The film was aired in India on Sony PIX on Friday. It also stars Lulu Wilson, Annalise Basso and Alexis G. Zall. (IANS)


Ali to star in and produce 'Zurn'

cademy Award-winning actor Mahershala Ali is set to star in and executive produce a crime thriller movie based on A J Wolfe's upcoming book 'Burn.'


