

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa will be at the forefront in receiving the leaders of the Arabian Gulf Cooperation Council upon their arrival to the Kingdom today, according to a Royal Court statement issued yesterday.

Among the top delegates

for the summit include the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud and British Prime Minister, Theresa May, who is on her first visit to the Kingdom.

The Cabinet yesterday noted that King Salman's historic visit to Bahrain embodies the

solid long-standing relations between the two Kingdoms' leaderships and people. Prime Minister May is attending the 37th GCC Summit as a Guest of Honour, at the invitation of King Hamad.

Secretary-General of the Cabinet, Dr. Yaser bin Essa Al-Nasser also welcomed

the leaders, stating that the Summit is expected to come up with resolutions that will further boost the joint GCC action through more complementarity and in rapprochement the economic, political, social, military and security fields in order to achieve Gulf Unity.

"Reports being circulated on social media by an Asian on the abduction of his son in Manama was followed up," tweeted the Interior Ministry.

"The child was found and he is safe and in good health. Investigation indicated that the case was a hoax, legal steps are to be taken.



enouncing the spate of false news spreading social across media platforms, UAE Exchange yesterday clarified that it is not accepting demonetised Indian currencies at any of its branches in the Gulf as claimed.

The Abu Dhabi-based financial service provider issued the statement after it was flooded with enquiries in this regard by members of Indian community here.

circulated Messages through Whatsapp and Facebook groups claimed

yesterday that Indians could exchange the demonetised notes at any of the UAE Exchange branches in the Gulf on December 12 and 13.

 $The \,Government \,of \,India\,on$ November 6, 2016 withdrew the legal tender status of ₹ 500 and ₹ 1,000 denominations of banknotes in a bid to tackle counterfeiting, nullify black money hoarded in cash and curb funding of terrorism with fake notes.

Following which, the Reserve Bank of India has also issued directions to nonresident Indians to deposit the specified bank notes in

his/her non-resident ordinary savings account, which is a rupee denominated account. However, many Indians living abroad either do not have these accounts or the international branches of their banks aren't accepting the old Indian currency notes.

The current frenzy also reveals that the RBI statements and clarifications have served little solace to the worried Indian communities here in Bahrain and all over the Gulf.

"We are receiving a lot of inbound calls seeking service assistance to exchange these notes. We would like to reassure you that we are closely monitoring the situation and are standing to make necessary

arrangements as and when notified by Reserve Bank of India and/or Government of India for handling such notes outside India," the UAE Exchange statement reads.

"As of today, UAE Exchange branches worldwide are not accepting the demonetised currency notes of INR500 and INR1000 until further notice "Should you come across

messages received through any other platform, please disregard them as false information," the statement

confirmed.

The statement further says that all updates and communication on this matter will be issued through their official channels via uaeexchange.com, official Facebook and Twitter accounts, and press announcements. The statement also requests people to alert the company in case they come across any misleading messages by writing to corporate. communications@ uaeexchange.com.

What the RBI says?

Most NRI's prefer to keep small amounts of Indian currency to meet their immediate expenses when they arrive in India. Here are some of the things you could do to change 500 and 1000 rupee notes:

1. Bring the cash to India

- Planning to travel to India before December 30, 2016? Then you can bring the cash with you and exchange it at any bank or post office in India.
- In addition, have up to March 31, 2017 to exchange the money at specified RBI office by furnishing passport and visa details.

2. Send the money with someone you trust:

- · You can also give the money to someone else you trust who is travelling to India.
- exchange it on your behalf.
- than Rs.25,000) it would probably not be an issue, but for amounts larger than that it is advisable that you provide

authorising letter to exchange the bills on your behalf with other valid documents like PAN card, Aadhaar card, Passport copy, Visa copy etc.

• The limit on currency a traveller can bring into India without declaring is Rs.25,000.

- You may authorise in writing and enable another person in India to deposit the



In a press release, the statement says, "For those who are incapable to exchange their 500 and 1000 Notes or deposit the same in their bank accounts on or before December 30, 2016, an opportunity will be given to them to do so at specified RBI offices on later dates along with required documentation as may be specified by the Reserve Bank of India.'

Hadi would only give way to elected leade

President emeni Abedrabbo Mansour Hadi would cede power only to an "elected" leader, after rejecting a UN peace roadmap asking

him to hand over to a deputy,

an official said yesterday. Hadi made his statement during talks last week in Aden with UN special envoy Ismail Ould Cheikh Ahmed, who has begun a new attempt to restart negotiations between the

government and Iran-backed rebels.

The official said the roadmap, whose content was not made public, requires Hadi to cede power to a vice president named in agreement with the rebels, a plan the president rejected.

Hadi referred to a former peace plan brokered by Gulf states, which stipulated that he would supervise the country's political transition.

"The roadmap has contradicted the Gulf initiative in terms of the president's powers," the official said, adding that Hadi should run Yemen during the transition and supervise national dialogue and elections.

"He would pass his powers to an elected president," the official said.

The Gulf initiative eased former president Ali Abdullah Saleh out of power in 2012 after 33 years in office following a year of nationwide protests. It also led to Hadi's election the same year.

But in a blow to the political transition, Saleh allied himself with Shia Huthi rebels who overran the capital in 2014 and expanded their control across Yemen, forcing Hadi to flee to Rivadh in March 2015.

A Saudi-led coalition intervened the same month in support of Hadi's government.

In his response to the UN mediator, Hadi demanded that Saleh and rebel chief Abdul Malik al-Huthi "abandon politics and be forced into a country of exile of their choice for 10 years".

More than 7,000 people have been killed and nearly wounded since Yemen's conflict escalated after the Saudi-led military coalition intervened in March 2015. (AFP)

Qatar Airways iet makes emergency landing

A Qatar Airways jet made an an emergency landing at a Portuguese military base in the Azores islands Sunday after heavy turbulence injured passengers.

The Boeing 777, bound from Washington to Doha, was re-routed during a storm to the Azores, a Portuguese territory in the North Atlantic, and landed at the Lajes Air Base.


Officials and witnesses said the plane had dropped steeply in altitude, hurling several passengers out of their seats and causing one traveller to suffer heart trouble.

"All the passengers were taken to a hotel in the evening and are due to depart on Monday morning," said an airbase spokesman, adding that several people onboard had "suffered light injuries during the turbulence". (AFP)



The car also has a capless fuel system, keyless entry with passive go, a power tailgate, and a glass sunroof. A generous 438 litre cargo bay (1251 litres with rear seats folded) is another USP.

The car will have more than 70 safety and security features.

The engine portfolio is the 1.4 multi air turbo, 1.6 and 2.0 turbo diesel, 2.4 tigershark petrol, 2.0 tigershark flex fuel (ethanol), and transmissions include a 6-speed manual/auto, and a 9 speed auto. China will get a 7-speed dual clutch gearbox. The Compass will begin trial production soon, and is expected to hit the market around March 2017. (NDTV)





Aleppo

Kafa Jawish hadn't slept in days, daydreaming of seeing her home in east Aleppo for the first time in four years, but when she arrived she found little more than rubble.

The 36-year-old was among hundreds of Syrians returning to east Aleppo in recent days after the army recaptured large swathes of the city from rebels and encouraged residents to visit neighbourhoods and homes they left years earlier.

She could barely contain her excitement as she sat on a government bus heading to her neighbourhood of Haydariya in northeast Aleppo, recaptured by the army earlier in the week.

"I left my house four years ago and I'm just so happy to be going to see it, I haven't slept for three days because I'm so excited," she said as the bus wound its way from western

Aleppo.
"I want to ululate with happiness when I see my house safe and sound," she said, dressed warmly in a black coat and headscarf that framed her smiling face.

Stuffed into a bus crowded with other passengers, she and her husband Tajeddin Ahmed discussed their plans to return home, after years living in the Syriac Quarter in central Aleppo.

"I'm going to go back to living in my house no matter what condition it's in," she said firmly.

"We're tired of paying rent, we miss our house and our families and our neighbours."

The couple fled Haydariya in July 2012, when rebels entered the city, leaving at dawn one morning without any of their belongings and moving into the ancient Syriac Quarter.

More than half of Syria's

population has been displaced internally or abroad by the conflict that began with antigovernment protests in March 2011 before spiralling into a war that has killed over 300,000 people.

Shocking destruction

"I want to go back to the house that I lived in with my family and go back to living together safely and happily," Ahmed, 45.

"I'm really hoping we'll find the house in good shape."

His phone rang as they talked: an old neighbour who couldn't leave work asked Ahmed to check on his house

As the bus set out, Jawish expressed hope that her neighbourhood might be relatively untouched, reasoning it was far from the frontlines that saw the worst fighting.

East Aleppo has seen some

of the worst violence of the war, and has been pounded by the army since it began an operation to recapture the city in mid-November.

As the bus edged closer to Haydariya, Jawish's smile dropped away, and she and Ahmed fell silent.

Along the road, buildings were partially or fully collapsed, windows long blown out and furnishings destroyed or looted.

The route itself was cratered in places, and the bus bounced as Ahmed stared grimly out of the window, murmuring prayers.

Jawish tried to pick out places that held memories, spotting an area she used to picnic with her husband. Growing impatient with the

bus's slow, careful progress, she tried in vain to convince her husband to get out and walk the rest of the way so she could get to her house quicker.

But when they finally arrived, she burst into tears at the sight of their building, parts of the length of one side of it completely gone, leaving the inside exposed to the elements.

Old life 'a memory'

Most of the windows were blown out, along with their frames, the front door was missing and a stack of broken tiles was piled up in the doorway.

Unable to enter the damaged building, the couple stood on tiptoes to peer in through a ground floor window at their old apartment.

"We were so optimistic, I thought I was going to ululate when we arrived, but now we've found it like this, uninhabitable," she said tearfully.

"We spent years working to make a home, buying things for it, bit by bit, until we had a washing machine and a fridge, and now there's nothing in it and the house is destroyed. Oh

She described the concerts that once took place at their house, with people playing the lute and singing.

"When I look at the house I remember all those beautiful moments.'

Ahmed appeared stunned as he looked on, repeating over and over: "Thank God for our health and wellbeing.'

"We sacrificed so much to make this house our home, how will we start over again?" Jawish asked.

"I know that our relatives will all be in the same situation as us, who will help us?"

The couple left to walk through the neighbourhood, checking on the homes of their neighbours, all similarly damaged and gutted.

Their old life, Jawish said, "has become just a memory". (AFP)

Russian and US experts will meet in the coming days to determine the routes and timing for a total rebel withdrawal from eastern Aleppo, Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said yesterday.

During the Russian-American consultations the concrete route and timeframe for the withdrawal of all fighters from eastern Aleppo will be agreed upon," the Russian diplomat said, indicating that the talks in Geneva would likely start on Tuesday or Wednesday.

"As soon as these routes and timeframes are agreed on, a ceasefire can come into effect," Layrov said.

The discussions would be based on proposals made by US Secretary of State John Kerry in Rome on Friday, he said.

Russia's top diplomat also denounced a proposed UN resolution demanding a temporary ceasefire in Aleppo, calling it a "provocative step".

Second Russia jet crashes in failed landing

Russia's defence ministry said yesterday a Sukhoi jet fell into the sea after a malfunction as it tried to land on the Admiral Kuznetsov aircraft carrier following a bombing raid in Syria.

Her conviction, overturned on appeal, sparked mass protests and even some reported suicides. Thousands of directors, actors and producers in the Tamil film industry went on hunger strike to demand her release. (AFP)

Blatter loses appeal against ban

Lausanne

Sport's highest court yesterday rejected the appeal of former FIFA president Sepp Blatter against a six year ban signalling the end of his efforts to clear his name.

The 80-year-old former football powerbroker was ousted over a two million Swiss franc (\$2 million/1.8 million euro) payment to UEFA boss Michel Platini which the Court of Arbitration for Sport called an "undue gift" that could not be justified.

Blatter called the verdict

"incomprehensible" but also acknowledged that he has come to the end of the road in his fight to clear his name.

"I will not be appealing in a Swiss court," he said, turning his back on what would have been his last legal recourse.

Earlier, however, he maintained that guilt had not been proven.

"It is difficult to follow it, because the principle of jurisdiction -- culpability has to be proven by prosecution -was not applied," Blatter said in a statement.

"Nevertheless I look back with gratitude to all the years, in which I was able to realise my ideals for football and serve FIFA," added the Swiss official widely condemned by critics during his 18 years as head of the world football body.

The payment made to Platini in 2011 for work carried out a decade earlier without any contract led to the downfall of both men. Platini had been expected to take over from Blatter, but has also seen multiple appeals rejected by tribunals and courts.

Blatter could face more trouble as he remains under investigation by Swiss prosecutors over the payment.

Ibrahimovic denies kicking Seamus Coleman

London

Zlatan Ibrahimovic has insisted he had no intention of kicking Everton full-back Seamus Coleman in the head during the 1-1 draw at Goodison Park on Sunday.

The 35-year-old Swede had given his side the lead with a lobbed finish but could have left them a man short had referee Michael Oliver seen the incident.

Losing out on a 50:50 with Coleman, Ibrahimovic proceeded to chase down the Irishman before the tussle saw them both fall awkwardly the ground.

It was what followed that enraged the Toffees players, however, as the forward's heel down came down onto Coleman's face, leaving him writhing in pain.

With the prospect of a retrospective ban looming, Ibrahimovic has pleaded his innocence, claiming the Everton player would have Manchester United's Zlatan Ibrahimovic (up) catches Everton's Seamus Coleman

Aguero's four-match ban confirmed

London

Sergio Aguero's four-match suspension has been confirmed by the Football Association following his dismissal in Manchester City's loss to Chelsea.

City striker Aguero was shown a red card for a dangerous two-footed foul on Chelsea defender David Luiz, which led to a bust-up between players and coaches from both teams in the final moments of Saturday's Premier League clash at Eastlands.

The Argentina international, who has scored 16 goals this season, will now miss league fixtures against Leicester, Watford, Arsenal and Hull.

Aguero has already missed three games through suspension this term for elbowing West Ham's Winston Reid and his latest absence is a major blow to City's title challenge.

Fernandinho was also sent off for shoving Cesc Fabregas during the incident, with City's Brazilian midfielder banned for three matches, as indicated on the disciplinary pages of the FA website on Monday.

Chelsea won the game 3-1 to move three points clear at the top, but both clubs may face FA disciplinary action for a failure to control their players.

Fabregas' role in Fernandinho's dismissal could also be scrutinised after it appeared he struck the City star in the face, prompting the Brazil international's furious reaction. (AFP)
