Council to resolve waste bag issue

The Southern Municipal Council has announced that it will convene an extraordinary session on Monday dedicated to addressing the waste bag distribution issue, following growing concerns raised by council members over delays and disruption to a core municipal service. Members stressed that the problem cannot be left without resolution and requires urgent intervention.

During the council's eleventh meeting of the fourth legislative term, municipal member Mohammed Hussain Darraj highlighted persistent complaints regarding slow processing of services and overlapping responsibilities between several authorities involved in waste management.

He stressed that citizens are often left without clear answers, with requests being rejected or delayed due to uncertainty over jurisdiction, adding to public frustration.

Southern Municipal Council member Ali Al Shaikh focused on the need for clearer coordination and stronger on-site supervision.

Rising burdens

MPs seek public debate on government measures to address escalating living expenses and business costs

Parliament has asked for a public debate to question the government on how it is dealing with the social and economic strain linked to rising prices, after recent changes that MPs say have pushed up household costs and business bills.

The request calls for an open discussion in Parliament to press ministers on their plan for coping with higher living costs and inflation-linked pressures.

The MPs behind it named MP Hassan Ibrahim to speak first.

"This request comes against the backdrop of a range of fast-moving economic changes," Ibrahim said, pointing to fuel price changes, higher electricity and water bills, and increased labour market fees, along with rising costs for some key inputs used by businesses.

Impact

He said the impact was being felt in day-to-day life and in running costs across the economy.

"These changes have pro-

duced cumulative, direct and indirect effects that have reached various aspects of daily living," he said. "They have affected the ability of many national institutions, particularly small and medium-sized enterprises, to continue and to meet their contractual and financial obligations."

Ibrahim said steps with a wide financial reach should come with clear support to ease the hit on households and firms.

"Any decisions with wide financial impact should be accompanied by supportive policies and clear mitigating measures," he said, adding that these

steps should take account of different incomes and levels of spending power.

Protection

MPs want the government to explain how it plans to strengthen consumer protection as prices rise, and to spell out how fuel prices are reviewed and how decisions are weighed against people's ability to pay.

They are also asking what will be done to deal with older contracts and tenders that have become harder to deliver because costs have risen, and what support is planned for contractors and suppliers facing new bills

that were not expected when agreements were signed.

The request presses for details on support for the private sector as operating costs rise, including steps meant to help national firms avoid financial trouble, keep the job market stable and prevent any knock-on effect on citizens or service quality.

It also asks about projects already under way, including how higher energy and service costs are affecting financing and whether contracted firms can keep work moving.

Clarity

MPs want clarity too on the role of the Labour Fund Tamkeen in rolling out support schemes and new initiatives to help firms cope with changes in energy and service pricing.

Another key point is the middle class, which MPs describe as heavily exposed to repeated rises in living costs while not always covered by support aimed at lower-income groups. MPs want the government to explain its plans.

Drugs found hidden in dried fish

Two suspects held

A man and woman were intercepted at Bahrain International Airport after customs officers became suspicious of their suitcases.

Using a sophisticated method to conceal narcotics among dried fish and shrimp, the defendants attempted to pass through customs.

Upon inspection, officers discovered drugs hidden in six transparent bags inside the fish and shrimp, as well as in clothing, making them difficult to detect.

The defendants denied the charges before the High Criminal Court (First Circuit), which scheduled a verdict date while ordering the defendants to remain in custody.

The Public Prosecution charged the defendants with importing and possessing narcotics for the purpose of trafficking in 2025, in violation of the law.

“Safety is not optional, it is your responsibility,” was the key message delivered to building, establishment, and restaurant owners by Colonel Dr. Osama Bahar, Head of Hidd Police Station, during an appearance on the Interior Ministry's Al Aman social media programme.

“Always use devices and equipment approved by the General Directorate of Civil Defence,” he emphasized. “Neglecting these requirements can lead to tragic consequences injuries, loss of life, and legal repercussions. God forbid; lives can be lost if safety is ignored.”

Colonel Bahar reminded viewers that buildings have

collapsed due to gas leaks, and some restaurants have operated before being inspected by Civil Defence, putting everyone at risk.

Proper safety equipment, such as gas detectors and detection devices, protects not only your property but also the lives of employees and customers.

As he mentioned in episode

43 of the Interior Ministry's Al Aman social media program, he explained the dangers of gas leaks, which were responsible for more than 300 fires and 21 explosions in 2024 and 2025.

He highlighted the main causes of gas leaks and shared four simple prevention tips that should be taught, explained,

and practiced by all household members to avoid similar incidents in the future.

“Negligence can cost lives,” he warned. “Your reputation depends on it but more importantly, so does human life. Do not rely solely on your staff; follow up personally, because the law holds you accountable.”

Explosions

He added a stark reminder: “In the past two years, 21 residential buildings have been affected by explosions, with some collapsing entirely due to gas. Lives were lost, people were injured, and some cases were referred to the Public Prosecution. The choice is clear: put safety first, or risk the consequences.”

Colonel Bahar concluded: “Choose wisely. Choose safety.”

A King's Vision That Still Protects Bahrain

For decades, Bahrain has continued to live by the far-sighted vision of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, King of the Kingdom of Bahrain, may God protect and preserve him—a vision that has consistently touched the daily lives of Bahraini citizens across all fields. ◆ **Colombia's most** powerful cartel walked away from months-long peace talks on Wednesday, after Presidents Gustavo Petro and Donald Trump vowed a new offensive targeting three key cocaine trafficking bosses. At the White House, the two presidents agreed to joint military and intelligence actions against Colombian criminal capos who together produce and supply much of the world's cocaine. Colombian Defense Minister Pedro Sanchez said the two countries would target Ivan Mordisco, Colombia's most wanted rebel; Chiquito Malo, commander of the Clan del Golfo cartel; and Pablito, an ELN guerrilla leader operating on the Venezuelan border. The Petro-Trump pact upends years of spluttering Colombian efforts to negotiate peace accords with big criminal groups. Colombia produces about 70 percent of the world's cocaine, and the United States is by far the world's largest consumer.

◆ **China's leader** Xi Jinping told US President Donald Trump in a call on Wednesday they could resolve bilateral issues with mutual respect, Chinese state media said. "By tackling issues one by one and continuously building mutual trust, we can forge a right way for the two countries to get along," Xi said, according to state broadcaster CCTV. "Let us make 2026 a year in which China and the United States, as two major countries, move toward mutual respect, peaceful coexistence, and win-win cooperation," he added.

◆ **Russia yesterday** condemned the killing of Seif al-Islam Gaddafi, son of slain Libyan ruler Muammar Gaddafi, and called for a thorough probe into his death. "We strongly condemn this crime. We hope a thorough investigation will be conducted and the perpetrators will be brought to justice," Russian foreign ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova said in a statement.

◆ **Gazan health officials** said Israeli air strikes on Wednesday killed 23 people, with Israel's military saying it struck after one of its officers was wounded by enemy gunfire. Despite a US-brokered truce entering its second phase last month, violence has continued in the Gaza Strip, with Israel and Hamas accusing each other of breaching the agreement. The latest bloodshed came days after Israel partly reopened the Rafah crossing between Gaza and Egypt, the only exit for Gazans that does not pass through Israel.

Iran formally allows women to ride motorcycles

Women in Iran can now formally obtain a licence to ride a motorcycle, local media reported Wednesday, ending years of legal ambiguity surrounding two-wheelers.

Previously, the law did not explicitly prohibit women from riding motorbikes and scooters, but in practice authorities refused to issue licences.

Due to the grey area, women have been held legally responsible for accidents even when victims.

Iran's First Vice President Mohammad Reza Aref signed a resolution on Tuesday aimed at clarifying the traffic code, which was approved by Iran's

cabinet in late January, the country's Ilna news agency reported.

The resolution obliges traffic police to "provide practical training to female applicants, organise an exam under the direct supervision of the police, and issue motorcycle driver's licences to women", Ilna said.

For Saina, a 33-year-old advertising agency employee who has been commuting to work by scooter for six months, the change to the traffic laws comes "too late" because "women have been riding motorcycles for months already".

"I don't think this is the main problem in our society," she told AFP, referring to the recent protests and Iran's economic challenges.

Rubio says US ready to meet Iran but must discuss missiles

Iranian state media said talks with the United States would take place Friday



The United States is ready to meet Iran this week but discussions must cover its missile and nuclear programs, Secretary of State Marco Rubio said yesterday.

Rubio did not confirm a meeting on Friday with Iran's clerical state, which has violently put down some of the most serious protests against its rule since the 1979 Islamic revolution.

"If the Iranians want to meet, we're ready," Rubio told reporters.

"They've expressed an interest in meeting and talking. If they change their mind, we're fine with that too," he said, after President Donald Trump ordered a sharp military buildup



near Iran's coast and threatened to strike. "In order for talks to

actually lead to something meaningful, they will have to include

certain things, and that includes the range of their ballistic missiles, that includes their sponsorship of terrorist organizations across the region, that includes their nuclear program and that includes the treatment of their own people," Rubio said.

Iran in previous talks on its disputed nuclear programme has ruled out discussions on its missiles, casting the weapons that can hit Israel as a tool of self-defense to which every country has a right.

But Iran has been under growing pressure from the protests and after an Israeli bombing campaign last year. Iran has also lost key regional allies with Israel's severe degrading of Hezbollah and the fall of veteran Syrian president Bashar al-Assad.

Iranian state media said yesterday that talks with the United States would take place Friday in Oman, after diplomats earlier said the meeting would happen on Friday in Turkey.

Merz heads to Gulf as Germany looks to diversify trade ties

German Chancellor Friedrich Merz headed to Saudi Arabia yesterday to kick off a Gulf tour as the biggest EU economy seeks to diversify its key trade and energy partnerships.

Joined by a business delegation, the conservative leader will meet with Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, then travel to Qatar and the United Arab Emirates on his whistlestop tour until Friday.

"In the geopolitical environment in which we operate, we must intensify our partnerships with important and influential states in the world. The Gulf

states are among them," a senior German official said ahead of Merz's trip.

A second official said Germany wanted to "strengthen trade and export opportunities, increase and incentivise foreign investment" and "diversify our supply chains... especially

in the energy sector". Germany has long exported defence goods and sealed major infrastructure deals in the Gulf region, whose wealthy monarchies have in turn used their energy riches to invest in German corporate giants from

Volkswagen to Deutsche Bank.

When Russia's 2022 invasion of Ukraine led to sharply lower Russian energy supplies, Berlin turned to Doha to step up liquefied natural gas imports that got it through the following winter.

Berlin has now accelerated efforts to lessen its reliance on American LNG and wants to increasingly bank on green hydrogen generated through clean energy to achieve its climate targets.

Saudi Arabia and other Gulf states have meanwhile been moving to diversify away from oil and gas, investing heavily in sectors from renewables to tourism, logistics and AI.

Saudi Arabia to provide passports for kingdom's beloved camels

Saudi Arabia has announced plans to issue passports to the kingdom's millions of camels, to help better manage the country's prized herds.

The ministry of the environment, water and agriculture promised the initiative would enhance the "productivity and efficiency in the sector and build a reliable reference database for camels".

A social media post from the ministry on Tuesday included a picture of the document: a green passport stamped with the country's coat of arms and a golden image of a camel.

The passport will "contribute to organising sales and trading operations by regulating commerce and transport, ensuring official documentation, protecting owners' rights, and facilitating proof of ownership," accord-

ing state-backed broadcaster Al Ekhbariya.

In 2024, the government es-

timated there were around 2.2 million camels in the kingdom. Camels have long been a vital mode of transportation in Arabia, conferring status on their owners and fuelling the rise of a lucrative breeding industry.

The kingdom also hosts beauty contests for camels at annual festivals, where Saudi enthusiasts spend hundreds of thousands of dollars on animal contestants -- and the unscrupulous sometimes seek an illegal advantage.

Organisers have in recent years cracked down on cosmetic enhancements, a malpractice that has thrived amid stiff competition and despite heavy penalties.


Methods to make the camels' lips droopier and their humps more shapely are particularly frowned upon by the authorities who want to encourage a natural look.

Camels have been essential to life on the Arabian peninsula for millennia, with research published in 2021 suggesting life-sized carvings of camels and horses hewn into rock faces in Saudi Arabia could be around 7,000 years old.

Xi, Putin hail 'stabilising' China-Russia alliance

Xi also held a phone call with US President Donald Trump

China's President Xi Jinping and Russia's Vladimir Putin hailed the strengthening of bilateral ties in the face of a "turbulent" global situation, in a video call yesterday.

Several hours later, Chinese state media said Xi held a phone call with US President Donald Trump, without immediately providing further details.

China and Russia have sought to present a united front against the West, with ties deepening since Moscow's 2022 Ukraine

invasion. The Xi-Putin call, which a Kremlin aide said lasted nearly an hour and a half, came ahead of the fourth anniversary of Russia's military campaign later this month.

"Since the beginning of the year, the international situation has become increasingly turbulent," Xi told Putin in a readout reported by Chinese state broadcaster CCTV.

"Both sides should... ensure that China-Russia relations continue to develop steadily along the right track, through deeper strategic coordination and a more proactive and effective commitment as major powers," the Chinese president said.

Addressing Xi as his "dear friend", Putin expressed a similar message, saying "the foreign policy alliance between Moscow and Beijing remains an important stabilising factor".

"The Russian-Chinese comprehensive partnership and strategic cooperation is exemplary," Putin said in the video broadcast on Russian state TV.

Neither leader went into detail on what strategic areas they would deepen coordination on.

Matching 'opinions' on US

The Kremlin said Putin had accepted invitations to visit China in the first half of 2026 and attend the APEC regional

summit hosted by Xi in November. "The conversation lasted one hour and 25 minutes," Kremlin aide Yuri Ushakov told reporters from AFP and other media outlets, saying the call was held in a "friendly and trusting atmosphere".

Putin praised trade ties, with Moscow redirecting its exports to Asia after Western countries imposed massive sanctions on Russia over the Kremlin's Ukraine offensive.

The video call took place as Russian, Ukrainian and US negotiators met in Abu Dhabi for a round of talks on ending the almost four-year war, which has turned into Europe's worst conflict since World War II.

Putin made no mention of Ukraine during the part of the call broadcast by Moscow, but the Kremlin later said Xi expressed support for the Abu Dhabi negotiations.

The pair discussed "opinions" on the United States, views that according to the Kremlin "practically matched" each other.

The Kremlin also said Putin had told Xi that Moscow intends to act "responsibly" after a key nuclear pact with the US expires on Thursday.

And "special attention was given to the tense situation in Iran", Kremlin aide Ushakov added.


Russia demands Ukraine give in as UAE talks open



India's commerce minister said yesterday the government had succeeded in protecting the country's critical agriculture and dairy sectors in its trade deal with the United States announced this week.

Farmers fear that opening these two sectors to foreign competition would rob vulnerable households of their livelihoods.

The trade deal was announced on Monday after months of uncertainty and negotiations between the two countries.

"The Indian side has succeeded

in protecting the interests of its sensitive sectors, particularly agriculture and dairy sectors,"

Piyush Goyal told the lower house of parliament.

"This framework agreement, with the world's largest economy, which will accelerate global growth and innovation in the coming years, is in the broader interest of the people of India and the nation."

US President Donald Trump

said the deal, which would lower levies to 18% from the 25% imposed on Indian goods last year, came together after Prime Minister Narendra Modi promised to stop buying Russian oil.

Washington has argued the oil sales help Moscow generate revenue to fund the war in Ukraine.

Goyal said the revised tariff was lower than what the US had imposed on many countries in the region and would increase "India's export competitiveness in the American market."

He also said both sides were working to complete the technicalities and the details of the deal would be announced soon.

When announcing the deal, Trump also said New Delhi had agreed to purchase more than \$500 billion worth of US energy, technology, agricultural, coal and other goods.

While Trump had struck deals with most governments since he unveiled sweeping tariffs in April last year, Indian officials had struggled to follow suit.

Dar Kulaib, Bahrain's other representatives, will start their campaign today against Oman's Al Seeb at 2pm, after yesterday's preparatory practice in Kuwait City. Kenyan professional Enock Mogeni said: "We train every day as if it's game day. Everyone is coming for one mission – just to win."

The top two teams from each pool, plus the two best third-placed sides, advance to the quarter-finals on 10 February. Semifinals are scheduled for 12 February, with finals on 14 February. Al Ahli's next matches are against CJS Batroun tomorrow at 2pm and Kuwait SC on Sunday at 6pm, Bahrain time.

France's Kante joins Fenerbahce after Erdogan 'support'

France midfielder N'Golo Kante has signed for Fenerbahce from Saudi side Al-Ittihad thanks to "support" from president Recep Tayyip Erdogan, the Turkish club said yesterday.

World Cup winner Kante, who turns 35 next month, had been set to move to Istanbul earlier but the transfer seemed to have failed due to an administrative error.

The length of Kante's contract has not been revealed but it offers the two-time Premier League winning midfielder a chance to further his claim for a place in France's World Cup finals squad.

Erdogan was in Saudi Arabia on Tuesday, making his first visit to the country in more than two years.

"Our club has successfully completed the transfer of N'Golo Kante, a prominent figure in world football," Fenerbahce president Saittun Saran said.

"On behalf of myself and our club, I would like to express my gratitude to our President Recep Tayyip Erdogan for his significant support in ensuring the positive conclusion of this process, which will contribute to the development of both Fenerbahce and Turkish football," he added.

Going in the opposite direction is Fenerbahce's experienced Moroccan international striker Youssef En-Nesyri.

The 28-year-old, who was part of the Morocco side that reached the 2022 World Cup semi-finals and last month's Africa Cup of Nations final, replaces Karim Benzema, who left Al-Ittihad for Saudi rivals Al-Hilal on Monday.

Arsenal sink Chelsea to reach League Cup final

Arsenal reach their first final in six years and end a run of semi-final defeats

Arsenal beat Chelsea 1-0, advance 4-2 on aggregate

Havertz scores late winner at the Emirates

Arsenal reached the League Cup final for the first time in eight years as Kai Havertz sealed a 1-0 win against Chelsea in the semi-final second leg on Tuesday.

Mikel Arteta's side had put themselves in pole position in the first leg and Havertz came off the bench to finish the 4-2 aggregate victory in the closing moments at the Emirates Stadium.

It was a cathartic triumph for the Gunners, who had lost their previous four semi-finals in the 2025 Champions League and League Cup, the 2022 League Cup and the 2021 Europa League.

In their first final for six years, Arsenal will face Manchester City or Newcastle at Wembley on March 22.

City held a 2-0 lead over Newcastle ahead of yesterday's second leg at the Etihad Stadium.

Arsenal haven't won the League Cup since 1993, losing in their last three final appearances.

Now they have the chance to end that drought by winning the club's first trophy since the 2020 FA Cup.

That remains the sole silverware won by Arteta since he was hired in December 2019.

"We knew it was going to be a real battle out there. That resilience, that clarity to understand what kind of game we had to play, we did so well," Arteta said.

"There was a special atmosphere inside our stadium. It makes such a difference. We've been waiting a few years to get into this position and we're certainly going to enjoy it."

It is shaping up to be a memorable season for Arsenal, who are six points clear at the top of the Premier League and reached the Champions League last 16 by winning all eight of their group

the win.

Rosenior's switch to a three-man central defence allowed Chelsea to stifle Arsenal in a scrappy first half.

The Gunners briefly shook off their shackles as Piero Hincapie's curler from just inside the area was palmed away by Robert Sanchez.

It rained so heavily in the first half that Rosenior had to take off his soaked glasses to see what was happening.

Squinting through the squall offered Rosenior an alarming view as Malo Gusto's misjudgement let in Gabriel Martinelli before the Chelsea defender scrambled back to block the shot.

It took 43 minutes for Chelsea to muster a shot on target when Enzo Fernandez's long-range blast was punched clear by Kepa Arrizabalaga.

Chelsea needed to push for a goal and Rosenior sent on Cole Palmer and Estevao Willian after an hour, ditching his back three.

Estevao immediately set up Fernandez for a curler that flashed over, but Chelsea's threat petered out.

Havertz delivered the knockout blow in the final seconds of stoppage-time, rounding Sanchez to slot into the empty net after Chelsea were caught on the counter.

Despite their success, Arsenal have attracted criticism for their reliance on goals from corners and set-pieces.

Arteta launched a passionate defence of Arsenal's style of play this week, revealing he has a "massive book of people" who feel his side are the "most exciting in Europe".

Tuesday's war of attrition will hardly silence Arsenal's critics, but Arteta won't care about that after leading his team to Wembley.

Chelsea boss Liam Rosenior had won six of his seven matches in all competitions since arriving from Strasbourg to replace Enzo Maresca.

But Rosenior was unable to solve his Arsenal conundrum, with the Gunners handing him the only two defeats of his brief

reign.

"Arsenal know they were in a game, over both ties. We dominated the areas we wanted to in the second half, but we didn't find that quality moment," Rosenior said.

"It's painful to lose. We just need to keep making improvements, which I'm seeing from the first leg to the second."

Knockout blow

Spin-heavy Pakistan hit form, but India boycott risks early T20 exit

Forfeiting the marquee India clash leaves Pakistan with zero margin for error in Group A

Pakistan's spin-heavy squad are in winning form ahead of the T20 World Cup, but a controversial decision to forfeit their marquee clash against India could still trigger another early exit.

Pakistan came close to withdrawing from the tournament in solidarity with Bangladesh, who pulled out after refusing to play in India, citing security concerns.

The Pakistan government eventually cleared the team's participation but it barred them from facing India in Colombo in a blockbuster clash on February 15.

With two points for a win, a forfeit of the match will leave Pakistan with no margin for error if they are to progress as one

of the top two from a five-team Group A.

It means they must win their opening game against the Netherlands in Colombo on Saturday and beat the United States three days later to stay in contention.

Their final group game will be against Namibia on February 18.

Captain Salman Agha said the move to boycott the India game was out of the team's hands.

"That is not our decision. We have to follow what our government decides," he said.

The Pakistan government has not said what their stance might be if the team were to end up facing India again in the semi-finals or final. Agha was not thinking about that.

"Our job is to win, and we are capable of doing that," he said.

Pakistan will be keen to avoid a repeat of the last T20 World

Cup in 2024, where a shock super over defeat to co-hosts the United States led to them failing to get out of the group.

The side has since faced criticism for failing to adapt to the modern demands of T20 cricket, with the batting, particularly Babar Azam's low strike rate, under scrutiny.

The criticism was fuelled by Pakistan's record last year, where 21 of their 34 T20 inter-

national wins came against lower-ranked opponents.

Confidence restored

Against elite teams, the results were sobering: three losses to India in the Asia Cup and a 4-1 series defeat to New Zealand.

However, Agha believes recent performances have restored confidence.

Pakistan beat South Africa 2-1, won a home tri-series, and then completed a 3-0 sweep of an under-strength Australia.

"We've had good preparation by beating Australia. We have the luxury of quality spinning

all-rounders like Mohammad Nawaz, Shadab Khan and Saim Ayub.

"We're ticking most boxes and believe we can win the World Cup," Agha said.

The spin department has been strengthened by Abrar Ahmed and Usman Tariq, the latter known for his unusual, slingy action and exaggerated pause at the crease.

The pace attack is led by the experienced Shaheen Shah Afridi and Naseem Shah.

Faheem Ashraf provides seam-bowling all-round support and newcomer Salman Mirza has been impressive.

Batting remains Pakistan's most volatile component.

When openers Saim Ayub and Sahibzada Farhan provide strong starts, the side can post competitive totals, but collapses remain a constant threat.

Head coach Mike Hesson has added another layer of risk by leaving out experienced wicket-keeper Mohammad Rizwan because of poor form, opting instead for makeshift options in Usman Khan, Khawaja Nafay and Farhan.

For Pakistan, the ingredients for a deep run are present, but with points potentially forfeited, there is little room left for error.

Draper to make long-awaited return in Davis Cup qualifier

Jack Draper insists he is "still improving" as he prepares to return from a long-term injury absence this week in Britain's Davis Cup qualifier against Norway in Oslo.

The 24-year-old has not played since withdrawing from the US Open last August following his first-round match with an arm injury.

Draper enjoyed the best year of his career in 2025 before the injury, climbing to fourth in the world rankings and winning the Indian Wells title.

He returns on Thursday against a Norway side which may include three-time Grand Slam runner-up Casper Ruud.

"I think last year definitely started off amazingly well," said Draper.

"The second half was extremely challenging, but I took a lot of belief and confidence from the first half of the year and what I achieved."

"I've kept that in mind and I want to be competing right at the top of the game."

"It's going to be a bit of a challenge and a journey to get back to where I was, just because I've been out for such a long time."

"At the same time I'm constantly getting better and I'm constantly improving still. I hope I get to show that sooner rather than later."

Draper has only won one of his four Davis Cup matches and has not played in the team event

since losing a singles rubber to Felix Auger-Aliassime in the 2024 Finals group stage.

Jacob Fearnley, who enjoyed a breakthrough season last year, and the in-form Cameron Norrie are also part of a strong British side who will be favourites to beat Norway and set up a second-round qualifier against either Australia or Ecuador.

Ruud was named in Norway's squad but his partner gave birth to their first child last week and he is yet to confirm if he will still be available.

"They've obviously got a

young player, (Nicolai Budkov) Kjaer, who was number one in the world juniors and playing great tennis on the tour," said Draper.

"He'll be really tough and we all know Casper Ruud has been a top-10 player for a long time."

"It's going to be a great challenge for us all, but I think we're ready to embrace it and we're ready to fight for every point."

Alcaraz hints at playing Davis Cup this year

Recent editions of the Davis

Cup Finals, to be held this year in Bologna in November, have been hit by withdrawals from the majority of the world's best players.

A weakened Italy, without Jannik Sinner or Lorenzo Musetti, won last year's title against a Spain team missing Carlos Alcaraz in the final.

Spain have received a bye into September's second qualifying round as the 2025 runners-up, while reigning champions and hosts Italy have a place assured in the Finals.

The Davis Cup is one of the few big titles Alcaraz is yet to win after he became the youngest man to win the career Grand Slam at the Australian Open on Sunday.

"The Davis Cup, it is a goal as well. I really wanted to achieve that for my country, for Spain," Alcaraz said after beating Novak Djokovic in the final at Melbourne Park.


"I set up some other goals for the season, and I will try to be ready for, or to try to get those goals."

Cunningham leads Pistons past Nuggets rally, Knicks roll on

Cade Cunningham scored 29 points as the Detroit Pistons held off a late rally from the Denver Nuggets to seal a 124-121 victory in their heavyweight potential NBA Finals preview on Tuesday.

Eastern Conference leaders Detroit looked to be cruising towards a comfortable win after surging into a 20-point lead early in the third quarter after a 37-point second period.

But Denver star Nikola Jokic rallied with 10 points in the third quarter and Jamal Murray poured in 14 points in the fourth to reduce the Pistons' lead to single digits in the final minutes.

Cunningham though was equal to the challenge, draining two crucial late free throws

to give Detroit a five-point lead with nine seconds remaining as the Pistons closed out the win.

Jamal Murray led Denver's scoring with 32 points while Jokic finished with 24 points, 15 rebounds and four assists.

All five Detroit starters finished in double figures, with Cunningham supported by 20 points from Duncan Robinson -- including six three-pointers -- and Jalen Duren 19 points.

The win gives Detroit a 37-12 record at the top of the Eastern Conference, five-and-a-half games clear of the second-placed New York Knicks, who extended their winning streak to seven games with a 132-101 blowout over the Washington Wizards on Tuesday.

Selection process for future Olympic hosts set for reform

The International Olympic Committee is considering reforming its procedure for awarding future Games to restore "transparency" and establish a clearer timetable, as the contest looms as to who hosts the 2036 Summer Olympics.

The 2036 race is considered wide open and is expected to feature bids from India and Qatar, with Saudi Arabia, South Korea, South Africa, Turkey and Chile among other interested parties.

"While there is no desire to return to the costly pre-2019 bidding process, the current election process requires refinement," former Croatian president Kolinda Grabar-Kitarovic, now an IOC member, told delegates yesterday during the IOC Session in Milan ahead of the 2026 Winter Olympics.

Grabar-Kitarovic, who heads

a working group on the designation of Olympic hosts set up by IOC president Kirsty Coventry, said she believed "structured timelines, increased transparency and more meaningful participation by IOC members" were required.

Since 2019 -- when Coventry's predecessor Thomas Bach was president -- the IOC has radically changed the way it chooses

Games organisers, with the aim of stemming the lack of candidates, reducing costs and avoiding inflicting public humiliation on unsuccessful bidders.

Gone are the suspense-filled elections, seven years before the event, in which the lucky winner was drawn from an envelope during a ceremony broadcast around the world, after costly campaigns to promote bids.

Negotiations are now confidential until the designation of a "preferred host", which is selected behind closed doors by the IOC's Executive Board and approved at the end of the process by the roughly 100 IOC members meeting in their Session.

Grabar-Kitarovic said her working group was proposing introducing a "transitional stage".

It would "allow shortlisting of a limited number of interested parties with advanced projects for deeper evaluation".

That evaluation "should be based on transparent criteria published in advance", she added.

Grabar-Kitarovic suggested such criteria could include "the importance of venue master plans, clarity on the sports programme, financial guarantees, and the added value of prior experience in hosting multi-sport events".

Timber hopes League Cup can be catalyst for Arsenal success

Arsenal defender Jurrien Timber believes lifting the English League Cup could inspire the Gunners to even more success this season.

Mikel Arteta's men are just 90 minutes away from ending their six-year wait for a major trophy after seeing off Chelsea at the Emirates on Tuesday to secure a place in next month's final.

Arsenal are also six points clear at the top of the Premier League and through to the Champions League last 16 following an unblemished league-phase campaign.

They also face third-tier Wigan in the fourth round of the FA Cup a week on Sunday.

"We don't have anything yet, but we've put ourselves in an

amazing position to win," Timber said when asked if winning the League Cup could spur Arsenal on to greater heights.

"The Carabao (League) Cup final is coming early, so maybe that could be nice for us as a

motivation and a boost towards the other cups as well.

"It's not always possible to play your best. But this team does an amazing job of finding a way to win, no matter what. We have done it away at Chelsea, for Kai.

Havertz spent nearly a year out injured following hamstring and knee operations but has now scored twice in his last three appearances.

"Kai's presence within the team makes a big difference, but also on the pitch," said Timber. "Everyone can see his amazing qualities, and how happy we all were for Kai."
