Inces new faces new barrage of sanctions

The United States and the European Union yesterday moved to impose new unilateral sanctions on North Korea as South Korea warned the United Nations of the risk of accidentally igniting a war.

After threatening to "totally destroy North Korea" in his first address to the General Assembly, US President Donald Trump signed an executive order targeting foreign companies doing business with North Korea, ratcheting up pressure on Pyongyang.

In Brussels, the 28-country EU agreed to a ban on investments in North Korea and on EU exports of oil, diplomatic sources said.

Trump said China's central bank had ordered national banks to curb their dealings with North Korea, describing the move as "very bold" and "unexpected."

The threat from North Korea's nuclear and missile tests has dominated this year's gathering of world leaders, but divisions remain over how to confront Pyongyang. North Korea detonated its sixth nuclear bomb and has test-fired intercontinental missiles -- saying it needs to defend itself against

hostility from the United States and its allies. Washington and its allies hope the tough economic sanctions will sway Pyongyang to come to the table and negotiate an end to its nuclear and missile programs. The US administration has refused to offer North Korea incentives to open negotiations and has ramped up threats of military action to force leader Kim Jong-Un -- whom Trump has dubbed "Rocket Man" -- to change course.

But meeting with Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and South Korean President Moon Jae-in, Trump said "Why not?" when asked whether there could be a dialogue with North Korea.

S. Korea warning

In his address to the UN assembly, Moon struck a different tone after Trump's fiery speech, saying the crisis needs to be "managed" to prevent an accidental outbreak of war.

Moon said South Korea was not seeking the collapse of its neighbor and was ready to help if Pyongyang decides "to stand on the right side of history" and halts its provocations. - AFP

discovery maya treatment tiple sclerosis

A team of medical researchers in Bahrain announced that they have made an interesting discovery, which could help toward improving the treatment of multiple sclerosis.

Researchers from the Princess Al Jawhara Centre for Molecular Medicine & Inherited Disorders believe their recent discovery will aid in improving the treatment of the auto-immune disease. Their study revealed five genes that were significantly higher in multiple sclerosis patients when compared to control group.

"Multiple sclerosis (MS) is a multi-factorial disease of the Central Nervous System (CNS) affecting young adults leading to significant disabilities over time. MS is now believed to be prevalent in Arabian Gulf area with high incidence due to environmental factors and unknown genetic variations. The objectives of this study was to detect up-regulated potential genes that might be involved in neuroinflammatory process in MS patients in Bahrain and to measure the protein levels of


the expressed genes," the report stated.

A newly introduced technique called microarray was used to examine gene expression. Blood samples from 88 Bahraini MS patients and from 88 from a control group from Salmaniya Medical Complex was used for the study.

Of the 47000 genes examined, the report noted the expression of 15,480 genes and five genes TNF-AIP6, IL-1RA, OASL, CLC and DOCK4 were found to be higher in MS patients.

The study also suggested biomarkers to understand the MS inflammatory process and to analyze treatment response.

Bahrain's hopes of winning a medal in taekwondo were ended yesterday when Walaa Al Doseri lost in the quarter finals of the women's 57kg and under at the Fifth Asian Indoor and Martial Arts Games in Ashgabat, Turkmenistan.

After Jumana Mohamed and her younger sister Juwana failed to reach the medal stages of their respective weight categories, Bahrain's third and final team member Walaa Al Doseri was also unable to improve on her teammates finish.

The 20-year old opened her campaign in the Round of 16 and defeated Bhutan's Chimi Dolma 10-6, after dominating the first round (8-4) and then fought a tight second round (2-2) to progress to the quarter

In the quarter finals, Al Doseri was pitted against the more experienced Vietnamese Thi Anh Tuyet Tran who was a comfortable 29-6 winner using her overall strength and stamina to reach the semifinals after winning the first round (7-4) and completely dominating the second round in winning (22-2).

Al Doseri had headed into the competition with high hopes of a medal he faced Chimi Dolma of Bhutan in the last-6 round, and lived up to many expectations by pulling off a 10-6 victory over her opponent to punch her ticket into the competition's last eight.

Saudis call on Myanmar to allow Rohingyas to return

A top Saudi relief official called yesterday for Myanmar to take back Rohingya refugees and let them live in peace.

Dr. Abdullah al-Rabeeah, former health minister and now leading the King Salman Humanitarian Aid and Relief Centre, said major global powers need to press Myanmar to stop its violent expulsion of the Muslim ethnic minority into Bangladesh.

"What I want from our allies like the US and UK and the international community. I think it's time to put pressure on the Burma or Myanmar government to allow those refugees to go back and live in peace and get their rights," he said.

Rabeeah, on a stop in Washington before talks Friday at the United Nations on Yemen, said Saudi Arabia was already pumping aid in for the 422,000 Rohingyas



who have been driven out of Myanmar's westernmost Rakhine state to Bangladesh since August 25.

The aid is going mostly into Bangladesh but also through Indonesia and Malaysia, he

"We are working heavily

to help the refugees in Bangladesh," he said.

Bangladesh said earlier Thursday that it had treated more than 2,350 Rohingya and machete wounds and trauma from landmines.

Aid blocked as crisis deepens

An attack on an aid shipment in Myanmar's violence-wracked Rakhine state and a deadly Red Cross truck crash in Bangladesh on Thursday hampered desperately needed relief efforts for Rohingya Muslims fleeing persecution.

An International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) ship carrying 50 tonnes of aid was halted by a 300-strong Buddhist mob in the state capital Sittwe on Wednesday night.

The group forced the ICRC to unload the aid from the boat and prevented the vessel from leaving, state-backed Global New Light of Myanmar newspaper reported Thursday, quoting Myanmar's Information Committee.

The crowd hurled "stones and Molotov (cocktails)" at riot police on the scene, injuring several officers before order was restored.

The ICRC confirmed the incident and said its staff were not injured, vowing to continue to try to deliver aid.

Saudi Arabia is airlifting 100 tonnes of donated tents, sleeping mats, blankets and food to refugees in Bangladesh, said the International Organization for Migration (IOM), which is chartering the flight.

"Many of these families are still living in the open without adequate shelter, food or clean water,' Mohammed Abdiker, IOM Director of Operations and Emergencies, said in a statement. (AFP)

Facebook bans militant group

Facebook said it has banned a Rohingya militant group from its site, designating it a 'dangerous organisation' as information on the deepening crisis is muddied by claims, counterclaims and hate speech on social media.

The social network is a key tool in the information war taking place over violence in

Myanmar's Rakhine state, which has driven more than 420,000 Rohingya Muslims from the country and sparked UN accusations of militaryled "ethnic cleansing".

Rohingya activists have used the platform to post alleged scenes of brutality from the conflict zone, where humanitarian and media access is severely restricted, while the army and

government deliver neardaily updates on the crisis.

A Facebook spokeswoman told AFP late Wednesday it was not requested by the government to bar the Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army (ARSA), which remains active on Twitter.

The spokeswoman added that the move was in line with its policy of prohibiting violent groups from its site.

The Man, The Gun, and The Controversy

A 30 feet, or nine-metre, monument of a man with an assault rifle, was unveiled in Moscow this week, on Tuesday, 19 September 2017.

The man's name: Mikhail Kalashnikov.

The rifle's name: AK 47.

A few days ago, listening to a BBC news program on the controversy surrounding this statue, I thought I should do some study on this popular killing machine invented by Kalashnikov in 1947.

But first, let us look at the controversy.

The statue was being erected in one of the busiest and most commonly used streets of Moscow. And, many Muscovites protested saying it was not an appropriate place for a memorial to the gun maker.

Among the placards the protestors waved was one which said: 'a creator of weapons is a creator of death'.

In a news item, "30ft-high statue of Mikhail Kalashnikov unveiled in Moscow" (The Guardian, 19 September 2017), there is a mention of a lawyer-protestor saying: "I'm not, in principle, against a statue of Kalashnikov. But it should not be erected here, now, and in this shape."

Supporters of the monument, however, did not agree. "This is Russia's cultural brand," and "He created this weapon to defend his motherland," they argued.

But is it only being used for Russia's defence? Is it really a "cultural brand"? These are the questions the leaders of global arms trade must answer.

In 2015 alone, look at what these Kalashnikovs have done.

In Garissa, Kenya, 147 Christian students were killed in a university. In Paris, France, 130 were killed with bombs and guns at a music concert. In Sausse, Tunisia, 38 people were killed on a beach by a lone gun-attacker. In all these cases, it was the 'AK 47' assault rifle, or a rifle from its family, that the terrorists used. In the same year, even in the Charlie Hebdo attacks, and in the Copenhagen attack, it was the same weapon used.

In a short video I watched online, Michael Hodges, the author of the book, "AK 47: 'The People's Gun" says that, with just 7 moving parts, and with the capability to fire 100 rounds of ammunition, this automatic rifle "is simple enough for a child to use"!

Perhaps, that is why many child soldiers in Africa are being illegally recruited and trained to kill - with this lightweight assault rifle.

The World Bank estimated in 2007 that out of the 500 million total firearms available worldwide, 100 million are of the Kalashnikov family, and 75 million are AK-47s.

But the author Michael Hodges says there could be up to '200 million' of these assault rifles in the world. Mostly because of the illicit arms trade, that is not accounted for.

Investigators of recent terrorist attacks have concluded that the most terrorists acquired these assault rifles through black markets in Europe. In some African countries with civil wars, many legal firearms disappear, and make their way into gunrunners' hands.

Actually, many forms of Kalashnikovs are manufactured – legitimately, for international trade – in more than 30 countries. China is a leader, and it exports mostly to African pations

But, sadly, in some African countries, many underpaid soldiers, apparently, sell their rifles for a pittance. And the rifles soon become illicit contraband, and not traceable.

Russia may be proud of its inventor today. And maybe we cannot begrudge Russia if it wants to erect a statue in honour of a man who helped the nation's arms trade.

But unless countries around the world have stricter gun control laws, these automatic assault rifles could be used for terror. And no killing or terror can justify a celebration.

Conjoined twins set for university in Tanzania

Apair of conjoined sisters are settling into campus life at a Tanzanian university, a first in a country where disabled people are often marginalised or abandoned at birth.

Maria and Consolata Mwakikuti, 20, who are joined at the abdomen, have become minor celebrities in the east African nation where the media have closely followed their path through high school and arrival at university earlier this month.

Mwazarau Mathola, spokeswoman for the Ruaha Catholic University in Iringa in the centre of the country, said on Thursday the women arrived a few weeks before classes start in October to get used to their new life and take computer lessons.

"Å separate house has



been provided for them, furnished and set up for their needs, because they can't be housed in normal student accommodation," said Mathola. A couch has been installed in their classroom to allow them to sit comfortably, and they have a carer.

The twins were abandoned by their mother after the death of their father, and later taken in by a Catholic mission. They will study education, with the hope of becoming teachers of history, English and Swahili, said Mathola. In July, Maria made an emotional call on state television for parents not to "hide or lock up their handicapped children".

"They must know they human beings, handicapped or not, are equal and have the same rights," she said.

The sisters, who enjoy knitting and cooking together, thanked the teachers who helped them through highschool, as well as the government who provided a vehicle to take them from their home to school each day.

"We didn't expect this day to come, it is by the grace of God that we are here today," said Consolata, the chattier of the two. The sisters admit that they do not always get along, as Consolata told a local newspaper in 2015: "For example when I want to do laundry and Maria prefers to read. However we always find a way around it." (AFP)





Madrid ramps up pressure on Catalonia

yrian fighters backed by JUS special forces battled yesterday to clear the last remaining Islamic State group jihadists holed up in their crumbling stronghold of Raqa.

"Victory is near" and would be declared in coming weeks, a spokeswoman for the operation to capture Raqa said in the city where US-led air strikes sent clouds of grey smoke into the air.

Across the border in Iraq, security forces were attacking all remaining territory held by the extremists, who are fighting to prevent the allout collapse of their selfproclaimed "caliphate".

Most of Raqa, long a byword for the jihadists' most gruesome atrocities, is now in the hands of the US-backed Syrian Democratic Forces, supported by waves of heavy air strikes by a military coalition led by Washington.

"We control 80 percent of Raqa and the other 20 percent is in the firing line of our forces," said Jihan Sheikh Ahmed, spokeswoman for the "Wrath of the Euphrates'

operation.

"We're in the final stage and will deliver victory to our people in Raqa within weeks," she said.

She said the Kurdish-Arab alliance was still fighting the jihadists around grain silos in the north of the city and the Raqa sports stadium, where IS fighters are believed to be storing weaponry.

"But victory is near," she said

SDF spokesman Talal Sello said the militia was battling jihadists in "20 percent of the city".

"That sector is not under the control of Daesh... our forces are present there," he said.

In the city Thursday, a correspondent heard US-led coalition warplanes carrying out air strikes around the

The sound of gunfire from running battles could also be heard as a journalist travelled across parts of the

The Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights monitor said the SDF and US special forces were engaged in a "mopping up operation.

But the operation was being slowed down by large numbers of mines planted by the jihadists in the city, where they have been under siege for three months, it said.

Exact estimates of the percentage of the city held by the SDF vary, with the Observatory putting it at 90 percent, but the US-led coalition saying that 70 percent had been "cleared."

As 12-year-d Palestinian Y o u s e f al-Bahtini distorts his body into almost impossible shapes, he dreams of entering the Guinness World Guinness Records.

That dream could come true in the coming weeks, provided Jordan and Israel grant him permits to travel for a time trial.

Bahtini lives in Gaza, the Palestinian enclave of two million people sealed off by Israel and Egypt.

But using YouTube videos and with his family's help, he has taught himself to bend in seemingly impossible ways.

And now his family believe Guinness should recognise him.

"This talent was discovered by my brother and I've improved it. I will participate in the Guinness Book of Records with a forward movement of 20 metres in 14 seconds, and it's name is 'The Roll," said Bahtini.

The move involves rolling forward onto your stomach before flicking your bent legs up behind you into a crab position, then rolling back through and dropping onto your chest again.

The current record, set in 2013 by Britain's Leilani Franco, is 20 metres (45 feet) in 17 seconds.

Bahtini's family say he has done it in 14, and sent the evidence to Guinness to prove it.

The company wrote to the family in July to say he had been accepted for a time trial.

They don't, however, have an office in Gaza so Bahtini must travel to Jordan for an official test.

The family are waiting for a Jordanian permit, after which they will apply for permission to transit through Israel.

"Guinness are understanding

of the circumstances in the Gaza Strip and therefore have not specified a particular date for our participation," Yousef's brother Mohammed, who is also his trainer,

He added they wanted to get his name into the Guinness World Records to "raise the name of Palestine high".

If successful, Bahtini would be the second Gazan contortionist to enter the Guinness records book in a year.

In February, 13-year-old Mohammad al-Sheikh broke the record for the most full body revolutions maintaining a chest stand in one minute.

The move involves lying on the chest, bending the back to put the feet in front of the head then rotating the hips to run the feet in laps around the body.

laiwan's struggling smartphone maker HTC said yesterday it would sell part of its smartphone business to Google for \$1.1 billion as the US giant looks to take greater control of its hardware business.

Google will take on half of HTC's research and development staff -- about 2,000 people -- many of whom have already been working on the Silicon Valley firm's Pixel handset, as well as intellectual property (IP) licensing.

HTC said in a statement the deal is expected to be completed early next year, pending regulatory approval.

"For Google, this agreement further reinforces commitment to smartphones and overall investment in its emerging hardware business," HTC spokesman Peter Shen told a press conference in Taipei.

"In addition to the talented and experienced team of professionals, Google will continue to have access to HTC's IP to support the Pixel smartphone family. This agreement also represents a significant investment by Google in Taiwan as a key innovation and technology hub."

The Taiwanese firm is working on its new flagship phone and will also continue to invest in areas such as virtual reality, artificial intelligence and internet of things, Shen

Apple shares slip on smartwatch reviews

pple shares slipped AWednesday after mixed reviews of its latest smartwatch and amid concerns pre-orders of coming iPhone 8 models were lagging.

Apple Watch Series 3 set to hit the market on Friday boasts the ability to connect directly to telecommunications networks to let users remain connected without a smartphone for phone calls, music and other functions.

During a live demonstration at a media event earlier this month, an Apple executive on a stand-up paddle board in the middle of a lake chatted via the smartwatch with a colleague on stage in San Francisco.

But, reviews posted on Wednesday expressed problems with Apple Watch Series 3 connecting to mobile

networks. Lauren Goode of tech news website The Verge wrote that while trying out the new Apple Watch she experience "notable connectivity issues," with the device trying to link with unknown WiFi hot-spots instead of a telecommunications network.

Standard & Poor's slashes China's debt rating over 'financial risks'

Standard & Poor's slashed China's credit rating yesterday, warning that a prolonged period of debt growth had raised "economic and financial risks"

S&P, which downgraded China's debt from AA-minus to A-plus, is the second major credit ratings agency to slash the Asian giant's rating after Moody's made the same decision in May.

"The downgrade reflects our assessment that a prolonged period of strong credit growth has increased China's economic and financial risks," New York-based S&P said in a statement.

While the credit growth has fuelled China's economic expansion and high asset prices, "we believe it has also



diminished financial stability to some extent", the agency said. Debt-fuelled investment in infrastructure and real estate has underpinned China's growth for years, but Beijing has launched a crackdown amid fears of a potential financial crisis.

"The recent intensification of government efforts to rein

in corporate leverage could stabilise the trend of financial risk in the medium term," S&P said. "However, we foresee that credit growth in the next two to three years will remain at levels that will increase financial risks gradually."

When Moody's downgraded China in May, it was the first time in almost three decades that the country's credit rating was cut. But another major credit ratings agency, Fitch, maintained its A-plus score for China in July.

China posted better-thanexpected second quarter growth as the economy expanded by 6.9 percent, but analysts have warned that the momentum may not last. (AFP)



Gwangju, South Korea

ondemned to death twice, former spy Seo Ok-Ryol spent three decades in prison, most of it in solitary confinement. Now aged 90, the only thing he wants to do before he dies is go home -- to North Korea.

Born in what is now South Korea, where he still has relatives, then a soldier and spy for the North -- where he left a wife and two children -- Seo epitomises the enduring divisions of the peninsula, and the way Koreans have been buffeted by the forces of history and politics.

Seo is stooped and gaunt, walks with a cane, and has a truculent manner, but his mind remains clear

"I've done nothing wrong but loved the fatherland," he said -- adding that for him, that encompasses both North and South.

The South repatriated some 60 former long-term prisoners in 2000, mostly soldiers, guerillas and spies, following a landmark inter-Korean summit.

But Seo was not eligible as he had signed a pledge of loyalty to the South to secure his release from prison, obtaining citizenship as a result.

Now activists are mounting a campaign for him and 17 other ageing ex-inmates still loyal to Pyongyang -- the oldest is 94 -- to be allowed to go home.

Suicide pill

Born on an island in southern Korea, Seo became a communist while a student at Seoul's elite Korea University and joined the North's forces during the Korean War, retreating with them as Americanled United Nations troops advanced.

He joined the North's ruling Workers' Party and was working as a teacher in Pyongyang when he was assigned to an espionage training school in 1961.

"I had to leave without so much as saying goodbye to my wife," he said.

Sent on a mission to the South to try to recruit a senior government official whose brother had defected North, he smuggled himself across the border by swimming the Yeomhwa river and managed to meet his parents and siblings.

But he was cold-shouldered when he tried to give the official a letter from his

"As far as my brother is concerned, he is as good as dead for me. I reported to government authorities that he died during the war," the man told him, refusing the missive.

But he did not turn Seo in, even though -- then as now -- unauthorised contact with North Koreans was punishable by heavy jail terms.

His mission a failure, Seo stayed in the South for a month, constantly on edge trying to hide his code book, until a radio broadcast of a series of numbers secretly ordered him back.

But he arrived late at the pickup point and missed the rescue boat. He tried to swim the rest of the way, only for the current to sweep him back to the bank, where he was overpowered and detained by South Korean marines.

"As a spy, you are supposed to kill yourself by either swallowing a poison capsule or using weapons," said Seo, adding: "There wasn't even enough time to commit suicide".

Death penalty

Seo says he was questioned harshly for months, beaten and deprived of sleep and food, before a military court sentenced him to death for espionage.

He was held in solitary confinement, eating meagre meals of small rice balls and salted radish, and saw several North Korean spies and sympathisers going to the gallows.

In 1963 Seo's death sentence was commuted on the grounds that he was a novice spy who had failed in his mission. But he was again condemned to die in 1973, for trying to convert another inmate to communism.

"My mother passed out in court repeatedly when prosecutors demanded the death penalty and the judges handed down a death sentence," he said in his first interview with international media.

His parents sold their house to finance his legal costs, and secured another commutation, but died while he was still in jail.

Attempts by the South's military dictatorship to re-educate North Korean prisoners reached their peak in the mid 1970s, when activists and former inmates say resisters were often beaten and waterboarded, denied sleep or meals, or thrown into dark and tiny "punishment cells".

But Seo remained firm, even as his left eye, which he later lost, became inflamed.

"They told me to convert, promising that they would then allow me to be treated at a clinic. I refused. Even if it means losing an eye, I must adhere to my beliefs.

"My political ideology is more precious than my own life," he said

Staying alive

After three decades in prison, Seo compromised in 1991 and promised to abide by the South's laws.

Released on parole, he moved to the southern city of Gwangju, close to his birthplace and siblings, but dreamed of returning to his wife and sons in a unified Korea.

Seo remains unyielding in his loyalty to the North, praising it as "egalitarian" society where he could graduate from its top Kim Il Sung University on state subsidies.


In his cramped rented apartment, he echoes Pyongyang's defence of its nuclear and missile programmes as necessary to protect it from the United States, and dismisses President Donald Trump as a "raving madman"

Gwangju is the heartland of South Korea's political Left, and 25 activist groups have launched a petition asking authorities to let Seo -- who was hospitalised for two months earlier this year with heart trouble -- and his fellow refuseniks be repatriated, saying their pledges were forced.

A few years after Seo's release, a Korean woman living in Germany who visited Pyongyang told him that his wife and sons were still alive -- but advised him not to try to contact them for fear of undermining the men's career chances.

Seo -- who has not remarried -- is defiant and cold, but was lost for words when asked what he would tell his wife if he saw her again.

"I would like to say -- thank you for staying alive," he said, controlling his voice. "I've been missing you. I never expected to be parted from you for so long a time." (AFP)







Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte has said

he will have his son killed if drug trafficking allegations against the younger politician are true, and that the police who carry out the hit will be protected from prosecution.

Paolo Duterte, 42, this month appeared before a senate inquiry to deny accusations made by an opposition lawmaker he was a member of a Chinese triad who helped smuggle in a huge shipment of crystal methamphetamine China.

President Duterte did not refer to the allegations specifically but reiterated his statement from last year's election campaign that none of his children were involved in drugs, but they would face the harshest punishment if they were.

"I said before my order was: 'If I have children who are into drugs, kill them so people will not have anything to say'," Duterte said in a speech on Wednesday night before government workers at the presidential palace in Manila.

"So I told Pulong (Paolo's

vou if you are caught. And I will protect the police who kill you, if it is true'," he said.

Duterte, 72, won the presidential elections on a brutal law-and-order platform in which he promised an unprecedented campaign to eradicate illegal drugs in society by killing up to 100,000 traffickers and addicts.

Since he assumed office in the middle of last year, police have reported killing more than 3,800 people in anti-drug operations while thousands of others have been murdered in unexplained circumstances.

n employee of the US Ambassy in Caracas was released early Wednesday after being kidnapped two days earlier by criminals demanding a ransom, police said.

Police said the employee, a Venezuelan national identified as Kerbin Barazarte, 28 -whom they described as a security guard -- had been released unharmed and without payment of a ransom.

They said he was abducted while patrolling in a van near the embassy on Monday night. His captors, who were not identified, had demanded payment of \$30,000 for his release.

A colleague who was with him managed to evade the

The interior ministry announced on Tuesday that the US embassy van had been recovered but that Barazarte was missing.

Police gave no details of the circumstances of his release.

India arrests eight alleged sex tourists for rape

New Delhi

Indian police have arrested eight Arab nationals accused of paying brokers thousands of dollars to arrange sham Islamic "marriages" with underage girls for sex, an officer said.

The five Omani and three Qatari men were detained in the southern city of Hyderabad where police had previously arrested wealthy sex tourists seeking so-called one month wives.

V Satyanarayana, deputy commissioner of police, said eight underage girls had

been removed from hostels across the city. Five brokers, three clerics and four hostel owners involved in the racket were also arrested.

"The Arab men paid between \$4,500 to \$15,500 to brokers who arranged the girls for short term marriages. They took help from qazis (clerics) to perform the rituals," Satyanarayana said.

The accused men, all in their late 60s, entered religious unions with the victims after arriving in Hyderabad last month, the officer added.

"I hadn't actually seen what was happening but when smoke cleared there was a guy on the ground and he'd obviously been burned.'

Malaysia jails Indonesian pirates for foiled hijacking

Kuala Lumpur

Eleven Indonesian pirates have been jailed for 16 years each for attempting to hijack an oil tanker off the coast of Malaysia, an official said vesterday.

The pirates tried to hijack the Thai-flagged tanker, which was carrying seven million ringgit (\$1.7 million) worth of diesel, off the coast of Terengganu state on peninsular Malaysia in early September.

succeeded in They boarding the vessel but Malaysian coastguard

commandos rushed to the vessel's last known location by helicopter after it disappeared off tracking systems.

The commandos descended by rope onto the vessel, and managed to detain the pirates. Fourteen Thai sailors on the tanker were unharmed.

A Malaysian court jailed the ten pirates who seized the tanker, and an 11th who masterminded the failed operation from land, said prosecutor Nurul Farahah Mohamad Suah.

Pilgrims bring boom times for lraqi gem traciers

Najaf

Every time Mohammed Lal-Ghoraifi visits Najaf he returns with another precious stone on his finger. Like for many pilgrims visiting the Iraqi Shiite holy city, buying a gemstone ring is part and parcel of the experience.

Ghoraifi, sporting two weighty rings on the right hand and a third on the left on his latest visit, said they formed only a modest part of his collection.

The collection may have cost him a small fortune, but "the stones have enormous value, whatever the cost", said the 60-year-old pilgrim from Bahrain, wearing a white robe and bedouin scarf.

Ghoraifi's passion for gemstone rings from Najaf, set with agate stones, rubies or turquoise, is shared by most of the pilgrims, primarily from Iran, who visit the city to pray at Imam Ali's shrine.

Customers come from "Saudi Arabia, Iran, Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Pakistan, Lebanon..." said shopkeeper Fayez Abu Ghoneim, 45.

In a city where several family businesses are renowned for the size and cut of their gemstones, pilgrims amble into Abu Ghoneim's shop right after visiting the mausoleum of Prophet Mohamed's son-in-law.

"Many of them buy a ring or a rosary as a souvenir of their pilgrimage for family or friends back home," said Abu Ghoneim.

Competition from abroad

In Najaf's main market, strategically located facing the golden gate of the mausoleum, the Shiite religious calendar controls the life of gemstone traders like Abu Ghoneim.

Major religious ceremonies for which millions pour into Najaf are boom times, especially as prices shoot up with the increase in demand, sending the most prized rings into the thousands of dollars price bracket.

But not all pilgrims are ready to fork out large sums.

Issa Mussa, a trader in his 70s, said business had declined because the market was being flooded with cheap imports from Turkey, China, Thailand and Iran.

"Now I've turned into a ring salesman whereas I used to be a jeweller," said Mussa.

As for Ali Anwar, he is proud to carry on the artisanal tradition of Najaf, which comes at a price.

"Turkish or Thai jewellery is sold by the gram, whereas a Najaf ring is sold individually, for between 40,000 and 50,000 dinars," or about \$35 to \$40 (29 to 33 euros), not including the price of the stone, he said.

Some clients bring in their foreign-manufactured rings for the stones to be recut in Najaf's workshops.

Ímported rings are sold by the armful, at a little over \$10 apiece, during major religious holidays such as the Shiite holy month of Muharram or the annual commemoration of Arbaeen.

Customers and window shoppers pack the alleyways of the market, a maze of shops built in the yellow stone of the Karbala region and with the names printed in blue mosaic.

The market with its Islamicinspired architecture plays host in the off-season mostly to Najaf's religious scholars and their students, both local and non-Iraqi, who are estimated to number 25,000.

Many of them wear one or several rings, most often on the right hand -- a sign of being a Shiite Muslim imitating Imam Ali.

For health and good luck

For pilgrims, the purchase of a Najaf ring is seen by many as the final rite.

As Sheikh Jassem al-Mandalawi, 42, explained to *AFP*, certain rocks bring "pardon, such as onyx from Yemen, while emerald is a portent of success".

A ring with a red agate stone or a sapphire can sell for 100,000 dinars or more, he said.

The "must-have" item is the Najaf quartz, a stone that looks like glass but is solid as rock, and which is found in the desert that encircles the city, explained Mohammed al-Shamarati, 30, a trader in precious stones.

Fadel Abu Abdullah, 50, said the stones he sells also have therapeutic powers.

"Yellow sapphire, for example, is good for the heart rate and can also treat jaundice in newborns," he said, while other stones can keep "bad fortune and evil spirits" at bay.

Shamarati said young single women bought his rings to help them find a husband.

For Abu Abbas, a 40-yearold from a remote area outside Najaf, a ring engraved with a verse from the Koran or one of the 99 names of Allah (God) can also protect the wearer.

"I often travel through desert areas and could be attacked with guns at any time," he said, as he scoured the shops for the right stone. (AFP)

An ancient Chinese fishing community washes ashore



Datang

A long southern China's snaking rivers, an ancient fishing community that once lived and worked exclusively on the water has been finding its way to land.

Wooden fishing boats, wispy nets and bamboo steering poles are typical of the traditions of the "Tanka" -- the term for generations of rural Chinese who have eked out an aquatic existence.

They are not an ethnic minority, but rather so named for their unique customs and egg-shaped vessels (Tanka, or "danjia," is homophonous to the Chinese word for egg).

In Guangdong province's Datang town, home to the country's largest surviving Tanka population, this way of life risks evaporating as younger Tanka seek more prosperous opportunities on dry land

Chen Yongfu, a 45-year-old Datang native, grew up on a fishing boat but now works at a restaurant in town.

"I moved out from the boat long ago, after I graduated from school," Chen said. "I went to work in bigger towns and never returned to this kind of fishing boat life."

He recalled that even weddings used to be held on the boats, jammed with tables and guests, creating "a pretty lively scene."

creating "a pretty lively scene."

"Now," Chen said, "there is no wedding culture for the Tanka anymore as all the younger generations moved onto land to live just like everyone else."

Yet despite government incentives for relocating into homes on land, some older Tanka are holding fast to their ancestral occupation.

Lin Ziqiang, 43, and his wife, surnamed Chen, take their boat out to fish at sunrise every day, coming back to the shore next to a towering bridge at around 1pm.

Later in the early evening, the couple sells their fresh catch at the market by the Beijiang River, making between 3,000 and 4,000 yuan (\$460 and \$610) a month.

It is the only occupation Lin and Chen have ever known. They met in the Tanka boats as children, and Lin's father still joins them sometimes on the water.

Their own children's lives will be different: one 22-year-old son is working in the city, while their 19-year-old is studying at university.

The community today is a collision of these two cultures -- the older fishers and the younger Tanka taking to land.

Rossi ready for pain game

ine-time world champion Valentino Rossi said Thursday he fully expected to feel the pain as he returns to action at the Aragon Grand Prix, just 21 days after suffering a double leg fracture.

The 38-year-old Italian successfully completed a mandatory medical examination at the MotorLand Aragon circuit and was given the go-ahead to take part in free practice on Friday.

"I've worked a lot to have good power and less pain. I think it's important to come back on the bike as quickly as possible and not to spend another race at home," Yamaha rider Rossi told a news conference.

Rossi underwent surgery on September 1, a day after a crash in training, discharging himself from hospital the following day.

He completed 20 laps around the Misano circuit on Tuesday before heading to Aragon for further

Rossi missed the San Marino Grand Prix because of the leg break, but remains fourth in the world championship standings, 42 points behind world champion Marc Marquez of Spain and Italy's Andrea Dovizioso with five rounds to go.

"I need to understand the feeling with the MotoGP bike because it's a bit different. In general I feel quite good, not too much pain and getting back there every day," he added.

Rossi won the Dutch MotoGP in Assen in June to reignite his dream of a 10th world title with the final race of the season finishing on November 12



McEnroe wants new Laver **Cup to spark reform**

ohn McEnroe said Thursday the new Laver Cup pitting Europe's top players against the rest of the world might finally inspire a reform to the format of the Davis Cup.

"I think we're all excited and hopeful that this is going to be successful and force some people to take a good hard look at the rest of the schedule too," the 58-year-old McEnroe told reporters in Prague.

"Davis Cup for example," added the fivetime Davis Cup winner, who captains Team World in the three-day Laver Cup starting on Friday.

"(The Davis Cup) is such a big commitment that they need to make some changes," the seven-time Grand Slam champion said, backing up players claiming the team competition adds more pressure to their already tight calendars.

Andre Ward announced his retirement from boxing yesterday, saying his weary body could no longer put up with the physical demands of the sport.

Ward, 33, is the reigning WBA, IBF and WBO champion and is widely regarded as one of the best pound-forpound boxers in the world.

He leaves the sport after recording back-to-back wins over Russian brawler Sergey Kovalev, hanging up his gloves with a perfect 32-0 record.

"I want to be clear -- I am leaving because my body can no longer put up with the rigors of the sport and therefore my desire to fight is no longer there," Ward said in a statement on his website.

"If I cannot give my family, my team, and the fans everything that I have, then I should no longer be fighting,' he added under the statement, titled "Mission Accomplished."

Ward added that he was leaving the sport at the pinnacle as he had intended.

"As I walk away from the sport of boxing today, I leave at the top of your did it." he said.

In a separate interview with ESPN's First Take program, Ward said the intensive training camps for title fights had taken a steady toll on his body.

"People see what I do fight night. They see under the lights, but they don't see the toil, they don't see the grind, they don't see just the pain, the physical pain that you go through, not just in the fights, but to prepare and to get ready for those battles," he said.

"I felt the physicality of the sport, not just in the ring stuff, but the training and the preparation, start to take its toll on me for the last two or three years, and I bit down and continued to push through, and at this point, it's time, and I know it's time," he added.

Ward, a gold medallist at the 2004 Olympics in Athens, had been a controversial victor over Kovalev last November, winning the Russian's three 175-pound belts with a unanimous decision.


