## Lawyer on trial over paternity row case leak

A lawyer has been sent to court after publishing material about a paternity dispute she was handling, according to the Cyber-crime Prosecution.

The Public Prosecution acted on a report from the Cybercrime Directorate at the Ministry of Interior, which stated that local on-line newspapers and social media pages had circulated details tied to an ongoing legal case.

Investigators traced the source of the information to a lawyer representing one of the parties.

She was brought in for questioning and shown the articles in which the disputed content appeared.

The Prosecution released her afterwards but referred her to trial on a charge of disclosing information linked to a paternity suit in breach of the law.

## Two Africans die in bus and truck collision in Hafira

Two African nationals, aged 33 and 37, were killed in a collision between a bus and a truck in the Hafira area, the Ministry of Interior announced yesterday morning.

The ministry confirmed the fatalities through its official account on the social media platform X, stating that the incident occurred earlier in the day and that relevant authorities were on-site conducting necessary procedures.

Further details about the cause of the accident and the number of people involved have not yet been released. An investigation is underway.

MP calls for urgent action as teen e-shisha and vaping reach alarming levels

Concerns grow over addiction and public health dangers

Parliament is preparing a debate on banning vapes amid rising alarm about their spread among teenagers, according to MP Jalal Kadhem.

Kadhem said the draft law, due to come up soon in Parliament, targets electronic shisha and vapes because they pose a clear health risk, especially to children and adolescents.

The plan draws heavily on similar restrictions already enforced across the Arabian Gulf, as well as in Canada, India and Singapore.

### Spike

Teen vaping has spiked dramatically in Bahrain and across the Arab world, Kadhem said.

Attractive sweet flavours, easy availability and slick social media adverts promoting vaping as safer than ordinary cigarettes have all fuelled its rapid spread.

Medical research quoted by Kadhem indicates vaping liquids contain chemicals harmful to lungs and immune systems, particularly among younger users whose bodies remain fragile.

The studies also warn of teen-

agers quickly becoming hooked on nicotine through vaping, opening the door to cigarette smoking or worse substance

abuse later in life.

Kadhem urged health authorities to abandon lenient approaches towards vape sales. In-

stead, he recommended tougher checks and stronger regulation to control distribution.

He also called for school-based information campaigns to raise awareness among younger age groups, emphasising the key role of parents in keeping teenagers away from vaping.

With pressure mounting from local community groups, the proposed measures also include a ban on online ads for vaping products and strict rules on retail points, alongside targeted anti-vaping messaging aimed specifically at teens.

## 46 illegal marine traps seized across Kingdom

Coast Guard patrols have seized 46 illegal marine traps, known locally as gar-goer, in separate incidents across various areas of the Kingdom.

The move was part of continued efforts to protect Bahrain's marine environment and uphold maritime security.

The Coast Guard Command confirmed that legal procedures were taken in response to the violations.

Authorities reiterated their commitment to ongoing monitoring and surveillance operations aimed at curbing unlawful maritime practices.

The Command emphasised its dedication to safeguarding marine resources by enforcing national laws and regulations, underscoring its role in promoting environmental security and ensuring long-term marine sustainability.

# Bangladesh to unveil democratic overhauls

Bangladesh's interim government said yesterday it will release its slate of democratic overhauls on August 5, the one-year anniversary of the overthrow of the previous autocratic administration.

The South Asian nation of around 170 million people has been in political turmoil since a student-led revolt ousted then-prime minister Sheikh Hasina on August 5, 2024, ending her 15-year rule.

### System

Muhammad Yunus, the 85-year-old Nobel Peace Prize winner who is leading the caretaker government as its chief

Protests began on July 1, 2024, with university students calling for reforms to a quota system for public sector jobs.

adviser until elections are held, has said he inherited a “completely broken down” system of public administration.

Yunus previously pledged to unveil a “big package” to overhaul democratic institutions.

But efforts to reach agreements have made slow progress as political parties jostle for power ahead of elections, slated for early 2026.

### Political power

Yunus's government has

warned that political power struggles risk jeopardising the gains that have been made.

On July 29, Yunus said he was working to “build a broad national consensus around a renewed political system - one that delivers inclusive, participatory, and credible elections”.

Yunus's office said yesterday that the “July Proclamation” would be “presented to the nation... in the presence of all political parties involved in the mass uprising”.

# Heat Safety Triumph

The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA), one of the UK's most prestigious institutions dedicated to excellence in health and safety, has published a comprehensive report highlighting the success of Aluminium Bahrain B.S.C. (Alba) in achieving eight consecutive summers without any heat-related injuries or illnesses.

Titled "People first: The human side of heat stress prevention" the report was authored by British journalist Jane Warren, who has written for the Daily Express for over 30 years. In her commentary, Warren noted that outstanding achievements in safety and health are all the more noteworthy given the temperature challenges it has to contend with.

The Daily Tribune re-publishes a summarised version of this report featured in RoSPA's website.



Nestled between the golden sands of the Sakhir desert and the turquoise seas of the Arabian Gulf, the temperature in the Kingdom of Bahrain regularly soars above 45°C in the summer months. And by 10am, the searing heat has already begun to shimmer off the tarmac at Aluminium Bahrain B.S.C. (Alba) – the world's largest aluminium smelter on one site.

Combine that with the extreme heat generated by six lines of aluminium production, and the result is one of the most challenging industrial environments on Earth.

Yet, inside this vast ten-hectare site, an extraordinary safety culture thrives. Record breaking safe working hours achievements stand testament to this commitment.

"It's not just a number," says Alba's CEO Ali Al Baqali. "It signifies the care we have for every single person on this site. Safety is not a regulation here—it's a way of life and we know that the people on the shop floor are the experts. They are dealing with danger every day. For management, it is about being there, supporting them and facilitating their needs."

That such physically punishing, inherently dangerous work could be done with an outstanding safety record—including eight consecutive summers without a single heat-related incident—might seem improbable. Yet Alba has made it routine after five decades building a world-class safety culture alongside their world-class industrial operation.

## SAFETY CULTURE

Alba generates its own electricity through several in-house

power stations and even operates its own marine terminal – a rare infrastructure advantage in the global smelting industry. But its most important asset isn't technical, it is cultural.

"We live by three safety principles," says Al Baqali. "Ownership of safety and the environment is everyone's responsibility. Working safely as one team is a condition of employment. And all work-related injuries and illnesses are preventable."

This ethos is more than a mantra; it underpins every action at the company. Safety is embedded into the workday from the very first moment.

Each morning, before a shift gets underway, every department pauses for a five-minute safety briefing. It's a small ritual with a powerful impact—setting the tone for the day and reminding all 3,200 employees that at Alba, safety isn't an afterthought. It's the foundation.

Today, Alba is helping to shape the safety practices of not only its workforce, but also those of its contractors and global peers. Founded in 1971, Alba is Bahrain's industrial crown jewel. Producing more than 1.62 million metric tonnes of aluminium per annum, it plays a crucial role in both the national economy and the global aluminium market. But behind its success lies a steadfast philosophy: that



safety and productivity are not in conflict—they are mutually inclusive.

From the moment you set foot inside the sprawling industrial complex, the ethos "Safety First, Safety Always" is palpable. Hard hats aren't just worn—they're worn with pride. Safety briefings aren't routine—they're respected rituals.

## PIONEERING LEADERSHIP

This cultural shift has been orchestrated under the steady leadership of CEO Ali Al Baqali, a Forbes-recognised industry figure whose hands-on approach has set a new standard in the region, and whose impact is felt far beyond the boardroom where every board meeting starts with a 'Safety Share' presentation from each department.

"Safety is our licence," says Al Baqali. "If we can't do it safely, we don't do it at all."

In a culture where top-down hierarchy has traditionally prevailed, the CEO's presence on the shop floor, clad in full PPE, side-by-side with frontline workers, is deeply symbolic. "You won't find him in a suit," says one team member. "He's out there wearing overalls, checking on people, showing he's not above safety—he's a part of it. His ultimate dream is to have zero injuries of any type."



This visibility is not performative. It's habitual. Executives routinely walk the factory floor during the weekly "Safety Hour", visiting different departments to listen, encourage, and model the behaviours they expect to see. "It's about approachability," says Director of Safety & Health, Mohd Khalil Saeed. "When leadership shows up, when they live what they preach, trust grows."

Saeed adds: "When the CEO was promoted in 2019, he said two things: When it comes to safety there is no hierarchy, and that he will not stop any capital expenditure to make our people safe. It's an aluminium plant, there are inherent risks and a completely different risk profile from other workplaces, and that is why there is no compromise on safety."

## HEAT STRESS INNOVATION

At the core of Alba's safety strategy is its pioneering work on heat-stress prevention—an area that, given Bahrain's harsh climate, is not just important but vital. Few industrial operations demand more from their workforce than aluminium smelting in the Gulf. The humidity alone is intense.

From June to September, during the kingdom's peak summer months, Alba enforces strict controls on outdoor work, in line with government regulations and additional in-house protocols.

"We don't leave it to chance," says Mohd Khalil Saeed. "We

tell workers how much water to drink—three cups per hour—when to rest, and when to stop. We've had summers without a single heat-related incident. Our goal is zero harm."

Alba's Heat Stress Management Programme is a meticulously engineered response to local climatic conditions. From misting systems and shaded walkways to air-conditioned rest zones and scheduled work-rest cycles, every detail is designed to protect employees and contractors. The company even uses Wet Bulb Globe Temperature (WBGT) calculations to determine safe exposure times based on real-time ambient temperature, humidity, and wind speed. On the hottest days, some teams work no more than 10-15 minutes per hour.

Nezar Hameed, Alba's Senior Safety and Health Manager, who leads the execution of Alba's occupational heat stress programme, states:

"Working in a smelter is intense at the best of times, but in Bahrain's summer months, the combination of ambient temperatures and radiant heat from furnaces can create an extremely high-risk environment. Our aim is to control the controllables, through planning, monitoring, education, and above all listening to our people."

Since 2017, Alba has had zero cases of heat exhaustion. It is a staggering achievement—and one that has earned international recognition.

## INSPIRING APPROACH

Lord Jordan, RoSPA's Life President, captured this achievement during his visit to Alba in January 2025 to present the company with RoSPA's Life President's Award. This prestigious accolade recognises organisations that have achieved multiple Gold Awards and maintain a strong commitment to safety, often for a decade or longer.

"In a country where summer heat can be perilous, Alba stands as a beacon," said Lord Jordan in his speech. "This is more than a company—it is a community that cares. Their efforts contribute to a safer, healthier Bahrain, where every worker can return home safely to their families."

What sets Alba apart is not only the infrastructure but the culture of communication that permeates the site. Safety messages reach employees through every channel imaginable: WhatsApp updates, LED screens, emails, and department meetings. Safety is discussed before every board meeting, not after.

Crucially, these messages are crafted not just to inform but to inspire.

"We believe in telling the story behind the message," says Eline Hilal, Director of Investor Relations. "Whether it's a visual campaign during Ramadan or a recurring safety initiative, we bring safety to life in a way people can relate to."

This creative, empathetic approach reflects Alba's belief that safety isn't about rules—it's about people. A single lost-time injury in 2023, involving a contractor burned during power plant maintenance, prompted immediate review and system-wide learning. Every incident, no matter how minor, is analysed, understood, and used to prevent the next. The numbers speak volumes: since 2019, Alba has averaged fewer than 13 minor first-aid cases annually. Last year there were just four such incidents.

With 87 per cent of its workforce made up of Bahraini nationals, Alba invests heavily in training, development, and employee well-being. Its Alba Club, a recreational hub with tennis courts, swimming pools and family-friendly amenities, underscores the company's belief in caring for the whole person, not just the employee.

"Alba is seen as a global benchmark," says Ali Al Baqali. "That's something we take seriously. We're not just doing this for us—we're doing it for the industry, for the region."





## Life terms upheld in Adliya drug farm case

Two men who ran a marijuana-growing operation from a house in Adliya will remain behind bars for life, after Bahrain’s High Criminal Appeals Court upheld their sentences.

It also confirmed a ten-year term for the fourth man and a one-year sentence for the fifth.

The third defendant, initially handed a life sentence, will instead serve 15 years.

Fines ranging from BD1,000 to BD5,000 were imposed. The first defendant is to be deported, and all seized items will be confiscated.

### Testimony

The prosecution built its case on the testimony of a captain from the Anti-Narcotics Directorate, who said the first defendant led a group that grew and sold marijuana inside Bahrain.

According to the investigation, he used his two-storey home in Adliya as the base, bringing in seeds through contacts abroad, then planting and caring for the crop himself.

Once dried, the product was handed over to others in the group for sale.

### Equipment

The second defendant was said to have taken part in the setup, fitting the house with



growing equipment and later handling packaging and storage.

He also collected payments and sent part of the proceeds to two European countries, allegedly on behalf of the ring-leader, who did not hold permanent residence.

The third defendant, said to have had useful contacts, helped with care and distribution. He gave himself up after a warrant was issued for his arrest.

The fourth man worked further down the line, according to the testimony, passing on small quantities to buyers and receiving cash in return.

He used drop-offs or hand-overs and passed most of the money back up the chain, keeping a share for himself.

The fifth defendant was accused of buying for personal use. He had no part in the operation itself but was arrested following a warrant.

# Hammer horror verdict

Man jailed for 10 years for attempting to kill former partner after breakup

A man who tried to kill his former partner with a hammer after she ended their romance has been jailed for 10 years and will be deported from Bahrain once his sentence is served.

The High Criminal Court of Appeal backed the earlier ruling from the High Criminal Court, handing the 43-year-old African expat a decade behind bars followed by deportation.

The violence erupted when the woman, hoping to shift from romance to friendship, invited the defendant to her flat for a quiet goodbye.

### Farewell

Expecting a peaceful farewell, she instead faced a brutal ambush, according to court documents.

Inside her home, he forced her onto the bed and repeatedly smashed a hammer against her body. When she crumpled to the floor, he continued the blows until convinced she was lifeless.

With blood staining the scene, he tried to conceal his crime, attempting to scrub away the evidence.

But the victim, despite her injuries, survived the attack.

### Call

When a friend arrived in response to a call from a mutual acquaintance who needed assistance changing a gas cylinder, the battered woman staggered to the doorway and escaped.

The friend, taken aback by the woman rushing past covered in blood, stepped inside the apartment to find the accused soaked in gore. The assailant immediately fled.

Questioned by investigators, the defendant denied wrongdoing.

He insisted that he and the woman had been close for a year, and that although saddened by her decision to end their relationship, he accepted it calmly.



Inside her home, the man forced her onto the bed and repeatedly smashed a hammer against her body. He continued the blows until convinced she was lifeless.

The man claimed the invitation to her home was simply

for lunch and a chance to persuade her gently to reconsider her decision.

Instead, he alleged he was falsely accused and wrongly arrested.

The victim, however, painted a different picture.

She explained she had expected another friend to help install her gas cylinder when the accused arrived unannounced.

### Warning

Once inside, he switched off the lights and attacked without warning.

The prosecution argued that the man’s aim was murder.

Only the victim’s quick thinking and desperate flight saved her life, the court heard, leaving the intended crime incomplete.

Vehicles involved in collisions causing death or injury, or those tied to reckless driving, are to be confiscated following new instructions from HRH the Crown Prince and Prime Minister.

MP Hassan Ibrahim, Deputy Chairman of the Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee, responded to the move by noting its focus on preserving life and property and maintaining order on Bahrain's roads.

He referred to the role of Interior Minister, His Excellency Shaikh Rashid bin Abdulla Al Khalifa, in putting the measure into effect, citing the decision to confiscate vehicles as part of a broad push to deter repeat offences.

"There's a clear message in this approach: careless drivers cannot expect to walk away without consequences," said MP Ibrahim.

He added that Parliament supports any action aimed at improving road safety and promoting lawful conduct amongst drivers.

# Diploma deception

**MP calls for national panel to screen foreign workers' degrees**

A national panel to root out fake degrees amongst foreign workers has been proposed by MP Mohammed Janahi after an expat was found holding bogus qualifications for over a decade.

Janahi submitted a parliamentary proposal urging the formation of a central body involving the Ministry of Education, the Civil Service Bureau and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

**Checks**

The group would re-examine all previously accepted foreign academic qualifications and require checks on any new ones before they are used for hiring, promotion or contract renewal.

He said repeated incidents of forged qualifications ending up before the courts point to clear flaws in the current system of recruitment and academic recognition.

He called for a full review of the qualifications held by foreign employees currently working in government bodies.

**Authenticity**

The proposed committee would also be responsible for confirming the authenticity of



degrees with recognised international universities and Bahrain's cultural attachés abroad.

It would maintain and publish a yearly list of foreign educational institutions approved in Bahrain and submit regular reports to oversight bodies.

Janahi warned that fraudulent degrees not only lead to the misuse of public funds but affect the quality of essential services.

**Performance**

He pointed to sectors such as electricity, water, healthcare and education, where unqualified staff could undermine performance and reliability.

"We had one recent case where an expat had worked for a decade on the strength of a forged degree from a dodgy university no one recognises. This case reveals deeper fail-

ings," he said.

He added that the proposal aims to ensure jobs are given to qualified individuals through a single national verification system, which would help uphold fairness in employment and protect institutions from academic fraud.

**Fairness**

"We need one solid national checking mechanism so that we employ truly capable people. We owe it to everyone to ensure fairness and protect our public institutions from fraud," Janahi said.

He ended by calling for the matter to be taken seriously and responsibly, saying the proposal forms part of Parliament's effort to protect public funds, reinforce equal access to jobs, and maintain the quality of services provided to the public.

## Court appeal fails over BD9,000 crash payout

An appeal by a woman found liable for a crash that left a man injured has been dismissed by the High Civil Appeals Court, which upheld a ruling ordering her to pay BD9,000 in damages.

The collision occurred on 12 July 2024 when she drove through a red light and struck the man's vehicle.

**Surgery**

He sustained a fractured thigh requiring surgery with metal pins, along with a knee wound that left him with reduced movement in his leg.

The claim was handled by lawyer Jassim Al Essa on behalf of the injured party.

The lower court had awarded BD9,000 in compensation for both physical injury and emotional harm, in addition to legal fees, medical committee costs, and translation expenses.

**Amount**

The woman challenged the amount, arguing it was too high given the circumstances and asked the court to reduce it to BD5,000.

On 31 July 2025, the appeals court dismissed the claim, stating the original ruling was well founded.

It accepted the evidence presented, which included the traffic report, medical documents, and a criminal court verdict that found her guilty of careless driving, ignoring a red signal, and causing damage to another vehicle. She had been fined BD1,000.

**Disability**

The injured man had also been referred to a medical panel, which concluded he suffered a 15 per cent permanent disability.

His lawyer later raised

the compensation request to BD10,000, citing physical pain, emotional distress, and the impact on his family.

On 29 May 2025, the first court awarded BD9,000, along with BD20 in legal costs, BD90 for the medical panel's report, and BD10 in translation fees. Other claims were dismissed.

**Ruling**

The appeals court found no grounds to alter the ruling.

The woman was ordered to pay BD177,500 in appeal costs, deducted from the BD196,500 she had already paid into court.

The remainder is to be returned to her.

# Drug drop blunder ends in jail after theft spree

A man with a record of past convictions has been jailed for five years after a bungled attempt to retrieve drugs from a dead drop set off a chain of break-ins, thefts, and fraudulent dealings.

The 38-year-old was caught after he used another man's identity card to sell gold jewellery and carried out bank transactions using stolen cards.

He also broke into a home, drank juice and water, stole

clothes and electronics, then drove off in a car left with its keys inside.

**Sales receipt**

The court found he had forged a sales receipt for gold, adding a false signature attributed to the owner of the jewellery.

He then handed the document to a shopkeeper, knowing it to be fake.

He was also convicted of stealing various items, including clothing, devices, and jewellery, from multiple homes.

According to the case file, the man had gone to collect drugs from a concealed drop-off point, but his search drew attention.

When others began to follow him, he leapt over a wall to escape and later crept into an empty house through a window.

Once inside, he helped himself to drinks before wandering through the home and making off with the maid's clothes and phone, a watch, and other garments. As the residents returned, he slipped out and fled in their car.

He was later caught using a stolen bank card and another person's ID to carry out sales and transactions.

**Victim**

One victim said he returned home to find his bank card and jewellery missing.

BD1,800 had been withdrawn from his account.

Items taken from the property included prescription medicine, the maid's clothes, a BD100 watch, a BD1,500 diamond ring, three laptops and four iPads.

## Many weddings and a heist

One of the turning points of 21st century tourism in Bahrain was the patronage of the multi-million dinar wedding industry. Today more than forty weddings are conducted back-to-back during season in hotels and venues across Bahrain and there is more than one season every year. Globally weddings are a money-spinner and have spawned a series of sub-industries: a weddings publishing business with many magazines dedicated to bridal fashion wedding catering and event management; wedding couture which churns out millions of dollars worth of fashionable clothes for the bride, groom, relatives and guests, high-end photography and videography worthy of a feature film and destination wedding zones.

In all this, perhaps the most implacable change has been the wedding planner. Since cross-cultural weddings are increasingly popular these days and no event is considered complete without being on social media, there is immense pressure to get the cultural references right and the look of every moment just perfect. And relatives, however close, cannot be given this responsibility since they too are part of the Instagram frame. Enter the wedding planner group. Men and women whose sole duty it is to plan and execute every detail from floral arrangements to the venue and wedding buffet and to do it to perfection. In fact, many destination wedding locations offer an entire directory of wedding planning services and the growing popularity of the location rests as much on the shoulders of these planners as on the weather gods. Therefore, Bahrain courts did the correct thing by slapping punitive damages on a wedding planner who tried to cheat a couple of their perfect day by taking money up-front for booking a hotel with excellent natural beauty and experience in the matter but then simply disappearing without making arrangements. Considering how seriously weddings are taken in the social context, this was a crime of negligence. The follow-up should be for all wedding-planners to register themselves with the Ministry of Tourism which oversees this area of tourism and for the planners to be trained in the delivery of their promise. Only then can we reap the full benefits of the wedding seasons.

#### SpaceX Crew Dragon docks with International Space Station



Dragon capsule docked yesterday with the orbiting International Space Station (ISS). "Docking confirmed!", SpaceX posted on social media, along with a video showing the spacecraft making contact with the ISS at 2:27 am Eastern Time (0627 GMT), far above the southeast Pacific Ocean. American astronauts Zena Cardman and Mike Fincke, Japan's Kimiya Yui, and Roscosmos cosmonaut Oleg Platonov are joining the ISS on a six-month mission.

US job growth missed expectations in July, Labor Department data showed, and revisions to hiring figures in recent months brought them to the weakest levels since the Covid-19 pandemic. Without providing evidence, Trump lashed out at the department's commissioner of labor statistics, writing on social media that the jobs numbers "were RIGGED in order to make the Republicans, and ME, look bad."

# Trump deploys nuke subs amid Russia spat

US President orders submarine deployment after online clash with Russian official

US President Donald Trump ordered the deployment of two nuclear submarines Friday in an extraordinary escalation of what had been an online war of words with a Russian official over Ukraine and tariffs.

Trump and Dmitry Medvedev, the deputy chairman of Russia's security council, have been sparring on social media for days.

Trump's post on his Truth Social platform abruptly took that spat into the very real -- and rarely publicized -- sphere of nuclear forces.

"Based on the highly provocative statements," Trump said he had "ordered two Nuclear Submarines to be positioned in the appropriate regions, just in case these foolish and inflammatory statements are more than just that."

"Words are very important, and can often lead to unintended consequences, I hope this will not be one of those instances," the 79-year-old Republican posted.

Trump did not say in his post whether he meant nuclear-powered or nuclear-armed submarines. He also did not elaborate on the exact deployment loca-

tions, which are kept secret by the US military.

But in an interview with Newsmax that aired Friday night, Trump said the submarines were "closer to Russia."

"We always want to be ready. And so I have sent to the region two nuclear submarines," he said.

"I just want to make sure that his words are only words and nothing more than that."

Trump's remarks came hours after Russian President Vladimir Putin said Moscow had started mass producing its hypersonic nuclear-capable Oreshnik missile, and could deploy them to Belarus, a close Russian ally neighbouring Ukraine, by year-end.

The nuclear sabre-rattling came against the backdrop of a deadline set by Trump for the end of next week for Russia to take steps to ending the Ukraine war or face unspecified new sanctions.

Despite the pressure from Washington, Russia's onslaught against its pro-Western neighbour continues to unfold at full bore.

An AFP analysis Friday showed that Russian forces had launched a record number of drones at Ukraine in July.

Russian attacks have killed hundreds of Ukrainian civilians since June. A combined missile and drone attack on the Ukrain-

prompted him to reposition US nuclear submarines.

"When you mention the word 'nuclear'... my eyes light up. And I say, we better be careful, because it's the ultimate threat," Trump said in the interview.

Medvedev had criticised Trump on his Telegram account Thursday and alluded to the "fabled 'Dead Hand'" -- a reference to a highly secret automated system put in place during the Cold War to control the country's nuclear weapons.

This came after Trump had lashed out at what he called the "dead economies" of Russia and India.

Medvedev had also harshly criticized Trump's threat of new sanctions against Russia over its war in Ukraine.

Accusing Trump of "playing the ultimatum game," he posted Monday on X that Trump "should remember" that Russia is a formidable force.

Trump responded by calling Medvedev "the failed former President of Russia, who thinks he's still President."

Medvedev should "watch his words," Trump posted at midnight in Washington on Wednesday. "He's entering very dangerous territory!"

Medvedev is a vocal proponent of Russia's war -- and generally antagonistic to relations with the West.

He served as president between 2008-2012, effectively acting as a placeholder for Putin, who was able to circumvent constitutional term limits and remain in de facto power.

The one-time reformer has rebranded over the years as an avid online troll, touting often extreme versions of official Kremlin nationalist messaging.

But his influence within the Russian political system remains limited.





# US envoy meets hostage families

US envoy Steve Witkoff meets with families of Israeli hostages as fears for their survival mount

● Protesters chant for urgent US mediation, “Bring them home!”

● 49 hostages remain, 27 confirmed dead

● Ceasefire, hostage release talks with Hamas remain stalled

● Israeli general warns fighting will escalate if no deal is reached

US envoy Steve Witkoff met anguished relatives of Israeli hostages still held in Gaza yesterday, as fears for the captives’ survival mounted almost 22 months into the war sparked by Hamas’s October 2023 attack.

Witkoff was greeted with some applause and pleas for assistance from hundreds of protesters gathered in Tel Aviv, before going into a closed meeting with the families.

The Hostages and Missing Families Forum confirmed the meeting was underway and videos shared online showed Witkoff arriving as families chanted “Bring them home!” and “We need your help.”

The visit came one day after Witkoff visited a US-backed aid station in Gaza, to inspect efforts to get food into the devastated Palestinian territory.

Yotam Cohen, brother of 21-year-old hostage Nimrod Cohen, told AFP: “The war needs to end. The Israeli government will not end it willingly. It has refused to do so.

“The Israeli government must be stopped. For our sakes, for our soldiers’ sakes, for our hostages’ sakes, for our sons and for the future generations of everybody in the Middle East.”

Of the 251 hostages taken dur-

ing the Hamas attack, 49 are still being held in Gaza, including 27 the Israeli military says are dead.

After the meeting, the Forum released a statement saying that Witkoff had given them a personal commitment that he and US President Donald Trump would work to return the remaining hostages.

### ‘Horrible acts’

Hamas attempted to maintain pressure on the families, releasing a video of one of the hostages -- 24-year-old Evyatar David -- for the second time in two days, showing him looking emaciated in a tunnel.

The video called for a ceasefire and warned that time was running out for the hostages. David’s family said their son was the victim of a “vile” propaganda campaign and accused Hamas of deliberately starving their son.

“The deliberate starvation of our son as part of a propaganda campaign is one of the most horrible acts the world has seen. He is being starved purely

to serve Hamas’s propaganda,” the family said.

The United States, along with Egypt and Qatar, had been mediating ceasefire talks between Hamas and Israel that would allow the hostages to be released and humanitarian aid to flow more freely.

But talks broke down last month and Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu’s government is under increasing domestic pressure to come up with another way to secure the missing hos-

tages, alive and dead.

He is also facing international calls to open Gaza’s borders to more food aid, after UN and humanitarian agencies warned that more than two million Palestinian civilians are facing starvation.

### ‘Without rest’

But Israel’s top general warned that there would be no respite in fighting if the hostages were not released.

“I estimate that in the coming days we will know whether we can reach an agreement for the release of our hostages,” armed forces chief of staff Lieutenant General Eyal Zamir said in a statement.

“If not, the combat will continue without rest.”

Zamir denied that there was widespread starvation in Gaza.

“The current campaign of false accusations of intentional starvation is a deliberate, timed, and deceitful attempt to accuse the IDF (Israeli military), a moral army, of war crimes,” he said.

Alongside reports from

UN-mandated experts warning a “famine is unfolding” in Gaza, more and more evidence is emerging of serious malnutrition and deaths among the most vulnerable Palestinian civilians.

Modallala Dawwas, 33, living in a displacement camp in Gaza City told AFP her daughter Mariam had no known illnesses before the war but had now dropped from 25 kilos (four stone) to 10 (barely one and half) and was seriously malnourished.

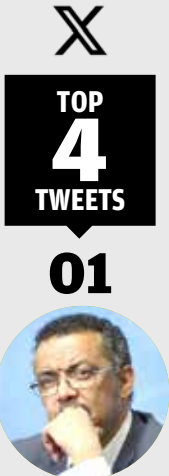
Hamas’s 2023 attack resulted in the deaths of 1,219 people, mostly civilians, according to a tally based on official figures.

Israel’s campaign in Gaza has killed at least 60,332 people, mostly civilians, according to figures from the Hamas-run territory’s health ministry, deemed reliable by the UN.

Gaza’s civil defence agency said Israeli fire killed 34 people in the territory yesterday.

Civil defence spokesman Mahmud Bassal said five people were killed in an Israeli strike on an area of central Gaza where Palestinians were awaiting a food distribution by the US-backed Gaza Humanitarian Foundation.

He added that yesterday’s strikes mostly targeted areas near Gaza City in the north and Khan Yunis in the south.

# Bog Apple: NYC discovers stand-alone toilet pods

Faced with closed restrooms, vandalized facilities and lavatory deserts, New Yorkers and visitors to the city alike confront a host of hurdles to relieve themselves when out and about.

In its latest efforts to combat this problem, the Big Apple has turned to a Portland-based company that designs modular public conveniences it claims are city-proof.

The products, dubbed “Portland Loos,” are the brainchild of Madden Fabrication and have garnered something of a cult following around the versatile, kiosk-like facilities which the company says are far cheaper than traditional toilet buildings.

Such public toilet pods have already been installed in 250 lo-

cations throughout the United States.

New York has pledged to build 49 new public bathrooms by 2029 to combat the lack of toilets across the five boroughs.

Currently, there are approximately 1,100 public conveniences for the megacity’s 8.4 million people, according to official estimates.

### ‘Simple but durable’

The city will spend \$150 million on building new restrooms and renovating 36 existing sites.

At the \$200,000 unit installed in the Bronx’s Joyce Kilmer park, two blocks from Yankee Stadium baseball park, bystanders eyed the new fixture with interest.

One man accidentally activated the hand dryer, part of a sink fitting located on the outside of the booth.

A spokesman for the company described the design as “simple but durable,” with the basin placed outside in order to keep

people moving and avoid a “hotel effect.”

“Hell yeah, we haven’t had a bathroom in this area in

forever,” said lifelong Bronx resident Carlos Lopez, describing discrepancies in public restroom access between lower-income and wealthier neighbourhoods.

For the five trial units ordered, New York insisted on a higher grade of stainless steel and other modifications to meet strict planning rules.

Street photographer Elijah Dominique, who lives near the park, said public bathrooms were especially important for unhoused people.

“We’ve got a lot of homeless people in this area,” Dominique said.

“Those are the people who really need these bathrooms. It’s good for them -- and for us too so that we’re not stepping in (waste) on the sidewalks. Nobody wants that.”

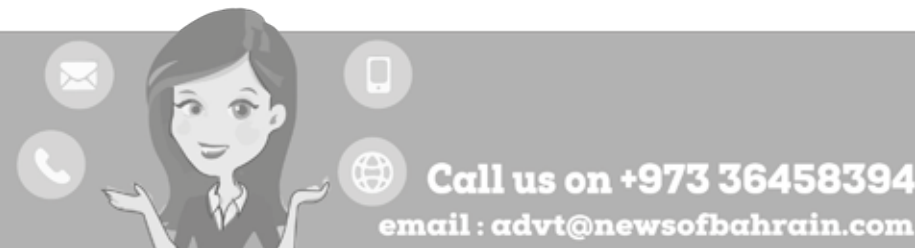

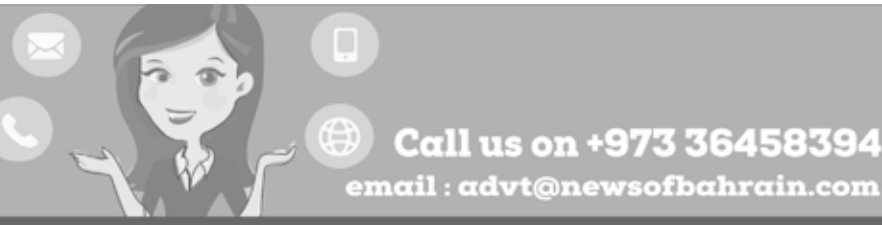

# Second seed Fritz ends Canadian hopes at ATP Toronto Masters

Taylor Fritz ended Canadian hopes at the ATP Toronto Masters on Friday as he crushed Gabriel Diallo 6-4, 6-2 to advance to the fourth round.

The American second seed needed just 77 minutes to dispatch the the 37th-ranked local and book a meeting with Jiri Lehecka, a 3-6, 6-3, 6-4 winner over France's Arthur Fils.

Fritz is aiming to at least reach the quarterfinals north of the border, the only Masters where he has not gone that far.

He broke once in the opening set against a nervous opponent and dominated from there.

"It was important not to let him get into the match and get the crowd fired up," Fritz said. "I knew the momentum could shift at any time.

"I'm super happy with it,

considering how I felt on the court two nights ago in my first match," Fritz added.

"I felt way more comfortable, confident, just hitting the ball, being aggressive, just striking it. I did well to be up an early break in the sets. I did well to just hold.

"Played really solid from the baseline as well. I backed it up well from the ground, and just did a good job of not letting him back in the sets."

Brandon Nakashima won his first set against American Ben Shelton before the fourth-seed-

ed Shelton rallied to finish off a 6-7 (8/10), 6-2, 7-6 (7/5) win.

Shelton had trailed by a break in the deciding set and Nakashima saved four match points before Shelton sealed the victory with his 19th ace.

Shelton finished with 46 winners to improve to 5-0 against Nakashima and will fight for a quarterfinal berth against Flavio Cobolli, who downed Fabian Marozsan 6-2, 4-6, 6-3.

"I've got to find my fire from somewhere," Shelton said of the late-night crowd support in

Canada. "I live off of that.

"Night matches are never easy, the temperature cools down and conditions are different. I showed a lot of perseverance. It's difficult being down against a big server. To come from behind takes a bit of luck."

The seeded pair of Andrey Rublev and Frances Tiafoe were tested over three sets before also making their way into the fourth round.

Sixth seed Rublev, runner-up in Canada a year ago to Alexei Popyrin, advanced 5-7, 6-4, 6-3

Tiafoe, the No 7, confessed to a bad day but earned his win the hard way as he beat Australian Aleksandar Vukic 6-3, 4-6, 6-3.

"The ball was flying a lot, it was really ugly, but I'm happy to get through it," Tiafoe said. "It doesn't matter how you win. You just have to compete."

Tiafoe next lines up against another Aussie in Alex de Minaur, who advanced when compatriot Christopher O'Connell pulled out with an injury.

Rublev now goes against Alejandro Davidovich Fokina, who beat him this season on clay in Barcelona. The Spaniard beat Jakob Mensik 6-2, 6-4.

# Ledecky reigns over McIntosh as record-breaking US hit back at critics

Katie Ledecky beat Summer McIntosh to win a classic 800m freestyle final at the world championships yesterday as the record-breaking United States hit back at their critics.

On a Super Saturday for the embattled Americans, who have been struggling with illness in Singapore, Ledecky won her seventh career world gold in the event she has made her own.

But the legendary American was pushed to the limit, touching the wall in a championship-record 8min 05.62sec, ahead of Australia's Lani Pallister (8:05.98) and McIntosh

(8:07.29).

It was Canadian sensation McIntosh's first defeat of the championships and ended her bid to match Michael Phelps as the only swimmer ever to win five individual golds at a single world championships.

The 18-year-old has already won three golds this week in Singapore and will go for number four in the 400m medley on Sunday.

"The feeling right now is something I never want to feel again," a forlorn McIntosh said.

Ledecky, 28, had too much staying power for her younger rival, with Pallister also right in the mix until the final lunge for

the line.

"They pushed me all the way," said Ledecky, a four-time Olympic champion in the event.

"I'm just really happy I could put that together. I just kept telling myself to trust my legs."

The United States team, under the cosh after criticism from Olympic greats Phelps and Ryan Lochte, won three golds on the penultimate day of competition.

They lead the medals table from Australia with eight golds following victories yesterday for Ledecky, Gretchen Walsh and their mixed 4x100m freestyle relay team -- the latter in a world-record time.

# Leclerc ends Ferrari barren run with stunning pole ahead of McLarens

Charles Leclerc ended Ferrari's barren qualifying run this year with a stunning late lap yesterday to beat both McLarens and claim his first pole of the season for the Italian team at the Hungarian Grand Prix.

The 27-year-old Monegasque went late in the final minutes of a closely-contested session to clock a best lap in one minute and 15.372 seconds in changing conditions, leaving his rivals frustrated as they failed to improve on their first run times.

"I definitely didn't expect that and honestly I just don't have any words for this. It's one of my best poles and the most unexpected," said Leclerc.

He took pole by 0.026 seconds ahead of series leader Oscar Piastri and by 0.041sec ahead

of the Australian's McLaren team-mate and title rival Lando Norris, with George Russell 0.053sec adrift in a breathtakingly close finish.

It was Leclerc's first pole of the year, his first in Budapest and the 27th of his career. It was Ferrari's first pole in Hungary since Sebastian Vettel in 2017.

Aston Martin's Fernando Alonso was fifth ahead of team-mate Lance Stroll, the pair enjoying their best qualifying of the season, with Sauber's Gabriel Bortoletto seventh ahead of Red Bull's four-time champion Max Verstappen and the two Racing Bulls rookies Liam Lawson and Isack Hadjar.

"Wow, whooaw!, Mama Mia!" exclaimed Leclerc, who had on Thursday described the Hungarian as his worst track of the season.

"Today, I don't understand anything about F1. The whole of qualifying has been so extremely difficult - and I am not exaggerating," he said.

Piastri blamed a change of wind direction.

"It basically did a 180 degrees from Q1 to Q3. It always seems pathetic, blaming the wind."

The Q1 segment began with clouds looming in a sunny sky and hot conditions with temperatures of 31 degrees (air) and 52 (track), falling as it became more overcast.

## Jaiswal's hundred leaves England needing Oval-record chase to beat India

India opener Yashasvi Jaiswal's excellent hundred in the fifth and deciding Test at the Oval yesterday left England needing to break a record that has stood for over a hundred years in their quest for a 3-1 series win.

India, were 304-6 in their second innings -- an overall lead of 281 runs -- at tea on the third day in south London.

No side have made more to win in the fourth innings of a Test at the Oval than England's 263 in a celebrated one-wicket victory over arch-rivals Australia way back in 1902.

Jaiswal was out shortly before tea for 118, his second hundred of the series after the
