The Coast Guard patrols have rescued five people south of Shaikh Khalifa bin Salman bridge from an accident between a boat and a fishing dhow.

Shortly after the case was reported to the main Operations Room, the maritime patrols rushed to the scene and rescued them. The National Ambulance provided them with first aid and referred them to the hospital.

The Coast Guard called upon seafarers to follow the weather reports and instructions and provide safety tools onboard. Assistance calls are received through 1700000 and 994.

Guest speakers included Dr. Nada Fadul, Professor of Medicine and Assistant Dean Dr. Jameela Al Salman of DEI Education Programs at the Division of Infectious Diseases, University of Nebraska Medical Center, and Dr. Jameela Al Salman, Head of Medical Department, Infection Control and Quality, American Mission Hospital.

Beginning the discussion, Dr. Jameela said that HIV is a global epidemic.



The issue is that people fail to test themselves, even if symptoms arise, for fear of judgment.

Motorist and insurance company are ordered to pay BD10,000 to traffic accident victim

The High Civil Court obligated a motorist and an insurance company to pay BD10.000 to the family of a Bahraini man who was injured in an accident caused by the defendant. The court also obligated them to pay legal interest at 2% as well as attorney fees and expenses. The plaintiff's lawyer stated that on November 2021, his client was involved in a traffic accident caused by the defendant. As a result, he became permanently unable to work. 'The Traffic Court sentenced the defendant to three months of imprisonment and a fine of BD1,000 while the Court of Appeal upheld the Thus the plaintiff's representruling, making it final," the ative requested that the two lawyer pointed out, explaining that the joint tort liability, whereby a causal relation exists between fault and damage, is applicable to the first defendant as the driver of the vehicle insured by the second defendant. The lawyer indicated that his client suffered an injury that prevented him from working for a period of six months from the date of the accident.

♦ All 19 people caught in landslide in southwestern China's Sichuan province yesterday have been confirmed dead, state media reported, announcing the end of rescue efforts. Part of a mountain collapsed at around 6 am (2200 GMT Saturday) near a state-owned forestry station in Jinkouhe, near the

city of Leshan, state broadcaster CCTV said. The disaster sent mud and debris hurtling towards a construction site operated by a local mining company, where it "struck and buried parts of the production and living facilities at the mineshaft platform", CCTV

adding that "search and rescue work has currently ended, and the cause of the... collapse is under investigation". Footage broadcast by CCTV showed rescuers and excavators picking through a tract of mud that had flattened a wooded hillside and strewn it with twisted metal and smashed masonry. The Jinkouhe government earlier said the landslide had killed 14 people and left five missing.

China warns 'NATOlike' alliances could lead to conflict in **Asia-Pacific** Singapore

China's defence minister warned yesterday against establishing NA-TO-like military alliances in the Asia-Pacific, saying they would plunge the region into a "whirlpool" of conflict

Li Shangfu's comments came a day after US and Chinese military vessels sailed close to each other in the flashpoint Taiwan Strait, an incident that provoked anger from both sides

"Attempts to push for NA-TO-like (alliances) in the Asia-Pacific is a way of kidnapping regional countries and exaggerating conflicts and confrontations," Li told a security conference in Singapore also attended by US Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin.

Li warned that these alliances would "plunge the Asia-Pacific into a whirlpool of disputes and conflicts"

Li's comments echoed long-held Chinese criticism of the United States' efforts to shore up alliances in the region and counter China's rise.

The United States is a member of AUKUS, which groups it with Australia and Britain. Washington is also a member of the QUAD group, which includes Australia, India and Japan.

"Today's Asia-Pacific needs open and inclusive cooperation, not buddying up into small cliques," Li said at the Shangri-La Dialogue security summit.

Nepali guide rescues climber from Everest death zone

An Nepali guide abandoned his client's Everest summit bid to rescue a Malaysian climber in a deadly mountaineering season that has seen at least twelve deaths.

Gelje Sherpa was guiding a Chinese client to the 8,849-metre (29,032-feet) peak and planned to assist him to paraglide down.

Instead, only a few hundred metres from the summit, they came across a lone man clinging to a rope and shivering in the area known as the "death zone".

LEGAL VIEWPOINT

Corporate Governance – How to achieve best results

basic principle of corporate governance (CG) relates to the Board of Directors of the company, wherein A the company shall be headed by an effective, collegial and informative Board of Directors. Herein, you need to ask yourself, where do we stand in this?

To achieve the goal, all members of the Board of Directors should understand the role and responsibilities of the Board as stipulated in the law "Company Law", the relevant Articles & Memorandum of Association of the company, the corporate culture and the corporate governance code.

This stand, in particular, highlights that the role of the Board of Directors is different from the role of the shareholders of the company (whose interests the Board serves) and, also, the role of the executives \ officers working in the company. In particular, members of the Board of Directors should fully understand the Boards fiduciary duties of care and degree of loyalty to the company and

the shareholders. Members of the Board of Directors are responsible both individually and collectively for performing these responsibilities, which cannot be transferred or delegated to other persons or to other bodies of the company.

When a new Director is appointed, the Chairman of the Board assisted by the legal advisor and compliance officer of the company, should review the Boards role and duties with all members of the Board of Directors, particularly covering the legal and regulatory requirements and the Code of Corporate Governance. The company should have

a written appointment letter \backslash agreement with each member of the Board of Directors including the powers and duties of the director

in addition to other matters relating to his appointment including his term, the time commitment envisaged, the committee assignment if any, his remuneration and expense reimbursement entitlement, and his access to independent professional advice when and if needed.

The Board of directors should consider adopting a formal Board "Charter" or other statement specifying matters which are reserved to it, which should include but need not be limited to the specific items stated in the Company Law. An alternative is a formal statement or by-law stating the functions and authority delegated to the officers as mentioned in the Company Law.

The Board of Directors should be collegial and deliberative for the sake of gaining the benefit of each member, of the Board of Directors, judgment and experience. The Chairman should take an active lead in promoting mutual trust, open discussion, constructive dissent and support for decisions after they have been made. The Board of Directors should meet frequently, usually more than the minimum required by law.

All members of the Board of Directors should attend the meetings, and the Board of Directors should maintain informal communication between meetings. Unexcused absence(s) is not welcomed as it may disturb the functions of the Board of Directors and indicates that the person is not the type of those needed for efficient Board directorship as stipulated in the Corporate Governance Code. Regarding attendance, more control measures are required and continuous absence could lead to termination of membership.

Commitment and accountability reflect the effectiveness of the Board and are essentially required and should be observed by all members of the Board of Directors, taking in account that they are supposed to excel and give good example to all related parties in the company, the shareholders and community stakeholders. If you are a Board member, you need to ask yourself where do you stand in this and are you effective enough to make your Board of Directors more effective, as required for corporate governance purposes. An active role by each Board Director will lead to the best corporate governance results.






