◆ The Philippines received 600,000 vaccine doses from China Sunday, kickstarting the country's inoculation drive despite concerns over the Sinovac jab's

effectiveness. Top government officials and health workers will be the first on Monday to receive the Chinese-made vaccine -- called CoronaVac -- just days after the drug regulator approved receives first it for emergency use. Around 525,000 doses of the AstraZeneca jab were also due to arrive Monday as part of the COVAX global inoculation programme and will also be

urging countries to use "any means necessary" to reverse a Feb. 1 coup that ousted the nation's elected leader Aung San

Suu Kyi. "I decided to fight back as long as I can," Kyaw Moe Tun told Reuters on Saturday, Myanmar state television announced on Saturday that Kyaw Moe Tun had been fired for betraying the country. However, the United Nations does not officially recognise the junta as Myanmar's new government as it has received no official notification of any change, said a U.N. official, speaking on condition of anonymity, and so Kyaw Moe Tun remains Myanmar's U.N. ambassador, for now. "We have not received any communication concerning changes to the representation of Myanmar at the United Nations in New York," U.N. spokesman Stephane Dujarric said.
