Kadyrov says Russia should use low-yield nuclear weapon

Ramzan Kadyrov, head of Russia's region of Chechnya, said yesterday that Moscow should consider using a low-yield nuclear weapon in Ukraine after a major new defeat on the battlefield.

As Russia confirmed the loss of its stronghold of Lyman in eastern Ukraine, Kadyrov slammed top commanders for their failings and wrote on Telegram: "In my personal opinion, more drastic measures should be taken, right up to the declaration of martial law in the border areas and the use of low-yield nuclear weapons".

"Due to a lack of elementary military logistics, today we have abandoned several settlements and a large piece of territory," he said.

Kadyrov said that two weeks before he had raised the possibility of a defeat at Lyman with Valery Gerasimov, chief of Russia's general staff, but that Gerasimov had dismissed the idea.

After Russia's defeat in Kharkiv, Kadyrov said he would be "forced to go to the country's leadership to explain to them the situation on the ground" unless urgent changes were made in the conduct of the war.

Candidates to pay election nomination fees starting today

● **Ministry, supervisory committees to receive fees, insurance**

● **Candidacy fee is BD50 for municipal and BD200 for parliamentary election**

● **Supervisory committees will receive candidates between Wednesday and Sunday**

● **Final list of candidates will be announced on the 26th of this month**

The stage is set for yet another high-voltage poll battle in the Kingdom, with the authorities here welcoming aspiring candidates to make their candidacy official for the upcoming Parliamentary and Municipal Council election next month.

Starting today, candidates could file their nominations and pay their candidacy and

insurance fees to make their candidacy official.

Candidates for municipal council elections should pay BD50, and parliamentary seats should pay BD200 as nomination fees.

Municipal election candidates should also pay BD100 as insurance on electoral advertisements and headquarters. They, however, will get back this amount once they clear their electoral advertisements and tents after concluding campaigns.

Last year, the House of Representatives rejected a bill by the Shura Council to raise the fee for parliamentary elections from BD200 to BD400. The dep-

"They may also pay those fees at relevant supervisory committees between October 5 and 9, from 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm," said Mohammed Abdulrahim Bucheeri, Assistant Undersecretary for Courts and Documentation Affairs at the Justice, Islamic Affairs and Endowments Ministry.

Candidates for municipal election may pay their fees and insurance amounts at the offices of Muharraq Municipality, the Northern Area Municipality in A'ali, Hamad Town and Budaiya and Southern Area Municipality during working hours.

"Candidates may also pay their fees and insurance amounts at supervisory centres from Wednesday until Sunday between 5 am and 9 pm," said Mohammed Adel Abu Hassan, Assistant Undersecretary for Resources and Information at the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture.

YOU KNOW WHAT

General elections will be in Bahrain on the 12th of November 2022 using a two-round system. If there is no majority for candidates in the first round, the vote will go for a second round. Voting at Bahrain embassies, consulates and diplomatic missions abroad will take place on the 8th of November 2022 and re-run, if necessary, on the 15th of November 2022.

Protesters rally across Iran in third week of unrest over Amini's death

Protesters rallied across Iran and strikes were reported throughout the country's Kurdish region on Saturday as demonstrations against the death of a woman in police custody entered their third week.

The protests, sparked by the death of Mahsa Amini, a 22-year-old from Iranian Kurdistan, have spiralled into the biggest show of opposition to Iran's clerical authorities since 2019.

In Tehran's traditional business district of Bazaar, anti-government protesters chanted "We will be killed one by one if we don't unite", while elsewhere they blocked a main road with a fence torn from the central reservation, videos shared by the widely followed Tavsir1500 Twitter account showed.
