Pop diva Madonna has defended her fiery, expletive-laden speech at the anti-Trump Womens March in Washington, D.C., saying her words were "taken wildly out of context", a media report said yesterday. At the protest march on Saturday the singer said that at times she has been angry after the election and thought "an awful lot about blowing up the White House", CBS

Later in a statement on Instagram, Madonna said she was trying to express there are two ways to respond to US President Donald Trump's election: with hope or with outrage.

She said she hoped to effect change "with love".

Madonna wrote that she did not promote violence and people should listen to her speech "in its entirety rather than one phrase taken wildly out of context".

Cable news networks broadcasting her speech cut away after Madonna used several expletives. MSNBC later apologised.

Madonna's performance at the Women's March may have caught the attention of the new Trump administration. (IANS)
