Hezbollah spreading Chaos: FM

Hezbollah is conspiring with the leaders of Lebanon and Qatar to spread chaos in the region, Foreign Affairs Minister Khalid bin Ahmed Al Khalifa stated yesterday. The minister's comments came as first response to recent statements made by his Qatari counterpart Shaikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani, who said that "what happened to Qatar is now happening in Lebanon".

The Qatari minister accused Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, the UAE and Egypt, of initiating "attempts to bully smaller countries in the region and forcing them to surrender".

Shaikh Khalid tweeted yesterday responding to Al Thani's statements, saying, "What happened with Qatar



is happening with Iran. Yes, what he said is true. Hezbollah is freely roaming in both countries and allying with their leaderships and conspiring to overthrow states and spread chaos."


Shaikh Khalid's comments came in reference to the biggest Iranian allies in region, the Qatari government and Hezbollah terrorist militias, and their destructive policies in the


The minister also commented on allegations made by some Lebanese officials, accusing several countries, including Saudi Arabia, of meddling in their domestic affairs.

UN climate negotiations not derailed after US pullout

Bonn (Germany)

Negotiations to bolster the climate-saving Paris Agreement, crafted over two decades, closed in Bonn yesterday, deflated but not derailed by Donald Trump's rejection of the treaty and defence of fossil fuels.

The US President's decision to yank the United States from the hard-fought global pact cast a long shadow over the talks, which ran deep into overtime. Negotiations were marked by revived divisions between developing countries and rich ones.

With a wary eye on America, which sent negotiators to a forum it intends to quit, envoys from nearly 200 countries got on with the business of designing a "rule book" for enacting the agreement, which enters into full force in three years' time.

"The Trump administration failed to stop the global climate talks from moving forward," said Greenpeace observer Jens Mattias Clausen.

Closing two weeks of talks, negotiators agreed in the early hours of Saturday to hold a stocktake in 2018 of national efforts to cut fossil fuel emissions. The Paris treaty calls for limiting average global warming to "well under" two degrees Celsius (3.6 degrees Fahrenheit) compared to preindustrial levels, or 1.5 C if possible. Anything over 2 degree C, experts say, dooms the world to calamitous climate change, with more extreme superstorms, droughts, floods, and land-gobbling sea level

A report this week warned that emissions of carbon dioxide, the main planetwarming gas, were set to rise by



two percent in 2017 after three years of hardly any growth.

"Starting now, emissions need to decrease to zero over the next 40 years to prevent us breaching the 1.5 C threshold," Piers Forster, a professor of climate change at the University of Leeds, said.

Nations have submitted voluntary emissions-cutting commitments under the Paris pact championed by Trump's predecessor Barack Obama.But scientists say current pledges place the world on course for warming of 3 degree C or more, and counsel an urgent upgrade of the global commitment to phasing out greenhouse gases produced by burning coal, oil and natural gas.

Islands in peril

"While the Paris Agreement represents a remarkable diplomatic achievement, it will be judged by history as little more than words on paper if the world fails to take the level of action needed to prevent the loss of entire island nations," Maldives environment minister Thoriq Ibrahim told delegates Friday.

The stocktake agreed Saturday must quantify the shortfall to determine what more needs to be done.

In Bonn, negotiators also worked on a nuts-and-bolts

rulebook, to be finalised at the next UN climate conference in Katowice, Poland in December 2018, for putting the Paris Agreement into action.

Some progress was made, but observers and delegates complained that things were moving too slowly.

Many lamented the void in "political leadership" left by the departure of Obama, and by German Chancellor Angela Merkel's failure to set a timetable for phasing out coal-fired power plants, which produce 40 percent of Germany's electricity.

The talks saw rich and poor nations butt heads on several issues -- mainly money. Developing countries demand detailed progress reports on rich nations' promise to boost climate finance to \$100 billion (85 billion euros) per year by 2020.-AFP



Xi offers support for Saudi Arabia

china has offered support for Saudi Arabia's efforts to safeguard national sovereignty and achieve greater development.

Speaking by telephone, President Xi Jinping told Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques Saudi Arabia's King Salman bin Abdulaziz that China's determination to deepen strategic cooperation with Saudi Arabia will not waver, no matter how the international and regional situation changes, China's Foreign Ministry said late on Thursday.

The offer comes ßat a time of regional tensions between Saudi Arabia, Iran, Lebanon and Yemen.

China has traditionally played little role in Middle East conflicts or diplomacy, despite its reliance on the region for oil. But it has been trying to raise its profile, with Salman visiting China in March.



"China supports Saudi Arabia's efforts to safeguard national sovereignty and realise greater development," the ministry cited Xi as saying, without elaborating.




The statement made no specific mention of issues like the resignation as Lebanon Prime Minister Saad al-Hariri while in Saudi Arabia, criticism against Iran and its Lebanese ally Hezbollah.

Saudi-led forces, which back the government in Yemen, have also been fighting against the Iran-allied Houthi militias for more than two-years.

China has had to tread a fine line between Riyadh and Tehran as Beijing has close ties with Iran as well.

The authorities have initiated a clampdown on $illegal \, vendors \, and \, bootleggers \,$ in the Southern Governorate. Some people have been arrested for possessing and selling alcohol in the district, Southern Governorate Police Directorate said.

According to Southern Governorate Police Director General Colonel Mubarak Al Merri, the arrests were in Ras Zowayed near the industrial area in Askar on the southeastern coasts of the island. The wares of some vendors have also been seized, police said.

"The police removed equipment used by street vendors and arrested violators to the residency rules and regulations. Legal steps are being taken to refer the case to the Public Prosecutor," Col. Al Merri added.

The move came after a simultaneous crackdown initiated by Southern Area Municipality against illegal street vendors.

The campaign targeted more than 180 illegal selling points in Ras Zowayed, in a drive described by the municipality as "the biggest campaign against illegal street

The municipality said in a press statement that the campaign was conducted in coordination with Interior Ministry, Labour Market Regulatory Authority and other concerned authorities.

"The campaign targeted the illegal market organised every Friday. Expired and illegal products are usually sold in this market on a weekly basis. This is one of the biggest campaigns this year and we targeted an area of one square kilometre. The suspects were monitored for a week and their violations were documented in coordination with security authorities," Supervision and Monitoring Department Head Mariam Al Siddiqi said, reiterating the municipality's keenness on eradicating such violations and "unhealthy

Ministry to tender Busaiteen coast revamp project soon

The Ministry of Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning has finalised the procedures for tendering the Busaiteen Coast Revamp Project.

In a statement, Minister of Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning, Essam bin Abdulla Khalaf said that based on the directives His Royal Highness Prime Minister Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa, the ministry has coordinated with the Muharraq Municipal Council to revamp a number of coasts and sea fronts, including the Busaiteen Coast and Halat Bu Maher Revamp projects, within the sea fronts development projects in the Muharraq Governorate.

The minister asserted that designs and administrative procedures completed, and the Busaiteen Revamp Project will be put out to tender next week, noting that that the two-kilometre coast, covering more than 45,000 sqaure metres, will be among the most important sea fronts in the governorate.

Regarding the Halat Bu Maher Corniche Revamp Project, the minister said that the Ministry will present the

local Municipal Council with the designs of the project before carrying on the necessary procedures, adding that the Works Ministry has coordinated with all the competent authorities to prepare the project ahead of its revamp. Khalaf asserted that the Capital Trustees' Board and municipal councils are partners to the Ministry in the decisionmaking process.

Besides, it is alarming to note that less than 1% of GDP is allocated to research and development in most developing

Hariri promises to return for Independence Day



T ebanese Prime Minister Saad Hariri arrived in France yesterday from Saudi Arabia, where his shock resignation announcement two weeks ago sparked accusations that he was being held there against his will.

Hariri is in Paris at the invitation of France's President Emmanuel Macron, who is attempting to help broker a solution to a political crisis that has raised fears over Lebanon's fragile democracy.

Aoun said he had spoken by telephone to Hariri, who said he would be back in Lebanon Independence Day celebrations on Wednesday.

Macron greeted Hariri warmly as he arrived for talks at the Elysee Palace hours after flying in from Riyadh with his wife.

Their eldest son Houssam joined the couple for lunch with Macron at the palace.

But the Hariris arrived in Paris without their younger children – Loulwa and Abdelaziz, born in 2001

and 2005 - who are staying in Riyadh "for their school exams", a source close to the premier said.

"Hariri does not want to mix his children up in this affair," the source said.

Hariri, who along with Saudi officials has repeatedly denied that he was being held under de facto house arrest in Riyadh, hammered home the message just before his departure.

"To say that I am held up in Saudi Arabia and not allowed

he said in a Twitter post.

A source close to Hariri said the premier had held an "excellent, fruitful and constructive" meeting with the powerful Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman before he left.

Hariri, a dual Saudi citizen who has previously enjoyed Riyadh's backing, announced his resignation on November 4.

He said he feared for his life, accusing Iran and its powerful Lebanese ally Hezbollah of destabilising his country.

Lebanese President Michel to leave the country is a lie," Police to resume war on drugs if problem worsens, says Duterte

Manila

Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte said on Saturday that the police would reassume their lead role in implementing his war on drugs if the narcotics problem worsens and that nobody could stop his campaign, not even U.S. President Donald Trump.

The firebrand leader ordered the Philippine National Police (PNP) to withdraw from the campaign a few weeks ago amid unprecedented scrutiny of police conduct in the campaign, which has killed thousands of suspected drug users and peddlers.

"If human rights (advocates)

are thinking that Trump or whoever the human rights (advocates believe) can stop me, I'm sorry," Duterte said in a speech at a business event in his hometown Davao City.

"The drug problem, if it becomes worse again, the police has to enter the picture. I want it eradicated if possible,"

The Philippines has drawn international criticism for the killing of 3,900 people in police anti-drugs operations over the past 15 months, but the police deny allegations by human rights advocates that many of the killings were executions. (Reuters)



Party set to sack Mugabe, as Zimbabweans march on residence

'imbabwe's ruling ZANU-PF party will meet on Sunday to dismiss President Robert Mugabe and reinstate the vicepresident he dismissed, Emmerson Mnangagwa, two party sources told *Reuters* on Saturday.

The sources said a party central committee meeting scheduled for 10:30 am (3.30 am ET) would also dismiss 93-year-old Mugabe's preferred successor, his wife Grace, from her role as head of the ZANU-PF Women's League.

Mugabe's 37-year rule has been effectively at an end since the army seized control on Wednesday, confining him to his residence, saying it wanted to target the "criminals" around

Shortly after the sources revealed the meeting, a motorcade left Mugabe's official residence in the capital Harare to boos and jeers from onlookers, although a security said Mugabe

Hundreds of thousands of people had flooded the streets of Harare singing, dancing and hugging soldiers in an outpouring of elation at Mugabe's demise, while others marched towards

In scenes reminiscent of the downfall of Romanian dictator Nicolae Ceausescu in 1989, men, women and children ran alongside the armoured cars and the troops who stepped in this week to oust the only ruler Zimbabwe has known since independence in 1980.

Under house arrest in his lavish 'Blue Roof' compound, he has watched support from his ZANU-PF party, security services and people evaporate in less than three days.

Mugabe's nephew, Patrick Zhuwao, told Reuters the elderly leader and his wife were "ready to die for what is correct" rather than step down in order to legitimize what he described

Speaking from a secret location in South Africa, Zhuwao said Mugabe had hardly slept since the military took over but his health was otherwise "good".

On Harare's streets, Zimbabweans spoke of a second liberation for the former British colony, alongside their dreams of political and economic change after two decades of deepening repression and hardship.

These are tears of joy," said Frank Mutsindikwa, 34, holding aloft the Zimbabwean flag. "I've been waiting all my life for this day. Free at last. We are free at last."

Mugabe's downfall is likely to send shockwaves across Africa, where a number of entrenched strongmen, from Uganda's Yoweri Museveni to Democratic Republic of Congo's Joseph Kabila, are facing mounting pressure to step aside.

The secretary-general of Zimbabwe's War Veterans Association, Victor Matemadanda, called on those at an anti-Mugabe rally to march on Mugabe's residence, and live television footage showed hundreds of protesters marching in that direction.

"Let us now go and deliver the message that grandfather Mugabe and his typist-cum-wife should go home," Matemadanda told the crowd in the Harare township of Highfield. (Reuters)

The Empower Me system is a digital coach that runs on smartglasses, to empower children and adults with autism to teach themselves social and cognitive skills.

Aiding emotional understanding

Autism spectrum disorder is characterised by impaired social interaction, communication and sensory sensitivities. The system features a suite of apps. One such app, Emotion Charades, teaches the user to identify emotions, and understand them.

How it works

Users look through the private screen on their smartglasses and see emojis on either side of their partner's face. They select which one they think matches the facial expression with a spoken command or a subtle head tilt. A software detects emotions and voice commands using Artificial Intelligence (AI), and the head tilt via accelerometer data.



Besides aiding emotional understanding, Empower Me also features apps designed to target attention to social cues, including the ability to focus on face and eye regions when it is desirable to do so.



A rare India ink drawing of young reporter Tintin and his faithful dog Snowy has been sold for almost \$500,000



he Central Bank of Bahrain (CBB) has issued directives related to Bahrain Domiciled Real Estate Investment Trusts (B-REITs), as part of its commitment to further enhance the REITS framework in the Kingdom of Bahrain under Volume 7 of CBB Rulebook that governs the rules and regulations of Collective Investment Undertakings (CIUs).

In a nutshell, REITs are CIUs that acquire and operate income generating local and foreign real estate properties, either directly or indirectly and hence, allowing all types of investors to obtain exposure to the real estate market in the Kingdom.

The new CBB directives

encompass retail investors as part of the target investors who are allowed to invest in Bahrain Domiciled REITs.

Such removal of the previous restriction on the type of investors in REITs, will allow all types of investors including high net worth, institutional and retail investors to benefit from the attractive characteristics of REITs, such as higher liquidity for listed REITs, regular distribution of cash dividends and high transparency.

Moreover, since REITs are tradable instruments, such changes to the directives will also make it more feasible and practicable to list B-REITs on the Bahrain Bourse and other licensed exchanges.

Abdul Rahman Al Baker said, "Overall, REITs have become an important addition to the real estate investment landscape in the last few years for both retail investors and large institutional the investors; reflecting the increased growth, maturity, transparency and sophistication of the local, regional and global real estate markets"

The details of the new directives are now available at the CBB website under CBB Volume 7 Rulebook that governs the rules and regulations of Collective Investment Undertakings

Germany bans sales of children's smartwatches

ermany's telecoms Gregulator has banned the sale of "smart watches" that can be used by parents to check on their children, saying the devices violated Germany's strict surveillance

The Federal Network Agency said it had already taken action against several firms that sell the watches online but did not name them.

It urged parents to destroy the watches, which are widely available on the German market and target children between the ages of 5 to 12.

'Via an app, parents can use such watches to secretly listen to a child's environment. They are to be seen as a prohibited transmitter," Jochen Homann, president of the agency, said in a statement. "Our investigation has also shown that parents have used the watches to listen to teachers in the classroom."

The decision follows the agency's decision in February to ban distribution of a talking doll, saying its software could be hacked to reveal personal data.

The agency's actions reflect growing concerns about the security and privacy risks associated with the exploding number of smart gadgets.

Surveillance is a particularly sensitive issue in Germany where East Germany's Stasi secret police and the Nazi era Gestapo kept a close watch on the population.

The agency said the

watches in question include a sim card and offer a limited telephone function which can be controlled via an app, similar to baby monitoring devices.

By programming the watches to call a telephone number, they can be used to secretly listen to conversations, an act that is prohibited under German law, the agency said.

It urged schools to be vigilant about the use of such smart watches. (Reuters)

Traditional friendship between China and North Korea represents "valuable wealth" for their people, China said after its special envoy met a highranking North Korean official, but there was no mention of the crisis over North Korea's weapons.

Song Tao, who heads the ruling Chinese Communist Party's international department, is visiting Pyongyang to discuss the outcome of the recently concluded Communist Party Congress in China, at which President Xi Jinping

cemented his power.

In a brief statement dated Friday but reported by Chinese media on Saturday, the international department said Song, who is there representing Xi, reported to North Korean official Choe Ryong Hae the outcome of the congress.

Song and Choe also talked about relations between their parties and countries, the department said.

They said that the traditional friendship between China and North Korea was founded and cultivated by both countries former old leaders, and is

valuable wealth for the two peoples," it said.

"Both sides must work hard together to promote the further development of relations between the two parties and two countries to benefit their two peoples."

The department made no mention of North Korea's nuclear or missile programs, which are strongly opposed by China.

The North's official KCNA news agency said Song informed Choe about China's 19th National Congress "in detail", and stressed China's stance to steadily develop the traditionally friendly

relations between the two parties and countries.

Song arrived on Friday but it is not clear how long he will be in North Korea.

China has repeatedly pushed for a diplomatic solution to the crisis over North Korea's development of nuclear weapons and missiles to carry them, but in recent months it has had only limited high-level exchanges with North Korea.

The last time China's special envoy for North Korea visited the country was in February last year. (Reuters)

Robots to take over 6,000 jobs by 2021: Nordic bank

Oslo

The Nordic banking giant Nordea has announced it would shed 6,000 jobs during the next four years. One of its reasons is replacement of human positions with "robots".

Nordea has around 32,000 employees. CEO Casper von Koskull explaining the layoff in a statement said "need to cut costs" and "improvement in efficiency" were key factors, *Xinhua* reported.

The layoffs include 2,000 outsourced consultants. How the sackings would be distributed in the Nordic area was not specified.

Nordea said it was introducing "robots" that respond to customer questions online.

One such robot in Norway has already begun working in September and has already

responded to 10,000 questions previously handled by staffers.

In Finland, robot service begins in December. Von Koskull said "artificial intelligence" will improve customer experience. Some jobs described as "routine" will be transferred to Poland. Salary levels in Finland and the other Nordics are higher than in Poland.

The news came two days after Nordea announced it

had begun cooperation with Apple-pay, now available in the Nordic area.

Analysts have pointed out that after a couple of years Apple and comparable companies could be severe competitors to traditional

After a change of legislation next year, banks in Finland must allow access to a customer's account to outside services, if the customer permits.

The media here noted that Nordea's announcement brought recollections of the 1990s. During that decade the number of jobs in banking in Finland reduced from 55,000 to 25,000 employees.

The Nordea employee union received the news "with dismay as the bank is very profitable now". (IANS)







President Donald Trump has dramatically reversed his decision to repeal the elephant trophy ban after a public outcry.

He tweeted late Friday that he will uphold a ban on importing trophies of elephants hunted and killed in Zimbabwe, pending further review.

The move went against his own administration's decision from Thursday, which sparked a huge public backlash.

'Put big game trophy decision on hold until such time as I review all conservation facts. Under study for years. Will update soon with Secretary Zinke. Thank you!' Trump tweeted.

Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke said the pair came to the decision after they 'talked and both believe that conservation and healthy herds are critical.'

Just hours before, Trump's spokeswoman Sarah Sanders

had defended the US Fish and Wildlife Service's move to end the 2014 ban initiated under Trump's predecessor Barack Obama.

The service said Thursday that it would begin issuing permits to import 'sporthunted trophies from elephants hunted Zimbabwe' between January

21, 2016 and December 31,

Zambia would also have been covered under the revised rule.

The move was met with a barrage of criticism from animal rights groups and activists.

It also came on the same day that the US State Department presented to Congress its first annual report on wildlife trafficking which, it said, 'remains a serious transnational crime.'

French screen legend and animal rights activist Brigitte Bardot added her voice to the growing chorus of criticism, slamming Trump as 'unfit for office' after his administration's 'shameful

'No despot in the world can take responsibility for killing off an age-old species that is part of the world heritage of humanity,' Bardot said in a letter to Trump, released through Fondation Brigitte Bardot. (Daily Mail)

Surgeon claims human head transplant a success

n a bizarre 18-hour operation, a team lead by Dr Xiaoping Ren of Harbin Medical University in China allegedly carried out what is being termed as the world's first human head transplant on a corpse, reported The Telegraph.

As per the report, through the operation, the team was able to successfully connect the spine, nerves and blood vessels of two people.

Only last year, Dr Ren had successfully grafted a head onto a monkey's body, the report said.

An Italian professor

at the Turin Advanced Neuromodulation Group, who has been working with the team behind the head transplant, told The Telegraph that they would eventually perform the operation on a living human paralysed from neck down. În a statement, professor Sergio Canavero claimed that the electrical stimulation of the nerves highlighted that the operation on the corpse had been successful.

Canavero also said that the details of the surgery are likely to be released in a few days by a surgical journal. (The Indian Express)

Coffee drinkers in London fuelling green bus initiative



London red buses London

ondon's caffeine habit Lould soon provide an eco-friendly energy kick to its buses, including its iconic red double decker.

Some 6,000 litres of oil extracted from ground coffee waste will be added to fuel tanks of the city's transport authority on Monday enough to power a bus for a year.

Behind the stunt is British start-up Bio-bean, which has been developing fuel from coffee waste grounds for four years, with financial and technical help from energy giant Royal Dutch Shell.

Londoners consume an average of 2.3 cups of coffee a day, contributing to 200,000 tonnes of mineral-rich coffee waste over the course of a year, according to data cited by Bio-bean.

"Instead of sending a tonne of waste coffee grounds to landfill ... we collect it, recycle it and turn it into a renewable. fuel which is then used to replace further conventional fuels," Bio-bean founder Arthur Kay said at a recent presentation. (AFP)

India's Manushi Chillar wins Miss World crown

India's Manushi Chillar yesterday won the coveted Miss World 2017 title at a glittering event, ending 16 years of drought for India at the international pageant.

Priyanka Chopra was the last winner from India in 2000.

Chillar, 21, looked emotional as the crown was placed on her head by Miss World 2016 winner Puerto Rico's Stephanie Del Valle. She competed against 108 contestants from various countries at the pageant.

Miss Mexico Andrea Meza was announced the first runner up, while Miss England Stephanie Hill was declared the



second runner up at an event held at Sanya City Area.

"I have no words. I cannot describe how I'm feeling - so much joy, so much happiness," said Goffin.

Grigor Dimitrov will face Jack Sock in the second semi-final.

Britain's Jamie Murray and Brazilian Bruno Soares take on defending champions Henri Kontinen and John Peers in the doubles semi-finals at the O2 Arena.

Federer, 36, went into the semifinal with a 6-0 record against Goffin, whose resistance appeared to have been broken after only seven minutes.


Goffin battled gamely to cling on in his opening service game but Federer took it on the fifth break point and went on to dominate the set. Two rasping backhand winners down the line helped the Swiss to a second break at 4-1 and the set was wrapped up in little over half an hour

WEC Bapco 6 Hours of Bahrain

The stars were out yesterday at Bahrain International Circuit (BIC) in Sakhir, but none shone brighter than Toyota Gazoo Racing in winning this year's hugely exciting FIA WEC Bapco 6 Hours of Bahrain.

Sebastien Buemi was behind the wheel of Toyota's no. 8 TS050 Hybrid as it crossed the finish line for the final chequered flag of the 2017 FIA World Endurance Championship (WEC).

Buemi shared duties

in the car with teammates Anthony Davidson and Kazuki Nakajima, and they completed the endurance challenge with a total of 199 laps around BIC's 5.412-kilometre track. They enjoyed an incident-free race, allowing them to take over as leaders in the first hour and never looking back.

It was the third successive victory for the in-form trio as they end this year's WEC campaign with five wins in

World champions Porsche followed in second and third place, respectively. The double podium was a fitting farewell to the team in what was their final race in the WEC's Le Mans Prototype (LMP) category. The German manufacturers announced previously that they would be withdrawing from the series' premier class at the season's

Their no. 2 drivers' titlewinning 919 Hybrid of Timo Bernhard, Earl Bamber and Brendon Hartley were the overall runners-up. They were one lap behind the winning Toyota but were also 46.641 seconds ahead of Porsche teammates and polesitters Neel Jani, Nick Tandy and Andre Lotterer, who had to settle for third.

Toyota's no. 7 challenger driven by Mike Conway, Kamui Kobayashi and Jose Maria Lopez was classified fourth overall, three laps behind their top-ranked teammates. They completed the overall classification in

In the LMGTE Pro category, Sam Bird and Davide Rigon steered their Ferrari 488 GTE to a fine win
