Yellow-box To be fined Smart cameras at junctions set to

Beginning Monday, smart cameras installed at traffic junctions will detect yellow-box violations, it was announced yesterday.

The General Directorate of Traffic confirmed in a statement issued yesterday that lawbreakers will be fined BD20-50.

"Traffic violations will be monitored by smart cameras and other advanced technology used at junctions. A special team will also monitor the traffic to plug violations that affect the traffic flow," the directorate said.

"The yellow boxes are crossed lines that the driver shouldn't cross if the way is not clear, as stated in Article 51 of the Traffic Law 23 of 2014. The fine for the yellow-box violation is ranged between BD20 to BD50," it explained further.

"The General Directorate of Traffic had carried out a number of traffic awareness campaigns to introduce the yellow boxes to the public, while expressing thanks to the Gulf Petrochemical Industries Company for its distinguished role in supporting the campaign as part of the active community partnership approach," the directorate said in the statement.

Yellow boxes are located on main and vital junctions in the Kingdom. Many citizens and residents had complained in the past about drivers violating the yellow box rule and hindering the flow of traffic, especially during rush hours.



Special House session to discuss traffic policies

The House of Representatives will discuss the traffic policies of the government, traffic rules and its violations in an extraordinary session to be held on Thursday.

The session will be held in the presence of government institutions, including the General Directorate of Traffic.


The session is expected to find a solution to the public grievances over traffic rules and its implementation mechanisms, and the alleged hefty increase of traffic fines.

On April 3, Prime Minister HRH Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa had ordered the authorities, including the directorate and Works, Municipalities Affairs and

Urban Planning Ministry, to reconsider speed limits on the Kingdom's main roads and highways, affirming that that the ultimate goal of the law is to avoid wrong traffic habits and not to impose fines and contraventions.

The request to hold the discussion in the Parliament was approved during the council's ordinary session held on April 18.

Pope Francis denounced "demagogic populism" yesterday and insisted that violence profanes God's name, in a wide-ranging speech as he visited Egypt to push for tolerance.

"Peace alone... is holy and no act of violence can be perpetrated in the name of God, for it would profane his name," the Catholic pontiff told a Muslim-Christian conference in Cairo.

Francis is in Egypt on a 27-hour visit to push for dialogue with Muslims and support the country's embattled Christian minority that has suffered a series of jihadist attacks.

In his speech, Francis said peace was not helped by "demagogic forms of populism... on the rise".

It is "essential", he added, to block "the flow of money and weapons destined to those who provoke violence". Francis landed in Cairo earlier on Friday and met President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi and Ahmed al-Tayeb, the grand imam of the prestigious Islamic Al-Azhar institution.

He will later visit a church that was bombed in December.


That attack was followed by twin church bombings in April that killed 45 people, in the deadliest assault in recent memory on Egypt's Coptic Christian minority.





DON'T WASTE PAPER!

Paper and paperboard products are a world wide commodity found everywhere including newspapers, magazines, books, stationery, envelopes, shopping bags, drawing, craft & scratch papers, plates and cups, wrapping papers, tissues etc. Paper is a valuable commodity and a versatile material vital to the growth and development of any country and its communication and packaging

One tree makes about 3,077 pieces of A4 paper. It takes 13 trees to make one tonne, or 40,000 pieces of paper. Paper can usually be recycled around six to ten times.

Paper is playing an important role in education, business, industries and recreation. Even after going electronic, the use of paper has not declined tremendously as was envisaged earlier. About one fifth of the contents of household dustbins consist of paper and cardboard, of which almost half is newspapers and magazines. Industrialized nations, with 20% of the world's population, consume around 87% of the world's printing and writing paper. This demand contributed to the loss of much of the forests worldwide.

Paper and allied waste accounts for more than 20% of municipal waste in the country with little quantities collected and sent for recycling and major quantity of mixed paper waste is being collected, transported and disposed in the landfill site each day. The paper waste is not much segregated mainly due to people's old habits, lack of awareness and absence of local recycling facilities.

The solution to the growing paper waste problem is mainly through 'prevention' of reducing or eliminating paper use so that the disposal is prevented in the first place. Printing paper on both sides of the sheet or using the paper sheets from both the sides rather than on one side is a classic example of paper waste prevention, as it can reduce the need for paper by up to 50 percent.

We need to understand that for every ton of paper used for recycling, the estimated savings are:

- 30,000 litres of water.
- 3000 4000 KWh electricity
- 17 trees
- 95% reduction of air pollution.
- 3 cubic yards of landfill space.
- Reduced waste treatment cost.
- 1,400 kg of CO2 gas emission

Recycling of paper is an environmental priority. It can reduce the load on importing and using virgin paper. Recycled paper can make various products. It can be used for newsprint, stationary, tissues, hand towels and toilet paper. Various packaging e.g. egg boxes, cup holders, presentation boxes and wall coverings can be made. It can also be used for CD racks and toys.

Paper is a biodegradable material. This means that when it goes to landfill, as it rots, it produces methane gas, which is a potent greenhouse gas (20 times more potent than carbon dioxide). With the occurrence of 'global warming', the methane and carbon dioxide emissions have to be reduced to avoid its adverse impacts. Forests take large amounts of carbon dioxide out of the atmosphere and store it in wood, in a process called carbon sequestration. Waste prevention and recycling of paper products can leave more trees standing in the forest, continuing to absorb carbon dioxide from the atmosphere.

We need to reduce the paper waste by:

- Reducing printing, using both sides of the paper in photocopy and printing.
 - Use waste paper as scrap paper.
 - Avoid envelopes and reuse if received.
- Segregate paper at source and contact recyclers/ waste collectors to collect based on a weekly collection



Erdogan sees

President Recep Tayyip Erdogan voiced confidence yesterday that he and Donald Trump can open a "new page" in troubled Turkey-US ties when they meet next month, after discord over Syria and last year's failed

The May summit between Erdogan and Trump, their first face-to-face encounter as heads of state, is a chance to mend a relationship between two key NATO allies that was strained by a series of disputes under former president Barack Obama.

"I believe that we will open a new page with Mr Trump in Turkey-US relations," Erdogan told the Atlantic Council Istanbul summit ahead of the May 16 meeting in the United States.

Érdogan made clear he expected a turnaround from Trump on the use of the Syrian Kurdish Peoples' Protection Units (YPG) as the chief US ally on the ground in Syria in the battle against Islamic State (IS) jihadists.

Turkey says the YPG is merely the Syrian branch of the outlawed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK), which has waged an insurgency inside Turkey since 1984 that has claimed tens of thousands of lives.

'We expect our American friends to better understand the threats our country is facing and to show the solidarity that we need," said Erdogan. He said that "concrete support"



given to the YPG by the United States in Syria was "harming the spirit of alliance and partnership"

His comments came after Turkey this week bombed YPG positions in Syria, prompting American accusations the strikes were not properly coordinated.

There have also been three straight days of border clashes between the Turkish army and the YPG, the latest in the Ceylanpinar district of Turkey's southern Sanliurfa province. Eleven "terrorists" were killed, the Turkish army said.

Erdogan warned the YPG that Turkey would "take this kind of measure as long as the threats continue".

Blasting "fools" who he said were trying to form a Kurdish state in northern Syria, he vowed: "We will not


allow the formation of such a state."

The spat over the YPG has so far held up any plan for Turkey and the United States to work together in Syria to prise the jihadist de-facto capital of Raga out of IS hands.

Erdogan said 2,500-5,000 IS fighters were believed to still be in Raqa. A joint operation with the United States but excluding the YPG to take Raqa would be nothing difficult for us. We can do this together," said Erdogan.

But Erdogan praised Trump for showing a "more determined" approach than Obama against the regime of President Bashar al-Assad after the air strikes this month that followed a suspected chemical attack.

"It was late coming but something that we welcomed," he said. "The Assad regime has seen for the first time in six years that there will be no silence to the massacre of innocents.



Turkish army, Kurdish militia in new clashes

New clashes erupted yesterday between the Turkish army and a Syrian Kurdish militia seen as a terror group by Ankara but as a key ally by the United States in the fight against jihadists, the Turkish army said.

Rockets fired from an area in Syria controlled by the Kurdish Peoples' Protection Units (YPG) targeted a Turkish army command post in the Ceylanpinar district of Turkey's southern Sanliurfa province.

The Turkish army fired back, killing 11 "terrorists", it said. There were no reports of casualties on the Turkish side.

This was the third day in a row





Experts from the world's watchdog tasked with destroying chemical weapons are probing reports that toxic arms have been used 45 times in Syria since late last year, the body's chief said yesterday.

Director general Ahmet Uzumcu said there was "a huge list of allegations" of the use of toxic arms reported to the operations hub of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW).

In the "second part of 2016, 30 different incidents, and since the beginning of this year, 15 separate incidents, so 45," he told a reporters, brandishing a list of several pages which he chose to keep confidential.

They include the April 4 sarin gas attack on the rebelheld town of Khan Sheikhun that was reported to have killed 88 people, including 31 children.

"All these allegations are recorded by our experts, who follow this every day from our

operations centre," Uzumcu said.

The OPCW is currently trying to ensure it is safe enough to deploy its factfinding team to the town for further analysis, after Uzumcu said last week that "incontrovertible" test results from OPCW-designated labs on samples taken from victims showed sarin gas or a similar substance had been used.

The government of Syrian

President Bashar al-Assad has "already stated that they would support this mission, actually they have invited us to go via Damascus," he said.

The problem is that this area is controlled by different armed opposition groups, so we need to strike some deals with them to ensure a temporary ceasefire, which we understand the Syrian government is willing to do," he added. (AFP)

Afghan Taliban announce start of 'spring offensive'

The Afghan Lauvan launched their "spring offensive" yesterday, heralding fresh fighting in the drawn-out conflict as embattled security forces struggle to recover from a devastating attack on a military base one week ago.

Operation Mansouri -- named after the group's former leader, killed in a US drone strike in 2016 -- will target foreign forces with "conventional attacks, guerrilla warfare, complex martyrdom attacks, insider attacks", an insurgent statement said.

"The enemy will be targeted, harassed, killed or captured until they abandon their last posts," it continued.

The annual spring offensive normally marks the start of the "fighting season", though this winter the Taliban continued to battle government forces, most successfully in last week's attack on the military base outside the northern city of

Mazar-i-Sharif.

The massacre last Friday saw insurgents armed with guns and suicide bombs slaughter at least 135 young recruits, according to the official toll, though multiple sources have claimed it is much higher.

The assault is believed to be the deadliest by the Taliban on an Afghan military target since they were driven from

power in 2001, and fuelled fears of insider attacks -- when Afghan soldiers and police turn their guns on colleagues or on international troops.

The attackers carried passes to the base, sources said, and were dressed in Afghan army uniforms. The defence minister and army chief resigned, and at least 35 soldiers have been arrested over the incident.

British inventor Richard Browning lifted off from the shore of Vancouver Harbor on Thursday in a personal flight suit that inspired references to comic superhero 'Iron Man.'

Using thrusters attached to his arms and back, Browning flew in a circle and hovered a short distance from the ground, captivating attendees at a prestigious TED Conference.

The personal flight suit is capable of propelling wearers much higher and faster, according to its creators.

"The hypothesis was that

the human mind and body, properly augmented, could achieve some pretty cool stuff," the extreme athlete and engineer said at the gathering a short time earlier.

Browning told experimenting with various numbers and arrays of essentially miniature jet engines on his limbs.

Along the way, he said, there were more than a few crashes to the ground.

"The whole journey was about trying and failing, and learning from that, Browning said.

The first reasonably stable,

six-second flight with the gear inspired his team to

His startup, Gravity, formally debuted about a month ago with an earlyversion suit called Daedalus.

A 55-second video clip of the suit in action has logged more than a million views since being posted on YouTube about three weeks

Browning said he is already getting interest from investors and some in the British military who told him they had given up on the flight feature of an 'Iron Man' suit until seeing his humanpropulsion gear.

"I don't think anyone is going to be going down to Wal-Mart with it or taking anybody to school for quite a while, but the team at Gravity is moving it along,' Browning said.

He dreams of a flight suit that one day will allow its wearer to launch from a beach, soar along the coast and then perhaps hop into a helicopter in the air to continue their journey.

Browning has already seen the early-version flight suit compared to 'Iron Man' armour worn by Marvel Comics character Tony Stark, but stressed that his goal is firmly rooted in the real world.

He also described the project as part of a personal journey, inspired by an engineer father with a love for flying machines, but who died when he was just a teenager. (AFP)



Us growth slowed to its lowest level growth slowed in three years in the first quarter as consumer spending and government expenditures tumbled to their lowest levels in years, the Commerce Department reported yesterday.

Preliminary data showed GDP increased only 0.7 per cent in the first three months of the year, down sharply from the 2.1pc expansion seen in the fourth quarter of 2016.

Though only slightly below the 0.8pc increase in the same quarter of last year, the pace fell well below analyst expectations for 1.1pc GDP growth.

It also marked a somber start to the presidency of Donald Trump, who hits his first 100 days in office Saturday and rose to power on a message of nationalist economic revival. Trump has taken credit for increased consumer confidence, growing employment and record gains on the stock market in recent months.

Trump also is basing planned multi-trillion-dollar tax cuts unveiled this week on an anticipated return to three percent annual growth, which the White

House says will generate the revenues needed to pay for the tax cuts.

While economists debate the likelihood of a return to that level of growth, the first quarter numbers showed a tepid pace, although the preliminary growth estimates are subject to revision.

The report was replete with records.

Consumer spending fell to its lowest level in nearly eight years, adding only 0.3pc, with spending on services their lowest in four years and durable goods orders their lowest since

Defence contracted by four percent, its lowest pace in nearly three years, helping drive down overall government expenditures by 1.7pc, the lowest quarterly result in almost four years.

Business investments increased 4.3pc for the quarter but this down from the brisk 9.4pc in the prior quarter.

A recovery in oil prices helped sustain growth in this category, with mining, exploration, shafts and wells skyrocketing to 449pc, an all-time record, up from 23.7pc in the prior quarter. (AFP)

ride-hailing leader Didi Chuxing said yesterday it had raised more than \$5.5 billion in new financing amid reports that the fund injection makes it the most valuable start-up in Asia with a worth over \$50bn.

Beijing based-Didi, which claims nearly 90 per cent of China's ride-hailing market after buying rival Uber's assets in the country last year, said it would use the money to "support its global strategy and continued investments in AI-based technologies."

Didi's valuation makes it tops in Asia and number

The fresh funding moves

Didi past Chinese smartphone maker Xiaomi, which was at \$46bn.

The Wall Street Journal's

rankings were based on companies "that are privately held, have raised money in the past four years and have at least one venture-capital firm as an investor."

Didi's statement did not give details on who provided the fresh funds, but Bloomberg News, quoting people familiar with the situation, said the investors include Japan's SoftBank Group, China Merchants Bank, and an arm of China's Bank of Communications.

Didi already lists among its investors Apple and Chinese internet titans Alibaba and Tencent. (AFP)



London

Global stock markets went soft yesterday, weighed down by disappointing American and British growth figures, with eurozone inflation data offering a bright spot on the macro-economic front.

Wall Street was a touch weaker after data showed that the US economy expanded by just 0.7 per cent in the first quarter, well below analysts' expectations and a three-year low. The mood in New York was further soured by political concerns as the US government tries to avoid a shutdown, said analysts at Charles Schwab, also pointing to tension over North Korea.

The US House of Representatives on Friday passed a one-week stopgap funding bill, which will now go to the Senate.

But strong corporate results, including from Amazon and ExxonMobil, kept a floor under the market.

"Markets were left a little unsure which way to turn after an upturn in corporate profits was met with data showing decelerating economic growth," said Jasper Lawler, an analyst with London Capital Group.

London's benchmark FTSE

100 index closed lower after data showed a slackening in Britain's crucial service sector had slowed GDP growth to 0.3pc -- an early sign that the country's post-Brexit vote boom may be coming to an end.

"With high inflation and slumping consumer demand, there is much to worry about with the UK economy at present," said David Lamb, head of dealing at FEXCO Corporate Payments.

Banking giant Barclays weighed down on the index following first-quarter results, which showed its investment banking operation "fell short of expectations due to weaker than expected fixed income trading", according to Helal Miah at The Share Centre.

Mixed eurozone data

Prospects for British exporters were also hit by the surging pound, which climbed to its highest since late September on Friday, approaching \$1.30.

Traders are betting on a thumping victory for Theresa May in the upcoming general election, which they believe will help her in Brexit negotiations.

France also posted disappointing GDP growth of 0.3pc, but Paris's CAC index

Germany to scrap '2-person' cockpit rule

Frankfurt am Main

German airlines will no longer require two people to be in the cockpit at all times, an industry group said yesterday, abandoning a rule introduced after a deadly crash in 2015. "An evaluation has shown that the two-person rule does not increase security, rather other risks to air security arise," the statement from the German Aviation Association (BDL) said.

The requirement to have two people in the cockpit at



all times was introduced after Germanwings copilot Andreas Lubitz deliberately flew a passenger plane into a French mountainside, killing 144 passengers and six crew in March 2015.

Black box recordings

showed that Lubitz, who had been treated for mental health problems in the months before the disaster, locked himself into the cockpit alone.

The BDL's decision follows an easing of the two-person rule at the EU level by the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) in August last year.

Instead of a blanket requirement, the EASA recommended using the measure only on a case-by-case basis.

Sydney

A toddler born with three legs --because body parts of a twin had grown inside her -- was returning home to Bangladesh yesterday after complex and rare surgery in Australia enabled her to walk and run, her doctor said.

Three-year-old Choity Khatun was given little prospect of survival until she was brought to Melbourne last year by Australian charity Children First Foundation.

A team of surgeons spent several months mapping out a procedure to reconstruct her anatomy.

"A twin had grown out of her pelvis but the twin was only part of a twin... The problem is there's no rulebook for this because she's a very unique individual so you have to try and work out what was where," Chris Kimber, the paediatric surgery head at Monash Children's Hospital, said.

"When Choity arrived in Australia, she was very malnourished, she couldn't walk properly at all," said

Kimber.

Working in consultation with experts from Europe and the United States, the surgeons planned a procedure that involved removing the remains of the third leg -- part of which was earlier cut off in Bangladesh -- as well as taking out, disconnecting and reconnecting other organs.

Choity's condition meant that body parts from a twin developed in her perineum -- the area between the anus and the vulva.

Surgeons spent countless hours examining her under anaesthetic and found she had two rectums, anuses, vaginas and uteruses. She was also incontinent.

'She's pretty good'

The surgery, which Kimber said was "extremely rare", was finally carried out in November and involved eight doctors who specialise in genital and pelvic reconstructions working on the girl for eight hours.

"We spent three or four months

thinking about it, presenting it to other doctors, getting ideas from around the world, and then based on lots of world opinion, we were able to come up with something that clearly works," he added.

A key triumph for the surgeons, including Kimber, was that they were able to help her become continent, which Kimber said was "extraordinary".

"She's pretty good," he added.

The little girl is also partially blind, but an ophthalmologist's examination at the hospital found her sight could not be improved.

But she has sufficient sight to now walk and run like other children, to the delight of her 22-year-old mother.

"Everything is good now... she can play like every baby," Khatun told broadcaster Channel Nine on Thursday, adding that she was looking forward to returning to her village outside Dhaka with her daughter and being reunited with her husband. (AFP)

Murad (Hussein Al-Sous) is the group's sole skeptic; his abusive father has turned him into a young cynic who declares, "People like us don't become pilots.

They're not the only ones struggling in society. Nour (Jordan television presenter Rana Sultan) is a real pilot. Beautiful and independent, she's a modern woman with an old-fashioned father who would rather see her barefoot and pregnant than pursuing a career high up in the skies. (washingtontimes.com)







British police warned yesterday they were facing an "increased level of terrorist activity", the day after a knifeman was arrested near parliament and a woman was shot in a separate police raid.

Just weeks after the attack on the Houses of Parliament that left five people dead and scores injured, London is once again on high alert as Britain prepares for a snap election on June 8.

"Yesterday was extraordinary day London," Deputy Assistant Commissioner Neil Basu said, after confirming six arrests overnight.

"I wanted to reassure the public that this increased level of terrorist activity is being matched by our action... We are making arrests on a near daily basis.

À 27-year-old man remains in custody after being arrested near parliament on suspicion of terrorism offences and possession of knives, in what police confirmed had been an ongoing investigation.

Just hours later, armed police raided a property in north London as part of an unrelated counter-terrorism investigation, firing CS gas as they entered and shooting a woman in her 20s.

Six people have been arrested as part of the probe, while the woman -- who is also suspected of involvement -- remains in a serious but stable condition in hospital.

"Due to these arrests that have been made yesterday, in both cases I believe we have contained the threats they posed," Basu said. (AFP)

Seoul rejects US demand to pay for missile system

Seoul yesterday brushed aside US President Donald Trump's suggestion it should pay for a \$1 billion missile defence system the two allies are installing in South Korea to guard against threats from the North.

The first parts of the Terminal High Altitude Area Defense (THAAD) system have already been delivered to a former golf course in the South -- infuriating China tensions over Pyongyang's nuclear and missile programmes.

Top US officials have said THAAD will be operational within days.

"I informed South Korea it would be appropriate if they paid. It's a billion-dollar system," Trump was quoted as saying by the Reuters news agency. "It's phenomenal, shoots missiles right out of

Macedonia parliament violence injures 100

The chaos in Skopje broke out on Thursday evening, with dozens of demonstrators -- including a group of masked men -breaking a police cordon and entering parliament waving Macedonian flags, shouting and singing the national

Footage from the scene showed chairs being thrown as fistfights broke out in the parliamentary press room, while Zoran Zaev, leader of the opposition Social Democrats (SDSM), had blood running down his face and shirt.

One female SDSM deputy is seen yanked by the hair while other women climb down from a balcony in a bid to escape.

An interior ministry statement on said 102 people had been treated at city hospitals, including MPs and police officers.

Berlin terror cell nabbed after Italy arrests

Italian police said yesterday they had helped their German counterparts neutralise a Berlin-based Islamist terror cell with links to Christmas market attack suspect Anis Amri.

The dismantling of the 11-strong group was completed at the end of January after nearly two months of investigations triggered by two of them being picked up at the Italian port of Ancona on December 4, 2016, according to the

anti-terrorism wing of Italy's state police force.

Italian authorities believe Congolese national Lutumba Nkanga, 26, and Moroccan Soufiane Amri, 22, were planning to travel to Istanbul en route to joining Islamic State in Iraq or Syria.

Their departure delayed by a Greek ferry strike and it was during the delay that they were subject to an identity check which revealed that Germany had banned Soufiane Amri from leaving the country.

Human DNA uncovered in caves without bones

Washington

nternational scientists have uncovered prehistoric human DNA from caves without bones, an advance that could shed new light on human history and evolution.

The study published in the journal Science is based on 85 samples from sediments dating to the Pleistocene, a period that extended from 550,000 years ago until 14,000 year before the modern era.

The samples came from eight caves in Belgium, Croatia, France, Russia and Spain.

These archeological sites are already well known to have been occupied by long-lost

"This work represents

creator Ridley Scott says he's convinced that there are aliens out there -- and one day they could come for us.

The veteran director said on Thursday he believed in higher beings as he prepared to release the sixth episode of the sci-fi horror series, "Alien: Covenant", next month.

"I believe in superior beings. I think it is certainly likely. An expert I was talking to at NASA said to me, 'Have you ever looked in the sky at night? You mean to tell me we are it?' That's ridiculous.

The experts have now put a number on it having assessed what is out there. They say that there are between 100 and 200 entities that could be having a similar evolution to us right now.

"So when you see a big thing in the sky, run for it," he joked.

"Because they are a lot smarter than we are, and if you are stupid enough to challenge them you will be taken out in three seconds."

'Alien: Covenant", the second of the prequel films, is set in 2104 on board a spaceship carrying 2,000 cryogenically frozen colonists to a distant planet when they chance upon an uncharted paradise.

But their voyage soon turns into a gory nightmare that makes "Alien"s original "chestbuster" scene seem tame in comparison.

'Hideous beyond belief'

The "neomorph" aliens in the new film are based on the goblin shark "which has a jaw which hinges in two ways. It's scary, hideous beyond belief actually," Scott said.

The 79-year-old British-born director who was also the brains behind "Blade Runner" -- said he never tired of scaring people out of their skins.

'When I did the first 'Alien' I had to get a sense of responsibility because the reaction to the kitchen ("chestbuster") scene with John Hurt was beyond anything I expected and it was not good," he said.

"But the film was very successful because people are perverse.'

He said he could not believe the terror he had created when he went to see people watching the film.

"Everybody was half underneath the seat watching by the time you get to the kitchen scene. There was a woman underneath the seat with her husband holding her. I said this is not healthy.'

Scott, however, claimed that he was unshockable.

"Nothing scares me. I have a 9mm (pistol)," he said.

"If there is a problem I tend to close down into calm. When you walk in in the morning on a film and 600 people turn and all look at you, that is scary," he said.

"Alien: Covenant" has a religious subtext, the director insisted.

He said he was "agnostic", but this did not stop him making a film about Moses, "Exodus: Gods and Kings", "Either religion is the greatest

trick played on mankind. Or it is not, and that poses some great questions, and this film is a great context for those," he said. The film sees Irish actor Michael


Fassbender return to his role as the cerebral android David which he played in the last prequel "Prometheus" in 2012.

But this time with a twist. Scott uses him to pose questions about the nature of humans.

> "There is an artist in there somewhere," Fassbender said in earlier an interview. 'There's definitely an ego in there... So again these are very human things. . We

all want to leave something behind after we go. There's a legacy of some sort that we've left behind," he added.

Scott, who was knighted in 2003, is about to make a film about the Battle of Britain during World War II, when the Royal Air Force fought off the German Luftwaffe. (AFP)

Kuwait beat Bahrain by 128 runs

Bahrain were defeated by 128 runs against Kuwait in its fourth match and the fifth round of round-robin matches yesterday in the International Cricket Council (ICC) 2017 World Cricket League (WCL) Asia Region Division One in Chiang Mai, Thailand.

Batting first, Kuwait were dismissed for 228 in 44.5 overs with the main scorers being Ali Zaheer (78 off 72 deliveries, 6x4, 4x6), opener Mohammed Asghar (37 off 24, 3x4, 3x6) and man of the match Mohammed Amin (34 off 33, 3x4, 1x6).

Highlights of the Kuwaiti innings were the 56-run sixth wicket partnership between Ali Zaheer and Imran Ali (13 off 25) which boosted the total from 162 for five to 218 for six in the 41st overs, while opener and man of the match Mohammed Asghar and Usman Waheed (17 off

48, 2x4) earlier put on 50 runs for the second wicket.

Bahrain's wickets were taken by Babar Ali (three for 38) in 10 overs, Tahir Dar (two for 30) in 10, Mohammed Iqbal Noor (two for 37) in 9.5, Janaka Chaturanga (one for 35) in 8 and Jabbar Amjad (one for 42) in 4.

In reply, Bahrain were dismissed for a disappointing 100 in 33.1 overs as they never really got started in pursuit of the challenging total, with the top scorer being Mohammed Sameer (47 off 66, 5x4, 2x6), with the only other double figure scores coming from Gamini Arachchige (15 off 47, 1x4) and Janaka Chaturanga (10 off 3, 1x4, 1x6).

The only significant partnership was the third wicket worth 45 runs by Mohammed Sameer and Janaka Chaturanga as they moved the score along from 14 for two to 59 for three after 17.3 overs

Kuwait's wickets were claimed by Mohammed Asghar (four for 13) in 8, Haroon Shahid (three for 25) in 10, Sajid Manzil (two for 15) in 4 and Bastaki Fahad (one for none) off one delivery.

Bahrain prepared for this championship with five friendly matches in Sri Lanka, winning three and losing two, getting aclimatised and getting used to turf wickets.

Under head coach Rexie Arunvasagam and manager Syed Rizwan Shah, the squad comprises the captain, Azeem Ul Haq, Tahir Dar, Babar Ali, Junaid Aziz, Gamini Arachchige, Imran Ali Butt, Janaka Chaturanga, Mohammed Rafeh, Aamar Shahzad, Mohammed Sameer, Mohammed Iqbal, Awad Khan, Bilal Mansoor and Jabbar Amjad.
