MOVIE: CHRONIC

Chronic is a 2015 English-language Franco-Mexican drama film written and directed by Michel Franco. David is an in-home nurse who works with terminally ill patients. Efficient and dedicated to his profession, David develops strong, even intimate, relationships with each person he cares for. But outside of his work, David is ineffectual, awkward, and reserved – effects of his chronic depression – and he needs each patient as much as they need him. Having long carried a burden of guilt and remorse, David must face his past in order to heal. The film won the Best Screenplay Award and was nominated for the Golden Palm Award at Cannes Film Festival.
