Defendant to stay behind bars for one year and fined BD200

The court also ordered her mobile phones to be confiscated and ruled that she be deported permanently once she serves her sentence.

The Minor Criminal Court delivered its ruling in person after examining footage in which the defendant appeared in suggestive poses that prosecutors said woman has been jailed went against public morals and the country's customs.
