Job integrity

Labour Ministry rechecks unemployment benefit lists to safeguard applicants

Jobseekers' rights are being reinforced on Bahrain's National Employment Platform through extra checks on vacancies and a re-examination of unemployment benefit lists, His Excellency Yusuf Khalaf, Acting Labour Minister, has told MPs.

Replying to a question from MP Mohammed Salman Al Ahmed, H.E. Khalaf said the Labour Ministry had put in place a range of regulatory and service steps aimed at protecting people looking for work.

These include a fresh review of those who receive unemployment allowance and compensation, and an online service on the National Employment Platform for complaints and enquiries about vacancies, interviews, attendance dates, training and unemployment insurance, so each stage of recruitment passes through a clear, recorded channel.

Complaints

Responding to complaints about clashing accounts from employers and jobseekers, H.E. Khalaf said the ministry does not accept information sent directly by employers as fact.

No outcome is entered into the system, he added, until a ministry employee has checked it and is satisfied that the procedure has been followed in the proper way, so jobseekers are not harmed by wrong or incomplete statements.

He said the ministry had also formed a grievance committee, with online slots to file and follow up cases.

The panel looks at practical and personal grounds raised by jobseekers as part of the ongo-

ing review of those who receive unemployment allowance and compensation.

Record

According to the ministry, a jobseeker's record stays active in the employment and training system and is counted within unemployment figures even if benefit payments stop for any reason.

A person is only removed from the jobseeker lists once they are registered with the Social Insurance Organisation as an insured employee or as the holder of a commercial registration.

H.E. Khalaf stressed that the ministry does not pick candidates or phone them to offer jobs.

Instead, he said, jobseekers choose posts that match their qualifications through the National Employment Platform using the eKey.

Details

They can see full details of each vacancy, including salary, job title, qualification, specialisation, workplace location, working hours, full-time or part-

perience and have not applied for enough vacancies.

If they still fail to put themselves forward for suitable roles, they are called in for a guidance meeting with an employment specialist, who explains how the application process works.

To reduce disputes between jobseekers and employers, the ministry has decided that all interview invitations are documented through the government notifications system using four channels: SMS text message, e-mail, the jobseeker's account on the platform and the general government notifications platform.

Result

Interviews are held at the ministry's headquarters in the presence of a named employee, who records what takes place and logs the result.

The ministry said each jobseeker's account now carries a record of the vacancies they have nominated themselves for and the outcomes of interviews as entered by the employer.

The system requires the employer to state the reasons for

any rejection, whether the decision came from their side or from the jobseeker.

Outcome

Both parties can see the approved outcome once it has been checked by a ministry employee, giving jobseekers the chance to file an appeal or ask for any entry they believe to be wrong to be reviewed.

The ministry added that it will go on working with the Council of Representatives to develop employment services and protect jobseekers' rights in line with current laws and procedures.

H.E. Khalaf also said that statements from employers after interviews held outside the ministry building, for example claims that a jobseeker did not answer phone calls, are not taken on trust.

In such cases, the ministry sends an official notice asking the jobseeker to attend its offices, where both sides are brought together in the presence of an employment specialist to keep the process transparent and balanced.

A powerful community movement promoting diabetes awareness

Shura supports tougher law on advertising with BD20,000 fines

Collateral freedom

New secured transactions law opens extra credit channel for SMEs

Fines of up to BD20,000 and the prospect of private firms tearing down unlawful billboards moved a step closer yesterday after the Shura Council approved in full an overhaul of Bahrain's advertising law, with a final vote due at its next sitting.

Members backed a draft law amending Decree-Law No. 14 of 1973 on the Regulation of Advertisements, attached to Decree No. 8 of 2025.

The move follows the Council of Representatives' earlier support for the same text, and comes after the Shura Council's Legislative and Legal Affairs Committee confirmed that the draft is sound in constitutional and legal terms.

Aim

Committee rapporteur Ejlal Bubshait said the changes are built around a simple aim.

"The draft law aims to reorganise the advertising sector in Bahrain so that it runs efficiently, is shielded from harmful practices and offers effective mechanisms to issue licences quickly and in an orderly way," she said, citing the Legislation and Legal Opinion Commission's memorandum.

On paper, the bill is short. It carries five articles and a preamble. Across the old 1973 text, general references to "the ministry" and "the minister" are replaced with "the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture" and "the Minister of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture".

Articles 1, 6, 10, 16 and 17 are rewritten. A new Article 14 (bis) is added, allowing some tasks to be handed to other entities with Cabinet approval.

Article 5, which had required the minister to form a committee from several bodies to oversee the law's application, is removed. The final article deals with entry into force and implementation.

Rules

Municipalities Affairs Minister, His Excellency Wael Al Mubarak, told members the existing rules were written for another era.

"This law was issued more than fifty years ago, when the advertising market was very different. With the growth and evolution of this market, it has become necessary to develop the legislation that governs advertising," he said, adding that the draft draws on practice abroad and on experience in Bahrain.

● Allowing Bahraini companies to use receivables, stock and movable assets to secure loans

A 60-article law approved by Shura councillors yesterday will let Bahraini businesses use receivables, stock and other movable assets as loan collateral.

This change is expected to make financing more accessible and flexible.

The measure is also set to cut borrowing costs for small and medium-sized firms and improve Bahrain's score in the World Bank's new business-readiness index.

The council backed the bill in full, with a formal final vote due at its next sitting.

Rights

The law, attached to Decree No. 11 of 2025 and already cleared by Parliament, creates a single system for security rights over movable property, supported by an electronic notice register to record and enforce these rights and to arrange priorities between creditors.

It is designed to plug gaps between existing laws, give

lenders clearer tools to manage risk, and allow companies to keep using assets that have been pledged.

Committee rapporteur Hisham Al Qassab said the draft had been built with the World Bank Group's Business Ready (B-READY) report in mind and to open the door to cheaper lending.

Growth

He told the chamber: "The bill is designed to lift Bahrain's performance in financial services and to support private-sector growth by helping companies secure lower-cost finance, using their movable assets as collateral while still putting them to work in the business."

Shura Financial and Economic Affairs Committee head Khalid Al Maskati linked the bill to guidance from the top of the state.

He said: "This law flows directly from His Majesty the King's directive to complete the legislation needed to strengthen national security and the economy and to keep Bahrain competitive on the world stage."

Framework

He added that the government had treated the secured-transactions bill as one of the measures to reinforce the financial and economic framework and bring in laws that support the wider legal fabric for the mar-

ket by encouraging investment and freeing up more liquidity through a more flexible regime for collateral.

According to the committee, the law lays down a flexible and integrated framework for security over movable property, widening the pool of assets that can be offered as collateral beyond real estate to include receivables, inventory, and intangible assets.

The electronic notice register will sit at the centre of the system, giving a way to record and enforce security rights and to make the order of priority between creditors clear.

Default

Members also noted that the law will let secured creditors enforce against collateral outside court in cases of default, with the aim of speeding up recovery of debts, while keeping

in place rules to maintain a fair balance between creditor and debtor.

These cover duties of good faith, disclosure, management of the collateral, and rights to inspect and obtain information.

Attention

Legal Affairs Committee head Dalal Al Zayed said the bill spells out the scope of the government and the procedures that must be followed, but added that close attention will still be needed when the executive regulations are written so that those who use the law can apply it clearly in practice.

She pointed in particular to the focus on transparency in electronic records, saying this should reassure parties in large secured deals and shows that Bahrain is following international practice in this field.

Justice, Islamic Affairs and Waqf Minister, His Excellency Nawaf Al Maawda, told the council that the new register must give both sides in a deal a clear view of existing pledges.

Transparency

"There has to be transparency in this register. The mortgagor and the mortgagee must be able to see clearly if goods have already been pledged to someone else," he said.

He added that the law will only work once the technical spine is in place.

GCC commitment

Dr. Al Zayani noted that the GCC has demonstrated over the past years its ability to address regional and international challenges, consolidating its position as an active and influential regional entity in promoting security and stability.

Plan to clear garages from Arad housing area

Garages and industrial workshops scattered through Arad's residential streets would be moved to designated industrial areas under an urgent proposal submitted by MP Hamad Al Doy.

The move calls for all such sites to be taken out of the neighbourhood and relocated to purpose-built zones outside housing districts, in co-ordination with the Ministry of Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning, the Ministry of Industry and Commerce and the relevant environmental bodies.

In his submission, Al Doy says that workshops have spread

through the residential area over many years and that their presence inside the housing blocks now requires clear action from the concerned ministries.

Proposal

The proposal points to industrial areas already equipped with services and infrastructure that could receive these garages and workshops.

He reports that residents have faced constant noise and strong smells from the workshops, along with pollution and poor handling of oils and paints, which has affected living conditions and the general environment in Arad.

The text also links the activity of the garages to traffic prob-



lems, with streets in the district becoming clogged as vehicles are parked and repaired on the roads and in spaces originally marked out for residents.

According to Al Doy, some workshops have in practice

been turned into accommodation for workers and single

men, in breach of safety rules and housing conditions, and this is described as creating health and security risks for nearby families.

Sites

The document maintains that keeping such workshops in the middle of residential areas is no longer acceptable given the presence of alternative industrial sites.

The proposal states that moving the workshops to suitable locations would improve living conditions in Arad, keep its residential character and ensure that industrial activity is carried out in a controlled way that does not harm people living in the district.

85 hospital psychiatric beds ‘missing’

Capacity at Bahrain's main psychiatric hospital has been cut by nearly a third and dozens of people seeking addiction treatment have faced long waits for a bed after a key ward lay idle for almost three years, the National Audit Office has said.

In its 2024–2025 report, the watchdog said the Ministry of Health had not carried out the required renovation and extra building works on the Ibn Al Nafees building at the Psychiatric Hospital, even though it was cleared around three years ago after it was found to be in poor condition.

A Ministry of Works report dated 14 September 2022 had already confirmed the need for those works.

Delay

The delay reduced the hospital's capacity from 267 to 182 beds, a fall of 85 beds, equal to 32 per cent.

The report added that, as of 30 June 2025, there were 32 addiction patients on a waiting list for admission to the Psychiatric Hospital, in breach of the hospital's own rules, which require addiction cases to be admitted and treated as soon as they come forward and ask for help.

Waiting times from the date of their admission request to 30 June 2025 ranged from 53 to 109 days, with treatment yet to start.

Maintenance

Responding on Ibn Al Nafees, the Ministry of Health said it had worked with the Ministry of Works in 2022 to assess the building and define the scope of maintenance, and that the project was transferred to 'Government Hospitals' in 2023.

It said the scope of work was reviewed again in 2024 and the budget revised, with the updated package sent for financial approval along with a request for extra funds to cover the gap.

Bahrain's Transport Ambitions Take Flight

At the Masaya Pavilion in the Ritz-Carlton Bahrain, His Excellency Dr Shaikh Abdullah bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, Minister of Transportation and Telecommunications, opened the session by thanking AmCham and encouraging dialogue over monologue.

He highlighted the strong relationship between Bahrain and the US.

The minister reaffirmed Bahrain's commitment to Economic Vision 2030, centred on sustainability, fairness and competitiveness.

Transport and telecommunications contribute roughly 9% to the economy. Connectivity across air, land, postal and digital channels remains a key priority.

Expanding aviation

As an island nation, Bahrain views aviation as essential.

H.E. Dr Shaikh Abdullah bin Ahmed outlined plans to develop the sector into a centre of excellence, focusing on commercial airlines, business aviation, cargo operations and MRO capabilities. Key partners include Gulf Air, DHL, VALOA Aviation and AirAsia.

The new terminal at Bahrain International Airport represents a US\$1.1 billion investment with long-term capacity for 14 million passengers.

Current targets begin at 3 million, rising to 5 million within five years.

A recent agreement with AirAsia includes a regional hub,

an MRO facility under Asia Digital Engineering, and regular cargo flights via Teleport using Boeing aircraft.

Private aviation

VALOA Aviation, having received an Air Operating Certificate, is preparing to expand private jet maintenance and services, including a dedicated hangar and a larger fleet.

A letter of intent was signed with Millennium Jet, a European private operator, to establish a presence in Bahrain.

Cargo operations continue to accelerate.

DHL has increased its fleet and volumes by 28% over four years and plans to build its largest regional MRO centre in Bahrain. Teleport is strengthening its regional logistics network.

Asia Digital Engineering plans to develop up to 14 MRO bases, beginning with four.

Boeing's long partnership

Wael Zaoud, Managing Director of Boeing Qatar, noted that Bahrain's aviation partnership dates back to 1977 with the introduction of the 737-200 into Gulf Air's fleet.

Recent additions include the 737 Connected Cargo and the

region's first 737 converted freighter.

He emphasised the importance of infrastructure, digital tools, maintenance and skills development to support future growth.

APM Terminals Bahrain, represented by CEO and Managing Director Matthew Luckhurst, highlighted more than 15 years of partnership at Khalifa bin Salman Port and a century-long relationship between Bahrain and MERSK dating back to the 1920s.

The company applies the same operational standards used in major US ports.

Efficiency gains

Modernisation and digitisation efforts continue across Bahrain's port operations, focusing on faster turnaround and cost-efficient handling.

In 2024, Bahrain's port was recognised internationally as the most efficient port of its size.

AI and digital twins

Luckhurst explained how AI is boosting productivity globally through better planning.

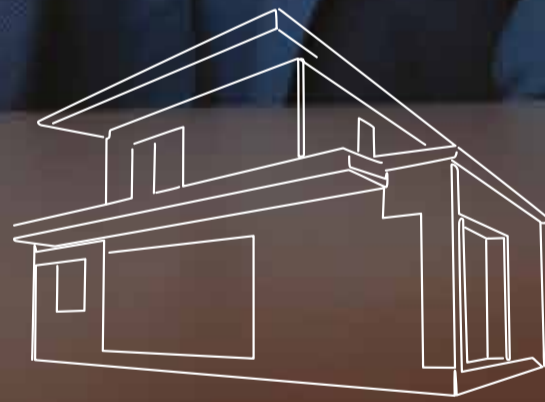

hind the menu is not a person but an AI programme -- known as chef Aiman -- trained on thousands of recipes and decades of culinary research and molecular gastronomy.

Chef Aiman can also optimise menus and balance flavours, according to the establishment.

The real work of preparing and serving the food, however, remains in human hands, for now. "AI is going to create better dishes than humans maybe in the future," said the restaurant's Turkish co-founder Ahmet Oytun Cakir.

While Woohoo's menu is mostly comprised of international fusion dishes, some AI creations stand out.

This includes a "dinosaur tar-

tare" meant to recreate the taste of extinct reptiles.

The restaurant did not reveal the dinosaur tartare recipe, which was created using DNA mapping.

Priced at roughly 50 euros (\$58), the dish tastes like a combination of raw meats and is served on a pulsating plate to appear as if it were breathing.

"It was a total surprise. It was so delicious," said customer Efe Urganlu. Along with AI-generated holograms and sci-fi animation, the heart of the neon-lit venue features a giant cylindrical computer -- presented as the digital mainframe powering the restaurant's lights and smoke shows.

'I don't believe in it'

Woohoo's Turkish chef Serhat Karanfil oversees the cooking and the final presentation and admits that he does not always agree with the AI chef's choices and selections.

"If I taste it, for example, and it is too spicy, I talk to chef Aiman again. After we discuss, we find the right balance," he said.

Cakir has high hopes that chef Aiman will one day become "the next Gordon Ramsay -- but AI".

Not everyone in Dubai's vibrant food scene is convinced.

For Michelin-starred chef Mohamad Orfali, "there is no such thing as an AI chef." "I

don't believe in it," the Syrian Dubai-based chef told AFP. His Orfali Bros restaurant snatched a Michelin star last year, after Dubai became the first Middle Eastern city to join the prestigious guide in 2022. Cooking requires "nafas", or soul, Orfali explained, using

the Arabic term that describes a cook's personal flair for food and their ability to conjure up exceptional meals. "Artificial intelligence lacks feelings and memories; in short, it has no nafas... It can't imbue it into food."

Dubai ideas

Orfali said he limited the use of AI in his own establishment to administrative tasks like setting the kitchen schedule and providing additional research.

"We use it as a kitchen assistant, but ultimately, it won't cook," he said.

Nonetheless, Woohoo has resonated with customers accustomed to the lavish offerings of Dubai, a tech-forward megalopolis with a proclivity for extravagance where AI has its own minister.

"Everyone is supporting these ideas here in Dubai," said Cakir.

The restaurant has also created a social media buzz, with an Instagram account dedicated to the AI Chef that features chef Aiman's avatar in videos sharing tips and recipes.

Dio, a customer who didn't give her last name, said she visited the restaurant after seeing the craze around it.

"It is such a creative concept, so I thought I must experience it myself," she said.

"The dishes were extraordinary."



Egypt trains hundreds of Palestinians for future Gaza police force

Gaza City, Palestinian Territories

Egypt is training hundreds of Palestinian police officers with an eye towards integrating them into a post-war security force in Gaza, a Palestinian official told AFP.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty announced the plan to train 5,000 officers for Gaza during talks with Palestinian Prime Minister Mohammad Mustafa in August.

A first group of more than 500 officers were trained in Cairo in March and since September the two-month courses have resumed to welcome hundreds more people, the Palestinian official told AFP on condition of anonymity.

He said all members of the force will be from the Gaza Strip and paid by the Palestinian Authority, which is based in Ramallah in the occupied West Bank.

"I'm very happy with the training. We want a permanent end to war and aggression, and we're eager to serve our country and fellow citizens," said a 26-year-old Palestinian police officer.

He told AFP he hoped the

security force would be "independent, loyal only to Palestine and not subject to external alliances or objectives".

"We received outstanding operational training, with modern equipment for border surveillance," said a Palestinian lieutenant who also requested anonymity for security reasons, as did everyone interviewed by AFP.

The lieutenant, who left Gaza with his family last year, said the training focused on the fallout of the October 2023 Hamas attack on Israel that triggered the war and the damage done to the Pal-

estianian cause.

Hamas's attack on Israel resulted in the deaths of 1,221 people.

Israel's retaliatory assault on Gaza has killed at least 70,100 people, according to figures from the territory's health ministry that the UN considers reliable.

'Protecting the dream'

The training also highlighted the role of the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) as the sole legitimate representative of the Palestinian people and stressed the importance of "pro-

tecting the dream of creating" a fully sovereign and independent Palestinian state.

A senior security official from the Palestinian Authority confirmed that its president Mahmud Abbas had instructed Interior Minister Ziad Hab al-Reeh to coordinate with Egypt on the training.

During talks sponsored by Egypt late last year, the Palestinian movements -- including the two main ones, Hamas and Abbas's Fatah -- agreed to a force of around 10,000 police officers.

Egypt would train half of them while the other 5,000 would come from the police force in Gaza, which has been under Hamas control since the militant group seized power there in 2007.

Under the agreement, the security force would be supervised by a committee of technocrats approved by the Palestinian movements.

A senior Hamas official confirmed to AFP that the movement supported "the details regarding security and management of the Gaza Strip" agreed during the talks.

The subject was also addressed in US President Donald

Trump's peace plan, which led to last month's fragile Gaza ceasefire, and was later endorsed by a UN Security Council resolution.

Europe too

The plan notably authorises the creation of an international force that would be responsible for securing border areas and demilitarising Gaza.

The European Union also wants to train up to 3,000 Palestinian police officers in the Gaza Strip under a scheme similar to one it already runs in the West Bank, an EU official told AFP.

The EU has financed a police training mission in the West Bank since 2006, with a budget of around 13 million euros (\$15 million).

But many details remain up in the air.

A Hamas official questioned to AFP the possibility of an agreement with Israel on the precise details of a police force in Gaza.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's government opposes any role for Hamas or the Palestinian Authority in Gaza after the war ends.

AFP journalists have regularly observed that Hamas maintains armed men in Gaza to ensure

traffic flows and to mediate disputes between residents, effectively providing a form of law enforcement.

Hamas has said it no longer wants to govern Gaza but added that it does not intend to disappear and remains a central part of Palestinian political life.

On the thorny issue of disarmament, Hamas has said it is not opposed to handing over part of its arsenal, but only as part of a Palestinian political process.

News in brief

◆ **The health ministry** in Hamas-run Gaza on Saturday said more than 70,000 people have been killed since the war between Israel and Hamas erupted more than two years ago. The milestone comes as a fragile US-brokered ceasefire largely holds, but with both sides accusing the other of violating the terms of the deal. In a statement, Gaza's health ministry said the death toll from the war had risen to 70,100. The ministry said that since the ceasefire came into effect on October 10, 354 Palestinians had been killed by Israeli fire. Two bodies arrived at hospitals in the Gaza Strip in the past 48 hours, the ministry said, one of which had been recovered from beneath the rubble.

◆ **Pakistan dismissed yesterday** a warning by the UN rights chief of potential "far-reaching consequences" for the rule of law in granting the head of the all-powerful military legal immunity. The foreign ministry said Pakistan was "fully committed to protecting... basic freedoms and the rule of law as enshrined in the constitution", responding to criticism from UN rights chief Volker Turk. A constitutional amendment approved by parliament earlier this month, shielding Field Marshal Asim Munir and other top officials from prosecution for life, has raised alarm among rights group. The change also created a new Federal Constitutional Court, stripping the Supreme Court of some of its powers and tightening oversight of judges. "These changes, taken together, risk subjugating the judiciary to political interference and executive control," Turk said in a statement on Friday. He warned of a risk of "far-reaching consequences for the principles of democracy and rule of law which the Pakistani people hold dear"

◆ **Iran's Revolutionary Guards** have seized a ship flying the flag of Eswatini and carrying "smuggled fuel", state media reported yesterday. Iranian forces regularly target tankers illegally transporting fuel in the Strait of Hormuz, a key chokepoint for global oil and liquefied natural gas shipments. "A vessel carrying 350,000 litres of smuggled fuel operating under the flag of Eswatini was seized and taken to Bushehr" in the south-west, state television said, quoting a local Revolutionary Guards commander. "There are 13 crew members on board, all from a neighbouring country and India," it added. Earlier this month, the Revolutionary Guards -- the ideological arm of the Islamic republic's military -- confirmed they had seized a Marshall Islands-flagged oil tanker in the Gulf. The company managing the ship later said Iran had released the tanker and its 21 crew members were safe.

'End of an era'

MTV pulling plug on music channels

MTV kick-started a new era of music and pop culture in 1981, when it went on air for the first time, emblematically playing "Video Killed the Radio Star" as its debut music video.

More than four decades later, the channel, now owned by US media giant Paramount Skydance, will wind down its international music broadcasting by the end of the year as it struggles to compete with online streaming and social media.

MTV Music, MTV Hits and its 80s and 90s music shows will be shut down in the UK and other European countries in the coming months, sources at Paramount confirmed to AFP.

These music channels will stop broadcasting at the end of the year in France, Germany, Poland, Australia and Brazil as well, according to various media reports.

It has been declared the "end of an era" by dismayed fans and former MTV video jockeys -- the beloved mu-

sic presenters known as VJs who appeared on millions of screens at the the height of the network's popularity.

However, the conditions that made MTV "revolutionary" simply "don't exist anymore", said Kirsty Fairclough,

a professor of screen studies at Manchester Metropolitan University. The rise of digital

streaming platforms like YouTube and TikTok has "completely refigured how we engage with music and images", the researcher on popular culture told AFP.

Viewers or listeners now expect "immediacy" and "interactivity" that sitting in front of the television to watch rolling music videos cannot provide, she added.

James Hyman, who directed and produced MTV Europe's dance music shows in the 1990s, agrees the network thrived before the internet was ubiquitous.

"It was so exciting, because that's mainly all people had," Hyman told AFP.



Indonesia, Thailand race to find missing as flooding toll tops 600

Heavy monsoon rain overwhelmed swaths of Indonesia, Thailand and Malaysia

Indonesian and Thai authorities raced yesterday to clear debris and find hundreds of missing people as the death toll from devastating floods and landslides across Southeast Asia topped 600.

Heavy monsoon rain overwhelmed swaths of Indonesia, Thailand and Malaysia this week, leaving thousands of people stranded without shelter or critical supplies.

At least two areas of Indonesia's worst-affected Sumatra island were still unreachable on Sunday, and authorities said they had deployed two warships from Jakarta to deliver aid.

Central Tapanuli and Sibolga city "require full attention due to being isolated", National Disaster agency head Suharyanto said in a statement, adding that the ships were expected in Sibolga on Monday.

The death toll in Indonesia rose to 442, while 402 were still missing, according to a tally published on Sunday by the disaster authority.

It said at least 646 people had been injured.

In Sungai Nyalo village, about 100 kilometres (62 miles) from West Sumatra's capital Padang, floodwaters had mostly receded on Sunday, leaving homes, vehicles and crops coated in thick

grey mud. Authorities had not yet begun clearing roads, residents told AFP, and no outside assistance had arrived.

"Most villagers chose to stay; they didn't want to leave their houses behind," said Idris, 55, who, like many Indonesians, goes by one name.

Across the island towards the north coast, an endangered Sumatran elephant lay buried in thick mud and debris near damaged buildings in Meureudu town.

Public criticism

In Thailand, where at least 162 people were killed in one of the worst floods in a decade, author-

ities continued to deliver aid and clear the damage.

Relief measures rolled out by the Thai government include compensation of up to two million baht (\$62,000) for households that lost family members.

However, there has been growing public criticism of Thailand's flood response, and two local officials have been suspended over their alleged failures.

Two people were killed in Malaysia after floods left stretches of northern Perlis state underwater.

A tropical storm has exacerbated conditions, and the tolls in Indonesia and Thailand rank among the highest in floods in those countries in recent years.

Climate change has affected

storm patterns, including the duration and intensity of the season, leading to heavier rainfall, flash flooding and stronger wind gusts.



The annual monsoon season, typically between June and September, often brings heavy rain, triggering landslides and flash floods.

Swiss right-to-die group says founder dies by assisted suicide

The head of Swiss right-to-die organisation Dignitas has died through assisted suicide, the group said in a statement yesterday.

Ludwig Minelli, who founded the group in 1998, died on Saturday just days before his 93rd birthday, Dignitas said.

Dignitas said it would "continue to manage and develop the association in the spirit of its founder as a professional and combative international organisation for self-determination and freedom of choice in life and at the end of life".

Minelli, a lawyer by trade, faced plenty of legal challenges and made several successful appeals to the Swiss supreme court and the European Court of Human Rights (ECHR).

Dignitas said his work had a lasting influence on Swiss law, pointing to a 2011 ECHR ruling that recognised the right of a person to decide the manner and time of their own end of life.

Swiss law does not allow for euthanasia, where a doctor or other person administers a lethal injection for example.

But assisted dying -- when a person who articulates a wish to die commits the lethal act themselves -- has been legal for decades.

Unlike some similar organisations in Switzerland, Dignitas, which says it has more than 10,000 members, also offers its services to people living outside the country.

Iran, Turkey agree to build key trade rail link

Iran and Turkey have agreed to begin constructing a new joint rail link to serve as a strategic gateway between Asia and Europe, Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said yesterday.

The planned route, known in Iran as the Marand-Cheshmeh Soraya railway transit line and running towards Turkey's Aralik border region, will cover around 200 kilometres (120 miles).

It will cost roughly \$1.6 billion and is expected to take three to four years to complete, Iranian authorities have said.

Earlier this month, Iran's transport minister Farzaneh Sadegh said the rail line would

transform the southern section of what was once the Silk Road into an "all-rail corridor ensuring the continuity of the network between China and Europe".

It would also ensure "fast and cheap transport of all types of cargo with minimal stops", she added. At a joint press conference on Saturday with his Turkish counterpart Hakan Fidan, Araghchi said "emphasis was placed on the need to remove barriers to trade and investment between the two countries". "The two countries also stressed the importance of the rail link ... in the region and expressed hope that the construction of this line can start as soon as possible," he added.

Floods hit Sri Lanka's capital as cyclone death toll rises to 334

Sri Lankan authorities battled rising floodwaters in parts of the capital yesterday after a powerful cyclone left a trail of destruction, killing at least 334 people across the country.

The northern part of Colombo was facing a major flood, as the water level in the Kelani River continued to rise, the Disaster Management Centre (DMC) said.

The death toll had reached 334, with several people missing, the DMC reported, following a week of heavy rains brought on by Cyclone Ditwah, which moved away from Sri Lanka on Saturday.

"Although the cyclone has left us, heavy rains upstream are now flooding low-lying areas along the banks of the Kelani

River," a DMC official said.

President Anura Kumara Dissanayake declared a state of emergency on Saturday to deal with the aftermath of the cyclone and appealed for international aid.

India was the first to respond, sending relief supplies and two helicopters with crew to carry out rescue missions.

Japan said it will send a team to assess immediate needs and pledged further assistance.

While the rains have subsided across the island, several roads in the worst-affected central province remained inaccessible, the DMC said.

The extreme weather system has destroyed more than 20,000 homes and sent 122,000 people into state-run temporary shelters.

Another 833,000 people required assistance after being displaced by the floods.

Troops from the army, navy, and air force have been deployed alongside civilian workers and volunteers to assist with the relief effort.

Officials reported that about a third of the country remains without electricity or running water due to collapsed power lines and inundated water purification facilities. Internet connections have also been disrupted.

The cyclone has become Sri Lanka's deadliest natural disaster since 2017, when flooding and landslides claimed more than 200 lives and displaced hundreds of thousands.

The worst flooding since the turn of the century occurred in June 2003, when 254 people were killed.

Netanyahu submits pardon request in Israel corruption cases

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, on trial facing corruption charges, announced yesterday he had submitted a pardon request, saying the long-running cases were tearing the country apart.

US President Donald Trump wrote to Israeli President Isaac Herzog earlier this month, asking him to pardon Netanyahu, who has repeatedly denied wrongdoing in the ongoing court cases.

"The trial in my case has been ongoing for nearly six years, and is expected to continue for many more years," Netanyahu said in a video statement.

He said he wanted to see through the process until acquittal, "but the security and political reality -- the national interest -- dictate otherwise.

The State of Israel is facing enormous challenges".

"The continuation of the trial is tearing us apart from within, arousing fierce divisions, intensifying rifts," he added.

The cases against Netanyahu have exposed divisions in Israeli society between his supporters and opponents.

Netanyahu's backers have dismissed the trials as politically motivated.

The premier and his wife Sara are accused in one case of accepting more than \$260,000 worth of luxury goods such as cigars, jewellery and champagne from billionaires in exchange for political favours.

He is also accused of attempting to negotiate more favourable coverage from two Israeli media outlets in two other cases.

Hong Kong in mourning as fire death toll climbs to 146

Crowds of mourners gathered yesterday across Hong Kong including thousands near the apartment blocks that were engulfed in flames earlier this week, killing at least 146 people in the city's deadliest fire in decades.

Police as well as Hong Kong's anti-corruption watchdog have launched investigations into the blaze at Wang Fuk Court, but a petition calling for greater accountability and demanding an independent probe was swiftly shut down as an organiser was reportedly arrested for sedition.

The first Sunday since the deadly inferno saw thousands flock to a small park next to the charred residential estate, which has become a focal point for grief over what was the world's deadliest residential building fire since 1980.

The queue of people, many dressed in dark colours and holding flowers, stretched more than 1.2 kilometres (0.75 miles) in the Tai Po neighbourhood, an AFP reporter saw, meaning some mourners had to wait hours to pay their respects.

Police said on Sunday that the death toll had risen to 146, up from 128 recorded the day before, as officers of the Disaster Victim Identification Unit broadened their search in the estate and recovered additional bodies.

"As of 4:00 pm (0800 GMT), the latest death toll stands at 146. We cannot rule out the possibility of further fatalities," Chief Superintendent Tsang Shuk-yin of the police's casualty enquiry unit told a news conference.

The 18 additional bodies were found in flats, staircases, hallways and rooftops, police said, adding that the wrecked building interiors complicated the search.

Hong Kong officials have set up an interdepartmental task force to look into the cause of the blaze.

The city's anti-corruption watchdog has arrested 11 people in connection to the fire, three of whom were also arrested by police for manslaughter.

Hong Kong media have widely reported, citing unnamed sources, that police have made one sedition arrest in relation to the fire.

Reports said the person arrested was 24-year-old student Miles Kwan, who was among those handing out flyers on Friday calling for governmental accountability and an independent probe.

Police told AFP on Saturday that it "will take actions according to actual circumstances and in accordance with the law" and said they had nothing further to add on Sunday evening.

Kwan could not be reached by phone on Sunday.

ISB Junior Campus Holds Colour Splash KG Sporting Gala Season 6

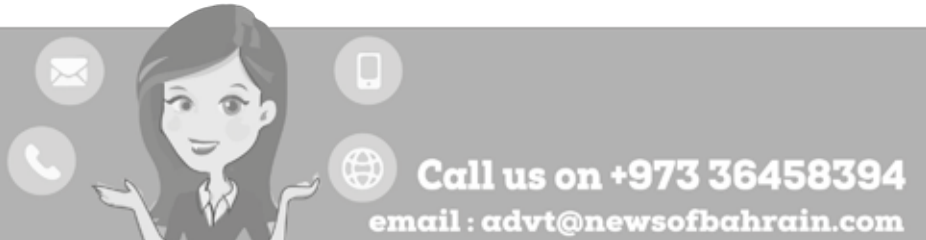

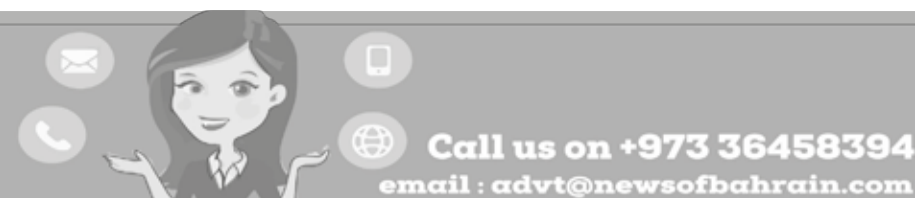

Isak scores first Premier League goal for Liverpool to sink West Ham

Alexander Isak finally scored his first Premier League goal for troubled Liverpool to inspire a much-needed 2-0 win against West Ham yesterday.

Isak had failed to score in his five top-flight appearances since making a British record £125 million (\$165 million) move from Newcastle in September.

The Sweden forward banished that drought at the London Stadium with only his second goal in 11 games in all competitions for the Reds, following his maiden strike in a League Cup win against second-tier Southampton.

Cody Gakpo bagged Liverpool's second goal in stoppage time to secure their first win in four games in all competitions.

Hampered by injuries and a lack of match fitness after missing pre-season due to his protracted transfer saga, Isak was on target in the league for the first time since netting for Newcastle against Brighton in May. The end of the 26-year-old's 10-match goal drought for club and country was a ray of hope for Liverpool amid a dismal campaign.

A 4-1 humiliation against PSV Eindhoven in the Champions League in midweek was Liverpool's third successive defeat by three goals or more following 3-0 league losses against Manchester City and Nottingham Forest.

Liverpool had lost nine of their previous 12 games -- their

worst run since 1953-54 -- including six defeats from seven league matches.

Salah has scored just five times in all competitions this season and Slot responded by dropping the Egypt forward to the bench for the third time this

season.

Bahrain's U17 national team closed their AFC U17 Asian Cup Saudi Arabia 2026 Qualifiers campaign in emphatic fashion yesterday, sweeping past Brunei Darussalam 10-0 in Chongqing to finish third in Group A with nine points.

With both sides already eliminated before kickoff, the match carried pride rather than qualification stakes, but Bahrain approached it with full competitive intent.

Captain Mohamed Rashed Aljazzaf was the driving force from the outset, opening the scoring in the 7th minute and going on to complete a remarkable four-goal performance with strikes in first-half stoppage time, the 51st minute, and again deep into added time at 90+2.

Forward Husain Zuhair Ebrahim added a quick-fire brace with goals in the 31st and 36th minutes, capitalising on Bahrain's relentless pressure in the attacking third.

Jassem Kacem Benjemia delivered two late goals of his own from the penalty spot in the 86th and 89th minutes, extending Bahrain's margin as Brunei faded defensively.

Head coach Mohammed Al Shamlan also saw immediate impact from his substitutes. Omran Adel Omran struck in the 76th minute, followed by Abdulrahman Majed seven minutes later, rounding off Bahrain's biggest win of the group stage and one of the largest scorelines of the entire qualifying campaign.

The result leaves Bahrain third in the standings, behind China PR and Bangladesh, as the group concluded later in the evening.

In the other match of the day, Timor-Leste defeated Sri Lanka 2-1 to secure fourth place. Elton Da Conceicao gave Timor-Leste the lead midway through the first half, with Jyzeus Gabriel Lay doubling the advantage in the 63rd minute. Sri Lanka's Ishaq pulled one back in stoppage time, but it came too late to change the outcome.

Number eight Corbin Bosch made a valiant 67 off 51 balls as South Africa fought until almost the end. Entering the 50th over, the visitors needed 18 for victory with one wicket left. Bosch fell on the second ball and South Africa were 332 all out.

Matthew Breetzke, who made 72, and Marco Jansen, with 70, put on a fighting stand of 97 for the sixth wicket to revived the chase after South Africa slipped to 11-3 and then 77-4.

Left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav stood out with figures of 4-68 in the high-scoring contest.

His double strike to remove Jansen and Breetzke in the space of three balls was the turning point for India who took 1-0 lead in the three-match series.

The 37-year-old Kohli re-

mained the hero with his 83rd ton across the three international formats after he raised his hundred with a boundary off Jansen and lifted his bat to a raucous home crowd.

"If you've played 300-odd games and so much cricket, you know when you're hitting balls in practice, you know the reflexes are there and the physical ability is there to bat long," player of the match Kohli said.

"As long as you're hitting the ball well and playing good cricket, it's about physically fit, mentally ready and excited."
