Disarm, recognise Israel to ioin unity Govt: US to Hamas

Atop aide to US President Donald Trump said yesterday that an emerging Palestinian unity government must recognise Israel and disarm Hamas, following a landmark reconciliation deal signed last week, the BBC reported

"Any Palestinian government must unambiguously and explicitly commit to nonviolence, recognise the state of Israel, accept previous agreements and obligations between the parties -- including to disarm terrorists -- and commit to peaceful negotiations," Jason Greenblatt, Trump's special representative for international negotiations, said in

"If Hamas is to play any role in a Palestinian government, it must accept these basic requirements," he added in the first detailed US response to last week's Palestinian unity deal.



The statement from Greenblatt similar to the Israeli government's response this week in which it vowed not to negotiate with a Palestinian unity government that includes Hamas unless the Islamist group agrees to a list of demands.

Palestinian president Mahmud Abbas's Fatah movement signed a reconciliation deal with Hamas in Cairo a week ago aimed at ending a bitter 10-year split.

The Mahmoud Abbas-led Palestine Liberation Organisation has recognised the Israeli state, but Hamas has not and is blacklisted as a terrorist organisation by the United States and the European

Israel and Hamas have fought three wars since 2008, and the Gaza Strip has been under an Israeli blockade for more than a decade.

Egypt has also kept its border with Gaza largely closed in recent years. Hamas has run the Gaza Strip since seizing it in a near civil war with Fatah in 2007 following a dispute over elections won by the Islamist movement.

Palestinian movement Hamas accused the United States of "blatant interference" in Palestinian affairs yesterday after US President Donald Trump's envoy demanded they disarm and recognize Israel in any unity government.

"This is blatant interference in Palestinian affairs because it is the right of our people to choose its government according to their supreme strategic interests," senior Hamas official Bassem Naim told French Press Agency.

He accused Iason Greenblatt, Trump's special representative for international negotiations, of bowing to pressure from Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's right-wing government.

"This statement comes under pressure from the extreme right-wing Netanyahu government and is in line with the Netanyahu statement from two days ago," Naim said.



Saudi scholars to vet teaching of Prophet to curb extremism

Saudi authorities have taken an "unprecedented" step to tackle Islamic extremism by setting up a council of scholars to vet religious teachings around the world, *The* Guardian reported yesterday.

A royal order issued this week by King Salman established a global body of elite scholars based in the holy city of Medina to root out and "eliminate fake and extremist texts".

The King Salman Complex will become a "trusted source of the correct and authenticate [sic] hadith", said an announcement from the Saudi ministry of culture and information. It described the move as an "unprecedented initiative".

Hadith are sayings, actions and pronouncements of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) that are additional and complementary to the Qur'an, and a source of guidance for

The scholars would study hadith "with the purpose of eliminating fake and extremist texts and any texts that contradict the teachings of Islam and justify the committing of crimes, murders and terrorist acts which have no place in Islam, the religion



of peace," said the ministry's announcement.

Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Salman bin Abulazis Al Saud has appointed Sheikh Mohammed bin Hassan al-Sheikh, a member of the senior scholars council, as chairman of the complex's scientific council. Members are to be appointed by royal

The Saudi authorities have been worried about extremism, both as a domestic threat and as a strain on its relations with the west, since 9/11, said Jane Kinninmont, a senior research fellow at Chatham House.

"They would say the accusations are out of date, but they know this issue is their achilles heel. The new leadership in Saudi cares much more about its image and PR than before and is genuinely trying to get to grips with extremism," she said.

Bahrain has reiterated its support for the Palestinian cause and for the brotherly Palestinians to restore their legitimate rights and establish an independent state on June 4 1967 borders according to relevant International Legitimacy's resolutions, the Arab Peace Initiative and the two-state principle.

The Kingdom's position was presented in a statement delivered by the Permanent Representative of the Kingdom of Bahrain to the United Nations, Jamal Fares Al Ruaie, at a general debate on the situation in the Middle East including the Palestinian cause.

The Kingdom has also called for immediate halt to all settlement activities which Israel is still practicing in a clear flagrant violation of international laws, UN Security Council resolutions; most importantly resolution 2334 that rejects occupational practices and repercussions.

Al Ruaie welcomed the recent Palestinian reconciliation

aimed to end divisions and achieve national high interests. On Syria, the Permanent Representative affirmed the importance of pushing forward efforts to reach a political solution while preserving the country's territorial integrity, ending foreign interference, eliminating all terrorist organizations and providing security to all Syrians.

Regarding Yemen, he stressed the need to end the imposed control by the foreign-backed militias and seek a comprehensive political

settlement according to agreed references, topped by the Gulf Initiative with its executive mechanisms, the outcomes of the National Dialogue and UN Security resolution 2216.

These, he said, would put an end to all foreign interference and halt the ever-deteriorating humanitarian situation, from which the brotherly Yemeni people are suffering.

"Fighting terrorism of all forms and manifestations in the Middle East, irrespective of the motives, justifications or origins is a prerequisite factor

for security and stability in the region and beyond," he said.

The Permanent Representative explained that it was for those reasons that the Kingdom of Bahrain had praised the new US policies and its strong keenness to prevent Iran from spreading chaos and exporting terrorism to the region.


He concluded the statement by affirming Bahrain's intent to work side by side with the international community to confront challenges and secure a prosperous future for all the peoples of the region.

Is She Malala?

It was a strange coincidence.

I was reading the news that Malala Yousafzai got an admission into Oxford. And at the time of my reading it, I was actually travelling from London to Oxford.

It was on August 18. And before starting my journey, I had picked up 'Metro', which is a freely available newspaper in London's many public places.

Metro reported that Malala had earlier been given a conditional offer by Oxford; and that she has now aced in her A-Level exams, to qualify.

Today, my thoughts went back to that afternoon of August for two reasons.

Firstly, because I just read news about Malala again. And, this time, the news is that she is being angrily targeted, 'for wearing jeans' to her college.

Secondly, and more importantly, it is also because I came across an article on 'Newsweek' website (dated Thursday, 19 October 2017) titled: "Taliban in Pakistan Attacks Malala in Latest Issue of Women's Magazine"; a tirade against Malala's education itself.

Let us look at the 'dress' problem first.

What has bothered many people is that this young woman who began attending classes, at Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford is not dressing up to their expectations.

An unverified picture of her - in skinny jeans and high-heeled boots - has been going viral on social media, with people making derogatory comments and vicious attacks.

Some have been so brutal in their criticism that they were even comparing her to some porn star.

According to UK's Daily Mail, one venomous message posted on Twitter and re-published in the Pakistani media said: 'That was the reason the bullet directly targeted her head long time ago.' And another said: 'Look at hypocrite Malala wearing pants! Is she even a Muslim?'

Oh, how quick we are to judge and condemn, and how low we are ready to stoop, in order to moralise on matters which don't concern us!

With our 'holier than thou' attitude, we are ready to lambast anyone who holds views contrary to our own.

If my opinion of a young woman's 'appropriate dress' is different from your opinion, just remember, I am always right, in all my opinions.

If I believe that your dress is western, and if I believe that, by donning it, you are betraying your eastern religion, culture, and country, just remember, I am always right, in all my beliefs.

This overshadows all other facts.

How does it matter if Malala was barely 13 when she boldly spoke up for girl's education? How does it matter that she was barely 14 when she was inhumanly shot at, by the Taliban?

She was 17 when she won the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize. She is now 20, as she begins her classes at Oxford.

So, can we just stop? And let that young woman live the way she wants to live? And dress the way she wants to dress?

No. We have to sit on our magisterial thrones pointing at her dress. And pointing her to a place where she must remain, if she must fit the mould we have made in our minds, for her!

The Newsweek article states that Taliban's English-language magazine entitled "Sunnat-e-Khaula", or the "Way of Khaula", attacks Malala with fierce words saying: "The one you call education is not right education; because you got it from kuffar"!

Maybe, it is. But, let us wish her success in the education she chose. Let us wish her strength to ignore vicious comments. And to keep on moving.

Tillerson to travel to Saudi, Qatar, South Asia



S Secretary of State Rex Tillerson will travel to Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Pakistan, India and Geneva from October 20-27, the State Department announced yesterday.

State Department spokesperson Heather Nauert said that in Riyadh, Tillerson would take part in the inaugural Coordination Council meeting between the governments of Saudi Arabia and Iraq.

Tillerson will also meet with various Saudi leaders "to discuss the conflict in Yemen, the ongoing Gulf dispute, Iran, and a number of other important regional and bilateral issues." The US top diplomat will then travel to Doha, where he will meet with Qatari leaders and US military officials "to discuss joint counterterrorism efforts, the ongoing Gulf dispute, and other regional and bilateral issues, including Iran and Iraq." Tillerson will then make his "inaugural visit to South Asia as Secretary of State, reaffirming Administration's comprehensive strategy toward the region," Nauert affirmed.

She indicated that in



Islamabad, Tillerson would meet with senior Pakistani leaders "to discuss our continued strong bilateral cooperation, Pakistan's critical role in the success of our South Asia strategy, and the expanding economic ties between our two countries." In

New Delhi, Tillerson will meet with senior Indian leaders "to discuss further strengthening our strategic partnership and collaboration on security and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific region," she noted.

Finally, in Geneva, Tillerson will meet with the office of

the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, International Organization for Migration, and the International Committee of the Red Cross "to discuss a number of the current global humanitarian crises." (KUNA)

Taliban stormed a military base in the south of the country killing at least 43 troops yesterday, the Defence Ministry said, with the militants saying they had killed 60.

Of 60 soldiers manning the base in the province of Kandahar, 43 were killed, nine were wounded and six were missing after the militants attacked in the middle of the night, the ministry said in a

At least 10 Taliban were also reported killed in the battle, which occurred in Maiwand, a district that neighbours volatile Helmand province.

The attack will underscore worries about the ability of the Afghan security forces to deal with a relentless insurgency which they have struggled to contain since most foreign troops left at the end of 2014.

U.S. President Donald Trump committed to an

open-ended military mission in Afghanistan in August despite criticism that it is no closer to peace despite billions of dollars in aid and nearly 16 years of U.S. and allied operations.

The attack began when a suicide bomber drove an explosives-laden Americanmade Humvee armoured vehicle, likely captured from Afghan security forces, into the gate of the base, an army official told Reuters.

That began an hours-long assault by Taliban gunmen, which was interrupted by a second Humvee breaking all the way into the base and detonating inside, he said.

The base itself was left in ruins, officials said.

Qari Yousuf Ahmadi, a spokesman for the militant group, said the attack began with a suicide car bomb followed by an assault that overran the base.

The militants had killed at

least 60 Afghan soldiers and wounded many, he said.

The Taliban have been waging an insurgency for a decade and a half in an attempt to overthrow the Western-backed government in Kabul and re-establish fundamentalist Islamic regime.

The United States and its allies maintain thousands of troops across Afghanistan, including in Kandahar, to advise and assist Afghan

forces as well as conduct strikes against suspected militants.

When asked whether U.S. forces provided any support for the besieged Afghan base, a spokesman at the coalition military command in Kabul said: "We can confirm that U.S. forces conducted an air strike during an operation in the Maiwand district of Kandahar province, October 19, under counter-terror authorities." (Reuters)

100,000 Kurds flee Kirkuk since Iraqi army takeover

bout 100,000 Kurds have Afled the Kirkuk region for fear of persecution since Iraqi armed forces retook disputed territory after a Kurdish independence vote rejected by Baghdad, Kurdish officials said yesterday.

The United Nations voiced concern at reports that civilians, mainly Kurds, were being driven out of parts of northern Iraq retaken by Iraqi forces and their houses and businesses looted and destroyed, and urged Baghdad to stop any such abuses.

In the first incident of deadly violence, a Kurdish man was killed and six wounded by Iraqi security forces while protesting at the army's takeover of their town, Khanaqin, by Iraqi forces, local Mayor Mohammed Mulla Hassan said.

Kurdish troops had left Khanaqin, near the border with Iran, on Tuesday to avoid clashing with advancing Iraqi forces. Central government forces swept into Kirkuk, a multi-ethnic city of more than



1 million people and the hub of a major oil-producing area, largely unopposed on Monday after most Kurdish Peshmerga forces withdrew rather than

Iraqi forces also took back control of Kirkuk oilfields, effectively halving amount of output under the direct control of the semiautonomous Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) in a serious blow to the Kurds' independence quest.

Baghdad's recovery of Kirkuk, situated just outside the KRG's official boundaries on disputed land claimed by Kurds, ethnic Turkmen and Arabs, put the city's Kurds in fear of attack by Shi'ite Muslim paramilitaries, known as Popular Mobilisation, assisting government forces' operations in the region.

Discovery of 50km cave raises hopes for human colonisation of moon

Scientists have fantasised for centuries about humans colonising the moon. That day may have drawn a little closer after Japan's space agency said it had discovered an enormous cave beneath the lunar surface that could be turned into an exploration base for astronauts.

The discovery

Japan's Selenological and Engineering Explorer (Selene) probe made the discovery and it comes as several countries vie to follow the US in sending manned missions to the moon.



Large hollow

Using a radar sounder system that can examine underground structures, the orbiter initially found an opening 50 metres wide and 50 metres deep, prompting speculation that there could be a larger hollow.

This week scientists at the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (Jaxa) confirmed the presence of a cave after examining the hole using radio waves.



Look out for resources

The chasm, 50km (31 miles) long and 100 metres wide, appears to be structurally sound and its rocks may contain ice or water deposits that could be turned into fuel, according to data sent back by the orbiter, nicknamed Kaguya after the moon princess in a Japanese fairytale.

Old lava tube

Scientsts believe the cave, located from a few dozen metres to 200 metres beneath an area of volcanic domes known as the Marius Hills on the moon's near side, is a lava tube created during volcanic activity about 3.5bn years ago.

Boost lunar missions

The discovery will boost plans by several countries to send astronauts to the moon almost half a century after the Apollo 11 mission. (theguardian)

Airbus staged the delayed maiden flight of its A330neo Ajetliner, an upgraded version of A330 series designed

to buttress European sales against the latest model of the Boeing 787 Dreamliner. The wide-bodied, long-distance jet took off from the planemaker's Toulouse headquarters under overcast skies, watched by executives from Airbus and Rolls-Royce, which supplies engines.



Cloud computing sees rapid growth at SAP

SAP SE continues to see strong growth in its cloud computing business, official figures released by the software producer

showed. Revenue in the cloud computing division of SAP grew by 22 per cent to 937 million euros (1.1 billion U.S. dollars) in the third quarter of 2017. By contrast, the firm's traditional business with the sale of software licenses only grew marginally.

Samsung adopts Google ARCore

Samsung and Google announced a partnership Google to bring Google's new ARCore framework to Samsung's line of Galaxy smartphones, uniting the two giants' augmented reality efforts as the market is starting to really crowd.

The news is a big boon for Google's ARCore, which Google announced earlier this year as a competitor to Apple's ARKit. It is effectively a software platform for building out AR apps that make use of both advances in cloud software and on-device hardware to place digital objects into the real world.

Now, developers will be able to design ARCore apps that work on both Google Pixel devices and Samsung Galaxy devices, including the Galaxy S8 and Note 8.

Samsung was an initial launch partner for ARCore with the S8, but this is a more formal adoption of Google's framework for any and all future devices, the company said today at the Samsung Developer Conference in San Francisco.

which Samsung, more phones than any other device manufacturer on the planet, has been a longtime ally of Google's in pushing the ubiquity of Android, and this partnership should extend the strength of Android into the AR market.



London

producers working to build consensus on extending their deal to reduce supplies, OPEC's secretary general said yesterday, with the potential for continuation throughout 2018 forming a basis for talks.

The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, plus Russia and nine other producers, are cutting oil output by about 1.8 million barrels per day (bpd) until March 2018 in an attempt to eradicate a supply glut that has weighed on prices.

The deal has supported prices, which are trading within sight of a two-year high, but an overhang of stored oil has vet to be fully eradicated and producers are considering extending the

deal at their next meeting on Nov. 30.

OPEC Secretary General Mohammad Barkindo, in a briefing with reporters yesterday, said that Russian President Vladimir Putin's suggestion this month that the deal could be extended to the end of 2018 were being taken "seriously".

Saudi Energy Minister Khalid al-Falih, the OPEC president, and Russian Energy Minister Alexander Novak "are taking cue from the open statement of President Putin and engaging the rest of the participating countries ... to build consensus before Nov. 30", Barkindo said.

Reuters reported Wednesday, citing OPEC sources, that producers are leaning towards extending the deal for a further nine

months, though the decision could be postponed until early next year depending on the market.

Barkindo said it wasn't yet clear if the decision would be made on Nov.30 and, asked whether another meeting could be held in early 2018, said that Falih and Novak would consult and decide.

"It's difficult to say at the moment what will be decided in November,' Barkindo said.

"It will depend on a number of factors, chief among which is how far are we from achieving objective of a convergence of supply and demand."

Falih and Novak are also talking to producers not currently participating in the supply cut, Barkindo added. (Reuters)

Banks led the Saudi Arabian stock market higher yesterday after Riyad Bank reported better-than-expected earnings for the third quarter, while builder Drake & Scull jumped in Dubai.

Riyad Bank gained 6.2 per cent after reporting a 47.7 per cent year-on-year rise in third-quarter net profit to 1.08 billion riyals (\$288 million); analysts polled by *Reuters* had on average forecast 852.5 million riyals.

It was one of the first Saudi banks to report quarterly earnings -- Alinma Bank beat analysts' estimates slightly on Sunday -- so the news buoyed the sector in general. Eleven of 12 listed Saudi banks rose yesterday.

The Saudi stock index climbed 1.0pc. Petrochemical

firm Saudi Kayan , which reported a rise in profit to 381 million riyals compared to analysts' average forecast of 129 million riyals, surged 5.0pc.

In Dubai, Drake & Scull, which has attracted renewed interest since it completed a capital restructuring early this month, gained 5.3pc to 2.01 dirhams in heavy trade. It has climbed by more than a third since early October.

In Abu Dhabi, Dana Gas added 2.7pc after saying its operations and production in Iraqi Kurdistan were continuing as normal, following the Iraqi military's retaking of some of the biggest oil fields from Kurdish Peshmerga forces.

The Antonio Gades Company, a major pillar of Spanish flamenco dance, will be presenting "Fuego", which is inspired by the work of the late Spanish legendary composer, Manuel de Falla. The plot, choreography and lighting made by the late Antonio Gades and the Spanish film director, photographer and writer Carlos Saura. Coinciding with the tenth anniversary of the death of Antonio Gades, the foundation that carries his name decided to undertake a very significant challenge setting up another version of the Manuel de Falla's ballet "Enchanted Love". Titled "Fuego", this production was the second scenic interpretation which the choreographer had of Manuel de Falla's work. Being an exponent of Gades' core idea "return to tradition if you want to evolve", this ballet is a transitional piece between the almost mythical setups in the classic plays, Carmen and Fuenteovejuna. It was also the last of the joint mythical flamenco works by Gades and Saura, with the same overlaying structure they followed in Carmen, first as a film and secondly as a ballet.

LECTURE:LIFE AND DEATH IN EARLY DILMUN: STORIES FROM THE DILMUN BIOARCHAEOLOGY PROJECTDATE



Date: 22 November 2017, 6:30pm Venue: Bahrain National Museum -Auditorium

Since 2008, the Dilmun Bioarchaeology Project has been studying and publishing the collections from Peter B. Cornwall's 1940-41 expedition to Bahrain and Saudi Arabia, which now reside in the Phoebe A. Hearst Museum of Anthropology at UC Berkeley. Cornwall excavated at least 24 burial mounds in the northern and western parts of Bahrain Island, and conducted surface survey at several archaeological sites in the al-Hasa region of Saudi Arabia. He drew on thesematerials to argue that the Bronze Age polity of Dilmun had been located in that region. By documenting and analyzing the skeletal remains and artifacts collected by Cornwall, our team hopes to add to anthropologists' understanding of how life was experienced and death commemorated in Dilmun. Preliminary findings have been published in academic and public-oriented peer-reviewed journals. We also mounted a touring museum exhibit entitled "From Death to Life in Ancient Bahrain" that features the facial reconstructions of two Early Dilmun people. Recently, we launched a new phase of the project in which AMS radiocarbon dating and stable isotope analysis are confirming the dates of the Bahraini burial mounds and shedding light on the residential mobility and dietary practices of the people buried in them. We look forward to sharing the results of our research with the audience at the Bahrain National Museum.

Alexis T. Boutin (Ph.D., University of Pennsylvania) is Associate Professor of Anthropology and Advisor in the Cultural Resources Management M.A. Program at Sonoma State University. Her bioarchaeological fieldwork and museum collections research focuses on ancient Near Eastern, Gulf, and eastern Mediterranean societies. Alexis's publications use human skeletal remains, archaeological contexts, and ancient texts to tell stories about embodied personhood in all of its iterations. Her recent projects emphasize community collaboration and stakeholder-oriented interpretation and outreach





Hours before Catalan president Carles Puigdemont faces a 10:00 am (0800 GMT) Thursday deadline to say whether or not he is declaring independence, a government source said that elections "could be considered a return to legality".

The government had earlier warned Puigdemont that unless he backs down, Madrid will start proceedings to take direct control over the semi-autonomous region.

With its own language and

culture, Catalonia is proud of its autonomy but its 7.5 million people are deeply divided over independence.

There are fears that moving to impose direct rule could inflame tensions in a crisis that has already sparked huge street rallies, prompted hundreds of companies to decamp to other parts of Spain, and rattled EU neighbours.

Spain has been in limbo since Catalonia held a banned independence referendum on October 1, which prompted a heavy police crackdown that drew international condemnation.

Puigdemont issued "suspended" a cryptic declaration of independence following the vote, saying he wanted time for talks with the central government

"All I ask of Mr Puigdemont is that he acts with good sense," Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy told parliament Wednesday as the government threatened to trigger Article 155 of Spain's constitution, a never-beforeused provision that would allow it to suspend Catalan autonomy.

North Korea threatens 'unimaginable' strike on US

North Korea has threatened to launch an "unimaginable" strike on the US, accusing the Trump administration and its South Korean "puppet" allies of seeking to "ignite a war on the Korean peninsula at any cost".

The statement released by the Korean Central News Agency, Pyongyang's official's mouthpiece, predicted catastrophic "imminent disaster" in the region.

Using typically hyperbolic

language, it vowed to "mercilessly smash the war frenzy of the US and South Korean puppet warmongers to get rid of the abyss of ruin through dangerous war gambling and inflict the most miserable death on the invaders.'

The threat came in response to joint US-South Korea military drills in waters east of the Korean peninsula involving the USS Ronald Reagan, a nuclear powered aircraft carrier. (The Independent)

Pakistani anti-corruption court indicts ousted PM

Islamabad

A Pakistani corruption court yesterday indicted ousted Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif and his daughter over allegations linked to ownership of London properties, opening a trial that could see the former leader jailed.

The Sharifs have called the corruption proceedings against them a conspiracy, hinting at intervention by

the powerful military, but opponents have hailed it as a rare example of the rich and powerful being held accountable.

Sharif, 67, resigned in July after the Supreme Court disqualified him from holding office over an undeclared source of income, but the veteran leader maintains his grip on the ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) party. (Reuters)

on Friday, from 2pm to 4pm in the Woodruff Commons of the Rose Library, it said.

Beautifully composed, the letters "reveal the search of a young man for meaning and identity," Rosemary Magee, Rose Library director was quoted as saying. "While intimate in a philosophical way, they reflect primarily

a college student coming to terms with himself and others."

"In fact, they show the same kind of yearnings and issues that our own students face - and that students everywhere encounter," Magee said. "Thus they will serve as sources of both inspiration and reassurance to people of all ages and backgrounds." (Xinhua)

Iran says missile programme will accelerate

Ankara

Iran's elite Islamic Revolutionary Guards (IRGC) said on Thursday its ballistic missile programme would accelerate despite U.S. and European Union pressure to suspend it, the semi-official Tasnim news agency reported.

In a significant U.S. policy shift on Oct. 13, President Donald Trump disavowed Iran's compliance with a landmark 2015 nuclear deal and launched a more aggressive approach to the Islamic Republic over its missile development activity.

"Iran's ballistic missile programme will expand and it will continue with more



speed in reaction to Trump's hostile approach towards this revolutionary organisation (the Guards)," the IRGC said in a statement published by Tasnim.

The Trump administration has imposed new unilateral sanctions aimed at impairing Iran's missile programme. It has called on Tehran not to develop missiles capable of delivering nuclear bombs. Iran says it has no such plans.

Tehran has repeatedly pledged to continue what it calls a defensive missile capability in defiance of Western criticism.

"Trump's anxiety and trembling voice in his speech was a sign of beginning of the era of failure for America's hegemony," Tasnim quoted IRGC chief commander Mohammad Ali Jafari as saying. "Boosting Iran's defence power remains our top priority."

Iran has one of the most advanced ballistic missile programmes in the Middle East, viewing it as an essential precautionary defence against the United States and other adversaries, primarily Gulf Arab states and Israel.

"Imposing cruel sanctions against the Guards and hostile approach of the rogue and brute (U.S.) president shows the failure of America and the Zionist regime's (Israel) wicked policies in the region," the Guards statement said.

Signalling no respite in tension in the Middle East, where Shi'ite Muslim Iran has waged a long proxy war with U.S.-allied Sunni Muslim Saudi Arabia, the Guards also vowed to continue confronting the United States and Israel.

"More decisive and stronger

than ever, the Guards will continue to defend Islamic Iran and its interests," the statement said, alluding to the Quds force, the Guards' overseas arm that operates in Iraq, Syria and Yemen among other places.

Trump's hardened Iran stance has united officials behind the IRGC.

"Today, Iranians, boys, girls, men, women, are all IRGC. Standing firm with those who defend us and the region against aggression and terror," U.S.-educated Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif wrote on his twitter account after Trump's speech.

President Xi Jinping declared China is entering a "new era" of challenges and opportunities on Wednesday as he opened a Communist Party congress expected to enhance his already formidable power.

Xi told some 2,300 delegates at the imposing Great Hall of the People that the party must "resolutely oppose" any actions that undermine its leadership as it steers a course through a high-stakes period in its development.

"The situation both domestic and abroad is undergoing profound and complex changes," said Xi, who is expected to secure a second five-year term as general secretary and stack leadership positions with loyalists during the twice-a-decade congress.

"China's development is still in a stage of important strategic opportunities. The prospects are bright, but the challenges are also severe," he said in a marathon speech that exceeded three hours and was met by waves of applause.
"Socialism with Chinese
characteristics has entered a
new era."

Speaking in front of a massive hammer and sickle, Xi touted his nationalistic "China dream" slogan, vowed to open the economy, promised to win the fight against poverty, and warned he would continue a "zero tolerance" campaign against corruption.

"Every one of us in the party must do more to uphold party leadership and the Chinese socialist system and resolutely oppose all statements and actions that undermine, distort or negate them," he said.

Considered China's most powerful leader since Deng Xiaoping or even Mao Zedong, Xi could use the congress to lay the foundation to stay atop the 89-millionstrong party even longer than the normal 10 years, according to analysts.

That would break the unwritten two-term limit accepted by his immediate predecessors Jiang Zemin and Hu Jintao -- who were by Xi's side at the congress -- and end the era of "collective leadership" aimed at preventing the emergence of another Mao.

Another signal of Xi's rise to the pantheon of Chinese leadership would be if his name is added to the party constitution, an honour that has only been bestowed upon modern China's founder, Mao, and the father of economic reforms, Deng.

'Tigers and flies'

Potential rivals have been swept aside under Xi's vast anti-corruption drive, which punished 1.3 million Communist Party officials over five years.

Xi said the campaign has been "unswervingly fighting against 'tigers', 'beating flies', 'hunting foxes'" -- terms used for lower- and higher-ranking officials, as well as those who have fled abroad.

His rise has also been marked by a relentless crackdown on dissent, with authorities even refusing to free Nobel peace prize laureate Liu Xiaobo as he lay dying of cancer in July.

On other fronts, Xi touted efforts to complete the army's modernisation by 2035 and build artificial islands in the disputed South China

In a stern warning to selfruled Taiwan, which Beijing considers a rebel province, Xi said China has the "ability to defeat separatist attempts for Taiwan independence in any form".

Xi, who has championed globalisation in the face of President Donald Trump's "America First" policies, vowed to further open up China's economy.

Foreign companies complain that Xi's words have not been backed by deeds, as the state retains control over the economy.

US should shed bias: Chinese official



Beijing

China today asked the US to shed its "biased views" and work with Beijing to uphold the momentum for a steady and sound relations, a day after the top American diplomat lashed out at the Chinese model of funding infrastructure projects and developmental activities.

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Lu Kang also said that Beijing is "happy" over the development of ties between India and America as long as they are conducive to regional peace.

In a major India-policy speech yesterday, US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson had highlighted the need for collaborating with New Delhi on offering alternative model of financing infrastructure projects and economic development to that of China whom he described as "predatory economics".

He had lashed out at the Chinese model of funding infrastructure projects and developmental activities, saying it does not create jobs and results in enormous level of debt.

Playing down Tillerson's criticism of China and his remarks to deepen ties with India, Lu told reporters here that the US should take more objective look at China's development.

"China steadfastly upheld the international order with the UN at the core and based on the purposes and principles of UN charter we will firmly uphold the multilateralism yet we will also firmly safeguard our own interests and rights," he said while responding to a question on Tillerson's remarks.

The US diplomat had branded China a "predatory rule breaker" specially in the South China Sea and leaving countries in debt.

China hopes that Washington can look China's development in an "objective way" as well as China's role in the international community, Lu said. (*PTI*)

"I am shutting down my season to make sure I can rehab and prepare as best as I can for the Australian summer," Kyrgios said in a statement on Twitter.

"Unless I want this to escalate into an injury that requires surgery, I need to listen to my body and my

The injury prematurely ends a season that been blighted by indiscretions.

Earlier in October, Kyrgios was fined \$10,000 (£7,573) for unsportsmanlike conduct after he quit his first-round match at the Shanghai Masters because he lost the first set on a tiebreak against Steve Johnson.

That incident came two days after he lost to Rafael Nadal in the final of the China Open after becoming frustrated by a line call in the first set.

"This year hasn't been as successful as I would have liked, especially at the Slams," he said.

"It's no secret that I have had some sad moments to deal with away from the court which have added to my disappointments throughout the year." (BBC)

ewis Hamilton dismissed ⊿talk of him wrapping up a fourth world title at the United States Grand Prix this weekend as "silly".

The 32-year-old Briton can claim the 2017 crown if he is triumphant for Mercedes and nearest rival Sebastian Vettel of Ferrari fails to finish in the top five in Sunday's race at the Circuit of the Americas.

'Honestly, I don't know, all of the talk of a championship win here is silly really --Sebastian won't have the same difficulties and he will be very quick.

"For me, it (the title) will be done in the last four races so my focus here is on winning.

"I don't mind if it is done here or at the last race, but the most important thing here is to win, in the midst of all that is going on in the country and that is a priority for me -- and you know what I am talking about."

Hamilton declined

elaborate on his plans or the significance of his comments about why winning is such a priority for him. He suggested that a member of the media audience understood, without explaining.

When he was asked directly if he intended to take a knee in support of the protests by NFL players against racial injustice and police brutality, he distanced himself from some of his earlier comments on the subject.

"I've not given that much thought," he said, adding that when he had referred to a "gentleman at the front" who understood his thinking he was not considering the protest action. "I've worked hard to be here today and I have feelings about the whole situation, but at the moment I have no plans to do anything."

He added that if he was not to win the title in the United States, he would be happy to win it in Mexico, Brazil or Abu Dhabi. (AFP)

Double world champion Fernando Alonso will stay with McLaren in 2018, the team said yesterday in a longexpected announcement that finally ended one of the sagas of the Formula One season.

McLaren did not say whether the new contract extended beyond next year.

The Spaniard has endured a miserable three years with the British-based former world champions and had refused to commit to staying until he felt they could provide him with a competitive car. McLaren have gone some way towards answering those doubts by ending a troubled partnership with Honda and switching to Renault engines in 2018.

"It's fantastic to be able to continue my relationship with everybody at McLaren. It was always where my heart was telling me to stay, and I really feel at home here," the Spaniard said in a team statement at the U.S. Grand Prix.

"McLaren has the technical resource and financial strength to be able to very quickly win races and world championships in F1," added the 36-year-old, who won his two championships with Renault in 2005 and 2006.

"Although the last few years have not been easy, we have never forgotten how to win, and I believe we can achieve that again soon."

Alonso has not been on the podium since 2014, when he was with Ferrari. His last win was in Spain in 2013, again with the Italian team.

McLaren are currently ninth overall, out of 10 teams, and the season ranks as the worst of Alonso's career with the exception of his debut year with now-defunct tail-enders Minardi. (Reuters)

Celtic discovered Bayern Munich are still very much a European force as the Hoops suffered a 3-0 drubbing in their Champions League clash at the Allianz Arena.

The German giants had replaced Carlo Ancelotti with Jupp Heynckes following their 3-0 Group B defeat by Paris St Germain last month but any thoughts of demise were swept away as skipper Thomas Muller opened the scoring in the 17th minute before rightback Joshua Kimmich nodded in a second before half-time.

Mats Hummels headed in a third six minutes after the break and the Bundesliga champions were unfortunate their dominance was not properly reflected in the scoreline.

Celtic's 3-0 win away to Anderlecht in September means they are favourites to at least end up with a Europa League place after Christmas but they were simply outclassed by the Bundesliga side.

And after losing 5-0 to Paris St Germain in their opening fixture, it is clear they still have a way to go to compete with the big boys on the Champions League stage.

Bayern's magnificent stadium was packed with 72,000 fans, more than 4,000 of whom were Celtic supporters making themselves heard high up in the stands.

The Parkhead followers and their heroes were relieved in the sixth minute when the linesman flagged when Thiago Alcantara had the ball in the net from a Robert Lewandowski cut-back, perhaps ruling the ball had already gone behind for a goal kick, although television replays showed that was not conclusive.

A tug on the Poland striker's shirt inside the box by Mikael Lustig moments later went unpunished by Russian referee Sergei Karasev but the Parkhead defence was soon breached.

Craig Gordon did brilliantly to parry Lewandowksi's close-range header from a Kimmich cross but the unmarked Muller was on hand to fire the loose ball high into the net.

Gordon but had no chance with Bayern's second just before the half-hour mark, when Kingsley Coman beat Cristian Gamboa again down the left and crossed for Kimmich to loop a header in from 14 yards.

Moments later, Gordon saved a powerful Lewandowski drive with his left elbow and there was a feeling of doom for the Scottish champions.

Bayern's third goal was simplicity itself as defender Hummels beat Scott Brown to head in Arjen Robben's corner from the right.

It was hard going for Scotland's treble winners.

On the hour-mark Gamboa cleared a Robben header off the line, after Kimmich had fired in Bayern's 10th corner of the night, before Lewandowski guided a David Alaba cross into the net from six yards only for the offside flag to be correctly up for offside.

In the 64th minute Brendan Rodgers brought on Moussa Dembele and Tom Rogic for Leigh Griffiths and Stuart Armstrong but Bayern kept the pressure up with Gordon making saves from Robben and Lewandowski.

At the other end, as the Glasgow side rallied late on, Bayern goalkeeper Sven Ulreich beat away a Scott Sinclair drive before Hummels cleared Rogic's drive from the rebound. (espn.in)
