he Kingdom of Bahrain has lost five of its soldiers in an attack that took place in southern Saudi Arabia, where they had been posted to help defend the border with neighbouring war-wracked Yemen.

The announcement was made by General Command of the Bahrain Defence Force yesterday. The deceased soldiers were identified as First Sergeant Mohammed Nabeel Hamad, Sergeant Mohammed Hafedh Younis, Sergeant Abdulqader Al Alas, Sergeant Hasan Iqbal Mohammed and Corporal Abdul Monem Ali Hussain.

Five Bahraini soldiers were killed in an attack that took place at the southern border of Saudi Arabia, where they had been posted to help defend the border with neighbouring war-wracked Yemen

General Command also offered sincere condolences to the families and friends of the martyrs.

Bahrain is a member of a Saudi-led Arab coalition that, since March, has battled Shia Huthi rebels in Yemen to restore the rule of President Abed Rabbou Mansour Hadi, exiled in Riyadh.

The General Command said in a

statement that the soldiers were killed "while defending the southern border of the Saudi Kingdom" but gave no details on the circumstances.

Yesterday, the UAE said 45 of its soldiers engaged in a Saudi-led campaign against Shia rebels in Yemen were killed in an accidental explosion that the insurgents claimed was caused by rocket fire.

The Yemeni government said an "accidental explosion" at an arms depot at a military base in the eastern province of Marib killed the Emiratis, but the rebels said their fighters fired a rocket that caused the blast.

Though the precise location of the attack against Bahrain soldiers is yet to be revealed, Yemen's exiled presidency said they died in the same blast that killed the Emiratis, in what was the deadliest day for the coalition since it was formed in March.

Around 60 people, mainly military personnel, have been killed in crossborder rebel attacks in the south of Saudi Arabia since the launch of air strikes on the Huthis and their allies.

Pakistani found dead near blocked train in **Hungary**

A 51-year-old Pakistani has died after he was found lying close to a railway track in Hungary yesterday following the escape of 350 migrants from a train blocked for more than a day near Budapest.

Emergency workers tried to revive the man for 50 minutes near the Bicske railway station, the official MTI news agency said.

"A 51-year-old man has died in Bicske after ambulance staff were unable to resuscitate him," Pal Gyorfi, a spokesperson for Hungary's National Ambulance Service, told

A police spokesman later confirmed to reporters that the man was Pakistani.

A statement on the police website said that the as yet unidentified man was among the 350 migrants who broke out from the train yesterday afternoon.

The ministry explained in a statement the projects aim to enhance the quality of roads

Roads Assistant Undersecretary Huda Fakhro revealed that the ministry has set a plan to implement important projects near schools as part of its preparations for the new academic year.

She said the projects would reduce traffic congestions near schools and provide a safe

environment for students. The ministry developed roads near Hamad Town Intermediate Boys' School, West Riffa Secondary Girls' School, Al Maarifa Secondary Girls School in Riffa.

According to the ministry, a similar project is also in the process in the Educational Area in Isa Town. It was stated the project includes repaving Roads 4013 and 41. The ministry added that 37 per cent of the project is completed.

Fakhro also said that pedestrian crossing points and speed-breakers near schools were repainted, in addition to implementing maintenance works at the traffic signals.

The Assistant Undersecretary confirmed that the ministry has coordinated with the General Directorate of Traffic to assign specialised technicians near traffic signals during rush hours.

The latest projects add to maintenance works that were previously initiated by the ministry at 40 public schools.

Public schools will receive over 133,000 students tomorrow, education authorities in the Kingdom announced yesterday.

Al Nuaimi said in a statement, the ministry had provided educational seats to over 133,000 students and transportation for about 24,000

He also highlighted the projects to be implemented this academic year. They include mainly the vocational guidance, the citizenship and human rights-promoting schools project to be implemented in four schools, the numerical strategy for first

IT'S A BUSY SEASON AHEAD FOR HEALTH AUTHORITIES

Beginning of new school year, approaching Hajj season

authorities are Hearing up for a busy season this month, considering the beginning of the new school year and the approaching Hajj

In a recent statement to DT News, Health Minister Sadiq Al Shehabi confirmed that the ministry is sparing no effort in preparing for the new school year and Hajj, to maintain the safety of students and pilgrims.

"We have commenced intensified coordination with Education Ministry in this regard, headed by the Minister Dr. Majid Al Nuaimi. We aim at improving the School Healthcare Programme and healthcare services the ministry provides to pupils, so we can

start a healthy new school year," Al Shehabi told DT News on the sidelines of the opening ceremony of the Gulf Pharma-Medical Conference.

In a recent meeting with the ministry's Hajj Medical Committee, the Minister ordered the 46 members of the panel to serve pilgrims and ensure their well being, particularly the elderly and those suffering from chronic diseases. The panel is set to leave for Saudi Arabia on Monday, where it will be stationed to serve Bahraini pilgrims throughout the pilgrimage season. It consists of 46 medical staff, including doctors, nurses, pharmacists, health inspectors and medical technicians.

During the meeting, which

was held on Wednesday, Al Shehabi instructed the committee members concentrate on raising more awareness among pilgrims. He

also highlighted the importance of protecting pilgrims from infectious diseases and intectious diseases and epidemics, particularly the Middle East Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus (MERS-CoV) and Ebola virus.

Speaking on similar lines, Assistant Undersecretary for Hospital Affairs Dr. Waleed Al Manea said, "Awareness is the first weapon used by health authorities to tackle infectious diseases."

'We are currently promoting the cultures of cleanness, hand washing, avoiding direct contact with patients, recognising symptoms and reporting diseases to authorities. Such methods are being intensively promoted among pilgrims and students," he explained.

Dr. Al Manea also said. "We should follow the culture of isolation. Parents should prevent their children from attending classes in case they are sick. This way they contribute in the protection of other students and limiting the spread of diseases."

Speaking more about the ministry's preparations for the new school year, Dr. Al Manea

added, "In Bahrain, we have the School Healthcare Programme, which includes all schools in the country. The programme is responsible for organising immunisation campaigns, in addition to implementing screening processes of students of all stages. Screening includes infectious diseases, blood diseases, nutrition and vital medical checkups.



SAUDI CONMAN'S JAIL TERM UPHELD

The accused swindled a Lebanese national of BD 25,000

A Saudi conman who was sentenced to five years in prison had his jail term upheld.

The accused reportedly swindled a Lebanese national of BD25,000, by promising him Bahraini citizenship.

According to court files, the conman promised him Bahraini citizenship for BD25,000 but failed to keep his promise after getting the money.

The victim stated that he was lured to believe that the deal was legitimate.

Prosecutors said the accused handed him with forged documents, with a fake stamp and signature.

In his testimony, the victim said that he is a businessman

The conman sent an image of the victim's fake passport to his mobile phone. He was shown a copy of a fake document from the Royal Court, stating that his Bahraini citizenship has been approved

working in GCC States and he was advised by a fellow Lebanese friend to apply for Bahraini citizenship, to facilitate his works in the region.

The friend reportedly told him that he knows a "wellperson (the connected" accused) who would help him in availing himself a Bahraini

The victim met the accused at Seef and during the meeting, the latter was accompanied by a person who claimed to be a member of the Bahraini Royal Family and brother of a top Interior Ministry official, court files stated.

Arson: Witness hearing on Oct 8

Prosecution witnesses will be heard on October 8 in the trial of six persons accused of setting a government property on fire.

The Jidhafs Municipality building was torched by masked men on October 16 last year, causing damage worth over BD500,000.

A security guard, who was inside the property during the incident, made a narrow escape by jumping out through the window.

He was, however, admitted to hospital with injuries.

The accused implicated in connection with the attack had earlier pleaded not guilty, though prosecutors confirmed they were the ones who carried out the attack.

Former Municipalities and Urban Planning Affairs Minister Dr Juma Al Ka'abi said earlier a terrorist group targeted the Jidhafs Municipality at around 10.30pm, damaging everything inside the building including documents, money, computers and equipment.

A video footage showed six masked persons entering the building, dousing the interior with flammable substances

The Jidhafs Municipality building was torched by masked men last year, causing damage to the tune of BD500,000

and torching it. Dr Al Ka'abi said the office was part of the Northern Municipality and handled 13,000 applications every year for permits related to construction, remodelling, electricity and connections and Commercial Registrations (CRs).

PROJECT TO HELP PUDDLE PROBLEM

Students develop substance to enhance concrete endurance

Bahraini civil engineering students managed to develop a students that enhances substance concrete endurance by double and allows water to pass through it.

University of Bahrain (UoB) Engineering College students Zainab Abdulla and Dua Majeed presented the new substance in the university's graduation projects contest and exhibition, which was recently organised under the patronage of UoB President Dr. Ibrahim Janahi.

Explaining the idea of the project, Abdulla said, "We were inspired by the never ending puddles problem that usually recurs during winter and rainy seasons. When added to concrete mixtures,

Abdulla said that they used more than 60 mixtures before they came to the final result. She confirmed that they have conducted three tests on the final combination. "The substance doubles the endurance of concrete mixtures," she added.

hree Chemical Engineering students from University of Bahrain have made a breakthrough in the field of Aluminium Alloy conditioning as part of their senior project.

Maram Al Aradi, Sarah Al Shamlan and Noor Bucheeri's senior project on 'Enhanced mechanical and electrochemical properties by interrupting ordinary heat treatment with low temperature cycles for Aluminium Alloy, was supervised by Dr. Oday Al Buhamad and Dr. Hosni Zubeir, who specialise in

corrosion testing. The students have plans to escalate the project to an industrial level as well.

Their project involved heating Aluminium Alloy 6061 at different temperatures followed by rapid cooling using water.

manipulates microstructure of the alloy, thus enhancing its properties in terms of maximum tensile strength, yield, hardness, fracture toughness, electrical conductivity and corrosion resistance.

"This project was chosen

because our kingdom's economy depends producing and exporting aluminium and aluminium alloys from Alba and Midal Cables respectively," Maram Al Aradi told DT News.

"In addition, aluminium alloys are widely used in electricity cables, bridges building vehicles including motorbikes, bicycle frameworks and ships," she

The student said that improving the performance of the aluminium alloys would serve greater benefits for customers and the industry.

"We selected this project in particular, as this idea is

not very common in the gulf countries," added the University student.

"Any slight improvements might be a breakthrough in this field. On top of that, we wanted to challenge ourselves, our limits and creative thinking as this type of study and investigation were quite different from what was being taught in the university," added Al Aradi.

alloys developed The through such heat treatment become stronger and more resistent to fracture, tension and corrosion.

Hence, cables, frameworks and bridges become more reliable and sustainable, using similar alloys.

The students did face some challenges while pursuing this project. Sarah Al Shamlan explained, "The biggest challenge of the project was finding the space and means to perform the heat treatment cycle.'

"Usually, aluminium alloys are produced in large quantities and the heat treatment should be conducted in a large oven with sufficient heating capacity," she added.



Meeting the Challenge of Water Crises

Recently an international report has revealed that Bahrain is listed among the top ten countries that are likely to suffer from a water crisis in the next 25 years. Researchers from the World Resources Institute (WRI) mention that half of the Middle East countries would suffer from a sharp water crisis by 2040.

With the aggravation of the water crisis globally, there are more warnings of the possibility of an increase in the severity of the conflicts and disputes to obtain water and its sources. Researchers from WRI estimated that 33 countries, half of which are in the Middle East, would suffer from a severe water crisis by 2040. According to the study that included 167 countries, the top ten countries that would face water crisis in the future are Bahrain, Kuwait, Palestine, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia and Oman.

Researchers further stated that the Middle East is already probably the least water-secure region in the

We need to understand that with such a problem looming, we have to understand the potential risks we may face in terms of the water needed to run our economies, societies and industries as well as to meet with the challenge of increasing population and uncertain impacts of climate change.

The country has already taken positive steps in meeting with the forthcoming challenges and having initiated massive waste water treatment, recycling and reuse schemes to provide water to non- essential fields and more domestic water to its people and industries.

Our major water demand is being met by desalination process, which is a high cost option. The cost of water treatment, storage, supply and again collection of waste water and its treatment needs to be publicized enabling the residents to understand how much the government is spending on this basic necessity.

Water consumption in Bahrain is around 600 liters/ day, compared to the international standard of up to 265 liters daily. The annual growth rate in water use is also increasing around 10 percent. The basic requirement of a person doesn't exceed 100 litres/day. In Bahrain we have access to an abundance of water and we're accustomed to having it available at the twist of a faucet.

Water conservation measures are urgently required to tackle with the water crises. It is unfortunate to see people who are misusing this expensive resource. There is an urgent need to initiate awareness campaigns at all levels and cross sections of the society starting form industries, farms, agricultural land, residents and potable water users. The subject is to be initiated at schools, colleges, universities and other educational institutions. NGOs should be mobilized and community support should be obtained in tackling with this urgent issue.

Conserving water is every body's task. We can conserve water at domestic level inside our homes, kitchens, toilets and laundry. Let us start with few water conservation tips which we can easily practice at home:

- Using Low-flush toilets.
- Using low-flow shower heads and taking shorter
- Avoid using excess water in car washing, watering plants and gardening.
- Check for dripping faucets, running toilets and leaks.
- Don't let the faucet run while tooth brushing, shaving, hair and face washing.
- Operating washing machine and dishwasher only when they are full.

Karachi

For more than 1,000 years, Parsis have thrived in South Asia, but an ageing population and emigration to the West driven by instability in Pakistan means the tiny community of "fire worshippers" could soon be consigned to the country's history books.

The ancestors of today's Parsis in Pakistan - followers of Zoroastrianism, one of the world's oldest religions - fled Persia over a millennium ago for the safety of the western Indian subcontinent.

Parsi leader Jadi Rana made a pledge to the then emperor of India that Zoroastrians, known in the region as Parsis, would not be a burden, but would blend in like sugar into milk.

But today they are a fading people across the subcontinent, with many affluent families from India and Pakistan leaving for the West.

The community, which has long been active in business and charity, has been unnerved by the upsurge in Islamist extremist violence. One expert said the loss of the Parsis would be a "huge blow" to Pakistan's diversity.

Only around 1,500 are left in Karachi, Pakistan's largest city, where they have "fire temples", community centres and final resting places - where the remains of their dead are left in the open to be consumed by vultures according to their tradition.

Parsis are often called "fire worshippers" because their religion considers fire - together with water - as agents of purity and fires are lit as part of religious ceremonies.

They have long been discreet in observing their faith, but some, like 23-year-old art student Veera Rustomji, think they need to do more to preserve their heritage. "It's been successful (in) that we have been an unattacked and unharmed c o m m u n i t y because of our low profile," she said at her studio at the Indus Valley College.

"But at the same time it backfires because a lot of people focus on how the community is becoming small numerically."

Business leaders

Rustomji has traced her family's past in Hong Kong, where Parsis founded a university, a ferry service and hospitals. It is this link to business as well as charity that Byram Avari, the head of the Avari chain, one of Pakistan's leading luxury hotel groups, said has allowed the community to build an enduring relationship with Karachi.

"Before partition the ladies maternity home called Lady Duferfin Hospital was put up (by) the Parsis, the NED College, now medical college, the Spencer Eye Hospital and I cannot

The past decade has seen violence soar, with religious minorities often in the extremists' crosshairs. While Parsis have not been specifically targeted, many feel vulnerable.

'We cannot see a future'

"There is a general instability in the country. Because of this we cannot see a future for our community here right now," says Kaivan Solan, a 27-year-old training to become a priest.

Izdeyar Setna, 37, a freelance photographer with a slew of international clients, added that Parsis

were seeking new lives in countries with larger Parsi communities, such as Canada.

"I think most people are leaving because of a few reasons. One is security. The way things are, people are scared not knowing if things are going to get better," he said.

"So I think they are trying to get out. Most people are going to Canada, or the USA, wherever it is easy to get the

In the city's Parsi neighbourhood, the rotting stench of death

emanates from the Tower

of Silence, a large circular structure where the bones of the dead are kept in accordance with Zoroastrian practice.

For many these traditions must go on, and the compound provides a sense of belonging.

It is home to dozens of Parsi families but many have now hired armed guards because of attempts

to seize their land by a neighbouring M u s l i m community.

"Losing community like the Parsis is definitely a huge blow to a tolerant Pakistan, its cultural diversity and economic wellbeing as Parsis have contributed immensely to the progress of this country," Rabia Mehmood, a researcher on religious minorities at the Iinnah Institute think tank.



threats faced by Parsis are external. They are already facing a low birth rate and their marriage laws are extremely strict, forcing women to leave the community if they "marry out" - though men marrying non-Parsis is tolerated.

"I would love to (marry) if I find the right person, but it's difficult because the numbers are so small," Rustomji, the student, said.





The 46-year-old said he would "seriously consider" playing the suave British spy, admitting he was previously asked to take on the role but turned it down.


Jackman was asked to play Bond a decade ago, just before Daniel Craig was chosen for the part, but he said the timing was wrong for his career.



Aylan Kurdi's last journey was supposed to take him to a safe home - hundreds of miles away from the relentless war in his native Syria.

Instead, it ended with a funeral in the city his family tried to flee.

In the Syrian town of Kobane, 3-year-old Aylan was laid to rest alongside his mother and fiveyear-old brother at "Martyr's Cemetery" in the predominantly Kurdish community near the Turkish border.

Aylan's father, Abdullah, who survived the capsizing that killed his family, wept as the bodies were buried. Speaking at the crossing with Turkey, he said he hoped the death of his family would encourage Arab states to help Syrian refugees.

"I want from Arab governments, not European countries, to see my children, and because of them to help people," he said in footage posted online by a local radio station.

"I don't blame anyone else for this. I just blame myself,"



Hungary's pushed parliament through emergency anti-migration laws vesterday to halt a surge in numbers crossing into the EU state as crowds of refugees and migrants defied the security forces in their quest to reach western Europe.

The new measures include three-year jail terms for people climbing over the newly built razor wire fence on the 175-kilometre (110mile) border with Serbia, as well as new border "transit zones" to hold asylum seekers while their applications are being processed.

Lawmakers also declared a "state of crisis caused by mass immigration", which will allow the police and army to assist in registering asylum-applications and operate detention facilities in registration camps.

Meanwhile, more than 1,000 people stranded for days in makeshift camps at Budapest's main train station set off on foot to the Austrian border, some 175 kilometres from the Hungarian capital.

Refugee aid charities see surge in donations

The Hague

harities aiding refugees ✓witnessed a surge in donations across Europe yesterday as people shocked by the heart-rending images of a drowned Syrian boy on a Turkish beach dug deep to help.

British Prime Minister David Cameron, under pressure to act, said Britain would provide an extra £100 million (137 million euros, \$153 million) in

humanitarian aid for the Syrian crisis, bringing London's total contribution to more than 1.0 billion pounds.

The International Olympic Committee launched an emergency two-million-euro (\$2.2 million) fund, as money flooded into the coffers of aid organisations helping those fleeing Iraq and Syria.

"There is an enormous response from the public, the tide of indifference is shifting," Christian Peregrin, spokesman for the Maltabased Migrant Offshore Aid Station, said.

The group, working to help migrants seeking to cross the Mediterranean from Libya, had by Friday received a record 600,000 euros (\$666,500) since the toddler's photo went viral.

"Before that, 10,000 euros in a day would have been a good day," he said.

Female MMA fighter traps robber in a leg lock

Brasília

A Brazilian street robber ended up pleading for mercy from the woman he tried to hold up - after she took him down in a jiu-jitsu move then held him in a leg grip until the police arrived.

Footage emerged of the sobbing man Wesley Sousa de Araujo screaming, crying for his "daddy" and pleading for someone to call the police as Monique Bastos locked his neck in a triangle choke.

Araujo and another man had earlier approached Ms Bastos and another woman

on a street in Acailandia, western Brazil - unaware that his would-be victim was a professional MMA fighter and jiu-jitsu blue belt.

Ms Bastos, who has six professional MMA fights on her record, pounced after the men cornered the women on a motorbike and demanded they hand over their mobile

The fighter, 23, later told how she took Araujo to ground in a "rear-naked choke" before locking him in a "triangle choke" for 20 minutes until police arrived.

Ms Bastos told Brazil's iG website: "One of the guys grabbed the mobile phone I was carrying. I could see that they were not armed so I knocked their motorbike

"I wasn't afraid. I knew I could immobilise them.

"One of them managed to run away, so I got the motorbike driver with a 'lion killer' and held him in my legs for 20 minutes.3

The 'lion killer' is a choke hold in Brazilian jiu-jitsu where the attacker wraps his arm around his opponent's

neck, placing the crook of his elbow on his trachea.

In the video filmed on an onlooker's mobile phone, Arauju is heard screaming out for help as Ms Bastos holds him in the lock and applies pressure on his neck.

He shouts: "Daddy, daddy, call the police, daddy. Help Jesus. I swear, it was the first time I've ever done this. Help, Lord, somebody help me. Where's my mum?"

Araujo was taken to the local police station, where he denied trying to rob the women, according to reports.

Obama meets King Salman

'THERE IS MUCH TO DISCUSS'

S President Barack Obama welcomed Saudi Arabia's King Salman for a first and long-delayed White House summit yesterday, marked by warm public words amid clashing views on Middle Eastern crises.

Obama made the rare move of greeting the 79-year-old monarch at the doors of the White House, as he hailed the "longstanding friendship" between the two countries.

Salman's inaugural visit as king - originally scheduled for May and cancelled by Riyadh - has been billed as a way of putting relations back on a more stable footing.

In the Oval Office, Obama was effusive, saying he wanted to "once again reaffirm not only our personal friendship,

but the deep and abiding friendship between our two people."

For his part Salman said his visit was a "symbol of the deep and strong relationship that we have with the United

States." These meetings normally end in "some kind of public statement that puts as positive a spin as possible on the meeting," said Anthony Cordesman of the Centre for Strategic and International

World's shortest man Chandra Dangi dies aged 75

The world's shortest man, as verified by the Guinness Book of Records, has died of an undisclosed illness in American Samoa, a hospital spokeswoman said yesterday.

Nepal's Chandra Bahadur Dangi, who was 21.5 inches tall (54.6 cm), died late Thursday at the Lyndon B. Johnson Tropical Medical Centre in Pago Pago.

The 75-year-old lived in a remote village around 400 kilometres (248 miles) from Kathmandu but travelled the world after he was officially declared the world's smallest man, posing for a photograph with world's tallest man Sultan Kosen in 2013.

Family friend Sujit Dilip,

owner of India's well-known Rambo Circus, based in Pune, said: "Today, our circus is flooded with tears at the loss of the world's smallest man... whom we lovingly called

Prince Chandra." Dangi, who was just 21.5 inchs, broke the record in 2012 when he was

Dangi was popular in his area after his title enabled him to travel abroad and earn money for Reemkholi, the Nepalese village where he lived some 335 miles southwest of Kathmandu.

Before that he made placemats and head straps for villagers carrying heavy loads.

The tiny man, who was a primordial dwarf, was the same size as six cans of baked beans Dangi with the world's tallest stacked on top of each other.







Germany 3-1 Poland

Berlin

Striker Mario Goetze scored twice to seal Germany's 3-1 win over Poland last night as the hosts avenged last year's away defeat to top their Euro 2016 qualifying group.

Having lost the corresponding fixture 2-0 in Warsaw last October --Germany's first defeat to their neighbours in 19 matches --the world champions gained sweet revenge by knocking Adam Nawalka's Poland from top of Group D.

It was Poland's first defeat in seven Euro 2016 qualifiers and this was an impressive display from the Germans after several below-par performances last

All four goals came from

Bayern Munich players as Thomas Mueller gave Germany an early lead, then Goetze made it 2-0 before Poland captain Robert Lewandowski pulled one back with a diving header as it finished 2-1 at the break.

Mueller and Goetze then combined for Germany's third on 82 minutes to kill off hopes of a late Poland equaliser.

Georgia's 1-0 home win over Scotland, who Germany play in Glasgow on Monday, and Ireland's 4-0 thumping of minnows Gibraltar means Germany are top with 16 points with Poland now second on 14 while Ireland go third with 12, one ahead of the Scots.

Poland host Gibraltar in Warsaw on Monday having

routed the part-timers 7-0 away last year. Germany coach Joachim Loew sprang a surprise before kick-off by naming Liverpool midfielder Emre Can at right-back to give the 21-year-old his debut.

The game started at a highpaced tempo in Frankfurt and Germany scored off their first clear chance.

A superb exchange of passes with Karim Bellarabi put Cologne left-back Jonas Hector in behind the defence and he squared for Mueller to fire home on 12 minutes.

The hosts doubled their lead six minutes later when World Cup final winner Goetze cut in from the left and unleashed a fierce drive, which gave Poland's Swansea City

goalkeeper Lukasz Fabianski little chance just inside the near post.

Poland were rewarded for a sustained period of pressure when left winger Kamil Grosicki powered down the left wing, with Can out of position, curled in a superb cross and Lewandowski powered the ball home with a superb diving header on 36 minutes.

Early in the first half, Loew brought on Ilkay Gundogan for Bellarabi, who provided a superb pass to Goetze and the Bayern man hit the post on 57 minutes.

Germany settled the matter when Mueller's fierce drive bounced off Fabianski's legs and Goetze tucked away the

'Lack of experience' killed the De Gea deal

Madrid

David de Gea's transfer from Manchester United to Real Madrid broke down at the last minute due to the Premier League club management's "lack of experience", Real president Florentino Perez claimed.

And although Real have been chasing the goalkeeper for more than a year as a long-term replacement for Iker Casillas, Perez refused to confirm they would make a second move for de Gea when the transfer window reopens in January.

Madrid seemed set to conclude the long-running transfer saga late on Monday's deadline day with a deal worth between 30 million (\$33.9 million) and 40 million euros and Costa Rica goalkeeper Keylor Navas joining United.

But Spanish league sources

confirmed the player had not been registered and Madrid admitted they had sent the required documentation after the window closed at midnight local time (2200 GMT).

Madrid had accused United of sending the documents after the Spanish deadline had passed.

Djokovic downs Seppi to reach US Open last 16



New York

Top seed Novak Djokovic defeated Italy's Andreas Seppi for the 11th time in 11 meetings to reach the US Open fourth round vesterday.

The world number one and 2011 champion triumphed 6-3, 7-5, 7-5 as the 28-year-old inched closer to a sixth final in New York.

Djokovic, who also recorded his 31st successive win over Italian opponents, goes on to face either Belgian 14th seed David Goffin or Spain's number 23 Roberto Bautista Agut for a place in the quarter-finals

The Serb star had dropped just 10 games in his first two rounds, not facing a break point, but was pushed hard by 25th seed Seppi, who knocked Roger Federer out of the Australian Open in January.

He dropped serve for the first time in the second set and was broken again as he served for the match in the 10th game of the third.

But the 31-year-old Seppi was unable to capitalise on his break and handed the advantage straight back to the world number one in the 11th game.

"I had to hang in there and try and play at my pace," said Djokovic.

"He was aggressive and went for backhands down the line."

"I just had to stay patient and wait for my opportunities which is easier said than done."

Djokovic ended with 11 aces and 37 winners but will look to reduce the error count of 31 in the fourth round, where victory would put him into a 25th consecutive Grand Slam quarter-final.



Venus Williams eliminated the highest-rated rival in her sister Serena's path to a historic US Open final by defeating 12th-seeded Swiss teen Belinda Bencic 6-3, 6-4 yesterday.

Bencic, who inflicted the most recent defeat upon topranked Serena Williams in a Toronto semi-final last month, fell to 0-4 against Venus and has yet to win a set off the seven-time Grand Slam champion.

"I'm really pleased I played a (great) match against someone who had such a great summer," Williams said.

Venus, 35, fired 31 winners against 15 unforced errors while Bencic, 18, had 12 of each.

would rather make an error and play aggressive, go for it," Venus said.

Venus Williams advanced to a fourth-round match against either US compatriot Madison Brengle or Estonian qualifier Anett Kontaveit and could face her sister Serena in the quarter-finals.

"I hope we both get to the quarterfinals," Venus said.

Serena Williams, who holds all four Grand Slam titles, continues her quest for more tennis history when she faces 101st-ranked fellow American Bethanie Mattek-Sands later in Arthur Ashe Stadium.

The World No. 1 is trying to complete the first calendar Grand Slam

Graf in since Steffi 1988 and only the fourth ever

while also seeking her 22nd career Slam singles crown, matching Graf's Open Era record and two shy of Australian Margaret Court's all-time mark. This could be the first

Grand Slam event in which Serena reaches the final without facing a top-10 opponent.

Venus broke Bencic in the eighth game and held on her fourth ace to take the first set in 33 minutes, having blasted 16 winners to only four by Bencic.

Bencic broke for a 3-1 lead when Venus sent a forehand long but Venus responded with a forehand winner to break back in the seventh game and broke again in the ninth before ending matters with her fifth ace.

Meanwhile, Russian 13th seed Ekaterina Makarova ousted Ukraine 17th seed Elina Svitolina 6-3, 7-5 in a matchup of the top-ranked remaining players in their quarter of the draw.

Makarova reached the semifinals of last year's US Open and this year's Australian Open while Svitolina reached her first Slam quarter-final at this year's French Open.

Makarova, playing with a taped upper right leg, began cramping while serving at match point.

After missing two of them, she sat down and asked for a trainer but was told she could not be treated until a changeover, so she fought through the pain to advance on a forehand winner.

"Just at match point it starts cramping," Makarova said.

"I was scared. It's the first time I was cramping. She told me she can't treat me until the

changeover. I kept playing and kept trying." A Grand Slam record 12 men have retired from matches at this tournament with two women quitting during matches as well, many from heatrelated cramping issues.
