New Online Service Tracks Large AC and Refrigeration Units

SCE introduced a central database to improve inspections, compliance and environmental protection

● SCE launches digital AC registration

● New service boosts environmental compliance

● Processing time cut from 20 days to 5

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The Supreme Council for the Environment (SCE) has launched a new digital service for registering large refrigeration and air conditioning units, strengthening environmental monitoring and compliance efforts.

The "Large Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Units Registration Request Service" enables licensed facilities to register units with a cooling capac-

ity exceeding 15 refrigeration tons, including industrial air conditioning and refrigeration systems.

The service supports the proper management of refrigerant gases through recovery and recycling, helping reduce emissions in line with Bahrain's environmental legislation and the requirements of the Montreal Protocol.

It also provides a central database for facilities to search registered units and regularly update their information, enhancing monitoring, inspections and environmental compliance.

The fully automated service has reduced processing time from 20 working days to five days, while simplifying procedures and improving the user experience.

Professor Amna Hamad Al Rumaihi, CEO of the SCE, said



the initiative strengthens oversight of controlled refrigeration materials, improves data accuracy and supports Bahrain's obligations under the Montreal Protocol.

The service forms part of Bah-

rain's government digital transformation efforts, which have seen more than 1,300 services documented and published, with 800 services developed and re-engineered across government sectors.

Man Charged with Stealing Delivery Bike



The First High Criminal Court has begun hearing the case of a 43-year-old man accused of stealing a delivery motorcycle after allegedly threatening a delivery worker with a knife in Isa Town.

According to the Public Prosecution, the incident occurred on April 14, 2026, when the suspect allegedly forced a 21-year-

old delivery worker to hand over the company motorcycle before fleeing the scene.

Police investigations identified the suspect, who reportedly has previous criminal convictions. The delivery worker later identified him during the investigation. The court adjourned the case until August 10 to bring the defendant from detention.

Student Fined BD1,100



The Court of Cassation has upheld a BD1,100 fine against a university student convicted of causing a 3% permanent disability to a university employee and insulting three staff members while they were carrying out their duties.

The case stemmed from an October 2025 incident in which the student entered a faculty-only restroom and became involved in a dispute with uni-

versity employees. As she left an office, she forcefully opened a door, fracturing an employee's wrist and causing a permanent disability, according to a forensic report.

The court also upheld her conviction for verbally insulting three university staff members, while the employee's civil compensation claim has been referred to the competent civil court.
