

The Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) has begun the pilot phase of its new one-stop travel system, starting with the UAE and Bahrain.

Bahrain hospital infection rates match global benchmarks

Bahrain's hospital infection rates are tracking global benchmarks under an infection control plan built on World Health Organisation guidance, the Health Ministry has told the Shura Council in a written reply.

The ministry was answering a question from Shura Council member Dr Jameela Al Salman.

She had asked if Bahrain has a national plan that follows WHO advice, what standards are in place to protect patients and staff, how those rules are checked, if binding regulations have been issued, and how hospital infection rates compare with figures abroad.

In its response, the ministry said Bahrain runs a national infection prevention and control plan that has been updated and approved by the National Communicable Diseases Committee, a multi-disciplinary, multi-sector group.

Approach

The plan follows the WHO's approach to infection control and workplace safety in health facilities and is applied across government hospitals, Royal Medical Services, primary health centres and private hospitals and clinics, with regular reviews to keep pace with practice overseas.

According to the reply, the plan rests on clear policies to limit the spread of infection, systems to watch for and prevent healthcare-associated infections, and training and ongoing development for healthcare workers in line with global standards.

The ministry said there is also a focus on building a safety-minded culture and on service quality at every level of the health system.

Infection control standards are tied to health, technical and safety requirements issued by the National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA) for health facilities and their equipment.

These national technical rules were drawn up.

MPs approve bill limiting foreign hires in public jobs reserved for qualified Bahrainis

MPs yesterday approved a bill that would force ministries and state bodies to bring in expatriates for public jobs only if they hold at least a master's degree and 10 years' experience, then sent it back to the Shura Council for a second review.

The Council of Representatives' vote confirmed earlier backing for amendments to Article 11 of the Civil Service Law and returned the draft to the upper chamber, which had previously rejected it in principle under the legislative process in force.

Under the bill, ministries and other government entities may only contract non-Bahrainis if no Bahraini candidate is available who meets the requirements for the post.

Any expatriate hire must hold at least a master's degree, or an equivalent qualification, in the relevant specialism and have no less than 10 years' experience in the same field.

Cap

Contracts for non-Bahraini staff would be capped at two years and could be renewed only once for another two-year term.

Renewal would depend on confirming that a suitable Bahraini candidate is still not available and on the approval of a committee formed by the Civil Service Bureau to check that the conditions in the executive regulations of the Civil Service Law have been met.

The text also requires that the employment contract for a foreign worker include an obligation to train a Bahraini employee during the contract period.

Where a contract is silent on a point, the Civil Service Law and its executive regulations would apply to those hired under these arrangements.

Instructions

The Civil Service Bureau would issue instructions spelling out the rules and standard forms for contracts with non-Bahrainis, including the training requirement.



The amendments are intended to give Bahraini citizens first call on public jobs and to build local skills so that Bahrainis can take over posts now held by expatriates.

The government, in a memorandum attached to the draft, asked MPs to reconsider the bill.

Academic level

It stated that fixing a specific academic level and detailed conditions in the law does not sit with the legislative approach of the Civil Service Law, as decisions on required knowledge, skills and extra qualifications for each post depend on actual staffing needs and changing circumstances.

According to the memorandum, that flexibility helps government bodies meet the tasks assigned to them.

Despite that position, and the earlier refusal of the Shura Council to approve the bill in principle, the Council of Representatives has now confirmed its support for the amended text and sent it back to the upper chamber for a further review.

Exit controls on indebted foreign investors and flexi-visa workers

● **MPs lodge urgent proposal for government action**

Foreign investors and flexi-visa workers who leave Bahrain without paying their debts are in the sights of MPs pressing for stricter exit controls tied to outstanding financial obligations.

A group of MPs has lodged an urgent proposal calling on the government to impose extra conditions, within existing laws, on foreign investors, commercial registration holders and

workers under the registered worker (flexi visa) scheme.

Their aim is to stop permanent departure from the country before all dues are settled.

The proposal is backed by Khalid Buanaq, Mahmood Fardan, Zainab AbdulAmeer, Mohammed Al Ma'arafi and Hisham Al Awadhi.

Confidence

They say recent years have seen more foreign investors and workers leave Bahrain without paying what they owe to government bodies or private companies, which has led to a build-up of unpaid debts and, in their view, affected confidence in the investment climate and commercial dealings in the kingdom.

According to the MPs, small and medium-sized enterprises are the most exposed.

Many such firms, they say, are left unable to recover what they are owed once debtors leave the country, which hits their cash flow and frustrates state efforts to back entrepreneurship and

help these businesses grow.

They add that the ease of opening commercial registrations and working under the flexi-visa system, without firm checks before final exit, has allowed some people to take advantage of the rules and walk away from contractual duties.

This, they argue, weakens the principle of the binding force of contracts and shakes trust in the local market.

Unpaid sums

The MPs also note that the unpaid sums cover a range of liabilities, including rent, bank finance, government fees and fines, leaving landlords, lenders and other parties unable to collect their money once the debtor has gone.

MPs back licence for quad-bike 'bungee' tracks

An urgent proposal to create a legal category for quad-bike circuits has been approved by MPs after operators of so-called "bungee" tracks were ordered to shut because no licence exists for the activity.

The Council of Representatives agreed yesterday to an urgent motion calling on the government to register "operation of bungee tracks - Bungee Vehicles / 4Wheel" as a new activity under the Renting and leasing of recreational and sports goods register.

The change is intended to give existing operators a clear legal route to resume work and to bring these tracks under a formal permit system. In Bahrain, "bungee vehicles" is the term widely used for four-wheeled quad bikes.

The proposal was lodged by MP Mamdouh Al Saleh, Second Deputy Speaker Ahmed Qarata, MP Mahmood Fardan, MP Jalal Kadhem and MP Abdulwahid Qarata.

Their explanatory memorandum links the move to the recent growth of Bahrain's tourism sector, which they say has expanded in step with government plans to widen leisure options, diversify income sources and improve quality of life.

Lawmakers block plan for Bahrain Post to offer banking services

Fourteen MPs have blocked a draft law to let Bahrain Post offer bank-style services under Central Bank oversight, with eight backing the plan and two abstaining at yesterday's sitting.

The proposal sought to allow Bahrain Post to provide financial services in line with the Central Bank of Bahrain and Financial Institutions Law, leaving a ministerial decision to list the services and set their rules.

The draft was originally put forward by MP Basema Mubarak. The Financial and Economic Affairs Committee had supported the idea during its study.

MP seeks fix to clashing medical rules after doctors suspended

Two Bahraini doctors were taken to court and suspended from work for six months even though they had followed official hospital policies, an MP told Parliament as he urged changes to clashing medical rules so that malpractice cases are handled on a clear and fair basis.

Jameel Mulla Hassan said the written reply to his parliamentary question was not clear and asked if this meant that investigation committees did not recognise approved policies in public hospitals and health centres.

He said health workers follow written policies and procedures issued by government institutions and objected to these being ignored when some decisions are taken.

He referred to two cases, one involving a psychiatrist and the other a doctor at Salmaniya Medical Complex.

Both, he said, had acted in line with formal policies in force at their institutions, yet the reports submitted in the cases went against them and they were prosecuted and suspended from work for six months.

Rising breakups

Bahrain records five divorces a day, straining families and state support, says MP

Five divorces a day and more than 20,000 cases in a decade have been recorded in Bahrain, MP Jalal Kadhem told Parliament, citing Justice Ministry data and warning of pressure on families, children and state support.

During a debate on the ministry's reply to his parliamentary question, he said Sharia courts had registered 5,284 divorce cases among Bahrainis over the past three years.

According to the reply, this works out to five divorce cases a day, roughly one every five hours, against 12 marriages a day.

MP Kadhem said this showed that "almost half of cases end in divorce, which poses a direct threat to the cohesion of society".

Cases

He added that 94 per cent of the divorce cases recorded during the period of the question involved long-standing marriages with children, rather than recent marriages as some might assume.

The lawmaker said this added to the social and psychological

strain on sons and daughters caught up in marital disputes.

He said Bahrain had recorded more than 20,000 divorce cases in the past 10 years.

Support

MP Kadhem linked this to government support programmes, saying the state spends about BD66 million each year on housing, cost-of-living and social security allowances for divorced women.

A large share of current housing applications, he said, comes from divorced women or families that have separated because of divorce, which has added to pressure on the housing file.

On family reconciliation, Kadhem said settlement rates at the family reconciliation office had fallen while the number of re-

ferred cases had grown.

Some disputes were resolved, but most ended without agreement.

Worrying sign

He described this as a worrying sign in a country of about 700,000 people, and said it showed that family disputes were growing more tangled and that it was becoming harder to reach middle-ground solutions between spouses.

The legislator listed several factors he believes are linked to divorce, including weak communication within families, constant use of social media, economic pressure and higher living costs.

He also mentioned poor understanding of marriage, the impact of some media content,

interference from relatives and cases of domestic violence.

Effects

The effects cited included poorer school performance and mental health among children, weaker community ties, higher costs for the state and lower productivity among adults involved in family disputes.

Kadhem called for steps to address the issue.

He proposed a joint committee bringing together the Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs, the Supreme Council for Women, the Ministry of Social Development and the Interior Ministry to draw up a national plan for handling family cases.

He also urged the creation of advisory centres in every gov-

ernorate, stronger pre-marriage preparation through compulsory courses and a larger role for religious and community bodies. He further called for stricter control of media content which, in his words, 'breaks up families and encourages separation'.

The MP also criticised the ministry's reply to his question on the total number of cases before the Sharia courts. He said the figures provided covered only marriage and divorce, although he had asked for the total caseload, including maintenance, khul', custody, inheritance, waqf-related disputes, missing persons and other Sharia proofs. He said the data submitted did not answer the first part of his question to the minister.

What began as a small hydroponic experiment in 2012 has grown into one of Bahrain's leading models of sustainable farming, a transformation personally driven by Shaikh Rashid bin Khalifa Al Khalifa, General Manager of Peninsula Farms, who affectionately refers to it as Bahrain's farm.

What began with a few pipes, seedlings, and hopeful tinkering has now blossomed into a national success story.

Speaking to The Daily Tribune at the opening of the Farmers' Market 2025, Shaikh Rashid reflected on the farm's early mission, one with no frills attached: strengthen Bahrain's food security.

The early days featured hydroponic lettuce, tomatoes and peppers, humble beginnings that would later pave the way for nearly 35,000 square meters of open-field farming.

Lineup

With each new season, the farm expanded its lineup, grad-

ually replacing several imported items with homegrown alternatives.

A small victory here, a big milestone there, all adding up to more nutritious options for shoppers and a shorter farm-to-table journey.

Beyond produce, Peninsula Farms has become a playground

for sustainability ideas.

Its solar power initiative currently covers about 70% of the farm's energy needs, with 100% green firmly pinned on the vision board.

Solar isn't the only innovation shaping the farm's environmental footprint. Peninsula Farms follows a strict zero-waste philosophy, including transforming unsold goat milk into natural, high-quality soap.

"We learned how to make soap from returned milk instead of throwing it out. It's genuinely good quality," Shaikh Rashid says.

The farm also runs a composting program that invites hotels and restaurants to send back organic waste, which is then converted into compost for their tree-growing initiative.

German economy in 'deepest crisis' of post-war era: industry group

Home to more than 100,000 manufacturing firms of varying sizes

● Merz has defended his government's actions

Germany's economy is suffering its "deepest crisis" since the aftermath of World War II, an industry group warned Tuesday, calling on Chancellor Friedrich Merz's government to take urgent action to spark a revival.

Europe's biggest economy "is in free fall, but the federal government is not responding decisively enough," said Peter Leibinger, president of the Federation of German Industries (BDI).

Germany is facing a perfect storm: high energy costs burdening manufacturers, weak demand for its exports in key

markets, the emergence of China as an industrial rival and the US tariff onslaught.

It has suffered two years of recession and is forecast to eke out only meagre growth in 2025.

The conservative Merz, who took power in May, has pledged to revive the eurozone's traditional powerhouse, including through a public spending blitz on defence and infrastructure.

But industry leaders are increasingly voicing frustration that the efforts are moving too slowly and are insufficient to tackle a host of deep-rooted problems, from chronic labour shortages to heavy bureaucratic burdens.

"The economy is experiencing its deepest crisis since the founding of the federal republic, yet the federal government is not responding with sufficient determination," said Leibinger.

"Germany now needs an economic policy turnaround with clear priorities for competitiveness and growth," he added.

Heavy regulation, little innovation

Brian Fuerderer, head and founder of German high-tech surgical equipment maker Microqore Medical, agreed with the BDI's assessment, saying the economy was being held back by overregulation and a lack of innovation.

"In Germany, entrepreneurship as such no longer really exists," he told AFP.

"The car manufacturers are no longer leaders... And I think that's where the first problem starts, that the spirit of innovation is no longer encouraged or desired."

In its latest report released Tuesday, the BDI -- an umbrella association for many industry federations -- forecast that German factory output will fall two percent in 2025, which would mark its fourth consecutive year of contraction.

Heavy industry, from car-making to producing facto-

ry equipment and steel, remains crucial to the German economy. The country is home to more than 100,000 manufacturing firms of varying sizes, employing over eight million people, according to the BDI.

But there has been a steady drumbeat of layoff announcements in recent times, particularly in the crisis-stricken auto sector, including carmaker Volkswagen and parts supplier Bosch.

Merz has defended his government's actions, saying it will take time to get the economy back on track and pointing to reforms that have been enacted, including on lowering corporate income tax and reducing industry power costs.

There is some light on the horizon. The economy is expected to start picking up speed next year, driven by the spending ramp-up, with the government forecasting 1.3 percent growth.

Some hope that the thousands of jobs being axed in the auto and other industrial sectors could be replaced by new roles in defence companies, which are hiring rapidly as European countries rearm to face the growing Russian threat.

But Hans Christoph Atzpödien, head of the BDSV defence industry association, warned that the sector's growth could only partially offset the losses at carmakers.

"Of course, the quantities involved and the ways of working are different," he told a press conference Tuesday, at an event organised by the economy and defence ministries.

"There are opportunities but it helps to be cautious about them."

Saudi powers forward with deficit spending to fund reforms

Saudi Arabia greenlit its 2026 budget yesterday, projecting a deficit of 165 billion riyals (\$44 billion) as the kingdom presses on with an ambitious spending drive to diversify its oil-dependent economy.

The Arab world's largest economy is overseeing a major push to slash its dependence on oil revenues, with officials pouring billions into projects to attract investment and tourism.

To help meet that goal in the coming year, the ministry said the state's general budget for 2026 would have total expenditures of 1.313 trillion riyals (350.1 billion dollars) and total revenues 1.147 trillion riyals (305.8 billion dollars).

The projected deficit amounts to 3.3% of GDP, which is lower than the deficit of 245 billion riyals estimated for

2025, which is equivalent to 5.3% of GDP, according to the finance ministry.

Ahead of the budget, the kingdom's finance minister Mohammed al-Jadaan defended the government's latest fiscal plan.

"The current level of deficit is a policy choice," the minister said in response to a question from AFP, during a briefing before the publication of the budget.

"We need to invest in our economy and so long as the return from these investments is higher than the cost of the debt, we will continue that drive."

The budget figures will be keenly watched by energy industry experts, with the hopes of gleaning insights into where Saudi Arabia expects oil revenues to head in the near future.

The kingdom's revenues are still heavily dependent on its petroleum exports.

Continued global economic uncertainty and a glut in supply has weighed on the market throughout most of the year, resulting in lower oil prices.

Crude oil prices have hovered in the \$60 to \$70 per-barrel range in the US and international markets, down by about \$10 from the 2024 period.

The world economy has been "surprisingly resilient" in the face of adversity this year, the OECD said Tuesday, raising its growth estimates for key economies, notably the US and the eurozone.

The gradual implementation of new trade policy barriers, political uncertainty and declining investment had put the brakes on growth, but demand had held up astonishingly well, it said in its latest world economic outlook report.

Easier global financial conditions, supportive macroeconomic policies, real income growth, and strong demand for new AI-related investments, particularly in the US, was supporting demand, the organisation said.

American gross domestic product (GDP) growth is now

estimated at 2.0% in 2025, 0.2 points more than in the OECD's previous outlook, published in September.

For the eurozone, the OECD now forecasts 1.3% growth, 0.1 points more than in September. The world economy overall is on course for 3.2% growth in 2025, down from 3.3% last year, before slowing to 2.9% next year, and rebounding again in 2027, when a 3.1% expansion is forecast.

US growth will taper off to 1.7% next year, while eurozone growth is likely to come in at 1.0%. Both estimates are better than what was forecast in September.

China is set for 5.0% growth in 2025, 0.1 points above the

September estimate.

"The global economy has shown surprising resilience in 2025," the OECD said.

Growth is, however, expected to soften during the second half of this year, as higher tariffs translate into higher costs for businesses and consumers, and elevated geopolitical and policy uncertainty continues to weigh on domestic demand.

Global growth is then expected to recover through 2026, helped by the fading impact of higher tariff rates, favourable financial conditions, supportive macroeconomic policies and lower inflation, with emerging-market economies in Asia continuing to account for the majority of global growth.

But there are downside risks, as the outlook "remains fragile", the OECD cautioned.

"A further rise in trade barriers, especially around critical inputs, could inflict significant damage on supply chains and global output," it said.

"High asset valuations based on optimistic expectations of AI-driven corporate earnings pose a risk of potentially abrupt price corrections," it said, also warning that fiscal vulnerabilities may push long-term sovereign yields higher, tightening financial conditions and hampering growth.

Samsung unveils first 'special edition' triple-folding phone

Samsung launched its first triple-folding phone on Tuesday, a special-edition product with an eye-catching price tag placing it out of the reach of the average consumer.

The Galaxy Z TriFold will go on sale on December 12 and costs more than twice as much as the new iPhone 17 at \$2,443.

Super thin, it unfolds to a 10-inch (25.4 centimetre) display, offering "increased possibilities for creating and working", the South Korean tech giant said. The triple fold function is not world-first -- China's Huawei beat Samsung to the punch last year with a phone at a similarly exorbitant price.

Growth has been patchy in the competitive smartphone market, pushing makers to find new, eye-catching ways to differentiate their products.

Offered solely in a black design, Samsung's new device comes in at 309 grams (10.9 ounces) and at its thinnest

point measures less than 0.2 inches.

Generative artificial intelligence features are integrated into the phone, which can give real-time help through screen or camera sharing.

Samsung admitted the Galaxy Z TriFold was "not intended for mass sales".

Alex Lim, executive vice president at Samsung Electronics said it was a "special edition" product.

The launch comes as recent industry numbers suggest Apple is on track to overtake Samsung for the first time in 14 years as the world's top smartphone maker through 2029.

Apple has also long been rumored to be planning a foldable iPhone, possibly as early as next year. The US company's smartphone shipments are expected to reach a global share of 19.4% in 2025 while Samsung is expected to hold 18.7% -- with Apple effectively dethroning its rival for the first time, according to research firm Counterpoint.

Apple AI chief leaving as iPhone maker plays catch-up

Apple on Monday said the head of its artificial intelligence team is stepping down, and the effort is to be led by a veteran engineer from Google and Microsoft.

The plan for Apple senior vice president of Machine Learning and AI Strategy John Giannandrea to retire early next year comes after the tech



stumbled in efforts to show it was not being left behind on the technology.

Giannandrea will serve as an advisor to

Apple during his remaining time with the

company, according to the iPhone maker.

"We are thankful for the role John played in building and advancing our AI work," Apple chief executive Tim Cook said in a post announcing the news.

Researcher Amar Subramanya has joined Apple as a vice president and will lead in "critical areas," including AI foundation models and machine learning, according to the company.

Subramanya was most recently a corporate vice president of AI at Microsoft, prior to that spending 16 years at Google where he was head of engineering for the Gemini digital assistant before leaving, Apple said.

Apple cited Subramanya's experience integrating AI into features and products as "important to Apple's ongoing innovation and future Apple Intelligence features."

Giannandrea joined Apple in 2018, heading the company's AI efforts. Apple early this year delayed the release of an improved

Siri digital assistant and is now promising it for next year.

Meanwhile, Google, Microsoft, OpenAI and other tech rivals have been releasing ever-improved AI models and features in a fierce race to lead in the technology.

Apple has been under pressure to show it is not being left behind when it comes to artificial intelligence, with the potential to change how people engage with the internet and computers.

Cook cited AI as "central to Apple's strategy" and said Sub-

ramanya will bring "extraordinary AI expertise" to his role reporting to senior vice president of Software Engineering Craig Federighi.

"Craig has been instrumental in driving our AI efforts, including overseeing our work to bring a more personalized Siri to users next year," Cook said.

On a recent earnings call, Cook touted the latest Apple devices and the tech giant's custom chips and efforts to enhance products and services with artificial intelligence.

Amazon unveils new AI chip in battle against Nvidia

Amazon Web Services launched its in-house-built Trainium3 AI chip on Tuesday, marking a significant push to compete with Nvidia in the lucrative market for artificial intelligence computing power.

The move intensifies competition in the AI chip market, where Nvidia currently dominates with an estimated 80- to 90-percent market share for products used in training large language models that power the likes of ChatGPT.

Google last week caused tremors in the industry when it was reported that Facebook parent Meta would employ Google AI chips in data centers, signaling new competition for Nvidia, currently the world's most valuable company and a bellwether

for the AI investment frenzy.

This followed the release of Google's latest AI model last month that was trained using the company's own in-house chips, not Nvidia's.

AWS, which will make the technology available to its cloud computing clients, said its new chip delivers over four times the computing performance of its predecessor while using 40 percent less energy.

Energy consumption is one of the major concerns about the AI revolution, with major tech companies having to scale back or pause their net-zero emissions commitments as they race to keep up on AI.

"Training cutting-edge models now requires infrastructure investments that only a handful of organizations can afford," AWS said, positioning Trainium3 as a way to democratize access

to high-powered AI computing.

AWS said several companies are already using the technology, including Anthropic, maker of the Claude AI assistant and a competitor to OpenAI, the maker of ChatGPT.

AWS also announced it is already developing Trainium4, expected to deliver at least three times the performance of Trainium3 for standard AI workloads.

The next-generation chip will support Nvidia's technology, allowing it to work alongside that company's servers and hardware.

Amazon's in-house chip development reflects a broader trend among cloud providers seeking to reduce dependence on external suppliers while offering customers more cost-effective alternatives for AI workloads.

OpenAI declares ChatGPT 'code red' over stiff competition: report

Washington, United States

OpenAI CEO Sam Altman has declared a company-wide "code red" as its ChatGPT technology faces stiff competition from other big tech rivals, especially Google, US media reported.

In a memo to staff on Monday, Altman told employees that the company was "at a critical time for ChatGPT," and that resources must be devoted to fending off the new competition to its chatbot, the reports said. Altman said that other projects would now be delayed, including a plan to introduce advertising to the chatbot.

According to the memo reported in The Information and Wall Street Journal, Altman

said "code red" meant OpenAI would also delay progress with other products such as AI agents, which aim to automate tasks related to shopping and health. With a half-a-trillion-dollar valuation, OpenAI is the world's most valuable private company. Major investors are eager to take shares in the company, but questions are growing on how it can generate revenues that will match the huge costs of delivering AI to its hundreds of millions of users, the vast majority of whom use the service for free.

Google last month debuted its latest Gemini AI model, capping a dramatic turnaround since it was caught off guard by ChatGPT's launch three years ago and mocked for early blunders in its chase of OpenAI.

◆ **A shipment of ammunition** bound for the German armed forces was stolen last week from a contractor's truck, an army spokesman said yesterday. The ammunition disappeared "from the trailer of the civilian carrier's transport vehicle, which had been parked overnight", the spokesman said. German media reported that boxes containing about 20,000 rounds were stolen from the truck after it was parked outside a hotel near the eastern city of Magdeburg. An initial check revealed that about 10,000 rounds of combat ammunition for pistols, 9,900 rounds of blank manoeuvre ammunition for assault rifles and so-called smoke ammunition were stolen, said news weekly Der Spiegel. The driver had apparently spontaneously decided to spend the night in the hotel in the town of Burg, according to the magazine.

Venezuela reauthorizes deportation flights from US: ministry

◆ **Venezuela** announced yesterday that it had reauthorized flights carrying migrants deported by the United States, days after suspending them due to President Donald Trump's demand that Venezuelan airspace be considered "closed." The aviation authority "has received a request from the US government to resume flights repatriating Venezuelan migrants from that country to Venezuela," said a statement from the Ministry of Transportation. "On the instructions of President Nicolas Maduro, this is authorized." Trump has ramped up pressure on Venezuela, accusing Maduro's government of being a drug cartel and carrying out military strikes on boats off the country's coast that Washington says were carrying drugs.

◆ **Pope Leo XIV** told a crowd in Lebanon yesterday that the Middle East needed new approaches to rejecting violence and overcoming divisions, while urging Christians in the region to "have courage". He made the appeal on his third day in the country at the end of his first trip abroad as pontiff, after arriving on Sunday from Turkey. Pope Leo said he wanted "to come as a pilgrim of hope to the Middle East, imploring God for the gift of peace for this beloved land, marked by instability, wars and suffering". "The Middle East needs new approaches in order to reject the mindset of revenge and violence, to overcome political, social and religious divisions, and to open new chapters in the name of reconciliation and peace," he said at the conclusion of a mass in Beirut attended by some 150,000 people.

Cyclone turns Sri Lanka's tea mountains into death valley

In the mist-draped mountains of Sri Lanka's tea country, rescuers were still plucking bodies from the red-brown mud on Tuesday after last week's cyclone, the island's worst natural disaster in decades.

At least 465 people were killed, according to disaster officials, with another 366 missing.

Sri Lanka's Air Force has been combing the landslide-struck landscape, surveying the damage and ferrying food and other essential supplies to marooned residents.

Though the rain has stopped, recovery has just begun.

As the first journalist for foreign media to join a relief mission over the tea-growing region, AFP photographer Ishara Kodikara saw a swathe of the country destroyed after slips

of soil flattened everything in their paths, including roads and the vehicles that were on them. The roof of some houses peaked through the mud, while the rest of the buildings were swallowed by the torrents of soil unleashed by Cyclone Ditwah.

Jagged tears in the mountainsides revealed churned-up expanses of earth, with a few patches of the lush vegetation still clinging nearby in stark contrast. There was no sign of human life in the wrecked landscape.

In the central Welimada area, now inaccessible to heavy vehicles, rescue workers pulled 11 bodies from the mud on Monday and appealed for help to search for dozens more.

In some places, entire slopes have been sheared away, leaving ochre wounds slicing through the dense plantation greenery.

If Europe wants war with Russia, 'we are ready': Putin

Zelensky calls for peace, Putin defiant ahead of US-Russia talks

● **Kushner and Witkoff were due to meet Putin**

● **Discuss a new version of US plan to end the war**

Donald Trump's son-in-law and special envoy headed to the Kremlin yesterday for high-stakes talks on Moscow's offensive in Ukraine, as Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky called for an end to the fighting and a "dignified peace".

Jared Kushner and envoy Steve Witkoff were due to meet with Russian President Vladimir Putin after days of frenzied diplomacy from Florida to Geneva to Abu Dhabi left Washington "optimistic" it could help end Europe's bloodiest conflict since World War II.

They are expected to present Putin with a new version of US plan to end the war, hammered out in recent days after an earlier version raised fears in Kyiv and elsewhere in Europe that it made too many concessions to Moscow.

A Ukrainian delegation could then meet with Witkoff and Kushner as soon as Wednesday, potentially in Brussels, a senior Kyiv official told AFP.

The US wants to "report directly to us after their meeting" with Putin, Zelensky said during a visit to Ireland, where he is shoring up European support.

But any plan must actually end the war -- for good -- and not just lead to a pause in the devas-

tating fighting that began with Moscow's offensive in February 2022, he said.

"Our common task is to end the war, not just to achieve a pause in hostilities," Zelensky said, adding: "A dignified peace is needed."

Putin, however, appeared to threaten the opposite shortly before the US talks began.

"We are not planning to go to war with Europe, but if Europe

wants to and starts, we are ready right now," he told reporters, accusing Europeans of obstructing US efforts to end the fighting.

In Brussels, NATO chief Mark Rutte said he was "confident" US efforts will "eventually restore peace in Europe". Russian forces have advanced fast in November in eastern Ukraine, and Kyiv has been rocked by graft scandals that ended with the resignation of its top negotiator -- Zelensky's right-hand man.



Moscow launched a total of 5,660 missiles and long-range drones at Ukraine last month, daily reports published by Kyiv's air force showed, marking a two percent increase over the previous month.

During the 3rd India-Indonesia Defence Ministers' Dialogue discussions, co-chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and his Indonesian counterpart, Sjafrie Sjamsoeddin, both leaders centred their talks on strengthening defence industry partnership, expanding mili-

tary-to-military engagements and reinforcing a shared strategic vision for a free, open, peaceful and prosperous Indo-Pacific.

According to a release by the Ministry of Defence, both sides reiterated the significance of a rules-based order in the Indo-Pacific and noted the strong convergence between the ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific and India's Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative.

They also agreed to intensify cooperation in maritime domain awareness, cyber resilience and joint operational readiness, and to deepen engagement through regional frameworks, including the Indian Ocean Rim Association under India's chairmanship.

Indonesia further welcomed India's proposal to establish a Joint Defence Industry Cooperation Committee to advance work on technology transfer, joint R&D, certification harmonisation and supply-chain linkages.

Both ministers expressed satisfaction with the outcomes of the Dialogue and committed to sustaining high-level exchanges and practical cooperation across defence and security areas to strengthen peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region. (ANI)



Qatar says hopes to push Hamas, Israel to next talks phase 'very soon'

● Qatar, alongside the United States and Egypt secured a long-elusive truce in Gaza

Gaza talks mediator Qatar said yesterday it hoped Israel and Hamas could be brought to a new phase of negotiations for a peace deal in the Palestinian territory following their October ceasefire agreement.

"We think that we should be pushing the parties to stage two very, very soon," Qatar foreign ministry spokesman Majed al-Ansari said.

"That includes, of course, the issues that are complicating the situation, like the fighters in the tunnels behind the Yellow Line, like the incidents that take place every couple of days," he added.

The so-called Yellow Line marks the point to which Israeli troops have withdrawn inside the Gaza Strip. Dozens of Hamas fighters remain holed up in tunnels beyond the line, though Israel says it has been targeting and killing them.

Qatar, alongside the United States and Egypt secured a long-elusive truce in Gaza, which came into effect on October 10 and has mostly halted two years of fighting between Israel and Hamas.

During the first phase of the Gaza peace plan, initially outlined by US President Donald Trump, Hamas and its allies were due to return all 48 hostages they held captive, 20 of whom were still alive.

Israel police say received presumed remains of one of last two Gaza hostages

Jerusalem, Undefined

Israeli police said yesterday they had received the presumed remains of one of the last two deceased hostages in the Gaza Strip and were transporting them to the morgue for identification.

In a brief statement, the police said they were "currently escorting, with reverence, the coffin of the fallen hostage to the National Centre of Forensic Medicine".

The office of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu had said earlier Tuesday that Israel had received through the Red Cross "findings that were handed over to an (Israeli military) and (security) force inside the Gaza Strip".

"Upon completion of the identification process, formal notification will be delivered to the family," the statement from Netanyahu's office said.

It did not specify whether what was discovered were the remains of one of the last two Gaza hostages -- Israeli Ran Gvili and Thai national Sudthisak Rinthalak -- but

All but the bodies of two hostages remain in Gaza, Ran Gvili and Sudthisak Rinthalak, but Israel has accused the Palestinian militants of dragging their feet on handing over remains.

Hamas has said the process of retrieving the bodies has been slow because the bodies have been under the vast piles of rubble left by two years of war.

"As we have always said, the logistical situation in Gaza would certainly make it difficult to reach this result," Ansari said, referring to the return of the bodies.

The spokesman added that

said authorities were in "continuous contact" with their families.

Hamas had not confirmed by Tuesday afternoon local time that it had handed the remains of a hostage over to Israel as it had done so on previous occasions.

A Hamas official told AFP that a team from the group's armed wing and that of Islamic Jihad -- accompanied by the Red Cross -- had been conducting search operations for several days in multiple areas, particularly in Jabalia and Beit Lahia in the north of the territory.

"A number of bodies were found under the rubble and are being examined," the official said, adding that search operations were ongoing and there was "no confirmation that any of these bodies found belong to an Israeli prisoner".

"The mediators were informed that if the two bodies are found, they will be handed over immediately to the Israeli side through the established mechanism," the official added.

the return of the remains should not be a hindrance to reaching stage two.

Under the second phase of the deal, which gained UN backing in November, Israel is to withdraw from its positions in the territory, an interim authority is to govern Gaza and an international stabilisation force is to be deployed.

Hamas is also supposed to disarm under Trump's 20-point plan, with members who decommission their weapons allowed to leave Gaza. The militant group has repeatedly rejected the proposition.

UK govt again delays China embassy decision

They fear the site could be used to surveil and harass dissidents

● **If approved, would become the largest embassy in the UK**

● **Deadline was previously extended to December 10**

Britain's government has delayed into the new year a decision on whether to allow China to build a sprawling and controversial new embassy complex in London, officials said yesterday.

A letter written to interested parties by the government department responsible for weighing the request showed that the housing minister has pushed the deadline back to January 20.

"We aim to issue the decision as quickly as possible," said the letter, released by the Inter-Parliamentary Alliance on China

(IPAC).

Residents, rights groups and China hawks from across the UK political spectrum oppose the development, which, if ap-

proved, would become the largest embassy in the UK.

They fear the site could be used to surveil and harass dissidents.

A spokesman for Starmer suggested that "particular security implications" meant that more time was needed to consider the planning application.

"The Home Office and Foreign Office have provided views on particular security implications, and have been clear throughout that a decision shouldn't be taken until we affirm that those considerations have been completed or resolved.

"MHCLG (the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government) considers that more time is needed for full consideration of the applications," he told reporters.

Housing minister Steve Reed had previously extended the deadline to December 10.

The decision is viewed as a key issue in Starmer's attempted reset of relations with China, which remain strained by accusations of spying and by tensions over the fate of Hong Kong, a former British colony.

Oil tanker hit by 'external explosions' off coast of Dakar

An oil tanker off the coast of Dakar was struck by four external explosions last week, causing it to take on water, AFP learned from the Turkish shipowner and Senegalese port authorities.

Security measures were implemented about 10 kilometres (six miles) off the coast of Dakar to stabilise the Mersin, a Panamanian-flagged tanker operated by the Turkish shipping company Besiktas, which was carrying nearly 39,000 tonnes of fuel.

"While the vessel was at anchor off the coast of Dakar, Senegal, four external explosions occurred", Besiktas Shipping said in a statement Monday, adding that "seawater ingress into the engine room" had occurred.

According to the shipowner, there were no injuries or loss of life and "the situation was

immediately brought under control".

It additionally stated that "no pollution" occurred and the vessel remained "safe and stable". The cause of the explosion was not known as of Tuesday afternoon.

Dakar port authorities told AFP Tuesday that they had responded to a distress call from the Mersin on Thursday, before evacuating the predominantly Turkish crew and deploying resources to address the damage.

According to ship-tracking website myshiptracking.com, the Mersin had sailed from the port of Taman, located on the Kerch Strait which connects Russia to Crimea, a Ukrainian territory annexed by Moscow.

Dakar is a major west African port located along several Atlantic shipping routes that connect Africa and Europe, as well as Africa and the Americas.

Under Trump pressure, Honduras vows accurate vote count

Honduras' electoral body, under pressure from Donald Trump, vowed yesterday its final tally of votes cast in a weekend presidential election would "scrupulously respect the popular will."

The US president, who backs one of two right-wing front-runners, on Monday accused Honduran election officials of "trying to change" the outcome of the November 30 vote.

Trump had given his support to businessman Nasry Asfura, 67, and intervened in his favor even before the final outcome was known.

"Looks like Honduras is trying to change the results of their Presidential Election. If they do, there will be hell to pay!" Trump wrote on his Truth Social platform without providing proof of his accusation.

Honduras's National Electoral Council (CNE) called Monday for

"patience" as it finalizes the vote count in one of Latin America's most impoverished and violent countries.

The final result could take days, even weeks, but the CNE said a partial electronic count showed Asfura leading 72-year-old rival Salvador Nasralla by just 515 votes, making it a "technical tie" -- prompting Trump's threatening post.

On Tuesday, the CNE reported "technical problems" with the portal disseminating vote results, saying it had requested a full report and "the fastest possible" solution.

"The CNE is enabling public access... for the media and political parties so they can follow the processing of the information in real time," it said.

The council vowed to announce the final result within the legally required timeframe of one month, and said "the declaration of results will scrupulously respect the popular will

expressed by the citizens in the exemplary voting process."

'I've already won'

Trump has become increasingly vocal in his support for allies in the region, having threatened to cut aid to Argentina and Honduras if his picks did not win.

Ally Javier Milei was victorious in Argentina's mid-term elections, and last week former Tegucigalpa mayor Asfura also won the Republican leader's backing. Rival Nasralla told reporters on Monday that despite Trump's endorsement of Asfura, he was confident the election would go in his favor.

"I know I've already won. This morning, they sent me a figure that puts me ahead," he told reporters about the preliminary count.

Nasralla clarified in a social media post that "we are not declaring ourselves winners, we are just projecting the results."

Afghan man arrested in Texas threatened suicide attack: Justice Dept

An Afghan man has been charged in Texas with threatening to build a bomb and carry out a suicide attack, US officials said yesterday as the Trump administration vows a crackdown on Afghan migrants after a deadly shooting.

Mohammad Dawood Alokozay, 30, of Fort Worth, allegedly made the threats in a November 23 video that he shared on TikTok, X and Facebook, the Justice Department said in a statement.

In the video, Alokozay allegedly praises the Taliban and threatens to carry out a suicide attack on Americans.

"Thanks to public reports

of a threatening online video, the FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Force apprehended this individual before he could commit an act of violence," FBI Dallas special agent in charge Joseph

Rothrock said.

Attorney General Pamela Bondi said Alokozay "came into America during the Biden administration and as alleged, explicitly stated that he came

here in order to kill American citizens."

He faces up to five years in prison if convicted of making a threatening interstate communication.

Alokozay's arrest comes a week after the shooting near the White House in Washington of two National Guard members.

A 29-year-old Afghan national, Rahmanullah Lakanwal, has been charged with first degree murder in connection with the attack which left one of the soldiers dead.

Lakanwal had been part of a CIA-backed "partner force" fighting the Taliban in Afghanistan, and entered the United States as part of a resettlement program following the US military withdrawal from Afghanistan in 2021.





Weight of history against England in pink-ball Gabba Ashes Test

Trailing 1-0, England must overcome a 39-year Gabba jinx to level the series

● Second Ashes Test is day-night match

● Australia excels with pink ball

● Wood injury concerns England

England head into Thursday's day-night second Ashes Test against pink-ball masters Australia needing a rare victory at Brisbane's Gabba to get back into the five-match series.

Travis Head's whirlwind century carried Australia to an eight-wicket victory inside two days in Perth as they went 1-0 up.

The hosts are again without captain Pat Cummins and fellow quick Josh Hazlewood, leaving swing king Mitchell Starc, who is expected to be a force in humid Brisbane under lights, to carry the attack.

England, who capitulated in four frantic hours in Perth from a winning position, cannot afford to slip 2-0 down with three matches to play if they are to have realistic hopes of regaining the urn.

They could be without their own pace spearhead, Mark Wood, who is nursing a knee injury.

Captain Ben Stokes says England have moved on from Perth and are not scarred by past results but they face a formidable weight of history in Brisbane, where they have been holding extra training sessions this week.

England have not won a Test in Australia since their 2010-11 tour, losing 14 and drawing two.

Moreover, they have not triumphed at the Gabba for 39 years and have lost all three previous day-nighters against the hosts.

Day-night specialists

Australia thrive under lights, winning 13 of the 14 pink-ball Tests they have played worldwide, but England will take encouragement from the sole defeat coming at the Gabba against the West Indies a year ago.

"On an evening it does seem to do a little bit more, especially if you have a slightly newer ball," said England fast bowler Brydon Carse after a night session in the nets yesterday.

England could opt for a like-for-like replacement for Wood with seamer Josh Tongue, or bring in a spinner in the form of Shoaib Bashir or Will Jacks. The latter would add depth to the batting.

Steve Smith captains an unchanged Australia squad with the only question mark appearing to be whether to retain the explosive Head as an opener

at the expense of out-of-form veteran Usman Khawaja, 38, who suffered from back spasms in Perth.

Should Head move up alongside Jake Weatherald, then seaming all-rounder Beau Webster could come into the side at number six with Cameron Green moving up to five.

Marnus Labuschagne filled in as an opener for Khawaja in the first innings at Perth and said Monday he was unsure how the batting order would shape up.

"It's just game-by-game, and you work out what's your best team and how does it best work for the game."

Labuschagne backed his Queensland teammate to come good on their home ground in Brisbane.

"I think Usman's a high-quality player. I mean, you look at his record. I don't think he needs advice. He's been around a long time," added Labuschagne.

Head, who stunned England with a match-winning 123 from 83 balls, normally bats at five but said he would be ready to move up again, adding that fixed batting orders were "slightly overrated".

"The traditionalists will say that's how it's got to be," Head said.

"It's ever evolving and we'll see where we get to. I feel I can play in any role."

New Zealand 231-9 as 'old school' West Indies exploit pace-friendly wicket

New Zealand reached 231-9 at stumps on a rain-shortened day one of the first Test against the West Indies yesterday after Justin Greaves triggered a middle-order collapse with the wicket of Kane Williamson.

New Zealand tumbled from 94-1 to 148-6 on a bowler-friendly wicket after Williamson was dismissed for 52, his 38th Test half-century.

Michael Bracewell and Nathan Smith arrested the slide with a 52-run stand for the seventh wicket. Smith eventually fell for 23 and Bracewell for 47.

After Matt Henry went for eight, Zak Foulkes and Jacob Duffy were both on four when bad light stopped play after 70 overs of a truncated day.

Bracewell rated the day "pretty even" given the nature of the wicket.

"It ebbed and flowed throughout the day and I think we'd be pretty happy with where we got to at the end of the day," he said. "It was a little bit 'old school'

West Indies.

"You grow up hearing about the fast bowlers of the West Indies and it was certainly that today. It was an exciting challenge."

Bracewell and Smith's partnership was the second face-saving stand for New Zealand after Williamson and Tom Latham put on 93 following the dismissal of Devon Conway on

the third ball of the Test.

The green wicket and heavy cloud cover ensured West Indies skipper Roston Chase gave his pace attack first use of the new ball when he won the toss and it revived memories of Calypso quicks from a previous era.

But after the immediate success of Kemar Roach, who removed Conway, the West Indies

were made to wait 29 overs before again tasting success.

In the first session, extended by a 90-minute rain break, Williamson and Latham cautiously inched New Zealand to 17-1 in the 10.3 overs available before a second shower brought lunch.

When play resumed, the New Zealand pair batted with more freedom until Williamson celebrated his first Test innings in a year by passing the half-century mark.

On 52, a lapse in his normal diligence saw a full delivery from Greaves edged to Alick Athanaze at second slip to ignite the collapse.

In his next over, Greaves removed Latham for a patient 24 off 85 deliveries and Rachin Ravindra was then bowled for three by Jayden Seales.

In the space of 21 deliveries the West Indies took three wickets for nine runs as New Zealand slumped from 94-1 to 103-4.

Will Young and Tom Blundell added 17 for the fifth wicket before Young, on 14, gave Johann Layne his maiden Test wicket.

'Superhuman' Salah unhappy after being dropped, says Liverpool's Slot

Salah, who has struggled for goals recently, was praised for his "top professional" attitude despite the omission

● Forward enduring rare scoring slump

Arne Slot admitted yesterday that "superhuman" Mohamed Salah was unhappy about being omitted from Liverpool's team for their vital 2-0 win against West Ham, but praised his attitude.

The Egypt forward was an unused substitute at the London Stadium on Sunday as Liverpool boss Slot made changes following a terrible run of nine defeats in 12 games in all competitions.

Misfiring Salah, 33, has scored just four Premier League goals this season -- in stark contrast to his haul of 29 last season, a tally that won him the Golden Boot.

Slot told reporters that during his reign as manager at Anfield, Salah had been a "superhuman being" but that he had not been at his best in recent weeks.

"As with all players around the world, there are also phases in your time at the club that you

are human," he said. "But he's scored so many goals for us and I'm sure he will in the future."

Slot, whose eighth-placed team host high-flying Sunderland on Wednesday, said he was not surprised by Salah's reaction to being left out, praising his

professionalism.

"That's a normal reaction from a player that's good enough to play for us," he said. "And I say it mildly, because he's been so outstanding for this club for so many years, and will be for us in the future."

"So, yeah, of course a player isn't happy when they're not playing. He wasn't the only one who wasn't happy that he wasn't starting, I can tell you."

The Dutchman said that Salah had been supportive of his teammates.

"You cannot be a player that's available every three days and play on that high standard if you go with your emotions," he said.

"But Mo is so disciplined, knows what to do to stay fit, and no matter if he plays well, doesn't play well, if he plays or if he doesn't play, he will always be that top professional."

Slot said that Salah was scheduled to leave for the Africa Cup of Nations on December 15.

there's a player involved, there's the nation involved -- Egypt in this situation -- and the club. And there are always talks about what is best for all three of us," he said.

Meanwhile, Sunderland manager Regis Le Bris -- whose newly-promoted side are an impressive sixth in the table -- said his players were relishing the prospect of playing at Anfield.

"We worked hard to have the privilege to play this kind of game," he said. "A challenging situation, a tough game but I think we want to live this kind of experience."

The Frenchman added: "Liverpool will be strong, the place (Anfield) is impressive but at the same time we want to be competitive so we'll see.

Kuwait Sweep Past Bahrain Side

Bahrain's senior men's volleyball team slipped to their second straight defeat in the Arab Challenge Cup, losing 3-0 to Kuwait last night in Amman. After pushing Egypt across four sets on Monday, the Bahrainis entered this contest needing a response, but Kuwait's preci-

sion and composure proved too much to overcome.

Atlas Lions Roar in Arab Cup

The 2nd day of the FIFA Arab Cup delivered high intensity across Qatar's stadiums. In Lusail, Egypt controlled possession but struggled to break down Kuwait's disciplined defense. The visitors stunned the hosts when Al-Hajeri powered a header from a corner into the top corner. Saudi Arabia's match against Oman was a tense tactical battle. Feras Al-Brikan opened the scoring with a towering header, only for Ghanim Al-Habashi to equalize moments later with a brilliant set-piece finish. Saleh Al-Shehri then restored the Green Falcons' lead with a blistering finish from a through ball, sealing a 2-1 win.

Bahrain now turn attention to their Group D opener against Iraq. After a week of training in Doha, coach Dragan Talajic stressed the need for focus and respect. "We accomplished our first task against Djibouti, but Iraq is a strong team. Tomorrow requires total focus and tremendous effort," he said.

Move to honour Bahrain handball team with cash prizes

Parliament has backed an urgent proposal calling on the government to grant cash bonuses and formal honours to Bahrain's national handball team after their victory in the Islamic Solidarity Championship.

The measure, passed on Tuesday, urges the government to reward and recognise the players 'as soon as possible'. It was submitted by MPs Jaleela Alawi, Mohammed Al Olaiwi, Mahmood Fardan, Second Deputy Speaker Ahmed Qarata and Ahmed Al Salloom.

According to the explanatory memorandum, the move falls within Parliament's drive to support sport and to acknowledge the results achieved by Bahraini youth in regional and

international competitions. The document describes the team's win as a well-earned achievement that carried Bahrain's flag to the winners' podium and showed that local players are able to compete for, and win, titles in different conditions.

The memorandum states that the victory shows the determination and resolve of young Bahrainis and the effort of national staff when they receive support and encouragement from the state. It adds that the result fits with government policy to strengthen the presence of Bahraini sport and to secure its place on the international stage.

MP Jaleela Al Sayed, who sponsored the proposal, said the urgent move seeks to grant financial bonuses and suitable honours to members of Bahrain's national handball team, in rec-

ognition of their title in the Islamic Solidarity Championship. She said the step is intended to show government backing for the kingdom's champions and to encourage young Bahrainis to keep pursuing results in sport.

In its reasons for the motion, the memorandum says that rewarding the team would help

create a supportive setting for national talent in sport, allowing athletes to build their skills and reach higher levels of performance, which in turn would keep Bahrain's sporting progress going. It also notes that material and moral rewards show the state's appreciation for their efforts and urge them to keep raising Bahrain's name in various competitions.

The document further states that direct backing for national teams would improve their readiness for regional and international events and strengthen Bahrain's standing as a competitive player in sport. It also calls for clear and direct procedures to reward champions soon after they achieve success, in order to deepen national pride and encourage different sectors to seek excellence and public service.



'Bahrain became my purpose'

Emotional Tony Davis steps down as boxing coach after 7 incredible years

Tony Davis says his seven years in Bahrain have shaped him more deeply than any period of his coaching career. Sitting down with The Daily Tribune yesterday, the outgoing national boxing head coach spoke with emotion, clarity and a sense of closure that carried the weight of a remarkable journey. "I came here as a coach," he said. "I'm leaving as someone who genuinely feels part of this country."

A Life-Changing Call

His Bahrain story began in 2017 in the aftermath of the Westminster terror attack in London. A veteran of 22 years in the military, Tony Davis was working in what he described as his "dream job" with Great Britain Boxing when chaos erupted outside Parliament. He heroically jumped over a fence to try and save a police officer, PC Keith Palmer, and rushed to help injured victims. The incident made international headlines and eventually reached His Highness Shaikh Khalid bin Hamad Al Khalifa, who invited him to join Bahrain's sporting project. "That moment changed my life," Tony said. "HH Shaikh Khalid and HRH Shaikh Salman made sure I got care and support. Bahrain stepped in like family. When someone saves your life, that loyalty stays forever."

Building a Legacy

His early months in Bahrain were an eye-opener. He arrived from one of the world's most resourced boxing environments to a programme still in its infancy. "There was talent here but it needed structure and belief," he said. Over the years that followed, Bahrain earned historic results, none greater than qualifying a boxer for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. "For a small nation to walk into an Olympic boxing ring is extraordinary," Tony said. "It's something I'll always carry with pride."

His journey was nearly cut short in 2021 when he contracted a severe strain of COVID-19 during a tournament in Istanbul. "I thought that was the end. I genuinely thought I was going to die," he said. "HH Shaikh Khalid and HRH Shaikh Salman didn't just support me as a coach, but also as a human being. That's something you never forget."

Defining Moments

This autumn brought two defining milestones for Bahraini boxing and for Tony personally. In early October, just before the national team settled for the 3rd Asian Youth Games in Bahrain, Tony quietly revealed to TDT that he would be stepping down after the season. Around the same time, he was fully immersed in his role as competition manager for the boxing tournament at the AYG, which brought together

athletes from 31 nations. The event required weeks of meticulous preparation and a level of operational precision he had never been responsible for before. "I wanted Bahrain to feel proud of what we delivered," he said. "When the feedback came in, I knew we had achieved something special." Despite only two young Bahrainis competing, Tony saw them as symbols of the Kingdom's future. He grew emotional recalling Abdulrahman Al Mudhaki's opening-bout victory. "I cried when he won. To see a young Bahraini stand there with that courage reminded me why I love this sport," he said. He also praised Mohammed Atiyah's resilience, calling him "a fighter with real potential."

Capping off his tenure, last Thursday Tony Davis oversaw the 4th edition of the Royal Rumble in Bahrain, a fast-grow-

ing event on the regional combat sports calendar. Tony believes its success reflects how far the country has come. "The Royal Rumble wasn't just a tournament. It showed the ambition of this nation. The crowds, the atmosphere, the organisation. It proved Bahrain can deliver major events at a level people once didn't think possible."

Tony will now remain in Bahrain and continue working in the sporting sector, while Olympian John Conlon assumes the role of national coach. "John is the right man. He'll push Bahrain to another level," Tony said. As he transitions to the next chapter, Tony carries a sense of gratitude that goes beyond sport. "Bahrain gave me a home, a purpose and a second chance at life," he said. "This country will always be part of me."

Red Bull promote rookie Hadjar to partner Verstappen

French rookie Isack Hadjar will step up to the main Red Bull car next season to partner four-time world champion Max Verstappen, the Austrian Formula One team announced yesterday.

Isack, who only turned 21 in September, has enjoyed an impressive first season with Red Bull's junior team Racing Bulls, scoring 10 top-10 finishes, including his first podium when he finished third in the Netherlands.

He replaces Japanese driver Yuki Tsunoda who becomes Red Bull's test and reserve driver.

"After all the hard work I have put in since joining the junior team, it's such a great reward,"

a grateful Hadjar said in a Red Bull statement.

"I've had many ups and downs throughout my career and they kept believing and pushing me."

"It's an awesome move, to work with the best and learn from Max is something I can't wait for."

Red Bull will be hoping Hadjar can solve the perennial problem of Verstappen's partner.

After releasing Sergio Perez at the end of last season, Red Bull began 2025 with Liam Lawson at the wheel but the New Zealander lasted only two races before being supplanted by Tsunoda.

Since then, however, Tsunoda has scored just 33 points in the world championship compared with Verstappen's 396.

The Japanese driver, who has



been with the team since joining the junior programme in 2019, has competed in more than 100 Grand Prix and has yet to make

a podium.

He currently sits one place and three points below Lawson in the standings.

"Everyone in the sport would agree it is impossible not to like Yuki, his personality is infectious, and he has become a very special part of the Red Bull family," said team principal Laurent Mekies.

"On behalf of everyone at Red Bull, I thank him for what he has contributed so far and we know he will provide invaluable support to the 2026 projects moving forwards."

Lawson will continue with Racing Bulls in 2026 when he will be partnered by Arvid Lindblad, who turned 18 in August and who is currently with the team's junior programme in Formula 2.
