Housing Ministry is implementing the third phase of Hawrat Sanad project, which involves the construction of 50 housing units of unit structural area 209 square meters, Assistant Undersecretary for housing projects, Sami Abdullah Bu Hazza said.

It will have two floors having 4 rooms each.

He added that 55 per cent of the construction and 39 pc of the infrastructure works have been completed.

Electricity and sewage networks would be installed immediately upon the completion of the necessary procedures.

303,316 visitors to Bahrain from Aug 20-26

The Assistant Undersecretary for Ports, Search and Follow-up at the General Directorate of Nationality, Passports & Residence (GDNPR) yesterday said 303,316 people entered Bahrain between August 20 and 26.

According to the weekly statistic, 229,212 people arrived from Saudi Arabia and other Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states via King Fahad Causeway, 73,843 through Bahrain International Airport and 261 through seaports.
