## Ipswich seal Premier League return

McKenna achieves third promotion as Wrexham fall short

## ● Ipswich beat QPR 3-0

## ● Promotion secured with second place

## ● Millwall settle for play-offs

## ● Wrexham miss out on top six

Ipswich secured an immediate return to the Premier League as they beat QPR 3-0 yesterday to hold off the challenge of Millwall as Hollywood-backed Wrexham missed out on the play-offs.

The Tractor Boys had the destiny of second place in the Championship in their own hands and two goals in the opening 10 minutes from George Hirst and Jaden Philogene allowed the party to start early at Portman Road.

Kasey McAteer rounded off victory five minutes from time as Ipswich join Coventry in the top flight next season.

Ipswich struggled last season on their return to the Premier League for the first time in 22 years, but will hope that experience serves them better for the challenge ahead.

Despite winning just four of

their 38 league games last season, the club have been rewarded for keeping faith with Kieran McKenna.

The former Manchester United assistant boss has now led the club to three promotions in four campaigns.

"This has probably been the hardest one, if I'm honest, so it means an awful lot," said McKenna.

"We've had to try and rebuild this team under difficult circumstances and you know everyone's stuck at it. I think we deserve to be where we are today."

Ipswich's cruise to victory spoiled Millwall's hopes of promotion back to the top flight for the first time since 1990.

The Lions did their job by

beating Oxford 2-0 to secure third place and will meet Hull for the first leg of their play-off semi-final on Friday.

Wrexham were denied the shot at a fourth consecutive promotion under the ownership of Hollywood actors Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenney in agonising fashion.

The Welsh side were held 2-2 at home by Middlesbrough, allowing Hull to leapfrog them into sixth thanks to a 2-1 win over Norwich.

Southampton are the favourites to also bounce straight back

to the top tier in the play-offs after a 19-game unbeaten league run.

A 3-1 win over Preston lifted the Saints up to fourth and secured home advantage for the second leg of their play-off semi-final against Middlesbrough.

Derby's hopes of climbing into the top six were dashed by a 2-1 home defeat to Sheffield United.

Sheffield Wednesday's relegation to the third tier was confirmed way back in February, but there was double cause for celebration for the Owls on the final day.

They beat West Brom 2-1 to win for the first time since September and end the season on zero points after an 18-point deduction.

## Real Madrid's Carvajal suffers toe fracture

Real Madrid defender Dani Carvajal will miss the Clasico on May 10 after suffering a toe fracture, his club said yesterday.

The veteran right-back is set to miss the next two weeks according to Spanish media and could return for the club's final game of the season against Athletic Bilbao.

Real Madrid, second, are 11 points behind league leaders Barcelona who could clinch La Liga this weekend with a win at Osasuna, if Los Blancos drop points at Espanyol on Sunday.

Carvajal will be out for the Clasico clash at Barca next Sunday, which may be his last as a Madrid player.

The defender, who has won six Champions League titles and four La Liga titles with Madrid, is out of contract at the end of the season.

The 34-year-old had hoped to form part of Spain's World Cup squad this summer but after an injury-hit season his chances were already slim before his latest setback.

## Joy for Norris in Miami as McLaren end Mercedes run

World champion Lando Norris beamed in the Florida sunshine Friday after steering his upgraded McLaren to pole position for yesterday's sprint race at the Miami Grand Prix.

The 26-year-old Briton made the most of the extensive upgrades on his car to outpace Mercedes' Italian teenager Kimi Antonelli, at 19 the youngest man to lead the drivers' championship in F1 history, and end Mercedes' early season domination.

"I've always loved Miami, both on and off the track," said Norris, who claimed his maiden F1 triumph at the compact circuit built around the Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens in 2024. "And this is a good result for us, but still only at the beginning of the weekend."

but it's nice to kick off by doing this. We've got a lot of new upgrades on the car and it is nice to feel some grip again -- and nice to reward the guys and girls who have put a lot of work into this."

Asked if he felt this indicated that the defending constructors' champions had regained the

initiative from McLaren, Norris was cautious.

"It's so tough to know because every track is different. We've known that this track has always been good to us, but we knew that what we were bringing was hopefully going to be a good step so it's nice that our estimations have proved to be correct."

"The team deserve that... Since the first lap today, I felt very comfortable and I thought I had a bit of rear grip, so it is good to start with pole."

McLaren team-mate Oscar Piastri, who won last year's race, was a close third ahead of Ferrari's Charles Leclerc, four-time Max Verstappen of Red Bull and early season leader George Russell of Mercedes.

## Leclerc offers hope to Ferrari fans in Miami

Charles Leclerc offered Ferrari fans a message of hope on Friday after the Italian team were outpaced by McLaren's world champion Lando Norris in qualifying for yesterday's sprint race at the Miami Grand Prix.

Leclerc, who was fastest earlier in practice, qualified fourth behind both McLarens and Mercedes' teenage world championship leader Kimi Antonelli.

"We struggled with tires today in the heat," Leclerc said. "On mediums, we were working very well, but it was not such a nice feeling on the softs, so we

have to look at that.

"We know that we're stronger in race pace but we have work to do in qualifying."

"I'm sure we have the pace to get back to the front in the race and we just have to see if we can find a way to overtake."

Leclerc added that he was impressed by the big improvement in McLaren with their extensive upgrades package.

"Our upgrades are fine, but it's just that everybody has brought upgrades here," he said.

"We kind of expected this situation where Mercedes is probably still the car to beat, but McLaren made a big step forward."
