Hazlewood stars as Australia ease past India to win 2nd T20

Josh Hazlewood’s 3-13 set up Mitchell Marsh’s brisk 46, securing a four-wicket victory

● India bowled out for 125

Mitchell Marsh slammed a brisk 46 after Josh Hazlewood took 3-13 as Australia cruised past India by four wickets to win the second Twenty20 international on Friday.

Sent in at a packed Melbourne Cricket Ground, India slumped to 125 all out off 18.4 overs with an electric spell by Hazlewood doing the early damage.

Only Abhishek Sharma (68) and Harshit Rana (35) made it into double figures.

Marsh led the reply with 46 off 26 deliveries, putting on 51 with Travis Head (28 off 15) for the opening wicket, with the hosts winning with 40 balls remaining.

“It was a good toss to win, bit of moisture and Josh is a great bowler when there’s something in it,” said skipper Marsh. “We wanted to take a couple of wickets early.

“I was a bit nervous but got going in the end,” he added of his batting. “Head took the pressure off. Should be a good three games to come.”

Thomas Frank insists he won’t take risks over Cristian Romero’s fitness as the Tottenham captain prepares to return against Chelsea on Saturday.

Romero has not featured for Tottenham since the start of October due to an adductor issue, but Frank is set to involve the Argentine for Chelsea’s visit to north London.

The centre-back also returned for the corresponding fixture last December, only to

suffer another injury and miss three months as a result.

Frank is confident Romero is fully ready to feature, but will take the blame if there is another injury issue for the 27-year-

old.

“The positive news is that Romero, Destiny (Udogie) and Wilson (Odober) are available for selection for Saturday,” Frank told reporters on Friday.

“I am very aware of trying to be able to take the best possible decisions. Of course in the end I will get a lot of information from medical staff, performance staff, but in the end it is always on me.

“If a player breaks down, it is on me. It is not on the medical staff, not on the performance staff, always me.

Mikel Arteta warned that player welfare should be the primary concern for football’s rule-makers as Arsenal’s fixture pile-up threatens to put his team at risk.

Arteta’s side are set to face Crystal Palace in the League Cup quarter-finals on December 16.

But that would mean Palace facing three matches in just five days and the FA Cup holders are hopeful of moving their match at the Emirates Stadium to the following week.

It is understood Arsenal’s preferred option is for the last-eight clash to remain on December 16 to avoid exacerbating the hectic Christmas schedule.

Arsenal are currently in a run of seven matches in just 22

days, with the Premier League leaders heading to Burnley on Saturday before returning to Champions League action at Slavia Prague on Tuesday.

“Every decision that we make in terms of a fixture has to be guided on two main things; players’ welfare, and then supporters, and that is it, and the rest has to come very, very far away from that. And we should never forget that principle,” Arteta told reporters on Friday.
