Dutchman Fabio Jakobsen claimed the second stage of the Tour de France, a 202.2km flat ride from Roskilde to Nyborg, in a stunning sprint finish after pulling ahead of Wout van Aert and Mads Pedersen yesterday.

The win capped a remarkable comeback for the 25-yearold Jakobsen after he spent two days in an induced coma two years ago following a bad crash during the Tour of Po-

Jakobsen's victory was the second in a row for Quick-Step Alpha Vinyl, who also enjoyed Yves Lampaert's surprise win in Friday's time trial. It was also the team's 50th stage win since their Tour debut in 2002.
