

I am probably the most untraditional bride



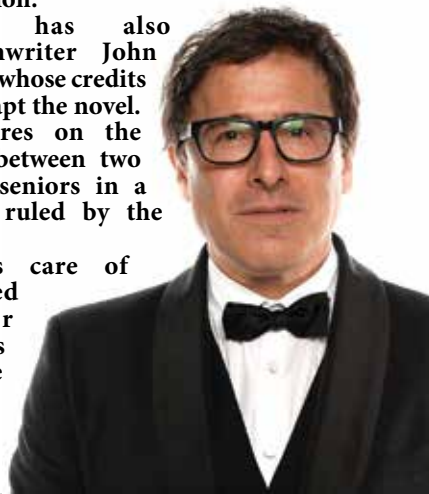

One takes care of his disabled grandfather and finds escape on the basketball court. (TOI)




