MEDICAL CONDITION LANDS BAHRAINI FAMILY IN DEBT

A Bahraini family is slipping deeper into debt with its sole breadwinner bedridden with severe health problems.

The husband and father of a 6-year-old was already suffering from diabetes and heart diseases when he was diagnosed with Gangrene, a condition where tissues die due to insufficient blood supply. The condition has paralysed one of his legs. He was initially admitted to Bahrain Defence Force Hospital for 21 days to undertake a surgery to stop

the infection in his leg from spreading.

seeking help from several officials through social media, told *DT News*, "My husband is currently bedridden and there is no one else but me to nurse him. The physical strain that I take to carry him around has now given me spinal disc problems. This is apart from my own diabetes and hypertension."

She said their financial situation is going from bad to worse. "We are under heavy debts. We have not paid the rent of our house for six

months and have defaulted the three years' electricity bills," she lamented.

Adding to this is the expense of their son, who has just started his first year of school.

The wife confirmed that she recently booked an appointment with a doctor in Salmaniya Medical Complex and is waiting to see what treatment he needs.

"The doctors have said his heart is too fragile to undergo a surgery. I have no idea what lies ahead for me," she said.

Increase in use of public transport buses recorded
