

February fuel prices approved

The Fuel Price Determination and Monitoring Committee at the Ministry of Oil and Environment announced the approved fuel prices for the local market in the Kingdom of Bahrain for the month of February 2026, effective today.

According to the decision, the price of Super (98) gasoline has been set at BD0.265 per liter, Premium (95) gasoline at BD0.235 per liter, and Good (91) gasoline at BD0.218 per liter.

Diesel fuel is priced at BD0.200 per liter, with continued support provided to Bahraini fishermen as part of ongoing efforts to support vital sectors and enhance the sustainability of activities related to food security.

The announcement comes as part of the Committee's periodic monitoring of fuel prices in response to global energy market changes.

The decision aims to strike a balance between meeting local market needs and maintaining economic stability, in coordination with the Ministry of Oil and Environment and relevant authorities.

Causeway toll fees updated

The King Fahd Causeway Authority has announced an update to toll fees, effective February 18, 2026.

The move comes as part of ongoing efforts to enhance services and improve the crossing experience for travelers between the Kingdom of Bahrain and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

According to details shared via the authority's official X account, one-way tolls will be 35 riyals for cars and motorcycles, 55 riyals for minibuses, 70 riyals for large buses, and 7 riyals per ton for trucks.

The authority confirmed that fees for people with disabilities, students, and frequent daily travelers will remain unchanged.

Bridge users are encouraged to utilise the available digital services and to follow official channels for the latest updates on crossing procedures and toll fees.

Shura Council backs GCC unified land-transport rules for smoother cross-border road haulage

● **New decree-law aims to streamline goods movement and address delays**

The Shura Council approved yesterday Decree-Law No. (35) of 2025, adopting the Gulf Cooperation Council's unified land-transport rules for cross-border road haulage between member states.

The decree-law was passed by name vote and sent to the Speaker of the Council of Representatives to inform the government.

During the debate, His Excellency Dr Abdullah bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, Minister of the Ministry of Transportation and Tele-

communications, said the sector was running on too thin a legal base, with pressure felt most at the King Fahd Causeway.

"We are facing a legislative gap in Bahrain and at the international level, particularly at the King Fahd Causeway where major challenges appear," he told members.

Traffic

He said the scale of freight traffic was clear.

"We have more than 2,300 trucks belonging to 150 companies," he said, adding that the ministry had brought in remote inspection to cut delays. "Remote inspection will help speed up procedures and make things easier."

H.E. Dr Abdullah said Bahrain moved to ratify the unified rules after neighbours started applying them.

"Saudi Arabia was the first state to ratify it, so it was neces-

Report

The Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee backed the decree-law in a report debated by the chamber.

Its rapporteur, Abdullah Al Nuaimi, said the step followed decisions taken by GCC leaders at their 43rd Supreme Council session and was meant to deal with delays after the date set

for work under the unified rules had passed.

The report said the hold-up risked leaving a legal gap that could disrupt cross-border traffic, especially with Saudi Arabia already applying the system, and could harm Bahraini carriers in an open regional market.

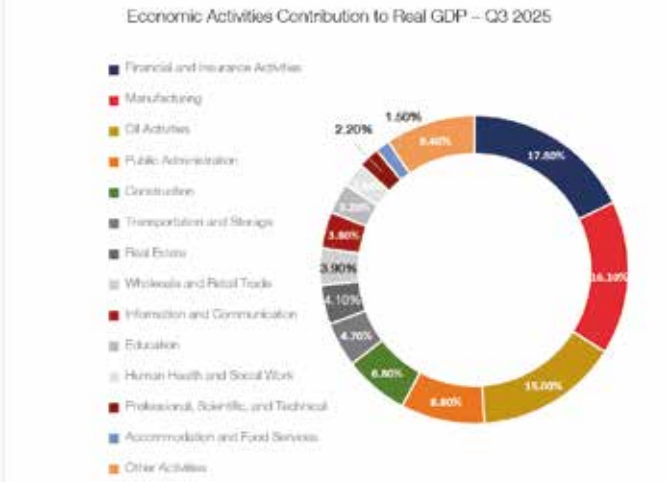
Under the decree-law, Bahrain approves the attached unified regulation, defines the "competent authority" as the body to be named by decree, and sets an exchange rate for application purposes at one Bahraini dinar to ten riyals.

Grievances

It also sets a route for grievances against decisions taken under the regulation and its executive rules, keeps existing decisions in force until those executive rules are issued, and includes an implementing article.

The attached regulation has 25 articles.

Services Drive Growth



Financial and insurance activities led Bahrain's GDP contribution in the third quarter of 2025, underscoring the growing role of services in the economy.

Bahrain's economy expanded steadily in the third quarter of 2025, with growth increasingly driven by services, trade and digital activity rather than oil alone, according to a new report by the Bahrain Chamber.

Real GDP grew by four percent year on year in the third quarter, supported by a 3.1 percent rise in the non-oil economy. Real estate emerged as the fastest-growing non-oil sector, expanding by 5.4 percent, followed by financial and insurance activities at five percent and education at 4.8 percent.

The report shows that financial and insurance activities are now the largest contributor to real GDP, accounting for 17.8 percent of output, ahead of manufacturing and oil activities. Manufacturing contributed 16.1 percent, while oil activities accounted for 15 percent.

Trade momentum also strengthened during the quarter. The volume of trade between Bahrain and other GCC

countries rose by 22 percent compared to the same period last year, increasing to \$2.15 billion. Trade with Saudi Arabia and the UAE continued to dominate, while trade with Oman recorded the fastest growth, surging by 116 percent year on year.

Domestic economic activity reflected a shift towards digital payments and consumer spending. The value of point-of-sale transactions rose by 12 percent, while electronic fund transfers through the Fawri and Fawateer systems recorded strong double-digit growth. At the same time, the value of ATM withdrawals declined by 11 percent.

The report also noted a decline in business loan interest rates across major sectors, including construction, manufacturing and trade, alongside Bahrain's continued top ranking in the MENA region for mobile network excellence during the quarter. Oil prices fell during the period, but the report indicates that non-oil sectors and regional trade helped sustain overall economic growth.

Discussions further examined the impact of climate change, the role of skills and diversity in enhancing labour productivity, and

emerging labour market trends across member states.

The Abu Dhabi Consultation aims to align policies and perspectives on labour markets

and promote constructive dialogue between labour-sending and labour-receiving countries, in support of shared interests and sustained economic growth.

This is achieved through the development of balanced labour policies that respond to market needs, safeguard workers' rights, and ensure safe and supportive working environments, while keeping pace with labour market transformations, particularly emerging professions requiring advanced skills, and prioritising optimal investment in human capital and the integration of citizens into promising sectors and future jobs.

Meat prices surge ahead of Ramadan

Lamb, beef, and cherished traditional dishes for flavourful Iftar meals

With Ramadan around the corner, homes across Bahrain will soon be filled with the aroma of spices and the warmth of family gatherings, with meat taking center stage on Iftar tables.

Among the beloved dishes, salona served with fresh bread will shine as a hearty favourite, satisfying both tradition and taste.

With demand set to soar, shoppers will not only think about flavour; they will also watch prices and weigh the variety and quality of meat available this season.

Bahraini people consider lamb an essential ingredient in their cooking, especially during the Holy Month of Ramadan, using it in traditional rice dishes like Mandi, Salona, and Harees.

Vendor

Speaking to The Daily Tribune, a vendor highlighted that meat prices start rising from Rajab and continue to increase until Ramadan approaches, typically climbing by 300 to 500 fils

per kilogram.

A closer look at Bahrain's meat markets shows a clear taste for freshness, with chilled lamb flying off the shelves while frozen cuts remain a less popular, budget-friendly option.

Kenyan lamb typically sells for around BD3 per kilogram, while Australian lamb has seen an earlier-than-usual price jump, now going for about BD3.2

per kilogram, up from BD2.7, as shop-pers rush to stock up ahead of Ramadan.

Choice

Traders say Australian lamb remains the preferred choice for its freshness and quality, while some Kenyan cuts offer thinner ribs with less meat.

Top-rated Pakistani beef is priced at BD2.5 per kilogram,

with boneless cuts at BD3, while Somali cattle are mostly sold for BD 65 as whole animals and weighing 13 to 15 kilograms, though they contain more fat than other varieties.

As Ramadan approaches, Bahrain's markets come alive.

Restaurants and caterers buy whole carcasses for nightly Iftar feasts, while families pick cuts that fit their size.

The buzz grows as communities stock up for Mandi, Harees, and other traditional dishes.

Warning

Traders warn that after Eid, demand drops fast, making left-overs harder to sell - so for now, it's the busiest and priciest season of the year.

One of the buyers told The Daily Tribune, "We eat meat twice a week during Ramadan, but after Ramadan, it might be just once a week."

This reflects how meat consumption in Bahrain peaks during the holy month and gradually returns to a more moderate pace afterward, highlighting both the cultural importance of meat in Ramadan and the practical considerations of households.

Dignity reinforced and rights upheld

Shura Council backs amendments strengthening protections for persons with disabilities

● **New decree-law advances reforms while preserving existing benefits**

The Shura Council approved yesterday a decree-law amending the 2006 law on the care, rehabilitation and employment of persons with disabilities, after its Services Committee said the changes meet constitutional and legal tests and leave existing rights and benefits unchanged.

The decree-law, Decree-Law No. (34) of 2025 amending Law No. (74) of 2006, was passed by roll-call vote and sent to the Speaker of Parliament to notify the government.

The committee said the text was issued under Article 38 of the Constitution during Parliament's recess and submitted to both chambers within the legal time limits.

His Excellency Osama Al Alawi, told the sitting the decree-law “strengthens the legal basis for a set of procedures” that accompanied its issue, including changes to the ministry’s set-up for disability services.

He said Bahrain would keep the term “persons with disabilities” in legal texts in line with the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, ratified under Law No. (22) of 2011, while using newer labels in organisational structures and services to support empowerment and inclusion.

Terms

Shura Council member Ali Al Haddad said the decree-law “brings the terms used in the law into line with the current set-up and removes any duplication or clash in names”, adding that it does so “without affecting the rights and benefits granted to persons with disabilities”.

The Services Committee said the amendments are limited to how bodies are arranged and coordinated, including titles and committee arrangements, and do not change the substantive provisions of the 2006 law.

Wording

The Services Committee said the wording leaves more scope for future changes to the set-up without needing to amend the law each time.

Council approval clears path for Hamala garden project

Formal approval has been confirmed to proceed with the development of a public garden on a designated plot of land in Hamala, clearing the way for the project to move from planning to implementation.

The decision reflects the completion of administrative coordination and legal verification required to secure the land for municipal use.

The site was previously under the authority of the Ministry of Housing before being transferred to the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture.

Registration

It has since been officially classified as a public garden, with its registration confirmed as a government owned prop-

erty allocated for municipal services.

This classification establishes the legal framework necessary for development and long term maintenance.

The proposed garden is intended to serve as a recreational and environmental outlet for residents of Hamala, responding to community needs for open public spaces within residential areas.

Objectives

Municipal officials have indicated that the project aligns with broader objectives to enhance liveability and improve access to green spaces across neighbourhoods in the Northern Governorate.

A field visit was conducted to review the current condition of the land and follow up on procedural progress. The visit confirmed that the site is suitable for development.

Caution over fraudulent online store accounts

The Cybercrime Directorate has warned of the spread of fake store accounts on Instagram that impersonate the names and logos of well-known retailers, appearing as official accounts in order to deceive users and steal their money.

The authority explained that these accounts rely on copying the visual identity of original stores and using similar images and posts, while offering attractive promotions to gain followers’ trust.

Victims are then asked to transfer money or communicate through applications outside the platform, such as WhatsApp.

Methods

It stressed that these methods are among the most common forms of online fraud in recent times, urging users to verify official accounts through authorized websites or recognized store branches, and not to rely solely on the account name or logo.

Users were also advised to remain cautious before making purchases, review the account’s history, check genuine engagement and ratings, and report any suspicious accounts, noting that digital awareness is the first line of defense against cyber fraud.

Bahrain participates in Arab and Indian forum

The Kingdom of Bahrain participated in the second ministerial meeting of the Arab-Indian Cooperation Forum.

India budget pledges record infrastructure and defence boost

New Delhi plans to spend \$133 billion on infrastructure and \$85 billion on defence

India will spend a record amount on infrastructure and defence, the finance minister said in her national budget speech on Sunday, with plans for high-speed rail, submarines and fighter jets.

New Delhi plans to spend \$133 billion on infrastructure and \$85 billion on defence, a respective rise of around nine

and 15 percent compared to last year's budget.

Data centres, artificial intelligence, and the mining and processing of rare earths will also receive government support, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman told parliament.

She said public spending on infrastructure had increased dramatically from around \$21 billion (2 trillion rupees) in 2014-15 and that it was now at an "all-time high".

'Best interest'

Defence minister Rajnath Singh described the spending as "unprecedented" and said it would help equip India's armed forces with fighter jets, drones, ships, submarines and other critical hardware.

"It is in the best interest of the nation," he added.

New Delhi is in the midst of negotiating defence contracts with domestic and international suppliers, including France, the United States and Germany.

The world's most populous country sees massive infrastructure spending as key to sustaining its high growth rate by boosting domestic manufacturing and creating millions of new jobs.

"India is not content with simply being the fastest-growing economy," Prime Minister Narendra Modi said after the budget.

"India wants to become the world's third-largest economy.

This year's budget presents an ambitious roadmap to give new momentum to domestic manufacturing and self-reliance.

Sectors including textiles, pharmaceuticals, electronics and chemicals are primary targets to boost exports, Sitharaman said.

She promised the development of business parks for textiles and chemicals and said \$5 billion would be spent on boosting domestic electronics manufacturing.

'Confident steps'

It is the first budget since US President Donald Trump imposed 50 percent tariffs on most Indian imports in August.

New Delhi and Washington are in the process of negotiating a long-delayed trade agreement.

But relations have soured over India's purchases of Russian oil, which Washington says is helping bankroll Moscow's war in Ukraine.

New Delhi signed a major trade deal with the European Union last month, with many crediting Trump's tariffs for helping finalise the deal.

"Today, we face an external environment in which trade and multilateralism are imperilled, and access to resources and supply chains are disrupted," Sitharaman said in parliament.

"India will continue to take confident steps towards 'Viksit Bharat' (developed India) by balancing ambition with inclusion".

The budget touted plans for seven high-speed rail corridors linking some of India's most important cities, including Mumbai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Pune, and Chennai.

It also puts forward a scheme to build "rare earth corridors" in four mineral-rich states in southern and eastern India.

"I propose to provide a tax holiday till 2047 to any foreign company that provides cloud services to customers globally by using data centre services from India," Sitharaman said in her speech.



The first Union Budget of independent India was presented on 26 November 1947 by Finance Minister R. K. Shanmukham Chetty – it planned to spend Rs 197.29 crore against expected revenue of Rs 171.15 crore, resulting in a modest deficit to help the newly independent country get started.

◆ **US House Speaker** Mike Johnson expressed confidence Sunday that he has the votes to end by Tuesday a partial government shutdown triggered by the Trump administration's violent immigration sweeps in Minneapolis. The government entered the shutdown Saturday as a funding deadline passed without Congress approving a 2026 budget. The impact so far appears to have been minimal. The House is due to begin acting on the emergency Monday as it returns from recess to a snowbound Washington, addressing a Senate-backed deal to reopen the government. "Let's say I'm confident that we'll do it at least by Tuesday," Johnson said on NBC's "Meet the Press." The funding lapse followed a breakdown in negotiations driven by Democratic anger over the killing of two protesters in Minneapolis by federal immigration agents, which derailed talks over new money for the Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

US House speaker sees swift end to government shutdown

◆ **Trump says he welcomes Chinese investment in Venezuelan oil**

◆ **US President Donald** Trump said Saturday he would "welcome" Chinese investment in Venezuela's oil industry as the South American country seeks to revive its battered economy following the ouster of leader Nicolas Maduro. Venezuela sits on the world's largest proven oil reserves and reformed laws this week to open the sector up to private and foreign investment. China had been the dominant buyer of Venezuelan oil under Maduro, whose January 3 capture by US forces drew condemnation from China's foreign ministry and made uncertain Beijing's future with Caracas. "China is welcome to come in and would make a great deal on oil. We welcome China," Trump told reporters Saturday on Air Force One. He noted Venezuela's Interim President Delcy Rodriguez on Friday agreed to an energy cooperation deal with India.



◆ **Indonesia will** restore access to Elon Musk's AI chatbot Grok after the billionaire's social media platform X promised to comply with the country's laws, a government official said yesterday. Grok has faced a global backlash after it emerged that its image creation feature allowed users to sexualise pictures of women and children using simple text prompts. Malaysia and the Philippines followed Indonesia in temporarily blocking access to the tool, which is integrated into X, over concerns about AI-generated sexual deepfakes. Alexander Sabar, a senior official in Indonesia's communication and digital ministry, said access was being restored "conditionally" after X Corp gave "a written commitment containing concrete steps for service improvement and prevention of misuse". Sabar said in a statement the ministry would continue to supervise and evaluate Grok and that it would take "corrective actions", including another suspension, if violations were found.

New Epstein accuser claims sexual encounter with ex-prince Andrew: report

A second Jeffrey Epstein accuser has alleged the late US sex offender sent her to Britain for a sexual encounter with former prince Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor, the BBC reported.

A US lawyer for the woman told the broadcaster late Saturday the alleged encounter occurred at the ousted royal's residence on the Windsor estate, west of London, in 2010 when she was in her 20s.

The latest account emerged after the US Justice Department released a huge new batch of documents on the Epstein case, including photographs of Andrew kneeling over a woman lying on the floor.

UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer has said the disgraced royal should accept requests to testify before the US Congress about Epstein's crimes.

Brad Edwards, from the Florida legal firm Edwards Henderson, said that after spending the night with Andrew, the woman said she was given a tour of Buckingham Palace.

He added there were communications between his client and the former prince before the alleged encounter and that he is now considering filing a civil lawsuit on her behalf.

The lawyer, who reportedly represents more than 200 survivors of Epstein abuse, did not

immediately respond to AFP's request for comment.

Andrew could not be reached for comment but has repeatedly denied any wrongdoing linked to Epstein.

The claim comes more than a decade after sexual assault accusations against the ex-Duke of York by another Epstein accuser, Virginia Giuffre, first emerged publicly.

Giuffre, a US and Australian citizen who took her own life last year, has alleged she was trafficked to have sex with Andrew three times, including twice when she was 17.

After she launched a lawsuit against him, he paid her a multi-million-pound settlement in 2022 without making any admission of guilt.

Iran says progress made towards US talks **despite attack jitters**

Iran's top security official said Saturday that progress had been made towards negotiations with the United States, even as the Islamic republic's army chief warned Washington against launching military strikes.

US President Donald Trump confirmed the two sides were talking, while keeping the threat of an attack in the foreground.

Washington has deployed warships led by the USS Abraham Lincoln aircraft carrier off Iran's shores, after Trump threatened to intervene in the wake of Tehran's deadly crackdown on anti-government protests.

"Contrary to the hype of the contrived media war, structural arrangements for negotiations are progressing," said Ali Larijani, head of Iran's Supreme National Security Council.

He was speaking a day after the Kremlin said he held talks in Moscow with Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian said Saturday a broader conflict would hurt both Iran and the United States.

"The Islamic Republic of Iran has never sought, and in no way seeks, war and it is firmly convinced that a war would be in the interest of neither Iran, nor the United States, nor the region," he said in a call with Egyptian counterpart Abdel Fattah al-Sisi, according to the Iranian presidency.

Later Saturday, Trump confirmed that there was a dialogue between Washington and Tehran.

"(Iran is) talking to us, and we'll see if we can do something, otherwise we'll see what happens... we have a big fleet heading out there," he told Fox News.

"They are negotiating," he added.

Qatar's foreign ministry said its premier Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani, who also serves as foreign minister, held talks in Tehran with Larijani on Saturday to try to "de-escalate tensions in the region".

Fears of conflict

The arrival of the US flotilla has raised fears of a direct confrontation with Iran, which has warned it would respond with missile strikes on US bases, ships and allies -- notably Israel -- in the event of an attack.

Trump has said he believes Iran will make a deal over its

Iran protester Erfan Soltani released on bail: lawyer

Iranian protester Erfan Soltani has been released on bail, his lawyer told AFP, after the United States warned he was due to be executed though Tehran denied he had been sentenced to death.

The 26-year-old "was re-

leased yesterday (Saturday) and received all of his belongings including his cellphone", said lawyer Amir Mousakhani, adding that a bail of "two billion tomans" (around \$12,600) was paid for his release.

Soltani was arrested on January 10 during recent nationwide protests in Iran.

He was held in a detention facility in Karaj outside Tehran, on charges of propaganda against Iran's Islamic system and acting against national security, the judiciary had said in January. The US State Department had said on its Persian-language X account that he had been sentenced to death.

"If the enemy makes a mistake, without a doubt it will endanger its own security, the security of the region, and the security of the Zionist regime," Hatami said, of-

ficial news agency IRNA reported. Iran's nuclear technology and expertise "cannot be eliminated", he added.

With tensions heightened, Iranian authorities rushed to deny that several incidents on Saturday were linked to any attack or sabotage.

They included an explosion in the southern Iranian port city of Bandar Abbas that local firefighters said was caused by a gas leak.

Naval exercise

On Friday, US Central Command (CENTCOM) said Iran's

Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) would conduct "a two-day live-fire naval exercise" in the Strait of Hormuz, a key transit hub for global energy supplies.

CENTCOM warned the IRGC against "any unsafe and unprofessional behaviour near US forces", drawing a sharp response from Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi.

"The US military is now attempting to dictate how our Powerful Armed Forces should conduct target practice in their own turf," he wrote on X.

Israel says partially reopening Gaza's Rafah crossing

Rafah, Palestinian Territories

Israel partially reopened the Rafah crossing between the devastated Gaza Strip and Egypt yesterday, following months of appeals from aid groups, though access is limited to pedestrians.

COGAT, the Israeli defence ministry body coordinating Palestinian civilian affairs, made no mention of allowing in a long hoped-for surge of aid, and clarified that the passage of individuals through

the gateway in both directions was expected to begin Monday. Rafah is considered a key entry point for supplies into the devastated Palestinian territory, where humanitarian conditions remain dire after two years of war in spite of a ceasefire in place since October 10.

The crossing has been closed since Israeli forces seized control of it in May 2024 during the war with Hamas, aside from a brief and limited reopening in early 2025.

MSF said it had tried for months to engage with Israeli authorities over the issue, but its attempts were unsuccessful.

MSF charged that the ministry's move was a "pretext to obstruct humanitarian assistance" to Gaza.

"Israeli authorities are forcing humanitarian organisations into an impossible choice between exposing staff to risk or interrupting critical medical care for people in desperate need," it said in a statement issued on Sunday.

"MSF did not hand over staff names because Israeli authorities failed to provide the concrete assurances required to guarantee our staff's safety, protect their personal data, and uphold the independence of our medical operation," it said.

Such demands by Israel will force aid organisations to pull out when "needs are overwhelming and health services are collapsing" in Gaza, it said.

"At a moment when more

humanitarian assistance is urgently needed, it is being restricted rather than facilitated," the charity said, adding that it remained open for dialogue with Israeli authorities to maintain its services in Gaza and the occupied West Bank.



MSF has long been a key provider of medical and humanitarian aid in Gaza, particularly since the war broke out in October 2023 after Hamas's attack on Israel. The charity says it currently provides at least 20 percent of hospital beds in the territory and operates around 20 health centres.

Indian Budget 2026 aims to promote prosperity at home and abroad

In the backdrop of estimated GDP growth of 7.4 percent (with nominal GDP growth at 8 per cent) for FY 2025-26, the Finance Minister of India, Ms. Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Union budget for 2026 on 1 February in New Delhi. Describing the Budget 2026 as historic, Indian Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi asserted that it reflects the aspirations of the 140 crore (1.4 billion) Indians, strengthens the economic reforms journey and charts a clear road map for Viksit Bharat or Developed India by 2047.

Strong macroeconomic fundamentals

The budget shows that the macroeconomic fundamentals of the Indian economy are strong. The country's GDP has passed USD 4.13 trillion. IMF states that while India accounts for 17 per cent of projected world-wide economic growth expansion, the USA sits at less than 10 percent. The fiscal deficit for 2027 is estimated at 4.3 percent of India's GDP while the debt-to-GDP ratio is expected to be 55.6 percent of GDP in 2026-27, slightly lower than 56.1 percent in 2025-26.

The services sector remains the primary growth driver, expanding by 9.1 per cent. Manufacturing and construction have grown by 7 per cent. Domestic demand continues to anchor growth. India's total exports (merchandise and services) reached USD 825.3 billion in FY25, with continued momentum in FY26.

Forward looking and reform oriented

Some of the significant initiatives of the Budget 2026 include the plans to develop seven High-Speed Rail corridors between cities as 'growth connectors' to promote environmentally sustainable passenger systems, significant outlay for Carbon Capture Utilization and Storage technologies, establishing dedicated Rare Earth Corridors, launching the Bharat-VISTAAR (a multilingual AI tool to improve agriculture sector), various tax related measures to attract global investment and improve ease of doing business and the like. It is pertinent to mention that since August 2025, almost 350 new economic reform measures have been unveiled including GST simplification, notification of Labour Codes, and rationalization of mandatory Quality Control Orders. More efforts are expected focusing on deregulation and reducing compliance requirements.

The budget has been inspired by three 'kartavyas' or duties of the Government of India, namely, (a) accelerating and sustaining economic growth, by enhancing productivity and competitiveness, and building resilience to volatile global dynamics, (b) fulfilling the aspirations of people and building their capacity, making them strong partners in India's path to prosperity, and (c) ensuring that every family, community, region and sector has access to resources, amenities and opportunities for meaningful participation. Also significantly, the budget is also focused on the youth.

International cooperation

India's Union Budget comes in the wake of a series of important developments in India's external engagement like the India-EU FTA, India-Arab League cooperation, India-GCC engagement besides the active bilateral commercial and trade links between India and countries around the world, in particular in the GCC area. The clear and unmistakable message is the commitment of India to multilateral cooperation and pursuing close ties with all economic partners around the world. This augurs well for India-Bahrain bilateral relations, especially as we celebrate the 55th anniversary of establishment of diplomatic relations. Equally significant is the Kingdom of Bahrain's presidency of the GCC and its participation in the UN Security Council for the two year term that started in January 2026. India strongly supports Bahrain's role and looks forward to working together for taking the bilateral relations forward.

Prime Minister of Bermuda Welcomed in Bahrain



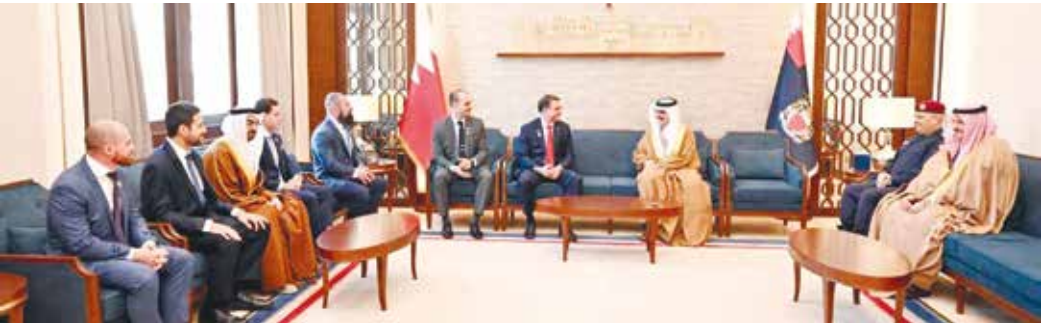

American University of Bahrain Concludes MISTI Program in Collaboration with BBK

The American University of Bahrain (AUBH) has concluded the MIT International Science and Technology Initiatives (MISTI), powered by Bank of Bahrain and Kuwait (BBK). The program aimed to enhance applied learning and technological innovation among higher education students while linking academic knowledge with real world challenges within the industrial sector.

The MISTI program, which was hosted by AUBH for the fourth consecutive year, concluded with a closing event attended by representatives from BBK. During the event, 33 students from 9 public and private universities across the Kingdom of Bahrain presented their projects and research findings developed throughout the program.

Throughout the program, students addressed real safety and reliability challenges within the oil refining sector. Project work



focused on applying artificial intelligence to predictive maintenance models to anticipate potential equipment failures, intelligent real time detection of abnormal conditions based on sensor and environmental data, and the use of computer vision technologies to enhance compliance with safety procedures.

During the first week, students defined problem scopes

and designed their projects with guidance from MIT graduate students and faculty from AUBH. The second week focused on developing prototypes that combine software solutions with technical components, followed by a third week dedicated to testing, validation, and further development. The program concluded in the fourth week with final project presentations,

submission of reports, and discussions on scalability and potential pathways for practical implementation.

Dr. Wafa Almansoori, Interim President and Provost of the American University of Bahrain, expressed her sincere appreciation to BBK for its support and sponsorship of the MISTI program: "We are proud to conclude the MISTI program in collabo-

ration with MIT. The program achieved tangible outcomes by engaging students in the development of practical proof of concept solutions to real industrial challenges, strengthening collaboration between academia and industry, and enriching the student learning experience through applied, team-based work in an environment that mirrors industrial practice. This

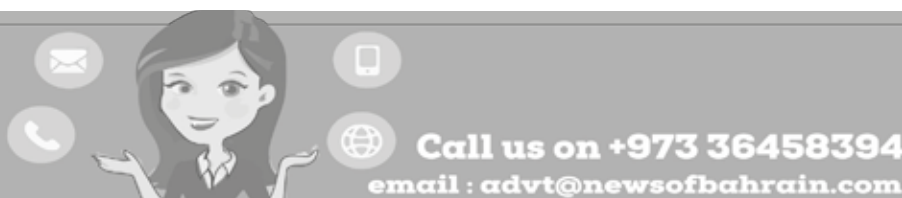

Mujtaba Hussain picked out Daniel Omokhoa on the far post, who tapped home to complete the turnaround.

The quarter-finals continue today with Muharraq facing Isa Town at 7pm at Khalifa Sports City, while Riffa take on Manama at Shaikh Ali bin Mohammed Stadium, also at 7pm.

Alcaraz sweeps past Djokovic to win 'dream' Australian Open

● **Alcaraz defeats Djokovic 2-6, 6-2, 6-3, 7-5**

● **Completes career Grand Slam aged just 22**

Carlos Alcaraz swept past Novak Djokovic to win his first Australian Open yesterday and become the youngest man to complete a career Grand Slam, denying the Serbian great an unprecedented 25th major.

The Spaniard was imperious after a slow start in dismissing the 38-year-old, 2-6, 6-2, 6-3, 7-5 on Rod Laver Arena to claim a seventh Slam title and cement himself as undisputed world number one.

He becomes the youngest man in the Open era to win all four majors, adding to his two titles each from Wimbledon and the French and US Opens.

At 22, he surpassed legendary countryman Rafael Nadal -- in the crowd to witness the feat -- who was 24 when he did

the same. A seventh Slam put him alongside John McEnroe and Mats Wilander and one behind Andre Agassi, Jimmy Connors and Ivan Lendl.

"Lifting the trophy for the first time in Australia was crazy," Alcaraz said, before writing on a TV camera lens: "Job finished. Four out of four complete."

He added: "A dream come true. I dreamt about getting an Australian Open and completing the career Grand Slam."

He paid tribute to Djokovic. "You were talking about how I'm doing the things I am, but what you're doing is really inspiring, not only for tennis players but athletes around the world."

It was a first defeat for Djokovic in a Melbourne final, having won all 10 previously, leaving him still searching for a landmark 25th major to better Australia's Margaret Court, who was also watching on centre court.

Djokovic, striving to become the oldest man to lift a Grand Slam singles trophy, last won one at the US Open in 2023. Since then Alcaraz and Jannik Sinner have dominated.

Rotax MAX karters step up intense battles as second half of season gets underway

The Bahrain Rotax MAX Challenge (BRMC) kicked off the second half of its 2025/2026 season over the weekend with an exciting fifth round at Bahrain International Karting Circuit (BIKC) in Sakhir. Rashid Almahroos, Rayyan Najjar, Shaikh Ahmed bin Saqer Al Khalifa, Rashid Hilal, and Abdulqader Qasem were all triumphant in their respective competition categories. The meeting featured plenty of high-octane, wheel-to-wheel battles along BIKC's 1.414-kilometre CIK-FIA track as the fight for wins, podiums, and cham-

pionship points continued to intensify. The BRMC is the Kingdom's premier national karting championship, and it features competitors of various ages and nationalities racing in their very own Rotax-powered machinery. The championship is organised and run by Bahrain International Circuit and BIKC in cooperation with the Bahrain Motor Federation and Bahrain Karting Commission. Rashid took his victory in the Micro MAX category. Enzo Younes started the day strongly by topping the practice timesheet, but Rashid took pole position in qualifying and charged to the victory in the pre-final. He then won the nine-lap final from pole in a total race time of nine minutes 14.157 seconds. Enzo followed 2.937s behind as the runner-up, while Sami Albandak came third 7.773s from first place. Rayyan captured his win in the Mini MAX class. Faisal Alnajjar was the pace-setter in practice

and he also took pole in qualifying. But in the pre-final, Rayyan emerged victorious, and then he led the final from start to finish to take the chequered flag in 8:52.810 after nine laps. Leo Saruhan followed 0.248s back, while Faisal came third 0.363s adrift. Amongst the Junior MAX fleet, Shaikh Ahmed claimed the all-important win. Jude Andrews began the meeting by outpacing Shaikh Ahmed by a mere 0.005s in practice, but Shaikh Ahmed powered to the top in qualifying and the pre-final. He then rode his momentum into the 15-lap final where he secured a pole-to-flag victory in 13:45.907. Leopold Juch came second 0.148s from the victor, while Ryan Suckling rounded out the podium 8.129s behind. In a tight Senior MAX final, Hilal inherited the victory despite finishing fifth on the road after 15 laps, with all four drivers ahead of him being handed post-race penalties.



Luca Houghton had led practice and qualifying before Khaled Najjar won the pre-final. But in the decisive stage, and with the Senior MAX class featuring a packed 17-karter grid, the order was jumbled in the first few laps and a series of penalties were later issued by the stewards. Hilal was eventually promoted

to first with a winning time of 13:35.763, while his fellow-podium finishers Yousif Alaali and Mohammed Hilal also benefited from the penalties. Alaali was classified second overall 0.520s behind Rashid Hilal after finishing eighth on the road, while Mohammed Hilal rose to third 1.680s back after originally taking ninth.

In the DD2 MAX class, Rakan Alfayez led practice and Abdulla Sajjad took pole in qualifying, but Qasem took charge in the pre-final. He went on to win the final from pole in 13:17.436 after 15 laps, followed by Alfayez 0.232s behind and Mohammed Sajjad with a 14.030s gap. After all the action, the winners and other top-three placers were presented their respective trophies in the podium ceremonies. The BRMC features a total of eight rounds in its 2025/2026 calendar. Round six is scheduled for 13 February, and then the seventh and penultimate meeting will then be held on 28 March. That will pave the way for the championship finale, slated for 18 April at BIKC. Freddy Schott won his first DP World Tour title after beating Calum Hill and Patrick Reed in a play-off at the 2026 Bapco Energies Bahrain Championship.

The trio were locked together at 17 under par after 72 holes after Reed shot 67 yesterday to make up a four-shot overnight deficit to Hill, who began the day two clear but had to settle for a 71 after a bogey at the difficult final hole. Schott carded 69 to join the pair.

Reed bogeyed the first play-off hole to drop out of contention and after Hill went out of bounds second time round, before sending his fourth shot into the water, he sportingly conceded without making Schott putt out for the win.

Asked to sum up his thoughts, Schott, who was presented with the trophy by His Royal Highness Salman bin Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, Crown Prince and Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Bahrain said: "I have no idea. It's just amazing, I'm just extremely happy, surprised... I don't know what's happening right now. I'm just so happy."

"I could have done it the regular way, that would have also been fine! But to do it this way feels even more special so I'm just glad it happened this way."

Hill, who equalled the course record of 61 in Friday's second round, added to his two-shot overnight lead with an opening birdie after a superb approach, with Schott responding at the second before both players birdied the next.

The Scot was four clear after another gain at the fifth but bogeyed the sixth while Schott made birdie – cutting the lead to one before drawing level with a birdie at the next.

Schott bogeyed the eighth but led anyway as Hill made a double, and a birdie at the tenth took the German two ahead – only for a double-bogey of his own at the 11th to leave the pair all square again.

"It was tough, especially towards the end," said Schott. "The start was okay, because I was playing alright. It had good flow to it. Obviously, nerves kicked in from the back nine onwards. I was happy that I managed it okay – not perfect, but okay – and you guys saw what hap-

pened, so I'm very happy now.

"We get a ride from the 11th to the 12th, and I just said: Okay, I'm not taking a ride, I'm walking just to settle myself again, to stay in the moment. That's what I said to myself: These are moments you're here for; that's the reason why you play golf – just try to press the pedal down and go on. We hit a beauty into 12, a good birdie on 13 and just tried to scrap it around those last few holes."

"The way I feel is indescribable. I have no words for it. I'm just glad that I got it over the line, and we will see what the future holds."

Garcia had joined the leaders by that point after responding to an opening bogey with three birdies in four holes from the third and another three in succession from the ninth, as had Reed after his fifth gain of the day at the 12th.

Daniel Hillier carded six birdies in a blemish-free 66, his second six-under-par round of the week, to set the clubhouse target at 16 under as the leaders still on the course battled for supremacy.

Schott, Hill and Reed all reached 18 under with back-to-back birdies, Reed at the 13th and 14th with his rivals a hole behind.

Garcia's challenge was left hanging by a thread after a double-bogey at the par-five 14th, as he eventually finished alongside Hillier on 16 under, and Reed dropped a shot at the 16th.

Schott and Hill missed the 17th green to the left before escaping with good chips – but while Hill holed his par putt, Schott made bogey.

Reed set a new clubhouse target of 17 under but when his birdie putt at the last agonisingly stayed up on the short side, Hill had a one-shot lead down the

last.

But he sent his approach to the extreme left of the green, leaving a nasty putt up the slope by the side of the green which he was unable to get close. Schott was in similar territory but closer in, allowing him to save par while Hill made bogey to set up the play-off.

Reed found the bunker with his 73rd tee shot and went from there to the edge of another, with Schott and Hill both hitting the fairway and then the heart of the green.

Schott holed for par and despite a superb effort at his up-and-down, Reed was unable to respond and dropped out of con-

tention. Hill held his nerve as he and Schott went back to the tee.

The Scot sent his next tee-shot out of bounds to the left, with Schott only just avoiding the water in response. He sent his approach right of the green but Hill found the water with his fourth and conceded after Schott chipped on.

Hill and Reed shared second with Garcia and Hillier fourth and France's Ugo Coussaud a shot further back in sixth.

Growing the game in Bahrain

The Bapco Energies Bahrain Championship once again provided invaluable experience for the Kingdom's emerging golfers, with local players gaining crucial exposure competing alongside Major champions and multiple DP World Tour winners.

Ahmed Alzayed, Ali Alkowiari and Khalifa Almaraisi all teed it up at Royal Golf Club this week, taking on the same course and conditions as the likes of former Masters champions Sergio Garcia and Patrick Reed, and three-time Major winner Padraig Harrington.

While the cut proved elusive, the experience of competing at the highest level of professional golf will prove invaluable as the Kingdom continues to grow the game and develop its next generation of talent.

"The competition comes to an end, but it's not the end for me

– I think it's just the beginning," said Alkowiari. "I'm happy with the result this year. I played 20 shots better than last year, so there are improvements. Hopefully, if I'm playing next year, it will be even better. Who knows, maybe even making the cut."

'A dream became reality'

Germany's Freddy Schott captured his first DP World Tour title yesterday at the BAPCO Energies Bahrain Championship 2026. The win came after a dramatic three-man playoff, where he edged out Calum Hill and Patrick Reed in a tense finale at Royal Golf Club.

Schott began the final round two shots off the lead but stayed patient as the leaderboard shifted repeatedly through a back-and-forth yesterday. While Hill, the overnight leader, mixed early birdies with costly mistakes on the front nine, Schott quietly kept himself in contention, refusing to be drawn into the chaos around him.

Speaking to TDT, Schott revealed a surprisingly calm mindset heading into the decisive day. "Honestly, not much was going through my mind," he said. "I slept really well, almost nine hours, which I didn't expect. I was just focused on doing my own thing and staying in the moment. I tried to stick with myself and keep it together out there, and I think we managed that pretty well."

The closing stretch delivered high drama. Reed briefly shared the lead before a late bogey knocked him back, while Hill had the chance to secure victory in regulation only to drop a shot at the last. That sent all three players into a play-off for the second consecutive year.

Reed was eliminated at the first extra hole, leaving Hill and Schott to battle on. When Hill

found trouble off the tee at the second playoff hole and conceded moments later, Schott was left as the last man standing.

For the 23-year-old, the moment was almost overwhelming. "It's my first DP World Tour win, so I'm pretty much speechless," he told TDT. "I can't really put into words what it means yet. This is what I've dreamed of for so long, and today that

dream became reality. I'm just unbelievably happy."

Schott's victory, sealed with rounds of 65, 67, 70 and 69, marks a breakthrough moment in his young career and signals his arrival as a new contender on the DP World Tour. Alongside the trophy, he collected \$467,500 in prize money, capping a week that could prove transformative for the rest of his season.
