

'Gaza is not for sale'

Hamas denounced yesterday a plan reportedly being considered by US President Donald Trump for the United States to take control of the devastated Gaza Strip and for its population to be relocated.

Hamas political bureau member Bassem Naim slammed the proposal yesterday, asserting "Gaza is not for sale."

"Gaza is... part of the greater Palestinian homeland," he added.

Almost two years since Israel began its campaign in Gaza after Hamas fighters' October 7, 2023 attack, swathes of the Palestinian territory have been reduced to rubble and the vast majority of its population has been displaced at least once.

The Washington Post reported on Sunday that the White House was considering a plan that would see Gaza - home to roughly two million people - become a trusteeship administered by the US for at least 10 years.

The goal would be to transform the territory into a tourism magnet and high-tech hub, according to the US newspaper, which cited a 38-page prospectus for the initiative. The outline also calls for at least the temporary relocation of all of Gaza's population, either through "voluntary" departures to other countries or into restricted, secured zones inside the territory.

Trump first floated the idea in February of turning Gaza into "the Riviera of the Middle East" after moving out its Palestinian residents.

**Summer 2025 UK's
'hottest on record'**

Britain sweltered through its hottest summer on record this year, the UK's meteorological agency announced yesterday, the latest in a string of global temperature records.

"Provisional Met Office statistics show that summer 2025 is officially the warmest on record with a mean temperature of 16.10C, surpassing the previous record of 15.76C set in 2018," Met Office scientist Emily Carlisle said in a statement.

Scientists have warned persistently that human-driven climate change is resulting in more frequent and intense weather events worldwide.

LMRA Steps Up Deportations

Targeted raids reshape labour enforcement

● 1,317 inspections conducted

● 9 detained, 92 deported

● Joint campaigns across Bahrain

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) has stepped up enforcement, carrying out 1,317 inspection campaigns and visits between 24 and 30 August 2025, which led to the detention of 9 irregular workers and the deportation of 92 violators.

The campaigns, which targeted shops and businesses across all four governorates, also uncovered a number of violations of labour and residency laws. LMRA said legal measures were taken in all observed cases.

The latest operations included 1,303



shop visits and 14 joint campaigns, broken down into five in the Capital Governorate, two in Muharraq, four in the Northern, and three in the Southern Governorate.

The authority worked in cooperation with several government bodies, including the Ministry of Interior’s Nationality,

Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA), the governorate police directorates, the General Directorate of Traffic, the Social Insurance Organization, and the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications.

Strategic shift

LMRA stressed that the continued campaign reflects joint efforts to intensify inspections and tackle practices that undermine the stability and competitiveness of the labour market or harm Bahrain’s economic and social security.

The authority underlined that coordination with government bodies will continue, with inspections expected to be maintained across all governorates.

Public support

LMRA also renewed its call for public support in reporting illegal labour practices through the electronic form on www.lmra.gov.bh, via the call centre on 17506055, or through the government’s Tawasil platform.

Bahrain attends 165th GCC Ministerial Council session

The meeting was chaired by Abdullah Ali Al Yahya, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the State of Kuwait and chairman of the current session, with the attendance of foreign ministers from the GCC countries and Jasem Mohamed Aludaiwi, Secretary General of the GCC.

They discussed the agenda items, including following up on the implementation of decisions by the GCC Supreme Council and the Ministerial Council, reviewing recommendations from ministerial and specialised committees

on joint Gulf cooperation, and reports from the General Secretariat on enhancing cooperation in various domains.

The Ministerial Council also reviewed updates on negotiations for the GCC Free Trade Agreement with countries and international groups, as well as outcomes of joint meetings between the GCC and partner countries or blocs, all aimed at benefiting shared cooperation.

Regional security and stability

Regional developments and their impact on regional security and stability were addressed, including efforts to stop the war in Gaza, secure the release of hostages, and ease the delivery of humanitarian aid to civilians without obstacles.

Other issues related to maintaining regional security and stability were also discussed.

Expat held for unlicensed cosmetic work

A 29-year-old expat woman has been arrested after posing online as a dermatologist and carrying out unlicensed cosmetic work in a hotel apartment.

The National Health Regu-



latory Authority (NHRA) said the arrest was made in coordination with the Interior Ministry’s General Directorate of Crime Detection and Forensic Evidence.

She was caught in the act, with a large stash of medicines, pharmaceutical

drugs and medical supplies of unknown origin found on the premises.

The seized items have been impounded and the case passed to the relevant bodies for legal action.

The authority said such practices endanger public health and confirmed it will pursue cases of this kind.

778 illegal fishing traps and nets seized



As part of ongoing efforts to protect marine resources and ensure the sustainability of natural wealth, the Ministry of Interior announced that the Coast Guard seized 770 illegal fishing traps (gargoor) and 8 illegal fishing nets in August. The Coast Guard explained that the necessary legal measures were taken regarding these violations. It noted that these actions come within the framework of an intensive inspection campaign aimed at reducing marine violations and ensuring fishermen’s compliance with the laws and regulations in force, thereby safeguarding Bahrain’s marine environment and resources.

Advancing Bahrain technologies in space cyber

Dr. Mohamed Ebrahim Al Aseeri, CEO of the Bahrain Space Agency (BSA), participated in a specialised seminar titled “Quantum Key Distribution from Space: Securing the Communications of the Future”, hosted by SpeQtral, a Singapore-based leader in quantum satellite communications.

The event formed part of Bahrain’s efforts to strengthen its engagement with advanced technologies in the field of space cyber security.

Dr. Al Aseeri noted that the discussions, led by company founders Chun Yang Lum and Robert Bedington, explored the foundations of global quantum communication networks.

Satellites

He highlighted the SpooQy-1

mission, the first satellite to demonstrate quantum key distribution in orbit, which underscored the advantages of satellites over fibre optics in securing intercontinental communications through quantum entanglement.

The seminar also showcased partnerships with major tech-

nology players Thales and SES to advance the development of a future “quantum internet”.

He added that the meeting set out a five-year roadmap to establish an unbreakable communications network linking major world cities via a constellation of 10 to 15 satellites.

Cyber security

Dr. Al Aseeri stressed that the coming “quantum revolution” would redefine cyber security in the decade ahead, adding that Bahrain’s participation underlines its commitment to adopting next-generation technologies to protect critical infrastructure and prepare for a post-classical encryption era.

SpeQtral is recognised as the first company globally to successfully transmit quantum encryption keys from space through its SpooQy-1 satellite.

Theft and ‘dirty money’

Charity vice-chair and care home director charged in BD192,000 case

A care home director is on trial over the alleged theft of more than BD192,000 and money laundering with a charity officer.

The High Criminal Court opened proceedings and adjourned to Sunday, 7 September, to review the defence reply.

The defendant denied the charges.



Findings

The case started with a report from a government ministry that enclosed the findings of an internal inquiry committee.

The committee said the home’s director collected funds for public purposes without a licence, took money belonging to the government entity, and worked with a second defendant to forge private documents and use them.

The Financial Crimes and Money Laundering Prosecution heard witnesses and members of the inquiry team and obtained an order to examine the first defendant’s financial transactions.

After reviewing the file, prosecutors said the evidence indicated the two men’s involvement.

Funds

In questioning, the first defendant admitted raising funds without a licence.

The second admitted helping with the forgery and with the use of forged papers.

Investigators said the first defendant worked with the charity’s vice-chairman, with both men signing cheques at the heart of the case.

Payee

Some cheques named the first defendant as payee.

Others carried the names of staff under his authority so they could be cashed and the proceeds taken.

Prosecutors also accused him of taking in-kind donations, including Ramadan hampers and support vouchers, after instructing staff to move them to his home for his own use.

Signing powers


Between 2019 and 2024, the first defendant is alleged to have used his signing powers over the home’s accounts to take large sums.

He faces charges of embezzlement and laundering the proceeds through transactions meant to hide the source of the funds, including BD79,755.500 and BD72,075.500, and two further transfers of BD25,020 and BD20,070.

The hearing resumes next week.

Regional partnership drives sustainability

- Minister tours Salalah hubs
- Green Data City visit
- Bahrain-Oman ties deepen

In Salalah, Bahrain’s Minister of Transportation and Telecommunications, His Excellency Dr Shaikh Abdulla bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, underscored the Kingdom’s drive towards a sustainable and interconnected future, combining modern logistics with renewable-powered digital infrastructure.

The Minister’s visit formed part of the Gulf Green Mobility Forum, held under the patronage of Sheikh Salim Mustahail Al Mashani, Advisor at the Diwan of the Royal Court of Oman. The event brought together ministers, experts and specialists from GCC countries to exchange experiences in sustainable transport and clean energy solutions.

The Forum, hosted by Oman’s

Ministry of Transport, Communications and Information Technology, spotlighted key policies to achieve carbon neutrality and reduce emissions across the transport sector. H.E. Dr Shaikh Abdulla joined regional leaders in discussions to enhance Gulf cooperation, exchange best practices and coordinate bilateral efforts on sustainable transport initiatives.

H.E. also met with Oman’s Transport Minister Saeed bin Hamoud bin Saeed Al Mawali, Civil Aviation Authority President Naif bin Ali Al Abri, and ASYAD Ports CEO Omar bin Mahmoud Al Mahrizi to strengthen collaboration between the two nations.

Ports and free zones

During the visit, the Transportation Minister inspected Salalah Port and the Free Zone, reviewing cargo operations, logistics technologies and expansion plans aimed at boosting capacity. H.E. examined the Free Zone’s latest investor facilities and support services, reinforcing Salalah’s growing role as a regional trade hub.

H.E. Dr Shaikh Abdulla stressed Bahrain’s commitment to closer cooperation in transport, logistics and free trade, noting that the developments in Salalah reflect shared priorities for growth and connectivity.

Data-driven sustainability

The Minister also toured the Green Data City, a flagship project under Oman’s Vision 2040 that operates on renewable energy sources including solar, hydrogen and seawater cooling. The initiative highlights the potential for digital infrastructure to complement sustainable transport and logistics across the Gulf.

H.E. praised Oman’s efforts to advance eco-friendly mobility and logistics, while reaffirming Bahrain’s determination to deepen bilateral collaboration.

Regional model

H.E. Dr Shaikh Abdulla said that the Bahrain-Oman partnership serves as a model for Gulf cooperation, supporting regional integration, sustainable development and innovation in transport and logistics.

BCDR and SIAC meet at Singapore Convention Week

Professor Marike Paulsson, Secretary-General of the Council for International Dispute Resolution of the Kingdom of Bahrain and vice chair of the Board of Trustees at the Bahrain Chamber for Dispute Resolution (BCDR), together with Mr. Ahmed Husain, CEO of the BCDR, held a bilateral meeting with Ms. Gloria Lim, CEO of the Singapore International Arbitration Centre (SIAC), and her team at the office of SIAC in Maxwell Chambers, during Singapore Convention Week 2025.

The meeting built upon the Memorandum of Understanding signed between SIAC and BCDR on 21 February 2024,

which established a framework for cooperation between the two institutions.

Collaboration

Discussions reviewed progress since the signing of the MoU and explored further pathways for collaboration, particularly in capacity building, knowledge exchange, and joint stakeholder engagement and collaborations with a focus on the Middle East Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Pre-Moot, recognizing the significance of collaborative initiatives for both institutions. The discussions stressed the shared commitment to strengthening institutional ties between Bahrain and Singapore as international arbitration hubs, with a focus on equipping practitioners, enhancing procedural innovation, and delivering trusted dispute resolution services within and beyond the region.

Expansion of Al Fateh Highway completed at Mina Salman Intersection

Works Ministry Undersecretary, His Excellency Shaikh Mishal bin Mohammed Al Khalifa, has confirmed the completion of the expansion project of Al Fateh Highway at its intersection with Shaikh Isa bin Salman Highway (Mina Salman Intersection) in both eastern and western directions.

The announcement came during his inspection visit to the site, accompanied by Engineer Ahmed Sami Al Tajer, Assistant Undersecretary for Roads at the Ministry of Works, along with a team of specialized engineers.

Shaikh Mishal explained that the project involved an expansion near the Al Ghuraifa area for traffic heading north towards Manama, as well as an expansion near the Umm Al Hassam area for traffic heading south towards Shaikh Isa bin Salman Highway.

The development adds a new lane in each direction of Al

Fateh Highway, extending from its intersection with Shaikh Isa bin Salman Highway (Mina Salman Intersection) southward to just before its intersection with Juffair Highway (Dolab Intersection).

With this, the north-eastern direction now has three lanes, while the southern direction increases to four lanes.

The project also included relocating and protecting ground services, installing road signs, and upgrading traffic signals to ensure road safety.

The Undersecretary emphasised that the expansion will significantly improve traffic flow and enhance safety levels for road users.

He further noted that this section of Al Fateh Highway forms part of wider development works previously completed and opened to traffic, covering the stretch from Shaikh Hamad Bridge in the north to Juffair Highway (Al Dulab Intersection) in the south, with a total length exceeding three kilometres.

Bahrain Sets **Four Exemption** Tests

Move aims at cheaper, steadier supplies

● Customs duties eased on inputs

● Four tests set for exemption

● Part of industry vision plan

Bahrain has introduced new rules allowing factories to import certain raw materials and parts

without paying customs duties. The decision sets out four clear conditions when the exemption applies, including a “10 per cent rule” that lets companies import duty-free if the local



cost of production is more than 10 per cent higher than the import price.

Four conditions

Factories can also avoid duties if the needed input is not produced in Bahrain, not

available in the right standards, or cannot be made locally within the required time. Officials say the policy is meant to cut costs, secure supply chains and give manufacturers room to compete.

Minister's remarks

Announcing Decision 63 of 2025, His Excellency Abdullah bin Adel Fakhro, Minister of Industry and Commerce, called it a “strategic step to boost national industries and develop local content.” H.E. said the move reflects strong government backing for manufacturing, which he described as one of the main pillars of Bahrain's economy.



Manufacturing in Bahrain employs over 50,000 people across food, aluminium, chemicals, and other industries.

Vision link

The minister added that the decision aligns with the Industrial Sector Strategy (2022–2026) and Bahrain's Economic Vision 2030. “This will help replace imports with high-quality national products, enhance self-sufficiency, and enable the industrial sector to continue its vital role in driving sustainable development,” he said.

The new duty relief is expected to ripple through the wider economy, with cheaper materials helping factories expand production lines, create jobs and keep Bahrain-made goods visible in export markets.

‘Serious danger’ if Trump controls US monetary policy: ECB chief

Paris, France

European Central Bank chief Christine Lagarde said Monday that it would be very dangerous for the global economy if US President Donald Trump took control of US monetary policy.

Trump is seeking to remove Federal Reserve governor Lisa Cook in a move that critics say aims to fill the central bank with officials who will support his calls for lower interest rates.

Lagarde told France's Radio Classique that it would “very

difficult” for Trump “to completely swing the majority” of the Fed's policymaking body in his favour.

But, she said, “if he were to succeed, it would be a very serious danger for the US economy and for the world economy.”

She noted that the central bank's policies affect price stability and aims to ensure “optimal” employment.

“If it depended on the dictates of one person or another ... the balance of the US economy, and consequently the effects it would have on the entire world, would be very worrying,” Lagarde said.

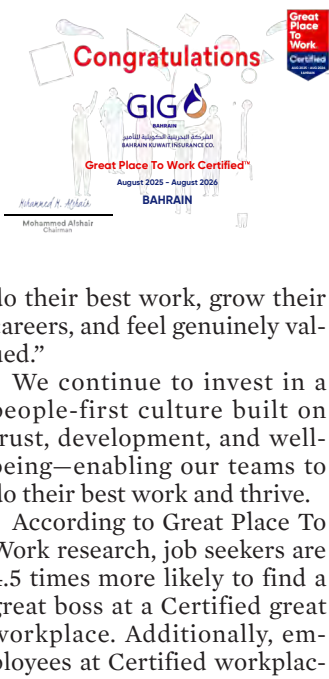

News in brief

◆ **A plane carrying EU chief** Ursula von der Leyen was hit by GPS jamming as it readied to land in Bulgaria and Russia was suspected to be behind the incident, the European Commission said yesterday. The commission said Bulgarian authorities believed Moscow was responsible for the incident on Sunday but it was not clear whether the aircraft was deliberately targeted as such attacks are common in the region. "We can indeed confirm that there was GPS jamming," commission spokeswoman Arianna Podesta told a press conference. The chartered flight landed safely at Plovdiv International Airport, in the south of the country, without having to change route.

◆ **A man and a boy** have been arrested in Paris with a haul of jewellery worth an estimated 10 million euros, the prosecutor's office said on Sunday. The Parisien newspaper earlier reported that investigators had discovered items including a necklace estimated at five million euros and earrings worth two million in a sock hidden in the underpants of one of the suspects. The haul also included a one-million-euro ring and a Rolex watch, the paper reported. The prosecutor's office told AFP the case had been handed to a serious crime unit over suspicions the pair were hiding the proceeds of theft.

The pair, of Tunisian origin, were arrested at the Gare de Lyon rail station on Saturday, the prosecutor's office said.

◆ **An army helicopter** crashed in northern Pakistan on Monday, killing all five people on board, the military said. "The helicopter was on routine training flying when it developed (a) technical fault and crashed," it said in a statement. Two pilots, two crew and a flight engineer on board the MI-17 died. A police official in the district had earlier said that the helicopter crashed during a test landing on a newly proposed helipad. The helicopter came down in a mountainous tourist area in Diamer district, in Gilgit Baltistan around 10:00 am (0500 GMT). It comes just weeks after a government MI-17 helicopter crashed in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province while carrying out flood relief efforts, killing all five crew and pilots. There have been several deadly helicopter crashes in Pakistan in recent years, including in 2022 when five servicemen and one of the army's top commanders were killed when their helicopter crashed during flood relief operations in southwestern Balochistan province.

Hiker dies after trampled by cows in Austrian Alps

A hiker in the Austrian Alps has died after a herd of cows trampled him and his wife while they were walking their dog on a forest road, local police said Monday. Fatal cow attacks are rare in the nation of more than nine million people, whose mountains are a popular tourist attraction where in the summer cow herds graze freely. The 85-year-old victim and his partner, 82, were hiking towards a mountain hut in Ramsau am Dachstein in Austria's Styria province on Sunday afternoon when the incident occurred, police said. "A retired couple from Vienna and their dog were walking just below the so-called Austria hut when a herd of nine cows -- including three calves -- charged and severely injured them," local police spokesman

Markus Lamb told AFP. Hikers in the area and people running the nearby refuge hut witnessed the attack, administered first aid and alerted emergency services, with the couple being taken to hospital. At a hospital in Salzburg, the man died shortly before he could undergo emergency surgery. Local prosecutors are investigating the exact circumstances of the attack, pending an autopsy. In 2024, a woman, accompanied by two small dogs, who was hiking in the Salzburg region died when a cow herd charged her. Following a deadly cow attack a decade earlier, Austria's government published a "code of conduct" for hikers. The guidelines include keeping a distance from cows and walking dogs on a short lead but unleashing them in case of attack.

Fierce winds force Gaza aid flotilla back to Barcelona

Fierce Mediterranean winds forced a Gaza-bound flotilla carrying humanitarian aid and hundreds of pro-Palestinian activists, including environmental campaigner Greta Thunberg, to return to Barcelona, organisers said on Monday. Around 20 vessels left the Spanish city on Sunday aiming to "open a humanitarian corridor and end the ongoing genocide of the Palestinian people" amid the Israel-Hamas war, said the Global Sumud Flotilla -- sumud being the Arabic term for "resilience". But "due to unsafe weather conditions, we conducted a sea trial and then returned to port to allow the storm to pass," the organisation said in a statement, without specifying when exactly the boats returned to Barcelona. "This meant delaying our departure to avoid risking complications with the smaller boats," it added, citing gusts that exceeded 55 kilometres (34 miles) per hour. "We made this decision to prioritize the safety and well-being of all participants and to safeguard the success of our mission." Spanish media reported that the organisers would meet to decide whether to resume the expedition later on Monday. Among the activists from dozens of countries were Thunberg, actors Liam Cunningham of Ireland and Eduard Fernandez of Spain, as well as European lawmakers and public figures, including former Barcelona mayor Ada Colau. The flotilla is expected to arrive in Gaza in mid-September and comes after Israel blocked two activist attempts to deliver aid to the devastated Palestinian territory by ship in June and July. The United Nations has declared a famine in Gaza, warning that 500,000 people face "catastrophic" conditions.

Another 47 charged for supporting Palestine Action: UK police

London's Metropolitan police said yesterday it had charged another 47 people with supporting Palestine Action, bringing the number of activists accused of backing the banned "terrorist" group to 114. The accused, aged between 18 to 81, will appear in court on October 27 and 28, and face a possible maximum sentence of six months' imprisonment if found guilty, the Met said in a statement. The UK government proscribed Palestine Action as a terror group in July after two planes were vandalised at a Royal Air Force base, causing an estimated £7 million

(\$9.3 million) of damage. Rights groups and UN experts have condemned the ban as legal overreach and a threat to free speech, and several protests have been held in London to denounce the move. More than 700 people have been arrested, mostly at demonstrations, since the group was outlawed under the Terrorism Act 2000. A total of 114 of those detained have been charged. Interior minister Yvette Cooper has said the group had a "long history of unacceptable criminal damage". And she has insisted "many people may not yet know the reality of this organisation," adding it "is not non-violent".

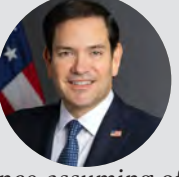

Xi and Putin round on West at regional summit **in China**

Slammed "bullying behaviour" from certain countries

● **Putin praised Turkey's mediation attempts around the Ukraine war**

● **Modi praised the "special and privileged strategic partnership" with Moscow**

Presidents Xi Jinping and Vladimir Putin took turns yesterday to swipe at the West during a gathering of Eurasian leaders for a showpiece summit aimed at putting Beijing front and centre of regional relations.

The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), comprising China, India, Russia, Pakistan, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and Belarus, is touted as a non-Western style of collaboration and seeks to be an alternative to traditional alliances.

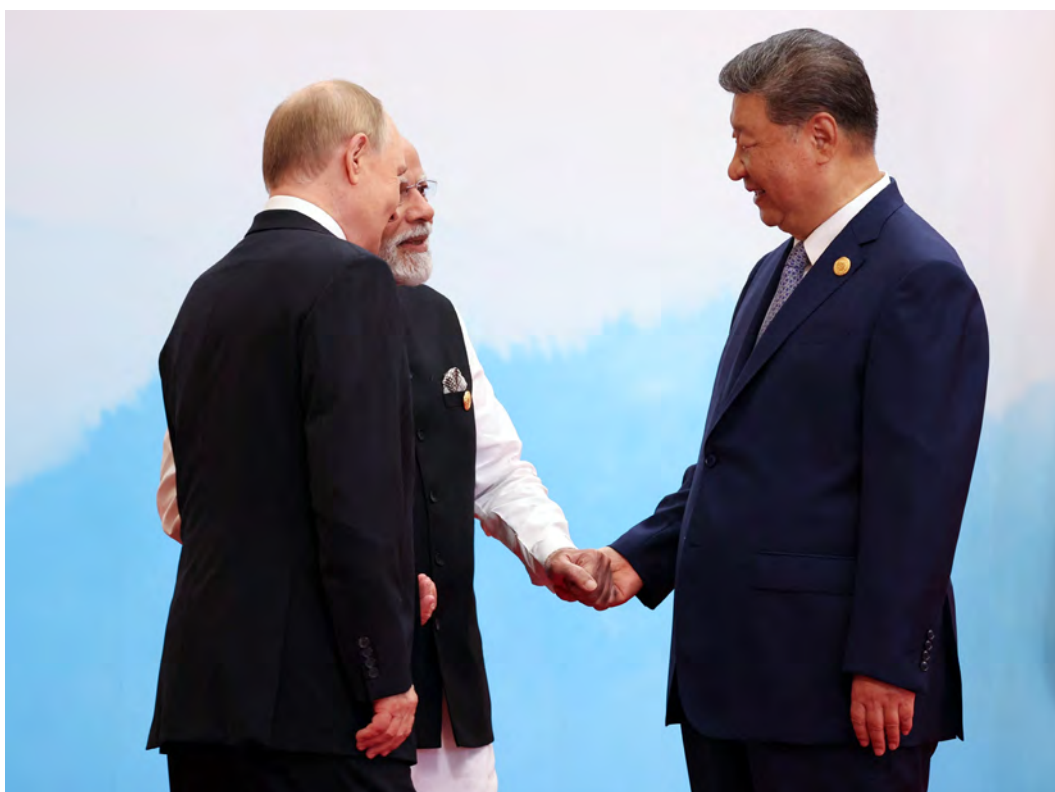
Xi told the SCO leaders, including Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko and India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi, that the global international situation was becoming more "chaotic and intertwined".

The Chinese leader also slammed "bullying behaviour" from certain countries -- a veiled reference to the United States.

"The security and development tasks facing member states have become even more challenging," he added in his address in the northern port city of Tianjin.

"With the world undergoing turbulence and transformation, we must continue to follow the Shanghai spirit...and better perform the functions of the organisation," Xi said.

Putin used his speech to defend Russia's offensive,

Shanghai Cooperation Organisation 'strongly condemns' civilian toll in Gaza

The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation said yesterday its "strongly condemn acts causing civilian casualties and humanitarian disasters in Gaza", according to a statement published by Xinhua news agency.

The 10-member SCO said they also strongly condemned US and Israeli strikes on

Iran in June, in the statement issued after a summit of the 10 member states in the northern Chinese city of Tianjin.

"Member states express deep concern over escalating Israeli-Palestinian conflict; strongly condemn acts causing civilian casualties and humanitarian disasters in Gaza; call for comprehensive,

lasting ceasefire and unhindered humanitarian aid," it said.

They also "strongly condemn the June 2025 Israeli and US military aggression on Iran targeting civilian nuclear infrastructure causing casualties (and) violation of international law and UN Charter principles," the statement added.

blaming the West for triggering the three-and-a-half year conflict that has killed tens of thousands and devastated much of eastern Ukraine.

"This crisis wasn't triggered by Russia's attack on Ukraine, but was a result of a coup in Ukraine, which was supported and provoked by the West," Putin said.

"The second reason for the crisis is the West's constant attempts to drag

Ukraine into NATO."

Meanwhile, Putin praised Turkey's mediation attempts around the Ukraine war during his first meeting this year with Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan on Monday.

Turkey has hosted three rounds of peace talks between Russia and Ukraine this year that have failed to break the deadlock over how to end the conflict.

'Always insightful'

Earlier, leaders from the 10 SCO countries stood on a red carpet and posed for a group photo.

Xi, Putin and Modi were seen on live footage chatting, the three leaders flanked by their translators. Modi and Putin, who were photographed holding hands, held talks in the afternoon.

Russian state media reported the pair spent nearly an hour talking "face-to-face" in Putin's armoured presidential car before their official bilateral

sible and to find stable peace".

Flurry of meetings

The SCO summit, which also involves 16 more countries as observers or "dialogue partners", kicked off on Sunday, days before a massive military parade in the capital Beijing to mark 80 years since the end of World War II.

The member states signed a declaration Monday, agreeing to strengthen cooperation in sectors such as security and economy, China's Xinhua news agency said.

They also "unanimously agreed" to admit Laos as a "dialogue partner", Xinhua added.

Xi held a flurry of back-to-back bilateral meetings with leaders including Lukashenko -- one of Putin's staunch allies -- and Modi, who is on his first visit to China since 2018.

Modi told Xi that India was committed to taking "forward our ties on the basis of mutual trust, dignity and sensitivity".

The world's two most populous nations are intense rivals, competing for influence across South Asia, and fought a deadly border clash in 2020.

A thaw began last October, when Modi met Xi for the first time in five years at a summit in Russia.

Their rapprochement deepened as US President Donald Trump pressured both Asian economic giants with trade tariffs.

More than 20 leaders, including Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, are attending the bloc's largest meeting since its founding in 2001.

Putin is expected to hold talks on Monday with Pezeshkian about Tehran's nuclear programme.

Many of the assembled dignitaries will be in Beijing on Wednesday to watch the military parade, which will also be attended by North Korean leader Kim Jong Un.

At the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summits, it's a tradition for leaders to plant trees together as a symbol of friendship and long-term cooperation -- a gesture that reflects the SCO's focus on stability and growth across member states



Afghanistan earthquake kills more than 800

The 6.0-magnitude earthquake struck just before midnight

● **Casualties and destruction swept across at least five provinces**

A massive rescue operation was underway in Afghanistan yesterday, after a strong earthquake and multiple aftershocks collapsed homes onto sleeping families in a remote, mountainous region, killing more than 800 people, according to the Taliban authorities.

The 6.0-magnitude earthquake struck just before midnight, rattling buildings from Kabul to neighbouring Pakistan's capital, Islamabad.

1.2 million people

More than 1.2 million people likely felt strong or very strong shaking, according to the US Geological Survey (USGS), which recorded at least five aftershocks throughout the night.

Casualties and destruction swept across at least five provinces.

Near the epicentre in eastern Afghanistan, around 800 people were killed and 2,500 injured in remote Kunar province alone, chief Taliban government spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid said.

Another 12 people were killed

and 255 injured in neighbouring Nangarhar province, while 58 people were injured in Laghman province.

In Wadir village in the hard-hit district of Nurgal, dozens of people joined the effort to pull people from the rubble of destroyed or severely damaged homes more than 12 hours after the initial earthquake, AFP journalists saw.

The epicentre was about 27 kilometres (17 miles) from the city of Jalalabad in Nangarhar province, according to the USGS,

which said it struck about eight kilometres below the Earth's surface.

Such relatively shallow quakes can cause more damage, especially since the majority of Afghans live in low-rise, mud-brick homes vulnerable to collapse.

Inaccessible

Some of the most severely impacted villages in remote Kunar provinces "remain inaccessible due to road blockages", the UN migration agency warned in a statement to AFP.

The Taliban authorities and the United Nations mobilised rescue efforts, with the defence ministry saying at least 40 flight sorties had so far been carried out.

A member of the agricultural department in Nurgal said people had rushed to clear blocked roads in the hours after the earthquake, but that badly affected areas were remote and had limited telecoms networks.

"There is a lot of fear and tension... Children and women were screaming. We had never expe-

rienced anything like this in our lives," Ijaz Ulhaq Yaad told AFP.

He said that many living in quake-hit villages were among the more than four million Afghans who have returned to the country from Iran and Pakistan in recent years.

"They wanted to build their homes here."

Nangarhar and Kunar provinces border Pakistan, with the Torkham crossing the site of many waves of Afghan returnees deported or forced to leave, often with no work and nowhere

to go.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres added his condolences to those shared by the Taliban government and several nations.

"I stand in full solidarity with the people of Afghanistan after the devastating earthquake that hit the country earlier today," he said.

In a post shared by the Vatican, Pope Leo XIV said he was "deeply saddened by the significant loss of life caused by the earthquake in the area of eastern Afghanistan".

In oil-rich Oman, efforts to preserve frankincense 'white gold'

The arid Dawkah valley is home to one of Oman's most prized resources: not oil or gas but frankincense trees, their fragrant sap harvested for millennia by residents who call it "white gold".

Located in Oman's southern Dhofar region, border-

ing Yemen, the valley is the world's largest such reserve, home to around 5,000 frankincense trees that dot the barren earth, their trunks bearing kernels that exude a distinctive woody scent.

"For us, frankincense is more precious than gold. It's a treasure,"

said Abdullah Jaddad, a frankincense harvester resting in the shade of a tree.

The oil extracted from the sap of the frankincense tree is used in perfume and skincare but it is also sold as solid beads of fragrance in local markets.

The high-end Omani perfume-maker Amouage, which manages the reserve, sells its

luxury scents internationally for hundreds of dollars a bottle -- with one limited edition perfume containing frankincense sold for nearly \$2,000.

The Dawkah valley is one of the rare places in the world where the Boswellia tree, from which frankincense resin is extracted, grows. Since 2000, it has been a UNESCO

World Heritage Site as part of the Land of Frankincense listing, along with Khor Rori, Al Baleed and Shisr.

Like oil

With its unique earthy scent, frankincense has long been used as incense, but also in traditional medicine, and even religious rituals.

Before modern technology, the frankincense trade, which began in the third millennium BC, extended from Dhofar via sea and caravan routes to Mesopotamia, the Indus Valley and Ancient Egypt, all the way to Greece, Rome and even China.

"Frankincense had roughly the same value as oil today," according to Ahmed al-Murshidi, who heads the Khor Rori site.

The ancient port of Samahram, which forms part of the Khor Rori site, served as the gateway for frankincense to the world.

As Jaddad collected dried beads of sap from the trees, he told AFP that the type of frankincense found in the valley was the Najdi -- one of four main varieties.

The Najdi and Hojari varieties are used for their medicinal properties, according to Faisal Hussein Bin Askar, whose father founded the Bin Askar frankincense shop, in business since the 1950s.

"The cleaner and purer the frankincense, the more suitable it is for drinking as a treatment, while the rest is used as incense," he said, adding that several factories in Dhofar are specialised in frankincense skincare and oils.

The highest-grade and rarest frankincense has a light green colour.

'Quick to anger'

The resin is harvested by hand using traditional methods that involve cutting the bark to release the sap and leaving it for a few days to harden.

Harvesting the tree requires care and skilled craftsmanship.

As one guide put it to a group of tourists at the Land of Frankincense Museum in Salalah: "the frankincense tree is quick to anger".

"We strike the tree in specific, small spots, about five times, to

preserve" the plant, said Musallam bin Saeed Jaddad, who works in the reserve.

"No one should cut open a frankincense tree... it could kill it," he said.

In 2022, Amouage partnered with Omani authorities to develop the Dawkah reserve and provide jobs for the local community, only harvesting a fifth of the trees to preserve them.

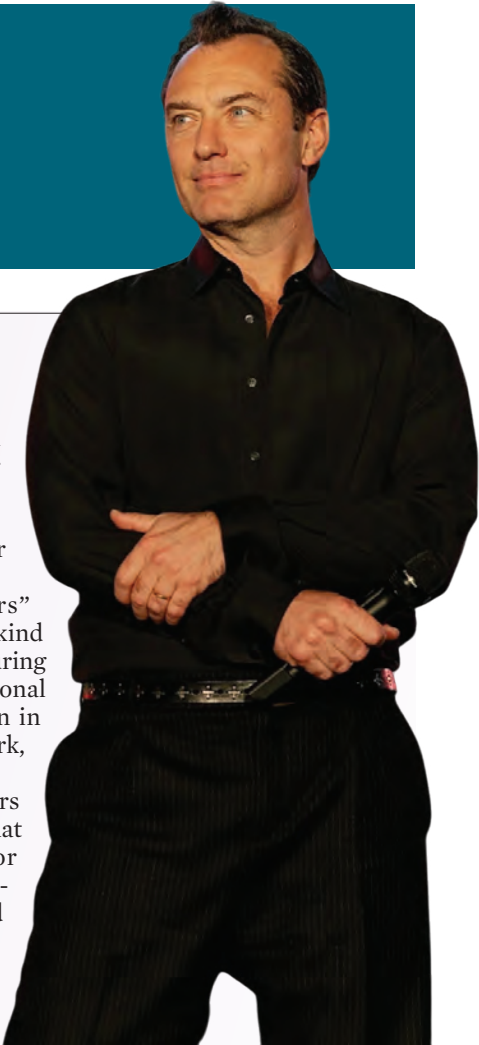
Each tree has a unique code and is monitored by a team of specialists, with donations open to anyone wanting to help the reserve in exchange for small gifts of frankincense products every year.

A distillery is set to be built in the reserve to extract the frankincense oil, a process for now completed in France, said Mohammed Faraj Istanbuli, the reserve supervisor.

"The government is carrying out vital projects, like building roads for example, which threatens other areas where frankincense trees grow," he said.

"We bring those trees... to the reserve. We have saved about 600 trees so far."

Jude Law became ‘obsessive’ Putin watcher for role as Russian leader

British actor Jude Law on Sunday said he became an “obsessive” watcher of Vladimir Putin as he prepared for his role as the Russian leader in his new film “The Wizard of the Kremlin” which premieres later at the Venice Film Festival.

Law, 52, bears an uncanny resemblance to Putin, aping his scowl and distinctive walking style in the film by French director Olivier Assayas, which charts the rise of the former intelligence officer.

“There’s a lot of footage one could watch and, personally when I start going down that rabbit hole, it becomes sort of obsessive,” he told a press conference.

He said portraying Putin had been a challenge because of his famously deadpan expression.

Assayas insisted he wanted Law “to appropriate the character” and become “a vessel for what he represents”.

The movie, which runs for two and a half hours, is an exhaustive look at Putin’s career muzzling political opponents,

cowing oligarchs, and enriching his entourage.

It is told through the eyes of a fictional political advisor, Vadim Baranov (Paul Dano), and is based on a top-selling book of the same name by Italian author Giuliano da Empoli.

Assayas said it was first and foremost a story about authoritarianism, with Russia’s transition from a chaotic democracy in the late 1990s to Putin’s modern autocracy a warning for the West.

“We made a movie about what politics has become and the very scary and dangerous situation we all feel we are in,” he explained.

“The Wizard of the Kremlin” is one of 21 films competing for the top prize at the Venice Film Festival, a key platform for international launches, which runs until Saturday.

Other highlights on Sunday include the premiere of “Father Mother Sister Brother”, the latest film from independent

American director Jim Jarmusch, with a stellar cast that include Cate Blanchett, Adam Driver and American singer Tom Waits.

The “Broken Flowers” director has called it “a kind of anti-action film”, featuring three separate dysfunctional families in conversation in the rural upstate New York, Dublin and Paris.

Jarmusch told reporters he was “disappointed” that the main distributor for the film, arthouse streaming platform Mubi, had accepted investment from a venture capital fund with links to the Israeli military.

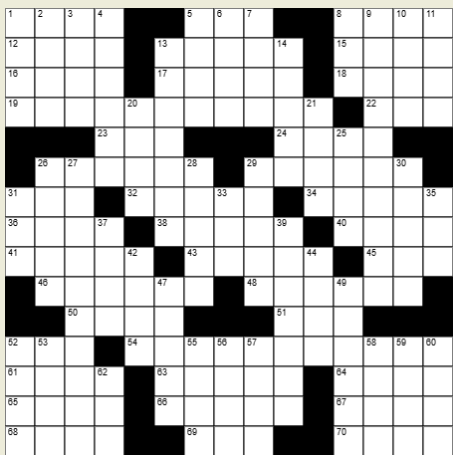

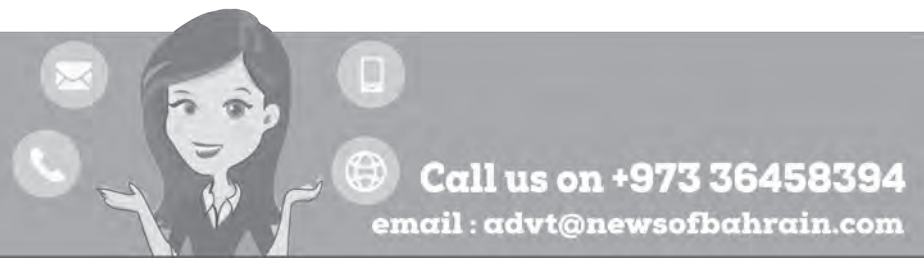

Alcaraz, Djokovic advance to quarters

Djokovic, Alcaraz eye US Open semi-final showdown while Sabalenka stays on course for title defence

Carlos Alcaraz and Novak Djokovic motored into the quarter-finals of the US Open on Sunday as reigning women's champion Aryna Sabalenka kept her title defence firmly on track.

Spanish second seed Alcaraz and tennis icon Djokovic -- who are on course to meet in the semi-finals -- both recorded straight-sets wins on the Arthur Ashe Stadium main court.

Five-time Grand Slam champion Alcaraz overpowered France's Arthur Rinderknech 7-6 (7/3), 6-3, 6-4 and has not dropped a set to date at the championships.

"I think my style of tennis suits pretty well the energy here in New York," the 22-year-old said.

"The energy is special playing the day session, playing the night session. It doesn't matter, people are always there. I love it and I think that's why I play my best tennis here," he added.

Alcaraz will face Czech 20th seed Jiri Lehecka in the quarter-finals on Tuesday.

Lehecka reached the last eight of a Grand Slam for only the second time after battling past veteran Frenchman Adrian Mannarino, winning 7-6 (7/4), 6-4, 2-6, 6-2.

Djokovic, 38, continued his latest bid for a record 25th Grand Slam singles title with a brisk 6-3, 6-3, 6-2 defeat of unseeded German Jan-Lennard Struff.

"It definitely helps if you serve well. I think I had a great serving performance last round and also tonight," said Djokovic.

"That helps make it easier on the court."

Djokovic faces a quarter-final on Tuesday against fourth seed Taylor Fritz, the lone American man left in the draw.

Fritz sprinted into the last eight with a 6-4, 6-3, 6-3 defeat of the Czech Republic's Tomas Machac in 1hr 38min.

Fritz is carrying hopes of being the first US men's Grand Slam champion since Andy Roddick in 2003 following the exits of fellow seeds Ben Shelton, Tommy Paul and Frances Tiafoe.

But Fritz will head into his quarter-final against Djokovic with history stacked against him. Djokovic has won all 10 of

their past meetings, including a 2023 quarter-final win at the US Open.

"I think the first, almost like seven or eight times I played him, I probably just wasn't a good enough player to really have that much of a chance," said Fritz.

"I think only the last couple times we've played I think I've been this just better player that can, you know, I'd say compete and have chances."

Sabalenka balance

In the women's draw, Sabalenka never looked troubled in a 6-1, 6-4 defeat of Moldova-born Spaniard Cristina Bucsa, ranked 95th in the world.

Sabalenka has now reached the quarter-finals or better at 12 straight Grand Slam tournaments, a consistency she attributes to striking a balance in her life on and off the court.

"I'm super proud, I think that's an incredible achievement," Sabalenka said.

"I think for me the key was balancing on and off-the-court life. I think I've done a great job on balancing really hard work and also great recovery and some fun time outside of tennis court. I think that's been the key."

Sabalenka faces a quarter-final against the Czech Republic's Marketa Vondrousova, the 2023

Wimbledon champion, who upset ninth seed Elena Rybakina 6-4, 5-7, 6-2 in the late game on Arthur Ashe.

In other women's draw action on Sunday, another Czech, unseeded former French Open and Wimbledon champion Barbora Krejckikova, conjured a remarkable escape to oust Taylor Townsend, saving an incredible eight match points before digging out a 1-6, 7-6 (15/13), 6-3 victory.

Krejckikova fought off a match point on her own serve at 5-4 down in the second set, and then somehow survived seven match points in an enthralling tie-breaker to move on.

"What a match," said Krejckikova, who revealed she had wondered if she would ever play tennis again after missing the opening months of the season with a back injury.

Krejckikova will face American fourth seed Jessica Pegula in the quarter-finals.

Pegula, beaten in the final last year, advanced to the last eight after breezing past compatriot Ann Li 6-1, 6-2 on the Arthur Ashe Stadium court.

Bahrain Victorious aiming for more success at 2025 Tour of Britain

Bahrain Victorious will compete at the Tour of Britain next week with a six-man team aimed at securing stage victories and a podium finish in the general classification. The race, which runs concurrently with the Vuelta a España, is the 21st edition and begins on Tuesday in Woodbridge, concluding on Sunday in Cardiff.

The team's roster includes four riders who competed in the 2024 edition. Matevž Govekar, who won the final stage last year, will be looking to repeat his success, particularly on the opening two flat stages. He will be supported by former British champion Fred Wright, riding his home race for the first time, and youngster Zak Eržen. Edoardo Zambanini, who finished third on a stage last year,

overall ambitions, supported by Zambanini and Wright on the uphill sections. Portuguese rider Afonso Eulálio completes the selection and will provide general support. According to Sports Director Roman Kreuziger, the team has "realistic" goals, stating that a top-three finish for Bilbao and a stage win for the sprinters are both "achievable."

The six-stage race is composed of a diverse route that mainly favors faster riders, with the first three stages expected to be sprints. The fifth stage, however, is considered the "Queen stage" with a five-kilometer climb at an 8% gradient that riders will tackle twice. The race concludes with a challenging weekend in Wales, which includes four categorized climbs on the penultimate day and an unpredictable finale into Cardiff.

Kreuziger noted that the team will need to be tactically astute, given the challenges of the course, including smaller roads, wind, and unpredictable weather. "We want to be stage winners, but we have to be careful if we want to fight for the podium," he said, emphasizing the need to focus on bonus seconds from intermediate sprints.

Leverkusen sack Erik ten Hag after two league matches

Bayer Leverkusen have sacked manager Erik ten Hag after just two Bundesliga matches in charge, the club announced yesterday.

Fired by Manchester United last October, Ten Hag signed a contract until 2027 in May, taking over as the successor to Xabi Alonso, who moved to Real Madrid.

But the Dutchman had to contend with the sale of a handful of the Leverkusen stars who won the Bundesliga title in 2024 and his new team have struggled in the first few games of the new season.

"This decision was not easy for us. Nobody wanted to take this step," sporting director Simon Rolfes said in a statement.

"The past few weeks have shown that the steps to build a

Bahrain stun Lebanon in final-second win at FIBA U16 Asia Cup

Onduenyi delivers as Marzooqi's team stays in the hunt for the knockout stage

Bahrain pulled off one of the shocks of the FIBA U16 Asia Cup so far, edging Lebanon 70–68 in a nail-biting finish yesterday morning in Mbank Arena, Mongolia. Just one day after a bruising 141–47 defeat to Australia, the young Bahrainis showed remarkable character to stay in contention for the knockout rounds.

A Game of Swings

Bahrain opened brightly, taking the first quarter 22–18 before faltering in the second where Lebanon hit back to grab a 33–31 halftime lead. The third belonged to Lebanon as well, as they stretched the margin to 54–46 behind steady rebounding from Mauricio Abboud.

But the fourth quarter saw Rassem Marzooq's team dig in. Bahrain poured in 24 points over the final 10 minutes.

Onduenyi Dominates Both Ends

Yet again, Somto Patrick Onduenyi was the difference-maker. The forward posted a towering stat line: 23 points, 23 rebounds, nine blocks, and four steals. His presence around the rim blunted Lebanon's offense and kept Bahrain alive during their cold spells.

Lebanon's Charbel El Herera led his side with 17 points, adding four assists and four steals. Abboud cleaned the glass with 18 rebounds but could not prevent Bahrain's late surge.

Final Quarter Drama

The closing minutes provided pure drama. Trailing 66–64 with just over a minute left, Bahrain

tied it from the line through Hussain Fuad Moosa Sharaf Ghuloom before Abboud briefly restored Lebanon's lead. Then came the decisive sequence: Ali Husain Mohamed buried a clutch three, and Onduenyi followed with back-to-back baskets, including the game-winning layup with four seconds remaining.

Lebanon had two last attempts to answer, but Johnny Sawma's miss and a turnover sealed Bahrain's win.

What's Next

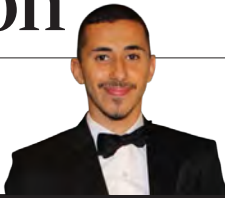
Bahrain's win evens their Group A record at 1–1, setting up an exciting match against India at 9 AM today to wrap up the group stage. The group winners advance directly to the quarter-finals. Teams finishing second and third will contest a play-off on September 4 for a spot in the last eight.

Bahrain's adjustments turn the tide against Lebanon

The FIBA U16 Asia Cup group phase match between Bahrain and Lebanon delivered one of the tournament's most dramatic moments so far. In a game featuring seven ties and six lead changes, Bahrain clawed back from an eight-point third-quarter deficit to snatch a 70–68 win. The decisive basket came with just four seconds remaining, when Somto Patrick Onduenyi finished a fast-break layup after a Lebanon shot-clock violation opened the door.

Numbers Tell the Story

Unlike their heavy defeat to Australia, Bahrain this time matched their opponents in nearly every category. Lebanon's stronger shooting stretches and ball movement gave them the edge for most of the middle quarters, but Bahrain's rim protection and late-game composure flipped the script.

Play by Play

Q1 – Bahrain Strike First

A back-and-forth start saw both sides exchange early baskets, but Hassan Oshobuge Abdulkadir's energy inside gave Bahrain the edge. He delivered a layup, dunk, and offensive rebounds, while Ghuloom's corner three stretched the margin. Lebanon trimmed it late, but Bahrain still led 22–18.

Q2 – Lebanon Regain Control

Mauricio Abboud and Johnny Sawma carried Lebanon through drives and free throws, punishing Bahrain's turnovers. El Herera's triple in the final minute swung momentum, giving Lebanon a 33–31 half-time lead despite Onduenyi's defensive presence.

Q3 – Lebanon Build the Gap

Lebanon surged after the break as Abboud and Sawma pushed the lead to eight, their largest of the night. Bahrain's offense stagnated, relying on Onduenyi's interior defense to keep within range. Mohamed's late three kept hope alive as the quarter ended 54–46 to Lebanon.

Standout Performers

Bahrain

- Somto Patrick Onduenyi: Game-winning layup, multiple blocks, rebounds, and paint dominance.
- Ali Husain: Two clutch threes in the fourth quarter to spark the rally.
- Hussain Fuad: Corner three in Q1 and key free throws in the final minutes.

Lebanon

- Charbel El Herera: Crucial perimeter shooting, including the late jumper to tie the game.
- Johnny Sawma: Aggressive scoring but missed the potential game-winner.
- Mauricio Abboud: High-energy drives and rebounds, though turnovers hurt his side late.

With time running out, Bahrain's adjustments clicked. Ali Husain Mohamed drilled back-to-back threes, Onduenyi scored inside, and Ghuloom hit pressure free throws. Lebanon answered through Abboud and El Herera, but turnovers crept in. With the game tied at 68–68, Lebanon's shot clock violation proved fatal, allowing Onduenyi to streak downcourt for the game-winner. Sawma's final jumper missed, sealing Bahrain's 70–68 upset.

Game Analysis

Bahrain's resilience was built on defense. Onduenyi's rim protection discouraged Lebanon from attacking inside, forcing them into contested jump shots. Offensively, the fourth-quarter shift to ball movement and perimeter

spacing freed Mohamed and Ghuloom to hit vital shots. Lebanon, by contrast, faltered in composure—turnovers and a critical 24-second violation erased their hard-earned lead.

The Big Picture

For Bahrain, this was a statement win after their opening-night blowout against Australia. Showing tactical maturity, composure, and defensive steel, they proved capable of toppling stronger sides in tight contests. They now carry momentum into today's match against India, which is a game that will determine their fate in the group. Lebanon, meanwhile, will rue missed opportunities but remain dangerous if they rediscover their early-game rhythm.
