# **Education Ministry rejects reports** of virtual classes during Ramadan

he Education Ministry yesterday rejected claims of shifting to online classes during Ramadan, terming such reports as 'false'.

The ministry said it had not taken any such decision allowing schools here to switch to remote learning during the blessed month, the ministry statement said. The ministry also said that in-person classes are to continue as planned.
