# Luis Enrique says 'unique' PSG-Bayern first leg could have gone either way

Paris Saint-Germain coach Luis Enrique said yesterday that he was "not frustrated" by the narrow advantage his side hold over Bayern Munich heading into their trip to Germany for the Champions League semi-final second leg.

Last week, the two sides played out what many considered to be one of the best matches in Champions League history as the side from the French capital emerged 5-4 winners at their Parc des Princes home.

"No, I'm not frustrated because it's a unique football match for me," Luis Enrique told reporters, despite the fact his side had led by five goals to two midway through the second period.

"We won the match. But we could have drawn, and we could have lost the match, and that wouldn't have been unfair."

Luis Enrique said the first leg

was such a spectacle because of the outstanding performances of both team's attackers, rather than any defensive shortcomings.

"It was a very spectacular match because the strikers from both teams got the better

of the defenders on numerous occasions, but not because they did a poor job defensively," he explained.

"No, that's what makes this match magnificent, because the standard was incredible, especially from the strikers."

The 55-year-old praised in particular the contributions of PSG forward Ousmane Dembele and Bayern's English centre-forward Harry Kane.

"The two number nines -- look at how they defend. How they attack is what we normally see. But look at how they both defend -- it's incredible," he said.

The second leg of the semi-final will take place next Wednesday in Munich.

## Villa boss Emery fumes as Forest star Anderson escapes red card

Unai Emery slammed the decision not to send off Nottingham Forest star Elliot Anderson as Aston Villa crashed to a 1-0 defeat in the Europa League semi-final first leg on Thursday.

Chris Wood's second half penalty, awarded for a needless handball by Lucas Digne, fired Forest to a tense victory at the City Ground.

But Villa boss Emery was incensed by Forest midfielder Anderson's escape after his ugly foul on Ollie Watkins in the first half.

"The VAR is so, so bad. It's a clear red card, I don't understand why the VAR is not calling the referee because it's so clear. It's a huge, huge mistake. VAR is responsible," Emery said.

"The referee, fantastic, fantastic job, 10 out of 10, I appreciated how he managed the match for 90 minutes.

"But I watched it back. Wow. Huge. He could break his ankle. VAR where are you? It is your responsibility, we are professionals.

"It was so clear for everybody. He could break his ankle. It's not fair."

Insisting Villa can still bounce back and reach their first European final since 1982, Emery added: "After their goal the most important thing was not to lose our mind and to keep our game plan.

# Formula One drivers welcome rule tweaks, but say more change needed

Formula One's drivers on Thursday welcomed rules tweaks made on safety grounds, but warned that more was needed to improve the racing at this weekend's Miami Grand Prix.

Speaking at an official news conference, most drivers said the changes made to the levels of 'super-clipping' and of battery power harvesting would reduce dangers, but have little overall effect on the spectacle in the sport's new hybrid era.

While Aston Martin's Canadian driver Lance Stroll lambasted the new formula as "fundamentally flawed" and a thousand times less fun than Formula Three, others took a more positive approach.

"The positive thing is that we had some nice meetings with F1 and the FIA and I think that's probably a starting point for the future even if there is time for that or maybe I'm not here anymore," said four-time champion Max Verstappen, who has struggled this season.

Verstappen had been a leading critic of this season's changes, accusing F1 of losing its identity

and suggested that he was contemplating his future if the sport did not take action to salvage its heritage as an all-out test of power and speed for drivers and machines.

"I really hope that the driver have more input to the organisers in general because most drivers have a good understanding and a good feel of what is needed to make F1 a good product, a fun product."

"At the end of the day, it's a very complex and political sport, but at least I think everyone has tried their best to do something -- but, of course, it won't change the world!"

The conflict has stemmed from this year's introduction of the 50-50 split between use of battery power and traditional engine power in an attempt to create a greener sport.

Many drivers feel the sport needs more naturally aspirated power from an engine and less from the battery.

"It's a step in the right direction," said Audi's Nico Hulkenberg. "I'm curious to see how it feels and works on track now."

McLaren's Oscar Piastri said the collaboration had produced good changes, but added that he felt the chief problems could not be fixed without a fundamental overhaul of the hardware of the power units.

# Bahrain Begin Countdown to Gulf Games

Bahrain's senior men's basketball team are stepping up preparations for the 4th Gulf Games in Doha, focusing firmly on making a strong start to the competition.
