Bahrain suffered a bitter start to their Arab Cup Group D campaign, losing 2-1 to Iraq at Stadium 974 in Doha yesterday. Before this match, Iraq had gone 10 games without a win against the Reds (2 Bahrain wins and 8 draws).

The opening goal was a cruel twist of fate. Aymen Hussain, top scorer of the 2024 AFC Asian Cup, met a cross with a firm header that goalkeeper Ebrahim Lutfalla initially saved, only for the ball to rebound off his trailing foot and into the net. Lutfalla was immediately substituted by coach Dragan Talajic, with Omar Salem coming on.
