'No excuses' for Arsenal in title bid after January spending: Arteta

Mikel Arteta says Arsenal can have no excuses if they do not win the Premier League title for the first time in two decades after strengthening their squad during the January transfer window.

Arteta splashed out more than £50 million (\$61 million) on three new signings as the club look to hold onto their hand on the champions and lead at the top of the table, Arteta knows his side are bringing in Italy midfielder Jorginho, Belgium forward club's first English title since Leandro Trossard and Poland defender Jakub Kiwior.


