Lin Dan battles past Holst

hina's Lin Dan came from behind to keep alive his hopes of a sixth world title yesterday as the 33-year-old saw off Denmark's Emil Holst 19-21, 21-8, 21-16 in a draining 81 minutes.

The decider was close, with the score tied at 16-all before Dan's greater experience helped him win the final five points and gain revenge for a defeat in the Danish Open earlier this year. Seeded seventh, Lin Dan admitted he was relieved to get through to the last 16.

"I am very happy to win and prove myself again at the world championships," he said.

"I have prepared very well and for a long time for this week and although it was a

long match I am now looking forward to tomorrow.'

Holst, the world number 39, was heartbroken at missing out on a chance to claim the most famous of scalps.

"I am very disappointed," admitted the 26-year-old. "I had my chance to beat him, but I was very tired towards the end and he made me make tough decisions."

In the longest match of the championships, Vincent Wong Wing Ki, 12th seed from Hong Kong, survived a scare to overcome Japan's Kanta Tsuneyama.

The Japanese underdog had three match points -- and had to save two of Wong's -- before he went out 23-21, 15-21, 24-26 in a marathon one hour and 24

"I wasn't too nervous when I was facing the three match points because I already prepared myself for a long and tough match," said the winner, who sank to his knees in relief at the end.

"I lost to him recently in the Asian championships so I knew it would be difficult. I am the 12th seed so the pressure is on me."

Defending champion Chen Long and top seed, Son Won Ho, both had easy passages into the last 16. Chen, the Olympic gold medallist and fifth seed, trounced Indonesia's Sony Dwi Kuncoro 21-3, 21-9.

South Korea's Son defeated Hungary's Gergely Krausz 21-13, 21-9. (AFP)

Griezmann handed

France international forward Antoine Griezmann was handed a two-game ban by the Spanish Football Federation yesterday after he was sent off at the weekend for insulting the referee. The 26-year-old was dismissed during Atletico Madrid's 2-2 draw at Gerona on Saturday during the opening weekend of the La Liga season.

He also received a 600-euro (\$700) fine, while Atletico were penalised 700 euros. Both have the right to appeal their

sanctions. Griezmann will miss league matches against Las Palmas on Saturday and Valencia on September 9.

He was shown a straight red card an hour into Saturday's match after insulting the referee for not awarding a penalty in his favour. He later apologised.

Real Madrid centre-back Sergio Ramos has also been handed a one-match ban after he was sent off for two yellow cards in the European and Spanish champions 3-0 win at Deportivo La Coruna. (AFP)

Bahrain are putting together a bid to host the FIVB Men's U21 World Championship in 2019, according to Bahrain Volleyball Association (BVA) Vice-President Jehad Khalfan, who is also the Organising Committee Director General of the ongoing 2017 FIVB Boys' U19 World Championship being played here in Bahrain.

Khalfan said hosting such competitions is part of the BVA's strategy to help boost the level of volleyball amongst the kingdom's up-and coming young players.

"When we thought of organising this under-19 championship, it was a part of our strategy at the BVA Board to help raise the level of our young teams so that they can compete with the top international teams from around the world," Khalfan

"Next year, we have already won the rights to host the Asian U20 Championship here in Bahrain for this same team that is playing right now in the under-19 tournament."

"Then, we are also bidding for the FIVB U21 World Championship in 2019 and are expecting to get a good report from the FIVB for hosting the under-19 competition. We hope that this can raise our chances higher than before to host the under-21 tournament, Khalfan added.

Bahrain has already hosted the FIVB Men's U21 World Championship twice in the past - first in 1987 and then again, 10 years later, in 1997.
