Asian trafficking suspect on trial

An Asian suspect is due to appear before the Criminal Court today following an investigation into a human trafficking case.

This was announced by the Public Prosecutor, who also holds the position of Head of the Human Trafficking Prosecution.

After thorough investigations, the Public Prosecutor has concluded inquiries into the human trafficking incident, signaling a crucial step in addressing such crimes.

According to the findings from the Department of Combating Human Trafficking and the Protection of Public Morals, it was revealed that an individual of Asian nationality had brought a girl from the same nationality into Bahrain under the pretense of offering her suitable employment. However, upon arrival, her passport was confiscated, and she was coerced into engaging in prostitution.

Brazil floods toll

Hamas rejects truce without 'end to war'

'Tough and long negotiations' to end fighting resume in Egypt, without Israel for now

A senior Hamas official insisted late yesterday that the group would "not agree under any circumstances" to a truce in Gaza that did not explicitly include a complete end to the war.

The official, who asked not to be named, also accused Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu of "personally hindering" efforts to reach a truce agreement due to "personal interests".

Talks resumed in Egypt yesterday aimed at halting months of war in Gaza between Hamas fighters and Israel that have triggered protests around the world.

Mediators from Qatar, Egypt and the United States sat down with a Hamas delegation to hear the group's response to a proposal that would halt fighting for 40 days and exchange hostages for Palestinian prisoners, according to details released by Britain.

Israel has yet to send a delegation to Cairo, with a top official telling AFP that it would do so only if there was "positive movement" on the proposed

framework.

"Tough and long negotiations are expected for an actual deal," the Israeli official cautioned.

Previous negotiations stalled in part on Hamas's demand for a lasting ceasefire and Prime Minister Netanyahu's repeated vows to crush the group's remaining

fighters in the southern city of Rafah, which is flooded with displaced civilians.

The prospect of an assault on Rafah has sparked deepening international concern.

'Significant progress'

Egypt's Al-Qahera News,

which is linked to the intelligence services, quoted an unidentified high-ranking source as saying "there is significant progress in the negotiations" and that the mediators have "reached an agreed-upon formula on most points of contention".

A senior Hamas official told AFP before the talks resumed that the movement "looks with an open mind to changes in the occupation's (Israel's) position and the American position, but there are issues that must be addressed".

Senior Hamas official Hossam Badran accused Netanyahu on Friday of trying to undermine the latest truce proposal with his threats to keep fighting with or without a deal.

Badran said Netanyahu's insistence on attacking Rafah was calculated to "thwart any possibility of concluding an agreement".



Eye-opening truths on women's cancer

Dr. Ibtihal Fadhil sheds light on 'often-overlooked' issue in Eastern Mediterranean Region

● **Patients face hurdles in cancer screenings**

● **Government action key to solving woes**

● **Event sets course for cancer advocacy**

Dr. Ibtihal Fadhil, Founder and Chair of the Eastern Mediterranean NCD Alliance (EM-NCDA) on Women's Cancer in the Eastern Mediterranean Region, has shared critical insights regarding the prevalent types of women's cancers, their unique challenges, and the actions needed to combat them.

The EM-NCDA is a coalition of non-governmental organisations in the Eastern Mediterranean Region, dedicated to tackling the burden of non-communicable diseases (NCDs).

In an exclusive interview with The Daily Tribune, Dr. Fadhil emphasised the pressing issues faced by patients, including restricted access to screening programs, societal barriers, and the looming threat of a doubling and tripling of cancer diagnoses

by 2040.

She highlighted the crucial role of governments in implementing robust tobacco control laws, promoting healthy lifestyles, and strengthening healthcare infrastructure to tackle the high prevalence of cancer and cancer-related deaths.

Dr. Fadhil also discussed Bahrain's progress in healthcare and outlined areas for improvement, including the expansion of cancer screening programs and enhancing patient support services.

The EM-NCDA will host an upcoming event on the sidelines of the 77th World Health Assembly (WHA), titled "Uniting Voices for Action on Women's Cancers in the EMR."

This convening is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, 28 May 2024, at Novotel Geneva Centre, Switzerland, from 17:30 to 19:30 CEST, with the aim to mobilise stakeholders toward action amplifying women's voices grappling with cancer in the EMR.

During the interview, Dr. Fadhil also outlined the next steps for EM-NCDA, emphasising advocacy, capacity building, awareness programs, and collaboration to advance the agenda for women's cancer care in the EMR.

lishing an insightful question-and-answer session with Dr. Fadhil:

What are the most prevalent types of women's cancers in the Eastern Mediterranean Region, and what unique challenges do these patients face in terms of diagnosis and treatment?

Dr. Ibtihal Fadhil: Breast, colorectal, cervical, ovarian, and liver cancers are the five most common types of women's cancers in the Eastern Mediterranean region (EMR), and they represent a serious public health concern. When it comes to diagnosis and therapy, each of these tumors has a particular challenges

Breast cancer includes restricted access to screening programs, which lead to diagnosis

in the later stages and lower survival rates. Misinformation, and social and cultural beliefs, make it difficult for people to participate in screening and vaccination programs. The absence of standard screening techniques for ovarian cancer, such as reliable biomarkers or screening assays. Limited prevention programs such as (tobacco control and obesity reduction measures)

Why is the incidence of cancer expected to double and trip across EMR countries by 2040?

Dr. Ibtihal Fadhil: Several interrelated factors may contribute to the projected rise in cancer incidence by 2040 across the EMR countries.

Population Growth and Aging: People are living longer thanks to advancements in healthcare and life expectancy, which raises the general risk of cancer, which is more common in older age groups.

Changing Lifestyles: Changes in food habits (poor diets), sedentary lifestyles, tobacco use, and pollution exposure, can lead to a rise in risk factors for cancer, together with socioeconomic development, may contribute to increased obesity rates, which are known to be risk factors for various cancer types (breast, colon).

Tobacco Use: Despite initiatives to reduce tobacco use, many Middle Eastern nations — including Syria, Jordan, Pakistan, Lebanon, and Iraq — retain high rates of smoking. Tobacco use is a major contributor to the rising cancer burden and is a main cause of many malignancies, including cancers of the mouth, throat, lungs, and bladder.

Limited Access to Healthcare: In many parts of these countries, access to cancer prevention,

screening, diagnosis, and treatment services is still restricted, even with advancements in healthcare infrastructure. Financial limitations, remote location, cultural beliefs, and other obstacles can prevent people from accessing healthcare, where women are often seen at advanced stages of cancer limiting their chance of survival.

Conflict and War: Prolonged periods of war and violence, like those that have occurred in many countries in our region (Sudan, Syria, Libya, and Iraq), cause population displacement, disruption of healthcare systems, and a rise in the prevalence of starvation and poverty. These illnesses not only raise the chance of developing cancer but also make it more difficult to detect, and treat cancer.

Is the expected number of new cancer diagnoses and cancer-related deaths in the EMR higher than in other parts of the world? If so, what are the reasons?

Dr. Ibtihal Fadhil: Indeed, in comparison to certain other regions of the world, the Eastern Mediterranean Region (EMR) is predicted to see a larger number of new cancer diagnoses and deaths from cancer. This increases cancer burden.

Academic fraud

Education Ministry refers report to Public Prosecution on private educational institution applicants' fake credentials

The Ministry of Education has taken decisive action by referring a comprehensive report to the Public Prosecution about allegations of forged academic credentials linked to three applicants vying for roles in private educational institutions.

Upon meticulous scrutiny of the submitted documents and records, the Ministry of Education uncovered substantial irregularities. Specifically, the authenticity of the qualifications presented by the applicants could not be substantiated even after diligent cross-verification with the relevant issuing institutions.

Consequently, the Ministry

promptly compiled detailed reports encompassing the personal information of the individuals involved, as well as the falsified qualifications they had put forth.

Legal investigation

Focus on Correction and Rehabilitation Institution Law amendments

The Shura Council will discuss the report of the Foreign Affairs, Defense, and National Security Committee concerning proposed amendments to the Correction and Rehabilitation Institution Law during its 29th session of the second session of the sixth legislative term, scheduled for today.

The amendments, as part of

ongoing efforts to enhance penal practices, aim to provide psychological and social support to inmates and pretrial detainees, emphasising their integration into society and improving their healthcare.

The draft law introduces new concepts for managing correctional facilities, visitation policies, and healthcare provisions for inmates. It underscores a shift towards social rehabil-

The draft law introduces new concepts for managing correctional facilities, visitation policies, and healthcare provisions for inmates.

itation, emphasising gradual treatment based on behavioral development through reform programs.

It also expands visitation rights for inmates, broadening

the scope to include extended family members. The legislation also outlines procedures for healthcare delivery, ensuring regular medical examinations and necessary treatments for

inmates.

The proposed amendments redefine key terms and authorities, such as the term "visit" and the role of government health institutions in providing healthcare services.

The revised text grants the center's doctor authority to refer inmates to public or private hospitals when necessary, streamlining healthcare access. The Council will discuss other

legislative matters, including amendments to Decree Law No. (19) of 1976 regarding medals and the review of its financial statements.

During the session, the Council will address inquiries directed to various ministers, covering topics such as tourism sector development, legislative impact assessment, labour market coordination, and corporate acquisitions affecting Bahraini workers.

Sigh of relief as restaurant supervisor acquitted of health violation claims

A restaurant supervisor has been acquitted of violating health regulations after a court found that he was not responsible for ensuring the restaurant met the required standards.

The supervisor, who was not named in the court documents, was accused of violating health regulations after a health inspector found several violations at the restaurant.

The supervisor had promised the inspector that he would remove the violations, but he was surprised to be charged with the offense despite not being the owner or manager of the restaurant.

The supervisor's lawyer argued that her client had no connection to the restaurant and was not responsible for its management. She pointed out that the restaurant was not reg-

istered in his name and that he was not authorized to manage it.

The court agreed with the lawyer's argument, noting that the supervisor was only responsible for the employees and their organisation.

The court found that the observed violations were the responsibility of the owner or the person authorised by the

owner to manage the restaurant and ensure it met all health and legal requirements.

Evidence

The court also noted that the actual owner of the restaurant had acknowledged to the health department that he was authorised to manage the restaurant since 2015 and had submitted evidence that all violations had been removed and had requested the issuance of a health certificate.

Based on this evidence, the court ruled that the supervisor was not responsible for the violations and acquitted him of the charges.

The court emphasised that the responsibility for ensuring compliance with health regulations lies with the owner or the person authorised by the owner to manage the restaurant.

Joint venture triumph

Bahrain and Egypt collaboration project earns place on 2026 Chinese lunar exploration mission

The National Space Science Authority (NSSA) has announced the success of the joint Bahraini-Egyptian venture in a global competition hosted by the Chinese Space Agency.

The winning project secures a spot aboard the Chang'e-7 lunar exploration mission slated for 2026, aiming to probe the lunar south pole's soil composition, including the presence of water ice.

This initiative entails the development, testing, and deployment of a multispectral camera, tasked with analysing lunar surface materials. It underscores Arab prowess in lunar exploration, showcasing region-

al competencies' capability to compete on the global space science stage.

The collaboration between Bahrain and Egypt stems from a 2022 memorandum of understanding, signifying the strategic partnership's commitment to advancing scientific frontiers.

Man jailed for issuing bounced check in investment scam case

● Six months in prison

The Lower Criminal Court handed down a verdict sentencing an individual to a six-month prison term for his involvement in an alleged investment scheme, where he issued a bounced check amounting to BD82,000.

In addition to the aforementioned offense, the defendant faces multiple charges related to defrauding unsuspecting individuals and subsequently evading authorities by fleeing the nation.

However, after more than 13 years of eluding justice, the accused individual was apprehended upon his return to Bahrain.

The Capital Governorate Pub-

lic Prosecution has confirmed that an active investigation is underway in response to a series of complaints lodged against the defendant, all of which are associated with fraudulent activities.

Funds

The defendant stands accused of deceiving individuals by so-

liciting funds under the guise of investment opportunities and subsequently absconding from the country.

The widespread attention garnered by this case on various social media platforms played a pivotal role in facilitating the defendant's arrest.

The Anti-Financial Crimes Department acted swiftly, ex-

ecuting the arrest based on a warrant issued by the Public Prosecution.

Guilty

Upon careful examination of the evidence presented, the court found the defendant guilty of the offense of issuing a bounced check without sufficient funds, a violation that carries severe penalties under Bahraini law.

Consequently, the court handed down a sentence of six months' imprisonment, which took immediate effect. The Public Prosecution has emphasised that investigations into other filed cases involving the defendant are actively ongoing.

It is anticipated that additional charges related to the alleged fraudulent activities will be brought against him, further underscoring the gravity of his actions.

European woman, Arab man arrested for gold jewelry theft

Strategically placed Sri Lanka's economic recovery was essential for stability in the Indo-Pacific region, Japan's foreign minister said yesterday, urging Colombo to swiftly restructure its foreign debt.

Yoko Kamikawa said Colombo should secure agreements with bilateral lenders and international sovereign bondholders to unlock suspended foreign funding for the cash-strapped nation.

After talks with her Sri Lankan counterpart Ali Sabry, Kamikawa called on President Ranil Wickremesinghe and discussed the island's reforms to overcome its worst economic crisis, the

two sides said.

"Deliberation also encompassed discussions on the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) pertaining to debt restructuring in Sri Lanka,"

Wickremesinghe's office said in a statement.

The Sri Lankan government which defaulted on its \$46 billion external debt in April 2022 had hoped to finalise deals with foreign creditors by April but there have been no final agreements yet.

Kamikawa told reporters that she "stressed the importance of reaching a debt restructuring agreement with all the creditors", including China -- the largest bilateral lender to the island.

"I also conveyed Japan's intention to further support Sri Lanka's development by swiftly resuming existing yen loan projects (after debt restructuring)," she said.

She said Tokyo considered Colombo's economic recovery as crucial for the entire region. The island is located halfway along

the main east-west international shipping route.

"The restoration of stability and economic development of Sri Lanka, which is at a strategic location in the Indian Ocean, is essential for the stability and prosperity of the entire Indo-Pacific region," she added.

Sri Lanka must secure agreement from all official creditors and a majority of private bondholders to continue with a four-year \$2.9 billion bailout loan begun since March last year.

Chinese-funded projects

Japanese foreign ministry spokeswoman Mariko Kaneko said they were keen that Colombo press ahead with IMF-backed governance reforms that include tackling corruption.

"Sri Lanka government needs to proceed with anti-corruption measures... make policy-mak-

ing process more transparent," Kaneko said, adding that they fully supported the reforms envisaged in the IMF bailout program.

Japan, the second largest bilateral lender to the island has expressed concern about China's big infrastructure projects in Sri Lanka and elsewhere in the region.

Tokyo maintains that the Chinese-funded projects did not meet international finance standards.

Unable to repay a huge loan taken from China in 2017 to build a deep sea port in southern Hambantota, Sri Lanka handed it over to a Chinese firm for \$1.12 billion on a 99-year lease.

Sri Lanka ran out of cash to pay for even the most essential imports in 2022, leading to chronic shortages of food, fuel and medicines.

Berkshire pares huge Apple stake as cash, operating profit set records

Berkshire Hathaway significantly reduced its enormous stake in Apple in the first quarter, as Warren Buffett's conglomerate let its cash hoard swell to a record \$189 billion.

Buffett's company also posted a record operating profit exceeding \$11bn, as its insurance operations benefited from improved underwriting and higher income from investments as interest rates rose.

The value of Berkshire's stake in Apple fell 22% to \$135.4bn as of March 31 from \$174.3bn at the end of 2023, even though the iPhone maker's share price fell just 11% in the quarter.

Based on changes in Apple's stock price, Berkshire appears to have sold about 115 million shares, or 13% of its holdings, in the quarter, ending with about 790 m.

A large sale is an about-face for Buffett, who is normally tech-phobic but came to view Apple as a consumer goods com-

pany with strong pricing power and devoted customers.

Some investors, however, have expressed concern that Apple consumed too much of Berkshire's investment portfolio.

But the sales leave Buffett with more than six times the minimum \$30bn cash cushion

he has pledged to keep.

At Berkshire's annual meeting on Saturday, Buffett assured shareholders that "unless something dramatic happens that really changes capital allocation, we will have Apple as our largest investment."

He also said "I don't mind" expanding the cash stake, in

light of alternatives in the equity markets and conflicts around the world, and said cash could top \$200bn by the end of June.

The Apple sales resulted in Berkshire's realizing \$11.2bn of after-tax gains in the quarter from selling investments. Buffett maintained that he doesn't mind paying taxes.

PROFIT SWELLS

First-quarter operating profit rose 39% to \$11.22bn, or about \$7,807 per Class A share, from \$8.07bn a year earlier.

"Berkshire continues to benefit from attractive yields on short-term investments and large cash balances," Edward Jones analyst James Shanahan said in a research note.

Net income fell 64% to \$12.7bn, or \$8,838 per share, from \$35.5bn a year earlier, when Berkshire had large unrealized gains from its stocks.

An accounting rule requires Berkshire to report those gains with its financial results. Buffett urges investors to ignore the resulting volatility.

France probes TotalEnergies over 2021 Mozambique attack

French prosecutors said yesterday they were investigating oil giant TotalEnergies for possible involuntary manslaughter in connection with a 2021 jihadist attack in Mozambique that killed hundreds.

The probe follows a legal complaint brought by victims' families and attack survivors, accusing the French energy company, which was developing a major liquefied gas project in the region, of failing to protect its subcontractors, the prosecutors' office told AFP.

The survivors and families say TotalEnergies also failed to provide fuel so that helicopters could evacuate civilians after Islamic State-linked militants killed dozens of people in the Mozambican port town of Palma on March 24, 2021.

The entire attack in Cabo Delgado province lasted several days, claiming several hundred lives. Some of the victims were beheaded and thousands fled their homes.

Contacted by AFP Saturday, a TotalEnergies spokesman reiterated a previous statement saying it "firmly rejects the accusations".

He said the company's Mozambique teams had supplied emergency aid and made the evacuation of 2,500 people from the plant possible, including civilians, staff, contractors and sub-contractors.

The French investigation also seeks to establish whether TotalEnergies is guilty of non-assistance to people in danger, prosecutors said.

Seven British and South African complainants --- three survivors and four relatives of victims -- accuse TotalEnergies of failing to take steps to ensure the safety of subcontractors even before the assault.



TotalEnergies's \$20-billion project to develop a large gas field on the Afungi peninsula was halted following the 2021 attack, but chairman Patrick Pouyanne has since said he hoped to revive it.

◆ **Russia has added Ukrainian** President Volodymyr Zelensky to its list of wanted criminals, a government database showed yesterday. Zelensky appeared in the Russian interior ministry's "wanted" list, an online database of alleged criminals sought by the authorities. It stated that the Ukrainian leader was wanted "under an article of the criminal code," without providing further details. There was no immediate comment from Russian officials on why Zelensky had been added to the list. Moscow has targeted Zelensky since the start of its military offensive in February 2022.

◆ **Russia yesterday said** it had downed four US-made ATACMS long-range missiles recently supplied by Washington to Kyiv over the Moscow-annexed Crimean peninsula. The defence ministry said it had "foiled" the night attack but did not specify if the falling debris had caused any damage. In April, the United States confirmed it had sent these missiles to Ukraine, which had been pressing for them to strike targets way beyond the front line. Ukraine used US ATACMS missiles against Russia for the first time in October, but the recently supplied versions have a farther range of up to 300 kilometres (190 miles).

◆ **An Israeli military incursion** into Gaza's southern city of Rafah could lead to a "bloodbath", the World Health Organization warned Friday, announcing contingency plans. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has vowed to crush Hamas's remaining fighters in Rafah, where much of Gaza's population has sought refuge from nearly seven months of war. WHO director-general Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus warned of possible dire implications for the 1.2 million people sheltering in Rafah. "WHO is deeply concerned that a full-scale military operation in Rafah, Gaza, could lead to a bloodbath, and further weaken an already broken health system," Tedros said on X, formerly Twitter. In a statement, the WHO announced contingency efforts, but warned "the broken health system would not be able to cope with a surge in casualties and deaths that a Rafah incursion would cause." "This contingency plan is Band-Aids," Rik Pepperkorn, the WHO representative in the Palestinian territories, told reporters in Geneva. "It will absolutely not prevent the expected substantial additional mortality and morbidity caused by a military operation." According to the WHO, most of the besieged territory's health facilities have been damaged or destroyed amid heavy Israeli bombardment.

India not xenophobic, FM says after Biden remark

Foreign minister S. Jaishankar said "Why are they not being held to account? Because nobody has lost citizenship."

India is not xenophobic, the country's foreign minister has insisted, after comments by US President Joe Biden suggesting the South Asian nation and fellow ally Japan were struggling economically because they rejected immigrants.

Biden, who is seeking reelection against Republican rival Donald Trump in November, made the remarks at a campaign fundraising event in Washington this week.

Foreign minister S. Jaishankar told a media roundtable Friday that Biden's comments did not match India's reality.

"First of all, our economy is not faltering," he said, according to a report of the discussion published Saturday by the Economic Times newspaper.

"India has been a very unique country," he added. "I would say actually, in the history of the world, that it's been a society which has been very open... different people of different societies come to India."

India is one of the world's fastest-growing economies with annualised GDP growth of 8.4% in the December quarter, according to official data in February.

"There are people who publicly said on record that... a million Muslims will lose their citizenship in this country," Jaishankar said.

'Unfortunate'

Biden had clubbed allies India and Japan in with rivals China and Russia in remarks intended as a defence of US immigration policy.

"Why is China stalling so badly economically? Why is Japan in trouble? Why is Russia in trouble? And India? Because they're xenophobic. They don't want immigrants," Biden had said at the Wednesday fundraiser.

Tokyo responded Saturday by saying it was "unfortunate that comments not based on an accurate understanding of Japan's policy were made".

The White House has since had to downplay Biden's remarks. The president was merely trying to send a broader message that "the United States is a nation of immigrants," National Security Council spokesman John Kirby told reporters.

British-Palestinian doctor says refused entry into France

British-Palestinian doctor and Glasgow university rector Ghasan Abu-Sittah

British-Palestinian doctor and Glasgow university rector Ghasan Abu-Sittah said yesterday he was denied access to France where he was to report on the medical situation in Gaza.

Abu-Sittah said on X, formerly Twitter, that he had been invited to give an account to French sen-

ators of his experience as a doctor in Gaza since the Israeli offensive there, but had been blocked at Paris's Roissy Charles-de-Gaulle airport.

He had already been stopped from entering Germany last month where he had hoped to attend a "Palestinian Congress" along with former Greek finance minister Yanis Varoufakis, who was also denied access.

"I am at Charles De Gaulle airport. They are preventing me from entering France," Abu-Sittah said on X. "I am supposed to speak at the French Senate today. They say the Germans put a 1 year ban on my entry to Europe."

A French police source confirmed to AFP that France could not allow the doctor entry because it was bound by a German-issued ban on his entry into

the visa-free Schengen zone of which both countries are members.

Last month, Abu-Sittah reported that he had been banned from Germany "for the month of April", and accused the authorities there of stifling freedom of expression.

In another X post on Saturday, Abu Sitta said that "the French authorities are denying me ac-

cess to an earlier flight and insisting on sending me on the last flight back" to London, calling the measure "an act of utter vindictiveness".

He said "fortress Europe" was "silencing the witnesses to the genocide while Israel kills them in prison".

The event which Abu-Sittah had been scheduled to attend was organised by Senator Raymond

Poncet Monge, a Green party member.

The president of the Greens' Senate group, Guillaume Gontard, called the decision to block Abu-Sittah "scandalous", and said he was negotiating with the interior and foreign ministries to reverse the move. He added however that the doctor would "probably" be sent back to Britain.

Abu-Sittah spent 43 days in

Gaza, notably at the territory's largest hospital Al-Shifa.

Israeli forces pulled out of the hospital complex in early April, saying they had engaged Palestinian fighters in combat for two weeks there.

The World Health Organization said in April that the hospital had been reduced to ashes by Israel's siege, leaving an "empty shell" with many bodies.

Philippine bishops instruct flock to pray for rain, heat relief

Catholic bishops in the Philippines are pitching in to seek divine relief from the extreme heatwave scorching the country, instructing their flock to recite special prayers for rain and lower temperatures.

Rising temperatures have forced the government to shut down tens of thousands of schools over the past week.

A widespread El Nino drought that began early this year is compounding the problem, ruining 5.9 billion pesos (\$103 million) worth of farm produce so far according to the Department of Agriculture.

The Catholic Bishops of the Philippines issued an "Oratio Imperata", instructing parishes in the mainly Catholic nation to recite a prayer for deliverance from calamities during masses, according to the text seen by AFP on Saturday.

"We humbly ask you to grant us relief from the extreme heat that besets your people at this time, disrupting their activities and threatening their lives and livelihood," the prayer read.

"Send us rain to replenish our depleting water sources, to irrigate our fields, to stave off water and power shortages and to provide water for our daily needs."

Armed groups in Gaza rob Bank of Palestine branches: report

Armed groups in Gaza, including one with presumed Hamas links, last month robbed the Bank of Palestine of some \$70 million, French daily Le Monde reported yesterday.

The funds were taken from the vaults of several branches of the bank, it said, citing a Bank of Palestine document sent to "certain international partners" detailing the robberies.

On April 16, staff discovered a hole in the ceiling of the safe deposit room at one of the bank's Gaza branches and found that some \$3 million worth of Israeli shekels destined for cash dispensers were missing, Le Monde said.

The next day, armed groups equipped with explosives returned to the site, blew up a cement protection chamber, and

took more than \$30 million in various currencies from three safes.

Two days later, the biggest Gaza branch was attacked by commandos who said they answered to "Gaza's highest authorities", which the paper said is understood to mean Hamas.

They took more than \$36 million worth of shekels.

The Bank of Palestine, founded in 1960, is Gaza's leading financial institution.

The Palestinian Monetary Authority, an independent body that oversees the financial system in Palestinian territories, said when contacted by AFP that it was planning to issue a statement about the issue later Saturday.

Guns and sheep: settlers use shepherding outposts to seize West Bank land

Palestinians in the Israeli-occupied West Bank say armed Jewish settlers are increasingly seizing their lands by bringing livestock to so-called shepherding outposts and refusing to leave.

One settler arrived recently near sunset on a hilltop near the village of Deir Jarir, wearing a black shirt and a green headscarf, like many Palestinian farmers, they said.

"The settlers imitate us in every way," said Abdullah Abu Rahme, a member of a Palestinian anti-settler group, who said the hardliners also employ violence and "throw stones at us and block roads".

One local man, Haidar Abu Makho, 50, looked sadly across to a hill where settlers' sheep were now grazing, in the rural area near Ramallah.

The land, where settlers' belongings and cars could be seen ringed by a wire fence, he said,

the bloodshed has intensified since the October 7 attack by Gaza's rulers Hamas sparked the devastating war in the Palestinian coastal territory.

Rights groups say settlers in shepherding outposts carry guns and have used attack dogs to threaten and attack Palestinians, sometimes killing their livestock and destroying their property.

The groups have been especially active around Deir Jarir, a village of about around 5,000 people, said the local man, Abu Makho.

"The settlers have effectively blocked access to vast stretches of land around Deir Jarir, preventing both agricultural use and grazing for the people across tens of kilometres," he said.

"By situating a shepherd with a flock of sheep atop a hill, a substantial portion of land is seized... denying Palestinians access to it."

He said settlers had "aggressively confiscated" local houses and tractors as well as horses and donkeys, all "symbols of the Palestinian traditional farming life".

The Israeli army did not respond to an AFP request for comment on the Deir Jarir case.

In March, Israeli authorities declared as state land 800 hectares next to a farmer's home near the Jordan Valley village of Jiftlik, a move that often leads to restrictions on Palestinians' access.

In areas near Deir Jarir, other residents also said they had been impacted, at great cost to their livelihoods.

Suleiman Khouriyeh, the mayor of the nearby village of Taybeh, population 1,800, said the "entire eastern region has been encroached upon by numerous hilltop shepherds".

"We are unable to access the olive groves that we rightfully own" during harvest season, he said, adding that the community's losses amounted to thousands of dollars.

Khouriyeh said that locals don't have "the power or strength to confront the heavily armed" settlers.

"We are defenceless against them and their weapons."

Boeing's Starliner finally ready for first crewed mission

Launch day is finally here: Boeing's Starliner capsule blasts off tomorrow to the International Space Station on its first crewed mission -- several years after SpaceX first achieved the same milestone.

The flight, a final test before Starliner takes up regular service for NASA, is critical for the US aerospace giant, whose reputation has suffered of late due to safety issues with some of its passenger jets.

Starliner, which was first ordered a decade ago by the US space agency, has had a bumpy ride to the finish line, with surprise setbacks and multiple delays -- a saga Boeing is eager to complete.

Astronauts Butch Wilmore and Suni Williams are set to leave Cape Canaveral at 10:34 pm Monday (0234 GMT Tuesday) aboard the capsule.

Starliner will be propelled into orbit by an Atlas V rocket made by United Launch All-

ance, a Boeing-Lockheed Martin joint venture.

Wilmore and Williams, Navy-trained space program veterans, have each been to the ISS twice, traveling once on a shuttle and then aboard a Russian Soyuz vessel.

"It's going to be like going back home," Williams said. As for the Boeing spacecraft, Wilmore said: "Everything is new. Everything's unique."

"I don't think either one of us ever dreamed that we'd be

associated with the first flight of a brand new spacecraft."

For NASA, the stakes are also high: Having a second option for human space flight in addition to SpaceX's Dragon vehicles is "really important," said Dana Weigel, manager of the agency's International Space Station program.

Weigel said the flexibility could help NASA manage emergency situations, such as problems with a particular space vehicle.

Pakistan records 'wettest April' in more than 60 years

Pakistan experienced its "wettest April since 1961", receiving more than twice as much rain as usual for the month, the country's weather agency said in a report.

April rainfall was recorded at 59.3 millimetres, "excessively above" the normal average

of 22.5 millimetres, Pakistan's meteorology department said late Friday in its monthly climate report.

There were at least 144 deaths in thunderstorms and house collapses due to heavy rains in what the report said was the "wettest April since 1961". Pakistan is increasingly vulnerable to unpredictable

weather, as well as often destructive monsoon rains that usually arrive in July. A third of Pakistan was submerged by unprecedented monsoon rains that displaced millions of people in the summer of 2022 and cost the country \$30 billion in damage and economic losses, according to a World Bank estimate.

Israel official says delegation not yet in Cairo for Gaza talks

A top Israeli official yesterday said Israel will send a delegation to Cairo for talks on a Gaza truce only if it sees a "positive movement" on a framework for a hostage deal.

"What we are looking at is an agreement over a framework for a possible hostage deal," the official told AFP on condition of anonymity.

"Tough and long negotiations are expected for an actual deal."

"The indication for positive movement over a framework would be if we send a delegation led by Mossad chief to Cairo," said the official, who spoke in English.

Dublin campus encampment erected in pro-Palestinian protest

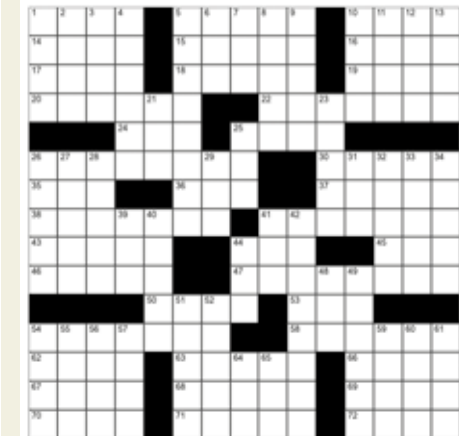

But just three minutes later Ben Yedder set up Brel Embolo for his first goal of the season on the Swiss player's first start this campaign after a serious knee injury.

The Monaco captain slotted in his team's third goal on 57 minutes, adding his second of the night with three minutes to go for his 117th club goal in all competitions.

Dončić added seven rebounds and 13 assists to gain a measure of revenge against a Clippers team that ousted his Mavs in the first round in 2020 and 2021.

Dallas next face the Oklahoma City Thunder, the surprise Western top seeds who swept New Orleans 4-0.

The series will offer a tantalizing matchup between Slovenian star Dončić and Oklahoma City's Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, both Most Valuable Player award finalists along with Nikola Jokić -- whose reigning champion Denver Nuggets face Minnesota in the second round.

"We stayed together," Dončić said of a Mavs team that led by 13 in the second quarter only for the Clippers to tie it up by halftime at 52-52.

Irving's driving layup in the first minute of the third quarter put Dallas ahead for good.

It was just the beginning of Irving's dazzling second half display that also featured an off-balance three-pointer as he was fouled, with Irving converting the free-throw to push the Mavs' lead to 24 points.

While Bayern head to Madrid with their tails between their legs, fellow Champions League semi-finalists Dortmund were in fine form ahead of their trip to Paris Saint-Germain on Tuesday.

It was a particularly emotional afternoon for Reus, who had announced on Friday that after 12 years at Dortmund he would leave at the end of the season.

Youssoufa Moukoko gave Dortmund the lead early on, flicking the ball in from close range after some chaotic defending from Augsburg.

Donyell Malen doubled the lead on 20 minutes, heading home an inswinging corner from English winger Jamie Bynoe-Gittens.

Moukoko added another from a corner shortly afterwards, before Ruben Vargas pulled one back for Augsburg against the run of play.

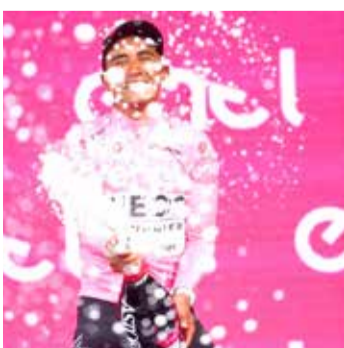
Dortmund remained unfazed, however, and Reus soon made it 4-1 with an elegant chip over goalkeeper Alexander Meyer.

Narvaez was delighted with the biggest win of his career.

"You don't get many chances like that," he said of taking the

pink jersey. After denying Pogacar an eighth win in just 11 days of competitive racing this year, Narvaez said the Slovenian had made a mistake.

"He launched his sprint too early, after a hard stage like that he went from like 200m. I waited for the 100m mark," said Narvaez, who allowed Pogacar to do all the work in his bid to become the first man to win the Giro d'Italia and Tour de France double since Marco Pantani in 1998.
