Civil Defence carries out 135 evacuations

Vivil Defence Director General Brigadier Mohammed Showaiter announced vesterday that his department had implemented the safety and security conditions in high-rise buildings and towers and carried out 135 evacuations in 2014.

The safety steps included the installation of fireextinguishing equipment, ensuring proper emergency exits and avoiding the storage of inflammable items, apart from coordination with the municipalities and engineering consultancy firms to study maps and designs of buildings before construction.

He confirmed that the department did not allow the buildings to obtain electricity connection until they had met all safety and security procedures.

Bahrain ranks 4th in world Islamic economy

recent international study has named ABahrain as one of the top four Islamic economies in the world.

Malaysia tops the list followed by the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Bahrain and Saudi Arabia, in the State of the Global Islamic Economy Report which measured

Global Islamic Economy Indicators (GIEI). Thomson Reuters carried out the study in collaboration with Dubai Islamic Economy Development Centre (DIEDC) and the Dinar Standard.

Researchers measured health and development of Islamic economy across 73 countries. Each country was evaluated for its Islamic finance, halal food, modest fashion, travel, media and research, pharmaceuticals and cosmetics.

DIEDC Chairman Mohammed Abdullah Al Gergawi said: "The Islamic economy is one of the fastest-growing sectors in the world, with the Islamic economy growing at nearly twice the rate of the global economy and Muslim consumer spending exceeding 41.8 trn. Islamic banking assets hover at some \$1.3

trn and are expected to double in just five years from today."

"Developing the Islamic economy is not limited to Islamic banking and finance, which constitutes an important part of this economy, but spans seven key sectors forming the true pillars of an economy that is expanding while the world's Muslim population continues to outgrow others," he added.

recently upgraded the electronic services on its portal.

With 1,516 users, August attracted the largest traffic followed by July with 1265 users. Most number of users was for materials testing results service, followed by road fault report service and the material/product assessment service.
