Disabled father saves family from burning house

A Bahraini family of three miraculously escaped a fire that devastated their house in the Capital Governorate yesterday.

The disabled father, who first discovered the fire by 10:30 pm, heroically saved the mother and daughter who were sleeping

who were sleeping.

The father, Abdulhameed Ahmed, told *DT News* that he saw flashes coming from his daughter's room.

He found out that it was coming from the air-conditioning unit, which quickly caught fire. "My daughter was asleep at the time. I woke her up immediately, got outside the smoke-filled room and then assisted her mother to exit the house," he said.

Mr Abdulhameed then managed to get in his wheelchair and exit the one-story house before he alerted the Civil Defence.

Civil Defence reached quickly and extinguished the fire, with the assistance of a few neighbours.

Civil Defence fire fighters attributed the fire to an electric short-circuit in the air-conditioning unit, as confirmed by Interior Ministry.

At least 80% of the furniture was destroyed in the fire.

The recent reports revolving around "the widespread swine flu in Bahrain" have been the main concern for citizens and residents alike in the country, despite official statements confirming that "the disease is under control and that it poses no threat to the public."

News posted on local social media accounts yesterday, claiming that "first death due to H1N1 in Bahrain has been confirmed", apparently made people flock to health centres in order to get vaccinated against the disease, as many pictures taken there showed.



Subsidy redirection benefits citizens

The recent decision to redirect subsidies has proven that commercial establishments were benefiting from the subsidised meat products in the past and not the eligible beneficiaries (household), it has been revealed.

This was stated by Information Affairs, Shura Council and Parliament Affairs Minister Isa bin Abdulrahman Al Hammadi during the post-Cabinet Press conference that was held at Gudaibiya Palace yesterday.

Confirming that the decision will remain in effect, the minister mentioned that citizens only benefitted from

20% of the subsidised meat products in the past, while the remaining 80% went to non-Bahrainis, hotels and restaurants, which mainly used them for commercial purposes.

"The main beneficiaries of decision to remove the meat subsidies are the citizens," the minister confirmed, adding that the direct fund compensation scheme to citizens is the best way to benefit them.

As reported earlier, the Government has decided, in consensus with the National Assembly (Shura Council and Parliament) to scrap meat subsidies, as part of the endeavours to cut government expenses. It has been reported that BD67 million was dedicated to support meat products in local markets in 2014.

After several delays, the scheme came into effect on October 1. However, despite several calls from Parliamentarians to delay it once more, the government showed no intention to withdraw the decision.

Cabinet lauds King's address

The Cabinet yesterday The Capiner, seed lauded the address delivered by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa at the opening of the second session of the Fourth Legislative Term of the National Assembly.

Chairing the regular Cabinet weekly session, at the regular Gudaibiya Palace, attended by His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander and First Deputy Prime Minister, HRH Premier stressed that the directives and issues embedded in the royal address will top the government's priorities, being a strategic vision about the future at the local and international levels.

The Cabinet discussed amendments to the executive bill of the Municipalities Law, especially Article 42 pertaining to budget spending orders, and Article 72 regarding the fees on land reclamation.

The Cabinet reviewed the recommendations submitted by the Deputy Premier and Chairman of the Ministerial Committee for Financial Affairs and Rationalising Expenditure in this regard, and referred them to the Ministerial Committee for Legal Affairs.

The Cabinet discussed five proposals submitted by the Parliament. They included the allocation government land housing projects in Muharraq, housing units for divorcees and widows, the establishment of specialised dentistry centres, a youth centre at the Capital Governorate's tenth constituency and a secondary school for girls that serves the towns and villages located along the Budaiya Highway.

The Cabinet referred to the Parliament the government's replies to the five proposals, as recommended by the Ministerial Committee for Legal Affairs.

It has been officially recognised that social media networks had a big role in spreading fears among the public. This motivated the state to pay more efforts to curb the quick spread of false news on online platforms, by intensifying cooperation between government authorities to deliver the truth to the public.

Speaking at a Press conference that followed the weekly Cabinet meeting yesterday, Information Affairs and Shura Council and Parliament Affairs Minister and the Official Government Spokesperson Isa bin Abdulrahman Al Hammadi said, "The power of social media sites has been locally and globally recognised.

Therefore, there's an urgent need to educate people on the appropriate use of it."

We can't demand the public to cease using them to communicate. In fact, we are pushing government entities to improve interaction with the public through social media websites, even before publishing official statement in the local press," the minister said, underlining the significance of social media networks nowadays.

He also mentioned that "when rumours appeared on the spread of swine flu in Bahrain recently, Health and Information Affairs Ministries posted on their social media pages that the matter would be discussed in an extraordinary TV show on the same night."

"Such procedures are needed to combat the rumours swarming social media networks and deceiving the public," Mr Al Hammadi commented, adding that the country has set certain regulations that criminalise online illegal activities such as insults.

'Don't politicise objectives'

Human rights organisation told to be non-political and avoid taking biased stance

The Kingdom has called upon the human rights organisations not to politicise their objectives and to avoid biased stances. This observation came during a recent forum titled "International Nongovernmental Organisations and Institutions between Professionalism Politicisation", which was organised by Bahrain Center for Strategic, International and Energy Studies (Derasat).

Deputising Foreign Affairs Minister Shaikh Khalid bin Ahmed Al Khalifa at the forum was the Minister's Assistant for Foreign Affairs Ambassador Abdullah bin Faisal bin Jabr Al Dossari.

In his speech, Mr Al Dossary stressed that "human rights organisations, as their names indicate, are non-political. So they ought to advocate human rights through respect for human rights.

He also talked about the credibility of international human rights organisations, affirming that "they are voluntary and independent from governments.'

asserted Bahrain's respect for non-governmental

organisations and its keenness on interacting and cooperating with them within the framework of national laws and on the basis of respect for human rights and relevant global conventions, to which the Kingdom is always committed.

He welcomed the role being played by non-governmental organisations in all fields including human rights, as far as they meet the credibility criteria such as objectivity and non-politicisation of human rights for hidden objectives and agendas.

At the same time, Mr Al Dossari affirmed that "national and international human rights organisations ought to should respect the law and steer themselves away from being selective, from adopting double standards or exploiting human rights causes to serve suspicious political goals."

Some of organisations are in the wrong direction, which affects their credibility. Their reports are biased to serve petty gains and hidden agendas and the information they contain are erroneous as they are not checked with national sources for consistency purposes and thus often turn to be poisonous instead of being neutral in highlighting whatever is positive," Mr Al Dossary commented.

Riffa Views project has been removed from the list of stalled development

The Ministerial Committee for Construction and Infrastructure announced the decision, which was based on the commitment of Riffa Views management to the plan which was worked out last March.

The committee, Chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Shaikh Khalid bin Abdulla Al-Khalifa, said that the management would start completing stalled work under the first phase of the plan.


Kidnappers sentenced

Five daccused defendants kidnapping and beating a boy have been handed down seven years in prison.

However, the victim had lodged a complaint about the incident, providing some tips about the attackers. Police managed to capture three out of the five assailants, while the identities of their remaining two accomplices are still unknown.

Greed costs meat trader

n Asian butcher was fined BD500 yesterday for selling subsidised meat at a higher price. The defendant was tried

on charges of increasing the prices of subsidised meat.

It was reported that the man was selling the one kilogram of the sheep meat at BD1.500, while the government had set its selling price at BD1 only. In September, an Asian butcher was fined BD10 for refusing to sell subsidised meat to customers. The Indian defendant is said to have declined orders from customers to buy the meat as he was retaining the quantity for unidentified buyers. He was caught by the Ministry of Health inspectors.

Court adjourns **Sharif trial**

The trial of former secretary general of the National Democratic Action Society (Wa'ad) was adjourned yesterday until November 12 to hear a prosecution witness.

Standing trial before the High Criminal Court, Ibrahim Sharif earlier pleaded not guilty to charges of inciting to overthrow the government. He is also facing other charges of inciting violence, hatred and sectarianism.

Mr. Sharif was nabbed in connection with a speech he delivered in July during an event. He was only released from jail in June after serving just over four years of prison sentence. He was one of 21 men convicted in 2011 in connection with a plot to overthrow the government with help from abroad.

Some were jailed for life, but he was found not guilty of the more serious charges and was sentenced to five years for espionage in connection with the topple attempt.

Three convicted in prostitution case

Criminal The High Comments Court has slapped three High defendants, including a Bahraini man and two Russian girls with ten years behind hars each after they were found guilty in a prostitution

The defendants reportedly held two females also Russian nationals - captive and forced them to indulge in immoral activities with strangers for money. One of the victims is said to be below 18 years old. It's alleged that one of the Russian suspects facilitated the entry of the victims after assuring them with jobs at Bahrain Duty

Court files showed that the victims were asked to sign documents in English on their arrival, only to be told later that they were acknowledgements of debt. "She (the first defendant) forced us to indulge in sexual acts in an apartment, in which we were locked up. We did it after they threatened to prosecute us over the signed documents," the teenage victim told prosecutors.

The defendants reportedly held two females captive and forced them to indulge in immoral activities with strangers for money. It's alleged that one of the **Russian suspects** facilitated the entry of the victims

"She also told us she might kill our families in Russia if we did not follow their instructions," the victim added. It is claimed that the defendants forced one of the victims to undergo abortion after she conceived during her captivity.

recent international study has named ABahrain as one of the top four Islamic economies in the world.

Malaysia tops the list followed by the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Bahrain and Saudi Arabia, in the State of the Global Islamic Economy Report which measured

Global Islamic Economy Indicators (GIEI). Thomson Reuters carried out the study in collaboration with Dubai Islamic Economy Development Centre (DIEDC) and the Dinar Standard.

Researchers measured health and development of Islamic economy across 73 countries. Each country was evaluated for its Islamic finance, halal food, modest fashion, travel, media and research, pharmaceuticals and cosmetics.

DIEDC Chairman Mohammed Abdullah Al Gergawi said: "The Islamic economy is one of the fastest-growing sectors in the world, with the Islamic economy growing at nearly twice the rate of the global economy and Muslim consumer spending exceeding 41.8 trn. Islamic banking assets hover at some \$1.3

trn and are expected to double in just five years from today."

"Developing the Islamic economy is not limited to Islamic banking and finance, which constitutes an important part of this economy, but spans seven key sectors forming the true pillars of an economy that is expanding while the world's Muslim population continues to outgrow others," he added.

Low oil price not an excuse for lax safety standards

he steep decline in oil prices to around \$50 has raised concerns of lax safety standards in the oil industry. Unlike the high oil-price regime, the industry is struggling to eke out a profit and broad-based cost cutting is expected in the sector.

David Doig, group chief executive for OPITO, a global training provider in the oil sector, said: "With operators looking for ways to cut costs in the current climate, it is imperative that there are no compromises when it comes to ensuring the safety of the workforce. It is a challenging but the economic conditions cannot be a reason to relax standards - not when

the cost of making mistakes is too high in terms of loss of life or damage to the environment."

He added that hazard and risk will not go down because the oil prices went down. Only organisations that are ready to invest in its workforce and create a highly skilled, safe and motivated workforce can remain competitive in times of turbulence, he added.

Oil prices have recently shown firmness and clocked good upswing in recent weeks, contrary to what witnessed in the earlier months of 2015. The global oil-rig count, especially the US rig count has been on a downtrend in recent months and this along with better consensus among oil producing countries seems to have helped the bullish-case for oil price.

Election fever Philippines

The Philippines' election season kicked off kicked off yesterday with politicians registering for thousands of posts, launching a typically raucous and deadly seven months of campaigning in a famously chaotic democracy.

A successor to President Benigno Aquino will be chosen in the six-yearly polls, with the frontrunners a savvy politician accused of corruption, the adopted daughter of a movie star and a low-key stalwart of the ruling Liberal Party.

Aquino, who has won international plaudits for tackling systemic corruption and for his solid economic stewardship, is imploring voters to choose longtime ally Mar Roxas to continue his "straight path" style of governance.

"This is a campaign to continue the straight path, a campaign to make our hopes possible, a campaign that will continue the heroic story of the Filipino people," Aquino said at a rally to announce the Liberal Party's Senate ticket.

But Roxas has struggled in opinion polls and is facing challenges from strong Jejomar Binay, the current vice president who is being investigated for graft, and Grace Poe, a political novice riding on her late father's popularity.

The start of a week-long registration process began yesterday for more than 18,000 positions up for grabs -- from the presidency down to village captain level -- in the May elections.

Binay, a former Aquino ally who now heads the main opposition party, was the first of the major candidates to register at election headquarters in Manila yesterday morning.

Binav had been a clear leader in opinion polls until the Senate and ombudsman began investigating him for alleged corrupt activities when he was mayor of Makati, the financial district in the Philippine capital.

Binay has insisted on his innocence.

Democracy challenges

The Philippines, a former US colony of 100 million, has struggled to establish a stable democracy, with many of the problems blamed on dictator Ferdinand Marcos's rule from 1965-1986.

But his son and namesake is running for the vice presidency next year as an independent, insisting his late father's rule was benign and that voters will focus on present problems rather than the past.

"There are corrupt Filipinos... within and outside the government who are killing our economy and keeping us poor," Marcos, 58, said at a weekend rally alongside his controversial mother and former first lady Imelda.

Another feature of the Philippines' democracy has been politicians resorting to violence to eliminate rivals or cheating to rig polls.

The mayor of a town on the turbulent southern island of Mindanao was shot dead yesterday, hours after filing his candidacy for re-election.

Randv Climaco was travelling with relatives and followers through his town of Tungawan when men fired upon their vehicle, a police report said.

'Mayor Climaco died on the spot while four of his companions were wounded, it added.

On October 1 a roadside bomb injured a local mayor and killed three of his bodyguards in the violencewracked southern island of Basilan.

The most infamous incident occurred in 2009, when the warlord family of a southern province allegedly massacred 58 people to try to stop a rival registering his candidacy for provincial governor.

While some members of the Ampatuan family accused of orchestrating the massacre are behind bars and on trial for the murders, many others are expected to compete in the

These include Sajid Ampatuan, who has been charged with murder but was allowed to post bail this year.

"I am not here to scare the people but to make their vision real," Ampatuan, who registered on Monday to run for a village mayor position in his family's stronghold, told AFP by phone.

Another enduring challenge for the nation's democracy has been the power of elite clans who dominate national, provincial and local posts, according to political analysts.

"Philippine politics has always been governed by the elite... I don't think the dynasties will change," Ateneo University political science professor Benito Lim told AFP.

Roxas, for instance, is the grandson of a former president

And while Binay does not come from a political family, since rising to influence he has set up his own dynasty, with his wife and children becoming powerful politicians.

Only celebrities, such as movie or sporting stars, have generally been able to challenge the elites.

Boxing hero Manny Pacquiao, 36, is one of those.

The eight-time world champion is currently a member of the House of Representatives and will next year run for a higher-profile

Microsoft Surface Book vs Apple MacBook Pro

Microsoft's Surface Book is turning heads and gaining much attention because of its sophisticated design and stylish hinges. It's Microsoft's answer to Apple's 13-inch giant tablet, the MacBook Pro.

Display

The MacBook Pro has a 13.3-inch display with a 2560 x 1600 resolution. On the other hand, the Surface Book has 13.5-inch display with a 3000x2000 resolution.

The Surface Book with its keyboard



weighs 3.34 lbs whereas the MacBook Pro is 3.48 lbs. The slightly bigger Surface Book has more pixel density (267ppi) with a commendable aspect ratio of 3:2. Microsoft also introduces its new PixelSense technology with super responsive touch and stylus controls

Processor and storage

It seems the Surface Book will also steal the show in this regard. Both the Surface Book and the MacBook Pro with Retina display offer sixthgen Intel Core i5 and i7 chips. But according to a report on *Gizmodo*, the latest Intel Core processor of Surface Book is more powerful than the MacBook Pro's 2.7 GHz dual-core i5 chip.

According to *Pocket Lint*, the MacBook Pro battery with Retina display drains out at 10 hours. On the other hand, the Surface Book touts a battery life of 12 hours. Both laptops feature 16 GB of RAM and up to 1 TB of expandable storage.

The Surface Book offers two USB



3.0 ports, a Mini Display Port and full microSD. On the other hand, the MacBook Pro features two USB 3.0 ports, an SDXC card reader and an HDMI port.

Camera

The MacBook Pro only comes with a front camera but the Surface Book

houses an 8 MP rear shooter and a 5 MP front snapper capable of recording 1080p videos.

The Microsoft Surface Book is a clear winner in this range of laptops with its faster processor; better battery life; additional features like Continuum and the stylish hinge. It's worth a buy if you don't mind shelling out a bit extra.

Picture perfect smartphone

Photography fans are increasingly spoilt for choice when it comes to quality smartphone cameras, and the new Lenovo Vibe **Shot** is the latest reason why. With a Samsung-developed 16-megapixel rear illuminated sensor, supported by a tricolour flash module and infrared AF, the Vibe Shot also has optical image stabilisation, meaning its camera is ideal for low light shooting.

On the top plate of the phone (when held in landscape orientation) you'll find a switch and shutter button. The switch puts the camera in either auto or pro mode. Auto mode worked well enough, with Face tracking and smile

detection following people's faces stubbornly.

But if you want a bit more control over your image, the pro mode gives you control over shutter speed, exposure compensation, ISO, White balance presets and drive mode.

The camera interface isn't particularly complex either, in fact it's almost identical to the Lumia camera found in the Microsoft Lumia 640, so you won't have to be an expert to find your way around and start capturing pictures manually. Selfie takers will love the 8-megapixel front-facing camera as well.

The design of the phone is pretty sleek. Measuring 142 x 70 x 7.3mm and weighing 145g, the Vibe Shot is a mix of tough Gorilla Glass 3 and aluminium, giving it a high-end feel.

Aside from the camera, the Vibe Shot is a highly capable phone with a 5.0-inch full HD IPS LCD display and the Qualcomm Snapdragon 615 1.7 GHz octa-core processor with 3GB RAM, running Android 5.0. There's 32GB of internal memory, but happy snappers will be pleased to know that up to 128GB of additional storage can be added via micro SD.

The phone's 2,900mAh battery should be able to survive a day's photography mixed with regular use and 4G data speeds will make it easy to share content on social media.

Turn your Windows phone into a PC

Microsoft unveiled its first Windows 10 Mobile devices today: the Lumia 950 and Lumia 950 XL. Both include an impressive new feature: Continuum. It allows Windows 10 Mobile devices (that include hardware support) to transform into a PC-like interface.

Continuum is pretty basic right now, but the features it has work well. Every app launches fullscreen, and there's the task view feature of Windows 10 to let you quickly switch between apps. You can also use keyboard shortcuts like alt-tab to switch apps, or ctrl+c and ctrl+v to copy and paste content.

You might expect the phone would just sit there idle in this mode, but you can actually pick it up and use it as you

would normally. If you open an app on the phone that's currently displayed, it will minimize on the monitor and resume on the phone. This means you can't run Outlook on both the phone and monitor, but it does mean you can send some SMS messages while you work on a Word or PowerPoint document.

It really feels that Microsoft is betting on this as the future of its mobile efforts, and the lack of performance lag is impressive for this first version.



PS4 now has an official remote control

Sony left most of the PS3's flaws behind when making the PlayStation 4, but there's no denying that one little inconvenience came along for the ride: you can't control the console with a standard remote control.

That's because the PS4, unlike everything else in your A/V stack, doesn't have an infrared sensor. And that's a problem if you want to sit back and watch a Blu-ray without a game controller in your hand.

Now, you can spend \$30 to fix that problem. Sony has announced its official PS4 Bluetooth universal remote, which will let you control and watch Blu-rays or videos from streaming services like Netflix, YouTube, and HBO Go.





Hikes forecast for global demand to 92.86 mbpd

ressures on o rice easing: OP

Market pressures that slashed the price of oil to below \$50 per barrel appear to be easing, the OPEC oil cartel said yesterday, tweaking upwards its 2015 forecast for crude demand.

"Fundamentals factors (of supply and demand) that have weighed on the market for more than a year have persisted, but are starting to show signs of alleviation," the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) said in its October monthly report.

It hiked its forecast for global demand for oil this year to 92.86 million barrels per day (mbpd), up from 92.79 mbpd previously, rising to 94.11 mbpd in 2016, down 40,000 barrels per day from its last projection.

for oil production by nonmembers of the group, notably in the Americas, to 57.24 mbpd from 57.43 mbpd, predicting that it will dip to 57.11 mbpd next year.

This is partly a result of OPEC's strategy -- driven by Saudi Arabia -- of keeping

production levels unchanged, despite the lower oil price, in order to preserve market share and make life difficult for US shale oil producers.

"While the increase in non-OPEC supply last year was more than twice that of global oil demand growth,

this relationship is expected to flip this year before widening further in 2016 so that world oil demand growth exceeds the change in non-OPEC supply," OPEC said. "This should reduce the excess supply in the market and lead to higher demand for OPEC crude.

Oil rose above \$50 a barrel in New York on October 8, extending a rally since hitting six-year lows in late

On Monday, both main contracts held close to that level, boosted by a weaker dollar and expectations that a rise in demand will ease a global supply glut.

Oil prices to rise on high growth: Kuwait

Kuwait City

Oil prices are likely to rise early next year amid signs of a decline in production of highcost crude and improved economic growth, Kuwait's Oil Minister Ali Al Omair said yesterday.

"There are signs that much of the high-cost oil has started to exit the market and this will help improve prices," Omair told reporters on the sidelines of the Kuwait Oil and Gas Conference.

There are indications global economic growth will improve early in 2016, and this will also help boost oil prices, he

said. His statements come amid a string of optimistic forecasts by the Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).

OPEC secretary general Abdullah El Badri said in Kuwait Sunday that "OPEC is confident that it will see a more balanced market in

He also said production from outside OPEC was declining and could contract next year, reducing much of the global market glut that has depressed prices.

Qatar's Energy Minister Mohammed bin Saleh Al Sada, who is acting OPEC president, also said on Sunday there were signs of an oil price rise next year, adding that the oil price has "bottomed out".

OPEC and non-OPEC producers are holding a technical meeting on October 21 to discuss the possibility of cutting production to boost prices.

But Omair said that so far no specific recommendations have been made ahead of OPEC's December 4 ministerial meeting.

At its past two meetings, last November and June this year, OPEC maintained its production at 30 million barrels a day, Omair said.

"As of now, there have been no calls for a big change to OPEC policy" at the next meeting, he added.

Cyber insurance premiums rocket

US companies over the past two years has prompted insurers to massively increase cyber premiums for some companies, leaving firms that are perceived to be a high risk scrambling for cover.

On top of rate hikes, insurers are raising deductibles and in some cases limiting the amount of coverage to \$100 million, leaving many potentially exposed to big losses from hacks that can cost more than twice that. "Some companies money to buy the coverage they want," said Tom Reagan, a cyber insurance executive with Marsh & McLennan Co's (MMC.N) Marsh broker

The price of cyber coverage which helps cover costs like forensic investigations, credit monitoring, legal fees and settlements - varies widely, depending on the strength of a company's security. But the overall trend is sharply up.

Retailers and health insurers have been especially hard hit by breaches at Home Depot Inc (HD.N), Target Corp (TGT.N), Anthem Inc (ANTM.N) and Premera Blue Cross.

Health insurers who suffered hacks are facing the most extreme increases, with some premiums tripling at renewal time, said Bob Wice, a leader of Beazley Plc's (BEZG.L) cyber insurance practice.

Average rates for retailers surged 32 per cent in the first half of this year, after staying flat in 2014, according to previously unreported figures hacks is potentially good and bad for insurers.

It means they have to pay out more in claims, but it also highlights the importance of buying insurance and gives them a reason to jack rates up.

As more companies realize the importance of having coverage, and insurers move in to meet that demand, the cyber insurance market is set to triple to about \$7.5 billion over the next five years, according to a recent study by consulting firm PwC. (Reuters)

Russian firm receives prepayment of \$234 million from Kiev

Gazprom resumes supplies to Ukraine

Moscow

Gazprom yesterday resumed gas supplies to Ukraine after receiving prepayment of \$234 million from Kiev, assuaging European fears about a new energy crisis ahead of the winter heating

The resumption of gas supplies comes as fighting in the east has largely died down, fuelling hopes that the conflict that has claimed more than 8.000 lives can be resolved.

"Gazprom began supplying gas to Ukraine at 10:00am (0700 GMT) today," Gazprom chief Alexei Miller said in a statement.

received \$234 Moscow million of the \$500m expected from Kiev, Miller said, adding that Ukraine had requested the delivery of 114m cubic meters per day, the maximum volume of gas that could be delivered by Gazprom.

Ukraine's state gas pipeline operator Ukrtransgas declined to immediately comment yesterday but the firm said last week that Kiev was ready

The resumption of gas supplies comes as fighting in the east has largely died down

to purchase two billion cubic meters of natural gas from Russia in October.

Moscow late last month agreed to resume gas supplies to Ukraine after reportedly offering Kiev a rebate, ending months of talks overshadowed by the crisis in eastern Ukraine and fears for Europe's energy security.

Russian energy minister had said that the price offered was competitive with those for the gas supplied to countries neighbouring Ukraine.

The resumption of deliveries could help Kiev accumulate 17 billion cubic meters of natural gas by Oct.21, the "absolute minimum for the security of gas transit to Europe," said analysts from VTB Capital bank.

Violence continues

Israel 'wants third intifada'

Jerusalem

Palestinian foreign minister Riad Al Malki yesterday accused Israel of seeking to spark "a third intifada", as violence again flared in Jerusalem, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip.

"(Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin) Netanyahu wants to instigate a third intifada. He wants to avoid problems that he is facing in the political and diplomatic arena, where he has failed miserably," Malki said in Vienna.

Malki said Netanyahu had committed a "grave mistake" by "violating the status quo" of East Jerusalem's Al Aqsa compound, one of Islam's holiest sites and the holiest site in Judaism.

The site has been a flashpoint in the conflict and the scene

of frequent clashes between police and Palestinian youths. "Netanyahu is widening the scope of the conflict from a political one with the Palestinians - which always has a possibility of finding a political solution - to an unlimited war with Muslims around the world," Malki warned.

Calling on Israel to act "according to international law", he said there was nevertheless still "a possibility to contain" the crisis.

The renewed violence, involving 18 stabbings of Israelis by Palestinians, an Israeli air strike on Gaza and deadly clashes, has prompted international diplomatic efforts to defuse the tensions. The crisis began on October 1, when an

alleged Hamas cell shot dead a Jewish settler couple in the West Bank in front of their children. It followed repeated clashes at the Al Aqsa compound in September between Israeli security forces and Palestinian youths.

Malki made the comments ahead of a ceremony for the raising of the Palestinian flag at the United Nations office in the Austrian capital after the flag was raised at UN headquarters in New York on October 1.

The General Assembly voted September 10 to allow the flags of Palestine and the Vatican -- both have observer status -to be raised at the world body alongside those of member states. Meanwhile, three new

YouTube takes down inciting videos: Israel

Israel said yesterday that YouTube had taken down Palestinian videos that the Jewish state considered to be "inciting murder" at a time of increasingly deadly unrest.

Videos of Palestinians stabbing Israelis or calling for such attacks as well as footage of rioters throwing stones at Israeli soldiers have been shared on the Internet. Others showing Israeli officers shoot dead alleged attackers have also helped galvanise Palestinian youths, with violence since the start of the month leading to warnings of the risk of a full-scale uprising, or third intifada. It was unclear which videos Israel requested be removed or how many.

Al Khatib attacked a policeman with a knife at an entrance to Jerusalem's Old City and was shot dead by security forces.

The police officer's protective vest stopped the knife and he was unharmed. The attacker, from east Jerusalem, was shot wounded by the victim, police said. In the third attack, two "terrorists" stabbed two Israelis in the east Jerusalem settlement of Pisgat Zeev, with one attacker -- reported to be 16 years old -- killed and the other shot and seriously wounded.

Egyptian court orders release of Hosni Mubarak's two sons

An Egyptian court yesterday ordered the release of ousted president Hosni Mubarak's two sons who were sentenced to three years in jail for corruption, a judicial official and their lawyer said.

The court ordered Alaa and Gamal Mubarak to be released after having taken into account time served since their arrest in 2011, the judicial official and defence lawyer Farid Al Deeb said.

"Yes, the court has ordered their release," Deeb said.

He insisted that Alaa and Gamal - seen as symbols of corruption under their father's three-decade rule - have served their time in prison and should be allowed to go free.

A security official said the brothers could be freed as early as "today (Monday) or tomorrow", depending on how quickly their release is processed.

Mubarak and his two sons were all arrested in 2011, months after the former strongman was toppled in a popular 18-day uprising.

Taliban releases rare new picture of Mullah Omar

Islamabad

The Afghan Taliban have released a striking new picture of late founder Mullah Omar from his days as a religious student, the only known image of the reclusive leader before he lost his right eye in battle.

The picture, taken in 1978, was first posted on the Taliban's official site (http://shahamat-english.com/omar-iii-from-the-slum-to-emirate).

A clearer scanned copy

obtained by AFP yesterday shows a youthful, thickly-bearded Omar wearing a green turban and a waistcoat over his traditional Afghan tunic, as he stares directly into the camera.

A senior Taliban official who sent the picture said it was originally a black-and-white image that was later colourised.

The life and death of Omar remain shrouded in mystery and the new image may be one of only two verified "The picture

photographs. "The picture was taken while Mullah Omar was a student at a madrassa in Kandahar," the official said. According to an official biography he was born around 1960 to a humble family in the southern Afghan province of Kandahar.

He fought with the Afghan mujahideen against the occupying Soviet army in the 1980s and lost his right eye in battle, possibly to exploding shrapnel.

Taliban legend has it that he cut out the wounded eye himself, while more prosaic accounts say he was treated at

a hospital in Pakistan. After the Soviets pulled out in 1989 he returned to his native area as a prayer leader and teacher, attracting a band of students, which later became the Taliban.

Under Omar's leadership they took power in Kabul in 1996 but were toppled by a US-led invasion in 2001.

His death in 2013 death, reportedly due to illness, was covered up by the insurgents until July this year.

'Saudi plans tripling of Umrah visas'

Saudi Arabia is planning to triple the number of visas it issues for the umrah pilgrimage, newspapers reported vesterday. more than two weeks after a deadly Hajj stampede.

'IS' prime suspect in deadliest attack: PM

Ankara

Turkish Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu vesterday said the Islamic State (IS) extremist group was the prime suspect in the double suicide bombings in Ankara that killed 97 and sparked anger over the authorities' failure to ensure security.

In his first interview since Turkey was scarred on Saturday by its deadliest ever attack, Davutoglu insisted that snap elections would go ahead as planned on November 1 despite the bloodshed.

The attack on a peace rally of leftist, labour and Kurdish activists ratcheted up tensions to new heights in Turkey as the government wages a relentless campaign against Kurdish militants and grapples with the presence of IS jihadists just inside the border with Syria.

"Looking at how the incident took place, we are probing Daesh as our first priority,

Davutoglu told NTV television, using an alternative Arabic acronym for IS. He said that

were investigating three groups including Islamic State but also the outlawed Kurdistan

"We are close to a name (for one bomber). That name points to an organisation," he said. Zimbabwe clears Cecil the lion killer

Zimbabwe yesterday Zabandoned its bid to press charges against a US dentist who killed Cecil the lion, saying his papers "were in order" and that he did not know he was committing any offence.

The black-maned lion was shot dead with a powerful bow and arrow in July by US trophy hunter Walter Palmer in a hunt that provoked worldwide outrage.

Palmer paid \$55,000 (50,000 euros) to shoot the lion on an expedition led by professional Zimbabwean hunter Theo Bronkhorst.

The hunt provoked a storm of criticism after it emerged that Cecil was a well-known attraction among visitors to the Hwange National Park and was wearing a tracking collar as part of an Oxford University research project.

Zimbabwean But government minister yesterday said they would not pursue any legal proceedings against Palmer.

Deaton wins Nobel Prize in Economics Angus

Angus Deaton of Britain and the United States won the Nobel Economics Prize yesterday for his work on consumption, poverty and welfare, the jury said.

emphasising links between individual decisions consumption and outcomes for the whole economy, his work transform helped modern microeconomics, and macroeconomics development economics," the

Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences said.

"To design economic policy that promotes welfare and reduces poverty, we must first understand individual consumption choices. More than anyone else, Angus Deaton has enhanced this understanding," it said.

Deaton was honoured for three related achievements: for developing with his colleague John Muellbauer around 1980 a system for estimating the demand for different goods;

studies of the link between consumption and income that

he conducted around 1990; and the work he carried out in later decades on measuring living standards and poverty in developing countries with the help of household surveys.

His research has shown how the clever use of household data can shed light on issues such as the relationship between income and calorie intake, and the extent of gender discrimination with the family.

focus "Deaton's household surveys has helped transform development economics from a theoretical field based on aggregate data to an empirical field based on detailed individual data," the Academy said.

Speaking to reporters at the Nobel press conference by video link, Deaton said he believed poverty would continue to decline. "I do foresee a decrease. I think we've had a remarkable decrease for the past 20-30 years. I do expect that to continue," he said, noting however that there were still 700 million extremely poor people according to the

World Bank "so we are not out of the woods yet." Deaton said poverty reduction would for example resolve the current refugee crisis.

Deaton, 69, was born in Edinburgh and has been a professor of economics and international affairs at Princeton University in the United States since 1983.

He wins the prize sum of eight million Swedish kronor (about 860,000 euros, \$950,000).

The economics prize caps this year's Nobel season.

First 'in womb' stem cell trial to begin next year

Pari:

Foetuses burdened with a crippling form of brittle-bone disease will receive stemcell treatment early next year in a pioneering trial, the lead researcher said vesterday.

Stem cells will be injected to help strengthen bones so frail they may break before birth, the researchers said. Stricken newborns will also be treated, and the results compared.

Children with severe forms of the condition, called osteogenesis imperfecta, suffer repeated fractures of bones throughout the skeleton, leading to painful disability

and, in some cases, death in early infancy.

Other symptoms include brittle and discoloured teeth, hearing loss and breathing difficulties due to malformed rib cages. There is no cure.

Genetic in origin, brittlebone disease affects about one in 25,000 people of European descent.

The condition is caused by a defect in a gene that produces collagen, a fibre-like protein crucial for strengthening bone, much in the way steel rods reinforce concrete. The trials, coordinated by the Karolinska Institute in

Sweden where the stem-cell treatment was developed, will involve a group of 15 foetuses and another group of 15 newborns.

Each group will receive

injections of stem cells designed to boost collagen levels in growing bones.

Stem cells are blank-slate cells which, as they grow, differentiate into the various



specialised cells that make up the tissue of different organs -- the brain, the heart, the kidney, and so on.

The approach was already tested on a handful of young children suffering from brittle-bone disease, with encouraging results, said the Karolinska Institute's Cecilia Gotherstrom.

"We have treated two children prenatally. One child is now 13 and one was born last year," she said. A third infant, today six years old, was treated in collaboration with researchers in Singapore and Taiwan.

Bahrain to face Philippines today

Bahrain is set to take on the Philippines tonight in a crucial must win FIFA 2018 Asia World Cup qualifier tonight 6pm at the National Stadium in Riffa if they are going to have any chance to progress.

The two teams met last June in the Philippines and the team known as the 'Azkals defeated tonight's hosts with a shock 2-1 victory on their home

soil. Bahrain under Argentine coach Sergio Batista need to bounce back quickly following last week's shocking 4-0 reversal to Uzbekistan at the National Stadium and have just three points from four games so far and are placed fourth presently.

The National team trail leaders North Korea (10 points), Uzbekistan (9) and tonight's opponent who have seven points after all five teams have played four matches each, with Yemen at the bottom

without a point. Bahraini will be relying on experienced defender and captain Hussain Ali Baba and goalkeeper Sayed Mohammed Jaffar to keep the 'Azkals' at bay and hope strikers such as Sami Al Hussaini, Abdulla Yousef Helal and the player who replaced him against Uzbekistan Ismael Abdullatif fire in the goals.

Both sides have also met in a friendly last March with Bahrain managing a 2-1 win, so a similar result would at least keep the Kingdom's hopes

The Philippines though could have an advantage with a large and vocal support presence from the Filipino expatriate community and could change the atmosphere in the stadium, if they come in large numbers?

Under former US International Thomas Dooley, Philippines are having its best ever World Cup campaign and its key players come in the shape of its captain Phil Younghusband, the record goalscorer with 42 goals, overseas players such as Neil Etheridge who plays in goal with English third tier side Walsall and Jerry Lucena who plays in Sweden for Esbjerg, others include local-based players, Amani Aquinaldo, Luke Woodland and Simone Rota.

Pyongyang. These matches also double as 2019 Asian Cup qualifiers and the eight group winners and four best runners-up will advance to the 2019 AFC Asian Cup finals in the United Arab Emirates and the final round of group qualifiers for the 2018 FIFA World Cup. The next best 22 teams from the preliminary stage of the joint qualifiers will compete in a separate competition for the remaining slots (11 + 1 UAE) in the 24-team 2019 Asian Cup.

Brazil eager to return

Montevideo

Brazil and Argentina head into the second round of qualifiers for the 2018 World Cup today looking to get their campaigns back on track after opening round defeats which have left the South American giants in disarray.

The pall of gloom enveloping Brazilian football since their humiliation against Germany at the World Cup last year darkened last week when they were humbled 2-0 by Copa America champions Chile in Santiago.

Argentina, still struggling to shake off the disappointment of losing the Copa America final in July -- the team's second defeat in a major final in 12 months -- were stunned by a 2-0 reverse at home to Ecuador.

While there is still plenty of time in South America's marathon 2018 qualifying campaign for Argentina and Brazil to turn their fortunes around, the opening defeats have left both sides determined

to halt the slide. Brazil face Venezuela on Tuesday in Fortaleza, a game that in previous years would have been regarded as a straightforward assignment against opponents who have never qualified for the World Cup.

But in a sign of how far

Brazilian expectations have fallen, midfielder Willian revealed on Sunday that victory by a single goal would be viewed with satisfaction.

"To be honest 1-0 would be a good result for us," Willian said. "We want the three points. Football today is different. All the teams are fit and well trained. Maybe in the past this game would have been a sure win for us, but today it's not like that -- we only beat them 2-1 in the Copa America after all," he added.

Willian insisted that Brazil

had done enough to earn a result against Chile until they were sunk by late second half goals on Thursday.

"We knew Chile would be difficult. But we marked them well for a lot of the game. We just couldn't take advantage of the opportunities we created."

Brazil badly missed the suspended Neymar against Chile, who remains banned for Tuesday's game against Venezuela.

Striker Hulk, who deputised in Santiago, said he understood the criticism of the team's attacking display.

"There is always pressure for anyone who plays as a forward for Brazil; it is our obligation because we have quality players. "We know the size of those demands and will try to answer in the best way possible," the Zenit St Petersburg striker said.

Argentina meanwhile travel to Asuncion to face Paraguay grappling a mounting injury crisis that has deprived them of their most lethal strikers.

Jayawardene wants to keep things simple

England's batting consultant Mahela Jayawardene urged his new charges to keep things simple while countering Pakistani spinners and tough conditions in the three-match Test series starting in Abu Dhabi today.

The 38-year-old former Sri Lankan captain was hired to fast track England's preparation for the challenging series.

Jayawardene said he was sharing his experience in the sub-continent, boasting of an illustrious career of 149 Tests which yielded 11,814 runs.

He also retired from one-day cricket after the 2015 World Cup, having scored 12,650 in 448 matches.

"I am trying to give different ideas, share my experience. What you have to realise is that it's a process – it's not going to happen overnight," Jayawardene told media on the sidelines of England's practice.

The conditions – it is going to be tough whether it be the weather or the wickets. It's about controlling what they can control and keep things nice and simple and then concentration and focus becomes much easier."

Tendulkar bats for sanitation to save children

Colombo

Indian cricket legend Sachin Tendulkar launched an initiative in Sri Lanka yesterday to improve hygiene among children in South Asia, where hundreds of millions have no access to toilets.

The Indian superstar showed local children at a deluxe hotel in Colombo how to use soap and water to wash their hands before meals and avoid the risk of disease.

"A simple act of washing hands with soap can keep children safe and healthy and protect them against these deadly (diarrhoeal) diseases," he told reporters.

Tendulkar, a goodwill ambassador for the United Nations children's fund UNICEF, was promoting the "wash in school" drive aimed at slashing the death toll from poor sanitation -- which kills some 1,800 children aged under five worldwide every day, according to the UN body.

had made considerable progress in the past two decades, with the proportion of people using toilets increasing from 20 per cent in 1995 to 45pc by this year.

"The number of people not using a toilet in South Asia is still huge with 64pc of the world's open defecators living in the region. A total of 610 million people in South Asia do not have toilets," UNICEF said.

In Sri Lanka some 14pc of households in the nation of 20 million lack toilets, UNICEF

Japan exit with a win

apan ended their stunning World Cup campaign on Sunday by beating the United States 28-18 to become the first nation to win three group games but fail to reach the quarter finals.

The Brave Blossoms have already caused the biggest sensation in World Cup history by beating South Africa 34-32 in their opening Pool B game.

But the simple victory over the American gave a fitting sendoff to coach Eddie Jones, who now leaves the post having said Japan would be the "team of the tournament" if they got three wins.

The winning points came from Kotaro Matsushima, Yoshikazu Fujita and Amanaki Mafi tries, and the reliable kicking of full back Ayumu Goromaru, who took his Test points haul beyond 700.

The 2019 World Cup is the first time the tournament will be hosted by an emerging rugby nation, meaning the Brave Blossoms were under pressure to show they merit the award.

"The guys have all played above themselves, they have

worked hard, they played with a real spirit, they played how rugby should be played," said Iones.

The Australian said he would definitely be heading for the Stormers in South Africa.

"I have done my job with Japan. When I took over Japan I wanted to bring pride back in the national team and I think we have done that so it

is someone else's turn to take it over."

After the South Africa upset, Iapan lost 45-10 to Group B runners-up Scotland, then beat Samoa 26-5.

The United States went into the match with only pride to play for, having lost 25-16 to Samoa, 39-16 to Scotland and 64-0 to South Africa.

Japan supporters among

the 14,517-strong crowd wore kimonos, while some US visitors were dressed head to toe in Elvis Presley jumpsuits. One Japan fan had his body painted with a message thanking Jones.

Jones made four changes to the side that beat Samoa, with centre Craig Wing becoming the Brave Blossoms' oldest World Cup debutant. The

35-year-old previously won 17 caps for Australia's rugby league team.

The United States retained only Zack Test and Samu Manoa from the side that lost to South Africa, while fullback Chris Wyles returned to captain the Eagles.

US ahead

The United States capitalised on some early pressure when fly-half Alan MacGinty successfully kicked a 45-metre penalty. But Japan immediately struck back. A kick through by Kosei Ono allowed Fujita to run on and take the Brave Blossoms to within five metres.

With the Eagles stretched, wing Matsushima crossed the line in the seventh minute and Goromaru converted.

The Eagles then drove deep into Japanese territory and scored a try through wing Takudzwa Ngwenya, who ran through to touch down in the right corner in the 25th minute.

With Japan committing players under the posts, Ngwenya had the space to score his first World Cup try in eight years.

England agonise over rugby failure

English rugby was yesterday in full inquest mode following the country's World disastrous Cup campaign with embattled coach Stuart Lancaster fighting for his future.

Amid public splits inside the England camp, there have been calls for Lancaster to be replaced, calls for captain Chris Robshaw to go and calls for a director of rugby to take charge.

Beaten by Wales (28-25) and Australia (33-13) at a World Cup they spent more than \$100 million preparing for, England are in their worst crisis as they watch the world's best battle it out for the trophy.

Ireland were relieved to avoid France's fate of having to play New Zealand. But Schmidt can see a big challenge

in Argentina who opened their Pool C campaign with a narrow 26-16 defeat by the All Blacks before easily seeing off Georgia (54-9), Tonga (45-16) and Namibia (64-19).

"The biggest attraction for us playing Argentina was the seven-day turnaround, not because we want to play them!" Schmidt said with one eye on the injuries.

Thomas Mueller had given Germany the lead shortly after half-time, converting a penalty for his ninth goal in the qualifiers, before it was cancelled out almost immediately by Jaba Kankava.

"We're happy on the whole to have secured qualification but displeased with our last two matches," said Loew, who had seen his team lose 1-0 to Ireland on Thursday. "This is not our standard, there's still a lot of work ahead of us," he added.

Robert Lewandowski equalled former Northern Ireland striker David Healy's 13-goal record for a single European Championship qualifying campaign as Poland claimed second place in Group D. Grzegorz Krychowiak netted a 13th-minute opener for the Poles in Warsaw before Jon Walters levelled from the penalty spot shortly after.

But Lewandowski's 15th goal in his last six matches won it for the home side, consigning the Irish, who saw John O'Shea sent off late on, to November's play-offs.

"We are all disappointed after doing brilliantly against Germany (last time out). We let ourselves down. We had the confidence and expected to win," said Ireland defender Seamus Coleman.

"We have a big month now in November and we have to get going again."

get going again."

In the group's other game, Steven Fletcher scored a hattrick as Scotland finished their unsuccessful campaign with a 6-0 mauling of Gibraltar in Portugal.

Albania make history

Earlier, Albania qualified for their first major international tournament as they beat Armenia 3-0, while Romania also booked their place at the finals after a 3-0 win in the Faroe Islands.

Defeat at home to Serbia on Thursday had left Albania needing three points in Yerevan to edge ahead of Denmark to claim second place in Group I and they made the most of their second chance.

Kamo Hovhannisyan turned into his own net to give Albania a ninth-minute lead before Berat Xhimshiti made it 2-0 midway through the first half.

Substitute Armando Sadiku then added a third 14 minutes from time as Gianni De Biasi's side secured their spot at next summer's tournament in France.

Portugal, already through as group winners, registered their seventh successive qualifying victory as they overcame Serbia 2-1 in Belgrade. The visitors were without the rested Cristiano Ronaldo but took a fifth-minute lead through stand-in skipper Nani as the ex-Manchester United winger converted the rebound after Danny's shot was saved by Vladimir Stojkovic.
