who applauded some of the Spaniard's return winners on court.

"It was a great game of tennis and he did enough to come away with the win.

Kyrgios made the quarterfinals at Wimbledon and the Australian Open this year, but his play has been overshadowed by his



alented Danish 25-year-Talented Danish 20 , and old Thorbjorn Olesen edged closer towards a third European Tour victory after a third round of seven-under 65 yesterday left him three shots clear at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

The diminutive right-hander,

who hails from Fureso, some 20km outside Copenhagen, shook off a bogey at the parfour opening hole at St Andrews before reeling off eight birdies in a third straight round in the 60s.

# SPRINGBOKS BEAT THE SCOTS

### Newcastle

Handre Pollard kept South Africa's World Cup revival on track landing 19 points with the boot in a 34-16 victory over Scotland yesterday.

The win took South Africa a point ahead of the Scots in Pool B as they took a new step back from the brink after their devastating loss to Japan in their first match.

Schalk Burger, JP Pietersen and Bryan Habana scored tries to bring the match alive in front of more than 50,000 people at Newcastle. But Pollard's deadly accuracy secured the key points.

Scotland staged an heroic comeback in the second half after trailing 20-3 at the break and twice hauled themselves to within seven points against the Springboks.

But each time Pollard denied them the chance for what could have been be a crucial losing bonus point, landing a drop goal the first time and a

50-metre penalty the second time.

It was the first defeat in the tournament for the Scots and for South Africa it made their pathway from Pool B to the play-offs more clear even though they did not get a bonus point.

They just need a win over the

United States to go through. "Hats off to South Africa," said Scotland's sporting coach Vern Cotter after the defeat. "They played very well."

Scotland must beat Samoa next week to go into the quarter finals and Cotter was happy to get seven days to prepare.

"There are a few things to sort out," he said.

But South Africa's opening loss to Japan has been put behind them as they improved to two wins from three games, the same as Scotland. Japan beat Samoa 26-5 earlier to stay in the Pool B qualifying race.

Scrum-half Fourie du Preez, stepping up to captain South Africa after the inspirational Jean de Villiers suffered a career ending broken jaw against Samoa, directed play with surety.

# **Scots muscled out**

He used South Africa's pack led by man-of-the-match Lodewyk de Jager to out-muscle the Scots, dominating scrums and mauls, while raking kicks from fly-half Pollard were used to turn Scotland wings Tommy Seymour and Tim Visser.

Wearing their white away strip, the Springboks announced their forward dominance from the start as they set up camp deep in Scotland territory.

Even after being driven back to their own 22 by a couple of quick penalties, a tighthead allowed them to ram their way back up field with a try awarded to Schalk Burger after a mass drive over the line.

The signs were ominous for Scotland that they were well out muscled up front.

A forward drive that marched the Scots back nearly 15 metres eventually produced a penalty which Pollard duly slotted from in front of the posts.

Facing an early 10-0 deficit, Scotland tried to up the pace of the game to upset the Springboks rhythm but for every metre they gained by running the ball they lost many more as South targeted the Scots wings with deep kicks.

# Goromaru's boots fire Japan over Samoa

Ayumu Goromaru scored 16 points to keep Japan in the race for a historic appearance in the Rugby World Cup quarterfinals as they beat Samoa 26-5 yesterday.

The 29-year-old, who starred in the epic win over South Africa two weeks ago, became the leading tournament points scorer with 45.

The Japanese also scored two tries, a penalty try and one from wing Akihito Yamada. Samoa paid for their lack of discipline losing three players to the sin bin in the game.

The win at Milton Keynes takes the Japanese -- who before this World Cup had won just one match and that back in 1991 -- onto eight points ahead of their final game with United States next weekend.

Table-toppers Scotland -who have 10 points from two matches -- face the Springboks, who have seven points, later on Saturday.

Goromaru looked to have given Japan a dream start as he went over in the left hand corner but linesman Wayne Barnes signalled for a forward pass leaving coach Eddie Jones fuming.

South Africa referee Craig Joubert, who had been playing an advantage anyway, awarded the Japanese a penalty instead and Goromaru shrugged off the disappointment to slot over the penalty.

Samoa were reduced to 14 men for 10 minutes when No8 Failfili Levave was sin-binned for making no attempt to tackle hooker Shota Horie simply bending his shoulder into the Japanese player and sending him flying.

Joubert read the riot act to Samoan captain Ofisa Treviranus about conceding penalties and the South African wielded another yellow card when prop Sakaria Taulafo took out a Japanese player in the air -- leaving the Samoans with just 13 men on the pitch.

The Pacific islanders defended stoically as the Japanese pounded away at them. The Asian champions eventually came away with a penalty try which Goromaru converted for 10-0 after 24 minutes.

# **Battered All Blacks in QFinals**

Starting their top available side against a Georgia team resting many of their best players, the All Blacks were expected to win comfortably. But they were only 22-10 up at half-time before adding three tries in the second half.

They were rattled by a Georgia team that used bone-jarring tackles and their powerful forward pack to shake the All Blacks.


