Israel's top court strikes down key govt legal reform

Israel's top court ruled yesterday against a key component of the government's controversial legal overhaul, which challenged the powers of the judiciary and sparked mass protests.

A Supreme Court statement said eight of 15 justices had ruled against an amendment passed by parliament in July which scraps the "reasonableness" clause, used by the court to overturn government decisions which are deemed unconstitutional.

"This is due to the severe and unprecedented damage to the basic characteristics of the State of Israel as a democratic state," the statement said.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu had argued the sweeping judicial reform package presented a year ago was necessary to rebalance powers between judges and politicians.

But his detractors warn the multi-pronged package paved the way for authoritarian rule and could be used by Netanyahu to quash possible convictions against him, an accusation the premier denies.

Slammed

Justice Minister Yariv Levin slammed the judges for "taking into their hands all the powers, which in a democratic regime are divided in a balanced way between the three branches" of government.

Levin, the architect of the judicial overhaul, said on Telegram that the ruling "takes away from millions of citizens their voice".

Tens of thousands of demonstrators had rallied weekly against the government reforms, with protests only ending due to the outbreak of the Israel-Hamas war in October.

The "reasonableness" amendment, the only major part of the legal reform package to become law, was also one its most contentious steps as it sought to curb judicial oversight of the government.

When Netanyahu's allies voted to scrap the reasonableness clause in July, opposition lawmakers stormed out of the chamber, shouting "shame".

Artillery fire pounds Hamas-run Gaza Strip, killing at least 24 people: health ministry officials

Fifteen dead bodies recovered from rubble of bombed house in Jabalia

Israel warned the Gaza war will continue throughout 2024 as unrelenting strikes killed dozens in the Palestinian territory and Hamas fired a rocket barrage at the stroke of midnight.

Israeli military spokesman Daniel Hagari said that some of the 300,000 army reservists would get a break from the war, in order to prepare for the "prolonged fighting" ahead.

"We will be required for additional tasks and warfare throughout this year," Hagari said as the conflict sparked by the October 7 Hamas attacks raged on.

Heavy artillery fire again pounded the Hamas-run Gaza Strip, killing at least 24 people, health ministry officials there said, with attacks including air strikes reported across the length of the besieged territory.

"This New Year's Eve, there are only missiles and the remains of people," said 20-year-old Hamdan Abu Arab, expressing hope that "2024 will be better".

The Gaza health ministry said 15 dead bodies from the same family were recovered Monday from the rubble of a bombed house in Jabalia, in the northern part of the territory.

"It's the worst year of our lives," Sami Hamouda, 64, told AFP. "Every new day is like the previous one: bombings, death and mass killings."

Hamas marked the start of the year by firing a rocket barrage at Israel in what it called

a "response to the massacres of civilians". AFP journalists in Tel Aviv witnessed missile defence systems intercept rockets overhead as some revellers ran for cover and others kept up the party with a shrug.

'Hopeless'

Hagari said the Israeli army was "adapting the planning of the force deployment in Gaza" including reserve soldiers, as "the fighting will continue and they will still be required".

"Some of the reservists will return to their families and employment this week. This will significantly ease the burden on the economy and allow them to gather strength for the upcoming activities in the next year."

Since Israel imposed a siege at the outset of the war, Gazans have been facing dire shortages of food, water, fuel and medicine -- eased only by aid trucks, about 120 of which entered on Sunday. The UN says 85 percent of the population of the Gaza Strip has been displaced.

"We are exhausted... We were displaced five times during this war," said 29-year-old Bassam

Hana. "We hope things improve in 2024 and that we live just like any other human being."

Regional fears

The war in Gaza has also raised fears of a broader regional conflict, with hostilities flaring with mostly Iran-backed militant groups in nearby countries who say they are acting in support of Hamas.

Iranian news agency Tasnim said yesterday the Alborz warship had entered the Red Sea, a globally important waterway where a US-led maritime coalition has deployed to stop attacks from Yemen's Tehran-backed Huthi rebels.

The US military said Sunday that Navy helicopters had fired at rebel boats off Yemen that were attacking a cargo ship, with Yemeni sources reporting 10 rebels killed.

Late Sunday, the Israeli army said it had intercepted two "hostile aircraft" flying from Syria.

And yesterday, the military said it had struck Lebanon, where it has fought the Hezbollah militant group, in response to attempted drone launches.

Major Japan quake triggers tsunami waves, residents told to run

At least four confirmed dead after 7.5-magnitude quake strikes: Japanese officials

More than 50 quakes of 3.2 magnitude or more rock region on New Year's Day

At least four people have been confirmed dead after a major earthquake struck central Japan yesterday, triggering tsunami waves over a metre high, damaging homes and sparking a major blaze.

The 7.5-magnitude quake struck Ishikawa prefecture on the Sea of Japan side of the main island of Honshu at

4.10pm, local time, according to the US Geological Survey (USGS).

Japanese authorities put the magnitude at 7.6 and said that it was one of more than 50 quakes of 3.2 magnitude or more to rock the region on the New Year's Day holiday -- when families get together and visit shrines -- over several hours.

Television channels interrupted normal services with special programming, including a message from Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, who urged people in vulnerable areas to "evacuate as soon as possible" to higher ground.

"We realise your home, your belongings are all precious to you, but your lives are important above everything else! Run to the highest ground possible," an alarmed presenter on broadcaster NHK told viewers.

Waves at least 1.2 metres high

hit the port of Wajima, and a series of smaller tsunamis were reported elsewhere, including as far away as the northern island of Hokkaido.

Officials in Ishikawa prefec-

ture confirmed four fatalities early today, according to the Kyodo news agency. The government said it was still assessing the extent of damage from the quake, which shook apart-

ments in the capital Tokyo some 300 kilometres away.

Tens of thousands of people were ordered to evacuate, according to the country's fire and disaster management agency, cited by Kyodo. About 1,000 people were staying at a military base, the defence ministry said.

Government spokesman Yoshimasa Hayashi said that there were reports that six people were in the rubble of collapsed buildings, but gave no further details.

Images on social media showed cars and houses in Ishikawa shaking violently and terrified people cowering in shops and train stations. Houses collapsed and huge cracks appeared in roads.

Around 33,500 households around the epicentre, in Toyama, Ishikawa and Niigata prefectures, were without power, local utilities said.

Housing requests inquiry

This information should be presented in a detailed table categorising each type of request, and should include the requests for each year separately, along with their respective dates, divided by each housing complex in accordance with the attached sample tables.
- The average age of each housing request in each governorate, from the date of submission until its completion.

- The ministry's projects for current and future requests aimed at meeting the housing demand.
- The properties owned by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning located in the Capital Governorate, allocated to meet the housing requests.

The submission of this parliamentary question indicates the concern of Deputy Fardan regarding the housing situation in Bahrain. The information sought will shed light on the current status of housing requests, the progress made in fulfilling them, and the ministry's plans for future housing projects.

MP seeks action on air quality

Air pollution in Bahrain is slated to spark a debate in Parliament, as MP Basma Abdulkarim Mubarak has raised a comprehensive question to Minister of Oil and Environment Dr Mohammed bin Mubarak bin Daina, focusing on several key aspects of the issue.

Monitoring

The MP from the eleventh constituency of the Northern Governorate has asked whether the ministry possesses accurate data on air pollution levels across the Kingdom. She has also asked where Bahrain stands on the latest international list of pollution-affected countries.

Questioning the causes of the concern, the MP further is seeking answers to the factors that contributed to the ranking, which is deemed alarming. She has also sought clarity

on the health impact of the issue and has asked whether the ministry has conducted studies assessing the direct impact of air pollution on citizens' health.

To tackle the problem, the MP is seeking concrete plans to reduce pollution and elevate Bahrain's global ranking in the future.

New homes for families

Housing and Urban Planning Ministry launches tender to provide 123 housing units in Al Buhair, Horat Sanad

● **Residential units to be up to 220 square metres each, constructed to modern standards**

● **Initiative part of Government Land Development Programme, conducted with private sector**

New homes will be built in Al Buhair and Horat Sanad as part of the Government Land Development Programme (GLDP).

This was announced yesterday by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning, which has launched tenders to provide the 123 housing units, in partner-

ship with the private sector.

Seventy-six of the units will be in the Al Buhair region, while the remaining 47 will be in Horat Sanad.

The move is in line with the directives of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, to expand the GLDP and implement eight additional projects in partnership with the private sector in 2023 and 2024.

Housing and Urban Planning Minister Amna bint Ahmed Al Rumaihi stated that the provision of the new homes is based on the positive outcomes of the GLDP since its inception, citing the great success achieved by the "Suhail" project -- the pilot project of the GLDP -- in addition to the signing of the contracts to build 131 units in Salman City, in partnership with Delmon Gate real estate company.

Al Rumaihi stressed that the

Al Buhair and Horat Sanad projects add to the gains of the GLDP in 2023.

She added that the tenders to provide the 123 housing units include the construction of residential units with building areas of up to 220 square metres, according to advanced building models that suit the needs of the Bahraini family, in addition to the implementation of infra-

structure works in the aforementioned sites.

She indicated that the acceleration in the pace of implementation of housing projects included in the GLDP is the outcome of the great demand by citizens for the various types of housing financing programme.

She noted that the programme provides more flexibility and diversity, as it enables the beneficiaries to select and purchase the units according to the financing amounts they receive from "Tas'heel" financial schemes or "Mazaya", the newly launched category, adding that the projects are implemented across various sites nationwide.

The Housing and Urban Planning Minister added that more projects will be implemented within the GLDP, in a way that enhances the gains of this programme and provides a base of diverse units for the beneficiaries of financing services.

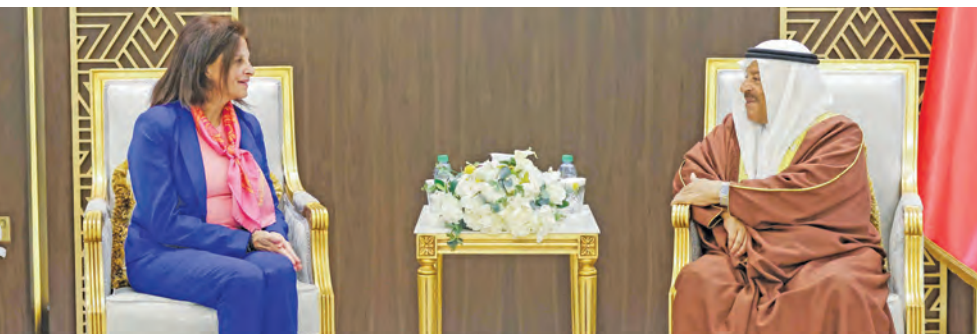

iGA launches household income and expenditure survey

● **Survey to help understand household expenditures on goods, their contribution to the GDP, and their price changes**

● **It will support the development of governmental economic, social, and environmental policies and programmes**

The Information and eGovernment Authority (iGA) has launched the Household Income and Expenditure Survey 2024.

The survey's aim is to gather data from a random sample of around 6,000 households, both Bahraini and non-Bahraini, and understand household expenditures on goods, identify the most commonly used goods and services contributing to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), and observe the price changes of these goods, which reflect inflation rates and directly influence bank interest rates.

The survey also supports the development of governmental economic, social, and environmental policies and programmes.

The launch was announced

yesterday by iGA statistics and population registry deputy chief executive Duaa Alharban, who said that the survey will run from January to December 2024, in line with the directives of Interior Minister and Ministerial Committee for Information Communications and Technology (MCICT) chairman General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdullah Al Khalifa.

Approximately 35 field researchers, who were carefully selected and have undergone extensive training, are conducting the survey.

Alharban underscored its role in improving government operations, enhancing the livelihoods of individuals and communities, and enabling government bodies to make informed decisions and develop aligned strategies and initiatives for both Bahraini and non-Bahraini families and to bolster social programmes.

She said that as part of a new approach, selected families will be contacted via the call center (17878070) for the visits to be scheduled at convenient times, facilitating better interaction and data accuracy, and building stronger trust in the process.

Researchers will conduct at least four visits to each household during the survey period to complete various forms on electronic tablets. This method aims to reduce errors and ensure greater data accuracy and reliability. The forms cover housing characteristics, income

sources, expenditures on durable goods and services, and a daily expense record, which families will fill out directly via an electronic link or paper form.

Following the data collection, field supervisors will review the completed forms, which will then be analysed by a specialised team to reveal indicators such as average family income, expenditures, and size, all of which are crucial for policy and planning.

Alharban urged Bahraini and non-Bahraini families to cooperate to ensure the survey's success, pledging the highest standards of confidentiality and data security.

The iGA has been conducting this survey since 1974-1975, with the fifth one carried out in 2014-2015.

Youth centres e-services launched

A series of electronic services for youth empowerment centres has been launched by the Ministry of Youth Affairs' Support and Services Directorate.

These services include the annual plan, programmes and activities; support and care licenses and contracts; annual subsidy disbursement and estimated budgets for expenses and revenues; general assemblies and minutes of meetings and their holding; as well as government transactions and other services.

Youth Affairs Minister Rawan bint Najeeb Tawfiqi said that the ministry has recently launched many initiatives and programmes that contribute to organising youth empowerment centres administratively.

These initiatives include the launch of electronic services and training employees in the

centers to use the new system, which aims to save effort and facilitate the process of completing transactions.

Tawfiqi noted that the ministry aims to permanently develop the work of youth empowerment centres by launching electronic services, tapping into modern technologies, offering digital transformation solutions, and improving the performance levels and admin-

istrative processes of youth empowerment centers.

She highlighted the ministry's efforts in developing youth empowerment centres as well as their administrative and technical systems, to enhance their role as youth supporters, which coincides with the Supreme Council for Youth and Sports policies, supported by HM the King's humanitarian work and youth affairs representative His Highness Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa.

The minister emphasised that the youth empowerment centres in Bahrain's governorates are an ideal place to embrace the energies of young people, invest in their talents, and equip them with the skills and expertise they need to contribute to the Kingdom's development.

She affirmed the importance of youth empowerment centres in enhancing youth skills by providing social, cultural, intellectual, and sporting activities.

MP proposes temporary utility services for buildings under construction

MP Mohammed Al Ma'arifi has submitted a proposal to provide a temporary and limited-term electricity and water connection service for owners of buildings under construction, in order to meet the need for these services during the construction phase. According to the explanatory memorandum of the

proposal, the focus is on the government's efforts to facilitate the construction process for beneficiaries by temporarily providing electricity and water connections during the building phase.

This aims to eliminate the need for alternatives, some of which are illegal, such as tapping into neighbours' cables and other environmentally detrimental approaches. It also addresses the

inconvenience caused to neighbours by the noise generated by power generators used in such cases.

Additionally, the provision of temporary electrical cables by the Electricity and Water Authority would generate new revenue for the authority, both through fees and monthly bills paid by owners of these buildings for electricity usage, he stressed.

Fake company, real crime

Court cracks down on BD7M money laundering ring

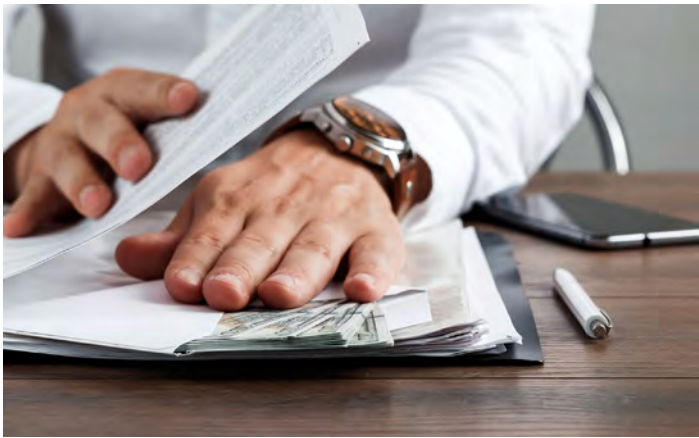

In a swift move to safeguard the financial integrity of the nation, the High Criminal Court has delivered justice in a case involving a clandestine money laundering network.

Two individuals, a Bahraini citizen and an Arab accomplice, found themselves sentenced to prison terms – six years for the Bahraini and three for the Arab defendant – after orchestrating a scheme that siphoned over BD7million through illegal channels.

The saga began with an alarm raised by the National Financial Investigations Centre, flagging suspicious activity involving unlicensed public fund collection and suspected money laundering. The Public Prosecution swiftly initiated investigations, unearthing a web of deceit woven by the defendants.

In cahoots with foreign accomplices, the duo had established a shadow system, bypassing the legal financial framework and its necessary licenses. Their modus operandi? Collecting funds from unsus-

pecting individuals, then funneling them through complex banking transfers before finally disguising the ill-gotten gains as legitimate earnings of one of the defendant's companies.

This nefarious scheme threatened to erode the very foundations of a transparent financial system.

The Public Prosecution, a formidable adversary against financial misconduct, acted swiftly. Bank accounts were frozen, funds meticulously tracked, and witnesses brought forward to shed light on the murky op-

eration.

The meticulous investigation yielded irrefutable evidence that the defendants had indeed formed a criminal network, amassing a staggering BD7,104,159.390 through their unauthorised activities.

Justice was served. The defendants, charged with laundering funds acquired through unlicensed collection, were held accountable for their actions. Their attempt to cloak their criminal proceeds in the garb of legitimacy proved futile in the face of a determined inves-

tigation and a resolute judicial system.

By delivering such a verdict, the High Criminal Court has sent a clear message to those tempted by the allure of ill-gotten gains – the cost of greed is a hefty one, measured not just in lost dinars but also in lost freedom.

Appeals Court reviews cyber fraud case

The High Appeals Court has commenced the review of an electronic fraud appeal case, involving a convicted individual who was sentenced to five years in prison for his involvement in embezzling over BD2,500 from his victim through a text message scam.

The defendant had sent a text message to the victim, requesting them to update their personal information on a mobile application through an electronic link. Upon opening the link, the victim was prompted to enter their bank card number and details.

Subsequently, the victim received another message containing a link, which instructed them to click and enter a series of numbers for data verification. After entering their PIN, the victim received a bank notification stating that over BD1,000 had been withdrawn from their account. It was then revealed that the victim had fallen victim to a fraudulent

scheme aimed at stealing their funds, prompting them to report the incident to the competent authorities.

The investigation progressed with the assistance of the electronic financial transactions company, which traced the transaction and identified the last individual who received the embezzled amount from a financial exchange.

Through security cameras, the suspect was apprehended. Subsequent investigations revealed that the suspect and an unidentified accomplice outside Bahrain were involved in defrauding victims abroad, with the suspect facilitating the transfer of funds in exchange for agreed-upon commissions. The Public Prosecution has charged the defendant with participating, in 2023, in an illegal agreement and aiding an unknown individual in the unauthorised use of the victim's electronic signature for the purpose of embezzling the mentioned amount.

The crime was committed based on this agreement and assistance. Additionally, the defendant collaborated with another unidentified individual to unlawfully obtain the cash amounts owned by the victim, utilising fraudulent methods and entering data through a technological information medium.

Ministry lawsuit dismissed in land dispute

The High Administrative Court rejected a lawsuit filed by the Ministry of Industry and Commerce demanding a sum of BD9,000 from an investor.

The ministry claimed that the investor was a tenant of an industrial land in Al Maamir, with a lease period of six months and 15 days. However, the ministry failed to provide a copy of the lease agreement or any evidence proving the contractual relationship between the parties.

The court confirmed that the plaintiff did not submit the lease contract during the period of the claim, despite being instructed by the court to do so. The lawsuit lacked evidence supporting the existence of a contractual relationship between the parties, and the court ordered the plaintiff to bear the expenses and attorney fees.

The investor's lawyer stated that the ministry filed a lawsuit against his client, seeking to compel him to pay a total amount of BD9,000, representing the rent for the industrial land located in Al Maamir In-

dustrial Zone.

The ministry claimed that they had entered into a lease agreement in 1992 for a period of 25 years. However, the ministry unilaterally terminated the lease agreement without compensating the client, and demanded the rent after the contract's termination.

The lawyer argued that the plaintiff's claim is ambiguous, unrealistic, and lacks legal basis as it fails to clarify the method or mechanism used to calculate the mentioned amount.

He further explained that his client's company constructed all the buildings on the land, complying with all the terms and conditions of the lease agreement. They also established and equipped the necessary facilities to achieve the desired objectives.

However, on December 5, 2016, the client received a letter from the ministry stating the cancellation of the lease agreement, withdrawal of the land, and refusal to renew the contract without any valid reason or compensating the client for the substantial amounts spent on constructions and buildings.

EU visa-free travel for Kosovo enters into force

A long-awaited European Union’s visa liberalisation scheme allowing Kosovo nationals to travel to Europe’s borderless zone without a visa came into force yesterday with the first travellers hailing it as a great relief.

The new regime, which entered into force at midnight (2300 GMT Sunday), enables Kosovars into the passport-free Schengen zone without a visa for periods of up to 90 days in any 180- day period.

The reform is perceived in Pristina as another step towards full recognition and a boost for the ambition of the country that proclaimed independence

in 2008 to join the European Union.

“This is a great relief ... feels good,” businessman Rushit Sopi told AFP before boarding a Pristina-Vienna flight.

He was among 20 winners of a quiz organised by the government within a public awareness campaign over the scheme.

The 48-year-old owner of a company manufacturing doors and windows flying almost regularly to the EU for business.

“Each visa cost me 300 euros (\$331). When I last changed my passport, I calculated that the EU visas alone in it cost me 2,500 euros.”

European embassies in Pristina, notably those exposed to strong pressure to issue visas, such as the German consulate, had prepared for no visa D-Day.

German ambassador Jorn Rohde himself issued the last visas to Kosovars a few days ago stressing that the visa era was “finally closing”.

He also invited locals to visit

his country for this summer’s Euro football championship. - ‘Second-class citizens’ -

Kosovars had awaited January 1 with great enthusiasm perceiving it as a “historic day” as their country moves closer to the EU, local surveys showed.

But they also blamed both Brussels and Pristina for such a long delay in lifting the visa regime. Kosovo, population 1.8 million, was the last of the six countries in the Western Balkans to receive the waiver.

“Until now, Europe has treated us as second-class citizens,” said engineer Agim Gosalci, 61.

“Our politicians are also responsible for such a long wait because one of the conditions for visa liberalisation was the fight against corruption and organised crime,” translator Adelina Kasolli, 33, said.

With average wages at slightly above 400 euro and youth unemployment over 20 percent Kosovo ranks among Europe’s poorest countries.

Emigration fears

For the past two months the government in Pristina has been conducting a campaign urging people not to misuse the freedom of travel by looking for jobs in the EU.

Prime Minister Albin Kurti led

the campaign himself travelling throughout the country to explain the new regime benefits.

“This day is important. A great injustice is being removed and a great right is being gained,” he told the quiz winners at Pristina airport before they flew to Vienna.

The prime minister urged Kosovars “to respect the criteria, and wherever we travel, let’s not forget that our home is Kosovo.”

His deputy in charge of European integration, Besnik Bislimi, warned against the possible abuse of the regime which could lead to EU restrictive measures that would “harm the entire country”.

Many also fear that it could also result in even greater labour force shortages.

Around 18 percent of private sector employees will quit their jobs and try to emigrate this year, according to the Pristina-based Riinvest institute.

Sopi’s business could also feel the impact but on Monday he was focused more on Vienna where he was taking his wife who had never travelled to an EU country.

“The decision (to lift visas) is more than welcome,” said his wife Valdete. “We have family in Germany and Switzerland and it was time to visit them.”

HSBC France retail bank sold to US fund Cerberus

Paris, France

After more than two years HSBC transferred on Monday for an undisclosed amount its retail banking network in France to My Money Group, controlled by US private equity fund Cerberus.

The operation will see HSBC France’s nearly 250 retail branches with their 800,000 clients and 3,500 staff become CCF, a brand that HSBC shelved when it began operations in France some two decades ago.

The move is part of London-headquarters HSBC’s efforts to simplify and refocus operations on its major region of Asia.

When announcing the planned sale in June 2021, HSBC said the transfer for a nominal one euro would see it incur a hefty charge.

But the rise in global interest rates complicated negotiations, with HSBC finally booking a charge of \$2.4 billion against third quarter 2022 over

the French unit.

The terms of the final deal were not disclosed.

In a statement released Monday the groups said CCF would seek to cater to professionals.

My Money Group traces its history in France back more than a century, originally helping people finance their purchases of Citroen cars, then spending two decades under General Electric’s control before the US conglomerate pulled out of finance activities. Cerberus acquired the group in 2018.

Sri Lanka raises taxes ahead of foreign debt deal

Colombo, Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka slapped a new 18 percent value added tax (VAT) on fuel, mobile phones and computers from yesterday to raise desperately needed revenue ahead of a foreign debt restructuring.

An earlier VAT of 15 percent on other consumer goods was also increased to 18 percent as the government sought to shore up its finances while Sri Lanka emerges from its worst economic crisis.

“In order to achieve economic stability, we must continue to forge ahead in this demanding path -- one that is not adorned with flowers but presents formidable challenges,” President Ranil Wickremesinghe said in his New Year message.

Months of civil unrest sparked by the economic crisis forced the resignation of then-president Gotabaya Rajapaksa when protesters stormed his residence in July 2022.

His successor Wickremesinghe has raised taxes and cut government subsidies to comply with an International Monetary Fund bailout and cracked down on anti-government protests.

The IMF rescue programme requires him to finalise by May a restructure of the island country’s \$46 billion external debt after a government default in 2022.

The higher taxes kicked in as the government negotiated with its bilateral lenders and sovereign bond holders to reschedule repayments, a key condition of the IMF bailout.

Singapore economy grows 1.2% in 2023: PM Lee

Singapore, Singapore

Singapore’s economy avoided a recession and expanded 1.2% in 2023, Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong said Sunday, warning however that geopolitical risks will weigh on next year’s growth.

The affluent city-state’s economic performance is often seen as a barometer of the global environment because of its reliance on international trade.

“We made 1.2% growth this year, avoiding a recession,” Lee said in his New Year’s message.

For next year, growth is projected to come in at 1.0-3.0% “but much will depend on the external environment,” he added, pointing to the continuing war in Ukraine and Israel’s conflict with Hamas.

The economy has been hurt by softer global demand for its exports, with the return of air travel after the Covid-19 pandemic boosting domestic growth.

“For some years to come, we

must expect the external environment to be less favourable to our security and prosperity. Geopolitical uncertainties will continue weighing on the global economy,” he said.

“In our own region, there are tensions and risks over rival claims in the South China Sea, and because of the cross-strait situation. These can affect confidence in the region, and hence our growth.”

Maritime tensions have risen recently in the sea after China and the Philippines traded blame for a series of incidents in the area, including a collision between their vessels.

China’s first domestically built cruise ship begins maiden voyage

Shanghai, China

China’s first domestically built cruise ship set sail on its maiden voyage from Shanghai on Monday, a sign of the nation’s growing prowess in sophisticated construction as it seeks self-sufficiency in key technologies.

The Adora Magic City left port on its first commercial cruise late afternoon, en route to South Korea and Japan.

Equipped with a mahjong lounge and hotpot restaurant, the luxury vessel is aimed squarely at China’s expanding middle class and their appetite

for international travel.

State media have hailed the 16-deck behemoth as a “major milestone for the country’s ship-building industry” and a “crown jewel”.

Its construction was delayed by the Covid-19 pandemic, according to Lloyd’s Register (LR), which provided marine services for the ship.

It is China’s first foray into a sector dominated by European shipbuilders.

The country’s first home-grown passenger jet, the C919, also made its debut outside mainland China last month.

The complex projects are key to Beijing’s decades-long ambitions to compete with European and US rivals and cut down China’s reliance on foreign technology.

Many of Adora Magic City’s components were provided by international suppliers.

But in the future, “China has the opportunity to build its own supply chain”, Marco Scopaz, LR’s on-site project manager, said in an article on Lloyd’s website.

The Adora Magic City “marks the beginning of the country’s inevitable and rapid develop-

ment in cruise design and construction”, he said.

News in brief

◆ **Iran's Alborz warship** has entered the Red Sea through the strategic Bab al-Mandeb strait, Tasnim news agency reported yesterday, at a time of heightened tensions over the globally important waterway. The agency did not give specific reasons for its deployment, but noted that Iranian military vessels had operated in the area since 2009. "The Alborz destroyer entered the Red Sea... by passing through the Bab al-Mandeb," waterway at the southern tip of the Red Sea, connecting with the Gulf of Aden in the Indian Ocean, the agency said. It added that Iran's naval fleet has been operating in the area "to secure shipping lanes, repel pirates, among other purposes since 2009". According to the International Chamber of Shipping, 12 percent of global trade passes through the Red Sea, which provides a shortcut past Africa via the Suez Canal.

◆ **Nobel peace laureate** Muhammad Yunus was convicted yesterday of violating Bangladesh's labour laws in a case decried by his supporters as politically motivated. Yunus, 83, is credited with lifting millions out of poverty with his pioneering microfinance bank but has earned the enmity of longtime Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who has accused him of "sucking blood" from the poor. Hasina has made several scathing verbal attacks against the internationally respected 2006 Nobel Peace Prize winner, who was once seen as a political rival. Yunus and three colleagues from Grameen Telecom, one of the firms he founded, were accused of violating labour laws when they failed to create a workers' welfare fund in the company.

◆ **Defence** Secretary Grant Shapps said yesterday that Britain is "willing to take direct action" against Iran-backed Huthi rebels in Yemen who have repeatedly attacked vessels in the Red Sea. London's warning comes amid escalating tensions in the vital shipping lane, with US Navy helicopters firing Sunday on Huthi rebels who attempted to board a cargo ship. The rebels, who seized Yemen's capital Sanaa in 2014 and control much of country including its Red Sea coastline, have reported 10 fighters dead or missing. The Huthis -- who say they are acting in solidarity with Palestinians in the Israel-Hamas war in Gaza -- have repeatedly fired drones and missiles at passing ships in the seaway through which 12 percent of global trade passes. Hours after the latest incident, Shapps said Britain could step up its own military interventions. A British destroyer shot down a suspected Huthi attack drone in the Red Sea in mid-December.

Nearly 30,000 migrants crossed Channel to UK last year

Nearly 30,000 migrants crossed the Channel to Britain from mainland Europe in small boats in 2023, an annual drop of more than a third, government figures released yesterday showed.

However, the unauthorised arrivals of 29,437 people on the southeast English coast remains the second largest yearly tally since officials began publishing the numbers in 2018.

The perilous journeys across one of the world's busiest shipping lanes have become a huge political problem for the Conservative government, with Prime Minister Rishi Sunak pledging last year to "stop the

boats". One of five key promises he made for 2023, the persistently high number of arrivals could haunt the Tory leader as he bids to win a general election due this year. Sunak said last month there was no "firm date" for meeting his pledge. The beleaguered leader will likely point to a 36 percent reduction in small-boat arrivals last year, after a record 45,000 migrants made the journey in 2022. His ministers have claimed Britain's £480 million (\$610 million) agreement with France to increase efforts to stop the migrants is starting to pay off, alongside fast-track return deals struck with countries such as Albania.

Fireworks lit up skies across the world to welcome 2024, but airstrikes marred the year's earliest hours in Gaza, Israel and Ukraine, and a major earthquake hit Japan triggering tsunami warnings.

Many around the world may wish to shake off high living costs, global tumult and extreme weather in 2024, which heralds elections for half the planet's population of more than eight million. Yet with the new year barely started there were already ominous signs.

At the stroke of midnight several rockets were fired from the Gaza Strip towards Israel, where they were intercepted. Some Israeli revellers ran for cover. Others continued to party.

Israel pounded targets the length of the heavily populated Gaza Strip, where the United Nations says 85 percent of people have fled their homes, killing at least 24 people, according to officials in the besieged Palestinian territory. On Monday, tens of thousands marched through the Turkish city of Istanbul to protest at the scale of death and destruction caused by Israel's response to the October 7 attack by Hamas.

Hamas killed around 1,140 people in Israel, most of them civilians, according to an AFP tally based on official figures, and took 250 people hostage.

Since then, Israel has reduced vast areas of Gaza to wasteland and killed at least 21,978 people, mostly women and children, according to the territory's health ministry. In his New Year's message, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Russian forces would feel the "wrath" of his

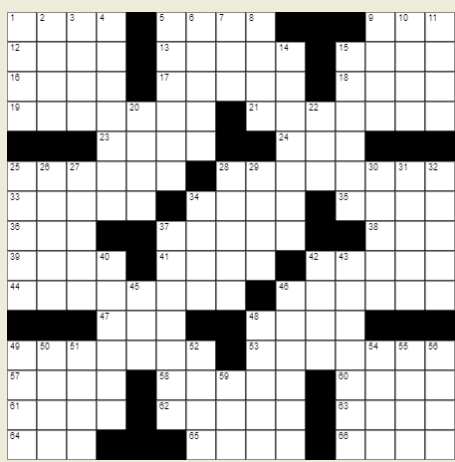

Jayson Tatum scored 25 points and Jaylen Brown added 24 to lead the NBA-best Boston Celtics over San Antonio 134-101 on Sunday, stretching their win streak to six games.

Kristaps Porzingis added 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds for the Celtics, who improved to 26-6.

Boston also got 17 points from Derrick White, who spent five seasons with San Antonio before joining the Celtics in a 2022 trade. He heard chants of "White's an All-Star" from the Texas fans.

"I've got a lot of respect for the fans here, great memories here," White said. "I'm just thankful."

Boston outscored the Spurs 40-23 in the third quarter to pull away for good.

"Just had that mindset of third quarter is important and coming out ready to go," White said. "We finished the first half well and kept it going from there."

Tatum made 10-of-17 shots from the floor, 5-of-10 from 3-point range, while Brown

went 9-of-13 from the floor, hitting both 3-point attempts, and 4-of-6 from the free throw line.

French 19-year-old rookie star center Victor Wembanyama, the 7-foot-4 (2.24m) top pick of the 2023 NBA Draft, scored 21 points and grabbed seven rebounds for the host Spurs, who fell to 5-27.

Zion Williamson and Brandon Ingram each scored 26 points and the host New Orleans Pelicans avenged an In-Season Tournament (IST) semi-final loss by ripping the Los Angeles Lakers 129-109.

Ingram also contributed eight assists, five rebounds, three steals and two blocked shots while Williamson added six assists and four rebounds for the Pelicans, who improved to 19-14 with all five starters scoring in double figures.

A day after his 39th birthday, LeBron James led the Lakers with 34 points while adding eight assists and five rebounds. Anthony Davis netted 20 points with 10 rebounds for the Lakers, who humbled the Pelicans 133-89 on their way to the IST crown earlier this month.

Pregnant Kvitova puts tennis career on hold

Kvitova, the Wimbledon champion from 2011 and 2014, has won 31 WTA singles titles.

David Warner retires from one-day cricket ahead of Test farewell

Dynamic Australian opener David Warner called time yesterday on one-day international cricket ahead of his farewell Test against Pakistan this week, but kept the door open to play the 2025 Champions Trophy if needed.

The 37-year-old will pad up in his 112th and final Test in his home city Sydney on Wednesday, having plundered 8,695 runs at an average of 44.58, with 26 centuries and 36 half-centuries.

At a press conference at the Sydney Cricket Ground, he also announced his retirement from ODIs, where he has been a fixture since his debut in 2009, helping the team win the World Cup in 2015 and 2023.


"I've got to give back to the family and also on the back of that I'm definitely retiring from one-day cricket as well," he said.

"That was something that I had said through the (2023) World Cup, get through that, and winning it in India, I think that's a massive achievement.

"So I'll make that decision today, to retire from those forms, which does allow me to go and play some other (Twenty20) leagues around the world and sort of get the one-day team moving forward a little bit.

"If I'm playing decent cricket in two years' time and I'm around and they need someone, I'm going to be available."

The Champions Trophy has not been played since 2017, but is set to be resurrected in 2025 in Pakistan. Traditionally 50-over cricket, reports have said there is a push underway to make it T20.

Warner leaves ODIs after 161 matches, smashing 6,932 runs at an average of 45.30, with 22 centuries. Among Australians, only Ricky Ponting with 30 has scored more one-day tons.

He will continue to be available in the T20 format, with the 2024 World Cup in the Caribbean and United States a target.

The BFA confirmed yesterday the national team’s official programme ahead of the AFC Asian Cup. Following their arrival today in Dubai, the Bahrainis will get right to work and then play an international friendly match against continental powerhouses Australia on Saturday. They then face African side Angola in an informal training match on 10 January, after which they depart for Doha the following day.

That will be just in time for the start of the tournament, in which Bahrain are in Group E for the preliminary round along with South Korea, Malaysia and Jordan.

Pizzi has named 26 players on the final list for the Dubai camp and the AFC Asian Cup. The players include goalkeepers Sayed Mohammed Jaafar, Ebrahim Luthfallah and Abdulkarim Al Fardan; defenders Amine Benadi, Sayed Mahdi Baqer, Waleed Al Hayyam, Ahmed Bughammar, Mohammed Adel, Hussain Al Aker and Abdulla Al Khala-si; midfielders Hazza Ali, Mohammed Abdulwahab, Moses Atede, Mohammed Hardan, Ebrahim Alwali, Mohammed Abdulqayoom, Jassim Al Shaikh, Jassim Khelaif, Mohammed Marhoon, Komail Al Aswad and Ebrahim Al Khattal; and forwards Ali Hassan Saeed, Ali Madan, Mahdi Humaidan, Abdulla Al Hashash and Abdulla Yusuf.

The nationals kick off their campaign against the South Koreans on 15 January at 2.30pm, and then take on their Malaysian counterparts on 20 January at 5.30pm. They complete the prelimi-

naries against Jordan on 25 January at 2.30pm. All times are Bahrain.

Bahrain need to finish amongst the top two in their group to automatically advance to the knockout stage, or be one of four of the best-ranked third-placed teams from the six pools.

Group A features hosts Qatar, China, Tajikistan and Lebanon. Group B includes Australia, Uzbekistan, Syria and India. Group C is composed of Iran, the UAE, Hong Kong and Palestine. Group D comprises Japan, Indonesia, Iraq and Vietnam. And Group F features Saudi Arabia, Thailand, Kyrgyzstan and Oman.

Bahrain will be making their seventh appearance in the AFC Asian Cup, having qualified for the competition’s sixth straight edition. Their first appearance came in 1988, and then also played in 2004, 2007, 2011, 2015 and 2019. Their best finish to date was fourth overall in the 2004 tournament held in China.

‘Super nervous’ Osaka wins comeback match at Brisbane International

Former world number one and new mother Naomi Osaka said yesterday she was proud to have won her first match back after a long break, admitting she had been “super nervous”.

The 26-year-old was on court at the Brisbane International for an hour and 47 minutes before finally seeing off gallant German Tamara Korpatsch 6-3, 7-6 (11/9) on Pat Rafter Arena.

“I was super nervous, but I was excited to be out there,” said Osaka, a four-time Grand Slam champion who stepped away from tennis in September 2022, citing mental health concerns.

“I think it’s better to have harder matches early because it will train me for what’s to come. “I know all the opponents I play aren’t easy anyway, so it would be very ‘out there’ for me to think my first match would be a 6-1, 6-1 win.

“Looking back on the match now, honestly I’m very proud of myself. I feel like I played at a pretty good level.”

It looked like she had never been away when she broke Korpatsch to love in the opening game then broke once more to

take the first set relatively comfortably.

But it was a different story in the second set as Korpatsch lifted and Osaka began to feel the pressure.

Korpatsch broke Osaka’s serve to start the second set and although the Japanese star broke straight back, she was no longer as settled against the tenacious German.

Osaka did break once more and was serving for the match at 5-4, but she was broken again and it went to a tiebreak, where both players had their chances.

Osaka squandered two match points and Korpatsch two set points before Osaka prevailed on her third opportunity with a powerful forehand down the line.

She said courtside that motherhood had changed her outlook on the game, and she had felt too isolated from fans and fellow players previously.

“The last couple of years that I played before I had my daughter I didn’t return as much love as I was given,” she said.

“So I really feel like that’s what I want to do in this chapter. I just really appreciate people coming out and cheering for me.

“I would say she’s (her daughter) helped me grow up so much so quickly,” Osaka added.

Second seed Grigor Dimitrov was also recovered from losing the first set to defeat former world number one Andy Murray 4-6, 7-5, 6-2.

Earlier, Russia’s Roman Safiullin ousted third seeded American Ben Shelton 6-3, 6-7 (5/7), 6-3 in a match lasting over two-and-a-half hours.

Japan call on Mitoma to help erase Asian Cup ‘frustration’

Brighton winger Kaoru Mitoma was named in Japan’s Asian Cup squad yesterday despite an ankle injury, as coach Hajime Moriyasu looks to erase the “frustration” of their 2019 final defeat.

Brighton coach Roberto De Zerbi said last week that Mitoma would be out for up to six weeks after hurting his ankle in a 1-1 draw with Crystal Palace on December 21.

But Moriyasu still included the player in his 26-man squad for the Asian Cup in Qatar, which kicks off on January 12.

“Given his current injury situation, I don’t know if he will be ready to play in the first game or not,” Moriyasu said of the 26-year-old.

Winfred is one of Bahrain's leading hopefuls for a medal at this year's Olympic Games. At the previous Olympiad in Tokyo in 2021, she could not meet her goals, but is determined to do so this time around.

Winfred is also eyeing the steeplechase world record. She attempted to attack it last year,

and she came close, setting a

blistering mark of eight minutes 50.66 seconds to set a new Asian and Bahraini record, en route to claiming her Diamond Trophy.

It was also the second-fastest time in history, as she inched closer to Kenyan Beatrice Chepkoech's world mark of 8:44.32 set in 2018.

Aside from her steeplechase gold medal at the Asian Games in Hangzhou, China, she secured a fantastic double after also winning gold in the women's 1,500m.

Winfred also set a new Asiad record in the steeplechase of 9:18.28 en route to her victory. She shattered the previous mark of 9:31.36, set by another former world champion of Bahrain, Ruth Jebet, in the 2014 edition in Incheon, South Korea.

Furthermore, Winfred successfully defended her steeple-

chase title from the 2018 Asiad in Jakarta, Indonesia, and captured the third Asian Games gold medal of her illustrious career.

Winfred continues to train ahead of this year's athletics season, which will lead up to the Paris Olympics, scheduled to take place in July and August.

Dominant Swiatek sends Poland into United Cup quarter-finals

An irrepressible Iga Swiatek unleashed on Spain Monday as Poland booked a 2-1 win to move into the quarter-finals of the United Cup.

The world number one showed no mercy to Sara Sorribes Tormo in a 6-2, 6-1 singles victory before teaming with Hubert Hurkacz to clinch the tie with a 6-0, 6-0 mixed doubles thrashing in just 53 minutes.

Hurkacz was ambushed in the day's opening singles, losing 3-6, 6-3, 6-4 to Alejandro Davidovich Fokina.

The top-seeded Poles finished Group A play with a perfect 2-0 record and await a last-eight opponent.

Swiatek, who has lost only seven games in two singles matches to start her countdown to the Australian Open, said playing mixed doubles was good experience.

In Sydney, a sharp Casper Ruud won his second straight singles match before backing up in the mixed doubles to steer Norway past Croatia.

World number 24 Donna

Vekic ground past unheralded Malene Helgo 7-5, 3-6, 6-3 to give the Croats a winning start to the Group F tie.

But three-time Grand Slam finalist Ruud swept past Borna Coric 6-4, 6-1 in just 89 minutes to level proceedings, then partnered with Ulrikke Eikeri to beat Vekic and Ivan Dodig 6-2, 3-6, 10-7.

It was a much-needed win for Norway, who lost to the Netherlands at the weekend.

"I'm motivated for the new year, I'm fresh and I'm ready," said world number 11 Ruud. "Another great singles match. I'm very happy to start the new year that way."

The win followed a similarly dominant 6-3, 6-4 victory over Dutchman Tallon Griekspoor

on Saturday.

Ruud has dropped serve just once through the two matches, and was not broken on Monday.

He also won 12 of 13 net approaches and said he had been working hard to improve his volleys.

"I'll never be the guy who is all over the net, but I'm trying to come into the court a little more," he said.

Vekic needed two hours and 49 minutes to battle past Helgo, who played far better than her ranking of 539 suggested.

"She's a really good player and her ranking doesn't do her justice," said Vekic, a quarter-finalist at the Australian Open last year. "Finally my serve showed up in the third set, which made it easier."

The Alexander Zverev-led Germany meet France in Group D later Monday in Sydney, while the defending champions United States face Australia in Perth.

Anisimova makes winning return after long tennis break

American wildcard Amanda Anisimova claimed a sizeable scalp Monday in her return after eight months away from tennis, upsetting Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova in straight sets at the Auckland Classic.

Anisimova toppled her accomplished opponent 7-5, 6-4 in her first appearance on the WTA Tour since announcing in May she would take an indefinite break, citing burnout and concerns for her mental health.

The 22-year-old former French Open semi-finalist showed no sign of rust, displaying the powerful game that lifted her to a world ranking just outside the top 20 in her

teens.

Anisimova spoke in the lead-up to the tournament of being better equipped mentally for the rigours of the professional circuit thanks to her break.

She withdrew completely from tennis for four months, before gradually resuming training in September.

But she revealed she nearly didn't take the court for her first-round match after waking up with "horrible" muscle spasms in her shoulder.

"I was just so upset because I had the wildcard for this tournament," she said.

"I really wanted to play for myself today but also for the tournament -- I was really appreciative of them giving me the opportunity.
