Florida school shooter Accused was 'crazy about guns'

the man accused of opening The man accused of open of fire at a Florida high school on Wednesday, killing 17 people, was a troubled former student who loved guns and was expelled for unspecified disciplinary reasons, police and former classmates said.

Nikolas Cruz, 19, was arrested about an hour after a shooting rampage at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida, Broward County Sheriff Scott Israel told reporters.

Cruz, who had been expelled from the school for reasons that have not been made public, was found with multiple ammunition magazines and one AR-15-style rifle, Israel said.


"We already began to dissect his websites and the things on social media that he was on and some of the things that came to mind are very, very disturbing," Israel said.

Chad Williams, 18, a senior at Stoneman Douglas High school, remembered Cruz as a troubled classmate from middle school. He said Cruz would set off the fire alarm, day after day, and finally got expelled in the eighth grade.

More recently, Williams saw Cruz carrying several publications about guns when they ran into each other at the high school. Williams thought Cruz was there to pick up a younger sibling.

"He was crazy about guns," Williams told Reuters by the side of the road near the high school. "He was kind of an outcast. He didn't have many friends. He would do anything crazy for a laugh, but he was trouble."

Jillian Davis, 19, said she was in a school Junior Reserve Officer

Training Corps with Cruz in the 9th grade. She remembered him as a quiet and shy young man who would almost change personality when angry. He talked a lot about guns and knives but no one took him seriously, she told Reuters.

"I would say he was not the most normal or sane kid in JROTC. He definitely had a little something off about him. He was a little extra quirky," said Davis, who graduated from the school last year.

Math teacher Jim Gard told the Miami Herald Cruz had been banned from returning to campus while carrying a backpack.

"There were problems with him last year threatening students, and I guess he was asked to leave campus," Gard told the newspaper in an interview. Administrators sent an email to teachers warning them about Cruz, Gard told the paper.

junior Dakota Mutchler, told reporters at a hotel in nearby Coral Springs that he hadn't spoken with Cruz in more than a year. Students were reuniting with their parents and friends at the hotel.

Mutchler said he declined to communicate with Cruz, a former friend, after the suspect contacted him two weeks ago on Snapchat.

"Everybody that knew of him had a sort of suspicion about him," Mutchler said. Cruz had once told him he had used a pellet gun in his backyard for target practice, he said.

Travis Julmice, an 18-year-old senior, said he had not been in a class with Cruz since middle school.

"You could tell he was a little off," Julmice told Reuters at the Coral Springs hotel. "He was always like a troubled kid, getting in-school suspension a lot. And detentions."

However, Broward County Public Schools Superintendent Robert Runcie told reporters outside the school after the shooting that the school had no indication Cruz was a danger. "Typically, you see in these situations that there potentially could have been signs out there," he said. "But we didn't have any warnings, there weren't any phone calls or threats that we know of that were made."

Runcie later said Cruz was still a student at Broward County Public Schools but declined to provide further details.

Israel said earlier Cruz may have been enrolled at Taravella High School in Coral Springs after his expulsion but the sheriff did not know if Cruz still attended Taravella.

faces 17 murder counts

Florida teen Nikolas Cruz was booked yesterday on 17 premeditated murder counts in horrific Florida school shooting that unfolded Wednesday afternoon.

Cruz, described as a loner by a former classmate, had once been expelled from a Parkland, Florida, high school for disciplinary reasons.

Investigators believe that the suspect pulled the fire alarm to draw people out and get a higher death toll, according to a law enforcement source.

He is also believed to have concealed himself among the hundreds of students fleeing the school, according to the Broward County Sheriff's Office. Investigators were able to identify Cruz from school security videos and found him in a nearby neighborhood in Coral Springs, Florida, according to police.

Officers arrested him without incident. He is talking to investigators, according to a law enforcement source.

His family life

As for his family life, Cruz was adopted by Lynda Cruz, said Kathie Blaine, her cousin.

More than three months ago, on November 1, she died after battling the flu and then pneumonia, Blaine told CNN. Cruz's father had died more than a decade ago due to a heart attack.

Blaine said she had last seen Lynda Cruz about 20 years ago and had never met Nikolas Cruz.

When asked who Cruz lived with since both of his adoptive parents had died, she said: "Nikolas was on his own. He is 19. He was an adult on his own. It's really at this point, I don't understand it anymore than anyone else does. I can't believe it. I can't believe any of these school shootings. I never met him.'

Cruz had been living with a friend's family since his mother died last year, Jim Lewis, a Ft. Lauderdale attorney who represents the family, told CNN affiliate WPEC.

"His mother had died back in November of last year, and this family took him in," Lewis told the news station.

Cruz was friends with the family's son who went to Majory Stoneman Douglas High School.

"They offered him a home and tried to help the kid out because he really didn't have any other place to stay." Lewis said. (Fox 4 News)

His digital life

Broward County Sheriff Scott Israel said Cruz's digital profile contained what he called "very, very disturbing" content.

He had a variety of gun and violencerelated postings on social media sites.

Postings under the name Nikolas Cruz included threatening comments under videos on YouTube and other sites, including "I whana shoot people with my AR-15" (sic), "I wanna die Fighting killing s**t ton of people' and "I am going to kill law enforcement one day they go after the good people.'

On his Instagram page, Cruz posted a photo of a shotgun, in another photo he is shown brandishing a pistol that appears to be a type of BB gun. In other pictures he is covering his face with a kerchief, and brandishing long knives.

Police say Cruz was armed with multiple magazines and at least one AR-15 style rifle.

The suspected shooter bought the firearm in the past year and had passed the background check to make the purchase, according to a US official briefed on the investigation.

The University of Bahrain (UoB) has revoked the decision to expel 160 underperforming first-year students who did not meet the minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 1, DT News has learnt.

The decision followed an appeal by the students who faced expulsion. They will be allowed to re-register.

"This is the first and last time the expelled students

will be given a chance to re-register," the academics programmes and graduate studies vice president, Dr Waheeb Alnaser told DT News. The students, who could not meet their first semester GPA requirement, were earlier given a five-day window to appeal.

The university rule to penalise underperforming students was announced last year, making it applicable for those who enrolled in 2017. As per the rules, those with a GPA below 2 would be slapped with two warnings before expulsion. Earlier, claims on social media platforms said around 400 students were expelled for not meeting the GPA criteria. The University responded by saying that the figure was exaggerated.

A committee was also formed to look into the claims and those with valid grievances were given a chance to appeal. Following the university decision, 160 students appealed.

"All students with a valid reason were given a chance to re-register. They were advised to repeat the courses

studied in the first semester," Dr Waheeb Alnaser told DT News. The students who are now back will be under a probation programme similar to the one for students who could not achieve the required cumulative GPA of 2 and above, he added.

To help the 160 students to integrate into the system, the university has also introduced a new programme. "An academic and social coaching session has been formed by the Student Affairs, effective from today," said Dr Waheeb Alnaser. "The University is

a place to study, learn and work hard, not relax," he said adding that the decision will "set an example for other students.'

Some expelled students, mainly from Saudi Arabia and Jordan, attributed their dismal performance to an unfamiliar coeducational environment.

Dr Waheeb Alnaser said students should take education seriously. "Students must work hard," he said.

'Blockchain-based payments ideal for Bahrain'

Bahrain should follow Dubai's example and should follow implement a blockchain based payments platform to provide the government with instant reconciliation and settlement, according to a visiting expert.

Introducing blockchain technology will dramatically reduce reconciliation time, said Dubai based blockchain expert Wagas Mirza.

Mirza's company Avanza Solutions was awarded a project by the Dubai government to implement a citywide blockchain based payments platform.

He said that with the implementation of the platform they were able to reduce the transaction reconciliation time from forty-five days to around two hours.

"We have gone live in

government entities, Knowledge and Human Development Authority and Dubai Electricity & Water Authority.

"The project is not meant to go live with a big bang go-live approach where you have 40 entities onboard because that would be a catastrophe, that is why you go step by step, we want to start with two and go from there. Every month we plan to onboard two to three entities and banks, and by the end of 2018 we plan to have the whole city live," he said.

When asked if Bahrain and other GCC countries should follow the example he said, "They should, it's not about whether they can or not, they should. There is a lot of efficiencies that come with this. it certainly comes with a lot of benefits.

Explaining how he achieves dramatic reduction reconciliation time using

blockchain he said: "What we are trying to do is address reconciliation and settlement of government funds. In Dubai, the payment gateway is connected with almost 40 government entities and a dozen banks. For example if a resident pays his electricity bill using the payment gateway it facilitates this transactions, it will debit their bank account and go to the biller for the payment.

"During this process there are a lot of transfer of files between government entities and then the funds are transferred to government entities. The problem is not with the payment from the customer's side, the customer does not face any issue. However, the problem is with the back-end.

problem "The reconciliation of books between 40 government entities, the government payment platform

and the banks, every party's books has to match and only then the department of finance release funds to different government entities.

"Today the process is very clunky, it takes the department of finance up to 45 days to tell the government entity about the funds that they have collected on their behalf. The situation is such that there are transactions coming from 40 different government entities with files coming from banks and other parties and the department of finance trying to deal with these files and transactions. This is the problem we are trying to solve with blockchain. We want to bring down these 45 days of friction and wastage to instant reconciliation."

"In our case all 40 government entities will be connected to our blockchain platform called Cipher and so will the banks. This is how we



achieve instant reconciliation through cipher: we ask the government entity to stamp a blockchain node when a transaction is made in addition to stamping in their logs and

"When the transaction comes to the payment gateway we ask the gateway to do the same. The transaction is sent to the banks and then it is stamped by the bank as well and the bank sends back an acknowledgement back. So when the transactions has been stamped by all the parties you achieve consensus. What does this do? This eliminates the need for reconciliation. Reconciliation programmes have been written for the past 30 to 40 years to act as a second eye to make sure everyone's book match but blockchain inherently does that for you. What we do is we reconcile the transaction as and when it happens, eliminating the 40 days of wastage."

Egypt kills 53 militants in week-long offensive

Egypt's military and police forces have killed a total of 53 militants and arrested 680 suspects in a week-long offensive to crush insurgents that is focused on the Sinai Peninsula, a military spokesman said yesterday.

President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi, who is seeking re-election in March, ordered the armed forces in November to defeat militants within three months after an attack on a mosque in Sinai killed more than 300 people.

The attack was the deadliest of its kind in Egypt, which is the Arab world's most populous country and a main regional ally of the United States.

The security operation, which involves the army, navy,

The security operation, which involves the army, navy, air force and police, began last Friday

Friday and targeted "terrorist and criminal elements and organizations" in north and central Sinai, parts of the Nile delta and the western desert, Colonel Tamer al-Rifai told a news conference broadcast on state television on Thursday.

He said forces have destroyed over 1000 kg (2205 lbs) of explosives, 378 militant hideouts and weapon storage facilities including a media center used by the militants.

He added that 680 people, some of them suspected militants or wanted criminals, were also detained in the operation.

carried out more than 100 airstrikes in northern and central Sinai since the operation began, has focused on militant hideouts outside residential areas to avoid hitting civilians, air force Brigadier General

He said after the military operation, Egyptian authorities would push ahead with a comprehensive development plan for Sinai.

Outside the peninsula, the Egyptian military said the operation would cover parts of the Nile Delta and the Western Desert, where other militants have waged attacks, some believed to be staged out of neighboring Libya.

The insurgency poses the greatest challenge to the government in a country that is both the most populous in the Arab World and a main regional ally of the United

States.

Insurgents have been targeting security forces since 2013 when the army led by Sisi, then the army chief, ousted President Mohamed Mursi, of the Muslim Brotherhood, following mass protests against

Some local residents have raised concerns over food

and medicine shortages in the peninsula after the army blocked all access to the area.

Rifai said the armed forces has cooperated closely with local authorities to coordinate the delivery of food, medical assistance and other supplies in compliance with local and international laws and human rights norms. (Reuters)

Growing Hezbollah arsenal a threat

U.S. Secretary of State Mea Tillerson said yesterday that Lebanon's security was threatened by the growing arsenal of the Iranbacked group Hezbollah and its involvement in regional conflicts.

Speaking alongside Lebanese Prime Minister Saad al-Hariri in a Beirut news conference, Tillerson also said the United States was engaging with Lebanon and Israel to ensure the border remained calm.

Hezbollah, which is deemed a terrorist organization by the United States, is part of Hariri's government. Its military strength has grown since the last major conflict with Israel in 2006.

Tillerson urged Lebanese leaders to uphold the country's commitment to staying out of regional conflicts, a reference to Hezbollah's role in wars around the Middle East including in neighboring Syria where Iran also holds major sway.

Lebanon is a big recipient of U.S. military support. Tillerson said Washington remained committed



to supporting the Lebanese army and internal security forces.

The United States has been mediating between Lebanon and Israel over their border dispute. In apparent reference to the maritime dispute, Tillerson said: "We've asked no one to give up anything".

He added that constructive discussions were underway and he urged the Israelis to be constructive.

US never gave 'heavy arms' to **Kurdish YPG**

U.S. Secretary of State Rex Tillerson said yesterday the United States had "never given heavy arms" to the Syrian Kurdish YPG militia and there was therefore "nothing to take back".

The YPG is the main component of the U.S.-backed Syrian Democratic Forces alliance that has seized vast territory from Islamic State in Syria.

Washington is focused on defeating IS in Syria. Ankara wants to prevent Syria's Kurds from gaining autonomy and fuelling Kurdish insurgents on its soil and last month launched a military incursion into the Afrin region of Syria to sweep the YPG from its southern border zone.

Tillerson also said the United States has had "fruitful meetings" with Europeans on the Iran nuclear deal, but said work on this issue was not yet over.

Real seekers of 'truth' are careful. Very careful. They check, double check, and – sometimes- triple check, before forwarding information to others.

Mobile phone technology with the Internet has become a dangerous thing. Especially, in the hands of the less-informed and the over-passionate.

Just because a bearded Arab man, in a thobe, has said 'Jai Siya Ram', his video cannot be forwarded saying that the Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi has said it during a recent Hindu Temple's foundation there. You cannot. Unless you are very very sure that the man who said it was really really the Crown Prince.

Just because a cute young boy is seen reciting a lot of verses from the Bible, his video cannot be forwarded saying he is UK's Prince George; and that the boy is being taught scriptures well. You cannot. Unless you are very very sure that the boy was really really Prince George.

Actually, mobile phone technology with the Internet connection has become a wonderful thing, too. You can easily search for, find images, read news-items, and know for yourself -- if what you are forwarding is really true.

The biggest war we would soon be fighting, I am sure, would be that against inaccurate information.

Getting to the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, is becoming harder and harder. And perhaps our unconscious participation in spreading unverified information is increasing this hardship.

Unlike how people used to go to physical libraries to check, in the past, we now visit recognized and reputed newspapers and news websites.

But, sadly, we are facing problems here too. When publishing houses hire people with inadequate training in professional journalism, things can go wrong.

Even news-websites are seen giving needless credence to unverified social media posts.

And then, these days, there's this new wave of strategic and systematic promotion of falsehoods, misinformation, fake stories, and abusive trolling, by some socio-political groups.

But, Truth is Truth. And as consumers of truth, we must hold all official news channels, newspapers and news websites accountable.

And as users of social media apps, we must refuse to participate in the spread of falsehoods.

Armed with a mobile phone or laptop, one should not falsify information, or abet 'misinformation mongers' in their spread of viral lies.

Data mining, I think, will soon have the tough job of separating truth and lies.

Getting through the dense jungle of compressed bits and bytes, digging into thick clouds of cyberspace, finding chronologically stored information, and analysing how truth got morphed over time; That is what truth seekers in the cyber world should soon become adept at.

Forensic methods to unravel and uncover the falsifiers of truth and legal systems that can seek and punish the malicious ones. Those are the growing needs of the digital world.

We should keep fighting for truth, against the onslaught of doctored videos and fake news. We must prevent Internet Rumour and keep campaigning against viral forwards of myths and hoaxes.

NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg yesterday announced that the alliance will expand its military training mission in Iraq and help the conflict-ravaged country develop new academies and schools for its armed forces.

NATO already has a small team of military and civilian personnel in Iraq and uses mobile teams to train national forces in de-mining, countering home-made bombs and dealing with explosives. The allies have also trained Iraqi troops in neighboring Jordan.

"We will scale up," Stoltenberg said after talks with NATO defense ministers in Brussels, though he declined to say how many personnel the effort would involve or where it would operate. He said the mission would not be used for combat, but rather to train Iraqi officers so they in turn can train their own troops.

NATO diplomats suggest the expanded mission could involve up to 200 personnel. The diplomats declined to be identified because the effort is still in the planning stages.

The training would take place in the capital Baghdad, other Iraqi cities and even in neighboring countries like Jordan. Germany's defense minister mentioned the possibility that some might take place in the northern city of Erbil.

Iraq is struggling to emerge from the chaos that followed the 2003 U.S.-led invasion that toppled dictator Saddam Hussein. After the invasion, the temporary U.S.-led administration disbanded the Iraqi army, leaving tens of thousands of trained personnel jobless and bitter.

Many took up arms, and while the insurgency has waned in recent years, the Islamic State group flourished. IS has now been dislodged from the third of Iraq that it once held, but the group still poses a threat and the Iraqi armed forces remain relatively weak.

"We believe that it's in NATO's best interests that we project stability at the government of Iraq's request," U.S. Defense Secretary Jim Mattis told reporters.

"We will go to a consistent mission in Iraq to build the capabilities that they believe they need to sustain this effort and protect their people from an uprising of another type of terrorist organization," he said.

Stoltenberg declined to say how long the training might go on. The U.S. and NATO fought in Afghanistan for over a decade and helped build up local forces there for several years.

"One thing is to win on the battlefield, but afterwards we have to make sure that we are able to stabilize the country, and enable the local forces... the local authorities to be in charge," he said. "It's dangerous to leave too early because then we may be forced back into combat operations." (AP)

Built in the first decade of the 20th century as Europe's gateway to the east, Istanbul Haydarpasa railway station stands proudly on the Asian side of the Bosphorus, its gothic towers looming over the waters.

The imposing facade has witnessed and survived more than a century of turbulent and sometimes tragic history; the collapse of the Ottoman Empire, World War I, the deportation of Armenians, military coups and a devastating November 2010 fire that destroyed the roof.

But this most historic of railway stations now lacks its most fundamental component - trains.

Since 2013, the celebrated terminus has not seen any train traffic after being shut for restoration work and a major upgrade of Turkey's railway network.

With the refurbishment stalling, top local officials openly spoke of plans to sell off the station, possibly turning it into a hotel, shopping centre or entertainment complex.

The situation sparked alarm among Turkish architecture and heritage activists, who staged weekly demonstrations to salvage its future.

In 2012, when the number of trains pulling in and out of the station had already dropped

off, Havdarpasa -- pronounced Haydarpasha and named after the neighbourhood where it is located -- was placed on the watch list of endangered heritage by the World Monuments Fund NGO.

'Trains to come back'

However, Turkish architecture activists, local officials and Turkish State Railways (TCDD) told that the station's future as a railway terminus was now assured after a period of uncertainty.

"It will remain in public ownership. There were debates but right now there is no such danger (of privatising) the train station," Aykurt Nuhoglu, the mayor of the Istanbul district of Kadikoy where the station is located, told AFP.

"The trains will begin to arrive as of 2019."

An official from TCDD added, asking not to be named: "It is being restored as a train station, nothing else is being considered."

Once the station is reopened, it should be the terminus for the new highspeed trains from Ankara which are currently stopping in Pendik, well outside the centre, as well as again being a hub for commuter trains.

'Murder on the Orient **Express'**

Haydarpasa station -- designed by two German architects -was inaugurated in its current form in 1909, five years before the outbreak of World War I.

It was a symbol of the friendship between the Ottoman Empire and imperial Germany under Kaiser Wilhelm II, who yearned to expand Berlin's influence deep

into the Middle East and had sealed a strong relationship with Sultan Abdulhamid II.

The station was to be the key hub of the kaiser's dream of a Berlin to Baghdad railway passing through Constantinople, Aleppo and Mosul, with a branchline south to Damascus.

One of the darkest moments in its history came on April 24, 1915 when Haydarpasa was used as the start point for the deportation of the first convoy of Armenians rounded up in Istanbul. Turkey denies Armenian assertions that the ensuing mass slaughter amounted to genocide.

Until its closure five years ago, Haydarpasa was a busy station, with commuter trains but also overnight services to towns in eastern Turkey like Kars and Van, as well as a service going as far as Tehran.

It was also the starting point of the Istanbul-Baghdad train service -- the Taurus Express -- which features in the opening chapter of Agatha Christie's "Murder on the Orient Express" but is now indefinitely suspended.

'Historic solidarity'

"Haydarpasa is not just a building of architectural importance but is at a critical point for the railways," said İshak Kocabiyik, a former general secretary of Turkey's United Transport Workers' Union.

"There were attempts to turn this land into a trade centre and a cruise port. We have so far stopped such attempts by using our right to opposition," he added.

Activists insist that it was only due to pressure from civil society that plans to transform the station into a hotel or shopping complex were thwarted.

"Our solidarity was a mission that will go down in history," said lawyer Ersin Albuz, a key force in the campaign. "We will keep going until all trains stop here and when that happens, only then will we end our campaign."

Some architects accuse the government under President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, a former mayor of Istanbul, of trampling on heritage in a drive to modernise the city, but the government insists it is merely implementing much-needed infrastructure improvements.

'Like back in the old days'


These include a major revamp of Turkey's railway network, which at the start of the millennium had barely changed from its pre-WW I layout, meaning most Turks took the bus or plane.

But what activists now want is the entire area around Haydarpasa to be revitalised and the terminus to become as bustling as any station in Europe.

"We want commuter trains and regional trains to stop there, just like back in the old days," said Kocabiyik, indicating a degree of scepticism about the authorities' assurances for the station's future.

The head of the Istanbul Chamber of Architects, Sami Yilmazturk, who has been bitterly critical of the government's infrastructure drive, described the station as a "gate of Istanbul on Europe".

Vowing to keep watch on the government's plans, he said: "Today it is being restored as a train station but I am concerned that might change two days later." (AFP)

il rose towards \$65 barrel yesterday, supported by Saudi Arabia's comment that it would rather see an undersupplied market than end an OPEC-led deal to withhold production too soon, and by a weak U.S. dollar.

Saudi Energy Minister Khalid al-Falih said on Wednesday the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries would do better to leave the market tight than end the deal on cutting output too early. Saudi Arabia is OPEC's top producer.

Brent crude, the global benchmark, rose 32 cents to\$64.68 as of 0943 GMT, extending the previous session's gain of \$1.64. U.S. crude was up 58 cents at \$61.18.

"Khalid al-Falih gave his strongest

hint yet that exiting the current supply agreement is unlikely to be on the agenda this year," said Tamas Varga of oil broker PVM.

Oil also gained as the U.S. dollar weakened, falling to a 15-month low against the yen. A weaker dollar makes oil and other dollardenominated commodities cheaper for holders of other currencies, potentially boosting demand.

"It seems that al-Falih felt this comment was necessary to stabilise oil prices," said Commerzbank analyst Carsten Fritsch of the Saudi minister's preference for a tighter market than an early boost in production.

"Prices are being additionally boosted by the fact that the U.S. dollar has been significantly weaker since yesterday.

The OPEC-led deal to cut output by 1.8 million barrels per day, almost 2 percent of global supply, started a year ago. Producers have succeeded in whittling down an excess of crude in storage that had been weighing on prices.

However, rising output in the United States is balancing the supply cuts by other producers.

U.S. crude production hit a record 10.27 million barrels per day, the Energy Information Administration said on Wednesday, more than Saudi Arabia pumps with Riyadh's voluntary curb on its output and not far from Russia.


With domestic production rising, U.S. crude inventories increased last week by 1.8 million barrels, although the gain was less than analysts had expected. (CNBC)

US strikes may have killed scores of Russian fighters in Syria

forces killed scores of Russian mercenaries in Syria last week in what may be the deadliest clash between citizens of the former foes since the Cold War, according to one U.S. official and three Russians familiar with the matter.

More than 200 contract soldiers, mostly Russians fighting on behalf of Syrian leader Bashar al-Assad, died in a failed attack in the oil-rich Deir al-Zour region, two of the Russians said. The U.S. official put the death toll in the fighting at about 100, with 200 to 300 injured, but was unable to say how many were Russians.

The attack took place on February 7, when the U.S. says hundreds of pro-government fighters supported by tanks and artillery advanced on a base east of the Euphrates River held by U.S.-backed Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) and American advisors. U.S. forces responded with aircraft and artillery fire, forcing the attackers to retreat.

laudi Arabia's central bank Shas signed a deal with U.S.based Ripple to help banks in the kingdom settle payments using blockchain software, as Gulf regulators begin to explore new forms of financial technology.

The pilot programme is the first of its kind to be launched by a central bank, allowing banks in Saudi Arabia to use Ripple's software to instantly settle payments sent into and out of the country, the company said late on Wednesday.

This will allow Saudi banks

to make faster, cheaper and more transparent cross-border transactions, Ripple said, adding that the central bank would provide training to Saudi banks interested in the program.

Most regulators in the Gulf initially expressed scepticism about fintech and last year the Saudi central bank warned citizens against trading bitcoin because it was outside the bank's regulatory reach.

But Bahrain, keen to boost its role as a regional financial center, has been exploring the use of digital currencies and in

the last few months, regulators in some larger Gulf economies have followed suit.

The Saudi central bank is working with the United Arab Emirates central bank to issue a digital currency that would be accepted in cross-border transactions between the two countries, UAE central bank governor Mubarak Rashed al-Mansouri told Reuters in December.

Earlier this week, the regulator of Abu Dhabi's international financial center said it might create rules for exchanges handling virtual currencies. (Reuters)

Indian bank is cheated of \$1.8 billion in complex fraud

New Delhi

Indian investigators are probing a \$1.8 billion bank fraud, an official said Thursday, with a wealthy jeweller reportedly using fake bank documents to obtain overseas loans.

State-owned Punjab National Bank said in a Wednesday statement that the "fraudulent and unauthorised transactions" had been discovered in January in a single Mumbai bank branch "for the benefit of a few select account holders with their apparent connivance."

India's Central Bureau of Investigation began its probe soon after the bank made the discovery, said Abhishek Dayal, an agency

spokesman. Numerous Indian media outlets have linked the scam to billionaire jeweler Nirav Modi.

Authorities have not publicly accused Modi in the \$1.8 billion fraud but say he is under investigation for allegedly cheating Punjab National Bank of \$43 million by using fake bank "letters of understanding" to get loans. The official complaint says Modi, along with his wife, brother and business partner, worked with a pair of bank employees to get the letters.

None could be reached for comment Thursday.

Indian news reports say the alleged \$43 million scam is a part of the larger fraud.

All left the country in early

January, before the alleged fraud was uncovered, the Press Trust of India news agency reported, quoting unidentified officials.

Bank officials say the \$1.8 billion scam appears to have gone on since 2011, but was only discovered in January. Most involved letters of understanding sent to overseas offices of Indian banks, which made the actual loans, said Sunil Mehta, Punjab National Bank's managing director.

Mehta said the fraud remained under investigation, but the bank would take responsibility where it

"The bank will honour all its bona fide commitments," Mehta said. (AP)

Tallest wooden skyscraper set for Tokyo in 2041

apanese architects have unveiled plans for the world's tallest wooden skyscraper.

The 1,148-feet (350-metre) tower, housing shops, homes, offices and a hotel, will become the tallest building in Japan when it is completed

Positioned in central Tokyo, the aim of the £4.2 billion (\$5.9 billion) structure is to turn the Japanese capital into an environment-friendly city and help 'transform the city into a forest', architects behind the plans said.

Designs for the structure were drawn up by Tokyobased architectural firm

Nikken Sikkei, but the building will be constructed by the Forestry arm of the Sumitomo Group, one of Japan's largest business conglomerates.

Currently referred to as the W350 Project, named after its height, it is not clear which woods have been chosen as the building material.

The tower has 70 stories above ground and is made of a combination of wood and steel, with more than 6.5 million cubic feet (0.2 million cubic metres) of wood making up 90 per cent of the construction material.

Nikken Sekkei's plans outline a braced tube structure that is able to

withstand strong winds, as well as Japan's frequent earthquakes.

As well as offices, a hotel, shops and residential units, the completed tower will feature a garden roof, balconies covered with greenery, water features and large internal open spaces filled with natural light.

Brock Commons Tallwood House, a 174-foothigh (53-metre) student accommodation tower opened at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver, Canada, last autumn, holds the current record for the world's tallest primarily wooden building.

S.Africa lawmakers choose Ramaphosa to succeed Zuma



Cape Town

outh African lawmakers South African Manager South former businessman Cyril Ramaphosa as new president yesterday after scandaltainted Jacob Zuma resigned under intense pressure from his own party.

Ramaphosa, the only candidate, was approved without a vote by the parliament in Cape Town, chief justice Mogoeng Mogoeng told assembled lawmakers, to loud cheers.

Zuma announced his resignation late Wednesday, and aimed barbs at the African National Congress (ANC) party for vowing to

oust him via a no-confidence vote in parliament.

In a 30-minute televised address, Zuma said he had "come to the decision to resign as president of the republic with immediate effect".

"I have only asked my party to articulate my transgressions and the reason for its immediate instruction that I vacate office," he said.

Zuma, 75, had been embroiled in a divisive power struggle with Ramaphosa, the deputy president.

Ramaphosa won control of the ANC when he was elected as its head in December.

Samba school with anti-graft message triumphs at Rio Carnival



Rio De Janeiro

Decrying rampant corruption and social rampant problems in Brazil, Rio de Janeiro's Beija-Flor samba school clinched first place on Wednesday after a twonight parade showdown that crowned Carnival festivities in the sweltering city.

Beija Flor triumphed over 12 other schools with a theme that depicted government employees with gold-lined briefcases and corruption-plagued state oil giant Petrobras turned into a favela, as performers enacted a shoot-out in a school classroom near a coffin containing a young child.

"You call me brother so much, and you abandon me to the throne," the dancers sang. "Greed wears a suit and tie, where hope succumbed."

Anger at corruption reached a fever pitch in Brazil

after a criminal investigation revealed collusion between company executives and politicians to bilk Petrobras out of billions of dollars by overcharging the oil company for contracts.

samba schools spend months preparing elaborate parades that can cost upwards of \$2 million and feature over-the-top floats and heavily costumed dancers that prance across a 700-meter runway in Rio's sambodrome, as they vye for the prize of bragging rights

Even as some fans spent over \$1,000 to witness the annual parades, Rio was overrun by violence. Actress Juliana Paes was held up by assailants just outside the samba venue and over a hundred were arrested for taking part in thefts during the holiday, despite a rampup in security. (Reuters)

Duterte offers k bounty for rebels to aims at armed militia members of Communist Party Philippine President Rodrigo Dute

The Philippine president offered a nearly \$500 bounty for each communist rebel killed by government forces to save on antiinsurgency costs and said insurgents are easier to hit than birds because they have bigger heads.

Rodrigo President Duterte's latest crass remarks, which the government issued to reporters late Wednesday, came after human rights groups condemned him this week for saying troops should shoot female communist guerrillas in the genitals to render them

"You kill an NPA today and I'll pay you 25,000" pesos, Duterte said in a speech at an air base in central Cebu city, referring to New People's Army guerrillas.

"I was computing that if this drags on for four years ... it'll be very expensive because it's war. If I'll just pay 25,000 for a life, I can save about 47 percent," he said to laughter from the crowd.

There was no elaboration on how he came up with those figures and whether or how the government would pay for claimed kills. Backing up his offer, the brash-talking president encouraged state forces to go

"If you work really hard to crawl across the forest, you'll surely be able to shoot even just one. If you can shoot a bird above you, then how much more an NPA whose head is so big?" Duterte said, again eliciting laughter from the crowd.

Regional rebel commander Jaime Padilla, who uses the nom de guerre Ka Diego, said Duterte wouldn't scare the guerrillas into ending their uprising even if he offers a million pesos for each rebel killed because the rebellion has been fuelled by deep social ills such as poverty for nearly a century.

"These are not remarks of a sane president," Padilla

said by telephone. "These are words of a thug or a goon, who reigns like a king in our country.

He said the guerrillas remain open to resuming stalled talks with the administration despite the president's "fascist" style.

Human Rights Watch said Duterte's remarks encourage government forces to commit war crimes instead of instilling a culture of accountability in accordance with international

"Duterte's pronouncements normalize the idea that government security forces can do as they wish to defeat their enemies, including summary

and executions sexual violence," said Carlos Conde of the U.S.-based rights group.

The volatile president turned up the rhetoric against the communist guerrillas after peace talks brokered by Norway collapsed last year when he protested continuing rebel attacks on government forces. When a rebel leader recently warned that the guerrillas could kill one soldier a day, Duterte countered by threatening to kill five rebels daily and offering to train tribesmen as militias and give them bounties to kill the insurgents.

Duterte is already under international criticism

and facing a preliminary investigation by International Criminal Court for thousands of deaths in the war on drugs he initiated after becoming president two years ago.

He lashed out at his critics and asked why the ICC was focusing on him when atrocities were occurring elsewhere.

"There are Rohingya who are being slaughtered, but they only chose to indict me. OK, you asked for it, let's have a trial. I will cross-examine you," said Duterte, a former state prosecutor, referring to Muslims fleeing from violence and persecution in Myanmar. (AP)

First transgender officer joins Philippine army reserves

The Philippine military has welcomed its first transgender officer, the defence department said yesterday, swearing in a prominent member of Congress as a reservist.

Geraldine Roman, 50, who became the Catholic-majority nation's first transgender person elected to Congress in 2016, took her oath on Wednesday.

"That indeed makes her the first transgender officer in the Armed Forces of the Philippines," defence department spokesman Arsenio Andolong said in a statement.

"Her being part of the (military) underscores the fact that gender is not an issue when it comes to serving the country," he added.

The Philippine military frequently inducts prominent figures like legislators and cabinet members as reserve officers.

Roman was appointed as a lieutenant colonel in the army reserves, alongside two fellow



House of Representatives members, the statement added.

"War and disaster do not recognise gender, it affects everybody, and everyone must defend and serve our communities, and our country," the statement quoted her saying during the

Born to politically prominent family based near Manila, Roman changed her gender in the 1990s.

Her political success has been hailed by lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) campaigners in a conservative society where divorce and same-sex marriage are both banned.

The Philippine military last year announced it would accept LGBT applicants "as long as they act and move with dignity". (AFP)

Pakistan asks Trump to help fund Afghanistan border fence



Miranshah, Pakistan

Pakistan is building a fence along its border with Afghanistan, and it wants Donald Trump to pay for it or at least some of it.

The 1,800-mile barrier being constructed will help end "the prolonged agony" of the Afghan war and reduce terrorism inside Pakistan, said Nasir Khan Janjua, the national security adviser to Shahid Khaqan Abbasi, the prime minister.

Janjua said that Pakistan would like the US president to pay for the barrier - or at least the Afghan side - arguing that the \$532m (£378m) price tag will be a lot cheaper than the \$45bn annual estimated cost of the Afghan war.

At a briefing in Miranshah, the main town in North

Waziristan - one of the semi-autonomous Federally Administered Tribal Areas -Pakistani officials laid out a timetable for construction of the 10ft wire fence running the length of the porous border with Afganistan.

In a bunker at the headquarters of the army's 7th Infantry Division, Col Wasi Uddin said 11,136 border posts and 443 forts are being installed on the Pakistani side - seven times more than on the Afghan side.

Uddin said Pakistan planned to complete the fence by 2019, apart from a section in the extreme north of the country. The border will be fitted with underground movement sensors and a network of CCTV cameras, Uddin said. (theguardian)

The man who owned Portsmouth for six weeks during an The man who owned Portsmouth for six media and ill-fated spell in 2009 has been sentenced to five years in a United Arab Emirates jail for stealing £5m from his wife to fund the purchase.

Sulaiman Al Fahim, who also fronted the Abu Dhabi United Group's deal to buy Manchester City in 2008, was found guilty of forgery, using forged documents and aiding and abetting.

He and an accomplice were found to have stolen the money used to buy Pompey from Sacha Gaydamak, with Al Fahim soon selling the club to Ali Al Faraj.

Al Fahim, 42, did not attend the hearing and was sentenced in his absence.

Prosecutors said that Al Fahim's wife discovered the money was missing after the returns she had expected from a high interest rate account she opened in 2009 did not come in.

She said she contacted the bank's accounts manager, but he "kept stalling" despite her asking him to move the account in September 2011.

Muguruza rolls past Cirstea

arbine Muguruza of Spain had very few problems reaching the quarterfinals of the Qatar Total Open, as the reigning Wimbledon champion dispatched Romanian Sorana Cirstea, 6-0, 6-4, in a third-round match yesterday.

The Spaniard was in dominant form against Cirstea, extending her head-to-head record with the Romanian to 3-0 after wins at the Australian Open and Wimbledon last year. Muguruza has now won

consecutive matches for the first time this season.

Muguruza led 6-0, 5-1, before closing out the match. "I think I played very well in the first set, and in the second set she came out much better, reached a high level, I made a few mistakes, and there we go, the match is equal," Muguruza said on court, after the match.

"I like to feel the pressure, to be one of those privileged tennis players that can hope for the title, and it's good," Muguruza continued. "It's tough when you lose, but I like it."

Muguruza finished the match 5-for-8 on break points, and put a solid 82 percent of first serves into play. Meanwhile, Cirstea had a whopping 43 unforced errors in the match, compared to only 10 winners.

In the first set, Muguruza played composed tennis while Cirstea self-destructed in a flurry of unforced errors. The Romanian had 14 miscues in the set, while

Muguruza had just a single unforced error, and the Spaniard hit more winners in the opening frame by a margin of five to three.

Cirstea was broken at love in the first game of the match, and a backhand winner by Muguruza gave her a second break to lead 3-0, after Cirstea had reached game point with an ace. After a love service game for 4-0, Muguruza broke again before closing out the first set whitewash in the next game with an ace. (*Wtatennis*)
