**A**ctors and filmmakers George Clooney and Grant Heslov, along with screenwriter-producer Matt Charman, are said to be working on a limited series that will explore the Watergate scandal that had forced then US President Richard Nixon out of office.

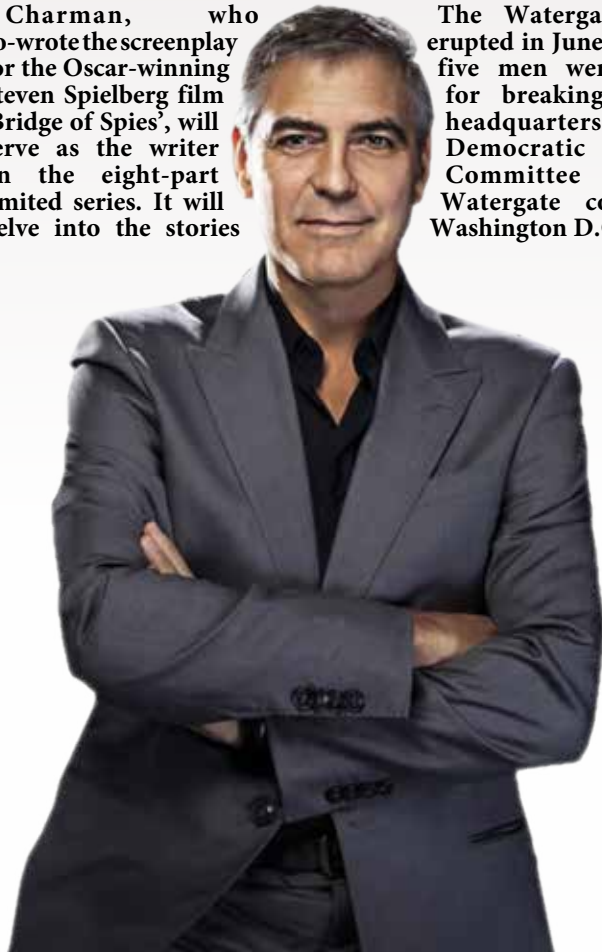
Charman, who co-wrote the screenplay for the Oscar-winning Steven Spielberg film 'Bridge of Spies', will serve as the writer on the eight-part limited series. It will delve into the stories

of certain key figures in the infamous scandal.

Clooney and Heslov will be the executive producers, with sources said that Clooney may also direct part of the series.

Sonar Entertainment, which will produce, inked a first look deal with Clooney and Heslov's Smokehouse Pictures last year.

The Watergate scandal erupted in June 1972 when five men were arrested for breaking into the headquarters of the Democratic National Committee at the Watergate complex in Washington D.C. (TOI)

Hayek joined the ranks of Hollywood women accusing movie producer Weinstein of sexual misconduct and called him "monster" in an op-ed she wrote for the *New York Times*.

"For years, he was my monster," Hayek wrote in the opinion piece in which she included descriptions of sexual harassment, bullying and threats. (IANS)
