Intercepted by the US Navy's Fifth Fleet in the Gulf of Oman

The incident marks US 5th Fleet's second major illegal weapons seizure within a month

A fishing trawler smuggling "more than 50 tonnes of ammunition rounds, fuses and propellants for rockets" was intercepted by the US Navy's Fifth Fleet in the Gulf of Oman along a maritime route from Iran to Yemen on Dec. 1.

"Navy personnel operating from expeditionary sea base USS Lewis B. Puller (ESB 3) discovered the illicit cargo during a flag verification boarding, marking US 5th Fleet's second major illegal weapons seizure within a month," it added in a statement yesterday.

The trawler was carrying more than 1 million rounds of 7.62mm ammunition; 25,000 rounds of 12.7mm ammunition;

nearly 7,000 proximity fuses for rockets; and over 2,100 kilograms of propellant used to launch rocket-propelled grenades.

"This significant interdiction clearly shows that Iran's unlawful transfer of lethal aid and destabilising behaviour continues," said Vice Adm. Brad Cooper, commander of US Naval Forces Central Command, US 5th Fleet and Combined Maritime Forces.

"US naval forces remain focused on deterring and disrupting dangerous and irresponsible maritime activity in the region."

The direct or indirect supply, sale or transfer of weapons to the Houthis in Yemen violates UN Security Council Resolution 2216 and international law.

Two weeks ago, Tim Hawkins, a spokesman of the US Navy's Fifth Fleet, said that the United States is ready to confront any Iranian threats to the region.

In a statement to Al Arabiya, he said that the US is committed to preserving the security of the Straits of the Bab al-Mandeb and the Straits of Hormuz.

US 5th Fleet previously intercepted a fishing vessel illegally shipping lethal aid from Iran to

Yemen on Nov. 8. US Coast Guard ship USCGC John Scheuerman (WPC 1146) and guided-missile destroyer USS The Sullivans (DDG 68) intercepted the vessel in the Gulf of Oman.

A weeklong search assisted by patrol coastal ship USS Hurricane (PC 3) and Navy explosive ordnance disposal technicians from US 5th Fleet's Task Force 56 discovered more than 70 tons of ammonium perchlorate, a powerful oxidiser commonly used to make rocket and missile fuel as well as explosives. US forces also found more than 100 tons of urea fertiliser, a chemical

Help wanted

New York City seeks 'swashbuckling' rat czar

Millions of New York rats have been put on notice: the most populous city in the United States is hiring a director of rodent mitigation, a new position that calls for a "swashbuckling attitude".

The new job, posted earlier



this week, is part of the city's attempt to curb an explosion in its rodent population since the pandemic began.

Rat sightings on the streets, in subways and even homes have jumped 71% over in the

past two years, according to the city's sanitation department. "There's NOTHING I hate more than rats," Mayor Eric Adams said in a tweet on Thursday in announcing the job posting. "If you have the drive, determination, and killer instinct needed to fight New York City's relentless rat population - then your

dream job awaits." Sidewalk dining outside of restaurants - first allowed in 2020 as a temporary measure to help blunt economic fallout from the coronavirus pandemic, has been blamed in part for the rat explosion.

The city is exploring ways to allow for permanent "streeteries."

Holding meetings for electing speaker before first procedural session is illegal: Dr Al-Ghaith

- The Council of Representatives shall elect in its first session, for the same term, a speaker and two vice-chairmen
- Election date and time will be determined by the Shura Council or the Council of Representatives

- Election process will be held in an open session

Disputes over electing the speaker and deputy speakers took another crucial turn yesterday, with the



Parliamentary Legal Advisers board now stepping in to declare that it is illegal to begin any procedures or meetings for the speaker election prior to the procedural session of the Council of Representatives. An Alayam report has said that invitations are out to 40 elected representatives to listen to the programmes and views of four candidates for speaker election, sparking protests from many elected representatives.

Yesterday, Dr Saleh Ibrahim Al-Ghaith, Chairman of the Council of Legal Advisors in the House of Representatives, confirmed that it is not permissible

to initiate any preliminary meetings or discussions for electing a speaker and two deputies without conducting the first procedural session.

Dr Al Ghaith said this after meeting the board of directors of legal advisors and Speaker Fawzia bin Abdullah Zainal.

The meeting, he said, unanimously concluded that it is not permissible to invoke any procedures for electing a speaker other than at the time and place decided for that constitutionally.

Explaining, he said that the term of the House of Representatives is four years from the date of its first meeting and that the

MPs shall elect in their first session a speaker and two deputies from the members for the same term.

He also pointed out that Article 77 of the constitution stipulates that any meetings held for this purpose, other than at a time and place scheduled by the council, stand invalid.

He pointed out that after the Royal speech, the House of Representatives will hold its first session, where the eldest member will assume the presidency, assisted by two senior members.

“Their role ends with electing a speaker, following Article (6) of Decree-Law No. (54) of 2002 regarding the internal regulations of the House of Representatives.”

Members shall submit nominations to the session chairperson, after which the election will take place in an open session.

Article (49) stipulates that “the chairman could delay the opening of the session for half an hour if more than half the members are not present and could postpone to a later date if the desired quorum is not present.



It is not permissible to initiate any preliminary meetings or discussions for electing speaker and two deputies without conducting the first procedural session.

“Therefore, it is not permissible to start any procedures or meetings related to speaker election,” said Dr Saleh Ibrahim Al-Ghaith.

Hearing candidates before the first session is illegal: Representative

Representatives, who refused to disclose their identities, had said they would not attend the sessions scheduled for today to hear the four-speaker candidates.

An Alayam report quoting them said the sessions are illegal and clearly violate constitution.

Members pointed out that all candidates will receive proper time to address the parliament, and the members are free to elect anybody. “There is no need to hold a session before that.”

“Holding such sessions will only deny the rights of others who desire to run for the positions and limits the number of candidates to four.

“These actions would only cause a rift between deputies and negatively affect the performance of the parliament,” the members pointed out.



Nuisance for several, daily bread for many

Roadside car washers say it earns them a living; the public says they destroy roads, harm the environment

● Authorities warn fine, deportation if found washing cars on street

● Car owners urged to install drainages on their driveways

● Workers say they earn up to BD80 a month by washing cars

● Officials say it's illegal to wash cars on public roads

● Such practices are harming environment, residents say

As street washing can bring dirt and grime from the car that flows into nearby roads and drains, more professional car wash services could aid in eradicating the menace of illegal car cleaners in the Kingdom.

When asked around, several claimed that they frequently struggle to cross the puddles of water left on public roads after car washing and had called for installing suitable drainages in driveways.

Throughout the residential, financial and entertainment districts, an army of migrant workers, commonly from Asia, scrub and polish the vehicles, where their average monthly wage can go up to BD 80.

For an extra 10 bucks in constant fear

Speaking to *The Daily Tribune*, Mohammed Hanif, a 33-year-old-labourer, said, "I have been working since 6 am on a construction site, and in the evening, I take bucket and rags from home and washes cars parked around coffee shops in Adliya.

"I don't think the roads are getting unclean; the water dries after a while. However, some store owners are bothered and ask us to leave.

Another migrant worker, who washes the cars near Manama, told us, "Car washing has be-

come one of the common ways of raising some money for people back home.

"Sometimes we get to work, and sometimes we just stand for hours for nothing."

Fine, deportation on cards

According to sources, Immigration mainly deals with such cases.

"If found washing cars illegally, there will face fine or deportation.

Hundreds of migrant workers who allegedly ran away from their sponsors try to earn a living by washing cars.

"They are under constant threat of being sent packing from the Kingdom."

Harms environment

Speaking to *The Daily Tribune*, a shop owner, who does not want to be named, said, "People are washing their cars in the morning, leaving puddles of dirty water on the public roads."

"Car cleaners would urge owners to allow them to clean their vehicles as soon as they pulled into any nearby parking lot.

Abusing Public service employee: Man gets a month in jail on appeal

The High Court of Appeal yesterday reversed a decision repealing a one-month jail term awarded to a man for insulting a public employee.

The ruling came in an appeal filed by the Public Prosecution challenging the acquittal.

Court files say the suspect had abused a public service employee and his employer through an Instagram post.

The post, the complaint said, had offensive remarks and violated telecommunication laws in the Kingdom.

Public Prosecution said they referred the suspect to a criminal trial after interrogation and with confirmed evidence.

However, following a trial, the Court of First Instance dropped the charges and acquitted him.

The Public Prosecution challenged this ruling in the Court of Appeal but failed to get a favourable ruling.

Prosecutors then challenged the acquittal decision in the Court of Cassation.

Following a hearing, the Court of Cassation approved the appeal and annulled the earlier judgement repealing the jail term awarded.

Public Prosecution said the latest ruling was unanimous and confirmed a month in jail for the defendant.

Restaurant trademark battle ends with court ruling against ex-partners

A court battle to determine the rightful owner of a restaurant trademark between a man who owns an 18-year-old restaurant and his former partners ended with the Court ruling in favour of the restaurant owner.

Court files say the plaintiff's former partners, who had waived their rights in the company, later opened a new restaurant but with the same trademark, which the plaintiff contested but backfired initially.

Plaintiff's lawyer Shahnaz said the decision to end the partnership business followed irrevocable differences.

"However, after giving up their rights, the ex-partners opened another restaurant with the same trademark.

"This is a breach of rights, and we approached a court demanding BD10,000 as compensation towards damages and removal of the trademark," the lawyer told the court, adding that the initial ruling was not in their favour.

"This made us approach the Court of Appeal, where the court ordered an investigation."

"That investigation con-

firmed my client as the rightful owner and creator of the trademark.

"My client has been with the restaurant for 18 years, which witnesses had also confirmed before the court.

"Their testimonies also confirmed my client as the rightful owner and creator of the trademark."

"Besides, documents also proved that the defendants had waived their rights while parting ways," the lawyer told the court.

"This makes the registration of the same trademark with the defendants' company illegal," the lawyer argued.

Accepting the argument, the court ordered the Ministry of Industry and Trade to cancel the trademark registration of the restaurant owned by the man's ex-partners.

Woman ordered to return BD1,500 dowry for renegeing on marriage promise

A woman who had accepted BD1,500 as Maher, a gift or contribution made by the husband-to-be to his wife-to-be as a mark of respect, but later stepped away from the marriage, has been ordered by the High Sharia Court to return the money.

Lawyer Khalil Ibrahim said the bride's family had asked his client to pay a dowry of BD1,700 for agreeing to their marriage, which the man paid in November 2020.

However, a month before the engagement date, the girl said



she don't want to proceed with the engagement.

"Though my client tried to talk out the differences, the girl and her family didn't budge.

"He then requested to return the BD1,700 he paid as a dowry, but managed to get back only BD200 leading to the court battle," the lawyer told the court.

The lawyer, citing Article 4 of the Jaafari Family Law, also told

the court that the gifts made in contemplation of marriage are conditional upon a subsequent ceremonial marriage, which in this has never happened.

However, the defendant and her attorney told the court that they received the amount for repairing and preparing the marital home and not as a dowry.

The Court ruled that the money provided was conditional on the completion of the marriage, and since the defendant had renegeed on her promise, she is obliged to return the money and other gifts presented to her.

Selling totalled car: Court orders refund

Importing a totalled vehicle and selling it after repairing it in Bahrain after masking its accident history landed a car seller in hot waters.

The buyer of the car, who got the shock of his life after discovering the vehicle's accident history, faced the seller in court and gained an order in his favour.

The Cassation Court ordered the seller to refund the buyer the BD12,300 he paid for the car.

The Court observed that the seller had withheld critical information from the customer during the deal.

The buyer learned about the pathetic condition of the car, only subjecting the car to a detailed inspection after issues started cropping up one after another.

However, when he contacted the seller, he ruled out refunding, leading to a court battle.

The Court ruling stated that the car had 'major' defects, which could be found only by an expert, with the papers of the vehicle lacking such information that affects the price.

The Court said the sales contract now stands cancelled, ruling for a refund.

More women need to be in "labour"

As Bahrain celebrated its triumphs and examined its future goals and challenges in the arena of female emancipation on Bahraini Women's Day, a call has gone out for more women to participate in labour unions.

The role of Bahraini women (as well as expat working women – Bahraini labour law allows expats also to contest in labour union elections) is important because of the increasing presence of women in the workforce. All over the world, women's participation in unions is seen as beneficial for several reasons. Unionised women have greater earnings – 30.9 percent more per week according to studies – and higher rates of health insurance coverage than non unionised women. Of course, in Bahrain our priorities are different because we have universal health-care and our labour laws mandate equal pay and excellent maternity benefits.

It is true that the central idea of women's participation in Bahrain's progress is that they should simultaneously discharge their important familial duties, unlike in many countries where working women have to compromise on their key roles as mother, wife and carer of the family.

However, we still have many significant goals to meet – equal financial and training access for women to progress in the workplace, for example and the removal of the last vestiges of gender bias in the workplace. More importantly, a new generation of girls and young women need to see their older generation take on leadership roles in the workplace and to articulate their rights.

As an emergent democracy, Bahrain's leadership places a lot of emphasis on the vox populi – the voice of the people. Labour Unions are spaces where these can be exercised for the greater good and are training grounds for a rich political discourse. As we head into 2023, I hope we see and hear more women union leaders' voices in the area of labour discussions.

The hidden cost of migration

Expatriates workers struggle as cost of living rises, says report

Low-income migrant workers have become more vulnerable due to the increasing cost of living in Bahrain.

According to a 2022 survey by InterNations, Bahrain is the 15th best destination for expats living and working abroad. It, however, also adds that while the cost of living rises continuously, the wages of expats have remained stagnant.

Specifically, the prices of food products, electricity, and water bills rapidly increased in recent years, but not wages. Some parliament members had even issued ration cards to nationals as a relief.

This was to ensure that "people in Bahrain do not go to sleep hungry", a migrant rights organisation website quotes a former lawmaker as saying.

The lawmaker adds: "Even average-income people

However, such humanitarian initiatives seldom take into account migrant workers, despite them occupying 50% of the population.

When asked about the poverty among expatriates, an economist and social worker remarked: "Bahrain is not a country where poverty is widespread; it is one of the richest countries in the world and those found begging on the streets are not nationals."

Our sources say the salaries of most expats have

not increased in about 17 years. "The cost of living has increased, but the salaries remained stagnant." "Commodity prices are also on the rise."

Private sector minimum wage!

Another issue is that Bahrain does not report a private-sector minimum wage.

"Since expatriates are arriving in great numbers to the Kingdom for work, employers always find healthy competition, giving them the freedom to hire at mini-

mum wages.

This should be read alongside the issues in the Kingdom regarding individuals not paying their EWA bills on time, with many claiming "they cannot afford it."

A resident, who does not want to be named, told The Daily Tribune, "I am struggling to pay my bills every month; my salary does not allow me to live comfortably."

"There are some months where I struggle to pay even for food."

Reports also say there is a considerable increase in the number of people begging on the streets recently, with most identified as migrants.

Meanwhile, citizens claim that the money sent abroad drains Bahrain's economy.

The common consensus, however, is that migrant workers are suffering harsh conditions (working and living), as the cost-of-living increases, it becomes more difficult for them to live comfortably.

Women leaders to rise in health sector: study

● Currently, males dominate over 59% of leadership positions, says Human Resources for Health Study

Bahrain will see more women taking leadership positions in the health sector soon, according to a new study, which states that men now hold 59.4% of the leadership positions.

But men won't enjoy that for long! "Soon, women will gain more potential to hold leadership positions," the Human Resources for Health Study says, citing an increasing trend in the participation and contribution of women to medicine in Bahrain.

The situation, however, is not the same in academic roles, where Bahraini women and men are equally

represented.

Bahraini women physicians also tend to "slightly surpass" their men counterparts. The study points out that Bahraini women healthcare workers are a strong pillar of the healthcare sector, and the country boasts one of the highest proportions of women healthcare staff in the region.

"Even though there has been an increasing trend of women in medicine, they are still underrepresented in leadership positions in the medical field," the study adds.

The study also highlights various

factors for this underrepresentation:

Balancing family vs. work duties and working part-time can limit women from achieving higher positions. The report adds that the government is boosting efforts to extend equal opportunities to women and decrease mistreatment or discrimination against women.

"Every year, women are getting closer to gaining more leadership positions in the medical field, and government officials in Bahrain are working hard to achieve equal opportunities for women," the report added.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has pointed out that a country needs a balanced distribution of workforce in healthcare to accomplish sustainable development goals.

Several studies also claim that women physicians tend to provide more patient-focused communication, better care for diabetic patients, readmission to hospitals, and more evidence-based management.

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) yesterday announced the launch of the new Labour Registration Programme, starting today.

The new programme will correct workers' legal status following the launch of the labour market reforms that replaced Flexi Permits.

The programme, launched in cooperation with the private sector, will streamline registering process for an occupation.

The new measures will link work permits to vocational and occupational standards to increase safety and protections in places of work.

The Authority stated that workers residing in Bahrain, or Flexi Permits holders, will be eligible for registration.



The LMRA called on all workers wishing to register in the programme to visit www.lmra.bh and use the "Eligibility to Apply Through Registration" service to verify their eligibility.

Applicants must register directly through accredited registration centres announced by the Authority. Applicants may also text from their personal number to 33150150, or contact the call centre on 17103103, for more information about their status.

The Authority explained that

the accredited centres will register and follow up on workers wishing to obtain a permit and will also work to include and update the data of workers in the Authority's system. Additionally, the Authority will verify the availability of relevant

required qualifications or certifications while ensuring grievances services are made available for said workers.

The LMRA added that registered workers could work in specialised occupations after obtaining a license.

Registered workers will receive a work permit card with a QR Code that includes the worker's updated data, including the type of permit, the occupation the worker is authorised to practice, the validity of the permit, health insurance details, and the name of the registration centre. Registered workers should pay the set fees at approved payment centres to process the registration.

Bahrain Bourse implements violations framework

● Covering 19 Violations

Bahrain Bourse announced on Thursday the implementation of the Issuers Violations Framework effective as of 2nd January 2023 following approval of the Central Bank of Bahrain.

The move allows Bahrain Bourse to impose administrative fines on issuers in the event of non-compliance with the Listing Rules and any other applicable BHB business rules.

The Issuers Violations Framework stipulates the rules for imposing monetary fines and/or sanctions, and the violations framework that apply for non-compliance to the Listing Rules, and any other applicable BHB business rules, regulations and directives as deemed appropriate.

According to the framework, administrative fines will be imposed on issuers based on the impact and frequency of the violation under consideration, which can impose an administrative violation such as suspension of trading or a monetary fine ranging from BD 500 up to BD 10,000 on each violation. Violations can reach up to BD 100,000 for cross-listed companies exceeding 30% of the Issuer's share capital traded outside of its main market jurisdiction.

All cases will be assessed and reviewed by the Violations Committee formed by Bahrain Bourse. The committee will be responsible for reviewing and evaluating high-frequency vio-

lations of BHB's business rules and regulations and determining penalties to be imposed on issuers and members based on the impact and frequency of the violation in a timely and cost-effective manner. The Disciplinary Appeals Board was formed to review and handle appeals arising from the decisions passed by the BHB's Disciplinary Board and the Violations Committee to ensure a high level of protection to all related parties.

Shaikha AlZayani, Director of Listing & Disclosure at Bahrain Bourse commented: "The issuance of the Issuers Violations Framework is a vital step towards the prevention of the violations and its associated risk in the market which aims to promote transparency and fairness and enhance issuer disclosure resulting in enhanced investor protection across the market and comes in line with Bahrain Bourse's commitment to position Bahrain's capital market at the forefront of adopting global financial market standards."

"The Administrative Fines framework falls in line with Bahrain Bourse's role as an SRO, and falls in line with IOSCO's Principles of Securities Regulation pertaining to self-regulation," Shaikha added.

Russia says won't accept price cap

Russia "will not accept" a price cap on its oil and is analysing how to respond, the Kremlin said in comments reported yesterday, in response to a deal by Western powers aimed at limiting a key source of funding for its war in Ukraine.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said Moscow had made preparations for Friday's price cap announcement by the Group of Seven nations, the European Union and Australia, the Russian state news agency TASS reported.

"We will not accept this cap," RIA news agency quoted him as saying. He added that Russia would conduct a rapid analysis of the agreement and respond after that, RIA reported.

Russia has repeatedly said it will not supply oil to countries that implement the cap - a stance reaffirmed by Mikhail Ulyanov, Moscow's ambassador to international organisations in Vienna, in posts on social media on Saturday.

"Starting from this year Europe will live without Russian

oil," he said.

The G7 price cap will allow non-EU countries to continue importing seaborne Russian crude oil, but it will prohibit shipping, insurance and re-insurance companies from handling cargoes of Russian crude around the globe, unless it is sold for less than \$60. That could complicate the shipment of Russian crude priced above the cap, even to countries which are not part of the agreement.

Russian Urals crude traded at around \$67 a barrel on Friday. US Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen said the cap will particularly benefit low- and medium-income countries that have borne the brunt of high energy and food prices.

"With Russia's economy already contracting and its budget

increasingly stretched thin, the price cap will immediately cut into (President Vladimir) Putin's most important source of revenue," Yellen said in a statement.

In comments published on Telegram, Russia's embassy in the United States criticised what it called the "dangerous" Western move and said Moscow would continue to find buyers for its oil.

"Steps like these will inevitably result in increasing uncertainty and imposing higher costs for raw materials' consumers," it said. "Regardless of the current flirtations with the dangerous and illegitimate instrument, we are confident that Russian oil will continue to be in demand."

Crypto exchange Gemini trying to recover \$900 million from crypto lender Genesis

Crypto broker Genesis and its parent company Digital Currency Group (DCG) owe customers of the Winklevoss twins' crypto exchange Gemini \$900 million, the Financial Times reported on Saturday.

Crypto exchange Gemini is trying to recover the funds after Genesis was wrongfooted by last month's failure of Sam Bankman-Fried's FTX crypto group, the newspaper said, citing people familiar with the matter.

Venture capital company Digital Currency Group, which owns Genesis Trading and cryptocurrency asset manager Grayscale, owes \$575 million

to Genesis' crypto lending arm, Digital Currency Chief Executive Barry Silbert told shareholders last month. Gemini, which runs a crypto lending product in partnership with Genesis, has now formed a creditors' committee to recoup the funds from Genesis and its parent DCG, the report added.

A group of people tried to take a mural by graffiti artist Banksy in Ukraine by cutting it off a battle-scarred wall where it was painted, the governor of Kyiv region said. The group managed to slice off a section of board and plaster bearing the image of a woman in a gas mask and dressing gown holding a fire extinguisher on the side of a scorched building.

But they were spotted at the scene in the city of Hostomel near Kyiv and the mural was retrieved, Oleksiy Kuleba said

in a statement.

The image was still intact and police were protecting it, he added.

"These images are, after all, symbols of our struggle against the enemy ... We'll do everything to preserve these works of street art as a symbol of our victory," he said.

Banksy, whose work can sell for millions of dollars on the art market, confirmed he had painted the mural and six others last month in places that were badly affected by heavy fighting after Russia invaded Ukraine in late February.

makeshift shelter at the port's entrance. The protesters say the huge project causes coastal erosion that has undermined their livelihoods, calling for a complete halt on the construction.

Adani Group, led by Asia's richest man Gautam Adani, and the Kerala government, which is shouldering two-thirds of the project cost with the federal government, have denied such

accusations. Clashes between police and protesters last week-end injured more than 100 people, including 64 police.

Although the protesters have refused to budge, Kerala's minister of ports, Ahammed Devarkovil, said the government of the southern state was hopeful of resolving the deadlock but there was no chance it would halt construction.

Distant black hole is caught in the act of annihilating a star



Astronomers have detected an act of extreme violence more than halfway across the known universe as a black hole shreds a star that wandered too close to this celestial savage. But this was no ordinary instance of a ravenous black hole.

It was one of only four examples - and the first since 2011 - of a black hole observed in the act of tearing apart a passing star in what is called a tidal disruption event and then launching luminous jets of high-energy particles in opposite directions into space, researchers said. And it was both the furthest and brightest such event on record.

Astronomers described the event in studies published on Wednesday in the journals Nature and Nature Astronomy.

The office of Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy called yesterday for a lower price cap on Russian oil than the one agreed to by Ukraine's Western supporters while Russian authorities called the \$60-per-barrel cap harmful to free, stable markets.

Andriy Yermak, the head of Zelenskyy's office, wrote on social media that the price ceiling set by the European Union, Australia, Britain, Canada, Japan, and the United States on Friday didn't go far enough. The cap is set to take effect Monday, along with an embargo on Russian oil shipped by sea.

One resident was injured in Selaawi village of West Java's Garut district, and at least four houses and a school were damaged, said Suharyanto, the National Disaster Management Agency head who goes by a single name. He said authorities were still collecting information about the damage.



Lionel Messi produced a moment of trademark quality to score the opener in a 2-1 win over Australia and send Argentina into the quarter-finals of the World Cup yesterday.

Messi's 789th goal in his 1,000th career appearance -- but first in the knockout rounds of the World Cup -- helped set up a last-eight clash with the unbeaten Netherlands on Friday.

Julian Alvarez scored the other in the 57th minute after some calamitous Australian defending, before Enzo Fernandez's 77th-minute own goal set up an unexpectedly nervy finale.

Now 35, one of the best players of all time is seeking to win the tournament for the first time in what will surely be his final World Cup.

Messi's classy first-half goal, bending the ball into the bottom corner, broke the resist-

ance and ultimately the hearts of a gutsy Australian side who defied all expectations in Qatar and went down fighting.

Back in Australia, where fans had a sunrise start if they wanted to catch the game live on television, the Sydney Opera House was lit up in green and gold.

Depay on target as Netherlands beat US 3-1 to reach quarter-finals

A clinical Netherlands ended the United States' World Cup dream yesterday, sweeping into the quarter-finals with a ruthless 3-1 victory.

First-half goals from Memphis Depay and Daley Blind and a late strike from Denzel Dumfries sealed a deserved victory as the Dutch handed out a painful lesson in finishing to their American opponents.

The Netherlands, bidding to win their first World Cup after losing in three previous finals, will face Argentina or Australia in the last eight.

Veteran coach Louis van Gaal's men were worthy victors in yesterday's last-16 clash.

Although the USA enjoyed long periods of possession in a bright first-half display, all too often a lack of composure in the final third let them down.

Instead it was the Dutch who calmly bided their time before carving open the Americans with forensic precision.

USA forward Christian Pulisic squandered a golden chance to

put his team 1-0 up after only three minutes, when he found himself in space only to see a scuffed shot saved by Andries Noppert.

Buoyed by that early chance, the US remained on the front foot, attacking high up the field.

Dumfries picked out Depay, who swept home the finish to cap a majestic 20-pass move that was in the best traditions of the Netherlands' total footballing heritage.

vanced purposefully into Dutch territory through Pulisic, only for the Chelsea player to deliver a cross that fell behind his US team-mates.

Tim Weah had the best American chance of the remainder of the half on 43 minutes, letting fly with a rasping shot that Noppert parried away.

But in first half stoppage time, the Netherlands delivered the hammer blow.

Dumfries again found space down the right and drilled a cross to Blind, who had ghosted clear of Sergino Dest, for an emphatic low finish.

The Netherlands nearly extended their lead early in the second half when Dumfries' low cross was prodded towards the US goal by defender Walker Zimmerman, forcing a smart save from Matt Turner.

Ronaldo denies he swore at Portugal coach over substitution

Cristiano Ronaldo denied that he had sworn at Portugal coach Fernando Santos when he was substituted during a dramatic 2-1 defeat to South Korea in the World Cup on Friday, as both teams advanced into the next round.

Ronaldo, Portugal's captain, said the comments he made as he left the field in the 65th minute were in fact aimed at a South Korean player.

Portuguese media said the former Manchester United, Real Madrid and Juventus player, who left the English club last month, appeared to challenge Santos over the decision to substitute him, using vulgar language towards the coach.

"What happened was before my substitution, the South Korea player told me to get off quickly. I told him to shut up as he doesn't have that authority. There was no disagreement (with the coach)," Ronaldo was quoted as saying by

Portuguese reporters.

The 37-year-old is seeking to equal the Portuguese record of most World Cup goals held by Eusebio, who racked up nine in 1966 in England, the only World Cup tournament he played in.

Ronaldo last week became the first ever player to score in five World Cups. Santos, asked by reporters about the substitution incident, also said a South Korean player had been aggressive in his comments towards the five-time Ballon d'Or winner.

Pele not responding to chemotherapy, moved to end-of-life care: Reports

Football legend Pele has reportedly been put under palliative care after the Brazilian legend stopped responding to chemotherapy treatment for colon cancer.

According to medical reports, Pele was admitted to the hospital on November 29; doctors wanted to re-evaluate the football legend's cancer treatment. Later, he was diagnosed with a respiratory infection.

Brazilian media outlet Folha de S. Paulo reported that the



82-year-old football legend was no longer responding to chemotherapy, so he was put under palliative care. Pele will reportedly be treated only for symptoms such as shortness of breath and pain.

Al Zayed, Al Hakam stay in top 10 in Arab golf

Team Bahrain keep up strong showing after 54 holes in 41st Pan Arab Men Golf Championship in Tunisia

Bahrain's Ahmed Al Zayed maintained his top 10 position in seventh overall after the third and penultimate round of play yesterday in the 41st Pan Arab Men Golf Championship, being held at La Cigale Tabarka Golf course in Tunisia.

Al Zayed was the national team's top-scoring golfer over yesterday's 18 holes, carding a four-over-par 76 to bring his three-day total to a 16-over 232.

His other two scores from the first two days were 81 and 75, and he now heads into the final round as the top Bahraini hopeful.

Teammate Fahad Al Hakam also stayed in the top 10 with the last 18 holes to go today. Al Hakam played a six-over-par 78 yesterday to go to 18-over 234—two shots behind Al Zayed—after 54 holes.

Al Hakam has been consistent over the course of the competition, with his totals on the first two days being 77 and 79. His score yesterday was sixth-best amongst the field of 21 who took to the fairways.

Meanwhile, Bahrainis Khalifa Al Merisi and Khalifa Duaij Al Kaabi were not far behind, both taking places in the top 20.

Al Merisi was ranked 12th after carding an eight-over-par 80 yesterday to go to 23-over-par 239 after three rounds, while Al Kaabi was 17th after playing a score of 81 yesterday to head into today's final day 32-over-par 248.

Their outings on day three were eighth and ninth-best, respectively. Al Merisi's totals on days one and two were 84 and 75, while Al Kaabi's scores were 85 and 82.

Leading the field with the

concluding 18 holes to play is Elyas Barhoumi from Tunisia with a three-under-par total of 213 over after 54 holes.

Saaoud Abdallah Al Sherif from Saudi is second on an even-par 216 score, while Issa Abu El Ela from Egypt is third with a four-over-par 220.

Dean Naeem (221) from Egypt, Baha Boulakmine (225) from Tunisia and Saleh Ali Al Kaabi (227) from Qatar are all ahead of Al Zayed on the leaderboard. Completing the top

10 behind Al Zayed in eighth is Faycal Mohammad Al Salhab (234) from Saudi Arabia, while behind Al Hakam in 10th is Aziz Dardouri (237) from Tunisia.

All four of Bahrain's golfers are back in action for today's finale. The tournament is taking place under the umbrella of the Arab Golf Federation, and is sanctioned by The R&A.

The Kingdom's delegation in Tunisia is headed by Captain Adel Ali Al Fayyad, and includes Spanish head coach Gabriel Sota.

The Arab championship is being played at the individual and team levels. In the teams' competition, only each nation's three lowest scores count on each day.

The other participating nations include the UAE, Saudi Arabia, Oman, Kuwait, Lebanon, Iraq, Qatar, Egypt, Palestine, Libya, Somalia and hosts Tunisia.
