Gears Up for Safe School Return

The Southern Governorate Security Committee reviewed security requirements across the governorate and reaffirmed its commitment to strengthening community partnership, improving response times to public reports, and enhancing safety measures during its eighth meeting of 2026.

The meeting was chaired by Southern Governor HH Shaikh Khalifa bin Ali Al Khalifa, in the presence of Deputy Governor Brigadier Hamad Mohammed Al Khayat, Deputy Director-General of the Southern Governorate Police Directorate Colonel Shaikh Salman bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, and representatives of the Ministry of Interior's security agencies.

Opening the meeting, HH Shaikh Khalifa highlighted



the committee's role in implementing the directives of Interior Minister General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdullah Al Khalifa and addressing residents' security needs to reinforce safety and stability across the Southern Governorate.

He praised the close coordination between the governorate and various security authorities, noting that continued cooperation has contributed to faster responses to reports and improved services for residents.

The committee reviewed efforts by the General Directorate of Traffic and the Southern Governorate Police Directorate to prepare for the upcoming academic year. Discussions focused on ensuring smooth traffic flow around schools, increasing traffic patrols, and implementing measures to safeguard students.

HH Shaikh Khalifa stressed the importance of maintaining traffic movement on both main and secondary roads, while intensifying patrols and public awareness campaigns to enhance road safety throughout the governorate.

The Governor also reviewed a

visual presentation by the Southern Governorate Police Directorate outlining security arrangements for upcoming events and activities, as well as operational statistics highlighting joint efforts to serve residents.

The General Directorate of Civil Defence presented a report on its key emergency responses during July. HH Shaikh Khalifa emphasised the importance of continued cooperation with Civil Defence to raise safety standards and promote greater public awareness of security and safety practices.

The committee also reviewed security observations and requests received from residents. HH Shaikh Khalifa commended the swift response by security agencies in monitoring and analysing reports and implementing solutions that contribute to community safety and wellbeing.

New Judicial Appointments Announced

Royal Order Names 33 Judges, Prosecutors to Key Judicial Posts

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa has issued a Royal Order appointing 33 judges and public prosecutors to various courts and the Public Prosecution in the Kingdom of Bahrain. The appointments include 31 men and two women—Noor Abdullah Shehab Ahmed and Noora Jamal Al Sayed Mohammed Al Mualla—who have been appointed as Heads of Public Prosecution (Category B).

Under the Royal Order, Judge Wajeeh Al Sayed Ahmed Al Shaikh was appointed as a judge at the Court of Cassation, while Judge Maamoun Al Sayed Abdulhadi Mohammed and Judge Hatem Mostafa Mohammed Al Sayed were appointed as Presidents of

the High Civil Court of Appeal. The order also included the appointment of several officials to senior judicial positions, including Heads of Public Prosecution (Category A) and Presidents of the High Civil Court.

Among those appointed as Heads of Public Prosecution (Category A) are Khalid Ahmed Abdullah Al Tamimi, Judge Mohammed Abdullah Mohammed Saleh, Judge Dr. Ali Mohammed Ahmed Al Jazzaf, Ahmed Kamel Mohammed Al Qurashi, Mohammed Ali Mohammed Al Nuaimi, Hassan Ahmed Hassan Al Muhaiza, Ahmed Jamal Saif Al Qallaf, Judge Isa Sami Ahmed Al Manaei, Ibrahim Isa Ali Al Banjasim, Judge Amer Abdulwahab Al Amer Al Hazani, Judge Nasser



Ibrahim Mohammed Al Buainain and Abdullah Salah Salem Al Dhowadi.

The Royal Order also appointed several Deputy Judges at the High Civil Court and Heads of Public Prosecution (Category B) with the rank of Deputy Judge at the High Court. The appointments further included Judge Mohammed Shaheen Isa Al Hiyyi Al Nuaimi as a Judge of the High Civil Court (Category B). In addition, Shaikh Juma Tawfiq Juma Al Dosari

was appointed Deputy Judge at the High Sharia Court of Appeal (Sunni Circuit).

Shaikh Dr. Mohammed Fouad Mohammed Al Kuwari and Shaikh Dr. Yasser Mohammed Ibrahim Sayadi were appointed as judges at the High Sharia Court (Sunni Circuit), Category A, while Shaikh Hassan Mohammed Jafar Al Saeed and Shaikh Mohammed Ali Hussein Al Oraibi were appointed as judges at the High Sharia Court (Jaafari Circuit), Category A.

The Royal Order forms part of Bahrain's continued efforts to strengthen the judicial system and enhance the efficiency of courts and prosecution services.



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Historic Bahrain Fort Tops Visitor Charts

July figures highlight growing interest in the Kingdom’s cultural landmarks

Bahrain Fort has strengthened its position as the Kingdom’s leading cultural attraction, welcoming 9,142 visitors in July, the highest among all heritage and cultural sites, according to figures released on Bahrain’s national open data platform.

The UNESCO-listed archaeological landmark attracted a broad mix of visitors, reflecting growing interest in Bahrain’s rich history and cultural heritage. International tourists made up the largest group with 4,282 visitors, followed closely by 4,202 Bahrainis. The site also welcomed 455 GCC nationals, 120 visitors from other Arab countries, and 83 organised group visitors.

The strong turnout highlights Bahrain Fort’s continued appeal as the country’s flagship heritage destination and underscores ongoing efforts to promote cultural tourism.

The Bahrain National Museum ranked second with 2,432 visitors, attracting 1,201 foreign visitors, 472 Bahrainis, and 393 GCC nationals, in addition to visitors from Arab countries, schools, nurseries, travel agencies and organised groups.



Historic landmark attracts more than 9,000 visitors as museums and cultural sites continue to draw crowds.

The Tree of Life and Visitors Centre secured third place with 1,644 visitors, reaffirming its popularity as one of Bahrain’s most iconic natural and cultural attractions.

Several other heritage destinations also recorded healthy visitor numbers during the month. The

Al Jasra Handicrafts Centre welcomed 526 visitors, followed by the Arts Centre with 493, and the Pearl Trail with 454.

The Khalifa Library received 225 visitors, while the Sports Hall welcomed 190. The Bahrain Fort Museum recorded 124 visitors, followed by Sheikh Salman bin

Ahmed Al Fateh Fort with 82 and Beit Al Jasra with 63.

The July figures reflect sustained public and tourist interest in Bahrain’s archaeological sites, museums and traditional heritage, reinforcing the Kingdom’s growing reputation as a destination where history, culture and tourism intersect.

Al Sawari Theatre Wins Five Awards in Jordan

The Bahraini theatre group secured five awards during the festival’s closing ceremony.

A Roof Over Every Family

Municipal schemes and donors restore dozens of homes in Northern Area

More than 50 families in the Northern Governorate have seen their homes repaired or protected against harsh weather conditions as part of ongoing efforts to improve housing for low-income households.

Councillor Abdulla Mubarak Belal Al Qubaisi said 52 homes in the ninth constituency benefited from repair and rain-insulation projects since December 2022, while a further 10 houses were restored through contributions from private donors.

The projects were carried out under the Towns and Villages Development programme by the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, with the aim of creating safer and more sustainable homes for eligible families.

According to municipal work records, 16 homes underwent maintenance and restoration works, including repairs following fire damage, while 36 properties received

rain insulation to protect them from weather-related damage.

The housing improvement drive remains ongoing, with additional requests being processed. One project is currently under implementation, another is nearing the tender award stage, and three rain-insulation requests are undergoing technical and administrative procedures before work begins.

Al Qubaisi highlighted the role of community support in expanding the impact of these efforts, noting that private donors helped restore 10 additional homes for families in need.

He praised the cooperation between government authorities and community members, describing it as an example of Bahrain’s culture of social responsibility and solidarity.

Visitor Spending Rebounds to BD86m

Visitor spending in Bahrain roared back in May, wiping out much of the slump caused by the war and the shutdown of air travel. Payments made with bank cards issued outside the kingdom hit BD86.1 million, up 204 pc from March and close to the level seen before the crisis, Central Bank of Bahrain figures show.

The rebound followed a steep fall in March, when the US-Iran war, Iranian attacks on Bahrain and the closure of airspace hit travel and trade. Spending on foreign cards sank 63 pc from BD76.5m in February to BD28.3m in March. It then rose through April and May.

The May total was equal to about 98 pc of the BD87.9m spent through foreign cards in the same month last year.

Transaction numbers told the same story. They rose from 1.82m in March to 2.63m in April, then to 4.71m in May.



That was a rise of 159.3 pc in two months and only 2.9 pc below the 4.85m transactions logged in May 2025. Spending on Bahrain-issued cards held up far better during the war.

It fell 9.5 pc from BD343.6m in February to BD311m in March, before climbing to BD333.5m in April and BD370.4m in May.

May spending was 11.1 pc higher than in April and 3.2 pc above the BD359m recorded a year earlier. A rush to buy goods in the first days of the war is thought to have softened the March fall.

Total point-of-sale and online payments reached BD596.2m in May. Point-of-sale spending stood at BD510m, against BD509.3m in May last year, a rise of 0.14 pc. Online spending was hit harder during the crisis. It fell 22.7 pc from BD148.2m in February to BD114.5m in March.

The drop came as imports plunged 57.7 pc, from BD523.1m in February to BD221.1m in March, showing how the disruption slowed trade at the height of the crisis and cut the flow of goods bought by households.

Online payments rose to BD127.7m in April, up 11.5 pc, then climbed by 9.3 pc to BD139.6m in May. They were still 7.1 pc below the BD150.3m recorded in May 2025.

The figures show a sharp return in visitor spending once flights resumed, while card spending by Bahrain residents stayed above last year’s level.

Court Acquits Gulf National in Enforcement Obstruction Case

The court acquitted a Gulf national accused of obstructing enforcement proceedings after authorities could not seize vehicles linked to the execution of a civil judgment.

The Lower Criminal Court ruled that the prosecution failed to provide sufficient evidence proving the defendant intentionally prevented the enforcement of a court order.

The case stemmed from a pre-



vious civil ruling requiring the defendant to pay money in a financial dispute. During enforcement proceedings, authorities found no bank accounts registered in his name in Bahrain.

Consequently, an enforcement officer obtained a court order to seize vehicles believed to belong to him.

When the officer attempted to carry out the seizure, the defendant stated that the vehicles had been sold as scrap years earlier. A criminal complaint was subsequently filed, alleging that he deliberately obstructed the enforcement process.

During the trial, the defendant argued that the outstanding debt had already been settled and submitted documents to support his claim. He also main-

tained that the vehicles had been disposed of well before the civil dispute arose.

In its ruling, the court found that the prosecution had not established that the defendant took any deliberate action to obstruct or prevent enforcement proceedings.

The court further noted that the case file did not specify when the vehicles were sold, making it impossible to determine whether the sale occurred before or after the civil lawsuit was filed or if it related to the enforcement process.

Rescuers recover climber Nirmal Purja's body after avalanche disaster

Rescuers recovered the body of renowned climber Nirmal Purja on Sunday after an avalanche killed him and nine team members on one of the world's highest peaks in northern Pakistan, the Alpine Club of Pakistan said.

The avalanche struck on Thursday, cutting off contact with the international expedition led by Purja, a 43-year-old British-Nepali climber, on Broad Peak.

"The ground rescue team has reached Nims Dai (Purja) at approximately 5,700m on Broad Peak -- a mountain he loved, and a mountain that has now taken him from us," the club posted on social media.

The club's general secretary Ayaz Shigri said a ground rescue team was transporting four bodies -- including those of Purja, two other Nepali nationals and a Chinese citizen

-- down from the mountain.

"Rescuers have also confirmed the presence of one additional body at a significantly higher elevation," he said in a statement.

"Due to the extremely hazardous terrain and prevailing conditions, it is unlikely that a recovery attempt will be made at this stage," he added.

Purja's expedition company confirmed on Saturday that no team members had survived.

Regional authorities said the remains of three climbers -- an Omani woman, a Nepali man and an American woman -- had been recovered and flown to the city of Skardu on Friday.

The avalanche has sparked an outpouring of shock in the mountaineering community, especially in Nepal, and leaders including Britain's Prince William have expressed condolences to the families of the climbers.

Trump says US, Israel to hold off on Iran strikes

President Donald Trump said Saturday that the United States and Israel had agreed to hold off on new strikes on Iran -- provided that a deal to end the months-long conflict is reached rapidly.

The US leader appeared to have changed course after speaking with Saudi Arabia's crown prince and after Tehran also spoke to Riyadh, and to mediators Pakistan and Turkey.

Trump insisted the US was "locked and loaded and ready to go against the Islamic Republic of Iran," but added that "we have just been asked by Iran, and other Middle Eastern Countries, to hold off any attack".

"Based on this request, I have agreed, for the future benefit of the WORLD and, likewise, the survival of a successful and prosperous Iran, to cancel the attack, subject to being able to rapidly make a DEAL," Trump posted on his Truth Social platform.

Efforts underway to revive June US-Iran deal: Iranian MP

An Iranian lawmaker said yesterday that mediators were seeking to revive a deal that briefly halted the war between Iran and the United States in June.

Hassan Ghashghavi, spokesman for parliament's national security commission, said in a video interview that "there is an effort underway to revive the 14-point Islamabad agreement, particularly by the mediators".

"They know that the main issue and, in fact, the key to the matter right now is the issue of the Strait of Hormuz, so yes, there is an exchange of views," he said.

The agreement, known as the Islamabad memorandum of understanding, was reached with the involvement of Iran's Gulf neighbour Qatar and eastern neighbour Pakistan, with negotiating sessions held in Islamabad.

The deal included arrangements concerning the Strait of Hormuz and a resumption of diplomacy between Tehran and Washington for a broader deal.

It also called for an end to the hostilities in Lebanon where Israel has been fighting the Iran-backed Hezbollah militant group.

Saudi and Iranian foreign ministers held a call and that Tehran also spoke with Pakistan and Turkey, which have acted as mediators in the talks, about "the risk of escalating tensions and insecurity in the region".

Saudi Arabia's official SPA press agency said Crown Prince Mohammed Bin Salman had a call with Trump where he "emphasised the necessity of prioritising dialogue to reduce tensions and the importance of exerting all possible efforts to achieve a truce that paves the way for diplomatic solutions".

The US president said the deal would have to include the

China flash flood death toll rises to 25

The toll from a flash flood in northwest China has risen to 25 dead, with 23 injured, state media reported yesterday a week after the disaster.

The flood ripped through the

Shuangshimen Scenic Area, a tourist spot popular with day campers, on July 26, with state media initially reporting 10 deaths and 23 injured.

The updated toll came as the country's national commission for disaster prevention said it

would oversee an investigation into the event, Xinhua said.

Shuangshimen -- in mountainous southern Gansu -- is known for its natural stone arches, alpine meadows and mountain streams.

Videos of the flooding

showed torrents of water surging through a valley where several tents and cars were parked.

China has been hit hard by extreme weather this summer, with large swathes of the country experiencing flooding.

Greek police arrest suspect over British woman's body found in suitcase

Greek police yesterday said they had arrested a suspect in their investigation into the death of a British woman whose body was found in a suitcase in Athens this month.

The police in a statement said they had arrested a 26-year-old man, identified in media reports as an Afghan national, adding that he had "confessed his actions".

"Officers of the Directorate for Combating Organized Crime have solved the homicide of a 38-year-old UK national, whose

body was found inside a suitcase in an abandoned building in the Kypseli area on July 18," they said.

They had opened a criminal

file against him for "intentional homicide, robbery and violation of firearms legislation", they said.

The woman, identified in media reports as Elisabeth-Jane Ross from Scotland, had come to Greece on June 26 and resided at a friend's home in the Piraeus area until July 10, at which point she departed for an unknown destination within the greater Athens area, they said.

"It emerged that the 26-year-old placed the body in a suitcase and transported it to the abandoned premises. Furthermore, in the days that followed, the 26-year-old used the victim's

bank cards to withdraw sums of money," the police said.

According to reports, the suspect said the victim was already dead when he found her.

Interpol authorities in the US helped identify the victim's fingerprints, and liaison officers of the United Kingdom National Crime Agency and Scotland police cooperated in the investigation.

"Despite advanced decomposition and adverse environmental conditions (investigators) managed to identify usable fingerprints belonging to the victim," the police said.

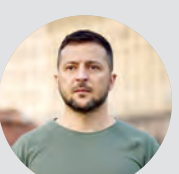

Vicious wildfires burn in US NW city of Spokane

Fast-moving walls of flame roared through Spokane in Washington state early Sunday, destroying homes and prompting mass evacuations in one of the city’s worst natural disasters on record.

Video of the wildfire shot by people driving through the city of some 230,000 on Saturday showed house after house engulfed by flames or reduced to ash as wind-fueled blazes burned out of control in hot, bone-dry weather.

Houses and trees exploded with loud bangs in some areas of the city, The Spokesman-Review, a Spokane newspaper, reported.Thick smoke billowed over the city. Cars lined up on highways as people fled their homes seeking safety.

“I was sitting near an elementary school and saw a wall of flames east of the school and just a cascade of black smoke and a wall of flames coming toward me,” said Alexandra Duggan, a public safety reporter for The Spokesman-Review.

Washington Governor Bob Ferguson declared a state of emergency and noted that the Pacific Northwest state is enduring a fourth consecutive year of drought as climate change creates conditions propitious for destructive wildfires. Blazes are burning around the region.As night fell Saturday in Spokane, local TV station KREM aired footage of what appeared to be a hillside off in the distance, with glowing orange dots or jagged lines showing structures on fire.

Officials said they are bracing for the worst when the sun comes up on the US West Coast. “When the sun sets and the sun rises, we are going to be in shock,” said Major General Gent Welsh, who oversees national guard forces in Washington state.

Thousands of Washington state residents have seen power knocked out because of the fires.Three are burning in and near Spokane. The biggest, called the Old Trails fire, jumped the Spokane River on Saturday afternoon and crossed into the city. Authorities issued the highest-level evacuation alert, “Go Now”, for swathes of northern Spokane affecting thousands of people within city limits, according to the government’s evacuation map. As of Sunday morning the three fires had charred a total of 5,390 acres, CNN reported. Emergency authorities set up a fire evacuation shelter at the Spokane Convention Center. Earlier Saturday the National Weather Service declared a “particularly dangerous situation” Red Flag Alert, which called the weather risk “extreme” across Eastern Washington.

The Washington National Guard said on X it was “rapidly mobilizing units” to assist Spokane.

close the windows.

The mayor of the nearby village of Clouange, Clement Deriu, said the smoke was causing headaches.

“From what I have been told, it’s making people nauseous,” he added.

France has been rocked by a summer of wildfires, including the country’s largest blaze since 1949 that has ravaged some 42,000 hectares (104,000 acres) of land.

That fire in a pine forest near

the winemaking capital of Bordeaux was under control on Sunday more than a week after it erupted, but firefighters continued to douse flames that were still active in several areas.

Last year, the World Meteorological Organization said wildfires can send a toxic mix of pollutants thousands of kilometres away.

It noted that, in 2024, smoke from wildfires in Canada caused air pollution even as far away as Europe.

Helicopters collide in Greece as fires spread

Two fire helicopters collided in Greece yesterday as forces battled multiple wildfires that have devastated swathes of land, with Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis warning of “extremely difficult” days ahead.

The hired Bell helicopters collided while battling a wildfire in the Psatha area west of Athens, the fire service said on Sunday.

“Search and rescue teams were immediately mobilised to locate and assist the crews,” it said.

State broadcaster ERT reported that one crewmember had been found safe, while rescuers were searching for the second.

Television footage showed one of the helicopters explode and plunge to the ground in flames after an apparent rotor collision.

Mitsotakis earlier said Greece was experiencing “extreme weather conditions” with winds that had reached 100 kilometres (60 miles) an hour.

“When the winds blow with such force, even the dozens of aircraft we have at our disposal cannot operate safely,” he

Nearly 500 firefighters were battling blazes around the popular coastal village of Porto Germeno, 70 kilometres northwest of Athens, the fire department said.

They were attempting to keep the fire from approaching the western outskirts of Athens after it scaled a mountain overnight.

Some 100 firefighters were fighting another blaze in Aigialia in the northern Peloponnese.

A new fire broke out late Saturday on the Ionian Sea island of Cephalonia, Greece’s popular holiday destination.

A 44-year-old man was arrested Sunday in Cephalonia on suspicion of deliberately starting the fire, according to the Greek news agency ANA.

The National Observatory’s climate tracker meteogr said early estimates indicated that over 6,500 hectares (16,000 acres) had been burned in separate fires on the Gulf of Corinth which also swept Porto Germeno.

It added that meteorological conditions remained adverse “mainly due to strong northerly winds, which, however, have partially weakened compared to previous days”.

Trump slams prosecutor over Reflecting Pool case withdrawal

Venezuela, Dominican Republic agree to restore ties after dispute over Maduro
Caracas, Venezuela

Venezuela and the Dominican Republic agreed yesterday to work toward restoring relations severed two years ago when the latter joined an international chorus of complaints that Nicolas Maduro's claimed presidential reelection was fraudulent.

The two countries have now agreed on a road map for talks on "gradual normalization" of their diplomatic ties, the Venezuelan foreign ministry said in a statement.

Maduro, a leftist criticized as a harsh autocrat who oversaw the collapse of oil-rich Venezuela's economy, was toppled and arrested by US forces in early January and whisked off to New York with his wife for trial on drug trafficking charges.

The former bus driver handpicked by Hugo Chavez to succeed him claimed victory in presidential elections in 2024 and a mandate for third term, even though the then US-backed opposition released voting tally sheets showing its candidate Edmundo Gonzalez had scored a landslide victory.

The Dominican Republic joined many other countries in questioning the results and Venezuela reacted angrily by severing ties between the two countries.

former Fox News host who has been a longtime supporter of the Republican president -- after she sought to dismiss the charges, acknowledging in court documents that poor installation, not vandalism, apparently wrecked the multimillion dollar renovation on the National Mall.

"I disagree 100% with Jeanine Pirro, the U.S. Attorney for the District of Columbia, on the Reflecting Pool. I don't know what she was thinking?" Trump wrote on his Truth Social platform.

"To me, it was a pure case of VANDALISM."

Trump then appeared to tacitly acknowledge what had long been suspected by politicians and the press: that a botched and hurried process had led a new

"American Flag blue" sealant to both peel from the pool's bottom and promote rapid algae growth.

"There may have been some contractor difficulty, but the major damage was caused by VANDALS!" Trump said.

He also shared security camera footage he claimed showed vandalism.

In the video individuals are seen from afar putting their hands into the water while workers undertook cleaning work, but it did not clearly show people damaging the pool or depositing anything into it.

Trump is spending the weekend at his New Jersey golf club outside New York City.

The attack on his long-time ally came amid other posts of

a war plane, gold-plated statues and what appeared to be a campaign poster of himself running for a third term, which would be illegal under the US Constitution.

Trump had made the renovation a national drama by repeatedly discussing plans and providing regular updates of the expedited work ahead of America's 250th anniversary celebrations earlier this summer.



When the pool liner began peeling off and algae grew quickly despite the application of chemicals, Trump blamed vandalism for the damage while providing no meaningful evidence. Former Olympian David Hearn, 67, was arrested and charged with felony vandalism, which could have seen him jailed for a decade. He pleaded not guilty.

On Friday, Pirro filed documents seeking dismissal of the case, saying new revelations "undermine the evidentiary basis for the indictment."

OPEC+ boosts September production by 188,000 barrels/day

Saudi Arabia, Russia and five other key members of OPEC+ agreed in an online meeting yesterday to boost oil production by 188,000 barrels a day from September, against a backdrop of disruption caused by the Middle East war. The seven participating countries decided to implement a production adjustment

of 188 thousand barrels per day," they said in a joint statement. The increase, decided by the

key countries in the enlarged Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, was wide-

ly expected by analysts.

"OPEC+ has finished unwinding its voluntary cuts. The next challenge is managing the surplus that could emerge as export flows normalise," said Jorge Leon, analyst at Rystad Energy. He warned, however, that "today's decision changes little in the near term because (the Strait of) Hormuz remains

constrained. The real market impact will come when normal export flows resume." The September increase, agreed by OPEC+ countries Saudi Arabia, Russia, Iraq, Kuwait, Kazakhstan, Algeria, and Oman, completes the unwinding of the second of the three production-cut packages introduced by organisation.



AI keeps consumer prices high in 'RAMaggedon' chip crunch

Print-outs of articles about the global memory chip shortage are pinned beside a price list at a Hong Kong computer shop, offering an explanation to confused customers feeling the pinch.

Price rises for goods such as laptops and smartphones, with cars potentially next, have been an unwelcome side-effect of the artificial intelligence gold rush -- and the squeeze is far from over.

Samsung Electronics' chief financial officer said this week shortages of microchips that store digital data will likely deepen in 2027 and stay tight through 2028.

The crunch has been nicknamed "RAMaggedon" after the components called RAM, or "random-access memory".

It is caused as profit-hungry chipmakers pivot to producing high-bandwidth memory (HBM) -- a more advanced type of computer memory in huge demand to help train and run AI tools.

The articles on display at In-Technology Services -- one

of many compact vendors crammed into Hong Kong's Wan Chai Computer Centre -- are to inform customers who "don't know what happened," manager Wade Lam told AFP.

The centre's shops sell tech equipment of all sorts, from computer parts to gadgets and games consoles.

Ken Tam, manager of Videocom Computer, which specialises in custom-built PCs, said business has halved since price rises began in September.

Sixteen gigabytes of RAM used to cost HK\$300-400 (\$40-50) but the price has now hit HK\$1,500, he said.

"When it suddenly gets so

expensive, customers have a psychological barrier," Tam told AFP.

"If they need it, they will buy it," but otherwise they will wait, or "lower their standards" and buy a less high-performing memory chip, he said.

Chinese competition

Analyst Ellie Wang at the Taiwan-based market research firm TrendForce said memory prices for PCs and smartphones were up around five to six times compared to a year ago.

The AI boom has brought humungous profits and share price jumps to the world's top three memory chip makers: South Korea's Samsung Electronics and SK hynix, along with US giant Micron.

In fourth place is ChangXin Memory Technologies (CXMT), which became mainland China's most valuable company on Monday when it made its market debut in Shanghai -- another sign of how red-hot the sector has become.

CXMT, as a relative newcomer, "remains in a follower position regarding leading-edge technologies", James Zhao, senior principal analyst at Omdia, told AFP.

HBM is used in data centre servers to support other powerful chips -- such as those made by US titan Nvidia -- that execute the dizzyingly complex calculations of AI systems.

But when it comes to conventional RAM, and a type for computers called DRAM, "the current supply-constrained market environment" could bring CXMT "late-mover advantages", he said.

At a shopping centre in a different part of Hong Kong, customer Henry Wong, an investment banker, said he had chosen

to upgrade the RAM in an older laptop instead of buying a new one with even better specs.

"After upgrading the memory, I found it ran really smoothly, and I stopped wanting to buy a new computer," he told AFP.

'Bubble'

Automakers say they are facing rising costs for in-vehicle computer systems, which could also soon push up the price of new vehicles.

In Tokyo's tech hub of Akihabara, Charles Brousse, a 30-year-old graphic designer and custom PC builder from Belgium, said prices for RAM, graphics cards and motherboards have hit "ridiculous levels".

For his "PC & Chill" service, Brousse does not buy parts to pre-build machines -- as it is too expensive -- but he requires clients to purchase their own that he assembles.

The chip shortage is pushing people to buy cheaper laptops than desktops, which can last up to a decade, said Brousse, in Tokyo on his honeymoon.

"I'm not sure that's a good thing; people end up buying products with shorter lifespans, which fuels a cycle of consumption."

Brousse added that the fact it is driven by the "speculative bubble" of AI is also frustrating, "because I'm a graphic designer by trade, so AI has a real impact on my profession."

At least 72 died in Spain's Ceuta migrant rush

At least 72 people died during the mass influx in recent days of migrants into Spain's Ceuta enclave, when tens of thousands of people mostly swam around the border post from Morocco since the territory's largest mass migrant crossing.

Most of the estimated 60,000 people who rushed into Spain's north African territory have returned to Morocco since the territory's largest mass migrant crossing.

"The latest figure that we have is 72," the government's delegate to Ceuta, Miguel Angel Perez Triano, told reporters, when asked about the number of fatalities.

The previous toll was 67 deaths.

Spanish police and troops patrolled the streets of Ceuta on Sunday as the enclave largely returned to normal after the sudden mass influx of migrants from Morocco that had occurred between Wednesday and Friday.

Only small groups of migrants were still walking around after most who crossed the small border barrier returned voluntarily to Morocco in 48 hours.

AFP on Saturday saw migrant minors milling around in a disused industrial park in Ceuta. Others were seen dozing on the pavements outside.

"All the children here want

to go to (mainland) Spain," said one of the few adults at the site, Moroccan man Aziz Dabch, 41.

The largest migrant rush into the enclave has caused an international crisis for Spain with European partners criticising Madrid for its immigration policies.

Outside a housing project near Ceuta port, Spanish soldiers detained a group of nine tired-looking migrants who were sitting on the pavement, guarded by troops with an armoured car, an AFP reporter said.

Small inflatable boats from a rescue unit scoured the waters around the border barrier that extends into the Mediterranean Sea, where a new 500-metre (1,640-feet) floating boom reinforced security.

Civil Guard were also taking migrants off a bus to escort them back to the border post to return to Morocco.

The border crossing was

calm, with groups of workers picking up trash, clothes and rubbish left behind during the mass crossing.

Rumours

Spain has blamed criminal gangs for spreading rumours that a recent Spanish Supreme Court ruling on immigration would allow migrants easier passage.

Some analysts suggested Morocco could allow migrants to cross the border to put diplomatic pressure on Spain, which has recently improved ties with Rabat's arch-enemy neighbouring Algeria.

In 2021, around 10,000 migrants crossed into Ceuta, taking advantage of Morocco easing border controls as a way to pressure Spain.

Moroccan officials have so far not offered any statement on the crisis.

But some of those who crossed the border said they

had heard the border was open -- a rumour quickly amplified on social media.

The EU said it would hold a video call on Tuesday after 22 bloc members issued a joint open letter calling for an urgent meeting to agree a speedy coordinated response, and to prevent further uncontrolled crossings.

Italy on Saturday implemented a one-month suspension of its Schengen agreement with Spain allowing for visa-free movement between borders.

Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez, in a letter to EU leaders, blasted the "selfish" reaction by some EU countries.

Pope Leo XIV on Sunday spoke to the situation in Ceuta in his daily prayers on Sunday, saying he was following it "with concern" and hoping for a solution of "peace, stability and justice".

Ukraine hits multiple Russian regions, killing 8: officials

Ukraine attacked multiple regions of Russia on Sunday, killing at least eight people, Russian officials said.

Some of the strikes hit hundreds of kilometres from the front line, according to authorities.

Both Moscow and Kyiv have upped attacks on each other in recent months, as US-led talks aimed at ending the conflict remain largely frozen.

Kyiv, which denies targeting civilians, says the strikes are fair retaliation for deadly Russian bombardment of its own territory and are aimed at pressuring Moscow into negotiations.

Ukrainian shelling of Russia's Belgorod region bordering Ukraine left three dead, while a separate drone attack on the Saratov region bordering Kazakhstan killed two others, regional authorities said.

Three were killed in a drone strike on a car in Russia's Udmurtia region, more than 1,000 kilometres (600 miles) from the front line, the region's acting governor Olga Abramova said on Telegram.

"This act is monstrous in its senselessness. These people were definitely not a military target," she said.

Russian air defence systems intercepted 635 Ukrainian drones overnight, the Russian defence ministry said.

South Korea records its highest-ever temperature of 42.5C

South Korea registered its highest temperature since records began more than a century ago yesterday, as authorities warned people to "immediately" stop all outdoor activities in affected areas.

The southeastern city of Yangsan saw the temperature reach 42.5C at 1:26 pm (0426 GMT), the Korea Meteorological Administration said on its website.

Yangsan has been the epicentre of the ongoing heat-

wave, where temperatures exceeded 40C for a fifth consecutive day on Sunday, while many other cities including Daegu and Busan are seeing temperatures climb into the high 30s.

People flocked to air-conditioned shopping malls or cafes to escape the blistering temperatures, an AFP reporter saw.

More than 20 localities were under emergency heatwave alerts yesterday -- a new warning category introduced this year to better address rising temperatures.

Five dead, 41 missing in Indonesia ferry fire

An Indonesian ferry caught fire at sea yesterday, killing five people and leaving another 41 missing after some jumped overboard, search and rescue officials said.

A total of 225 people on the vessel were rescued, said the regional Surabaya Search and Rescue Agency, which provided the latest figures in an afternoon update. Some passengers jumped into the sea and were picked up by a nearby ship, according to Basarnas, Indonesia's National Search and Rescue Agency.

Four other vessels were on standby near the ferry but could not approach because of the risk posed by flammable material on the ferry, it said.

The captain had called the ferry company to report the fire as the vessel sailed from Surabaya in East Java to Makassar in

South Sulawesi, Basarnas said. The captain had not been in

contact since then, it said.

A larger rescue operation was

heading to the site from Surabaya, a six-hour journey from

the site of the disaster, Basarnas said. "Based on preliminary re-

ports from the field, passengers are waiting to be evacuated by the vessels in the vicinity of the incident site," said Muhammad Masyhud, a senior official at the Ministry of Transportation.

"The safety of passengers and crew is our top priority. We are continuously coordinating with all relevant parties to ensure that the evacuation process can proceed quickly, safely, and effectively," he said in a statement.

Marine accidents are a regular occurrence in Indonesia, an archipelago of more than 17,000 islands, partly due to lax safety standards and unpredictable weather. A ferry transporting more than 70 people sank last month while sailing near Selayar, a small tropical island south of the much larger Sulawesi.

At least four people were found dead, and 14 others remained missing until the end of the search operation.

Saudi Crown Prince, Trump Discuss Regional Security and Diplomacy



Saudi Crown Prince and Prime Minister Mohammed bin Salman held a phone conversation with US President Donald Trump to discuss the latest developments in the Middle East and ongoing efforts to ease regional tensions.

According to the Saudi Press Agency (SPA), the two leaders reviewed the current regional situation and reaffirmed the importance of resolving conflicts through dialogue and diplomatic engagement. They also discussed the need to support international efforts aimed at preserving peace and preventing further instability.

During the call, the Crown Prince emphasised the importance of prioritising dialogue over confrontation and called for intensified efforts to de-escalate tensions. He stressed that diplomatic

solutions remain the most effective path to safeguarding regional and global security while avoiding a broader conflict that could have serious humanitarian, political and economic consequences.

The Crown Prince also highlighted Saudi Arabia's continued support for initiatives that promote stability, encourage constructive dialogue and strengthen international cooperation in addressing regional challenges.

The conversation comes amid heightened tensions across the Middle East, with global powers and regional stakeholders working to prevent further escalation and encourage diplomatic engagement. The latest exchange reflects ongoing consultations between Saudi Arabia and the United States on regional security and shared efforts to maintain peace and stability.

Jordan, US Discuss Regional Security and Defense Cooperation



Jordan's Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Maj. Gen. Yousef Huneiti, held talks with US Sen. Joni Ernst, a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, on Sunday to discuss the latest security developments in the Middle East.

The meeting, held at the General Command headquarters in Amman, focused on enhancing military and defense cooperation between Jordan and the United States, including expanding joint training programs and strengthening the exchange of military expertise, according to the Jordan News Agency.

The discussions come as Jordan continues to play a key role in regional security. Since the escalation of tensions involving Iran, the US and Israel, the Jordanian Armed Forces have intercepted numerous drones and missiles that entered the Kingdom's airspace. Last month, Jordan also intercepted several Iranian missiles reportedly targeting US forces stationed at Muwaffaq Salti Airbase in Azraq.

US Ambassador Jim Holtsnider, the US defense attaché in Amman, and senior Jordanian Armed Forces officials also attended the meeting.

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Global ICC honour for Bahrain cricket

Shukla earns ICC Long Service Award and a place among only four Lead Master Coach Educators

For more than two decades, Prachur Kumar Shukla has quietly worked behind the scenes to shape Bahrain's cricketing future. Today, that dedication has earned global recognition.

The High Performance Director of Bahrain Cricket received the prestigious ICC Long Service Award from ICC Chairman Jay Shah at the ICC Annual Conference 2026 in Edinburgh, Scotland, honouring 21 years of service to the sport.

The recognition comes alongside another landmark achievement. Shukla has also become one of only four ICC Lead Master Coach Educators in the world, placing Bahrain at the centre of international coach education.

"This gives Bahrain cricket a direct line into ICC's global coaching standards," Shukla told The Daily Tribune. "The pathway we build for our players - from grassroots to the national team will now be shaped by the same frameworks used

at the highest level of world cricket."

The appointment means Bahrain can increasingly deliver internationally recognised ICC coaching courses locally, reducing the need for coaches to travel overseas for certification. The Kingdom has already hosted the ICC Global Level 3 Coaching Programme, attracting participants from 21 countries, while dozens of Bahraini coaches and national team players have earned Level 2 qualifications at home.

As an ICC Lead Master Coach Educator, Shukla's role extends beyond coaching players. He is responsible for training the next generation of coach educators, maintaining global coaching standards and leading programmes across different countries. His next assignment will take him to Malaysia later this month to conduct another ICC Global Level 3 course.

Looking back, Shukla said Bahrain's cricket landscape has been transformed over the past two decades.

"When I started, structured coaching pathways barely ex-

isted. Today, Bahrain produces ICC-certified coaches locally, has reached 25th in the ICC T20I rankings and operates five high-performance squads. We are also preparing for a new international cricket ground with turf wickets and floodlights."

Shukla attributed much of that progress to the continued support of Bahrain Cricket's leadership. He thanked His Highness Shaikh Khalid bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Patron of Bahrain Cricket, and Bahrain Cricket Federation Board and Advisory Board Chairman Mohammed

Mansoor for consistently backing the federation's high-performance and coach education programmes, helping them grow over the years.

He also acknowledged his employer, Aluminium Bahrain (Alba), for supporting his voluntary work alongside his full-time role for more than two decades. From launching the Alba Cricket Tournament in 2007 to establishing the Alba Club Cricket Academy, Shukla said Alba's management, led by CEO Ali Al Baqali, encouraged his commitment to developing cricket. He dedicated the honour to the players, coaches, volunteers and administrators who have contributed to Bahrain cricket's journey.

For Shukla, however, the award is not the finish line.

"My ambition is to make Bahrain a regional hub for coach education," he said. "More importantly, I want to build a system that develops more local coaches, umpires and administrators so the game continues to grow long after any one individual."

Bahrain have announced their squad for the second edition of the Arab U17 Men's Volleyball Championship, with head coach Yusuf Khalifa selecting a 15-player roster for the regional tournament hosted by the kingdom.

sain Albalooshi, Mohammed Abdulaziz, Hadi Hussain and Ali Hassan.

Bahrain enter the tournament after gaining valuable international experience at the AVC Boys' U18 Volleyball Championship 2026 in Haikou, China, last month, where they finished 12th among 16 participating teams.

The nationals will be looking to improve on their performance from the inaugural Arab youth championship in 2024, where they claimed the silver medal in Amman, Jordan. Saudi Arabia won the gold medal on that occasion.

The Arab U17 Men's Volleyball Championship will feature a single round-robin format, with each team facing the other five participating nations. Bahrain will begin their campaign against Algeria on August 9 at 7pm before meeting Jordan at the same time the following day.

They will then face Kuwait on August 12, Saudi Arabia on August 14, and Egypt on August 16, with all of Bahrain's matches scheduled for 7pm.

title contender after earning a unanimous decision win over South Africa's Luthando "Shorty" Biko.

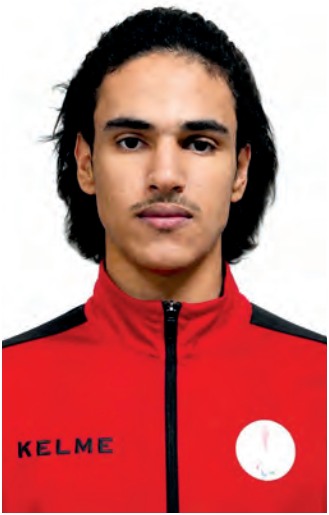

The Grand Prix series sits among the highest-ranked events on the World Taekwondo calendar. Qualification is not open to all — only athletes holding top positions in the world rankings and meeting strict criteria earn a place on the start list.

Samqa met every standard.

National taekwondo coach Tawfiq Nwaiser called the selection a landmark for Bahrain, saying it reflects the real progress made by the Kingdom's para taekwondo programme in recent years.

Para taekwondo coach Fajr Al Binali echoed that view, pointing to a series of strong international performances that steadily built Samqa's standing among the world's elite in his weight category.

More Than a Competition

For Samqa, Paris is not just

a destination — it is an opportunity.

Al Binali said competing at Grand Prix level will sharpen his international ranking, test him against the very best, and strengthen his preparation for the major competitions ahead.

The achievement also carries wider significance. The Bahrain Paralympic Committee has made developing athletes capable of competing at the highest global level a central part of its strategy — and Samqa's qualification is evidence that the approach is working.

Bahrain's flag has been raised on many sporting stages. In Paris, it will fly in para sport for the first time at this level.

Riffa begin Dubai camp ahead of new season

Eala stuns Osaka to book Washington final against Pegula

Alexandra Eala stunned former world number one Naomi Osaka 6-4, 6-2 to reach the women's final of the WTA and ATP Washington Open, where she will face third-ranked Jessica Pegula.

The 21-year-old Philippines left-hander delivered an impressive victory over the four-time Grand Slam winner from Japan to reach her second WTA final, having lost her first last year at Eastbourne.

"I'm super proud of my performance," Eala said.

"I played really well and I had a great mentality and I stayed locked in until the end."

Eala, set to jump to a career-best 24th in the world rankings, had previously ousted

second seed Elina Svitolina for her sixth top-10 victory of the year after dethroning 2025 Washington champion Leylah Fernandez.

It was the first meeting of the Asian stars, Eala facing one of the idols of her youth.

"She definitely has an aura and she definitely has power," Eala said of Osaka.

"I remember watching her finals in the Australian Open and US Open, so really a great experience to share the court with her."

"I'm really happy I was able to produce that level against her."

Osaka, ranked 13th, was thwarted in her bid for an eighth WTA title and first since taking the 2021 Australian Open.

Messi returns as Inter Miami draw 2-2 against Columbus Crew

Lionel Messi returned to Major League Soccer action after World Cup duty, coming on in the second half as his Inter Miami side drew 2-2 with Columbus Crew.

Two weeks after Argentina's loss to Spain in the World Cup final, Messi was back on the pitch, entering in the 53rd minute to the delight of fans at Miami's Nu Stadium. But Messi could not mark his return with a goal, twice shooting wide.

Uruguayan Luis Suarez scored

his seventh goal in his last four games to put Miami 1-0 up in the 16th minute.

Miami's former Manchester United and Real Madrid midfielder Casemiro scored an own goal in the 34th minute which drew Columbus level at 1-1.

Suarez provided the assist for Noah Allen to head Miami into a 2-1 half-time lead.

But midfielder Brais Mendez, making his Columbus debut after arriving from Real Sociedad in Spain, curled in a second equalizer from an 84th-minute free-kick.

The result ended Miami's six-match winning streak and kept them in second place in the Eastern Conference behind Nashville, who drew 2-2 at DC United.

Los Angeles FC and Vancouver Whitecaps remain level at the top of the Western Conference after they drew 1-1 at Vancouver's BC Place.

Son Heung-min extended his scoring streak since the MLS resumed after the World Cup to four goals in four matches as he put Los Angeles ahead in the 37th minute.

Infantino struggling to survive, says former IOC marketing chief

FIFA president Gianni Infantino's leadership has become "radioactive" and his 10-year reign as head of world football "is over", a former head of IOC marketing told AFP.

A FIFA plan to raise up to \$4.2 billion, based on a valuation of \$20 billion, through private investment leaked to media on Tuesday.

The scheme proposed a new commercial subsidiary, called the FIFA Forward Enterprise (FFE), to run events such as the World Cup and Club World Cup and one-off payments of \$20 million to all 211 member associations, who each have one FIFA vote.

Following a furious global reaction, Infantino on Saturday shelved the scheme.

"I do not think we have ever seen such a fast fall from grace by a sports leader," Michael Payne, former head of marketing at the International Olympic Committee, told AFP.

"One week ago, Infantino was riding high from delivering a very successful World Cup, and expected to run unopposed for

election next year to continue his mandate as president of FIFA.

"Now Infantino will struggle to survive the month.

"How does he find himself in this mess -- gross hubris!"

The signs are not good for the 56-year-old Swiss, with European football's governing body UEFA and CONCACAF -- which includes the three recent co-hosts of the World Cup, the US, Canada and Mexico -- among

those expressing their discontent over his leadership.

UEFA said he had lost their "confidence" with his "shabby deal". CONCACAF called for "a comprehensive reckoning with this presidency".

Payne, who in nearly two decades at the IOC helped modernise the organisation's brand and improve its finances, said he feared the fall-out if Infantino stayed.

"I learnt long ago to never say

never in this world, but this is going to take more than a miracle for Infantino to survive," said the 68-year-old Irishman.

"I don't see how any amount of lobbying or 'persuasion' of the smaller countries can save him.

"His leadership has become radioactive, and if he stays there will be total civil war in global football, with breakaways by leading nations and boycotts.

"Its over."

Terrence Burns, who was

brand and marketing strategist for two successful World Cup hosting bids, told AFP he had never seen "anything mismanaged and bungled so badly by people so smart".

'Played it well'

However, Burns said that even though Infantino's position is "precarious", it is not beyond repair even if a challenger does emerge for the vote in Rabat next year.

He said that UEFA had resorted to the "nuclear option" of threatening a World Cup boycott but in FIFA elections "confederations do not vote as a bloc".

"It's the individual associations that receive development money from Zurich," said Burns, adding that Africa (CAF) and Oceania could be pivotal.

"If CAF stays with him, he can lose Europe, Asia, and CONCACAF in public and still win in the hall.

"If CAF moves, it's game over."

Burns said Infantino has wasted all his capital and a 64-team World Cup might not be enough of a sweetener.

"I think expansion sells when

it reads as access," he said.

"But offered now, weeks after an attempt to sell a fifth of the asset that generates the money, it reads as a payment."

Burns said Infantino's authority has taken a hit.

"The thing he's lost is inevitability, which in this business is a real asset," he said.

"He was unopposed in 2019 and 2023 because serious people don't run against someone who can't be beaten.

"I think that calculation changed this week, before the 18 November nomination deadline.

"That's the part I'd be most worried about if I were in his camp."

For Burns the winners were the "sport itself" and UEFA president Aleksander Ceferin.

"He played it well," said Burns.

"UEFA carried the fight collectively while he issued no personal statement at any point, which means he can now stand, or not stand, (for the FIFA presidency) without having spent anything on the argument.

"The boycott threat was aggressive and credible, which is a rare pairing."

Tottenham manager 'happy' with pre-season progress

Tottenham manager Roberto De Zerbi said he was "happy for a lot of things" as they return to London unbeaten in three pre-season games after a 2-1 win over Chelsea in Sydney.

The Italian spent more a week in New Zealand and Australia with his squad as he builds towards the new Premier League campaign where they aim to do better than their 17th place last season.

They head home after beating Auckland FC 2-0, recording a shootout win after a 1-1 draw with Sydney FC and a gutsy victory over their London rivals on Saturday despite playing most of the second half with 10 men.

"I'm happy for a lot of things. First of all, because we have spent a very important 10 days together. We worked very well," he said.

"I'm happy to work with these players. I'm looking forward to

Bergvall, who all played a big part in the Chelsea victory which was sealed by Richarlison's 90th minute winner.

But the Italian also pinpointed several future prospects.

"I am so happy for the young players because Malachi (Hardy), Rio (Kyerematen), Tye (Hall), Kota (Takai), they have been in this period very important for us, very good players."

De Zerbi was particularly pleased with the way Spurs kept their composure when defender Kevin Danso was sent off for a reckless challenge three minutes into the second half against Chelsea.

He wants to see similar fight when Spurs kick off their Premier League campaign against Brentford on August 22.

"It's important to change the habits, because our habits in the last two seasons have been not good in terms of results," he said.

Auger-Aliassime playing for hometown pride at Montreal Masters

World number four Felix Auger-Aliassime will be playing for local pride when the ATP Montreal Masters begins yesterday in his hometown.

The Canadian returns as second seed to a tournament he attended frequently as a budding young player, when he used to watch and study his sporting idols up close in training between matches.

"There were several times when I didn't have a ticket, so I would watch all the training sessions," he said at the event, where he is seeded behind Roland Garros winner and Wimbledon runner-up Alexander Zverev.

"I learned even more things during training since they (fans) have the chance to be very, very close to the players."

Auger-Aliassime recently split with his longtime coach of 10 years, Frederic Fontang, after losing a frustrating Wimbledon five-set quarter-final to Novak Djokovic.

He will have the bulk of the

crowd support at an event which is missing major stars including top-ranked Jannik Sinner, who opted not to play in the wake of his Wimbledon triumph to send tournament organizers into crisis mode.

Joining the Italian on the sidelines with less than a month to go before the US Open begins are the 39-year-old Djokovic and Spain's Carlos Alcaraz, still testing and healing the right wrist injury which has kept him off court since mid-April.

Auger-Aliassime's best performance at the Canadian event was a quarter-final four years ago. Last year he lost in the second round.

Despite the hometown support, Auger-Aliassime said he will aim to stick to his usual routines and focus solely on his game.

"Already, my expectations or hopes are at the same level as the public's. So already, there is no gap at that level," he said.

"I have my work to do, I have my preparation, I have my routines, so all that doesn't change.

De Zerbi unsure over Richarlison's future at Spurs

Tottenham manager Roberto De Zerbi is unsure whether Richarlison will stay at the club, saying the Brazilian forward "sometimes" wants to leave.

The 29-year-old Richarlison reinforced his importance with a last-minute winner as Spurs beat Chelsea 2-1.

He also scored in their 2-0 win over Auckland FC last weekend.

Richarlison's fate has come into focus after Tottenham's aggressive summer of spending to boost their fortunes after avoiding the drop by coming

17th in the Premier League last season.

Tottenham have yet to recruit a striker, but De Zerbi has made clear he is not fin-

ished in the transfer market yet with Manchester City forward Savinho among those reportedly in his sights.

"I don't know," De Zerbi said when asked about Richarlison's future after the Chelsea match.

"As a player, as a guy, it is unbelievable his attitude and behaviour, but at the end we have to respect what he wants to do.

"For me he is still an important player because it is not so easy to find another striker as Richarlison, because Richarlison scores goals and he knows the way."
