Saudi Arabia yesterday ordered the reopening of its border with Qatar to pilgrims.

The Salwa border crossing, also known as Abu Samrah, a key passage for pilgrims on the annual Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca, has been closed since June in a diplomatic crisis that saw Riyadh cut ties with Doha for its support to extremists.

Saudi King Salman authorised "the entry of Qatari pilgrims to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia through Salwa border crossing to perform Hajj, and to allow all Qatari nationals who wish to enter for Hajj without electronic permits", state news agency *SPA* announced.

He also ordered that private jets belonging to Saudi airlines be sent to Doha airport "to bring all Qatari pilgrims at his expense".

The Hajj is to take place this year at the start of September and it is expected to draw around two million Muslims from around the world.

Qatar's foreign minister welcomed the decision. "The government of Qatar welcomes the decision and will respond positively," Foreign Minister Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al-Thani told a press conference in Stockholm.

The decision to reopen the frontier for Qatari pilgrims came shortly after Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman met with Qatari envoy Sheikh Abdullah bin Ali bin Abdullah bin Jassim al-Thani, a member of Qatar's ruling dynasty.

It was the first public high-level encounter between the nations since the crisis erupted.

The Qatari foreign minister, however, said Sheikh Abdullah had acted on a "personal initiative" by meeting the crown prince on Wednesday in the Saudi city of Jeddah and not on behalf of the Doha government.

Saudi Arabia last month said Qatari pilgrims would be allowed to enter the kingdom for Hajj this year but imposed several travel restrictions, including flying in only on airlines approved by Riyadh.

On June 5, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, Bahrain and the United Arab Emirates severed diplomatic and trade ties with Qatar. (*Agencies*)

Slamming the Qatari authorities for politicising Hajj, Bahrain Foreign Affairs Minister, Shaikh Khalid bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, yesterday hailed the "exceptional facilities" provided by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to Qatari pilgrims.

Terming move as a "great historical responsibility", the minister said that the effort is "challenged only by deniers".

On his official *Twitter* page, the Minister reminded the Qatari authorities that such facilities granted by Saudi Arabia to the Qatari pilgrims are "not obtained by any other Islamic country before."

The Minister also condemned Qatari authorities and the media for raising baseless allegation that



Saudi is denying their right to perform Hajj.

"This is a great historical responsibility," the minister said praising the Saudi Royal directives to facilitate the entry and stay of Qatari pilgrims during Hajj.

13 dead as van rams crowd arcelona 'terror attack'

t least 13 people were Akilled yesterday when a driver deliberately slammed a van into crowds on Barcelona's most popular street in what police said was a "terror attack".

The Islamic State group claimed responsibility for the attack which caused panic on the streets of Spain's largest city and drew condemnation from world leaders.

"We can confirm there are

13 dead and more than 50 injured," regional interior minister Joaquim Forn said in a tweet.

Catalan police said they had arrested one suspect, and denied earlier reports that the perpetrator was holed up in a bar near the scene.

The famous Las Ramblas is one of Barcelona's busiest streets, lined with shops and restaurants and normally thronged with tourists and street performers until well

Police said there had been a "huge collision" between a van and pedestrians on the thoroughfare and a police source said officers were seeking a total of two suspects.

Spain's royal family condemned the assault in unusually strong terms, vowing that their country would not be "terrorised" by extremists.

'Bodies on the floor'

Witnesses spoke of a scene of carnage, with bodies strewn along the boulevard as others fleeing for their lives.

"When it happened I ran out and saw the damage," local shop worker Xavi Perez said.

"There were bodies on the floor with people crowding round them. People were crying. There were lots of foreigners."

Witness Aamer Anwar told Britain's Sky News television that he was walking down Las Ramblas, which he described as "jam-packed" with tourists.

"All of a sudden, I just sort of heard a crashing noise and the whole street just started to run, screaming. Í saw a woman right next to me screaming for her kids.

Spain had so far been spared the kind of extremist violence that rocked nearby France,

Belgium and Germany.

But it was hit by what is still Europe's deadliest jihadist attack in March 2004, when bombs exploded on commuter trains in Madrid, killing 191 people in an attack claimed by

Al Qaeda-inspired extremists. Ethan Spibey, a charity

director on holiday in the city, said he and several others had locked themselves in a nearby church after yesterday's van ramming.

"All of a sudden it was real kind of chaos... people just started running screaming," he told Sky. "There was kind of a mini stampede."

Local Tom Gueller, who lives on a road next to Las Ramblas he saw the van speeding along the boulevard.

"It wasn't slowing down at all. It was just going straight through the middle of the crowds in the middle of the Ramblas," he told BBC Radio.

A Greek diplomat in the city said three nationals had been wounded -- a woman and two children -- without providing details.

Yesterday's attack, which followed similar incidents in Britain, Germany and France, drew widespread condemnation. (AFP)

ver 50 employees of a Construction company staged a protest at Andalus Garden yesterday demanding the release of pending salaries.

The agitating workers claimed that about 200 employees working in the company were not paid since November last year.

Jagan, a protesting employee told *DT News* that the company has also falsely informed the ministry that "the dues were cleared" which is not right.

"They have paid a few of the employees," he said adding: "Thirty Bahraini employees were paid but all

of us who are expatriates weren't paid."

"They have lied to the ministry and the public and this has made us even more anxious," he said. "We are struggling everyday financially."

"They have ruined our careers and even our visas are expired now," he said.

According to Jagan, most of them were recruited in 2016 when the company bagged some major contracts.

The company, he claimed, however, "failed to make payment to the suppliers" resulting in the projects getting delayed.

This also resulted in the company getting "fired by the clients," said Jagan.

The employees, however, "continued to work until April," Jagan claimed adding: "Even though we weren't paid since November."

"A total of five months' salaries from December to April are pending now," he

He also alleged that the company is now refusing to communicate with them.

"We are totally in the dark," he said. "We weren't even fired by the company."

"When we call them, they don't answer," he said.

Quran reciting should be on the curriculum: MP

Parliamentarian vesterday Aproposed making Quran reciting compulsory in the school curriculum, saying "the wrong recitation of the Holy Book has become one of the negative phenomena prevalent in our society".

"The current teaching of the Quran does not fulfil the purpose and does not reflect the absolute status of the Holy Ouran in our lives," said MP Jamal Dawood.

His proposal requires teaching the subject to all Muslim students as part of the curriculum followed by the public schools in Bahrain.

The proposal also requires that Muslim students should not be allowed to take part in any other religious classes other than Islamic and in non-Islamic activities such as "preaching, guidance and prayer at all levels of education".

"Private educational institution shall abide by the curricula, books and study hours approved by Education Ministry, Dawood said.

Kingdom, it was revealed yesterday.


"The schools for boys and girls will be environmentfriendly and will be established in conformity



What do I think of 'The Crown'?

It does not matter to 'The Crown' what I think. But I suppose I can still express my thoughts on it.

I am not talking here about Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, 'The Crown' and the powerful head of the now jaded and faded British Empire.

I am talking about the TV series 'The Crown' made on her life.

In July, I had set a one-month goal to complete watching this Netflix TV series, and I am glad I accomplished it.

All the ten episodes - set during 1947-1955, spanning the time of her engagement to Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh, to the time of her differences with her sister Princess Margaret, over her sister's affair with Peter Townsend - are extremely engaging.

The TV series covers the period of British Empire under Prime Ministers Clement Attlee, Winston Churchill (during his second term) and Anthony Eden.

In the background, we see the diplomatic problems related to the independence of India, 'the jewel in the crown' of the British Empire; And also to the times of US President Dwight Eisenhower and Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

We see a few flashbacks. Of her interesting exchanges with her father King George VI, and with her uncle King Edward VIII who abdicated the throne -- to marry the twice divorced Miss Wallis Simpson of USA.

The TV series gives us a peek into what could have transpired, behind closed doors, in palaces and parliament buildings.

It gives us a keyhole view, into The Crown's interactions with her family members and with her Prime Ministers.

It gives us her innocent misdemeanours, as a novice – she was only 25 when she became the Queen - and also her clever manipulations, as she understands her role as the Queen.

It gives us her private struggles and her public triumphs.

Not everyone may agree with Peter Morgan, the writer of the series. Some critics say he was not accurate in the portrayal of the world's most famous royal family.

But "They're still living, and you have to take that stuff really seriously," he said in an interview to 'The Hollywood Reporter' (THR, 14 August 2017); which shows he must have researched a great deal, before surmising some of these scenes.

No wonder this drama is nominated for an Emmy this year. And some are predicting a six season series of 'The Crown'. Claire Foy, as 'The Crown', did not seem like a good

Claire Foy, as "The Crown', did not seem like a good actress at first, but as the series progressed, I began to love her performance. Vennesa Kirby, as Princess Margaret, was beauty and spirit personified.

Initially, I felt Sir Winston Churchill was caricatured a bit. But then, I realized that this was set during his later years, when he was very old, and when he refused to let go of his office.

The locations, of English countryside and palace interiors, are very beautifully shot.

As an Indian, I am angry that India had suffered under 'The Crown' of British imperialism. But Britain's advances in communication and transportation, long before telegraphy, and its administrative effectiveness, across continents, cannot be denied.

I write this piece, sitting in a coffee shop in London, near Buckingham Palace, after a visit to some historic places here. And I must say I am awed at the beauty and the grandeur of this place; a place from where the once famous British Empire was run.

This TV series shows us how 'The Crown' had struggled, how it succeeded at times and failed at times, and how it had affected the politics of far-flung countries across the globe.

But, most importantly, it shows us how 'The Crown' actually affects the person wearing it.

Nile dam to benefit all: says Sudan

Sudan's President Omar al-Bashir said yesterday that the construction of Ethiopia's controversial Grand Renaissance Dam on the Nile River would not impact water supplies to Egypt as feared by

Visiting Ethiopian Prime Minister Hailemariam Desalegn, for his part, said the project was a "win-win" for the peoples of all three countries if it was not politicised.

Construction of the massive dam on the Blue Nile in Ethiopia has poisoned relations between Cairo and Addis Ababa, with Egypt fearing its share of water from the Nile will be hit once the project is completed.

"We are fully committed to ensure that the Egyptian share of the Nile water will not be affected because of the building of the Renaissance Dam," Bashir said at a joint press conference in Khartoum with Desalegn.

Egypt, which is almost totally reliant on the Nile for agriculture and drinking water, says it has "historic rights" to the Nile guaranteed by treaties from 1929 and 1959.

The treaties grant it 87 percent of the river's flow, as well as the power to veto upstream projects, according to Cairo.

The Blue and the White Nile rivers converge in Khartoum and from there run north into Egypt as the Nile.

Desalegn called for the issue of the dam not to be politicised.

"This is more of a technical issue and it is not political," he

said. "If we don't politicise it, then we will reach a conclusion that is a win-win for all our people."

Bashir said Khartoum too had concerns initially about the safety of the dam, which when complete will be the largest in Africa.

"If anything happens to the dam, it will be crisis for Sudan because of the huge amount of water the dam will be storing," said Bashir.

"But Ethiopia has made some changes to the dam's structure, and now we are satisfied."

French firms Artelia and BRL are currently carrying out technical studies on the project.

The dam is designed to feed a hydroelectric project that would produce 6,000 megawatts of power --tantamount to six nuclear-powered plants.

Ethiopia began building the dam in 2012 and initially expected to commission it in 2017. Ethiopian media reports say that only about 60 percent of the construction has so far been completed.

US blacklists Paris, Brussels attacker

The United States yesterday added the suspected iihadist bombmaker said to have supplied the gangs behind the deadly attacks in Paris and Brussels to its terror blacklist.

and Belgian authorities believe a militant known as Ahmad Alkhald provided suicide vests and explosives expertise before the November 13, 2015 attacks on a Paris concert, bars and football crowd that left 130 dead.

He is thought to have fled to Syria, but remained in contact with a gang that later carried out the March 22, 2016 bombings at Brussels airport and a metro station that killed 32 people.

On Thursday, the United States added Alkhald to what is now a 32-strong list of senior figures in the so-called Islamic State group now dubbed "specially designated global terrorists."

"A Syrian national, Alkhald traveled to Europe, where he helped plan the Paris attacks and manufacture the explosive belts used in that plot, which killed and injured hundreds of people, including a number of Smoke rises from a damaged BMW car after a controlled explosion as French police inspect the site after they arrested a suspect on the A16 motorway, near Marquise, northern France, on August 9, 2017, following an attack on servicemen who were hit by a BMW which drove down a quiet street in the upmarket western Paris suburb of Levallois-Perret.

"Following his return to Syria shortly before the attacks in Paris, Alkhald continued to guide ISIS operatives in Europe on making the bombs used in the March 2016 Brussels attacks.

Alkhald's false passport was used in Greece in September 2015, where he is thought to have arrived among refugees fleeing the conflict in Syria, before heading to Belgium.

French authorities say they found traces of his DNA on explosive vests used by Brahim Abdeslam -- who blew himself up in a crowded Paris cafe -- and his brother Salah, who abandoned his un-used.

The US terror designation forbids Americans from conducting business with Alkhald and any assets he is found to possess in areas under US jurisdiction will be seized.

IS-held Raga 'worst place' in Syria: UN

erritory still controlled Territory still controlled by the Islamic State group in Raqa is "the worst place" in Syria, the UN said Thursday, as fresh reports emerged of more civilians killed by US-led coalition air strikes.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said 21 children were among at least 59 civilians killed since Monday in the air strikes aimed at dislodging the jihadists from Raqa.

"The worst place probably today in Syria is the part of Raga that is still held by the so-called Islamic state," the UN's humanitarian pointman for Syria, Jan Egeland, told reporters in Geneva.

The UN estimates there are up to 25,000 civilians trapped inside Raqa, the jihadist group's erstwhile de facto Syrian capital.

"They are encircled by the SDF (Syrian Democratic Forces) fighters and they are used seemingly as human shields by the Islamic state," Egeland added, noting the "constant air raids" by the US-led coalition.

US insists military ready to counter N Korean threats

enior US officials insisted Sthey are ready to respond to any North Korean attack yesterday, after a White House aide dismissed talk of a "military option."

Defense Secretary Jim Mattis and Secretary of State Rex Tillerson are trying to pressure North Korea to halt its nuclear weapons programme and come to the table.

While they stress they want to convince Kim Jong-Un's regime through diplomatic means of the need to disarm, they have not dropped the threat of military action.

But their stance was partly undermined on Wednesday when President Donald Trump's strategy chief, Steve Bannon, told a news magazine: "There's no military solution."

A day later, Mattis and Tillerson faced questions about Bannon's remarks as they appeared with their Japanese counterparts at a State Department press conference.

"I don't want to comment on what Mr Bannon's remarks were in that particular interview," Tillerson said.

"I think we have been quite clear as to what the policy and the posture towards North Korea is," he said. "Our approach has been endorsed by the president."

Tillerson warned again that

North Korea faced a "bleak future" if it does not agree to negotiate disarmament, and Mattis insisted that US regional allies

"In close collaboration with our allies, there are strong military consequences if the DPRK initiates hostilities," the Pentagon chief told reporters.



ndia approved a \$650 million purchase of six attack choppers Thursday from US aviation giant Boeing, officials said, as it boosts its military might amid border tensions with China and Pakistan.

The Defence Acquisition Council (DAC), which approves big-ticket purchases, gave the green light to acquire six additional Apache helicopters after 22 were bought as part of a \$2.5 billion deal in 2015.

Two defence ministry sources told AFP on the condition of anonymity that the deal was approved exclusively for the army, without providing further details including a date for delivery

"DAC approved procurement of

six Apache helicopters along with associated equipment for the army totally about 4,168 crore rupees (\$650 million)," an official told AFP by text message. The initial batch of 22 Apaches -- equipped with Hellfire and Stinger missiles -- replaced the Indian Air Force's ageing fleet.

Soon after the first Apache acquisition, the army put in a separate request for a fleet of at least 39, one of the officials told AFP.

It will be the first time the Indian army has received attack helicopters and it hopes to deploy the craft along India's high-altitude frontiers -- particularly its border in the east with regional rival China.

New Delhi and Beijing are locked in a tense impasse over a strategic Himalayan plateau where hundreds of Indian and Chinese soldiers have been squaring off against each other for more than three months.

India -- the world's largest defence importer -- has been investing tens of billions in updating its Soviet-era military hardware to counter longstanding territorial disputes with its nuclear-armed neighbours.

India has signed several big-ticket defence deals since Prime Minister Narendra Modi stormed to power in 2014.

In April, it signed a military deal with Israel worth nearly \$2 billion which includes an advanced defence system of medium-range surfaceto-air missiles, launchers and communications technology.

Alibaba profit doubles

hinese e-commerce giant Alibaba ✓said yesterday its net profit almost doubled in the latest quarter on the back of solid revenue growth in its core shopping business and in cloud computing.

Alibaba, which has made billionaire founder Jack Ma one of China's richest men and a global e-commerce icon, has seen its New York-listed shares soar 80 percent since last December on perennially robust earnings.

With those shares at all-time highs,



the company's market worth has been fast approaching that of industry leader Amazon.

Alibaba said net income in the quarter which ended June 30 was 14.7 billion yuan (\$2.2 billion), a year-onyear increase of 94 percent.

Alibaba thoroughly dominates e-commerce in China mainly through its Taobao platform, and its continued strong earnings performances have underlined the strength of the sector even as the country's broader economic growth has slowed.



The Riyadh index added 0.7 per cent as all 12 listed banks rose, with Alawwal Bank adding 2.4pc.

A t h e e b Telecommunications climbed 2.5pc to 8.21 riyals in its highest traded volume since June 2016 after it swung to a quarterly net profit of 55.4 million riyals (\$14.8m) from a loss of 58.1m riyals a year ago.

But it closed well off its intra-day high of 8.78 riyals. While some of the profit gain was due to higher revenues, most was due to the sale of communications towers, the company said.

Saudi Steel Pipes gained 1.3pc after one of its units won a 250m riyal contract to manufacture pipes for oil giant Saudi Aramco.

Elsewhere, the Dubai index rose 0.3pc with activity dominated by Union Properties, up 3.7pc, and GFH Financial, up 2.8pc.

Both stocks have been volatile in recent days, GFH because of a big capital increase and Union Properties because it posted a big quarterly loss as it fixed accounting errors; the stock has now regained the level where it was trading before the announcement of the loss.

Abu Dhabi National Energy jumped 3.3pc in heavy trade. The stock soared 24pc this week; last week the company said it swung to a tiny profit

Moody's downgrades rating of ICICI's MTN notes to Ba2

Moody's has downgraded ratings on forex debt of ICICI Bank raised through its Bahrain branch under the medium term notes programme even as it retained the ratings on the bank's foreign currency senior unsecured debt.

"We've downgraded the provisional ratings on the foreign currency senior unsecured MTN programme of ICICI Bank's Bahrain branch to Ba2 from Baa3, because the forex bond ceiling for Bahrain is now at Ba2," Moody's said in a note today. "At the same time, we've retained the Baa3 rating on its foreign currency

senior unsecured debt raised through this branch," Moody's said

The city-headquartered bank declined to comment.

The branch's counterparty

risk assessment has also been downgraded to Ba1(cr)/not prime (cr) from Baa3(cr)/P-3 (cr), as the agency has downgraded the local currency country risk ceiling for Bahrain to Ba1. "The downgrading of the provisional ratings on the foreign currency senior unsecured MTN programme for the bank's Bahrain branch to Ba2 is solely on account of the forex bond ceiling of Bahrain, which was downgraded to Ba2," it said.

Similarly, the downgrading of the branch's CRA to Ba1(cr)/NP(cr) is solely on account of the local currency country risk ceilings of Bahrain, which was downgraded to Ba1. "All other ratings under the MTN programme of the bank remain unchanged," Moody's said, adding the outlook on all ratings is also stable. (*PTI*)







her engagement rom to Prince Charles as a shy teenager to her roles as doting mother, humanitarian and global celebrity, Diana's turbulent life still captivates people around the world.

Young, beautiful and fun, she seemed refreshingly informal when she married the heir to the throne in 1981 at age 20, after what the media and palace officials portrayed as a fairytale romance.

But the acrimonious breakdown of her relationship with Charles, during which every salacious detail was played out in the world's newspapers, would shake the monarchy to the core and drive her to self-harm.

For many people the public image of Diana remains fixed as she was in an extraordinary 1995 interview in which she spoke out about her feelings over her husband's affair with Camilla Parker Bowles, her own infidelity and her history of self-harm.

The way she spilled secrets, stripping the monarchy of its mystique and casting doubt on Charles's ability to be king, drew horror in some parts of the British establishment.

But for many ordinary people, her troubles -- revived

documentaries and interviews -- made her only more popular.

Like Marilyn Monroe, she has frozen in time. She was like a creature locked in a piece of amber. There forever - beautiful, young, vulnerable and damaged," said royal biographer Penny Junor.

13 dates before marriage

Born on July 1, 1961, Diana grew up in an aristocratic family with ties to the monarch -- her father worked for the late king George VI and Queen Elizabeth II.

She grew up with three siblings, in a childhood marred by the bitter break-up of her parents.

She left school at 16 with no qualifications and went to finishing school in Switzerland, before getting a job in a nursery in London.

From the moment she was linked to Charles, however, her life changed.

The prince was under increasing pressure to find a bride, and at the age of 32, he proposed -- perhaps too soon.

Diana said they only met 13 times before their wedding.

She quickly fulfilled her primary duty as princess, with the birth of an heir, William, Harry two years later.

Diana was a hands-on, adoring mother, and also possessed a remarkable empathy that drew people to her. Coupled with a strong sense of style, she rode a wave of popular and media enthusiasm for the monarchy. She used her

position to champion some of the most marginalised groups in society, shaking hands with patients with AIDS and leprosy, who were viewed as pariahs at the time.

But beneath the surface she was in turmoil, plagued by bulimia and wracked by self-doubt made worse by the feeling that her husband did not love her -- and the rest of the royals did not care.

Crossed a line Rumours

that the

marriage was in trouble broke into the open in 1992, after Andrew Morton lifted the lid on Diana's misery with a revelatory book, tactically endorsed by the princess

herself. That year ended with the bombshell announcement that the royal couple would separate.

The scandal only deepened with further recriminations and allegations appearing in the media, before first Charles and then Diana admitted to being unfaithful. In her 1995 interview

with the BBC's Panorama rogramme, Diana gave her version of events, admitting her affair with army officer James

Hewitt, but also criticising the royals and questioning her husband's ability to be king.

This crossed a line. A few weeks later, the queen, who had already publicly expressed her sadness at the situation, wrote to both Charles and Diana urging them to seek a divorce.

On August 28, 1996, the divorce was granted and Diana was stripped of her title of Her Royal Highness. The fairytale was over.

'Queen of people's hearts'

Still a princess, Diana remained in the public eye.

She found new love in Dodi Fayed, the son of millionaire businessman Mohamed Al Fayed, who was also killed with her on August 31, 1997, as their car was chased by paparazzi through the streets of Paris.

The outpouring of public grief was immense.

Millions of flowers were left outside her home at Kensington Palace, and thousands lined the streets of London to pay their last respects at her funeral.

Much of the popular anger over her death was directed at the royal family, fuelled by the queen's initial refusal to return to London to greet the crowds, and there was a surge of republicanism. Two decades

Manila

Police in the Philippine capital shot dead 25 drug suspects in another round of anti-drug raids, authorities said yesterday, as they followed President Rodrigo Duterte's call for dozens of deaths a day.

The killings, carried out in Manila from Wednesday to yesterday morning, came after police shot dead 32 drug suspects in the province neighbouring the capital early in the week in what was billed as a "shock and awe" operation against drug traffickers.

Manila police spokesman Senior Superintendent Erwin Margarejo said the 25 were killed in 18 various operations against drug suspects.

"It is a simultaneous police operation. All the units and stations of MPD (Manila police district) conducted their own operations," Margarejo said.

Duterte on Wednesday praised the killings of the 32 suspects in Bulacan province, describing the operations as "good".

"If we could kill another 32 everyday, then maybe we can reduce what ails this country," Duterte said.

However national police spokesman Senior Superintendent Dionardo Carlos insisted that officers in Bulacan and Manila had killed only in self-defence.

"Can you blame the police now when the initial action is perpetrated by the suspect?" he said.

Duterte easily won last year's presidential election largely on a vow to kill tens of thousands of drug traffickers and addicts, which he said

was necessary to stop the country's slide to narco-state

Police have killed more than 3,500 people in drug raids since Duterte came to office in the middle of last year, according to government data.

More than 2,000 other people have been killed in drug-related crimes and thousands more murdered in unexplained circumstances, according to the police.

He has also repeatedly assured policemen that he will protect them if they are charged for killing drug suspects as part of his campaign.

Rights groups have warned Duterte, who has said he would be "happy to slaughter" three million drug addicts, may be orchestrating a crime against humanity. (AFP)

10-year-old rape victim gives birth to baby girl

New Delhi

A 10-year-old rape victim whose plea for an abortion was rejected by India's Supreme Court has given birth to a baby girl, a doctor said yesterday.

The girl, who cannot be named for legal reasons, was raped several times allegedly by an uncle who has since been arrested.

Last month her parents asked the country's top court to allow her to have a lateterm abortion but the request was turned down.

Indian law does not allow medical terminations after 20 weeks unless there is a threat to either the life of the mother or her child.

"She gave birth through C-section today (Thursday). Both the girl and her baby are doing fine," doctor Dasari Harish said by phone from the northern Indian city of Chandigarh.

Ancient species of giant sloth discovered in Mexico

xican scientists said Wednesday they have discovered the fossilized remains of a previously unknown species of giant sloth that lived 10,000 years ago and died at the bottom of a sinkhole.

Pleistocene-era The remains were found in 2010, but were so deep inside the water-filled sinkhole that researchers were only gradually able to piece together what they were, the National Institute of Anthropology and History (INAH) said in announcing the find.

Scientists have so far hauled up the skull, jawbone, and a mixed bag of vertebrae, ribs claws and other bones. but the rest of the skeleton remains some 50 meters (165 feet) under water, the INAH

Researchers are planning to bring up the rest by next year to continue studying the find -- including to estimate how big the animal was.

"They'll be putting the pieces together like a puzzle," INAH spokesman Arturo Mendez said.


The skeleton is nearly complete, leading scientists to believe the sloth "fell into the sinkhole when it was dry or had only a little water at the bottom," the researchers

Malala wins place at Oxford

Nobel peace laureate Malala Yousafzai, who was shot by the Taliban for advocating education for girls in her native Pakistan, announced yesterday she has won a place to study at Oxford University.

"So excited to go to Oxford!!" the 20-year-old posted on Twitter, along with a picture of the message she received confirming her acceptance on the philosophy, politics and economics (PPE) course.

The announcement came on the day that students across Britain received the



results of their A-levels, exams taken at the end of secondary school.

Yousafzai did not reveal her results, but said: "Well done to all A-level students -- the hardest year. Best wishes for life ahead!"

She was just 15 years old when she was shot in the head by a Taliban gunman in October 2012 as she travelled by bus home from an exam to her village in the Swat valley.

She was flown to the central English city of Birmingham for treatment, and has lived there with her family ever since, continuing her education and activism.

Yousafzai was granted the Nobel Peace prize aged 17 in 2014 along with India's Kailash Satyarthi for their championing of children's rights.

Infamous Australian IS fighter 'likely' dead: minister

anberra said yesterday ∠there was a "high probability" a notorious Islamic State fighter from Australia and two of his children had been killed in a US airstrike in Syria.

Reports said Khaled Sharrouf and his sons Abdullah, 12, and Zarqawi, 11, were killed last Friday while driving near the IS bastion of Raqa.

Sharrouf sparked international revulsion in 2014 when he posted pictures on social media of Abdullah holding the rotting severed head of a soldier.

The father of five had used his other children in propaganda videos, including one that surfaced this year in which he grilled his youngest son about killing non-Muslims as the six-year-old handled guns and knives.

"Nobody will mourn his passing... I can assure you of that," Australia's Immigration Minister Peter Dutton told Channel Nine.

The Australian newspaper and the Australian Broadcasting Corporation, both citing unnamed government sources, reported the death of Sharrouf and his

Mass burials for 160 Sierra Leone victims

Freetown

Sierra Leone prepared for the burials of 160 victims of devastating floods yesterday, as fears grew of more mudslides and accusations of government "inaction" over deforestation and poor urban planning mounted.

After it emerged that at least 105 of the dead were children, citizens and experts alike questioned why the government of President Ernest Bai Koroma had not done more to tackle illegal construction in the overcrowded capital of Freetown.

A Red Cross official said

meanwhile that smaller mudslides had occurred since Monday in eastern Freetown and in Sierra Leone's second city of Bo, with the rainy season far from over.

"There is a fear that more trouble is imminent," in Freetown, a coastal city of around one million people, said Adbul Nasir of the International Red Cross.

Adding to the danger, the Office of National Security, which is coordinating the government's response, was informed that a mountain which partially collapsed on Monday had cracked at another point.

Although the death toll is officially 300, rescue workers privately agree the toll is far higher, and one said that in line with an unofficial morgue toll, 400 graves had been dug for the victims, who will be buried over a two-day period.

The UN has said 4,000 people are affected by the mudslides and flooding.

With the aim of clearing the overflowing central morgue, the first burials were due to begin at 1500 GMT in Waterloo, a nearby town where victims of the Ebola crisis were also laid to rest.(AFP)



Secrets of the deep: Senegal s slave shipwreck detective



Dakar

Staring out to sea on a flawlessly sunny day, underwater archaeologist Ibrahima Thiaw visualises three shipwrecks once packed with slaves that now lie somewhere beneath Senegal's Atlantic waves.

He wants more than anything to find them.

Thiaw has spent years scouring the seabed off the island of Goree, once a west African slaving post, never losing hope of locating the elusive vessels with a small group of graduate students from Dakar's Cheikh Anta Diop University.

Goree was the largest slave-trading centre on the African coast between the 15th and 19th century, according to the UN's cultural agency UNESCO, and Thiaw believes his mission has a moral purpose: to heal the open wounds that slavery has left on the continent.

"This is not just for the fun of research or scholarship. It touches us and our humanity and I think that slavery in its afterlife still has huge scars on our modern society," he said, pulling on a wetsuit and rubber boots for the day's first dive.

Thiaw believes his native Senegal, with its own long and violent history of trade in human flesh, could tell the world more about how modern capitalism was founded on violence inflicted on African bodies.

"The Atlantic slave trade was the foundation of our modernity, so this is a history for all mankind," he added, referring to the so-called "Triangular Trade" of human labour for consumer goods between Africa, the Americas and Europe.

After making final checks on the magnetometer that will run up and down a painstakingly designated strip of seabed for traces of wreckage, Thiaw disappears under the surface of the dark green waves.

1,000 slave shipwrecks

African nations affected by the slave trade have never fully come to terms with it, Thiaw believes, and even today in countries like Senegal, a caste of people still refer to themselves as slaves.

The horrors of the so-called Middle Passage, or journey across the Atlantic, not only industrialised the trade of people but ripped entire societies from their roots.

"The umbilical cord between Africa and its diaspora was broken and in the ocean (slaves) were being seasoned to be other people, to adapt to other conditions," he notes.

Thiaw, who originates from a rural area of Senegal but went on to study in the United States, had become known for his research into slaves' living conditions on Goree island when he was approached three years ago by the US National Park Service and National Museum of African American History and Culture to find a west African base for their "Slave Wrecks" project.

They offered dive training, equipment and expertise and had already helped establish similar dive sites in Mozambique and South Africa, with one historic success.

Artifacts, including shackles and ballasts from the Sao Jose Paquete de Africa, a Portuguese slave vessel that sank in 1794 with more than 200 slaves on board, were dredged up off the coast of Cape Town in 2015.

Around 1,000 slave shipwrecks are believed to dot the seabed between Africa and the Americas, according

to "Slave Wrecks" researchers, but few have been found.

Today's dive, like dozens before it, was unsuccessful.

Precious clues

"We found a modern shipwreck, a big one," the powerfully built Thiaw said, seawater running down his face, but "it's not really what we are looking for."

The trio of wrecks Thiaw seeks -- the Nanette, the Bonne Amitie and the Racehorse -- all disappeared off Goree in the 18th century, taking with them crucial evidence of how enslaved Africans were carried across the harrowing Middle Passage.

The key is building a team of Senegalese archaeological divers who will dedicate themselves to the task, as some of his students graduate and move on.

The overwhelming majority of slave ships were repurposed and simply rotted away after abolition, meaning the slave shipwrecks preserved by the sea will provide precious clues.

'Silence' around slavery

Thiaw complains that there is a lack of interest within Senegal for his work, especially at the institutional level where, he said, there was "very little funding for research".

"I think in Senegal there's a lot of silence surrounding the issue but I think the time is ripe that we start to teach our students and our children how to respect people of different or lower status, slave caste," he said.

Discrimination remains a problem in the country, with some people still referred to as slaves using the word "jaam" in the country's majority Wolof language.

"There are still people, who are still known to be slaves," he said. "Some of them would even tell you proudly: 'yes, I am a slave'."

Thiaw wants his nation to unflinchingly analyse "the most painful aspects of our history and the contradiction of our history", especially the lingering elements of a class system that designated some Senegalese as worthy only of serving others.

Senegal's past lies somewhere on the seabed between Dakar and Goree, but perhaps also its future.

"We know they are there," Thiaw said. (AFP)

Halep advances to quarters

Second-ranked Simona Halep charged closer to taking the world number one ranking yesterday, beating Latvian 15th seed Anastasija Sevastova 6-4, 6-3 to reach the WTA and ATP Cincinnati Masters quarter-finals.

Romania's Halep, a French Open runner-up for the second time in June, can overtake top-ranked Czech defending champion Karolina Pliskova by winning the title in the final major tuneup for the US Open.

"To be number one in the world I think is a big thing," Halep said this week. "If I deserve the place, for sure I will win it."

Pliskova, who faces Italian qualifier Camila Giorgi in a later third-round match, must also fight off Ukraine's Elina

Svitolina, who won her fifth WTA title of the year last week in Toronto to reach a careerhigh fourth in the rankings. Svitolina faces Germany's Julia Goerges later.

"Of course to be number one is a goal of mine," Svitolina "The important thing is to play well at the big tournaments. Then the ranking will be there."

Spaniard Rafael Nadal, the 15-time Grand Slam champion assured of returning to world number one next week, faces countryman Albert Ramos-Vinolas in a night match. Nadal could meet Australian Nick Kyrgios in Friday's quarter-finals.

Nadal was assured advancing past injured Andy Murray for the top spot when Roger Federer withdrew from Cincinnati on Monday with a back injury.

After an early exchange of breaks, Halep double faulted to surrender another and give Sevastova a 3-2 edge.

She then had a visit from her Australian coach, Darren Cahill, who encouraged more backhands but closed with, "This is on you. Turn this around."

Halep did, breaking to 4-4 and again to claim the set when the Latvian swatted a backhand beyond the baseline.

Sevastova squandered two break points in the first game of the second set and netted a backhand to give Halep a 2-0 edge, but broke back in the fifth game. Halep responded with a drop volley winner to break the Latvian at love for a 4-2 lead. (AFP)

oe Root led from the front with a century as England took charge against the West Indies on the opening day of the inaugural day/night Test on English soil at Edgbaston vesterday.

England were 215 for two at tea with Root, who won the toss, unbeaten on 103.

Former captain Alastair Cook was closing in on a century of his own at

The skippers past and present had added an unbroken 176 for the third wicket.

They had joined forces with England faltering at 39 for two after Test debutant Mark Stoneman and Tom Westley were both dismissed

But from then on the West Indies found life tough against two proven world-class batsmen.

Root's fifty was his 11th in successive Tests -- a new England record and just one shy of South Africa star AB de Villiers's all-time leading mark of 12.

But while his conversion rate of fifties into hundreds has sometimes been a source of frustration to Root, this time the Yorkshireman went on to score his 13th century in 58 career

The fifth day/night Test worldwide saw Root win the toss under blue skies and on a good pitch.

He decided to bat first, for all the concerns about facing the pink ball and the difficulties of batting in twilight later on.

Left-hander Stoneman's first two scoring shots in Test cricket were both fours.

The 30-year-old eased Kemar Roach through the covers before clipping him off his pads.

It was an encouraging start by the Surrey batsman -- Cook's 12th England opening partner since Andrew Strauss retired five years ago.

But that was as good as it got for Stoneman, brought in after England dropped Keaton Jennings following a run of low scores during the preceding 3-1 home Test series victory against South Africa.

Roach produced a superbly sharp delivery that pitched on middle stump and clipped the top of off to clean bowl Stoneman and leave England 14

Westley, still to cement his place at number three, was then lbw on review after missing a drive off first-change Miguel Cummins, with replays showing the ball would have smashed into the middle and leg stumps.

But Cook, who had a lucky break when he edged West Indies captain Jason Holder through a gap in the slips, and Root repaired the damage with a succession of boundaries.

Just before the lunch interval left-hander Cook, England's all-time leading Test run-scorer, completed 74-ball fifty including 10 fours. (AFP)

Real rout Barca

Real Madrid shrugged off the absence of the suspended Cristiano Ronaldo to cruise past rivals Barcelona 2-0 in the second leg of the Spanish Super Cup to cap a 5-1 aggregate win.

Ronaldo was slapped with a five-game ban for pushing the referee after he was sent-off in the first leg, but his replacement Marco Asensio enhanced his reputation as one of world football's rising stars as he smashed Madrid into the lead after just four minutes.

Karim Benzema then deservedly doubled Real's lead before half-time.

Barca responded with a more spirited second-half showing and were unfortunate not to at least pull a goal back as Lionel Messi and Luis Suarez hit the woodwork.

Victory continues Madrid's run of success under Zinedine Zidane with the European champions now having lifted seven trophies in the 20 months since the Frenchman took charge. Zidane even had the luxury of leaving first team regulars Gareth Bale, Isco and Casemiro on the bench as Real's strength in depth was demonstrated in a dominant first 45 minutes.

Asensio had already shown the threat he poses with a dangerous run and cross that saw Luka Modric's goalbound effort blocked by Samuel Umtiti before he found the net himself. Just as in the first leg, the 21-yearold sent an unstoppable left-footed shot past Marc-Andre ter Stegen into the top corner from outside the box.

Worst possible start

Barcelona boss Ernesto Valverde has suffered the worst possible start to his reign with backto-back defeats against the Catalans fiercest rivals and the visitors only briefly threatened to mount a comeback after conceding. Suarez volleyed over before Keylor Navas rushed from his goal to block from Messi.

However, shorn of Neymar after his world record breaking transfer to Paris Saint-Germain and injured captain Iniesta, Barca's star front two lacked the service needed to make a meaningful impact. Indeed, the scoreline could have been a lot more embarrassing for Barca. (AFP)
