US slams Iran

Washington

Iran's Islamic revolution four decades ago has been a complete failure for the country, President Donald Trump said yesterday.

In a tweet written on the anniversary of the upheaval that was also sent out in Farsi, Trump said: "40 years of corruption. 40 years of repression. 40 years of terror. The regime in Iran has produced only #40YearsofFailure."

"The long-suffering Iranian people deserve a much brighter future," he added.

Airstrikes kill 16 civilians

Beirut

US-led coalition air strikes on the last Daesh pocket in Syria yesterday killed 16 civilians, including at least seven children, a war monitor said.

Eight women and one elderly man were also among the civilians killed while trying to flee towards the Iraqi border, said Rami Abdel Rahman, the head of the Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights.

The coalition was not immediately available for comment, but has repeatedly said it does its utmost to avoid targeting civilians.

The Cabinet yesterday, chaired by His Royal Highness Prime Minister Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa in the presence of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander and First Deputy Premier, endorsed a draft-law on

"Rehabilitation Justice for Children and their Protection from Ill-Treatment" that will replace the existing law.

The draft-law included non-conventional measures to prevent children from being taken away from their family environment and to protect them from ill-treatment and criminal accountability.

Under the new law, rehabilitation justice courts will be established to hear cases related to crimes committed by children over 15 years old at the time of the crime, and a "Judicial Child Committee", to be responsible for examining cases on children's ill-treatment or exposure to risks, will be set up.

The Cabinet, after being informed about the opinion of the

certain provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedures to fast-track investigation, trial and prosecution procedures, allowing the Public Prosecution and the courts to adopt modern audiovisual techniques and transport in all proceedings and in assessing the statements of the witnesses.

The amendments also ensure the protection of witnesses and develop easier solutions for precautionary measures, without prejudice to rights and freedoms.

The session referred a draft-law on amending some provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedures, issued as per Decree 46/ 2002, to the Council of Representatives.

Among other things, the Cabinet reviewed the results of a study conducted by the World Health Organisation (WHO) experts to verify the risks of electromagnetic emissions from telecommunications towers.

The experts concluded in their study that the manner in which telecommunications masts are managed in Bahrain complies with the international secure emission protocols, and that the existing masts have no impact on human health because their rate of radiation emission is very low, and is at safety levels.

Death sentence upheld for imam's murderer

The Court of Cassation yesterday upheld the death sentence handed down to the killer of Abduljalil Hmood, the Imam of Bin Shaddah Mosque.

The suspect had earlier been referred by the Public Prosecution for trial on charges of

premeditated murder, hiding evidences related to the crime and hiding the body after violating its sanctity.

The Public Prosecution launched an investigation following a notification on finding the body cut into pieces inside plastic bags in Al Mazra area near a scrap yard.

Examination, investigations

and technical reports confirmed that the body was of the Imam of Bin Shaddah Mosque who had been killed and cut into pieces by the Muezzin (caller for prayer).

The Public Prosecution referred the Muezzin for criminal

trial after all evidences, including the suspects' and eyewitnesses' testimonies as well as medical, forensic and technical reports, confirmed the accusations.

The High Criminal Court heard the case in the presence

of the suspect's lawyer and sentenced unanimously the suspect to death.

The suspect challenged the verdict before the Court of Appeals and then the Court of Cassation, which upheld the death sentence.

Works Ministry ex-assistant undersecretary loses appeal

A former assistant undersecretary at the Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning Ministry had his three-year imprisonment upheld yesterday for wasting more than BD4 million of public funds.

The Cassation Court rejected the defendant's appeal as he was found guilty, along with another defendant, of causing financial losses exceeding BD4 million

during the establishment of King Hamad University Hospital.

This came after the ministry

formed an investigative committee into the claims of mistakes made during the period of electrical works at the hospital.

The results of the committee's investigation found the former assistant undersecretary and an engineer guilty.

The investigations also showed that the total financial losses caused by the defendants to the project was BD41,64,000, an amount that was paid from the budget allocated by the ministry to implement the project.

Road traffic staff's jail term upheld in bribe case

An Arab national employed by the General Directorate of Traffic, who was sentenced to one year behind bars for accepting bribes, had his sentence upheld by the appeals court yesterday.

Two other Asian men stood trial with him in this case, but they were acquitted by the High Criminal Court earlier due to lack of evidence.

The Arab man is said to have been conning money out of people on the pretext that he could

sort out their traffic-related issues thanks to his job.

The two Asian men, on the other hand, were believed to have offered their first co-de-

fendant bribes to cancel their traffic violations despite knowing that it was an illegal act, according to court files.

The case was brought to light by one of the co-accused who filed a complaint against the Arab national.

"My car was confiscated by the traffic authorities and the Arab man promised me to take me out of all legal troubles for BD800. I gave him the money and he cheated me," the second accused told prosecutors.

The Arab man will be deported from Bahrain once he completes his jail time.

VAT seminar for unregistered businesses held

Key decision makers, including CFOs, heads of finance, chief accountants and lawyers, gathered at the Downtown Rotana in Manama yesterday to discuss how they and their businesses should react to VAT, described by one seasoned observer as the single most significant change to have impacted Bahraini businesses in living memory.

Mubeen Khadir, who heads Keypoint's tax practice, said that, while Bahrain's larg-

est businesses are now largely registered for VAT, it was clear that the government, businesses and advisers were all going to have to work together if implementation was to be a success.

"We saw in the UAE and Saudi that learning curves are steep and the consequences of mistakes can be sizeable. Businesses large and small – as well as the National Bureau for Revenue and tax advisers like us – can all learn from what went well, and not so well, with their peers

in other GCC countries – and also from the experiences of Bahrain's largest businesses over the last six weeks."

Presenters including Khadir and Chris Park, Raman Ohri and Tariq Haq, managers with Keypoint, discussed VAT fundamentals. Battle on for last IS pocket

AFP | Sousa, Syria

Syrian fighters backed by artillery fire from a US-led coalition battled a fierce jihadist fightback yesterday as they pushed to retake a last morsel of territory from the Islamic State group.

Mushrooming black clouds rose over the embattled jihadist holdout in eastern Syria, as missiles and a warplane streaked through the sky.

More than four years after the extremists declared a "caliphate" across large parts of Syria and neighbouring Iraq, several offensives have whittled that proto-state down to a tiny holdout.

The Kurdish-led Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) on Saturday announced the final push to expel hundreds of diehard jihadists from that patch on the Iraq border.

"IS launched a counterattack on our forces and we are now responding with rockets, air strikes and direct clashes," SDF spokesman Mustafa Bali told AFP Monday.

He said there were "dozens of SDF hostages held by IS" inside their last foothold, but denied

reports of executions.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, a Britain-based monitor, said the alliance of Kurdish and Arab fighters had pressed on yesterday morning in the face of tough obstacles.

"The SDF are advancing

slowly in what remains of the IS pocket" on the edges of the village of Baghouz, Observatory chief Rami Abdel Rahman said.

But landmines, IS snipers, and tunnels the extremists have dug out for their defence are hinder-

ing the advance, he said.

Backed by coalition air strikes, the SDF alliance has been battling to oust the jihadists from the eastern province of Deir Ezzor since September.

Screening for jihadists

Since December, tens of thousands of people, most women and children related to IS fighters, have fled to SDF territory.

US-backed forces have screened the new arrivals, weeding out potential jihadists for questioning.

On Monday, dozens of coalition and SDF fighters were stationed at a screening point for new arrivals from IS areas.

Coalition forces stood over about 20 men who were crouching on the ground.

Some 600 people were able to reach SDF territory on Sunday after fleeing the fighting, the Observatory said.

The SDF -- which has said it expects the final offensive to be over in days -- announced Sunday that it had taken some 40 positions from the jihadists following direct combat involving light weapons.

Armoured van driver disappears with 1 million euros

The driver of an armoured cash delivery van disappeared outside Paris early on Monday along with an estimated one million euros, police sources said.

The 28-year-old man had stopped in front of a Western Union office at around 6:00 am (0500 GMT) in Aubervilliers, a

suburb just north of the capital, and stayed behind the wheel as two of his colleagues went inside.

"When they came back out, the van and the driver were gone," one of the sources said.

The van was found soon afterwards a few blocks away with its doors wide open, but the driver and the bags of cash, worth some \$1.13 million, were nowhere to be found.

Loomis, the armoured van company, did not return calls seeking comment.

At least 99 dead after consuming toxic alcohol in northern India

New Delhi, India

At least 99 people have died and scores have been hospitalised in northern India after drinking toxic alcohol, triggering a crackdown against bootleggers, officials said yesterday.

News of the deaths in the states of Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand has trickled in over the past three days, with police suspecting the moonshine had been cut with methanol.

Cheap, locally-made liquor is common in parts of rural India and bootleggers often add methanol -- a highly toxic form of alcohol sometimes used as an anti-freeze -- to their product to increase its strength.

If ingested in large quantities, methanol can cause blindness, liver damage and death.

In one district of Uttar Pradesh 59 people had died after consuming toxic alcohol, police spokesman Shailendra

Kumar Sharma said.

In a neighbouring district a senior police officer said nine had died, adding that 66 suspected bootleggers had been arrested and samples of the liquor sent to a laboratory for testing.

Police said at least 31 people died in neighbouring Uttara-

khand state and that two had been arrested on suspicion of supplying the liquor.

Newspaper reports said around 3,000 people linked with the illegal trade were arrested across Uttar Pradesh in the aftermath of the tragedy.

Sala killed by head and trunk injuries: inquest

London, United Kingdom

Argentine footballer Emiliano Sala died of "head and trunk injuries", an inquest in England heard yesterday as it began to examine his death in a plane crash in the sea.

Sala, 28, had signed for English Premier League side Cardiff City and was flying to his new team from his old club Nantes in France when his plane went missing over the Channel on January 21.

The wreckage was located on the seabed. The striker's body was recovered but pilot David Ibbotson is still missing. The plane remains under the sea.

In a brief hearing in Bournemouth on the south coast, an inquest into Sala's death was opened, and adjourned until November 6 pending further inquiries. The post-mortem presented at the hearing gave Sala's cause of death as "head and trunk injuries".

Sala was formally identified by fingerprints.

In English law, inquests are held to examine sudden or unexplained deaths.

They set out to determine the identity of the deceased, the

place and time of death as well as how the deceased came by their death, but they do not apportion blame.

'You shouldn't give up'

Senior coroner's officer Ian Parry told the hearing that the plane "was located on the seabed in international waters."

"Following a closer examination of the site a body, later identified as Mr Sala, was found and recovered."

"To date the pilot, Mr Ibbotson, has not been found."

"Police, the Air Accidents Investigation Branch and the Civil Aviation Authority are continuing with their inquiries," he said.

A fundraising campaign to restart the search for Ibbotson is already more than half way to its £300,000 (\$385,000, 340,000 euro) target.

"If you've got hope then you shouldn't give up," his daughter Danielle told ITV television.

"He wouldn't stop searching for me."

Nantes gave a final rousing send off to Sala with a series of

moving gestures in their Ligue 1 match against Nimes on Sunday.

Known as the Canaries due to their yellow kit, Nantes played in a one-off full black outfit with Sala's name on the back of each shirt.

Tickets for the game were sold at a symbolic nine euros (\$10) in memory of the player's shirt number, which they have also withdrawn.

Before Saturday's Premier League match between Southampton and visitors Cardiff, a minute's silence was observed.

4 killed as hospital torched in Cameroon's anglophone west

Douala, Cameroon

Four people died when gunmen raided a hospital and burnt it to the ground in western Cameroon where anglophone separatists have been fighting troops, witnesses and a local official said yesterday.

The incident occurred in Kumba, a town which serves as the commercial hub for the anglophone region and which has been badly hit by the violence between separatists and Cameroon troops that began in October 2017.

"Attackers killed four peo-

ple and burnt down the hospital," said an administrative official in the Kumba region, confirming information from a witness.

It was not immediately clear whether the victims were shot or died in the fire, nor whether they were patients at the facility.

The incident occurred on National Youth Day, the anniversary of the 1961 referendum which saw Cameroon's western English-speaking areas joined onto the francophone areas which had just won independence from France.

Russia jails IS pair for 15 years


Moscow, Russia

ARussian court on Monday jailed two members of the Islamic State group for 15 years for planning attacks on a mall and public transport in Moscow, news agencies reported.

Bakhtiyor Makhmudov and Zafarkhon Rakhmatov from Muslim-majority Tajikistan will serve their sentences in a "strict regime camp", a court statement said.

Russia's FSB security service arrested the duo in December 2017.

Trump takes border campaign to El Paso

El Paso, United States

President Donald Trump takes his politically explosive push for walling off the Mexican border to the frontier city of El Paso yesterday, four days before a deadline for Congress to meet his demands.

According to Trump, illegal immigrants pose a national security risk to the United States and can only be stopped by dramatic extensions of current barriers.

Trump chose El Paso as a historic crossing point where, he says, walls have eradicated an out-of-control influx of criminals from Mexico and made the city a model for what could happen elsewhere on the

border. But there'll be a counter-message a short distance from where Trump speaks when rising Democratic star Beto O'Rourke -- a possible challenger to Trump in 2020 -- holds his own rally.

A former congressman who excited grassroots Democrats last November with an against-the-odds near upset of Republican Senator Ted Cruz, O'Rourke is from El Paso.

"While some try to stoke fear and paranoia, to spread lies and a false narrative about the US-Mexico border and to demand a 2,000 mile wall along it at a time of record safety and security, El Paso will come together for a march and celebration that highlights the truth," O'Rourke's office said.

Germany wants more women in politics

Forced parity is fundamentally anti-democratic though it is aimed at attaining equality

Women in Germany won the right to vote in 1918, but a century later they still do not enjoy equal representation. Though the country is led by a woman — who will, most likely, be succeeded by another woman — fewer than a third of the members of the federal Parliament, the Bundestag, are female.

That's why leading figures from all major German parties are now calling for parity: a 50-50 quota for male and female representatives in the Bundestag and the 16 state-level parliaments. But is achieving a gender balance in Germany's legislatures worth weakening another hard-fought accomplishment, the right to free electoral choice?

This week the Parliament in Brandenburg became the first to require all political parties to nominate an even slate for state elections, starting in late 2020. The centre-left Social Democratic Party is pushing for a similar rule for national elections. The party is already informally enforcing such a rule in its selection of candidates for the coming European Parliament elections, in May, in the process overruling the results of local party votes.

Most people can agree that equal representation in our elected bodies is a desirable goal. In a democracy, the people's representatives should look like the people. Laws that put more women onto the field might look like a good start. And parity laws achieve that goal.

"I am not a great fan of quotas, but I like the results they bring," said Viviane Reding, a former commissioner of the European Union.

But parity laws come at too high a price. Forced parity would turn unequal representation, at least in part, into forced representation. It would question voter judgment and pre-engineer a certain result. It would impair the freedom of parties to nominate their best candidates. It would install a discriminatory principle that could eventually swing back at the very group it aims to emancipate.

Nor will quotas, in the immediate term, do anything to overturn the root causes of gender disparity in political representation. The problem, not only in politics, is an unlevel playing field for men and women. Thousands of years of patriarchy ex-

ert their influence in thousands of ways. First, we have to tackle those.

For example, we should ask what keeps women from entering politics in the first place. Legislative sessions, from local councils to the Bundestag, are

time-intensive and family-unfriendly, often running late into the night. And in German society, for all its pretensions to gender equality, a woman is expected to be the primary caregiver, while it is less acceptable for a man to tell his superiors that he has to go home earlier to get the kids' supper or put them to bed.

Men and women are entitled to care for their families equally if they want to. It is every man's duty to make this clear to his boss. And, if his boss doesn't listen, it is the job of legislators to help change the rules so that he has to.

A second factor is unconscious bias. For instance, a deep male voice is often associated with authority, whereas a female voice has less social clout and gets easier talked over. Too often this becomes an onus on women. Recently, the German

chancellor, Angela Merkel, stated that "for a woman, commanding authority is something she needs to learn." Margaret Thatcher underwent special training to lower her voice.

Can anyone imagine the opposite: a male politician striving to sound more like a woman because the power struggle demands it? There you go. Too many women see these informal but powerful rules stacked against them, and stay away from politics altogether.

Unconscious bias can't be legislated away. But it can be fought in the public sphere, through government and private campaigns to raise awareness of the unseen barriers that keep women from engaging in politics.

In fact, Germany may be well on its way. Women already have proportionally more representation in the Bundestag than men,

when compared with their political engagement: The share of women in the Social Democrats' parliamentary caucus is 42 per cent, even though women make up 32pc of the party's membership. The Greens do even better: Women enjoy a majority in the caucus, while they make up 40pc of their membership.

Merkel's center-right Christian Democrats, the largest party in the Bundestag, perform less well, with about 25pc in each category. Yet the party has been led by a woman, Merkel, for 19 years, and in December it passed over two men to elect another woman, Annegret Kramp-Karrenbauer, as its new leader.

In other words, absent a quota, Germany is not about to reach gender parity in politics, but it is steadily moving in that direction — and will make even more strides if, in the meantime, it tackles some of the underlying issues keeping women from entering the field in the first place.

One of the virtues of a gender-blind democracy, like the one established under Germany's postwar Constitution, is that we can let these social changes play out as far as society wants. It's not hard to imagine a day when the makeup is flipped, and women constitute 70pc of the Bundestag.

And that, above all, is the problem with quotas. I asked one of its proponents, a young Social Democrat named Kevin Kühnert, if his party's parity rule would allow it to put up more than 50pc women as its nominees. No, he said — it had to be 50-50. This is where the idea comes back to haunt its inventors. I had always thought that equal opportunity for women meant something else.

It is well known that the Republic of Indonesia is the world's largest Muslim country. However, the development of Islamic economy including Islamic finance is still far from its potential. For example, despite Islamic finance in Indonesia has officially existed for more than two decades in the country, the market share of Islamic banking in the country is still

standing at around 6pc of the total banking assets.

Uniquely, unlike most top Islamic financial centers such as the Kingdom of Bahrain which focus more on the wholesale segment, the Islamic financial market in Indonesia is strongly retail-oriented and segmented in a distinctive way, making it a lot more complex than other countries. The market structure consists of several layers that have loosely defined boundaries with overlaps that are sometimes disputed among the players.

Despite the above challenges, Indonesia has some unique strengths. The country has the largest number of Islamic financial institu-

tions (formal and informal), it is the first country and the only one that issues retail Sukuk, it is the first country that has Islamic online trading system (SOTS) in capital market sector, and the first and the only one that implements the concept of Baitul Maal wat Tamwil. In addition, it has more regulations pertaining to Islamic finance than any other countries even though they are scattered and sometimes split between too many regulators.


Based on the above challenges and potentials, the government of Indonesia has recently established a National Islamic Finance Committee known in Indonesia as KNKS mandated to lead, coor-

dinate and synergise the efforts of all Islamic economy's stakeholders. Given the importance role that the committee plays, KNKS is directly chaired by the President of Indonesia His Excellency Joko Widodo. The main functions of KNKS are to fasten, widen, and advance the development of Islamic Economy in the country in order to support national economic development.

According to the Presidential Decree No. 91/2016, the roles of KNKS are as follows: (1) To make the policy and strategy recommendations; (2) To coordinate, monitor, and evaluate the planning and the implementation of strategic programs; (3) To promote the research

and innovation for product development of Islamic finance; and (4) To look for solutions on various strategic problems in the development of Islamic finance. KNKS has a Masterplan for Indonesian Islamic Financial Architecture and is currently finalising the Masterplan for Indonesian Islamic Economy. KNKS' vision is to make Indonesia as the world's prominent centre of Islamic Economy.

The main programmes of KNKS are to (1) Establish strong and resilient state owned Islamic banks; (2) Create the country's first full-fledged Islamic Investment Bank; (3) Establish an Indonesian based world class takaful operator; (4)

The alarming allure of Australia's brumbies

The environment is being sacrificed for a national myth

Since this country's founding in the early 20th century, the packs of untamed horses that roam freely through our beautiful and hostile alpine landscape have captured the public's imagination. The savage grace and freedom of the horses — known here as brumbies — have made them into a popular symbol of the national spirit.

Today, environmentalists want the brumbies shot.

Not since cattle roamed the mountain parks (before a ban in the 1950s) have animals done such damage to the alpine regions that Australians proudly call the "high country."

A 2014 survey estimated there were more than 9,500 wild horses in the Australian Alps. Some of the horses descend from animals that belonged to settlers in the early 1,800s.

The brumbies eat fragile alpine moss. Their hoofs trample the banks of creeks, killing vegetation that stops silt from building up. They destroy peat that takes thousands of years to develop. Campers report the fear of being trampled by herds in the middle of the night.

Populations of rare alpine water skinks and broad-toothed rats are declining as the brumbies degrade their habitats. Three endangered species — the corroboree frog, the mountain pygmy possum and the stocky galaxias, a fish found in only one river system — are at risk unless the number of horses is reduced quickly, scientists say.

The environment is being sacrificed for a national myth. The cultural bias for brumbies has helped the tourism industry — reinforced by anti-scientific sentiment among rural communities — to successfully lobby government officials to end an annual culling of the horses.

The animals are now a protected species. And the government of

New South Wales State enacted a law last year ending a program that had aimed to gradually reduce the brumby numbers over the long term in the Alps' largest reserve, the Kosciuszko National Park.

Misguided military lore increased the horses' mystique. During World War I, Australian mounted units called the Light Horse Brigades served with distinction in Gallipoli and Beersheba in the Sinai Desert, where they carried out a famous charge at entrenched Turkish soldiers over open ground.

Some of the Light Horse soldiers came from the high country. Many Australians believe that brumbies made an important contribution to the horse regiments. Among them is the deputy premier of New South Wales, John Barilaro, the politician responsible for shielding them today.

"Nothing is more synonymous with the Australian outdoor lifestyle than the brumby," Barilaro told the legislature when he intro-

duced a pro-brumby law.

The war story doesn't stand up. The Australian army preferred Waler, a sturdy breed that could travel long distances in hot climates with little water, and a study for the New South Wales National Parks Service found no evidence that brumbies were ever used by the army.

In alpine national parks, even a small number of horses can cause

severe damage because the sensitive environment recovers very slowly.

The legend of the bush battler resisting state authority has become a central and often-irresistible rationale for the protection of rural interests at the expense of scientific and political progress. Australians' attachment to rural legends is exploited by local politicians to deliver their communities' wish lists — from counter-productive subsidies for farmers who haven't prepared for drought to the construction of an inland railway line of dubious value.

Opposition to culling is also driven by a hostility among local communities towards environmentalists and government conservationists. A leading proponent of the new state law is a former conservative politician who now makes a living organising horse rides in the park.

The horse advocates' success has emboldened activists across the border in Victoria State, where in December a judge was

asked to stop the government from removing wild horses from the Bogong High Plains section of the Alpine National Park. A decision is expected this year.

To apply political pressure, dozens of scientists published an open letter in November arguing that the decision gave priority to a single invasive species over many native species and ecosystems, some of which are found nowhere else on Earth. These scientists advocate shooting horses from helicopters right away (large parts of the park are inaccessible by vehicle). Barilaro, the politician, says Australians' "social conscience" won't accept shooting, and they should be moved to less-vulnerable areas of the reserve.

Safeguarding a nation's cultural heritage is as important as protecting its environmental heritage. But a fantasy, however appealing, should not be allowed to outweigh good science.

US team in Beijing after IMF warning

● Hopes to reach a deal before March 1 deadline set by Trump

● Talks will include officials from the agriculture, energy and commerce departments

Beijing, China

US negotiators were in Beijing yesterday for a new round of high-stakes trade talks, hoping to reach a deal before the March 1 deadline set by Donald Trump as the IMF warned of a possible global economic "storm".

Preliminary discussions had been expected to start on Monday, according to the White House, before US Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer and Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin step in for the main event on Thursday and Friday.

In December, Washington suspended for three months its plan to increase tariffs on \$200 billion worth of Chinese imports -- to 25 per cent from the current 10pc -- to allow time for negotiators to work out a trade spat that has triggered fears of a global economic slowdown.

Deputy trade representative Jeffrey Gerrish was due to lead the US delegation in preparatory meetings to begin on Monday, the White House had said.

The talks will include officials from the agriculture, energy and commerce departments.

Gerrish left his hotel in central Beijing on Monday morning

without talking to the media. Neither side offered any confirmation that talks actually started.

Mnuchin and Lighthizer will be joined by David Malpass, Trump's nominee for president of the World Bank who has worked to limit the bank's assistance to Beijing.

The Chinese delegation will be led by Vice Premier Liu He, who will be joined by central bank governor Yi Gang.

Liu, China's chief trade negotiator, met last month with Trump, who announced that a final resolution of the trade dispute would depend on a meeting with Chinese President Xi Jin-

ping "in the near future" to iron out the "more difficult points" fuelling the spat.

While the two sides said major progress was made after talks last month in Washington, more recent comments have jarred financial markets, amplifying concerns about how the dispute will affect global growth.

Trump said last week that he did not expect to meet his Chinese counterpart before the trade truce expires on March 1, and top White House economic adviser Larry Kudlow said that while Trump was "optimistic" about a deal, a "sizeable distance" still separated the two sides.

Washington is demanding far-reaching changes from China to address commercial practices that it says are deeply unfair, including theft of American

intellectual property and myriad barriers that US and other foreign companies face in the Chinese domestic market.

China has offered to boost its purchases of US goods during the truce, but is likely to resist calls for structural changes to its industrial policy including slashing government subsidies, said Louis Kuijs of Oxford Economics.

"The US side will not fully remove the spectre of tariff hikes any time soon," Kuijs said, given that there is "broad support in the US for a hard stance on China".

The two sides have already slapped tariffs on more than \$360 billion in two-way trade, which has weighed on the two countries' manufacturing sectors and sent jitters through global markets.

Economic storm

The International Monetary Fund warned on Sunday of a possible economic "storm" as growth forecasts dip.

It cited the trade row as one of four "clouds" over the global economy, along with financial tightening, Brexit uncertainty, and China's slowdown.

"We have no idea how it (the trade dispute) is going to pan

out and what we know is that it is already beginning to have an effect on trade, on confidence and on markets," IMF managing director Christine Lagarde told the World Government Summit in Dubai.

Last month, the IMF lowered its global economic growth forecast for this year from 3.7 per cent to 3.5pc.

Australia formally signed a Aus\$50 billion "strategic partnership" with France to build 12 state-of-the-art submarines yesterday, a signal of Canberra's willingness to project power across the Pacific.

The partnership's main pillar is a contract for France's Naval Group to build 12 attack-class submarines and has been years in the making.

At roughly US\$35 billion this is Australia's largest ever defence procurement project and the largest ever foreign sales deal by French shipbuilder Naval Group.

UK posts slowest growth in six years as Brexit looms

London, United Kingdom

The British economy grew at its slowest pace in six years in 2018, data showed Monday, as Brexit uncertainty grips the country and fears grow that Britain could crash out of the EU without a deal.

The bleak official figures came as the British government seeks to win more time to secure EU concessions on Brexit that could pass parliament and avert a chaotic split from the bloc on March 29.

Businesses are on edge with Britain just weeks away from its scheduled departure from the European project after 46 years and still with no firm arrangements in place.

The UK parliament last month roundly rejected a Brexit deal Prime Minister Theresa May had sealed with the remaining 27 EU leaders.

Monday's figures followed data last week that showed Britain's dominant service sector almost ground to a halt in January.

"The economy is clearly struggling in the first quarter of 2019 amid serious business and consumer caution resulting from heightened Brexit uncertainties while weaker global growth is also impacting the figures," noted Howard Archer, chief economic advisor at the EY ITEM Club.

Last year gross domestic product growth stood at 1.4 percent, down from 1.8 percent in 2017, the Office for National Statistics said Monday.

Growth was meanwhile only 0.2 per cent in the last three months of 2018, the ONS said in a statement.

"Construction, production and services output fell in the month (of December), the first time that there has been such a broad-based fall in monthly output since September 2012," the ONS said.

Britain has been in a state of political turmoil for two months since the Brexit deal was agreed in December.

In an incident heavy with symbolism, parts of parliament were cordoned off Monday after a large piece of masonry fell onto a parked vehicle over the weekend.

600,000 jobs under threat

Meanwhile in Luxembourg the EU's chief Brexit negotiator Michel Barnier called for "clarification and movement" from Britain.

He also said British opposition leader Jeremy Corbyn's proposal for a permanent customs union with the EU was an "interesting" one.

Concern is growing on both sides of the Channel.

Researchers at the IWH In-

stitute in Halle, eastern Germany on Monday said a no-deal Brexit could put 600,000 jobs around the world at risk, with Germany the hardest hit.

The institute examined what would happen if UK imports from the remaining EU fell 25 percent after Brexit.

They reckoned some 103,000 jobs would be under threat in Germany, Europe's largest economy, with the car industry the worst affected sector.

Global growth slowdown

Monday's economic data came after the Bank of England last week slashed its forecast for UK growth this year to 1.2 percent from 1.7 percent, blaming the downgrade on a global economic slowdown and "the fog of Brexit".

The Bank of England last week warned that Britain's economic output was also being dragged down by a global slowdown, with growth dampening in China, the United States and eurozone.

Weak oil prices led to falls in most Gulf stock markets yesterday, while Qatar and Dubai were dragged lower by their blue-chip bank stocks.

Qatar's index fell 1.3 per cent as the Middle East's largest lender Qatar National Bank slid 5.2pc, its biggest intraday loss since June 2017. The stock gained more than 65pc last year after QNB announced plans to lift its foreign ownership ceiling to 49pc from 25pc.

Dubai's index was down 1.3pc, partially due to a 1.5pc drop in Emirates NBD.

The Emirate's largest listed developer Emaar Properties fell 1.5pc. Dubai's property stocks

have been struggling and show no signs of recovery.

"The UAE (United Arab Emirates) has managed a soft landing, with a less pronounced cycle than in 2008. We expect non-oil real GDP growth to have bottomed as the fiscal drag eases and infrastructure activity picks up. We expect overall UAE real GDP growth to pick up but the real estate sector remains a drag," BoFa Merrill Lynch said in a note.

Dubai Investments slumped 6pc to a six-year low. The stock has been sliding since the firm said it had bought the 66pc in Globalpharma it did not already own. On Monday, the firm said

the value of the deal was confidential and its disclosure was subject to Globalpharma's consent.

Saudi Arabia's stock market lost 0.4pc, with Al Rajhi Bank shedding 0.8pc and Saudi Basic Industries down 0.7pc.

In first week of February, foreigners bought 920.7 million riyals (\$245.51 million) of Saudi stocks on a net basis, according to stock exchange data.

Al Yamamah Steel Industries Company was down 4.1pc after it posted a first-quarter net loss of 30.2 million riyals compared with a profit of 6.7 million riyals a year ago.

The Abu Dhabi index slid 0.7pc, with the country's largest lender First Abu Dhabi Bank shedding 0.9pc.

Waha Capital declined 8pc to a five-year low. It dived 10pc on Thursday after reporting a plunge in its full-year net profit and slashing its dividend by half.

Egypt's blue-chip index edged up 0.1pc with the country's biggest lender Commercial International Bank gaining 1.7pc.



pressed her disdain in a series of since-deleted tweets at the fact Mac Miller, who was nominated posthumously for best rap album, lost out to Cardi B.

Accompanied on stage by her husband Offset, Cardi thanked her daughter Kulture Kiari for giving her the impetus to finish the record on time.

Lady Gaga won three prizes, including best pop performance

for Joanne and best pop duet for Shallow, from the Oscar-nominated film A Star Is Born.

Holding back tears, the star thanked Bradley Cooper, her co-star and director, who missed the Grammys to attend The Baftas in London.

She also used her speech to highlight the film's mental health message, telling the audience: "If you see someone that's hurting,

don't look away."

And Emily Lazar, who worked on Beck's Colors album, became the first woman in Grammys history to win best engineered album.

But while the Grammys has made strides with female artists, it still needs to repair its image in the hip-hop community.

At one point, host Alicia Keys awkwardly had to fill time when no-one came forward to accept the song of the year award on his behalf.

Former first lady Michelle Obama also made a surprise appearance, giving a speech about the unifying power of music alongside Lady Gaga, Jada Pinkett-Smith, Jennifer Lopez and Alicia Keys.

Ronaldo keeps scoring as Juve soar 11 points clear

Cristiano Ronaldo headed in his 18th league goal this season as Juventus bounced back from last week's stalemate to soar to an 11-point lead in Serie A on Sunday with a 3-0 win at Sassuolo.

Ronaldo proved decisive, scoring after 70 minutes as Sami Khedira found the net first in Modena with fellow German Emre Can slotting in the third four minutes from time.

The Serie A champions had been held by Parma last week despite the Portuguese forward's double.

Now they have left second-placed Napoli trailing after Carlo Ancelotti's side were held to a goalless draw at Fiorentina on Saturday.

Paulo Dybala again started on the bench coming on late for the champions, to help set up the third goal, with coach Massimiliano Allegri saying he needed to find the right balance.

"Ronaldo and Dybala can certainly play together and they will do, but we need everyone to work hard in order to keep the team balanced," said Allegri.

"It all depends on who you are playing against. Sassuolo have a strong midfield, so I had to balance my team that way today.

"Players are disappointed, but every now and then sitting on the bench is necessary to recharge batteries and rediscover the right mental toughness."

Juventus had started slowly with goalkeeper Wojciech Szczęsny saving twice in the opening minutes as the champions were without injured defenders Leonardo Bonucci and Giorgio Chiellini.

The pair are fighting to be fit for Juventus's European Champions League last 16 trip to Atletico Madrid in 10 days' time.

Juventus broke through after Sassuolo goalkeeper Andrea Consigli rushed out to parry a Ronaldo shot leaving the way clear for Khedira to turn in the rebound after 23 minutes.

It was the German international's second league goal of his injury-hit campaign, after scoring the opening goal of the Serie A season against Chievo on August 18.

Consigli denied Federico Bernardeschi just before the break with a Khedira header flying wide.

But Portuguese star Ronaldo jumped highest after 70 minutes to meet Pjanic's corner for his fourth goal in his last three league games to bring his tally to 20 goals for Juventus in all competitions.

The 34-year-old celebrated by mimicking Dybala's 'mask' goal celebration.

Argentine Dybala came off the bench seven minutes from

time along with Can and was involved in the buildup for the final goal with Ronaldo proving the assist.

Champions League battle tight

Inter Milan are third -- 20 points behind Juventus -- after beating Parma 1-0 on Saturday, for their first league win of 2019.

But city rivals AC Milan are just four points behind Inter in fourth after beat struggling Cagliari 3-0, with new signings Lucas Paqueta and Krzysztof Piatek both scoring.

Cagliari defender Luca Cepitelli gave the hosts their first with an unfortunate own goal after 12 minutes.

Brazilian Paqueta volleyed in the second after 22 minutes

with Polish forward Piatek again finding the net after 62 for his fourth goal in all competitions.

Paqueta dedicated his first goal in Italy to the ten victims of the fire that ripped through buildings at Rio club Flamengo, where he started his career.

"It was a very difficult time for me," said the 21-year-old.

"I am living a dream playing for Milan and scoring my first Serie A goal, but it was also a dream for me to be in the Flamengo youth academy and I can't forget those who were experiencing the same thing."

The battle for elite European football remains tight with Atalanta, Roma and Lazio all just a point behind AC Milan.

The side from Bergamo battled to a 2-1 win over SPAL, with Roma beating Chievo 3-0 and Lazio seeing off Empoli 1-0 during the week.

"I've liked the team for a while now," said coach Gennaro Gattuso.

"Milan haven't fought for many years for a place in the Champions League, now we are here we need to work to stay."

Azpilicueta says sorry to Chelsea fans after Man City drubbing

Cesar Azpilicueta has apologised to Chelsea fans after their humiliating 6-0 defeat by Manchester City, describing it as one of the lowest points in his professional career.

Maurizio Sarri's team crashed to their heaviest loss since 1991 as the Premier League champions ran riot at the Etihad Stadium on Sunday.

The heavy defeat saw Chelsea slip below Arsenal to sixth in the table on goals scored and raised further questions over the future of Sarri.

"It's difficult to find the words to describe my feeling after the game," defender Azpilicueta, who was given a torrid time by two-goal City winger Raheem Sterling, told the club's website.

"It is one of the worst nights in my career. It's very frustrating, it's very disappointing."

"When you lose 6-0 everyone has to accept they didn't play well. The only thing I can say to the fans is 'sorry', because it's not acceptable, and I feel sorry for all of them."

It was Chelsea's third defeat in four Premier League games, coming after a 2-0 loss at Arsenal and a 4-0 thrashing by Bournemouth. The only relief during that period was a 5-0 victory over bottom side Huddersfield.

Barcelona give fresh hope to La Liga rivals after Athletic Bilbao stalemate

Barca was saved by Ter Stegen as Suarez struggled

Lionel Messi was short of fitness and Barcelona lacked spark as a goalless draw away to Athletic Bilbao on Sunday offered fresh hope to their rivals in the title race.

A thigh injury had limited Messi to 27 minutes against Real Madrid on Wednesday and while he played the full match at San Mames, Barca's assistant coach Jon Aspiazu had admitted before kick-off he was not yet 100 per cent.

In all likelihood, he stayed on because his team needed him but Messi was not at his best and neither were Barcelona, who would even have lost had it not been for Marc Andre ter Stegen's stunning late save to deny Inaki Williams.

"He saved us," coach Ernesto Valverde said. "It was a great stop."

The draw makes it three games without a win for La Liga's leaders, whose advantage is still six points but now with Real Madrid their closest challengers, after they beat Atletico on Saturday.

"We were first last week and

we are still first, and if my maths is right, we will be again next week," Valverde said.

But Real's victory at the Wanda Metropolitano was their fifth on the bounce and just as they have gained momentum, Barca appear to be losing theirs, at a crucial juncture, with more stern tests to come.

After Real Valladolid at home next weekend, Valverde's side travel to Lyon in the Champions League and Sevilla in the league. They then face two Clasicos in four days, one in the Copa del Rey, and both at the Santiago Bernabeu.

"We are playing a lot of games at the moment and that shows," Luis Suarez said. "We also lacked communication today -- it is the little details that make a difference."

Injuries have not helped either. Messi was picked but not fully recovered while Ousmane Dembele was fit enough only for the bench, having shaken off an ankle injury.

Coutinho struggling

The struggling Philippe Coutinho retained his place alongside Suarez and Messi up front but Arturo Vidal came in for the injured Arthur Melo and Nelson Semedo started at left back, with Jordi Alba suspended.

Bilbao had the better of the early stages as Yuri Berchiche flashed just wide after a poor pass from Vidal while Markel Susaeta's drive forced the leaping Ter Stegen into an acrobatic save.

Barcelona settled into the game but were never in con-

trol. Still, they twice should have scored, with Messi and Suarez both guilty of missing.

First, Suarez peeled free at the back post but glanced wide from Messi's cross and then Messi hit the crossbar, the goal gaping after Iago Herrerin had rushed out to intercept Nelson Semedo.

The game was frantic and Bilbao were more than holding their own. Raul Garcia's finish was blocked and Mikel San Jose's effort whistled inches outside the post.

In between, Barca had enjoyed their best spell at the start of the second half but the gaps

always seemed to close around the penalty area and they struggled to find a way through.

Dembele replaced Coutinho with just over 10 minutes left but Bilbao had the best chance to win it. Iker Muniain squared for Williams, who looked certain to score after wriggling free of Gerard Pique. Instead, Ter Stegen shot out his right hand, somehow denying the striker from eight yards.

De Marcos received a second yellow card in injury-time for a handball but there was no time for Barce to feel the benefit. Bilbao held on.

Martial can reach Ronaldo's level, says Man Utd boss Solskjaer

Anthony Martial has the talent to reach Cristiano Ronaldo's level if he puts his mind to it, according to Manchester United caretaker boss Ole Gunnar Solskjaer.

Martial had looked set to leave the club in the summer after falling out with Jose Mourinho but battled his way back into the Portuguese manager's plans.

Last month, with Solskjaer now at the helm at Old Trafford, he signed a deal keeping him at the club until at least 2024.

The France international marked his first start since that contract with an assist and a superb second in the 3-0 win against Fulham, where his fine solo goal led ex-United captain Gary Neville to compare it to a Ronaldo effort at Craven Cottage in 2007.

"He does have similarities, of course," said Solskjaer, who replaced the sacked Mourinho in December. "If he wants to be at Cristiano's level, Anthony knows what he has to do. It's up to him. He has the talent."

"I am glad he is in my team," the Norwegian added. "He has contributed to so many chances, so many goals. He is a Manchester United player. He excites the crowd. He excites the manager. He excites his teammates. And he is a great

character around the place."

Martial, 23, who became the most expensive teenager in history when he moved to United from Monaco in 2015 for an initial £36 million (\$46 million), has scored 47 goals for the club.

Ronaldo scored 118 goals in 292 appearances for United, winning the Premier League three times and the Champions League.


United play Paris Saint-Germain in the first leg of their Champions League quarter-final on Tuesday, bolstered by Neymar's injury, but Solskjaer said the absence of the Brazilian would be a loss.

"When you play against the best teams, you want to play against the players," he said. "The crowd want to see the best players. Too bad for Old Trafford."

"I have played a couple of games when we played Real Madrid and (Brazil's) Ronaldo and (Luis) Figo and all those were coming to Old Trafford. That gives it an extra edge."

"Unfortunately for Neymar he is injured but of course he is a quality player. I think our right-back thinks it is not too bad he will not be here."

Solskjaer says perfect time for confident United to play PSG

Manchester United's return to Champions League action against Paris Saint-Germain today has come at the perfect time, according to caretaker manager Ole Gunnar Solskjaer after a run of 10 wins and one draw since the Norwegian took charge.

When the two sides were paired together in December's draw, PSG were strong favourites to make the last eight, with United mired in the final days of Jose Mourinho's troublesome tenure.

However, the mood around Old Trafford is transformed two months on as Solskjaer has overturned an 11-point deficit to break into the top four of the Premier League and beaten Arsenal away to reach the fifth round of the FA Cup.

"We've given ourselves the best possible opportunity with the way we've gone into this game because we are confident," said Solskjaer yesterday.

"I've found out what kind of team we have. We are playing like a team, we are agreeing on how we should approach games. If there was ever a time to go into big games like this it is now."
