

Climate Resilience Plan for Bahrain’s Water Sector

Minister highlights scientific and technical tools developed to strengthen water security

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Minister of Oil and Environment and Special Envoy for Climate Affairs Dr Mohammed bin Mubarak bin Dinah affirmed that the “Enhancing Climate Resilience of the Water Sector in the Kingdom of Bahrain” project represents a leading national initiative aimed at strengthening the Kingdom’s water sector.

The minister made the remarks while opening a workshop showcasing the project’s outcomes, which the Green Climate Fund (GCF) supports and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) implements in cooperation.

Dr bin Dinah said the project helped establish an integrated scientific and technical foundation to support planning and decision-making, enhance water security and improve the efficiency of water resource management.

He added that the project’s outcomes align with Bahrain’s national directions for sustainable development and climate change adaptation.
