





BAHRAIN READY TO CUT TIES WITH UNHEEDING IRAN: MP

MP Jamal Dawood said breakage of complete relations with Iran in the offing

If Iran doesn't mend its ways Land stop smuggling arms to Bahrain, it will result in a breakage of all kinds of relations between both the counties, stated MP and Head of Public Utilities and Environment Committee Jamal Dawood.

He was speaking to DT News following Bahrain's decision to recall its ambassador Rashid Saad Al Dossari from Iran and demand Iranian Charge

d'affaires Mohammad Reza Babaei to leave Bahrain within 72 hours.

The decision came after Bahrain intercepted the biggest Iranian cache of arms and explosives in Nawaidrat since 2011.

"If this situation persists it means Iran does not want to review its foreign policy and is fully determined to interfere in the internal affairs of Bahrain and other regional countries. In that case, we are ready to end all kinds of relations with Iran," Dawood said. He said the problem

He stated Iran's intentions are not going to happen as Bahrainis have already rejected all sorts of external interference in their country's internal affairs. Responding to a question whether some insider is helping Iran in importing arms in the

Kingdom, he rubbished the idea and said, "Since Bahrain is an island surrounded by sea, it gives Iran an easy access to infiltrate. We need to guard all the sea borders extremely carefully."

Responding to whether registering a complaint against Iran will have any positive effect, he said, "Of course, it is the official complaint from Bahrain to the United Nations. So I am hopeful that Ban Ki Moon would look into the matter seriously.
