Change in Iran must come at home: Macron

Paris

Iran creates high tension and its regional presence is destabilising, says French President.

Change in Iran must come from the Iranian people alone, not from abroad, French President Emmanuel Macron said yesterday.

In a speech to foreign diplomats, Macron said that "today there is a crisis in Iran. This crisis (comes from) the free expression of the Iranian people."

"Our role is to be on the lookout, demanding, scrupulous" to ensure that protesters' rights are not abused.

The deadly unrest in Iran began one week ago. Hundreds have been arrested, social media apps have been blocked and pro-government rallies have quickly followed. French Foreign Minister Jean-Yves Le Drian postponed a planned visit to Tehran this week.

The French leader also said he wants to see the emergence of an accord limiting Iran's regional presence that is considered destabilizing, ticking off its actions in Iraq, Syria, Lebanon and Yemen. The Iranian-backed Hezbollah

notably fought in Syria at the side of President Bashar Assad, backs a rebel group fighting in Yemen and has had a prime political role in Lebanon, where it is based.

Such actions, Macron said, "destabilize the region ... and contribute to maintaining elements of high tension."

Meanwhile, following the heroic uprising of the people of Izeh (in Khuzestan province) where the repressive forces were unable to confront the people and many of the regime's agents ran away, the clerical regime dispatched many groups of IRGC and Bassij forces from the surrounding areas to suppress the people, and practically imposed an undeclared curfew in this city.

Guards and other agents are constantly patrolling on vehicles or on foot across the city, especially during the night.

So far, more than 1,000 people have been arrested and detained in jails and are subjected to torture and other ill-treatment over the past one week and many have been denied access to their families and lawyers.



Bahrainis condemn atrocities against people

The people of Iran have once again risen in the face of their brutal regime. Protests have erupted in around 80 cities across Iran and violence has led to 21 deaths in the past few days. While the world watches in interest, many await an end to the Islamic Republic, according to a report issued by Citizens for Bahrain.

The report stated that these developments have been a big issue of discussion, with almost all Bahrainis supporting the right of Iranians to protest against their regime. Many Bahrainis saw that after years of Tehran wasting billions of dollars meddling in Arab states, including Bahrain, it was good to see Iranians taking a stand.

"The people of Iran deserve to be liberated from this regime. This regime has given them nothing but increasing poverty, curbs on freedoms and isolation from the world. They should stand strong as this is going to be a rough journey," said Abdullah, age 28, from Manama.

"We hope that Iran doesn't end up becoming like Syria

where the army massacres people just to stay in power. If a crackdown takes place then it's going to get ugly. I hope the people of Iran will be able to overthrow this brutal regime and join the world in fighting terror," said Fatima, age 32, from Isa Town.

"The international community should put more pressure on the Islamic regime

in Iran to step down and for free and fair elections to take place in what is supposed to be a democracy. The people have woken up and it does not seem like they will put back to silence," Mariam 30, Manama.

"The poverty and lack of opportunities within the Iranian society has resulted in this uprising. Iranians seem to have nothing to lose anymore. Their government has sucked them dry and they simply don't want to continue living in poverty anymore" Khalid 36, Riffa. (Continued on page 3)

The statement, an audio and video message, was relayed from the International Space Station (ISS) by astronauts working with the Russian Space Agency - Roscosmos on the occasion of Bahrain's National Days.

HM the King, in his reply, told the astronauts in ISS that Bahrain is "looking forward to seeing a Bahraini astronaut

among the ISS crew soon."

Future plans


While reviewing plans to enhance the combat capability of the BDF units, HM King said that the training programmes adopted by BDF command "falls in line with the most modern training methods.'

It seems like government's tough anti-smoking anti-smoking initiatives along with the recent tax hikes are discouraging smokers from continuing their habit at least for now.

Several cold store operators in the Kingdom told *DT News* that there is a dramatic decline in cigarette sales volume after

the implementation of the excise tax. However, sales of the

carbonated drinks are yet to feel the pinch. Consumers, according

to cold-store operators, are now buying less number of cigarette packets than earlier.

Mohammed Islam. Bangladesh national, told DT News that he may have to "stop smoking altogether" to stay within his budget.

He said he was forced to

return from a store without buying cigarettes after finding the new price tags.

"While living on a small salary, any increase in prices affects us greatly. I can't afford to pay double for anything, whether it is cigarettes or food or rent."

"Now, if I choose to smoke like I used to, I may not have enough money to send back to Bangladesh.

"So I will have to cut down or stop completely," he said.

Accounts of cold-store salesmen also gave us the same picture. "Price hike has forced heavy

smokers, who usually buy 2 to 3 packets a day, to cut down,' a cold store salesman told us. The doubling of prices,

according to cold-store operators, are scaring the customers away.

"I have had many customers come in, ask the price of cigarettes and leave without buying anything."

A cold store salesmen from Anwar Al Zinj in Bilad Al Qadeem told DT News he is expecting "a lot more of this".

"There are many who are poor but kept up the cigarette habit as they could afford it," he said. "But it doesn't seem to be the case anymore.'

Another cold store salesman in Manama, Majeed, pointed out that there are many who smoke 3 to 4 packets of cigarettes a day. "They will feel the pinch, even if they are rich. They are going to buy less."

However, for Energy drinks, things are still rosy. According to cold-store companies are yet to transfer the burden of the price hike to consumers as "old stokes are selling at old prices" now.

Revised estimates also state that even though prices of other fizzy drinks have increased sales are still

A Button and A Book: Trump Strikes Back!

Secretary of State Rex Tillerson was caught crouching under Donald J. Trump's Oval Office desk on Wednesday, in an attempt to disconnect Trump's newly installed nuclear button".

No. That's not true.

It is just a piece of satirical news in the "The Borowitz Report" published in 'The New Yorker' on 3 January 2018.

Andy Borowitz, a New York Times best-selling author and a comedian, has been writing for the New Yorker, since 1998. And I find some of his satire on current news very funny.

After the recent exchange between the leaders of North Korea and USA, the cyberspace was flooded with jokes and memes. All about the nuclear button both leaders are purported to have.

True to his now-well-known style - on hearing that Kim Jong-Un, the head of North Korea said he has the nuclear button on his table at all times – US President Donald Trump tweeted: "I too have a Nuclear Button, but it is a much bigger & more powerful one than his, and my Button works!".

Whether that particular Trump tweet was necessary or not, has soon become a matter of debate.

But even before the debate on "the button" died down, a newer debate on "the book" has come up in the USA.

Extracts from a new book "Fire and Fury: Inside the Trump White House" by Michael Wolff, have hit the Internet and are causing great controversy.

The book which is not set for release

The book which is not set for release until Tuesday apparently features fiery quotes from former White House chief strategist Steve Bannon and potentially embarrassing depictions of life and work inside the White House.

Needless to say, as I write this I am also reading the latest news on cnbc.com that "A lawyer for President Trump demands an apology and a retraction of material from an explosive new book by Michael Wolff about the White House".

The lawyer's letter to the author Michael Wolff and publishers Henry Holt & Co. reads: "Mr. Trump hereby demands that you immediately cease and desist from any further publication, release or dissemination of the Book, the Article, or any excerpts or summaries of either of them, to any person or entity, and that you issue a full and complete retraction and apology to my client as to all statements made about him in the Book and Article that lack competent evidentiary support Wolff and Henry Holt and Company did not immediately respond to requests for comment."

While we are unsure as to the content of the book, and while we must, of course, desist making assumptions, we must accept the fact that in today's day and age, it is almost impossible to stop people from talking.

Unlike in the past when mass media has had editors who wielded enormous control, social media can take the news – and some rumours along with it - faster and farther than was ever imagined.

If we must give both sides a fair chance to express themselves, we must of course accept that for every writer with an opinion, there could also be an opponent with a completely different opinion.

So, when Kim Jong-Un boasts that he has the entire US mainland within the range of his nuclear missiles, and when an author publishes a one sided view of what transpired in the white house, we cannot think that there will be no opposition to that thinking.

Retaliating to the aggressive talk of opponents has always been the staple act of politicians. And all this talk of bigger buttons and of banning books must be taken. But, with a pinch of salt.

AGU signs deal for medical city

The Arabian Gulf University (AGU) yesterday announced signing a contract for the construction of the King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz Medical City with the Saudi Fund for Development.

The signing ceremony was attended by the Bahrain Minister of Education Dr Majid Al Nuaimi and Ambassador of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques to the Kingdom of Bahrain, Dr Abdullah Abdul Malik Al Shaikh and a number of VIPs.

"This signing is the actual beginning and launch of construction work on the Medical City project, as the project contractor has begun the work of building the medical city on the site," said Dr Khalid Abdul Rahman Al Ohaly, President of AGU during the signing ceremony.

The University President thanked the late Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud for his royal generosity to build the Medical City with a sum of one billion Saudi riyals. He also extended gratitude to His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa for his donation of a million square meters of land in a strategic location for the construction of the Medical City project.

In his opening speech, he said that the Medical City was designed by expertise and competencies from various

all GCC countries.

"Over 60 workshops were held in the last period, attended by more than 100 experts to design the medical city, working closely with the National Health Regulatory Authority. We are currently working side by side with the Supreme Council of Health to include the Medical City under the health services covered by the health insurance of the Kingdom of Bahrain, to provide medical services to all residents of the Kingdom."

He added: "I extend my thanks and gratitude to the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud for the support of the Government Arabia to the University and for financing the Medical City project through the Saudi Fund for Development. We also extend our gratitude and appreciation to His Majesty King Hamad Bin Al-Khalifa for his generous sponsorship of the University providing for all its needs, and granting land to build the Medical City project on".

He confirmed that the Medical City will be a distinctive addition to the residents of the Southern Governorate, as well as the residents of Bahrain and the Gulf community.

The Medical City will include 300 beds and a full range of outpatient clinics, in addition to 15 operating

rooms and quality support medical services such as advanced laboratories and a pharmacy.

The three objectives of the Medical City are: the education and training of the students of the College of Medicine in the University who hail from GCC countries to benefit all health services in the Gulf, providing the faculty at the College of Medicine of AGU to practice their medical professions, and establishing centres for clinical research to address health issues prevalent in Arab Gulf States, such as diabetes, obesity, cancer and cardiovascular diseases. At the end of the ceremony, a film was presented showing the designs of King Abdullah Medical City.

He was speaking to DT News on the sidelines of a meeting held at the Capital Municipal Council where the Council met with Nasser Al-Ahli, Chairman of Bahrain Real Estate Association to discuss the new rental policy and its effects on the real estate business in Bahrain.

soon," Dr Maha Al-Shehab, Chairman of the Committee of Information and Public Relations in the Council said.

Meanwhile, Nasser Al-Ahli, Chairman of the Bahrain Real Estate Association pointed out that the new law will speed up the development of real estate investments in the Kingdom, especially in the Capital.

"In the old law there was ambiguity about the rights of the landlord, but now it is clear," he said adding: "Previously, there was a delay in the courts, but with the new law the eviction process has become much easier."

"The biggest problem in the previous law, Al Ahli said, was that Bahrain was divided into two regions with different characteristics and requirements, but with a single law. "Now with the new law, all the other laws and decrees get annulled."

"In 1988 and 1989, the action began to pass the new law and it was finally enacted in 2014. According to Article (4) in the new law, if the leases expire, after three years of legal issuance, that is in 2018, all leases will have to be renewed."

He also said that it was difficult to get the law implemented earlier as tenants had been living in the houses for a really long time.

"So a time frame of three years was given to all the contractors to renew their contracts to guarantee the rights of both the parties," he said.

He further emphasised the need to register contracts, pointing out the importance of raising the awareness in this regard. The law stipulates the establishment of a contract registration office in each municipality.

On the other hand, Deputy Chairman of the Board of the Capital Municipal Council Mazen Al-Umran told DT News, "As of February 2018, the tenants must sign a new contract."

necessary to renegotiate with the lessor or vacate the site," he said adding: "Most of these contracts are really old with the rents being too low and later on becoming a burden for landlords with these contracts were never renewed."

"Further, when landlords asked the tenants to evacuate the place, the process took forever to complete as the case went to the court."

"Thus, under this law, all the landlords must make a new contract that would benefit both the landlord and the tenant, and further if these new contracts are not signed by February 2018, the landlords have the right to ask the tenants to evacuate the place without involving court into this," Mazen added.

Handle with care

UN rights officials urge the Iranian authorities

he top United Nations The top United American human rights official has urged the Iranian authorities to handle the protests that have taken place around the country "with great care" so as not to further inflame violence and unrest.

"I am deeply disturbed by reports that more than 20 people, including an 11-yearold boy, have died and hundreds have been arrested during the recent wave of protests in Iran," said UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein, in a statement that urged the authorities to investigate all deaths and serious injuries that have occurred so far.

He said the Iranian authorities must respect the rights of all demonstrators and detainees, including their right to life, and guarantee their safety and security. Calling for thorough, independent and impartial investigations of all acts of violence that have taken place, the UN rights chief said there must be a concerted

effort by the authorities "to ensure that all security forces respond in a manner that is proportionate and strictly necessary, and fully in line with international law.

Zeid stressed that Iranian citizens who take to the streets to express their discontent have a right to be heard, and that the issues they raise should be resolved through dialogue, with full respect for freedom of expression and the right to peaceful assembly.

"It is incumbent on the authorities that their actions do not provoke a downward spiral of violence, as occurred in 2009," he warned. "The authorities must take all steps

to ensure that this does not happen again.'

The High Commissioner urged the authorities to release from detention any protestors who have been arbitrarily deprived of their liberty, or penalized in any way, for expressing their views and protesting in a peaceful manner. "Peaceful protests must not be criminalised," he said. "They are a legitimate part of the democratic process.

Meanwhile, United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres deplored the loss of life in the wave of protests in Iran and said that further violence must be avoided.

A statement issued by a UN spokesperson said the Secretary-General is following with concern recent developments in the Islamic Republic of Iran.

"He urges respect for the rights to peaceful assembly and freedom of expression, and that any demonstrations take place in a peaceful manner. Further violence must be avoided," the statement said. (UNI)

Abdulhadi Al-Rabie, Taif Health Affairs spokesman, said: 'The Health Affairs investigated the source of the video and was able to identify the nurses who appeared in the video and the hospital where the incident took place.

The nurses, who have not been named, were immediately suspended after they were tracked down.

Their medical licenses have now been revoked and they are banned from practising nursing in other health departments.

The baby's father told Saudi media the baby was in the hospital for ten days for treatment for a urinary tract infection and was shocked when he saw the video being widely shared on social media.

Social media users were horrified at the footage. One wrote: 'How dare they do this?

'All three nurses should thank God I was not the baby's mother. I'd squeeze all your faces much harder.' (Daily Mail)

Egypt detains 75 people in human trafficking probe: state media

An Egyptian prosecutor has ordered the detention of 75 people following an investigation into suspected human trafficking, state media

reported yesterday. A 14-month investigation

by the Administrative Control Authority, the anti-corruption body, found that the group was made of government officials, Egyptian citizens, and foreigners, state news agency MENA said.

Authorities arrested the defendants in raids across the country, from the capital Cairo to the northern city of Kafr

The probe showed that they were involved in "bribery, profiting from public office, forging official documents, and human trafficking" among a host of other offences.

Egypt passed legislation in 2016 to crack down on a growing smuggling industry along its northern seaboard. The law imposes prison terms and fines on those found guilty of smuggling potential migrants or acting as brokers or middlemen.

It also imposes prison sentences on those who provide shelter to trafficked migrants, and gather, transport or otherwise facilitate their journey. (Reuters)

Russia denies report that seven planes destroyed in Syria shelling Moscow

Russia denied a report in daily newspaper Kommersant that seven Russian planes had been destroyed by rebel shelling at Syria's Hmeymim air base on Dec. 31, the TASS news agency on Thursday quoted the defence ministry as saying.

At least four Su-24 bombers, two Su-35S fighters and an An-72 transport plane, as well as an ammunition depot, were destroyed by the shelling, Kommersant said on its website, citing two "militarydiplomatic" sources.

In the single biggest loss of military hardware for Russia since it launched air strikes in Svria in autumn 2015, more than 10 servicemen were wounded in the attack by "radical Islamists", the report said. (Reuters)



asheed Mohammed Al Maraj, the Governor of the Central Bank of Bahrain (CBB), has been named as the best central bank governor in the Middle East for 2018 by 'The Banker'.

The award, according to the leading UK-based magazine, recognises Al Maraj's contribution in adopting a progressing stance to develop a "world-leading regulatory environment for financial services - coupled with a forward-looking embrace of digital innovations and financial technology" in the Kingdom.

The annual recognition by the magazine under the Financial Times Group the officials celebrates that have best managed to stimulate growth and stabilise

"Beyond growing economy and low inflation environment, over the past 18 months, the CBB has pursued a number of eye-catching initiatives in the fintech sector," the magazine said in an article.

The article noted that under the governorship of Al Maraj "Bahrain has built on its already impressive credentials as a globally minded financial

"Bahrain may not be the largest financial centre in the Gulf, but it is one of the most sophisticated," the article said.

Al Maraj, who assumed CBB's governorship in 2005, according to The Banker, was instrumental in launching a dedicated regulatory sandbox for fintech start-ups in June

The framework offered

open to existing licensees, as well as new local and foreign firms. The testing phase is nine months with a maximum three-month extension. A dedicated fintech unit established in October 2017 oversees the approval process for participation in the sandbox.

"Collectively, these changes will open up new opportunities for business and investment structures to be developed in the country. In addition, they bring Bahrain's structuring options to the level of best international practices," said The Banker.

Among other achievements, The Banker points out that the CBB has issued a new directive recognising both locally domiciled and foreign exchange-traded funds (ETFs) collective investment undertakings. It means banks and other financial institutions can list ETFs established in Bahrain on licensed exchanges, while also permitting the registration of offshore ETFs. Notably, the new directive recognises both conventional and sharia-compliant funds.

"It is for these reasons that Al Maraj has claimed the Middle East Central Bank Governor of the Year award for 2018," *The Banker* said.

The award, according to the leading **UK-based magazine, recognises Al** Maraj's contribution in adopting a progressing stance to develop a "worldleading regulatory environment for financial services – coupled with a forward-looking embrace of digital innovations and financial technology"

Design flaws in new computer processor chips


Design flaws in processor chips (CPUs) by AMD, ARM and Intel could allow hackers to trick apps into revealing sensitive data such as passwords. The CPU "kernel" – the core of the operating system – is

Some fixes, in the form of software updates, have been introduced or will be available in the next few days, said Intel, which provides chips to about 80% of desktop computers and 90% of laptops worldwide. CPUs use a process known as "speculative

execution" to optimise performance, using different types of memory to store data and code temporarily.

In many cases, that information is supposed to be secure from attempts to hack it, but these two bugs allow malicious code to read the entire operating system without permission, stealing passwords and login files.

US suspending security aid to **Pakistan: report**

he U.S. State Department said yesterday The U.S. State Department said yesterday it was suspending security assistance to Pakistan until Islamabad takes action against the Afghan Taliban and the Haqqani network, which Washington believes is destabilizing the

State Department spokeswoman Heather Nauert said she could not provide a dollar value for the suspended aid because the administration was still calculating the types of aid affected by the decision. She said some of the aid could still be permitted if Islamabad takes decisive action against the groups.

"Today we can confirm that we are suspending ... security assistance only to Pakistan at this time until the Pakistani government takes decisive action against groups including the Afghan Taliban and the Haqqani network. We consider them to be destabilizing the region and also targeting U.S. personnel," she told a regular news briefing. (*Reuters*)

The average chief executive of Britain's FTSE 100 top companies has earned the same in the first three days of 2018 as the typical worker will make in the entire year, according to the High Pay Centre and Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development (CIPD).

The CIPD, the professional body for human resources, calculated that company bosses earn £4.5 million (€5.06), or £12,300 (€13,821) every day of the year. They will take less than three days to surpass the £28,758 (€32,315) average salary.

When looking at a chief executive's median pay, researchers found that bosses earned 120 times more than the average employee, despite an average 17 percent drop in CEO pay in 2017 amid pressure over excessive compensation from investors and the government.

The report on "Fat Cat Thursday" showed the best-paid boss -- advertising company WPP's Martin Sorrell -- on £48.2 million

Arnold Donald of cruise company Carnival follows Sorrell with £22m, (€24.7m) and Rakesh Kapoor of consumer goods company Reckitt Benckiser, is in third place -- despite seeing his pay fall from £23.1m (€26m) to £14.6m (£16.4m).

Tesla falls on production delay

Tesla Inc shares fell 3.5 percent in premarket trading on Thursday, setting the company up to lose nearly \$1.9 billion in market value after it pushed back a production target for its muchanticipated Model 3 sedan yet again.

Analysts, however, stayed upbeat, saying the electric car maker had finally set an achievable target for their




mass-market sedan that is priced at \$35,000.

Tesla said on Wednesday it would likely build about

2,500 Model 3s per week by the end of the first quarter, half the number it had earlier promised. The company now expects to reach its goal of 5,000 vehicles per week by the end of the second quarter.

"We believe that Tesla may have finally set a beatable production target," Nomura Instinet analyst Romit Shah wrote in a note to clients. (Reuters)



oil rose further above \$68 a barrel yesterday to the highest since May 2015, supported by unrest in Iran that has raised concerns about supply risks, cold weather in the United States which is boosting demand and OPECled output cuts.

Six days of anti-government protests in OPEC's thirdlargest producer have added a geopolitical risk premium to oil prices, although Iran's production and exports have not been affected.

Brent crude LCOc1, the international benchmark, was unchanged at \$67.84 a barrel at 1151 GMT and traded as high as \$68.27. U.S. crude CLc1 rose 20 cents to \$61.83

and also touched the highest since May 2015.

"The protests in Iran add more fuel to the already bullish oil market mood, said Norbert Rucker, head of commodity research at Swiss bank Julius Baer.

"We believe that today's oil prices project an overly rosy picture, stick to our cautious view and see the market at risk of profit-taking," Rucker added.

Freezing weather in the United States has spurred short-term demand, especially for heating oil.

Aside from the spike in May 2015, oil is trading at its highest since December 2014 - the month in which the Organisation of the Petroleum

Exporting Countries decided to stop cutting output, a move that deepened a price collapse.

Analysts at JBC Energy said the price reaction to the Iranian unrest was overdone.

OPEC, supported by Russia and other non-members, began to hammer out a deal to cut supplies again in 2016, aiming to lift prices by removing a glut built up in the previous two years.

Their cuts started a vear ago and compliance has been high, aided by involuntary output declines in Venezuela, whose economy is collapsing, plus unrest in Nigeria and Libya. Producers have decided to extend the deal until the end of 2018. (Reuters)

ingenious drone Adelivery service known as "Uber for blood" has slashed the delivery time of life-saving medicine to remote regions of Rwanda from four hours to an average of half an hour.

A partnership between Zipline, a Silicon Valley robotics company, and the country's health ministry has delivered more than 5,500 units of blood over the past year, often in life-saving situations. Never before have patients in the country received blood so quickly and efficiently.

While commercial drone delivery in wealthier countries is still at the testing stage, hampered by busy skies and strict regulations on airspace, Zipline is delivering blood to 12 regional hospitals from a base in the east of Rwanda. Each hospital serves about half a million people.

The use of drones is helping to reduce maternal deaths quarter of which are the result of blood loss during childbirth and high incidences of malaria-induced anaemia, which is common in children.

Drone delivery also means hospitals can store less blood, which means less waste blood

quickly.

Now Zipline plans to work with the government of Tanzania, a country of 56 million people, to launch what it claims is the world's largest drone delivery network.

Keller Rinaudo,

Zipline's co-founder and chief executive officer, said the move will make east Africa a world leader in drone logistics.

"Some of the biggest, most powerful technology companies in the world are still trying to figure out how to do this. But east Africa

is showing them all the way," he said. "The work Rwanda has shown the world

thousands names, addresses, and ages phone numbers," said Rinaudo.

"We've designed Zipline to solve the second half of this problem. We know who needs medicine, when and where. And now, we can get them that medicine as quickly as possible."

This year, the firm aims to deliver a range of medical products - including blood transfusion supplies, HIV medication, antimalarials, sutures and UV tubes - to four bases in Tanzania, supporting more than 1,000 clinics.

In Rwanda, when a doctor or medical staffer at one of the 12 clinics needs blood, they send a WhatsApp message or log on to Zipline's order site. They are then sent a confirmation message saying a Zip drone is on its way.

The drone flies to the clinic at up to 60mph. When it is within a minute of the destination, the doctor receives a text. The drone then drops the package, attached to a

parachute, into a special zone near the clinic before returning to base.

Critics of the scheme in Rwanda have questioned why the authorities have invested in hi-tech schemes when demand for basic infrastructure, roads and health centres still exceeds supply. Zipline and the government have not revealed the cost of the project.

But a spokesman for the Rwandan health ministry said: "The ministry and Rwanda Biomedical Center are happy to use such innovative

North Korea may have accidentally hit one its own cities with a missile, it has been claimed.

Satellite images show damage caused by a failed test launch that struck Tokchon, a city of 200,000 in the interior of Kim Jong-un's secretive state, according to a US government official.

The Hwasong KN-17 medium-range rocket was fired from Pukchang Airfield in South Pyongan Province, 40 miles north of Pyongyang on April 28 last year, it is claimed.

But it failed shortly after take-off, the Diplomat reports, before crashing down in the Chongsin-dong area of Tokchon, apparently damaging what looks like an agricultural or industrial building.

unnamed source

pointed out where the rocket had landed and Google Earth images taken on May 18 last year, just weeks after the launch, appear to show damage to a greenhouse-style structure at the same spot.

The official, who is described as having knowledge of North Korea's weapons programmes, told the Diplomat that the missile's flight lasted just one minute before suffering engine malfunction and travelling 25 miles northeast before crashing down.

Had it completed its flight without failing, it may have been destined to land in the northern parts of the Sea of Japan, the Diplomat reports.

There have been no reported deaths as a result of the apparent stray rocket, but the damaged building is close to heavily populated areas.

In November, North Korea

test-fired its most powerful ICBM ever which is likely capable of striking almost anywhere on earth.

. Kim Jong-un could be seen walking alongside a huge new mobile launch platform, which Pyongyang said was specifically constructed for the missile, before the rocket was maneuvered into place.

Hwasong-15 intercontinental ballistic was launched missile eastward from Pyongsong in North Korea's South Pyongan Province.

It flew for around 50 minutes, reaching an unprecedented altitude of 2,800 miles, before splashing down in the Sea of Japan around 620 miles away.

It marked the first missile launched since one was fired across Japan and into the Pacific Ocean on September 15. (Reuters)

Indian pilots grounded after 'mid-air row'

Mumbai

An Indian airline said Ayesterday it had grounded two pilots over allegations they had a fight and both briefly stormed out of the cockpit during a New Year's Day flight from London to Mumbai.

Jet Airways is investigating claims that a male pilot slapped his female colleague during a heated argument while the plane was in the air with 324 passengers on board.

Reports in several Indian newspapers, quoting unnamed sources, said the

mid-air altercation led the female pilot to leave the cockpit in tears and she had to be persuaded to go back in by cabin crew.

At one point the male pilot also left the cockpit, leaving the controls briefly unattended, the Times of India claimed.

"A misunderstanding occurred between the cockpit crew... However, the same was quickly resolved amicably and the flight... continued its journey to Mumbai, landing safely," Jet said in a statement.

Trump lawyers threaten ex-adviser Bannon

US President Donald Trump has hit back against his former trusted chief strategist, Steve Bannon, after the ex-adviser called the president's son and his team "treasonous" for meeting a Russian lawyer who promised dirt on Hillary Clinton in 2016.


Trump said in a statement that "Steve Bannon has nothing to do with me or my Presidency. When he was fired, he not only lost his job, he lost his mind."

A lawyer representing Trump also sent a cease-and-

desist letter accusing Bannon of violating a non-disclosure agreement by speaking to the author of an upcoming book, US media reported Wednesday.

Excerpts from the book by Michael Wolff that were published on Wednesday sparked a firestorm in Washington.

England skipper Joe Root again missed out on an elusive first century in the series as Australia fought back with two late wickets on the opening day of the fifth Test yesterday.

Root was out to a superb diving catch by Mitchell Marsh at square leg for 83 in the day's penultimate over before Jonny Bairstow was caught behind in the final over.

Root slumped to his haunches in dismay after missing out on a hundred following his fourth half-century of the series.

Root and Malan recovered

England's first innings with a 133-run stand after the tourists had slumped to 95 for three following the loss of Melbourne double-centurion Alastair Cook.

Malan lived a charmed life in his half-century, surviving a run out attempt and a dropped Steve Smith catch to provide stoic support for his skipper.

At the close, England were 233 for five with Malan left unbeaten on 55 off 160 balls when Bairstow was caught behind off Josh Hazlewood for five.

But the throw from wicketkeeper Tim Paine was off target and bowler Nathan Lyon was unable to effect the run out with Malan well out of his ground.

Malan had another life on 34 when Smith dropped a sharp ankle-high chance at slip off Lyon.

Only last week in Melbourne Smith put down two catches in Alastair Cook's unbeaten double century.

Cook, who carried his bat through the England first innings in the fourth Test for an unbeaten 244, looked on his way to another big score until Josh Hazlewood struck in the 33rd over.

Hazlewood's leg before wicket appeal was turned down on-field, but on review the ball was found to be just pitching in line with the left-hander's leg stump and hitting middle and Cook was given out for 39 off 104 balls.

It was the third time in the series Cook has fallen lbw and it left him just five runs short of 12,000 career Test runs in his 152nd Test match. (AFP)

Ferrari's final step will be the hardest

London

Ferrari's final step back to becoming a Formula 1 world champion again will be the hardest, admits Sebastian Vettel.

Though Ferrari made a huge improvement in 2017 to go from a winless '16 F1 season to challenging Mercedes for the title, it has still not taken a driver to the championship since Kimi Raikkonen's 2007 success or won a constructors' crown since '08.

Vettel believes Ferrari can carry its momentum from last year into 2018, but acknowledged going from underdog title challenger to being capable of ending Mercedes' four-season run of championship doubles was another step.

"Obviously the regulations stay roughly the same. I think we have a good and healthy platform to build on at the beginning of the year so I hope we can continue," said Vettel.

"What we have to do is take that final step. If you look back it's always that final step that's the hardest.

"There's a lot of work going on already and for the last couple of months focusing on next year, trying to make the car faster, with more power into the power unit, and then we'll see where we are."

Prior to 2017, Ferrari had not been in a championship fight since Fernando Alonso's 2010 near-miss and his shock title shot in '12 (above) in a car that was rarely a match for the frontrunners.

It was the first time Vettel had been a title contender since the last of his four straight successes with Red Bull in 2013.

"In the end as a driver you want to win, and obviously when you are competitive at the beginning you don't know if it will be enough to fight for the championship," he said. (autosport)



De Villiers hungry for big test runs

South Africa are backing AB de Villiers to show his class and score heavily as he continues his return to the test arena, captain Faf du Plessis said ahead of their three-test series against India.


