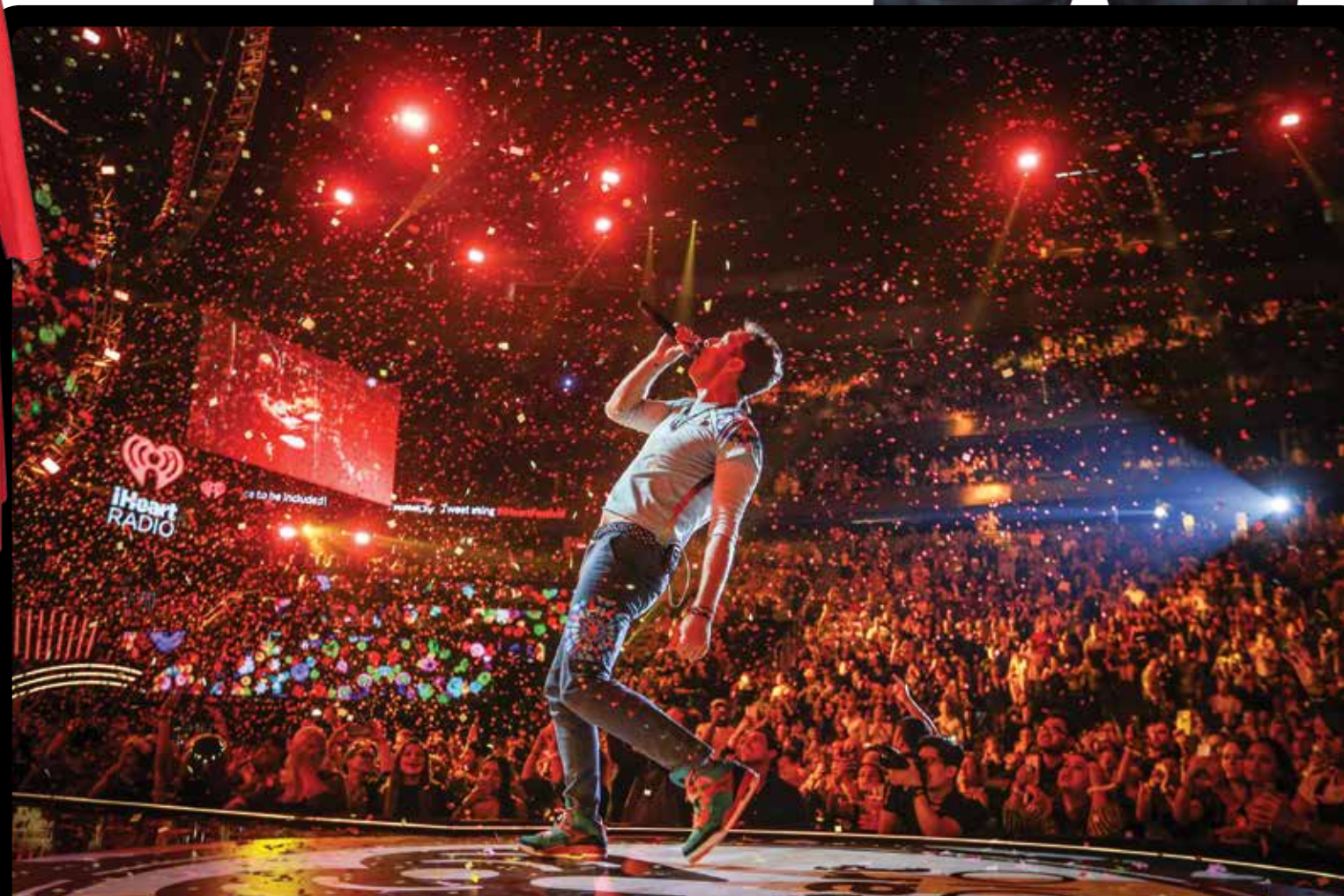


Acting helped Stone to cope with anxiety
