Bahrain yesterday marked its 46th National Day with His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa leading the celebrations in the Sakhir Palace

HM the King arrived at the ceremony accompanied by a constellation of cavalry as the artillery fired twentyone rounds to salute His Majesty.

In his speech, His Majesty the King told the nation that there is "no better occasion than this to affirm our commitment to our national principles based on unity, depth of belonging and tolerance of coexistence, which protect Bahrain against the forces of destruction and division."

King Hamad stressed that this is an occasion to renew the pledge of loyalty to the sacrifices of the martyrs of the homeland, "who came to its aid and gave their souls to defend its sovereignty".

"Today, Bahrain is at the forefront of the global development race according to performance indicators in all fields of work," said HM the King adding: "This is an incentive which makes us, with God's help, advance with the same strength and determination to continue the blessed journey of our development."

Shortly after the speech HM the King conferred medals of appreciation on national work pioneers.

The celebrations mark the anniversary of the establishment of the modern state of Bahrain as an Arab and Muslim country in 1783 by its founder Ahmed Al-Fateh, the 46th Anniversary of its accession to the UN as a full member and the 18th Anniversary of HM the King's Accession to the Throne. His Royal Highness Prime Minister Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander and First Deputy Prime Minister, and the Malaysian Prime Minister, Haji Mohammad Najib bin Tun Haji Abdul Razak, were present.

The Malaysian Prime Minister extended sincere congratulations to HM King Hamad on the glorious National Days, wishing Bahrain and its people further progress and prosperity.

Najib began his three-day official visit with an audience with King Hamad at Shaikh Hamad palace earlier, during which he was honoured with the King Hamad Order of the Renaissance of the First Class.

The booming popularity The booming por of Bitcoin is only the beginning of the growth and development of digital assets, crypto-currencies and the application of the blockchain technology, according to Blockchain technology expert Alex Tapscott.

Talking to DT News on the unprecedented surge witnessed by Bitcoin and cryptocurrencies, Tapscott said, "The development has caused an international frenzy, with people from all over the world investing and trading with such currencies in order to make a profit.'

According to him one of the reasons for the frenzy is social media. "News of early investors becoming millionaires and billionaires have blown up on social media."

He, however, also points out that while excitement has been stirring up at one end, anxiety about it being a 'bubble' has been evolving at the other.

"Many have called it the biggest bubble the world has ever seen," Tapscott warns.

In this regard, Tapscott said he is more excited about the technology behind bitcoin "rather than the short-term financial rewards or risks it has to offer".

"I am more interested in the technology behind it, not in giving investment advice," he told DT News.

He said the Blockchain, a technology invented by Satoshi Nakamoto in order to create Bitcoin is as revolutionary as the internet. He said that countries must not wait in adopting the technology.

"Bitcoin is a better accounting system than any we have ever devised.

"Its a ledger that allows us to



What is Bitcoin?

Bitcoin is a new currency that was created in 2009 by an unknown person using the alias Satoshi Nakamoto. Transactions are made with no middlemen - meaning, no banks! Bitcoin can be used to book hotels on Expedia, shop for furniture on Overstock and buy Xbox games. But much of the hype is about getting rich by trading it. The price of bitcoin skyrocketed into the thousands in 2017.

How Bitcoin works?

Bitcoins are completely virtual coins designed to be 'selfcontained' for their value, with no need for banks to move

Once you own bitcoins, they possess value and trade just as if they were nuggets of gold in your pocket. You can use your bitcoins to purchase goods and services online, or you can tuck them away and hope that their value increases over the years. Bitcoins are traded from one personal 'wallet' to another.

A wallet is a small personal database that you store on your computer drive, on your smartphone, on your tablet, or somewhere in the cloud. (CNN/Economic Times)

know who owes what money in a way that is peer to peer and relatively anonymous,

"This is something that is relatively new," he points out.

He added: "What Bitcoin is worth is very subjective, it's in the eye of the beholder, the same I think can be said for the FIAT currencies. So the value today may seem very high but it is relatively low to most other asset classes such global equity market."

Looking ahead, he said, "Bitcoin is the first digital asset but it's not going to be

He said that there are lots of new kinds of technologies like Etherium which is a platform to run applications in a decentralized way.

"Soon you will see the third class of digital assets which in fact will have a claim on something; with digital assets functioning a lot like securities," he said adding: What I can say right now is that we are really just in the beginning stages of all this."

Saudi Arabian women will be able to drive trucks and motorcycles, officials have said three months after the kingdom announced a historic decision to end a ban on women driving.

King September, Salman issued a decree saying women will be able to drive

from next June as part of an ambitious reform push in the conservative kingdom.

The Saudi General Directorate of Traffic gave details of the new regulations that will follow the lifting of the ban on the official Saudi Press Agency late on Friday.

"Yes, we will authorise women to drive motorcycles"

as well as trucks, it said, adding that the royal decree stipulates that the law on driving will be "equal" for both men and women.

There will be no special licence plate numbers for female-driven cars, it said.

But women involved in road accidents or who commit traffic violations will

be dealt with at special centres that will be established and run by women. Its historic decision to allow women to drive from next June has been cheered inside the kingdom and abroad -- and comes after decades of resistance from female activists, many of whom were jailed for flouting the ban. Egypt reopens ancient library

Egypt reopened yesterday an ancient library which holds thousands of centuriesold religious and historical manuscripts at the famed St. Catherine Monastery, a UNESCO World Heritage site, in South Sinai.

The inauguration ceremony, attended by Egyptian and western officials, comes after three years of restoration work on the eastern side of the library that houses the world's second largest collection of early codices and manuscripts, outnumbered only by the Vatican Library, according to Monk Damyanos, the monastery's archbishop.

"The library is now open to the public and scholars," said

Tony Kazamias, an adviser to the archbishop, adding that restoration work is still underway without specifying a completion date.

The ancient library holds around 3,300 manuscripts of mainly Christian texts in Greek, Arabic, Syriac, and Slavonic Georgian, among other languages. It also contains thousands of books and scrolls dating to the 4th century.

At least 160 of the manuscripts include faint scratches and ink tints beneath more recent writing, according to Kazamias, who believes the palimpsests were likely scraped out by the monastery's monks and reused sometime between the 8th- 12th centuries.

the During library's renovation, archaeologists apparently found some of Hippocrates' centuries-old medical recipes. The ancient Greek physician is widely regarded as the "father of western medicine."

"The valuable most manuscript in the library is the Codex Sinaiticus, (which) dates back to the fourth century," said the Rev. Justin, an American monk working as the monastery's librarian. "This is the most precious manuscript in the world," referring to the ancient, handwritten copy of the New Testament.

The library also held some ancient paintings which are currently on display in the monastery's museum.

"There are beautiful paintings in the manuscripts. When you turn the (pages) there is a flash of gold and colors. It is a living work of art," said Justin.

officials The inaugurated the Mosaic of the Transfiguration situated in the eastern apse of the monastery's great basilica. It mosaic covers 46 square meters and features a rich chromatic range of glass paste, glass, stone, gold and silver tesserae. Jesus Christ is depicted in its center between the prophets Elias and Moses.

The 6th century mosaic was created at the behest of the Byzantine Emperor Justinian, who also requested building the monastery. St. Catherine's,

located, is an area revered by followers of the Abrahamic faiths, Judaism, Christianity and Islam. Like the Old City of Jerusalem, it has become a popular destination and an attraction not only for pilgrims

but also tourists from the world over. The 6th century monastery, one of the oldest Christian Orthodox ones, is home to a small number of monks who observe prayers and daily rituals unchanged for centuries. (AP)





Feminism: Misunderstood

hen Merriam-Webster Dictionary announced that the Word of the Year for 2017 was feminism, it was hardly surprising. Women were everywhere this year: their achievements and the issues they face were the topic of many a news article, so it is unsurprising that feminism was one of the most searched words online. Yet feminism continues to be misunderstood and viewed as a "bad word." Far from accomplishing its goals, feminism needs the support of all women in order to move forward.


Merriam-Webster defines feminism as "the theory of the political, economic, and social equality of the sexes" and "organized activity on behalf of women's rights and interests." The theory is simple: a woman's gender should not impede their ability to run for office, vote, hold a job, study, etc. Feminism does not mean that women hate men, or are better than men, or should have privileges over men. Feminism does not mean that women should abandon their families and stop acting "feminine," it simply means that women should be able to have choices.

Yet even today, feminism is considered a bad word, a word that makes people—both men and women uncomfortable. Studies show that girls don't want to call themselves feminists because it makes them seem "uncool" or "difficult." Numerous celebrities, when questioned, have said that they don't identify as feminists because they don't want to be labeled. It seems as though the word itself is the problem-after all, if you asked these celebrities if they felt women should, for example, receive equal pay to men, they would likely agree. The very word feminism (and feminist) has been twisted so that even women—the very people it is trying to help—shy away from the concept.

There is also the prevailing argument that feminism isn't needed anymore. While many countries have enshrined equality in their laws, socially there is plenty of work to be done. As the United States proved in 2017, no country is living in a post-feminism era. There are women who say, "I have everything I need or want, I don't see how I'm oppressed" or "I don't feel constricted because I am a woman." These women are free to feel this way, but just because they do not feel discriminated against does not mean thousands and millions of other women don't suffer because of gender discrimination.

Feminism has accomplished a lot, but it still has far to go. Feminism needs all women on board. To do this, let's start with getting the definition correct.

Iraq plans new oil pipeline network

Baahdad

Traq plans to build a pipeline network to carry oil products across all its territory as an alternative to expensive and hazardous transport by tanker truck, Oil Minister Jabar al-Luaibi said on Saturday. The network is part of a "strategic" plan for oil transportation that includes pipelines to deliver crude and oil products to neighbouring countries, he said.

The only crude pipeline now in operation in Iraq links the northern, semi-autonomous Kurdish region to Turkey's Mediterranean coast.

All other crude pipelines were shut down or destroyed in the past 35 years as a result of wars and conflicts. iRAQ, OPEC's second-largest producer after Saudi Arabia, once had an extensive network of pipelines to export its crude.

One of them carried Iraqi

oil across Syria to Lebanon's Mediterranean coast, another to Turkey's Mediterranean coast, largely bypassing the Kurdish region, and one to the Red Sea across Saudi Arabia.

Iraq earlier this month announced plans to build a crude pipeline to fellow OPEC member Iran. (*Reuters*)

Recycled rocket soars with recycled capsule

SpaceX racked up another first on Friday, launching a recycled rocket with a recycled capsule on a grocery run for NASA.

Second-time flier

Falcon rocket blasted off, taking flight again after a six-month turnaround, with a Dragon supply ship, also a second-time flier. The Dragon reaches the space station Sunday.

Back in 10mins

Within 10 minutes of liftoff, the first-stage booster was back at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station, standing upright on the giant X at SpaceX's landing zone.

5000 pounds of goods

This time, the capsule is hauling nearly 5,000 pounds of goods, including 40 mice for a muscle-wasting study, a first-of-its-kind impact sensor for measuring space debris as minuscule as a grain of sand and barley seeds for a germination experiment by Budweiser, already angling to serve the first beer on Mars.

Acompromise Republican tax bill released late Friday does not eliminate a \$7,500 electric vehicle tax credit







Al Masti detaine

Amman

Sabih al-Masri, Jordan's influential businessman and the chairman of its largest lender Arab Bank, was detained in Saudi Arabia for questioning after a business trip to Riyadh, family sources and friends said yesterday.

A Saudi citizen of Palestinian origin, Masri was detained last Tuesday hours before he was planning to leave after he chaired meetings of companies he owns, according to the sources.

He is the founder of Saudi Astra Group, which has wide interests in diversified industries ranging from agro-industry telecommunications, construction and mining across the region.

"Masri was heading to the airport and they told him to stay where you are and they picked him up," said a source familiar with the matter who asked not to be named.

He canceled a dinner in Amman on Wednesday that he had invited board members of Arab Bank and business associates to attend

on his return.

Masri could not be reached for comment. The Saudi authorities did not respond to requests for comment.

"He has been answering questions about his business and partners," said a source familiar with the matter who did not elaborate nor confirm he was held.

Masri, who comes from a prominent merchant family from Nablus in the Israelioccupied West Bank, amassed a fortune from partnering with influential Saudis in a major catering business to supply troops during the U.S.-led military operation to retake Kuwait from Iraq in the 1991 Gulf War.

He was elected chairman of Arab Bank in 2012 after the resignation of Abdel Hamid Shoman whose family had founded the bank in Jerusalem in 1930.

The bank, which has earned a reputation of resilience in the face of political upheaval, played a prominent role in supporting former Palestinian leader, the late Yasser Arafat during past Middle East turmoil.

Arab Bank, which operates

in 30 countries and five continents, has an extensive network in Palestinian territories where it is the largest bank. It also owns 40 percent of Saudi Arabia's Arab National Bank ANB.

Masri led consortium of Arab and Jordanian investors who bought a 20 percent stake in Arab Bank Group from Lebanon's Hariri family business empire for \$1.12 billion last February.

He was also instrumental in agreeing in 2015 to settle litigation brought by hundreds of Americans who accused Arab Bank of providing financial services in the West Bank that facilitated militant attacks in Israel.

Masri is also the leading investor in the Palestinian territories with a large stake in Paltel, a public shareholding company, which is the largest private sector firm in the West Bank

family ranks Masri's among the wealthiest in the Palestinian territories, with majority holdings in real estate, hotels and telecommunications firms set up after a self-rule agreement with Israel in 1993. (Reuters)

china and Britain have vowed to continue and strengthen cooperation on a wide range of economic, financial and trade issues, including speeding the introduction of a London-Shanghai stock connect programme.

In a joint statement on Saturday, coinciding with an official visit to China by British finance minister Philip Hammond, the countries also said they opposed trade protectionism and reaffirmed their support for the World Trade Organisation as a key pillar of the global trade system. The statement comes

as China, in an unusual step, accused the United States and the European Union of breaking promises that they made when China joined the WTO.

Speaking at a press conference in Beijing together with Chinese Vice Premier Ma Kai, Hammond said the two countries were also discussing a long-awaited London-Shanghai stock connect programme, as well as a possible scheme to connect their bond markets.

"We have agreed to accelerate the final preparations for the London-Shanghai stock connect initiative and we've agreed to commence feasibility studies for a UK-China bond connect and for mutual recognition of funds between the two jurisdictions," he said.

Hammond, who also visited a separate forum on Saturday where the London and Shenzhen stock exchanges signed a pact on supporting innovative companies, said he hopes to see more Chinese small firms "make the most of our country's startup expertise, networks and capital raising capabilities."

Other areas of cooperation highlighted in Saturday's joint statement include encouraging each country's banks to increase their presence and activity in the other country, the promotion of China-U.K. cross-border yuan business, an agreement to cooperate on ultra-low-emission vehicles, and support of the yuan as a settlement currency.

China and the U.K. will establish a new joint expert group to exchange views on macroeconomic and fiscal policy, the joint statement said. Former British PM David Cameron will also be involved in a proposed \$1 billion bilateral investment fund, the statement added. (Reuters)

Tobacco industry trumps as court cancels labeling rules

New Delhi

An Indian court on Friday quashed federal rules that mandated stringent graphic health warnings on tobacco products, lawyers involved in the case said, in a decision seen as a major victory for the tobacco industry and a setback for health advocates.

India's Supreme Court last year ordered enforcement of the government's 2014 federal rules that required 85 percent of a tobacco pack's surface to be covered in health warnings, up from 20 percent earlier,



despite protests by the tobacco industry.

At the same time, the top court had asked a court in southern Karnataka state to rule on the dozens of tobacco industry pleas that challenged the federal rules.

The High Court of Karnataka on Friday struck down the government's 2014 notification, said Aradhana L, a lawyer at Poovayya & Co, who represented tobacco companies including India's ITC and Philip Morris International Inc's Indian partner, Godfrey Phillips India Ltd.

India's tobacco packaging rules were among the world's most stringent and aimed at reducing tobacco consumption

which kills more than 900,000 people a year. The World Health Organization estimates tobacco-related diseases cost India about \$16 billion annually.

A government survey earlier this year found that 62 percent of cigarette smokers thought of quitting because of warning labels on the packets.

Industry lawyer Sajan Poovayya cheered the move. "Bye Bye gruesome warnings on tobacco packages," he said on Twitter after the verdict. (Reuters) There are no secrets to success. It is the result of preparation, hard work, and learning from failure. -**Colin Powell**

"For years, he was my monster," Hayek wrote in the opinion piece in which she included descriptions of sexual harassment, bullying and threats. (IANS)


Streep responds to Tom Hanks' remark





Paranoid Kim Jong-un has changed every phone number in North Korea after a telephone directory was smuggled abroad.

The jumpy dictator has ordered engineers to bring in new numbers for everyone listed in the book - which included Kim's security services.

During the summer, an internal directory containing numbers for government departments, as well as other private lines was smuggled out, causing a headache for the authorities.

It ended up in China and later pages were published on news website Daily NK. Several people have since been arrested on suspicion of treason.

Now the outlet has reported that secretive Kim has shut down all the landline telephone services - causing havoc for merchants.

And it could take six months to make the changes.

A source told Daily NK: "The directory is about 500 pages long and was published in 2003. It contains the phone numbers of all department offices and security desks across the country.

"There are numbers for various companies and their managers, Workers' Party offices, judicial offices criminal hotlines. and prosecutors' offices, and many other offices and government departments."

According to another source, traders are facing difficulties with the outage as they can no longer easily coordinate business with partners in other regions They are now being forced to use costly mobile phones.

Another source in North Hamgyong Province added: "Many are feeling uneasy now, because in the markets in South Pyongan Province, we have not been able to contact other merchants in the Pyongsong market.

"Landline phone services preferred among merchants due to their cheaper usage fees over mobile services, so this has really caused us a lot of problems."

Even workers in stateowned companies are complaining, demanding a speedy return of landline services as they fear the increased costs associated with mobile phone usage.

Workers away on business trips must also now use personal mobile phones in order to keep their managers updated on their trade activities.

People have been heard complaining about the country's "turtle pace" compared to the rest of the world, suspecting that it may be six months before service is restored. (thesun.co.uk)


Police did not identify the victims, who were found on Friday, but Canadian media named them as Sherman and his wife Honey, prominent Canadians whose deaths

Rahul Gandhi extends family grip on Congress

New Delhi

India's Rahul Gandhi took over yesterday as president of the main opposition Congress, becoming the sixth member of the Nehru-Gandhi dynasty to head the party that has ruled the country for much of its independent history.

Fireworks erupted over the party headquarters in New Delhi drowning out the voice of his mother Sonia Gandhi as she handed over the reins of power to her 47-year-old son, who now faces the tough task of ousting the right-wing

government of premier Narendra Modi.

Rahul, wearing a long flowing white kurta, smiled and waved from the dais adorned with posters of his late grandmother and father, former prime ministers Indira and Rajiv Gandhi.

"I accept this position with the deepest humility, with the knowledge that I will always be walking in the shadow of giants," Gandhi said in his acceptance speech which quickly became an attack on Modi and the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). (AFP)

Ancient Biblical city found intact underwater

mainly thanks to his booming International Petroleum Investment Company.

Shaikh Mansour is the deputy Prime Minister of his native United Arab Emirates, minister of presidential affairs, as well as member of the ruling family of Abu Dhabi.

The 47-year-old Mansour is even buddies with Richard Branson, owning a large stake in the British entrepreneur's Virgin Galactic spaceship company.

And if that's not enough, his Premier League team are bossing English football at the moment.

They could even add a Champions League crown to their trophy cabinet this season, which would make Mansour's investment seem sound.

But who is Mansour and what does he spend his money on?

Let us invite you into his world of wealth, including a £400m yacht he let one of Hollywood's biggest movie stars borrow.

Football teams

In 2008 Shaikh Mansour bought Man City with his Abu Dhabi United Group for £210m and has ensured The Citizens buy the best talent in the world.

But the Shaikh Mansour is a shrewd businessman and

doesn't throw his money away that easy.

In fact, the day City signed Gareth Barry for £12m from Aston Villa, he also made a \$1.4bn profit selling a stake in Barclays he bought months earlier. Mansour launched a second team in the MLS in New York in 2013, luring Frank Lampard and David Villa to New York City F.C. in recent years.

Another apology saw him set up the impressive Wilfred Zaha for a goal, with Bakary Sako adding a late third as Palace moved up to 14th.

Roy Hodgson's men are now unbeaten in seven games and their cause was aided by sloppy Leicester, who had birthday boy Wilfred Ndidi sent off in the second half.

Vicente Iborra had a goal disallowed for the hosts, who had previously won four straight games, as they missed the chance to move within two

points of the top five.

Benteke had been in the spotlight after missing the lastminute spot kick in the 2-2 draw with Bournemouth and he was keen to make amends but failed to pounce on Jeff Schlupp's early cross.

Kasper Schmeichel also saved smartly from Ruben Loftus-Cheek during Palace's bright start.

Buoyed by their late 2-1 comeback win against Watford on Tuesday Palace bossed sloppy Leicester and cashed in after 19 minutes.

It was a simple goal but a well-crafted one as Andros Townsend made room to cross for Benteke, who lost Wes Morgan to head in from 12 yards before celebrating with his fingers in his ears.

It was Palace's first away goal of the season but owed much to Leicester's slapdash marking while Schmeichel's positioning was also suspect as he failed to



Cristiano Ronaldo's superb freekick gave Real Madrid a 1-0 win over Brazilian side Gremio as they retained their FIFA Club World Cup title in Abu Dhabi.

Portugal forward Ronaldo, voted the Best FIFA Men's Player for 2017 and the Ballon d'Or winner for a fifth time, broke the deadlock after 53 minutes when he clipped the ball over the wall and into the bottom corner.

The hard-earned victory over a stubborn Gremio side at the Zayed Sports City Stadium was Real's third FIFA Club World Cup since 2014, equalling the record of LaLiga rivals Barcelona.

Real, who beat Al Jazira 2-1 in the semi-final with a goal from substitute Gareth Bale, started brightly as an effort from Karim Benzema was deflected behind.

Ronaldo then curled a shot wide before Isco fired over.

As the half-hour mark approached, the Brazilians had a chance to threaten when Casemiro conceded a free-kick 30 yards out.

Edilson opted for a long-range effort, which flew just over.

Ronaldo found himself with a clear sight of the Gremio goal after benefiting from a deflection, but could not get the ball under control.

As half-time approached, it was then Ronaldo's turn to fire in a freekick from distance, which again was narrowly too high.

The Champions League holders continued to press early in the second half.

Ronaldo sent another long-range shot wide before the deadlock was finally broken.

The Portugal forward was tripped just outside the Gremio penalty area

by Jailson.

Ronaldo got up to take the freekick himself and he dink it up over the wall and down into the bottom left corner past the diving goalkeeper.

Gremio, who beat Mexican side Pachuca to secure a place in Saturday's final, were forced to go on the offensive, but lacked any real threat.

It looked like Real had scored again just before the hour, but Ronaldo's effort was ruled out by an offside flag.

Gremio goalkeeper Marcelo

Grohe pushed a 20-yard effort from Luka Modric on to a post as Real continued to press.

With 10 minutes left, Bale replaced Benzema, and the Wales forward soon forced Grohe into another good save, this time tipping his curling shot over.

Earlier yesterday, Pachuca secured third place after a 4-1 win over home club Al Jazira. (eurosport)
