State television quoted a health ministry official as saying a "large number" of the victims were children.

"They used automatic weapons," Minya governor Essam el-Bedawi told state television of the attackers. Bedawi said police were fanning out along the road where the attack took place and had set up checkpoints. State

television reported that the attack killed 28 people, citing the health minister. The latest attack came after jihadists had threatened more strikes against the Copts, who make up about 10 percent of Egypt's 90-million

population.

Bahrain has condemned the terror attack in Egypt in strongest terms. Extending condolences to the families of the victims and wishing the injured a speedy recovery, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs expressed full solidarity with Egypt and offered support in fighting terror. "Bahrain supports Egypt against any threat to its stability and security. Such despicable acts will never succeed," the Foreign Ministry said.

Children are among at least 28 killed in the attack carried out by masked gunmen on a bus carrying Coptic Christians on a visit to a monastery south of the Egyptian capital yesterday.

The interior minister said in a statement that the assailants in three pick-up trucks attacked the bus as it was heading for the Saint Samuel monastery in Minya province, more than 200 kilometres (120 miles) from Cairo, before fleeing.

"They used automatic weapons," Minya governor Essam el-Bedawi told state television of the attackers.

The latest attack came after jihadists had threatened more strikes against the Copts, who make up about 10 percent of Egypt's 90-million population.

The north Minya town of Maghagha saw scenes of anger and despair and Friday.

A group of around 50 men gathered near a church where the funeral of two victims was held, calling for the interior minister to "beat it" and for his ouster.

Nearby, a dozen women dressed in dusty black robes cried and moaned.

In a statement on its spokesman's Facebook page, the Coptic Church called for "measures to be taken to prevent the dangers of those incidents that tarnish Egypt's image".

Al-Azhar, Egypt's top religious authority,

condemned Friday's shooting on the eve of the start of the Muslim holy month of Ramadan.

"The Minya incident is unacceptable to Muslims and Christians and it targets Egypt's stability," Al-Azhar's Grand Imam Ahmed al-Tayeb said in a statement.

Condemnation also poured in from Israel, the Palestine Liberation Organisation, Russia and France, with Paris mayor Anne Hildalgo saying the Eiffel Tower's lights would be turned off on Friday.

"Israel strongly condemns the severe terrorist attack in Egypt and sends the condolences of the Israeli people to President al-Sisi and the Egyptian people," a statement from Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said.

Russian President Vladimir Putin denounced the "barbarism and cruelty of terrorism", and French Foreign Minister Jean-Yves Le Drian tweeted that no one "should fear for their life by practising their faith".

Hidalgo said the Eiffel Tower would go dark after midnight in solidarity with the victims, as also happened on Tuesday after the Manchester Arena attack.

Copts have suffered sectarian attacks for years.

Friday's shooting came after a historic visit to Egypt by Roman Catholic Pope Francis to show solidarity with the country's Christians.

In his late April trip, Francis visited one of the bombed Coptic churches and condemned violence carried out in the name of God.

Trump urges end to violence

Washington

Muslims "a joyful Ramadan," yesterday, urging them to use the holy month to reject violence by Islamist extremists.

"On behalf of the American people, I would like to wish all Muslims a joyful Ramadan," said Trump, who is winding up a first overseas trip as president that included a stop in Saudi Arabia.

"This year, the holiday begins as the world mourns the innocent victims of barbaric terrorist attacks in the United Kingdom and Egypt, acts of depravity that are directly contrary to the spirit of Ramadan," said the US leader.

"Such acts only steel our resolve to defeat the terrorists and their perverted ideology," he said in his message to the world's estimated 1.6 billion Muslims.

Trump said that when he met dozens of leaders of Muslim countries in the Saudi capital Riyadh, he had vowed to stand with them to counter "terrorism and the ideology that fuels it."

The Copts

Egypt's Copts, targeted by gunmen yesterday as they travelled in a bus to a monastery south of Cairo, are the Middle East's largest Christian minority and one of the oldest.

Making up about 10 per cent of Egypt's population of 90 million, the Coptic Orthodox form the largest Christian denomination in the Muslim-majority country.

The Copts trace their history to the dawn of Christianity, when Egypt was integrated into the Roman and later the Byzantine empire.

The word "Copt" comes from the same root as the word for "Egyptian" in ancient Greek.

The community's decline started with the Arab invasions of the 7th century and the progressive Islamisation of the country, which today is largely Sunni Muslim.

Copts, represented in all social classes, are present across the whole country, with the strongest concentration in central and southern Egypt.

Poorly represented in government, Copts complain that they are sidelined from many posts in the justice system, universities and the police.

Egypt's Copts have been the target of several deadly attacks since the 2011 uprising that toppled longtime president Hosni Mubarak.

Shaikh Khalid also tweeted that Khamenei should pay attention to the endless issues his country is facing and leave the Kingdom of Bahrain alone.

Iranian officials often interfere in the internal affairs of GCC states, especially Bahrain.

However, it's not common for the Supreme Leader to appear on screens with such statements.

Road project nearing completion

Work on Malkiya entrance and roads in the vicinity are nearing completion, Roads Projects and Maintenance Director Sayyed Bader Alawi has said. The project is part of the paving of dirt roads programme, aiming to provide infrastructure services as per priorities set for the Northern Governorate.

The Ministry has completed paving 90 per cent of the roads in the block. Work is underway to implement storm water drainage tanks, construct speed humps and put in place traffic signs and ground markings. The project will serve 90 housing units and facilitate movement in Malkiya. Alawi explained that the project comprises of paving a total of 2.6km long roads, implementing ground channels for present and future use.

Several arrested in Diraz released

More than 40 people who were arrested in Diraz on Tuesday were released by the police on Thursday.

This was confirmed by the area's parliamentary representative MP Jalal Kadhim, following his meeting with several MPs with Interior Minister Lieutenant General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdulla Al

Kadhim stated on his official Twitter page that the police directorate has communicated with the families of 45 people arrested from Diraz.

The MP confirmed that the move follows the directives

of the minister to release the individuals arrested in Diraz events on Tuesday.

DT News reported on Wednesday that more than 280 people who participated in an illegal gathering in Diraz were arrested. Among the arrested were convicts and fugitives wanted in terror crimes. Five people were killed and more than 30 policemen were injured in armed clashes that occurred while security forces dispersed the crowd.

Panel rejects ban on publishing photos of accused

parliamentary committee Arecently rejected a proposal to ban publishing photos of the accused ahead of being convicted by the court.

This comes as Foreign Affairs, National Security and Defence Committee in the House of Representatives issued a report rejecting a proposal submitted by MP Khalid Al Shaer to amend the Kingdom's Penal Code,

criminalising publishing pictures of the accused ahead of conviction and subjecting violators to punish not exceeding one year and or fines not exceeding BD100.

Al Shaer, who's a member of the National Institution for Human Rights (NIHR) and the former head council's Human Rights Committee, justified his proposal by quoting the Universal Declaration of Human Rights saying, "Everyone charged with a penal offence has the right to be presumed innocent

until proved guilty according to law in a public trial at which he has had all the guarantees necessary for his defence."

He also quoted Article 20/C of the Kingdom's constitution, which reads, "An accused person shall be presumed innocent until proved guilty in a legal trial in which the necessary guarantees for the exercise of his right of defence in all the stages of investigation and trial are ensured in accordance with the law."

However, the MP's justifications didn't convince the committee which rejected the proposal in a report published yesterday and will be reviewed by the Council of Representatives on Tuesday.

The committee's decision came after discussing the proposal with several parties including the council's Legal and Legislative Affairs Committee and Legal Consultant, in addition to Interior Ministry and NIHR, which earlier expressed its rejection to publishing pictures of the accused ahead of conviction.

Driver gets 18 months jail as crash leaves victim in coma

reckless driver Asentenced to 18 months in prison and BD1000 fine for causing an accident that resulted in the complete paralysis of a female driver.

This was revealed in the final verdict by the Seventh Lower (Traffic) Court against the defendant on Thursday.

Court files showed that the mishap occurred on Al Ghous Highway in Muharraq.

The defendant was overspeeding on the flyover near Shaikh Hamad Bridge. He lost control of the vehicle and rammed into the victim's car, before both vehicles tumbled down the flyover. The driver and a passenger suffered minor injuries, while the victim, who's a newly-wedded university student, remains in a coma to this day. It was revealed by the attorneys that the victim was driving back home at the time of the accident. She suffered serious head injuries and is now bedridden and surviving on life-support, unaware of her surroundings.

The Public Prosecution had earlier accused the driver of reckless driving, injuring the victim and resulting in a 100 percent disability for her, in addition to causing several damages to public and private properties.

Britain has arrested a "large part" of the network behind Manchester's suicide bomb attack, police said yesterday, as the government came under fire for cutting police budgets and election campaigning resumed.

Eight suspects are currently in detention on UK soil in connection with the blast, for which the Islamic State group has claimed responsibility. While police in Libya have detained the father and brother of 22-year-old bomber Salman Abedi.

Mark Rowley, head of Britain's counter-terrorism police, said police had got hold of "a large part of the network" linked to the atrocity in which seven children aged under 18 were among the 22 dead.

"We are very happy we've got our hands around some of the key players that we are concerned about but there's still a little bit more to do," he said.

Police said the eight men ranged in age from 18 to 38, including a 30-year-old arrested in the Moss Side area of Manchester in the early hours of Friday.

"I woke up because I heard the police shouting, they were shouting 'Get down, it's the police, hands on the ground, get on the ground'," said local resident Anita Santonelli, who said she looked out to see around 10 armed police officers.

Opposition Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn said it was the "responsibility" of governments to minimise the

risk of terror by giving police the funding they need after cuts made while Conservative Prime Minister Theresa May served as interior minister.

US 'full responsibility'

Washington's top diplomat Rex Tillerson also visited London yesterday in an expression of solidarity after Britain reacted furiously to leaks of sensitive details about

the investigation to US media.

"We take full responsibility for that and obviously regret that that happened," Tillerson told reporters.

Britain briefly suspended intelligence-sharing with the United States on Thursday over the leaks, but Tillerson said the "special relationship" between the two countries would "withstand this particular unfortunate event".

US President Donald Trump has threatened to prosecute those responsible for the "deeply troubling"

security breach.

Hunting accomplices May was at the G7 summit

in Sicily yesterday where she emphasised the importance of tackling the spread of terror online by urging internet companies to do more to

remove extremist content.

"Make no mistake: the fight is moving from the battlefield to the internet," she told the


Manchester-born Abedi, a university dropout, grew up in a Libyan family that reportedly fled to the northwestern English city to escape the now-fallen regime of Libyan dictator Moamer Kadhafi.

Libyan officials said he and

his brother Hashem belonged to the Islamic State group, while their father Ramadan once belonged to a nowdisbanded militant group with

alleged ties to Al-Qaeda. Libya said it was working closely with Britain to identify possible "terrorist networks" involved, while a British official said that Abedi had been on the intelligence radar before the massacre. (AFP)

Zeid's spokesman Rupert Colville told reporters in Geneva that identifying the air force responsible for civilian deaths is often difficult given the number of countries in the anti-IS coalition and the

Zeid underscored that civilians were now being hit by both sides in the conflict.

"The same civilians who are suffering indiscriminate shelling and summary executions by (IS), are also falling victim to the escalating air strikes", he said in a statement.

The rights office has also received credible information that IS fighters slit the throats of eight people earlier this month who were accused of providing the coalition coordinates to guide strikes, Colville said.

"Scant attention is being paid by the outside world to the appalling predicament of the civilians trapped in (IS-held) areas," Zeid said.

"The secondary explosion triggered a rapid failure of the structure which killed the two ISIS snipers, 101 civilians sheltered in the bottom floors of the structure," said US Air Force Brigadier General Matt Isler, the lead investigator.

Syria dismissed 4,000 judges

Turkey has dismissed over 4,000 judges and prosecutors accused of links to last year's failed coup after an investigation of the judiciary, the Turkish justice minister said Friday.

Ankara blames the attempted overthrow of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan on an Islamic movement led by Muslim preacher Fethullah Gulen.

"Over 4,000 judges and prosecutors have been removed from their posts inside the Turkish judiciary over their links to the Fethullah Terrorist

Organisation," Justice Minister Bekir Bozdag said, referring to the name Turkey gives the Gulen movement.

Gulen, living in selfimposed exile in the United States, vehemently denies the claim that he ordered the coup attempt.

"The investigations have finished. At this moment, there is no judge or prosecutor left that we have not screened," Bozdag said in a speech in Ankara.

He added that there could be further investigations "because of the nature of the organisation", saying: "We are facing a very different kind of terror organisation."

More than 100,000 people

have been sacked or suspended from the public sector including teachers, academics, doctors and members of the armed forces under the state of emergency imposed a few days after the attempted putsch and renewed three times.

Meanwhile, more than 47,000 people have been imprisoned because of suspected links to the movement and the failed putsch.

Ankara claims the Gulen movement had infiltrated the state and the series of purges are necessary to remove the "virus" inside the public sector.

New Taliban attack kills at least 15 soldiers

At least 15 Afghan soldiers were killed when Taliban fighters attacked their base in Kandahar, officials said Friday, in the third major insurgent assault this week on the military in the southern province.

The assault in Shah Wali Kot district late Thursday comes

after hundreds of insurgents stormed other bases in the same area and Maiwand district earlier this week, bringing the death toll among Western-backed troops to around 60.

The attacks highlight a growing insurgent offensive in Kandahar, a Taliban hotbed where security has relatively improved in recent years under the iron grip of police chief and regional strongman General Abdul Raziq.

"The Taliban launched a coordinated assault on an army base last night (Thursday) in Shah Wali Kot," defence ministry spokesman Dawlat Waziri said.

A provincial official who spoke on the condition of anonymity gave a higher death toll of 20, adding that some soldiers were missing after the attack and the Taliban had seized four military humvees.

Tunisia opens trial over 2015 beach massacre



Seifeddine Rezgui killed 38 people in the Sousse attack in June 2015

Tunisian court held its first public hearing yesterday in Athe trial of 26 people in connection with a 2015 jihadist beach massacre that killed dozens of foreign tourists.

A student armed with a Kalashnikov assault rifle and grenades went on a rampage in the Port el-Kantaoui resort near Sousse killing 38 holidaymakers, 30 of them Britons, before being shot dead by police.

It was the second of two deadly attacks on foreigners claimed by the Islamic State group that year, which devastated Tunisia's once-lucrative tourism sector.

Security was unusually tight at the Tunis courthouse for Friday's hearing, which lasted around an hour and a half and was attended by British diplomatic officials.

Six of the defendants are policemen accused of failing to assist a person in danger.

The remainder, all Tunisians, are accused of terrorist offences, murder and "conspiracy against the security of the state", the prosecution said.

Syria army takes control of **Damascus-Palmyra road**

The Syrian army is in full control of the highway The Syrian army is in run control of the first time from Damascus to ancient Palmyra for the first time since 2014 after driving out jihadists, a monitor said yesterday.

Since troops recaptured Palmyra from the Islamic State group in March, the UNESCO World Heritage site had been accessible via Syria's third city Homs, about 150 kilometres (95 miles) to the west.

But after major advances on Thursday night, the army now controls the direct road from the capital to Palmyra, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said.

IS fighters first overran Palmyra in May 2015, and government troops recaptured it 10 months later.

ArcelorMittal, allied with Italian steelmaker Marcegaglia, was up against a consortium made up of the Indian group Jindal South West Steel, Italian specialist steelmaker Arvedi, the Italian state's CDP investment bank and Delfin. the holding company of Italian businessman Leonardo Del Vecchio.







US economy grew much faster than originally reported in the first quarter due to sharp increases in business and consumer spending, the Commerce Department reported

The revised data mean GDP growth in President Donald Trump's first quarter was 1.2 per cent, half a percentage point higher than the first report, which had US economic expansion at its slowest pace in three years.

Businesses fixed investment rose at the fastest pace in five years, which helped put a far rosier on the January-March period.

Analysts had been expecting a revision of only a tenth of a point.

The result was still far slower than the final three months of 2016, when GDP grew 2.1pc but analysts say first quarters have trended low in recent years.

Having risen to office with an agenda of economic revival. Trump has pledged to return the world's largest economy to annual expansion of three percent or more.

The administration is counting on that robust growth -- which economists say may not be realistic -- to help pay for a proposed military buildup and multi-trillion-dollar tax cuts.

The revised GDP estimate, based on a more complete set of a data than was available in April, also reflected a smaller decrease in spending by state and local governments than originally reported. The Commerce Department will revise the data again in June.

have been **Economists** expecting a rebound in the April-June period, but a key indicator for the first month of the second quarter was only fair.

In a separate report, Commerce

Department figures showed a dip in civilian aircraft sales helped depress orders for big-ticket US-manufactured goods in April. marking the first decline in five months

The slowdown was smaller than analysts were expecting but appeared larger due to the steep upward revision in March's numbers.

Total orders for durable goods fell by 0.7pc in April to \$231.2 billion, down from March's robust 2.3pc gain, and the slowest expansion since November.

An analyst consensus forecast had called for a far greater decrease of 1.8pc last month.

The decline was largely driven by 9.2pc drop in orders for civilian aircraft, but there were other signs of weakness.

volatile Excluding the transportation category, durables orders fell 0.4pc, their biggest monthly decline in 10 months.

UPS fined \$247 million for illegal cigarette shipments

US judge ordered the American shipping giant UPS to pay \$247 million to New York state and city governments, for shipments of cigarettes that illegally evaded taxes.

Federal district court Katherine Forrest found UPS "liable in each claim" and therefore the city and state "are entitled to compensatory damages and penalties," according to court documents.

Noting that UPS repeatedly denied any wrongdoing, the judge ordered the company to pay \$166 million to New York state and \$81 million to the city of New York. The two plaintiffs claimed approximately \$872 million in damages.

UPS said it was "extremely disappointed in the court's ruling and imposed penalties and we will vigorously appeal the decision."

The company said the penalties were "excessive and far out of the bounds of constitutional limits, particularly given that the shipments at issue generated around \$1 million in revenue," UPS said in a statement.

New York State Attorney General Eric Schneiderman filed the lawsuit against UPS in February 2015, accusing the company of delivering 683,000 cases of undeclared cigarettes to private individuals and resellers without a license between 2010 and 2014.

That represented a total loss of \$34.4 million in taxes not paid to the city and the state of New York.

But the company said ne authorities "sought the authorities to force UPS to serve in a quasi-law enforcement role which involved monitoring, inspecting and reporting package contents, which is not appropriate for a common carrier." (AFP)

London stocks hit record highs yesterday after the pound took a beating on an opinion poll surprise two weeks before Britain's general election.

The blue-chip FTSE 100 index rose 0.4 per cent to close at 7,547.63 points, having hit a record 7,554.21 points during the afternoon.

Meanwhile, the British pound dived to a month low against the dollar after a Yougov opinion poll put the opposition Labour Party just five points behind the ruling Conservatives before a June 8 general election.

That raised concerns the government's expected poll win might not be as big as expected, which could weaken its hand in Brexit talks. Against the euro, the pound fell to a two month low.

"Today's weakness in the pound has helped push both the FTSE100 and FTSE250 to new record highs," said market analyst Michael Hewson at CMC Markets.

"On the flip side of the coin broader European markets have continued to struggle despite economic data which to all intents and purposes points to a continued improvement in economic activity across the whole of Europe."

Frankfurt finished the day down 0.2pc while Paris ended flat. Meanwhile, the euro slipped below \$1.12 after US first quarter growth was revised sharply higher to 1.2pc.

Oil volatility

Elsewhere, oil prices stablised, after having plunged almost fivepc on Thursday as traders were left disappointed by OPEC's latest output cut deal.

Europe's energy sector shrugged off the market's OPEC-inspired volatility.

Asian equities were broadly weaker, despite another record close for the S&P 500 and Nasdaq on Wall Street that come on the back of upbeat US retail data.

French oil giant Total said yesterday it plans to go ahead and invest in additional production capacity, even while crude prices are falling in the wake of OPEC's latest output decision.

"In raw materials sectors such as ours, the right strategy is to invest counter-cyclically," Total's chief executive Patrick Pouyanne told the group's annual shareholder meeting.

This means that Total will invest in additional capacity even at a time of falling prices so that it can ratchet up output quickly once oil prices start to rise again.

"Our aim... is to decide within the next 18 months on around 10 new projects representing additional production capacity of around 350,000 barrels per day and which will be profitable" with an oil price of \$50 per barrel or more, he said.



o escape the nightmare of life in their besieged hometown near Syria's capital, 13 young girls sought refuge in a fairytale performance of "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs".

The all-girl cast spent months memorising lines from the classic Brothers Grimm fable before performing in front of a packed audience this week in the elementary school in Douma.

"It was really hard, but I memorised all my lines in English," said proud 10-year-old Afnan, who played the story's lead antagonist, the Queen.

'When I act, I forget the war that we're living through in Douma and I feel happy and hopeful," she said.

Afnan's hometown is the de facto capital of the Eastern Ghouta region, the last remaining rebel enclave near Damascus and besieged by government troops since 2012.

Until this month, Eastern Ghouta had been regularly targeted by air strikes and artillery as part of a government offensive chipping away at rebel territory.

The bombardment would often wound or kill children as they headed to street markets, played outside, or walked to

But the skies have been quiet since a landmark deal earlier this month to create four "de-escalation zones" in Syria, where more than 320,000 people have been killed since conflict broke out in 2011.

'Bombing is their normal'

On-stage, her character is consumed by a search for youthful beauty, but Afnan said her own ambitions in life lie elsewhere.

"The lesson from the play is that beauty is in your heart and your soul, not in your looks! I want to be a doctor -- I want to be brave and treat sick people," Afnan said.

With the glittering stage decorations and nervous murmurs of young students, the evening could have almost taken place in any school around the world.

But halfway through the performance, two distant booms shook the room -- rockets that hit the edge of the town, residents later said.

"These children don't know what it's like not to have shelling. For them, bombing is their normal," a female stagehand said.

Earlier this year, international aid group Save the Children warned that a whole generation of war-scarred Syrian children may be "lost to trauma and extreme stress".

For the school's director of extracurricular activities, Yasser al-Assaad, theatre is one of the most effective ways to offset years of traumatic experiences -- for the young students and their mentors alike.

"I get my rehab from a student's smile, and that student draws her psychotherapy from the teacher that came to her

school to motivate her," Assaad said.

It is his third fairytale performance: in 2015, he helped put on "Little Red Riding Hood", and last year his students performed "Beauty and the Beast".

"We want to send a message to all of humanity that Syrian children can create, that we are open to all civilisations," he

'Flowers can grow'

Despite efforts to leave Douma's devastation behind, death seemed to touch the cast of Snow White.

Just days before the final performance, the director's husband was killed by a stray bullet from intra-rebel clashes in the town.

And the play's rosy-cheeked narrator, Dania, recalled how her own school had been bombed just a year and a half ago.

"It was all blood and (the bodies of) girls in front of me," the 11-year-old said.

Even lead actress Rayhana Noaman, who played Snow White, said her favourite part of the story was escaping a tragic

"The witch wanted to kill me, but the charming prince saved me from death!" she said with a shy smile.

Slender Amal al-Kurdi burst onto the stage with an explosive introduction: "A-a-achoo! I'm Sneezy!"

The eight-year-old actress donned a white felt beard and brown shirt like her fellow dwarfs.

"I really liked acting because we learned how to be brave and how not to be afraid to speak in front of an audience," she said.

As his students prepared to raise the curtain, Assaad said the performance was a sign that "flowers can grow amid rocks

Every household in Douma has lost someone and tasted the anguish of pain, war, and siege. Despite this, we can build Syria anew," he said. (AFP)



Encounter Point

t first glance, there isn't anything unusual about Athe Bereaved Families Forum. Fathers, mothers, spouses and siblings gather to talk about their loved ones who have died and the sometimes agonizing process of working through their grief.

But in this support group some members are Israeli, and some are Palestinian, holding hands both literally and figuratively, mourning deaths on opposite sides of a long, bloody conflict.

It isn't often that you see a film about Israelis and Palestinians that can be called hopeful, but Ronit Avni's assured, thoughtful and clear-eyed "Encounter Point" certainly qualifies. Ms. Avni; her co-director, Julia Bacha; and their crew took their cameras to Tel Aviv, Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Hebron and wherever else they could find men and women urging and working toward reconciliation.

One is Robi, whose son was killed by a Palestinian sniper. She sees frightening parallels between Israel's stance today and the language of apartheid in South Africa, where she spent her childhood.

Another is George, who was driving home from the supermarket with his family when Israeli soldiers opened fire on their car. His 12-year-old daughter was killed.

The documentary also includes scenes that illustrate just how difficult reconciliation can be. Ali, a Palestinian pacifist whose brother was killed by an Israeli soldier, is seen visiting his wounded nephew in the hospital and sitting in the cafeteria there, talking to a group of Palestinian civilians who were attacked and injured.

Yousef, who lost his leg in the attack, tells Ali angrily, "With Jews there's no peace." Then a little boy with the group adds firmly, "We don't want peace." But as "Encounter Point" skillfully reassures us, a lot of people on both sides do. 





and landslides looding killed at least 91 people and left another 110 missing in Sri Lanka as the monsoon set yesterday, dumping record rainfalls in many parts of the island, authorities said.

About 20,000 people were also driven out of their homes in the south and western parts of the country, the Disaster Management Centre said.

"The Southwest monsoon began with very intense rain," deputy minister for disaster management Dunesh Gankanda told reporters in Colombo.

"There are some areas where we are unable to reach, but relief operations are under way.

The DMC said the toll rose to 91 dead and another 110 missing as reports came in from areas which had been inaccessible earlier in the day.

Sri Lanka appealed to the international community including the United Nations and neighbouring countries for help as the numbers of dead and missing climbed.

Heavy rains in the southern and western parts of the country have destroyed hundreds of homes and cut off several roads.

"The (foreign) ministry will continue to monitor the flood situation and seek assistance as required in consultation with the Ministry of Disaster Management," the government said in a statement.

It said Colombo had already sounded out the UN and its South Asian neighbours.

The latest flooding was the worst since May 2003 when 250 people were killed and 10,000 homes destroyed after a similarly powerful Southwest monsoon, officials

On Friday the military deployed thousands of troops to reach marooned villagers and the airforce carried out several rescue operations to pluck people from rooftops of flooded homes.

In the early hours of the day a mountainside collapsed on a women's hostel at a tea plantation at Neluwa in the island's south, killing at least seven women, police said.

Evacuation notices were issued to residents along the Kelani river, which flows to the Indian Ocean through the capital Colombo, amid fears that it was about to burst its

"The residents who are living along the Kelani should evacuate to high ground within six hours," the DMC

DMC officials said the monsoon had been expected on Thursday night and ended a prolonged drought that had threatened agriculture as well as hydro power generation.

The rains filled the reservoirs used for hydro power, which had hit rock bottom, raising concerns of power shortage in June.

But officials said most reservoirs were now so full they were in danger of spilling over and causing dangers of flooding to people living downstream. (AFP)

Nepal lets Everest permit dodger off \$22,000 fine

Kathmandu

Nepal said yesterday a South African who tried to climb Mount Everest without a permit can go home without paying a \$22,000 fine, but banned him from mountaineering there for 10 years.

Ryan Sean Davy, 43, was found hiding in a cave near Everest base camp nearly two weeks ago after being spotted on the world's highest mountain without a \$11,000 climbing permit.

The South African, who has no prior mountaineering experience, said he could not

afford the hefty permit fee but wanted to scale Everest and document his experience in a book and film.

"The tourism department has excused me and given me permission to go home," Davy said yesterday.

The head of the tourism department confirmed that Davy had been let off the heavy fine and just given a 10-year ban on climbing mountains in Nepal.

"We have imposed a 10 year ban on him against mountaineering in Nepal. No fine has been imposed," said Dinesh Bhattarai, head of the tourism department.

Vietnam gets US vessel

The US transferred its seventh security vessel this week to Vietnam, the embassy said yesterday, boosting defence ties amid a spike in tensions in the South China Sea. The US coast guard gave its Vietnamese counterpart a high endurance cutter in

a ceremony in Honolulu on Thursday, the embassy in Hanoi said.

The gift comes several days after the US delivered six patrol boats to Vietnam's coast guard to strengthen its "maritime law enforcement" and humanitarian response operations.

Briton jailed for 15 years for planting bomb on train

20-year-old British man Awas sentenced to 15 years in prison yesterday for planting a bomb on a busy London Underground train last year in what he claimed was a Halloween prank.


Student Damon Smith, who has a form of autism and an obsession with weapons, left the bomb in a backpack on a crowded train in October.

The abandoned bag was

spotted by two members of the public who handed it to the driver, who in turn raised the alarm when he saw wires sticking out.

Smith was convicted for possession of an explosive substance with intent and sentenced to 15 years in a young offenders' institution, a type of prison.

The bag was packed with explosives and ball bearings and the device was timed to go off within minutes.



Manila

Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte joked yesterday that soldiers could rape up to three women, as he reassured them of his full support under his newly imposed regional martial law.

Duterte, who often peppers his language with man-on-the-street curses, made the comments in jest during a speech at a military base to lift the spirits of troops tasked with quelling what he says is a fast-growing threat of Islamist terrorism.

"For this martial law and the consequences of martial law and the ramifications of martial law, I and I alone would be responsible. Just do your work. I will handle the rest," he said.

"I will be imprisoned for you. If you rape three (women), I will say that I did it."

Duterte imposed martial law on Tuesday across the southern region of Mindanao in response to militants going on a deadly rampage through a city in the south and flying the black flags of the Islamic State group.

Duterte said the militants were planning to establish a caliphate for IS across all of Mindanao, home to 20 million people, and that martial law was the only way to crush the rebellion.

Duterte, 72, easily won presidential elections last year by presenting himself as in touch with ordinary Filipinos, often using street language full of profanities.

On the election campaign Duterte said he had two mistresses but jokingly reassured taxpayers that he would not cost them much if he was president because he took them to cheap, short-time hotels for sex.

Duterte also attracted controversy when he said he wanted to rape an Australian missionary who had been caught up in a 1989 prison riot in the Philippines and murdered by the inmates.

"There was this Australian lay minister. When they took them out, I saw her face and I thought, 'Son of a whore. What a pity. They raped her, they all lined up. I was mad she was raped but she was so beautiful. I thought, the mayor should have been first'," Duterte said in April last year.

The Australian and American ambassadors to Manila voiced their disapproval at the comments, but Duterte reacted furiously and insisted he had been taken out of context.

On the campaign trail Duterte also jokingly told voters to open funeral parlour businesses because as president he would fill them with corpses from a war on drugs.

Duterte did launch his drug war, and it has claimed thousands of lives. (AFP)

Military flags martial law censorship

Manila

The Philippine military said it would censor the press and social media to protect "national security" across the southern third of the country that is under martial law, and warned violators would be arrested.

President Rodrigo Duterte declared martial law across the southern region of Mindanao on Tuesday to combat what he says is the rising threat of Islamic militancy.

"We'll exercise the right to censure," military spokesman Brigadier General Restituto Padilla told reporters. In a text message, Padilla clarified he meant "censor"

"One, to ensure the safety of lives, second to ensure operational security and ensure the safety of our men in uniform who are fighting, and for other national security considerations," he said.

Padilla specified that social media would be subject to censorship, warning

people against posting material that breached the conditions.

"That's why we are appealing to you now while there's still time, to exercise your common sense, he said.

"If you know that this will harm the public and will not be helpful, better not post it because police might come to your door later on and arrest you."

Prisoner executed in 8th date with death

Washington

Tommy Arthur was executed late Thursday after his eighth, and final, rendezvous with the US state of Alabama's capital punishment system.

The 75-year-old was given a lethal injection after the US Supreme Court allowed the execution to proceed by denying the inmate's stay requests.

Arthur's death ends a legal saga spanning more than three decades in which he became known by some as the Houdini of death row, managing to evade his final sentence seven times. He

was first sentenced to death back in 1983 for a murder he denies committing. Since then, the southern US state has executed 58 people -- an end Arthur had until now dodged.

"Thomas Arthur's protracted attempt to escape justice is finally at an end," Alabama's Attorney General Steve Marshall said in a statement released following the execution.

In last-minute appeals Arthur's lawyers had challenged the injection method to be used on Thursday and asked that a cellphone be put in the death

chamber in the event that something went awry -- requests the nation's highest court denied.

In her dissenting opinion Justice Sonia Sotomayor noted the risks of the lethal injection protocols, writing: "When Thomas Arthur enters the execution chamber tonight, he will leave his constitutional rights at the door."

'Houdini no more'

His case had angered both opponents and supporters of the death sentence: the former saw his endless runins with execution as a form of psychological torture, while those who supported the

sentence see Arthur and his legal team as constantly playing the system to cheat justice.

"He has used every trick in the books to manipulate the courts for over 34 years. He has used every trick possible to manipulate the public into believing he is innocent," she said. "Hopefully Houdini's bag of tricks is empty and he is finally going down. No Houdini no more."

Arthur was found guilty of conspiring with his then-lover Judy Wicker to murder her husband Troy so that she could cash in on his life insurance. She was accused of paying Arthur \$10,000 for the hit.

Arthur had already served five years for the 1977 murder of his sister-in-law and was out of jail on work release at the time. He admitted to the previous killing, which he says was an accident and blames on being drunk. But he has always denied murdering Wicker.

Prior to the execution Troy Wicker's niece had told Alabama media that the execution would give surviving family members closure after decades of pain.

'Changed' Hamilton is now a team player

Monaco

Mercedes boss Toto Wolff believes Lewis Hamilton has changed from being a loner to become a true team player this year – and hopes that it will boost his hopes of taking pole in Monaco.

As the Formula One paddock took advantage of Friday's traditional rest day in Monte Carlo, Mercedes were busy seeking solutions to the set-up problems that saw three-time champion Hamilton fall a second behind championship leader Sebastian Vettel in Thursday afternoon's second practice.

Ferrari were doing the same to ensure their advantage was consolidated with four-time champion Vettel forecasting a major fight-back from the champions.

"I am not counting out Mercedes," he said. "They probably had a problem and I am sure they will be back to full force on Saturday.

"There is plenty of time for them to sort things out. My guess is that it will be very close -- and that the five-tenths we are ahead of Red Bull is not the reality.

"We have been able to put it together on Thursday and I am happy about that. It was a good start into the weekend -now let's let that sink in and see that we keep the tension until Sunday."

Vettel added that he was wary of saying he felt like the favourite.

"We have to get everything right and then we should be in good shape, but here you are not entirely the master of your own fate and so many things can happen in a long race.

"We have seen that many times before, so let's keep the fingers crossed."

Vettel also made clear he believed it was time for Ferrari to win again in Monaco after a 16-year spell since 2001.

"Monaco is always special -- if you

could have h freedom to choose any race on the calendar that you would want win, to it would without doubt Monaco...

"You can ask up and down the paddock and you would get the same answer. I would say it is about time that Ferrari wins again here." **British Formula**

Wolff revealed that the abrupt retirement of 2016 champion German Nico Rosberg has led to a new unity at Mercedes with his replacement Finn Valtteri Bottas working more closely with Hamilton.

"Nico played a fundamental role in our car development," he said. "His head worked like an engineer, but with Valtteri, we have found the best possible substitute.

"The dynamics in the team have changed completely. With Lewis and Nico, we went through different phases, from friendship to rivalry to hostility and arrogance.

"But with Valtteri and Lewis, there is zero controversy."

Wolff said that mutual respect had brought a new mood inside the team.

"I think Lewis changed over the winter. He went from a loner to a true team player." (AFP)

'I'm the favourite? I don't care', says Nadal

Paris

Rafael Nadal insisted yesterday that he didn't care if he was regarded as the favourite for a 10th French Open, even if his rivals begged to differ.

"100% he's the big favourite," said

"100% he's the big favourite," said Austrian star Dominic Thiem, one of the support cast waiting in the wings should the great Spaniard slip up.

"Of course I think he's back at his best this year, and then also he won here nine times. So he knows how it works to win here.

"I think he will try everything to win Le Décima, I think it will be very unique in tennis to win a Grand Slam title ten times. It's pretty crazy, I guess. So 100% he's the one to beat and the big favourite."

Thiem, the 23-year-old world number nine, has already faced Nadal three times on clay this spring -- losing in the finals in Barcelona and Madrid before gaining revenge in the quarterfinals in Rome.

It's that kind of surprising setback -- Nadal's only loss on clay this year -- that has the 30-year-old Spaniard eager to calm the mood.

However, with defending champion Novak Djokovic and world number one Andy Murray both struggling for consistency, it appears to be a thankless task.

"You have to write what you

have to do, but I don't care," said Nadal.

"At the end of the day for me the only important thing is arrive here, play well. If I am playing well, doesn't matter if you believe or you don't believe that I am one of the candidates or not.

Nadal, who was forced to withdraw from last year's Roland Garros with a wrist injury after two rounds, has already reached the magical 10 titles number this year at the claycourt events in Monte Carlo and Barcelona.

Rossi crashed out of the French Grand Prix at Le Mans on the last lap last weekend handing victory to teammate Maverick Vinales and lies third in the world championship



Saving my fingers biggest battle, says **Petra Kvitova**

Petra Kvitova will return to tennis at the French Open having already won her biggest battle -- saving the fingers so badly damaged fighting off a knife-wielding burglar.

Two-time Wimbledon champion Kvitova, 27, a semi-finalist at Roland Garros in 2012, suffered career-threatening injuries to her left playing hand when she tackled an intruder at her home in the eastern Czech town of Prostejov in December.

The terrifying attack left the popular Kvitova fighting to save her hand and her career.

But almost six months on, she is ready to return to the sport, claiming that the nightmare incident has left her with a fresh perspective on life.

'I actually already won my biggest fight. I stayed in life and I have all my fingers," the 6ft

(1.82m) Kvitova told reporters at a sweltering Roland Garros on Friday. She still carries the physical and mental scars. "I didn't sleep well the days after. I don't really have nightmares," she added.

"I was always staring at the guys and looking to see if there

are no strangers there. With time, it's better. But of course I'm more actively watching the people around me."

Kvitova was told by her doctors that she may never play tennis again as a result of the

Sunweb team leader Dumoulin produced some valiant efforts trying to save his pink jersey this week, including a brave solo climb over the formidable Stelvio climb following an embarrassing, unscheduled toilet stop.

Bad leas'

But a day after sparking a spat with Quintana and Nibali, the Dutchman was given payback.

Although he shook hands with Nibali before the start, Italy's two-time winner was quickly involved when Movistar put the pedal to the metal on the descent of the first climb.

It caught Dumoulin cold, and he admitted: "I had bad legs from the start and I made a rookie mistake at the beginning, sitting at the back of the bunch on the downhill.

"Then Bahrain and Movistar split the bunch and I was in the second group and needed, with my bad legs, to go to the maximum to come back, in the middle of the stage. So that was really unnecessary."

Throughout the stage, Dumoulin was in danger of losing the lead after being isolated prior to the final, 15.4 km climb to Piancavallo.

Landa, who had been part of an earlier breakaway that built a lead of nearly 10 minutes, made amends for his runner-up finish to Tejay Van Garderen on Thursday when he attacked Rui Costa 10 km from the summit to solo over the finish line well ahead of his Portuguese rival.

"I was very emotional at the finish because I've had a tough few months, and earier in the Giro when we crashed," said Landa, one of several riders brought down, alongside teammate Geraint Thomas, by a police motorcycle on stage nine.
